ABSTRACT

Grade reports supplied by California State University at Los Angeles (CSULA) for the 1978-79 academic year were used to assess the academic performance of the 503 Los Angeles City College (LACC) students who transferred to CSULA in Fall 1978, Winter 1979, Spring 1979, and Summer 1979. These data indicate that 23% of the transfer students failed to complete any work at CSULA during their first quarter; 57% of them withdrew without penalty. Of the 388 students who completed some work, 37% earned a "B" average or better, and 21% fell below the "C" level. Highest grade point averages (GPA's) were earned in Pan Afro studies, Music, Physical Education, and Spanish; lowest grades (below 2.25) were earned in Physics, Criminal Justice, Business, and Geography. While the average pre-transfer GPA for students (2.67) was the highest in 12 years, the average GPA earned by these students after transfer to CSULA (2.43) was the lowest for the 12-year period; the most significant decline was registered by students enrolled in the School of Letters and Science. A decline was also seen in the number of transfers who completed work--the 1978-79 figure is less than half of that from 1969-70 and is a 30% decrease from 1977-78. PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

To assess academic performance of recent Los Angeles City College transfers to California State University at Los Angeles, and to compare with past performance.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

Grade reports for transfers from LACC are received periodically from the Office of School Relations of California State University at Los Angeles. Each grade report indicates, in addition to courses taken and grades earned, the class and major of the student. The report also indicates "transfer totals," i.e., units carried and grade points attempted at colleges prior to entering the University. For the purposes of this study, these figures are assumed to represent LACC performance. A previous study indicated that this procedure would be reasonably reliable. The findings indicated in the next section of this study are based on information obtained from the State University grade reports for the academic year 1978-79.

FINDINGS

Table 1 indicates the number of grade reports received for each of the three quarters of the 1978-79 year, plus the summer quarter of 1979.

503 students entered CSULA as transfers from LACC during the four quarters indicated. 52% of these entered in September, 15% in January, 21% in April, 12% in the Summer. Of the 503, 115 (23%) failed to complete any work at CSULA during their first quarter. 57% of these withdrawals were without penalty.

Table 2 summarizes the first quarter academic performance of the 388 students completing some work during their first quarter.

Table 3 analyzes performance according to school or division of major.

Table 4 indicates distribution of grades earned (in student's first quarter) in each department at CSULA by the 388 transfers.

Table 5 shows, in order of grade point average, the grade point averages earned in departments enrolling 15 or more students.

Tables 6 and 7 present available data for previous semesters.

Figure 1-3 indicate numbers of transfers and their grade point averages over the past twelve years. Figure 4 shows enrollments according to school of major.

FIGURE 1 - Number of LACC Transfers to CSULA, 1967-79

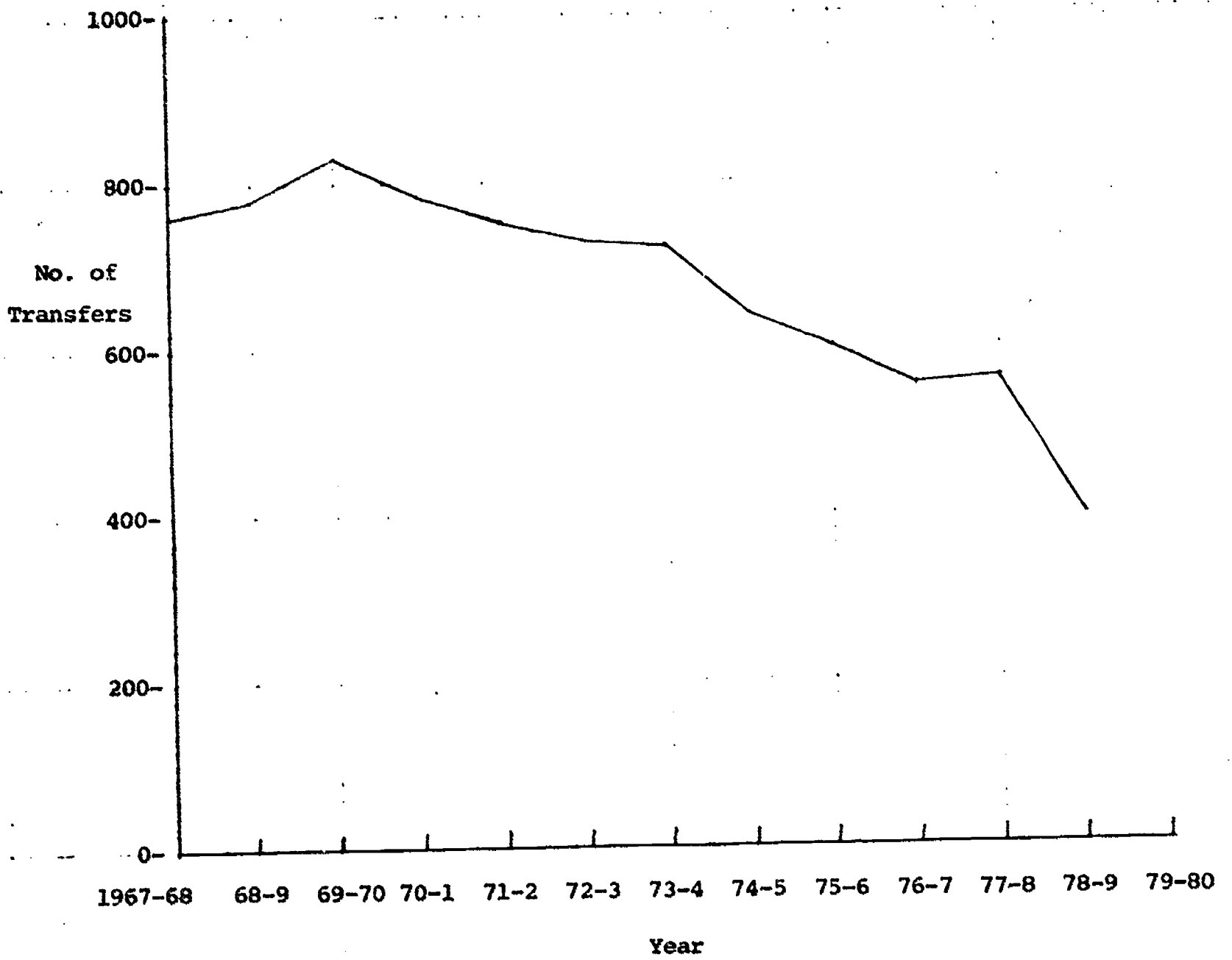


FIGURE 2 - Grade Point Averages Earned by LACC Transfers to CSULA 1967-79

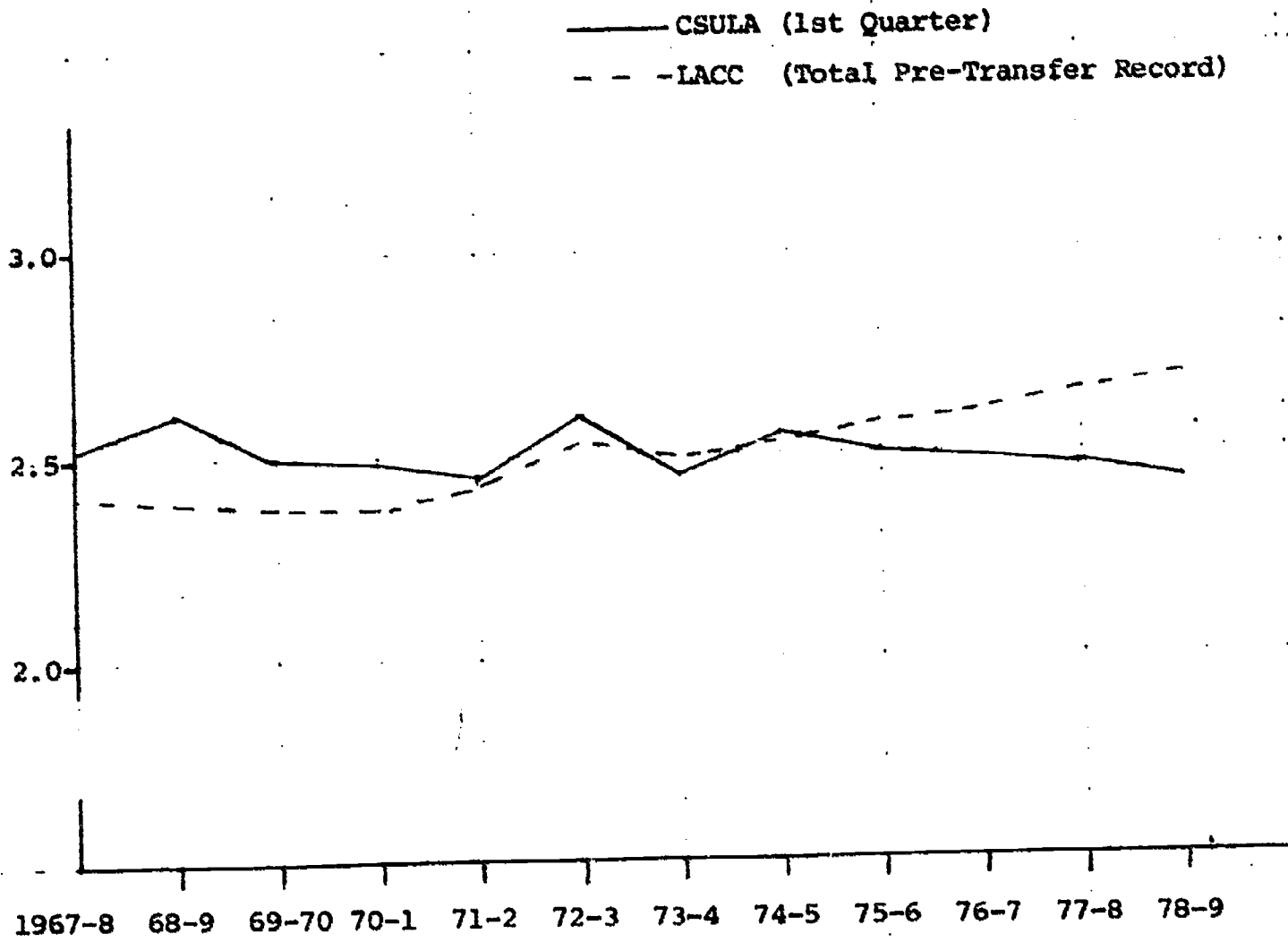
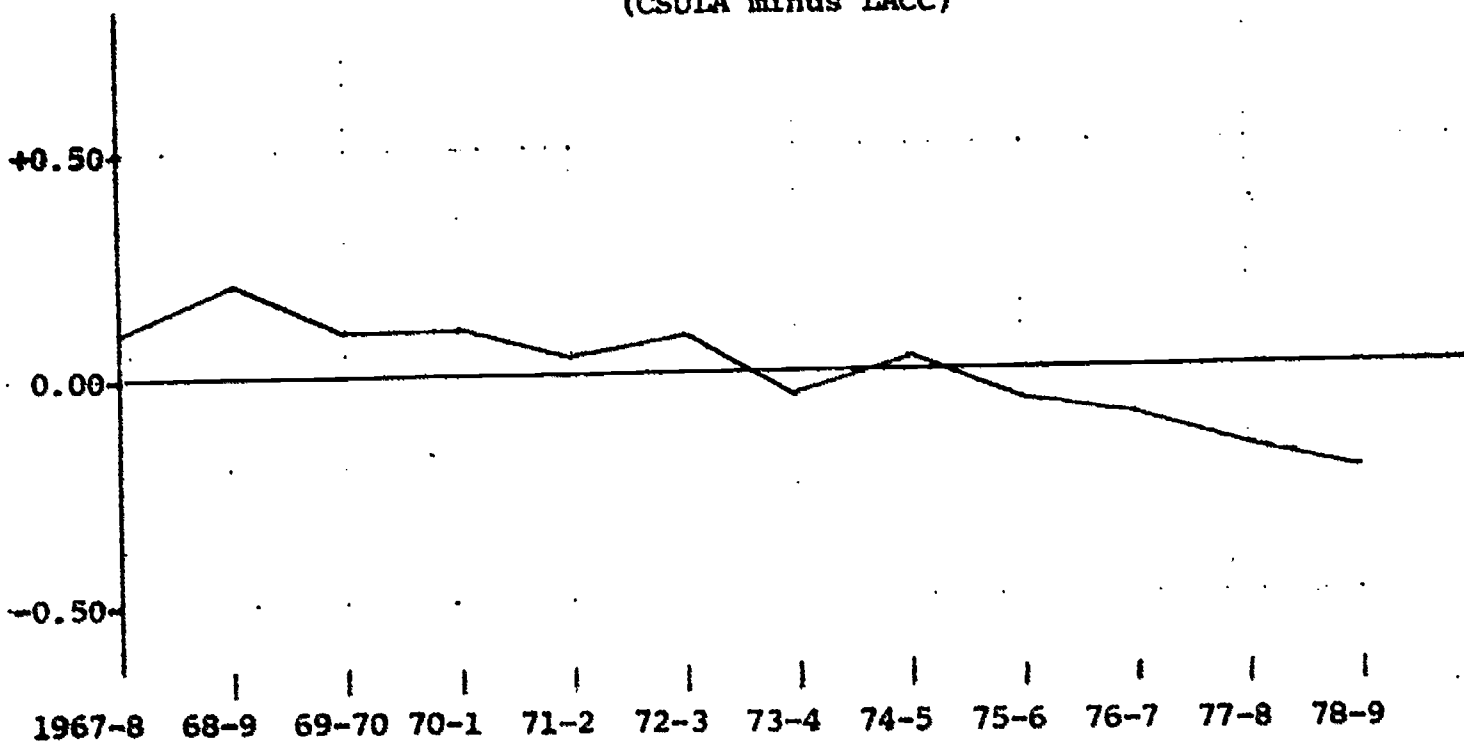
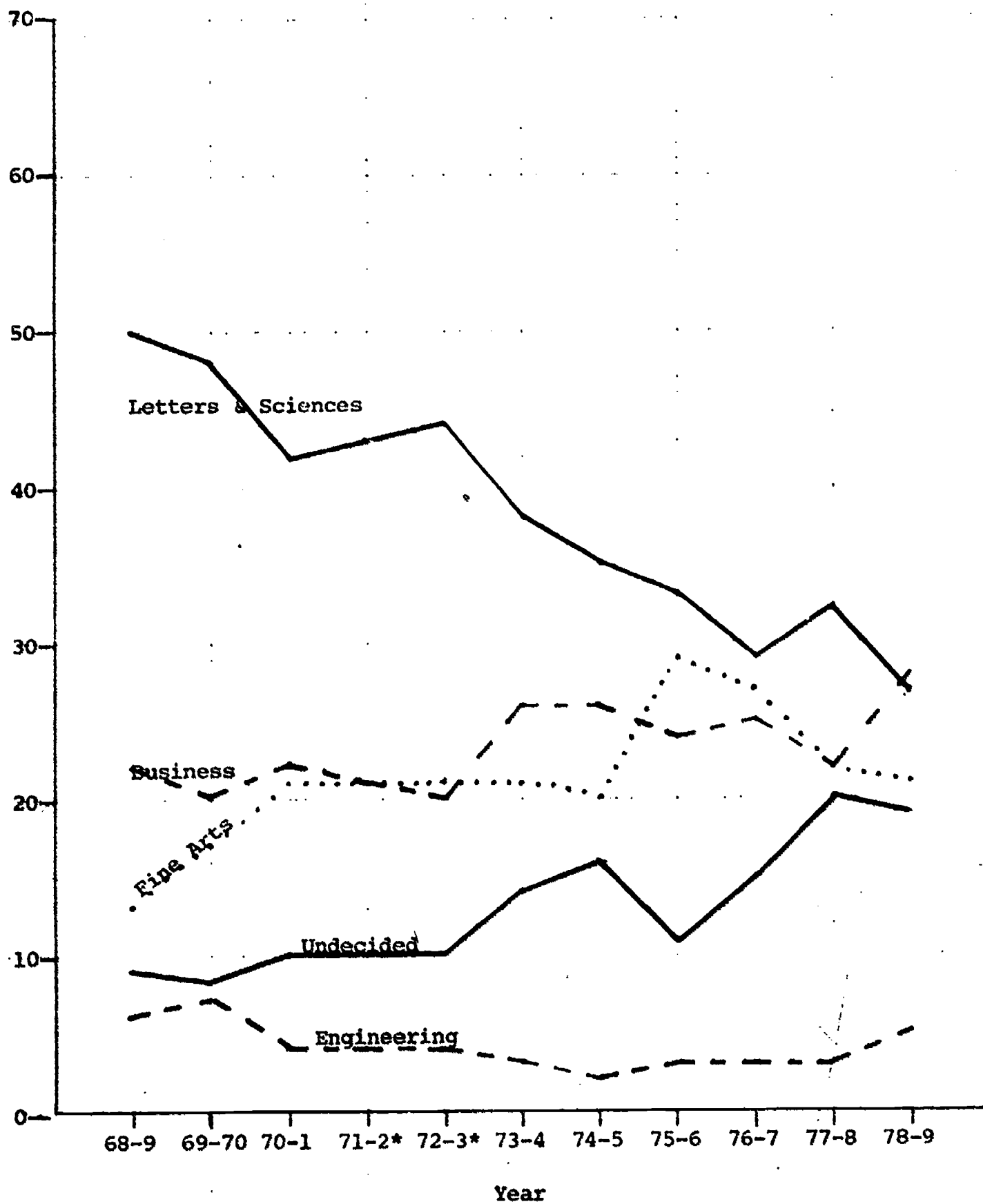


Figure 3 - Differential in GPA's Earned by LACC Transfers to CSULA, 1967-79

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This study summarizes performance of LACC transfers to CSULA during the 1978-79 year. Findings were based on first quarter grade reports for 503 students entering in Fall 1978, Winter 1979, Spring 1979, and Summer 1979.

388 (77%) of the 503 entrants completed some work. Of the 388, 53% entered in the Fall quarter, 14% in Winter, 22% in Spring, and 10% in summer.

First quarter grade point average earned by the 388 entrants was 2.43, 0.24 grade points below their community college average of 2.67. 37% of the students earned a "B" average or better at CSULA, while 21% fell below a "C" average. Females (56% of the total) performed better than males, both at CSULA and LACC.

A total of 1096 grades were earned by the 388 transfers in 47 different departments. 47% of these grades were A's or B's, 9% D's or F's. Highest averages (3.0 or higher) were earned in courses in Pan Afro Studies, Music, P.E., and Spanish. Departments offering the most difficulty (below 2.25) were Physics, Criminal Justice, Business, and Geography.

In comparing numbers of transfers and their academic performance over the past twelve years, significant declines can be noted in both items. The number of transfers who completed work in 1978-79 is less than half that for 1969-70, and is a 30% drop from 1977-78.

Also, the Grade Point Average earned at CSULA by the 1978-79 LACC transfers (2.43) is the lowest in the twelve year period, while the pre-transfer LACC record (2.67) is the highest, thus producing the largest differential performance (-0.24) on record. Students with

majors in Business have consistently experienced the most difficulty over the twelve year period.

Most significant decline is shown by transfers whose major was in the School of Letters and Science. The number of Letters and Science transfers in 1978-79 is less than one-third that of ten years ago.

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
