#### ABSTRACT

This Self Assessment Instrument was prepared to assist school nurses in assessing their own functions and other activities related to the operation of a school health program. Its primary purpose is to provide a ready tool that can be used as the basis of an internal or peer evaluation or to serve as a model for local school districts to follow in developing their own assessment instruments. In addition to its assessment function, it can also be used in program development, in establishing school health priorities, in promoting an understanding of school health, and in determining professional preservice and inservice education needs. Six major goals relating to school nursing and school health services are identified. Specific objectives for meeting these goals are stated and a questionnaire on how each of these objectives are being met is provided. (JD)

#### PREFACE

This Self Assessment Instrument which follows was prepared to assist school nurses to assess their own functions and other activities related to the operation of a school health program. Its primary purpose is to provide a ready tool that can be used as the basis of an internal or peer evaluation or to serve as a model for local districts to follow in developing their own assessment instruments. Used in this way, the instrument could be a valuable part of the Needs Assessment and Action Planning phases of the School Improvement process.

In addition to its assessment function, it is anticipated that it could also be used in program development, in establishing school health priorities, in providing support data for program revisions, in promoting an understanding of school health and in determining professional pre-service and in-service education needs.

Although it was the intent of the Self Assessment Instrument to present more than the minimum essential components of a sound school health program, the writers recognize that it is in no way all inclusive. Therefore, the revision or addition of goals, objectives and indicators is suggested and the development of additional assessment techniques reflecting local priorities and needs is encouraged.
