ABSTRACT

Information about salaries of higher education administrators in the West in 1978-79 is presented. The data came from an annual survey of administrative salaries conducted by the College and University Personnel Association. The 216 institutions from the West, which were part of the national data base, are described by state, type, and source of support. Among the findings are the following: although median salaries of administrators in the West are generally higher than salaries nationally, the differences are small: administrators in public institutions generally receive higher salaries than their counterparts in private institutions: salaries at private institutions in the West are generally lower than median salaries nationwide: median salaries at public institutions are higher at four-year than at two-year colleges and higher at universities than at four-year colleges: and salaries for most positions in the western states of California, Hawaii, Nevada, and Guam tend to be higher than in the northwestern states of Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming. Salary levels are reported at the median, first quartile, and third quartile. Salary data for the nation and descriptions of positions are included. (SW)

Preface

This report provides information about salaries of higher education administrators in the West. While several sources report faculty salaries, there is no published source of western regional data on administrative salaries. The College and University Personnel Association (CUPA), which provided the data in this report, publishes only a national study with very limited attention to regional data. Further, this report groups salary data somewhat differently than the CUPA report, by public and private institutions and for institutions of different sizes and levels. The data here are for the 1978-79 academic year. This report will be updated in the fall of 1980 when new data are available.

This report is the first of a series published by WICHE's Information Clearinghouse in an effort to provide useful information for higher education administrators, governing boards, coordinating boards, legislatures, and executive agencies. We urge the reader to comment on this report; an evaluation form can be found at the conclusion.

Highlights

Although median salaries of administrators in the West are generally higher than salaries nationally, the differences are small (tables 1 and 2).

- Administrators in public institutions generally receive higher salaries than their counterparts in private institutions. This is true in the West and in the nation as a whole (table 1).
- Salaries at private institutions in the West are generally lower than median salaries nationwide (tables 1 and 2).
- Median salaries at public institutions are higher at four-year than at two-year colleges and higher at universities than at four-year colleges (table 4).
- As the size of the institution increases, median administrative. salaries also increase (table 5).
- Breakdowns into subregional groups are important in interstate comparisons. For example, salaries for most positions in the "western states" (California, Hawaii, Nevada, and Guam) tend to be higher than in the "northwestern states" (Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming) (table 6).

The Survey

This report presents 1978-79 data on administrative salaries in higher-education. The data are taken from an annual survey of administrative salaries conducted by the College and University Personnel Association (CUPA). National data on administrative salaries are taken with permission from the CUPA publication, 1978-79 Administrative Compensation Survey, published in March 1979. Administrative salary data for the West were supplied to WICHE by CUPA via a special computer program.

In fall 1978 CUPA sent its survey instrument to 3,173 postsecondary institutions in the United States. It received 1,328 usable responses (a 42 percent response rate), which became the national data base. The data collected by the survey met the following specifications:

- Salaries were those in effect during the fall of 1978.
- Salaries were annualized for full-time service, reflecting only actual cash earnings, excluding any services contributed without charge.
- Enrollment ranges used in the report were for the academic year 1978-79 and are stated in terms of equivalent full-time students.

A copy of the complete survey instrument can be found on pages 114-131 of the 1978-79 Administrative Compensation Survey. The administrative position descriptions used by CUPA are in Appendix C of this report. The user should be aware of the limitations inherent in any form of survey research, which qualify the data that are presented. These include:

- The response rate—the western response rate to the survey was 42 percent (46 percent for the public institutions, 35 percent for the private institutions). In addition, the response rate varied greatly from state to state.
- Other factors -- there is, of course, no control for variables such as length of time in office or job performance, which are major factors in establishing salary levels.

- No information is available on staff benefits. It is essential to consider these benefits in examining the broader question of administrative compensation.
- No trend data are presented. Salary data are presented for one year only. No analysis of change over time could be presented in this report, but this problem will be eliminated in future years as WICHE obtains salary reports on an annual basis.
- Institutional reporting of salary levels varies for each position. In some instances; data were derived from as few as five institutions. The number of cases reported is noted.

The special computer run provided to WICHE compiled data on salary levels for various types of institutions in the thirteen western states that comprise the WICHE Compact. Two-hundred-sixteen institutions from the West were included in the national data base. A summary of these institutions by state, type, and source of support follows.

The Institutions

Table A describes the institutions that responded to the CUPA survey.

Details for both the national and western data bases are shown. Higher education in the West is slightly weighted in the direction of the public sector and toward the two-year college segment, and this is reflected in the data. A breakdown of the western salary data base by state is shown in table B on the following page.

The Data

Tables 1-6 show median salary levels for fifteen common administrative positions. The report uses median salary because unlike the mean, a median, which is the middle case in a list, is not affected by extremely high or low salaries. Thus, half of the salaries are below the median and half of the salaries are above. This is especially important when the number of cases is small—an extremely high salary in a list of five will create a high mean salary.

The fifteen administrative positions were selected on the basis of their commonality to most colleges and universities. The term "cases" used in some tables refers to the number of institutions in the category that reported salary data.

,<u>The Tables</u>

Tables 1-6 were condensed from the complete tables found in the appendices. Appendix A, including tables 7-18, shows the salary levels for administrative positions in colleges and universities in the West.

The appendix tables report salary levels at the median, first quartile, and third quartile. In the same way that the median divides the total list in half, the quartiles divide the two segments in half. Thus, 25 percent of the salaries fall below the first quartile, 50 percent of the salaries fall below the median and 75 percent of the salaries fall below the third quartile (or 25 percent of the salaries occur above the third quartile). The salaries between the first and third quartile compose the interquartile range. This is a valuable measure because it determines a range within which half of the salaries (the middle 50 percent) fall.

Appendix B (tables 19-27) contains salary data for the nation.

(Although tables 25-27 are tables for the subregions within the West, the data are derived from CUPA's national data base and thus are listed here.)

Tables 19-21 and 25-27 present salary information, while tables 22-24 contain a calculation of administrative salaries as a percentage of the chief executive officer's salary. These tables were taken from CUPA's 1978-79

Administrative Compensation Survey. The following matrix indicates the correspondence between summary tables and complete tables for the West and the nation.

1978-79 Administrative Compensation Survey Summary Position Descriptions*

- 1.0 CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF A SYSTEM/DISTRICT/MULTI-CAMPUS OPERATION (PRESIDENT/CHANCELLOR): The principal administrative official responsible for the direction of all operations of an institution or a system of higher education, who reports to a governing board.
- 2.0 CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF A SINGLE INSTITUTION (PRESIDENT/CHANCELLOR): The principal administrative official responsible for the direction of all operations of a campus or an institution of higher education. Reports to a President/Chancellor of a universitywide system or multi-college district.
- 3.0 EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT: The principal administrative official, in lieu of the Chief Executive Officer, responsible for the direction of all operations of an institution of higher education. Reports to the Chief Executive Officer.
- 4.0 CHIEF ACADEMIC OFFICER: The senior administrative official responsible for the direction of the academic program of the institution. Functions typically include teaching, research, extension, admissions, registrar and library activities. Reports to the Chief Executive Officer.
- 5.0 CHIEF PLANNING OFFICER: The senior administrative official responsible for the direction of long-range planning and the allocation of resources. Functions typically include budget planning, institutional research and facilities planning and may also include responsibility for current planning and budgeting, as well as state and federal relations. Reports to the Chief Executive Officer.
- 6.0 CHIEF BUSINESS OFFICER: The senior administrative official responsible for the direction of business and financial affairs. Functions supervised typically include purchasing, physical plant management, property management, auxiliary enterprises, personnel services, investments, accounting and related matters.
- 7.0 CHIEF BUDGETING OFFICER: The senior administrative officer responsible for the current budgetary operations. May also include responsibility for long-range planning unless there is a separate planning officer.

- 8.0 CHIEF DEVELOPMENT OFFICER: The senior administrative official responsible for institutional development programs. Incumbent typically leads the institutional fund-raising and, in the absence of an organizational coequal specifically assigned to the function, public relations, alumni relations and information office activities.
- 9.0 CHIEF PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER: The senior administrative official responsible for public relations programs. Functions typically include public relations, news media relations, legislative relations, alumni relations and information office services.
- 10.0 DIRECTOR, ALUMNI AFFAIRS: Coordinates contacts and services to alumni; develops and maintains alumni mailing lists and mailings; organizes receptions and other special alumni activities.
- 11.0 CHIEF HEALTH PROFESSIONS OFFICER: The senior administrative official with the responsibility for administration of academic health programs, hospitals, clinics, and affiliated health-care programs.
- 12.0 GHIEF STUDENT AFFAIRS OFFICER: The senior administrative official responsible for the direction of extra-curricular student life programs. Functions typically include student counseling and testing, student placement, student union, relationships with student organizations and related functions.
- 13.0 REGISTRAR: The administrative official with principal responsibility for student admissions and records. Functions typically include undergraduate admissions, classroom scheduling, maintenance of student records and related matters.
- 14.0 DIRECTOR, ADMISSIONS: The administrative official with primary responsibility for the admission of undergraduates. May also be responsible for the admission of graduate and professional students, or for scholarship administration or similar functions.
- 15.0 DIRECTOR, STUDENT FINANCIAL AID: Directs the administration of all forms of student aid. Functions typically include assistance in the application for loans or scholarships; administration of private, state or federal loan programs; awarding of scholarships and fellowships; and maintenance of appropriate records.
- 16.0 DIRECTOR, STUDENT PLACEMENT: Directs the operation of a student placement office to provide job placement and counseling services to undergraduates, graduates and alumni. May also be responsible for placement of students on part-time jobs within or outside the institution.
- 17.0 DIRECTOR, STUDENT COUNSELING: Directs the provision of counseling and testing services for students.
- 18.0 DIRECTOR, STUDENT UNION: Directs the operation of a student union building and related student activities. Functions typically include supervision of food service facilities, activities programming, guest rooms, information desk, recreational facilities and arrangements for special functions or activities.




- 19.0 DIRECTOR, STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES: Directs the clinics, medical staff, and other programs that provide institutionally based health services for the student body.
- 20.0 DIRECTOR, STUDENT HOUSING: Directs all residence hall operations for students. May also administer off-campus housing programs.
- 21.0 DIRECTOR, FOOD SERVICES: Administers all institutional food services whether directly managed and operated or catered.
- 22.0 DIRECTOR, PHYSICAL PLANT: The senior administrative official responsible for the construction, rehabilitation and maintenance of physical facilities. Functions typically include supervision of new construction and remodeling, grounds and building maintenace, power plant operation and parking.
- 23. DIRECTOR, PURCHASING: Conducts central purchasing operations for the institution. Functions typically include preparation of specifications, contracting, bidding, receiving and stores, approval of invoices and related matters.
- DIRECTOR, BOOKSTORE: Directs the operation of the campus bookstore, usually under the direction of the Chief Business Officer. Functions typically include purchase and sale of new d used books, supplies and equipment, advertising, employment and supervision of sales staff, maintenance of sales and inventory records, and related matters.
- 25.0 DIRECTOR, CAMPUS SECURITY: Manages campus police and patrol units; directs campus vehicle traffic and parking; organizes security programs and training as needed.
- 26.0 DIRECTOR, LEGAL SERVICES: The principal salaried staff person responsible for advising the institution on its legal rights, obligations or privileges. May act as agent in various transactions or serve as principal contact with other legal counsel. (Do not report unless on institution's payroll.)
- 27.0 DIRECTOR, PERSONNEL/HUMAN RESOURCES: Administers institutional and personnel policies and practices for staff and/or faculty. Functions typically include personnel records, benefits, staff employment, wage and salary administration and, where applicable, labor relations.
 - 28.0 DIRECTOR, AFFIRMATIVE ACTION/EQUAL EMPLOYMENT: The senior administrative official responsible for the universitywide program designed to insure equality of opportunity on an individual basis without giving preference in opportunity to any group.
- 29.0 DIRECTOR, LIBRARY SERVICES: Directs the activities of all institutional libraries. Functions typically include selection and direction of professional staff, acquisitions, technical services, audio-visual services and special collections.
- 30.0 DIRECTOR, COMPUTER CENTER: Directs the institution's major administrative computing activities. Functions typically include computer programming, systems studies and computer operations.



- 31.0 DIRECTOR, INFORMATION SYSTEMS: The senior official who directs the development, implementation and maintenance of institutional management information systems. Functions typically include responsibility for developing systems requirements, systems analysis, programming applications, and coordination with user areas. May also include responsibility for director of the administrative computer operations.
- 32.0 DIRECTOR, INFORMATION OFFICE: Directs the provision of information about the institution to students, faculty and the public. Functions typically include news media relations, preparation of review of news releases and photographs, and preparation and distribution of newsletters, magazines and other publications.
- 33.0 DIRECTOR, COMMUNITY SERVICES: Directs or coordinates the conduct of special (usually noncredit) educational, cultural and recreational services to the community.
- 34.0 DIRECTOR, INSTITUTIONAL RESEARCH: The administrative staff official responsible for the conduct of research and studies on the institution itself. Functions performed or supervised typically include data collection, analysis, reporting, and related staff work in support of decision making.
- 35.0 COMPTROLLER: Directs accounting, payroll, cashiering and related functions. May also have responsiblity for office services, such as mail and telephone.
- 36.0 DIRECTOR, ATHLETICS: Directs intramural and intercollegiate athletic programs. Functions typically include scheduling and contracting for athletic events, employment and direction of athletic coaches, publicity, ticket sales, and equipment and facilities maintenance.
- DEAN or Equivalent Administrative Title (e.g., directors of academic divisions in community colleges): Serves as the principal administrator of the instructional division indicated (i.e., Architecture, Agriculture, Nursing, etc.).
