ABSTRACT

Data are presented on a series of tables summarizing enrollment trends and the personal characteristics of the 19,359 regular students enrolled in credit programs at the Hawaii community colleges during Fall 1980. The tables cover: (1) headcount enrollment in regular credit and special programs: (2) headcount enrollment by campus for the years 1970 through 1980; (3) selected student characteristics (i.e., sex, educational objective, major, attendance status, semester hours taken, residence, tuition status, age, citizenship, marital status, and registration status); and (4) student profiles in terms of these characteristics for 1976 through 1980. The data provided indicate, among other findings, that the regularly enrolled students constituted 73% of the total Fall 1980 enrollment at the colleges. Approximately 50% of the students were female, and 51% were enrolled on a part-time basis. The average semester hours attempted by all students was 9.8, as compared to 10.0 in Fall 1979. Demographic data reveal that the median age of the students was 25.1 years, that 90% of the students were United States citizens, and that 79% were unmarried. Liberal arts majors comprised 43% of the enrollments, while vocational education majors made up another 45%. Programs showing satisfantial enrollment increases from Fall 1979 included computer science, human services, and industrial education. (JF)

FALL ENROLLMENT REPORT UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII, COMMUNITY COLLEGES FALL 1980

This is a brief report summarizing data on students in the community colleges for the current semester*. Included are data on enrollment trends as well as selected personal and academic characteristics of students. Such data have been found to be extremely helpful in describing and understanding the nature of the clientele served, in assessing and planning programs, as well as in responding to inquiries from various governmental and other agencies.


The primary emphasis of this report is on regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs. Data on other students served, largely in non-credit programs such as apprentices, Senior Citizens Center, etc., are limited to registration counts.

Sources of Data

Except for Table 1, the information cited in this report was extracted from the Student Enrollment Reports (SER) as of October 8, 1980. The basic data are derived from student applications, personal history forms, and student class registrations.

Highlights

- A. Registrations in various community college offerings number 26,445 this fall (Table 1). Of these:
 - 1. 19,359, 73 percent, are regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs of the community colleges.
 - 2. 113, less than 1 percent, are early admittees or concurrent registrants enrolled in credit programs.
 - 3. 1,778, 7 percent, are registered in non-credit apprenticeship/journeyworkers program.
 - 4. 5,195, 20 percent, are registered in special offerings such as those presented at the Kalihi-Palama Education Center.
- B. Data on the 19,359 regular (classified and unclassified) students (Tables 2, 3, 4) in the credit programs show the following:
 - 1. This fall's enrollment of 19,359 students is the highest recorded for the community colleges.
 - 2. The enrollment shows an increase of approximately 300, 2 percent, over last fall.
 - ... This is the forcentage increase in four mears.
 - ... As expected. -rollment changes, by cames valid: from -3 to +7 percent.

Enrollment increased by 7 percent at Kapiolani, 1 percent at Leeward and 3 percent at Maui Community College. (The enrollment increase at Leeward reverses the declining enrollment pattern of the past four years.)

- 3. Certain trends are continuing in terms of student characteristics.
 - ... There are more women (numerically and proportionately) than in previous years.

Women students this fall number 9,765 (50 percent) compared to 9,420 (49 percent) last fall and 8,631, 45 percent, in Fall 1976. Noteworthy is that the enrollment increases at Kapiolani, Leeward and Maui community colleges can be attributable to increases in the number of women students.

... There are more part-time students (numerically and proportionately) than in previous years.

Part-time students this fall number 9,858, 51 percent, compared to 9,607, 50 percent, last fall and 42 percent in Fall 1976.

...FTE:HEADCOUNT ratios are declining.

The ratio of FTE students to headcount enrollment is .65 (as in Fall 1979), considerably less than the .71 indicated for Fall 1976.

... Students are taking lighter credit loads.

The average semester hours by all students (full- and part-time students) this fall is 9.8 compared t. 10.0 last fall.

- 4. There appears to be little change in the nature of the students attending the community colleges in terms of the following characteristics:
 - ...U.S. citizens, students with Hawaii permanent home addresses and Hawaii resident tuition status continue to comprise over 90 percent of the students.
 - ...Half or more of the students are "continuing" students, i.e., were on campus the previous semester; three-tenths are "first-time college" students.
 - ... The great bulk--79 percent--are unmarried.
 - ... Mean and median ages of students differ only slightly for Fall 1979 and Fall 1980 enrollees.

The median and mean ages for the current semester are 21.0 and 25.1, respectively. (Last fall, the ages were 20.9 and 25.0,)



- 5. A brief analysis of the distribution of students, by majors, shows that:
 - ...Liberal Arts majors comprised 43 percent of the enrollment last fall, 42 percent, this fall. (There were 130, 2 percent, fewer liberal arts majors throughout the community colleges.)
 - ... Vocational education majors comprised 45 percent of the enrollment last fall, 44 percent, this fall. (Numerically, however, there was no change.)
 - ...Unclassified students comprised 12 percent of the enrollment last fall, 14 percent, this fall. (There were 426, 19 percent, more unclassified students throughout the community colleges.)
 - ...An examination of the data on majors (Appendix A) shows substantial changes (±15% with at least a difference of 10 students) in several programs.

Programs showing substantial increases: computer science, human services, industrial education, recreational instructor, drafting technology, electricity, and electronics technology.

Programs showing substantial decreases: business, medical lab technology, commercial baking, fire science, police science, agriculture, applied trades, carpentry, and refrigeration and air conditioning.

Summary

The enrollment of 19,359 is the highest recorded for the community colleges. It shows a 2 percent increase over last fall's enrollment. Noteworthy is that this is the first percentage increase in four years.

The data on two student characteristics are consistent with the findings reported nationally: (1) the number of women continue to increase; (2) a greater proportion of the students are part-time students. Noteworthy is that there seems to be a stabilization of students in the older age groups.

What are the implications of the data for planning?
