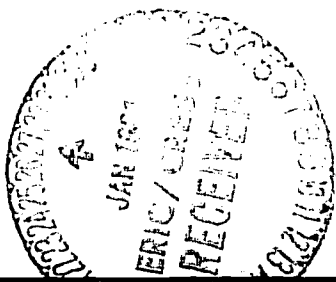

## ABSTRACT

Prepared to assist teachers in the planning and implementation of outdoor field trips as types of learning experiences in the State of Hawaii, this book is arranged by island and by day trips and overnight trips within each island. A brief introduction to each island gives general background information, and a table enables teachers to quickly obtain decision-making information about each site on that island. Details provided in the individual site sheets include: location, grade level, contact person, days and hours, activities available, resources, restrictions, special requirements, emergency facilities, and fees. Three appendices supply information applicable to more than one site. Appendix A provides ground transportation information; Appendix B lists resource agencies and persons; and Appendix C consists of a safety check list for field trips. (CM)

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

## I N T R O D U C T I O N

This guide has been prepared to assist teachers in the planning and implementation of outdoor field trips as types of learning experiences that help young persons learn more dynamically through first-hand observation and experience with the natural environment.

The objective of the Outdoor Education program, including camping, is to provide students with first-hand, real-life experiences in natural surroundings, using all of their senses in learning about their environment and their relationship with the ecosystems therein. Further, camping provides experiences in group living which help develop skills in cooperating and working together toward common goals.

As is common to all off-campus activities, it is necessary for the teacher to obtain trip-participation permission slips from each student's parents. Safety rules for all trips are presented in Appendix C so are not listed here. It is urged, however, that each teacher considering an outdoor-education field trip study Appendix C thoroughly and include the recommendations there in planning any trip. For more detailed information in planning camping and field trips, teachers should refer to the document, *Educational Field Trips in Hawaii*.

The contents of this book are arranged by island--and within each island, by day trips and overnight trips. A brief introduction to each island gives general background, and a table is presented so that the teacher can scan quickly and obtain decision-making information on each site on that island. More details are provided in the individual site sheets that follow. Three appendixes supply information applicable to more than one site--Appendix A on Ground Transportation; Appendix B on Resource Agencies and Persons; and Appendix C on a Safety Check List for Field Trips.

This document is a start on what is hoped to be a more comprehensive book that will be developed from supplementary input provided by teachers as a result of using the present information. It is urged that each teacher evaluate the usefulness of the book as it stands and offer constructive suggestions for improving it in the next revision. The loose-leaf format was selected because it makes possible the modification of any site sheet and the addition of new site sheets and possibly more supplementary material.

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## T H E I S L A N D O F H A W A I I

The Big Island of Hawaii is indeed properly named--it is the largest of the 122 islands that make up the State of Hawaii. Its 4038 square miles offer exploration opportunities to students not found elsewhere in the entire state. Of the five volcanoes that formed the island, two remain active today--Mauna Loa and Kilauea still sporadically spew lava in easily accessible areas.

A slow drive along the coasts to the northeast presents an entirely different view of the island. Waterfalls plunge to the ocean from majestic cliffs beside the highway. Lush foliage of both native and introduced plants provides color contrasting vividly with continuously varying shades of blue of the offshore waters.

The beaches are unique. They offer black, white, and green sands on which to relax or from which to explore the numerous tidepools, which abound with countless varieties of marine flora and fauna.

Deserts are also a unique feature to the Big Island. In many of these dry areas, reminders of Hawaii's past are found intact. Petroglyph fields, walls, and massive stone ruins provide clues to long-gone culture.

Perhaps the best feature of the island is its size. Just by driving around the island one can experience its many diverse features, micro-climates, and environments.

## THE ISLAND OF KAUAI

The Garden Island of Kauai, as its name implies, is a lush, verdant land on which both endemic and exotic flora and fauna flourish. In many instances, the endemic specimens are unique not only to the island but to a very limited micro-environment on that island.

Some of the most varied microclimates in the world exist in close proximity on Kauai. For example, 5,243-foot Mt. Waialeale is the wettest known spot on earth, with an average of more than 486 inches of rain per year. And it is only about 18 miles from desert-like Barking Sands, which averages less than 20 inches of rain a year. Between the two extremes lies Alakai Swamp, on the high Kokee Plateau. Torrential rainwater pouring off Mt. Waialeale to find its way to the sea carved out the spectacular Grand Canyon of the Pacific, Waimea Canyon, and still drops in high waterfalls from sheer cliffs into valleys and the ocean.

As the oldest island of the chain of presently inhabited island forming the State, Kauai is the most weathered and therefore has the most extensive beaches. Seashore expeditions can thus offer fascinating marine studies, tidepool explorations, and beach investigations, as well as good swimming and fishing.

Characteristically, five of the eight day trips feature plantlife--in some, introduced crop plants such as sugarcane and pineapple are subjected to tests and experiments for economic value. In others, specimens of endemic flora are carefully nurtured to display these rare and fragile plants, which would otherwise not be seen by the public because their natural habitat is so difficult of access. The island also retains some of the few remaining native-forest enclaves in the State.

With these outstanding natural features, Kauai is a rich source of outdoor-education sites, and students can absorb a wealth of natural history as a basis for beginning to grasp the impact of man and his actions on his environment.

## T H E I S L A N D O F M A U I

The Valley Isle has much in common with each of its neighbor islands, yet contains many unique features worth exploring.

Maui is a panorama of geological, historical, and cultural sites that bring to life what may be only so many vapid words in a student's textbook. A drive up Haleakala vividly demonstrates the effects of change in altitude, dryness and moisture, and wind patterns on flora and fauna, in addition to climaxing in the spectacular vista of that vast dormant crater.

The drive around the Kanae peninsula and into Hana is one of the most impressive ways of seeing that facet of the island. On the coast of West Maui, Lahaina, onetime whaling capitol of the Pacific, has done a splendid job of preserving its historic atmosphere and landmarks of the past. Central Maui, the most populated part of the island, contains Iao Valley, the site of Kamehameha's famous battle that united the islands.

Among these landmarks lie some of the last remnants of old plantation camps, some ancient areas of surfing and fishing, some magnificent vistas, and some areas showing the microenvironments and the impact of man on those environments.

The various excursion and camp sites listed in this section offer educational experiences that span many academic disciplines and all ages. Maui invites you to come and learn why residents and visitors alike say, "Maui No Ka Oi."

## THE ISLAND OF MOLOKAI

The Friendly Island of Molokai is a long, narrow land extending almost due east-west, directly east of Honolulu, across about 14 miles of one of the roughest ocean channels in the world. The island was formed by two major volcanoes, one at the east, the other at the west end of the island. The peninsula called Kalaupapa was created by a third, smaller volcano, which poured a tongue of molten lava into the ocean off the north edge of the island. All three volcanoes are now extinct.

Almost the entire north shore of the island is formed of sheer cliffs, a few heavily vegetated, essentially impenetrable valleys, and hundreds of Hawaii's unique "hanging" valleys, from which fall a wonderland of high, incredibly fine, misty waterfalls that drain the tradewinds-drenched highlands behind the cliffs.

At the east end of the island is Halawa Valley, relatively easy to get into, and highly rewarding in the variety of resources for outdoor education--ancient taro plantations, in some of which taro still grows; remnants of old Hawaiian stone walls and other archaeological ruins; twin high waterfalls at the head of the valley, both pouring tremendous quantities of water from the inland mountains to crash into the twin pools at the foot of the cliff, creating exhilaratingly cold, frothy swimming holes at the end of the 3- to 4-mile trail from the valley's mouth.

Unique to Molokai is the series of Hawaiian fishpond walls that scallop almost the entire length of the south shoreline of the island. Although other islands had a few of these structures, Molokai's south shore apparently had repeated ideal configurations of which the Hawaiians took advantage most ingeniously to develop a highly sophisticated aquaculture. Hundreds of years ago they built immense submerged seawalls for trapping fish on an incoming tide. Many of these massive walls are still visible underwater, and the seaward shapes of the ponds can be determined, reminding us that the sea was a primary source of food to the ancient Hawaiians.

The protruding tongue of Kalaupapa from the north-shore cliffs, with its tragic history of leprosy victims, is also interesting geologically. It can be reached only by a steep, twisting trail down the nearly sheer face of the cliffs above it--usually traversed by mule trains, although it can be hiked--or by aircraft.

Molokai has no real harbor, therefore had no particular association with the whaling industry, as Maui had. And its coastline was adapted for purposes other than swimming. Nevertheless, Molokai too has its unique features, its share of variety and beauty, and great value as an island of interesting outdoor-education field sites.

## THE ISLAND OF OAHU

The travel brochure phrase for Oahu, "A unique island with a great variety of wonderful places to visit," is taken very seriously by environmentalists and other scientists familiar with natural history around the world. This island possesses--in land forms alone--outstanding volcanic craters; spectacular cliffs above which hang-gliders have set world records; road cuts revealing masses of volcanic dikes thrust upward; hillsides composed of giant volcanic-mud flows and other hills of volcanic ash with fossils; many kinds of rocky shorelines, some with unusual wave-sculptured beach rock; emerged reefs with easily found fossil seashells; muddy seashores at which seabirds are reliably available for birdwatching; easily accessible, verdant mountain terrain from which gorgeous vistas unfold; semi-wilderness drylands bordering isolated shorelines for those who prefer escape into nature; tropical rainforests offering similar retreat; beautiful bays and reef flats, some ideal for tidepooling; a giant sea cave, and smaller caves with petroglyphs; a fountaining blowhole; plus many other natural areas of scenic splendor.

In addition, numerous events of our colorful Hawaiian history have occurred at many other sites convenient to visit, such as the USS Arizona Memorial and the Iolani Palace grounds. Modern attractions include the Polynesian Cultural Center, Sea Life Park, Paradise Park, and many other stimulating places to visit.

Many of these ideal sites for field-tripping are close enough to each other that a teacher can easily arrange a schedule with great variety within a single day. For instance, an early morning visit to the Waikiki Aquarium, which provides an interesting lecture and fascinating visual experience for youngsters, can be followed by a nature walk along Diamond Head Beach, which involves about an hour's physical activity, allowing a release of pent-up energy. Or a field trip can start at the Diamond Head Beach Park, which also includes handling of tidepool creatures, and terminate with a visit to the Kuliouou Beach Park/Paiko Lagoon area, where the students can take the rare opportunity to study seabirds, or simply play on the playground swings and grassy fields there. Some large field-trip sites--such as Kualoa Beach Park, Camp Harold Erdman, or the new Girl Scout Camp at Poamoho--offer programs with a variety of activities.

In terms of an interesting variety of places to visit, therefore, and the convenience possible for seeing them, Oahu is probably unmatched anywhere else in the world--the island is a field-tripper's delight.

## APPENDIX C. SAFETY CHECK LIST FOR FIELD TRIPS

### Preliminary Planning

1. Pre-survey the field-trip site and route at least once before taking students to the site, noting any historical sites, geological formations, interesting plants, and other items of interest.
2. Pre-scout emergency facilities--nearest telephone, availability of lifeguard or other assisting personnel at site, emergency telephone numbers, medical facilities.
3. Always carry a well-stocked first-aid kit; check it for completeness a day or two before the trip and replenish any necessary items, including sunburn prevention cream or lotion.
4. A few days before the trip, invite help from parents and/or other concerned adults for the field trip; their mere presence will have a significant dampening effect on any proclivities of the students toward over-exuberance and provide added aid in an emergency.
5. Recommend the type of clothing suitable for the expedition--normally light cotton clothing for one-day field trips.
6. Require the students to wear appropriate footgear (as indicated on most site sheets); tennis or deck shoes with good tread are usually satisfactory.
7. A few days before the trip alert the students of the danger of sunburn if extensive time in direct sunlight is involved, and urge them to use sunburn preventive.
8. Train the students a few days ahead of the trip as to what to do in the event any of them is separated from the group during a field trip--person to contact and how to contact him, safest route of return, etc.

### The Day of the Trip

1. Introduce all of the responsible adults along, including the bus driver if chartered bus is used, to the students, and offer your cooperation in following all safety rules on the bus, such as preventing students from putting hands out of windows, etc.
2. Alert the students of the time availability of restrooms, drinking water, and food.
3. Remove any valuables from buses, vans, and/or cars parked at unguarded areas on your trip, and always lock the vehicle(s).
4. Make a frequent head count of the students, particularly during a departure from any stopping point.
5. Use the "buddy" system so that the students are aware of each other's presence during the entire trip; these "buddies" should sit together on the bus. This tactic should facilitate the head count also.

Walking and Hiking

1. Avoid walking students on a road with traffic; students should be taught to stay out of streets and away from moving vehicles.
2. Gather students at traffic intersections and pause before crossing; the teacher should determine the safest time to cross.
3. Establish "ground rules" and enforce them:
  - a. Not to throw rocks, break branches on plants, or otherwise abuse natural features
  - b. Not to tease or otherwise provoke dogs when walking past private residences
  - c. Not to disturb trail markings, such as piles of ti leaves, piles of white reef rock used on night trails, or colored ribbons tied to trees.
  - d. Not to hold on to plants as supports when climbing up or moving down slopes
  - e. To crouch or sit when moving down a steep slope, and not be reluctant to use their hands as brakes
  - f. To maintain a safe distance from the edge of any cliff or steep slope, either standing or walking
  - g. Not to eat any part of any plant--the poisonous ones do not look any more dangerous than the safe ones.
4. Check the stability of terrain when hiking along a cliff or over steep slopes, particularly in areas of crumbly volcanic tuff on the slopes of Diamond Head, Hanauma Bay, etc.

Seashore Exploration

1. The best time for exploring the seashore is just before low tide, preferably a minus tide, and when surf is not strong. The teacher should double-check this situation, since by far the greatest danger at the seashore is from wave action.
2. Start the exploration at the farthest point from the bus that you plan to study--walk/hike to that point steadily, without stopping to admire or explore, and work your way back toward the vehicle, exploring only on the return trip.
3. On a sandy beach, check that no large waves have struck recently by observing how smooth the sand is high up on the beach; a lifeguard can help in this regard.
4. Train students to observe the ancient Hawaiian rules of staying off wet rock and of not turning their backs on areas of splashing waves.
5. If it is necessary to walk over wet rock, train the students to avoid seaweed, which is very slippery, to keep their bodies low and be ready to slip, and to have at least one hand free ready to brace or catch themselves if they do slip.
6. When examining fish that have been recently caught by a fisherman (or by a student), be sure that the students do not touch surgeonfish or rockfish, which have dangerous spines.

7. When looking under rocks or exploring tidepools, train students always to be able to see their fingers, and to be able to recognize cone shells, fireworms, eels, sea urchins, Portuguese Man-of-War, and any other poisonous sea creature that you know of. If a student is bitten or stung, immediately apply first aid and then contact a physician for further advice and/or treatment.
8. If swimming is to be allowed, be sure that a lifeguard is on hand and is aware of the group's use of the water.
9. If the students are allowed to fish, the teacher should be knowledgeable as to the types of fish that might be caught in the area and have equipment (pails, buckets) for transporting the catch.
