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In 1978-79 the USOE Steering Committee for Basic Skills Coordination* engaged in an earnest study of the problems of coordination across educational programs for children, pouth, and adults which are assisted by Federal, State, and local funds and legislation. One problem at the Federal level that stands out is the complexity of the Federal legislation under which the programs operate. Each piece of Federal education legislation has been framed to meet specific national needs. Yet that same legislation in many instances mandates coordination across programs. The question has been: How do we maintain the integrity of each program and yet accomplish needed coordination?

As a first step in developing a defensible and practical approach to coordination, the Compatison of Legislation Concerned with Basic Skills was undertaken. The method of developing the comparison was as follows:

- 1. The legislative authority for each program was collected for FY 1980. In cases where the authorization ceased in 1979, the current legislation was studied.
- 2. Steering Committee reports were studied to ascertain the kinds of information about the laws that are needed by educational decision-makers. One bundred and twenty-one variables or kinds of information seemed to be needed.
- 3. Each law was exhaustively studied for each variable.
- 4. The completed comparison was sent to the programs responsible for administering the laws for verification and completion. (Some programs were able to provide more information than others.)

HOW TO USE

This comparison of legislation is meant as a tool for coordination. It is important to nethat the Regulations have not yet been compared. This comparison is solely of the legislatic
