#### ABSTRACT

Thirty-six tables provide detailed information about educational and socioeconomic characteristics of students nationwide. The data show, among other things, that overall enrollment is down from 1970, especially at the kindergarten and elementary school level. College attendance is up, though, as more women and people over 25 enroll. This is especially true for two-year colleges, where enrollment growth since 1974 has resulted entirely from increased enrollment of women. The probability of college enrollment remains dependent on family income; high school graduates aged 18 to 24 from high-income families are much more likely to attend college than those from low-income families. The socioeconomic characteristics covered include age, sex, race or ethnic group, residence in metropolitan or nonmetropolitan areas, marital status, family income, and membership in the labor force. The educational characteristics considered comprise enrollment at all educational levels (from preschool through higher education), educational attainment, public or private control of the institution, full- or part-time enrollment, and two-year and four-year college attendance. Appendices extend the data back in time, as far as 1947 for some characteristics, and project college enrollment forward to 1990. (Author/RW)

# School Enrollment—Social and Economic Characteristics of Students: October 1979

## HIGHLIGHTS

- In October 1979, 57.9 million persons 3 to 34 years old were enrolled in school, about 2.5 million less than in 1970, reflecting the decline in the elementary and high school-age population.
- About the same number of men and women under 35 years old were enrolled in college in 1979 (5 million of each), while the number of women 35 years old and over who were enrolled (914,000) was almost twice the number of men (487,000). The majority of students 35 years old and over were enrolled part time.
- In October 1979, college students 25 years old and over constituted 36 percent of all students, 3 percentage points above the figure in 1974.
- The number of women 25 years old and over enrolled in college in 1979 increased by 62 percent since 1974, while the number of men enrolled did not change.
- The growth in 2-year college enrollment among 14- to 34-year-olds was the result of a substantial rise in attendance among women; from 1974 to 1979, the the number of 14- to 34-year-olds enrolled in 2-year colleges rose by 300,000, while the number of 14- to 34-year-old women enrolled in 2-year colleges increased by 400,000.
- For 14- to 34-year old undergraduates, about 31 percent of women and 27 percent of men were attending junior and community colleges in 1979.
- The probability of college enrollment-tended to increase with income. Among high school graduates under 25 years old in families with incomes of \$25,000 or more, 54 percent were enrolled as compared with 31 percent of those in families with incomes of less than \$10,000.

# INTRODUCTION

There were substantial changes in school enrollment from October 1974 to October 1979 that involved all levels of education and reflected changes in both population size and enrollment patterns. The total number of persons 3 to 34 years old enrolled in school was about 57.9 million in October 1979, about 2 million less than the number enrolled 5 years earlier (table A). From 1974 to 1979, enrollment in kindergarten and elementary school declined, while enrollment in nursery school and college rose; total high school enrollment in 1979 was not significantly different from enrollment in 1974.

In 1979, 1.9 million students were enrolled in nursery school, 262,000 more students than in 1974 and 773,000 more students than in 1970. Changes in nursery school enrollment were due to the increased enrollment rate of 3-and 4-year-olds in spite of the decrease in the number of children in the age group. The increase in this enrollment may have occurred because more mothers entered the labor force, pursued college careers, or participated in other activities outside the home.

Elementary school enrollment, however, experienced a decline of about 3.3 million students between 1974 and 1979, representing a drop of 10 percent. Changes that occurred in enrollment at the elementary level between 1974 and 1979 were similar for males and females and were caused by a decrease in the eligible population.

College-enrollment increased by 13 percent from 1974 to 1979, and the increase was due largely to the increased enrollment of women. Table A shows that in 1979, 5 million men and 5 million women 14 to 34 years old were enrolled in college. While there was not a significant change from 1974 in the number of men enrolled, there was an increase of about 1.1 million women (28 percent). This rise occurred at both the undergraduate and graduate levels as well as for women 14 to 24 and 25 to 34 years of age.

Table B shows that in 1979, about 500,000 men and 900,000 women 35 and over were enrolled in college. This represents an increase of 400,000 women since 1974 but no change for men.

# **ENROLLMENT IN 2- AND 4-YEAR COLLEGES**

In October 1979, there were about equal numbers of men and women 14 to 34 years old enrolled in college as undergraduates; 5 years earlier, there were 8 women for every 10 men. While the number of women enrolled rose by about one-fourth between 1974 and 1979, there was no significant change for men. Undergraduate enrollment in 4-year colleges increased by 650,000 between 1974 and 1979, largely because of the increased in enrollment of women. Almost one-half of the increase in female college enrollment occurred in 2-year colleges. In 1979, the number of women 14 to 34 years old enrolled in 2-year colleges surpassed the number of men enrolled by about 200,000, while enrollment of men and women in the first and second year of 4-year colleges was not significantly different (table C).

During the 1974-79 period, enrollment of 14 to 34-year-olds in 2-year colleges grew by about 336,000. This growth was the result of a substantial rise in attendance among women, especially in the number of women attending college on a part-time basis. Between 1974 and 1979, part-

time enrollment of women in 2-year colleges rose by 250,000. Students in 2-year colleges were much more likely than those in 4-year colleges to be attending part time. In 1979, almost one-half of all women in 2-year colleges attended part time, while only about 1 in 6 students in 4-year colleges attended part time, regardless of gender.

# COLLEGE ENROLLMENT OF NONTRADITIONAL-AGE STUDENTS

ntal college enrollment increased by 16 percent, from 9.9 million to 11.4 million, between 1974 and 1979. About one-half (56 percent) of this increase was in the number of students beyond the traditional age of college students: 31 percent was in the number of students aged 25 to 34 and 25 percent was in the number aged 35 and over (table 8). Although there was some evidence of change in the relative size of these two groups of college students, it was not appreciable. In both 1974 and 1979, about 23 percent of all college students were 25 to 34 years old, while the proportion 35 years and over rose from 10 to 12 percent.

Since 1974, enrollment of persons 25 and over has increased substantially. This increase (about 26 percent) is due to both an increase in the eligible population and an increase in the enrollment rate. The enrollment increase of persons over 34 was proportionately greater than the increase for those 25 to 34, although both groups had significant gains. Enrollment of younger students increased by 10 percent from 1974 to 1979.

Women 25 and over have experienced particularly large increases in college enrollment. The number of women 25 to 34 years old enrolled in college rose by 59 percent from 1974 to 1979, while the number of men enrolled was about the same in 1974 and 1979. The total number of women 25 to 34 years old enrolled in college in 1979 was about equal to the number of men of the same age who were enrolled, about 1.3 million. The number of women 35 years old and over enrolled in college rose by 67 percent between 1974 and 1979, while the number of men enrolled was essentially unchanged (table 8).

In 1979, the largest proportion of students 25 to 34 years old were attending graduate school (43 percent) and the majority of students, both undergraduates and graduates, were enrolled part time (about two-thirds). In this age group, women were more likely than men to be starting their college education: 21 percent of all female students were enrolled as first year students as compared with only 12 percent of the men (table 15).

As in 1974, about one-fourth of students 25 to 34 years old enrolled in college in 1979 were attending junior and community colleges. In both years, about the same proportion of students aged 14 to 24 (about one-fourth) were attending 2-year colleges. In 1979, women 25 to 34 years old were more likely to be enrolled in 2-year colleges than men (28 percent and 21 percent, respectively), while in 19<sup>-7</sup>4, there were no differences in the proportion of men and women enrolled in 2-year colleges. Part time attendance was more common than full-time attendance among older students in 2-year colleges, and in 1979, women were more likely than men to be attending part time (78 percent and 65 percent, respectively).

Some changes in the characteristics of students 25 to 34 years old have been noted in the 1974-79 period (table B). For example, a smaller proportion of students were married and living with their spouse in 1979 than in 1974. In 1979, about 58 percent of male students as compared with 50 percent of female students were married and living with their spouse. Among nonstudents of the same age, a higher proportion of women than men were married with their spouse present (72 percent and 70 percent, respectively).

Women 35 years old and over enrolled in college were substantially more likely than those not enrolled to be in the labor force (69 percent and 43 percent, respectively)

(table 17). About 88 percent of male college students 35 years old and over were also in the labor force, compared with 72 percent of nonstudents. Although a smaller proportion of women than men were in the labor force, a substantially larger number of women than men were in the labor force and attending school.

In 1979, about 90 percent of college students 35 years old and over were White—comparable to the proportion in the total population. Students who were Black or of other races were more likely than White students to be enrolled in college full time (28 percent and 15 percent, respectively) (table 17). As in the total population, about three-fourths of all college students 35 years old and over were married and living with their spouse.

Implications of the new higher enrollment rates. Among persons 25 and older, enrollment rates may remain high.

With the increased need for production and social services, coupled with intense job competition, persons may return to school at a later age to update their knowledge in rapidly advancing fields, learn a new trade, or earn an advanced degree which will give them a competitive advantage in the labor market.

As the following simplified projection illustrates, it is possible that the expected decline in college enrollment among younger persons during the 1980's (due to a drop in the size of the young adult population) may be largely offset by an increased enrollment of older persons. If the enrollment rate of persons 25 years old and over remains at its present level, the number enrolled will increase, because the population 25 and over will grow.<sup>2</sup> The first cohort

of the post World War II baby boom was 32 years old in 1979 while the largest cohort was 18 years of age. Applying 1979 age-specific college enrollment rates to the projected 1990 population 14 to 64 years old,<sup>3</sup> there would be an increase of about 939,000 college students 25 to 64 years old and a decrease of 803,000 students 14 to 24 years old. In 1990, older students would constitute 43 percent of all students, compared with 36 percent in 1979.

Since older students are more likely to attend college part time (72 percent of older students and 17 percent of younger students attend part time), they will replace a smaller proportion of younger students, in terms of full-time equivalent enrollment, than their numbers imply. At present, one part-time student is equivalent to 0.36 full-time students. If the present age-specific allocation of enrolled students among part time and full time persists, and if the fractional full-time equivalency of part-time students remains constant, the potential increase in older student enrollment will absorb about 70 percent of the loss in full-time equivalents.

# UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT AND FAMILY INCOME

It is evident from the 1979 data that college enrollment is closely related to family income. Table F shows enrollment figures for dependent family members 18 to 24 years old who were high school graduates. In 1979, high school graduates from high-income families were much more likely to attend college than those from low-income families. For high school graduates in families with incomes of \$25,000 or more, 54 percent were enrolled in college, compared with 31 percent of those in families with incomes of less than \$10,000.

Among 18- to 24-year-old high school graduates who were dependent family members, the proportion enrolled in college was about the same for males and females in families with incomes below \$20,000, about 36 percent. In families with incomes of \$20,000 or more, the proportion of females enrolled was slightly higher than the proportion of males enrolled (53 and 48 percent, respectively). However, women usually marry at younger ages than men, and therefore, are less likely to be enrolled in school and members of

In 1979, 44 percent of women, but only 29 percent of men, 18 to 24 years old who were not in school were married, in their own households, and no longer dependent family members. Although there was some evidence that a higher proportion of women than men in families with incomes of \$25,000 or more were enrolled in college, there was some evidence that the number of men was larger (table F).

Table F further shows that differences in college enrollment and family income are most visible when comparing college enrollment and family income by race. In 1979, the median family income for White dependent students was more than \$25,000, while the median family income for Black dependent students was \$13,077, roughly half that for Whites.

There is a 10-percentage-point difference between the proportions of White and Black dependent high school graduates enrolled, but no such difference was evident within most of the income groups shown in table F. It is evident from table F that, regardless of race, the probability of college enrollment tends to increase with income. For each income group in table F, the differences between enrollment rates of Blacks and Whites were not statistically significant. Thus, the data in table F are consistent with the hypothesis that the overall White-Black enrollment difference for dependent high school graduates derives largely from Black-White income differences. Since, in addition, Blacks and Whites are not equally likely to graduate from high school. The total Black-White difference in enrollment has other causes as well.

## **COLLEGE DEGREE SOUGHT**

In the October 1979 CPS survey, the question, "What degree is ... working toward?" was asked for college students. In this survey, persons were classified as college students if they were enrolled in courses creditable toward an academic college, graduate, or professional school degree. With increased availability of vocational and adult education courses at some colleges, there has been confusion over the meaning

of the total college enrollment figures e.g., whether they include only academic students. In this survey, fully 7 out of 8 college students (87 percent of those reporting) were working on an academic or professional degree, 10 percent of those reporting were not working toward a degree, and only 2 percent were working toward a vocational certificate.

Highlights of the data on college degrees, derived from table A-4, follow. One-half of all college students who reported on degrees were working toward a bachelor's degree. Among undergraduates in 4-year colleges, 87 percent of reporting students were working toward a bachelor's degree in 1979. In 2-year colleges, 62 percent were working toward an associate degree, 13 percent were working toward a bachelor's degree, 7 percent were working toward a vocational certificate, and 17 percent were not working toward a degree. Among graduate students, about one-half were working toward a master's degree, 11 percent were working toward a doctorate, 14 percent were working toward a professional degree, and 17 percent were not working toward a degree. In some cases, students reported the highest degree expected rather than the current degree; data in table A-4 were not edited to force compliance of degree with year of college.

Almost all full-time students were working toward a degree. Of part-time students, however, about one-fourth of those reporting were not working toward a degree, including 29 percent of 2-year college students, 17 percent of 4-year college undergraduates, and 27 percent of graduate students. Almost one-half of part-time students were working on undergraduate degrees and one-fourth on graduate degrees. Among nontraditional age students (25 years old and over) 44 percent of those reporting were working on undergraduate degrees, 32 percent were working on graduate degrees, and 20 percent were not working on a degree.

Table A-4 further reveals that among undergraduates, about one-third of both Black and White students were enrolled in 2-year colleges. Black students appear to be more likely than Whites to be working toward a degree. Also, Black undergraduates were slightly more likely to be working toward an associate degree and less likely to be working toward a bachelor's degree than Whites, but the differences were not great.

### Appendix B. Definitions and Explanations

Population coverage. The figures shown are for the civilian noninstitutional population.

Metropolitan-nonmetropolitan residence. The population residing in standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) constitutes the metropolitan population. Except in New England, an SMSA is a county or group of contiguous counties which contains at least one city of 50,000 inhabitants or more, or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000. In addition to the county, or counties, containing such a city or cities, contiguous counties are included in an SMSA if, according to certain criteria, they are essentially metropolitan in character and are socially and economically integrated with the central city. In New England SMSA's consist of towns and cities, rather than counties. The metropolitan population in this report is based on SMSA's as defined in the 1970 census and does not include any subsequent additions or changes.

Comparability of metropolitan and nonmetropolitan data from the 1979 CPS with data for previous years. Changes in CPS design and procedures over the last several years have made the annual series of sample population data for metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas inconsistent. Analytic comparisons of year-to-year changes in these figures should be avoided. Trends in metropolitan and nonmetropolitan population growth over the 1970-79 and 1976-79 periods should not be appreciably affected by the procedural changes.

The major revisions to the CPS sample design and estimation methods have involved the expansion of the number of sample units from 55,000 housing units to 65,500 housing units. This incorporation of approximately 10,000 supplemental housing units into the March CPS sample in 1977 was accompanied by new procedures for inflating the sample results to reflect national estimates. It was determined subsequent to the introduction of the additional sample that the new inflating (weighting) procedures used for processing both the March 1977 and March 1978 CPS supplement data had resulted in an apparent overestimate of the nonmetropolitan population and corresponding underestimate of the metropolitan population for those years. For March 1979, another revision of the weighting process was introduced to correct the problem discovered in the earlier procedures. The result of this change was a spurious large increase in the metropolitan population and decrease in the nonmetropolitan population relative to March 1978 levels.

The March 1979 CPS metropolitan-nonmetropolitan population estimates also reflect other operational changes including the introduction of a coverage improvement

sample designed to provide greater accuracy in survey estimation. The net effect of all changes in procedure was to increase the metropolitan area estimates. Research and detailed analysis of the impact of each procedural change on the population estimates is underway and the results will be issued in a forthcoming technical report.

Central cities. Each SMSA must include at least one central city, and the complete title of an SMSA identifies the central city or cities. If only one central city is designated, then it must have 50,000 inhabitants or more. The area title may include, in addition to the largest city, up to two city names on the basis and in the order of the following criteria: (1) The additional city has at least 250,000 inhabitants or (2) the additional city has a population of one-third or more of that of the largest city and a minimum population of 25,000. An exception occurs where two cities have contiguous boundaries and constitute, for economic and social purposes, a single community of at least 50,000, the smaller of which must have a population of at least 15,000.

Geographic regions. The four major regions of the United States, for which data are presented in this report, represent groups of States, as follows:

Northeast: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont.

North Central: Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

South: Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, and West Virginia.

West: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.

School enrollment. The school enrollment statistics from the current survey are based on replies to the enumerator's inquiry as to whether the person was enrolled in school. Enumerators were instructed to count as enrolled anyone who had been enrolled at any time during the current term or school year in any type of graded public, parochial, or other private school in the regular school system. Such schools include nursery schools, kindergartens, elementary schools, high schools, colleges, universities, and professional schools. Attendance may be on either a full-time or part-time

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basis and during the day or night. Thus, regular schooling is that which may advance a person toward an elementary or high school diploma, or a college, university, or professional school degree. Children enrolled in nursery schools and kindergarten are included in the enrollment figures for "regular" schools, and are also shown separately.

"Special" schools are those which are not in the regular school system, such as trade schools or business colleges. Persons attending "special" schools are not included in the enrollment figures.

Persons enrolled in classes which do not require physical presence in school, such as correspondence courses or other courses of independent study, and in training courses given directly on the job, are also excluded from the count of those enrolled in school, unless such courses are being counted for credit at a "regular" school.

College enrollment. The college enrollment statistics are based on replies to the enumerator's inquiry as to whether the person was attending or enrolled in college. Enumerators were instructed to count as enrolled anyone who had been enrolled at any time during the current term or school year, except those who have left for the remainder of the term. Thus, regular college enrollment includes those persons attending a 4-year or 2-year college, university or professional school (such as medical or law school), in courses that may advance the student toward a recognized college or university degree (e.g. BA or MA). Attendance may be either full time or part time, during the day or night.

Two-year and four-year college. Students enrolled in the first 3 years of college were asked to report whether the college in which they were enrolled was a 2-year college (junior or community college) or a 4-year college or university. Students in the fourth academic year of college or higher were assumed to be in a 4-year college or university.

School enrollment in year preceding current survey. An inquiry on enrollment in regular school or college in October of the preceding year was asked in the survey concerning persons 14 to 24 years old who were not currently attending regular school or who were enrolled in college.

Level of school. The statistics on level of school indicate the number of persons enrolled at each of five levels: Nursery, kindergarten, elementary school (first to eighth grades), high school (ninth to twelfth grades), and college or professional school. The last group includes graduate students in colleges or universities. Persons enrolled in junior high school through the eighth grade are classified as in elementary school and the others as in high school.

Nursery school. A nursery school is defined as a group or class that is organized to provide educational experiences for children during the year or years preceding kindergarten. It includes instruction as an important and integral phase of its program of child care. Private homes in which essentially custodial care is provided are not considered nursery schools.

Children attending nursery school are classified as attending during either part of the day or the full day. Part day attendance refers to those who attend either in the morning or in the afternoon, but not both. Full-day attendance refers to those who attend both in the morning and afternoon.

"Head Start." Children enrolled in "Head Start" programs or similar programs sponsored by local agencies to provide preschool education to young children are counted under "Nursery" or "Kindergarten" as appropriate.

Public or private school. In this report, a public school is defined as any educational institution operated by publicly elected c appointed school officials and supported by public funds. Private schools include educational institutions established and operated by religious bodies, as well as those which are under other private control. In cases where enrollment was in a school or college which was both publicly and privately controlled or supported, enrollment was counted according to whether it was primarily public or private.

Full-time and part-time attendance. College students were classified, in this report, according to whether they were attending school on a full-time or part-time basis. A student was regarded as attending college full time if he was taking 12 or more hours of classes during the average school week, and part time if he was taking less than 12 hours of classes during the average school week.

Modal grade. Enrolled persons are classified according to their relative progress in school, that is, according to whether the grade or year in which they were enrolled was below, at, or above the modal (or typical) grade for persons of their age at the time of the survey. The modal grade, then, is the year of school in which the largest proportion of students of a given age is enrolled.

Age. The age classification is based on the age of the person at his last birthday.

Race. The population is divided into three groups on the basis of race: White, Black, and "other races." The last category includes Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and any other race except White and Black.

Spanish origin. Information on origin or descent was obtained by asking 'What is (this person's) origin or descent?'' Responses generally refer to a person's perceived national or ethnic lineage and do not necessarily indicate the country of birth of himself or his parents. The category Spanish origin includes persons of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Central or South American, and other Spanish origin.

Marital status. The marital status category shown in this report, "married, spouse present," includes persons who are currently married and living with their spouse.

The category "other marital status" includes persons who are single (never married), separated, divorced, or widowed.



Family. The term "family," as used here, refers to a group of two persons or more related by blood, marriage, or adoption and residing together; all such persons are considered as members of one family.

Primary family. A primary family is a family that includes among its members the person or couple who maintains the household.

Family head. In the Current Population Survey, the term "head of family" is used to refer to persons maintaining the household. This practice will be discontinued in surveys conducted after the 1980 Census of Population. However, in surveys taken prior to the 1980 Census of Population, women were not classified as the "head of family" if their husbands were present.

Head versus householder. In the 1980 census, the Bureau of the Census discontinued the use of the terms "head of household" and "head of family." Instead, the terms "householder" and "family householder" were used. Recent social changes resulted in greater sharing of household responsibilities among the adult members and, therefore, made the term "head" inappropriate in the analysis of household and family data. Specifically, the Bureau reconsidered its longtime practice of always classifying the husband as the head when he and his wife are living together.

In the 1980 census, the householder was the first adult household member listed on the census questionnaire. The instructions called for listing first the person (or one of the persons) in whose name the home is owned or rented. If a home is owned jointly by a married couple, either the husband or the wife was listed first, thereby becoming the reference person, or householder, to whom the relationship of other household members was recorded. Thus, the Bureau is publishing the responses on relationships as given in the 1980 census, except in selected tables where the husband is always shown as the householder in order to maintain comparability with previous census classifications.

Dependent family member: his survey, a dependent family member is a relative person maintaining the family other than the spouse. Such persons are generally sons and daughters within the family. Family members who are living away from home while attending college are also counted as dependent family members.

Years of school completed. Data on years of school completed in this report were derived from the combination of answers to two questions: (a) "What is the highest grade of school he has ever attended?" and (b) "Did he finish this grade?"

The questions on educational attainment apply only to progress in "regular" schools. Such schools include graded public, private, and parochial elementary and high schools (both junior and senior high), colleges, universities, and professional schools, whether day schools or night schools. Thus, regular schooling is that which may advance a person

toward an elementary school certificate, high school diploma, or a college, university, or professional school degree. Schooling in other than regular schools was counted only if the credits obtained were regarded as transferable to a school in the regular school system.

Family income. In this report, family income is derived from a single question asked of the household respondent when a household first enters the sample and is updated on the anniversary of entry. Income includes money income from jobs; net income from business, farm, or rent; pensions; dividends; interest; social security payments; and any other money income. The income of nonrelatives living in the household is excluded, but the income of all family members 14 and over, including those temporarily living away, is included. It should be noted that while characteristics of the person, such as age and marital status, and the composition of families refer to the date of the interview, family income statistics refer to receipts over a 12-month period starting 12 to 16 months prior to the interview.

The income tables include in the lowest income group those who were classified as having no income in the 12-month reference period and those reporting a loss in net income from farm and nonfarm self-employment or in rental income.

The detailed income tables in this report include a separate category for families for which no income information was obtained. In most other Current Population Reports showing income data, the missing income data have been allocated.

The money income level of families shown in this report may be somewhat understated. Income data from the October control card are based on the respondent's estimate of total family money income in broad, fixed income intervals. Income data collected in the March supplement to the Current Population Survey are based on responses to 11 direct questions asked about each person 14 and over and identifying 23 different sources of income in the preceding calendar year. (See U.S. Bureau of the Census, Current Population Reports, Series P-20, No. 333, School Enrollment—Social and Economic Characteristics of Students: October 1977, table B-1.)

Previous research has shown-that-the use of-broad-income intervals to record money income tends to reduce the rate of nonreporting, while increasing the likelihood that the amounts reported will be significantly understated as compared with results from more detailed questions.

Symbols. A dash (-) represents zero or rounds to zero and the symbol "B" means that the base of the derived figure is less than 75,000. An "X" means not applicable and "NA" means not available.

Rounding of estimates. Individual figures are rounded to the nearest thousand without being adjusted to group totals which are independently rounded. With few exceptions, percentages are based on the rounded absolute numbers.



# Appendix C. Source and Reliability of the Estimates

#### **SOURCE OF DATA**

Most of the estimates in this report are based on data collected in October of the years 1969 through 1979 from the Current Population Survey (CPS) of the Bureau of the Census. Some estimates are based on data obtained in earlier years. The monthly CPS deals mainly with labor force data for the civilian noninstitutional population. Questions relating to labor force participation are asked about each member 14 years old and older in each sample household. In addition, supplementary questions regarding school enrollment are asked about all eligible members of the household each October. The following table provides a brief description of some aspects of the CPS sample designs in use during the referenced data-collection periods.

The present CPS sample was initially selected from the 1970 census files and is continuously updated to reflect new construction where possible. (See section, "Nonsampling variability.") The monthly CPS sample is spread over 614 areas with coverage in each of the 50 States and the District of Columbia. The CPS sample areas are comprised of 1,113 counties, independent cities, and minor civil divisions in the Nation.

The estimation procedure used for the monthly CPS data involves the inflation of weighted sample results to independent estimates of the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States by age, race, and sex. These independent estimates are based on statistics from decennial censuses; statistics on births, deaths, immigration, and emigration; and statistics on the strength of the Armed Forces.

### **RELIABILITY OF THE ESTIMATES**

Since the estimates in this report are based on a sample, they may differ somewhat from the figures that would have been obtained if a complete census had been taken using the same questionnaires, instructions, and enumerators. There are two types of errors possible in an estimate based on a sample survey—sampling and nonsampling. The standard errors provided for this report primarily indicate the magnitude of the sampling error. They also partially measure the effect of some nonsampling errors in response and enumeration, but do not measure any systematic biases in the data. The full extent of nonsampling error is unknown. Consequently, particular care should be exercised in the interpretation of figures based on a relatively small number of cases or on small differences between estimates.

Nonsampling variability. As in any survey work, the results are subject to errors of response and nonreporting in addition to sampling variability. Nonsampling errors can be attributed to many sources, e.g., inability to obtain information about all cases in the sample, definitional difficulties, differences in the interpretation of questions, inability or unwillingness to provide correct information on the part of respondents, inability to recall information, mistakes made in collection such as in recording or coding the data, errors made in processing the data, errors made in estimating values for missing data, and failure to represent all units with the sample (undercoverage).

Undercoverage in the CPS results from missed housing units and missed persons within sample households. Overall

undercoverage, as compared to the level of the decennial census, is about 5 percent. It is known that CPS undercoverage varies with age, sex, and race. Generally, undercoverage is larger for males than for females and larger for Blacks and other races than for Whites. Ratio estimation to independent age-sex-race population controls, as described previously, partially corrects for the biases due to survey undercoverage. However, biases exist in the estimates to the extent that missed persons in missed households or missed persons in interviewed households have different characteristics than interviewed persons in the age-sex-race group. Further, the independent population controls used have not been adjusted for undercoverage in the 1970 census, which was estimated at 2.5 percent of the population, with differentials by age, sex, and race similar to those observed in CPS.

A coverage improvement sample was included in computing the estimates beginning in October 1978 in order to provide coverage of mobile homes and new construction housing units that previously had no chance for selection in the CPS sample. This sample is composed of approximately 450 sample household units which represent 237,000 occupied mobile homes and 600,000 new construction units. These new construction units are composed of those units where building permits were issued prior to January 1970 and construction was not completed by the time of the 1970 census (i.e. April 1970). The extent of other sources of undercoverage of housing units is unknown but believed to be small. The inclusion of this coverage improvement sample in the CPS does not have a significant effect on the estimates.

Use of metropolitan and nonmetropolitan data. In using metropolitan and nonmetropolitan data, particular care should be exercised in comparing estimates from 1977 and later years to each other and to those from earlier years. Methodological and sample design changes have occurred in these recent years resulting in relatively large differences in the metropolitan and nonmetropolitan area estimates.

Sampling variability. The standard errors given in the following tables are primarily measures of sampling variability, that is, of the variations that occurred by chance because a sample rather than the whole of the population was surveyed. The sample estimate and its estimated standard error enable one to construct, interval estimates that include the average result of all possible samples with a known probability. For example, if all possible samples were selected, each of these surveyed under identical conditions using the same sample design and an estimate and its estimated standard error were calculated from each sample, then:

- Approximately 68 percent of the intervals from one standard error below the estimate to one standard error above the estimate would include the average result of all possible samples.
- 2. Approximately 90 percent of the intervals from 1.6 standard errors below the estimate to 1.6 standard errors above the estimate would include the average result of all possible samples.

Approximately 95 percent of the intervals from two standard errors below the estimate to two standard errors above the estimate would include the average result of all possible samples.

The average result of all possible samples may or may not be contained in any particular computed interval. However, for a particular sample one can say with specified confidence that the average result of all possible samples is included within the constructed interval.

All the statements of comparison appearing in the text are significant at a 1.6 standard error level or better; and most are significant at a level of more than 2.0 standard errors. This means that for most differences cited in the text, the estimated difference is greater than twice the standard error of the difference. Statements of comparison qualified in some way (e.g., by use of the phrase, "some evidence") have a level of significance between 1.6 and 2.0 standard errors.

Note when using small estimates. Summary measures (such as medians and percent distributions) are shown in the report only when the base is 75,000 or greater. Because of the large standard errors involved there is little chance that summary measures would reveal useful information when computed on a smaller base. Estimated numbers are shown however, even though the relative standard errors of these numbers are larger than those for the corresponding percentages. These smaller estimates are provided primarily to permit those combinations of the categories which serve each user's needs.

Standard error tables and their use. In order to derive standard errors that would be applicable to a large number of estimates and could be prepared at a moderate cost, a number of approximations were required. Therefore, instead of providing an individual standard error for each estimate, genéralized sets of standard errors are provided for various types of characteristics. As a result, the sets of standard errors provided give an indication of the order of magnitude of the standard error of an estimate rather than the precise standard errors

The figures presented in tables C-1 through C-6 provide approximations to standard errors of various estimates for total, White, Black or persons of Spanish origin in the total United States for education only. To obtain standard errors for other characteristics, factors from table C-7 must be applied to the standard errors given for education in order to adjust for the combined effect of sample design and estimating procedure on the value of the characteristic. Standard errors for intermediate values not shown in the tables may be approximated by interpolation.

Standard errors of estimated numbers. The approximate standard error,  $\sigma_{\rm X}$ , of an estimated number shown in this report can be obtained by the use of the formula

$$\sigma_{\mathbf{X}} = \mathbf{f}\sigma$$
 (1)



In this formula, f is the appropriate factor from table C-7 and  $\sigma$  in the generalized standard error for total or White persons in table C-1, for Black and other races in table C-2, or for persons of Spanish origin in table C-3.

Standard errors of estimated percentages. The reliability of an estimated percentage, computed by using sample data for both numerator and denominator, depends on both the size of the percentage and the size of the total upon which this percentage is based. Estimated percentages are relatively more reliable than the corresponding estimates of the numerators of the percentages, particularly if the percentages are 50 percent or more. The approximate standard error,  $\sigma_{(x,p)}$ , of an estimated percentage can be obtained by use of the formula:

$$\sigma_{(x,p)} = f\sigma \tag{2}$$

In this formula, f is the appropriate factor from table C-7 and  $\sigma$  is the generalized standard error for total or White persons in table C-4, for Black and other races in table C-5, or for persons of Spanish origin in table C-6. When the

numerator and denominator of the percentage are in different categories, use the table and factor indicated by the numerator.

Illustration of the use of tables of standard errors. Table A of this report shows that in October 1979, there were 29,535,000 males 3 to 34 years old. At that time, an estimated 14,321,000 of them were attending elementary school. Table C-1 shows the standard error of an estimate of this size to be approximately 110,000. Applying the appropriate factor from table C-7 and using formula (1), the approximate standard error is  $1.0 \times 110,000 = 110,000$ . The 68-percent confidence interval as shown by the data is from 14,211,000 to 14,431,000. Therefore, a conclusion that the average estimate derived from all possible samples lies within a range computed in this way would be correct for roughly 68 percent of all possible samples. Similarly, we could conclude with 95-percent confidence that the average estimate derived from all possible samples lies within the interval from 14,101,000 to 14,541,000 (i.e.  $14,321,000 \pm (2 \times 110,000)$ ).

Table F shows that in October 1979, 29.1 percent of the 700,000 Blacks 18 to 24 years old who were high school graduates and dependent members of families with incomes under \$10,000 were enrolled in college. Table C-5 indicates the standard error on this percentage to be 2.9 percent.

Applying the appropriate factor from table C-7 and using formula (2), the approximate standard error is  $1.0 \times 2.9 = 2.9$  percent. Consequently, the 68-percent confidence interval as shown by this data is from 26.2 percent to 32.0 percent, and the 95-percent confidence interval is from 23.3 percent to 34.9 percent.

Standard error of a difference. For a difference between two sample estimates, the standard error is approximately equal to

$$\sigma_{(x \cdot y)} = \sqrt{\sigma_{x}^{2} + \sigma_{y}^{2}}$$
 (3)

where  $\sigma_{x}$  and  $\sigma_{y}$  are the standard errors of the estimates x and y, respectively; the estimates can be of numbers, percents, medians, etc. This will represent the actual standard error quite accurately for the difference between two estimates of the same characteristic in two different areas, or for the difference between two separate and uncorrelated characteristics in the same area. If, however, there is a high positive (negative) correlation between the two characteristics, the formula will overestimate (underestimate) the true standard error.

Illustration of the computation of the standard error of a difference. As stated earlier, table F of this report shows that in October 1979, 29.1 percent of the 700,000 Blacks 18 to 24 years old who were high school graduates and dependent members of families with incomes under \$10,000 were enrolled in college. Table F also shows that in October 1979, 44.4 percent of the 142,000 Black high school graduates 18 to 24 years old who were dependent members of families with income \$25,000 or more were enrolled in college. Thus, the apparent difference between the two percentages is 15.3 percent. The standard error  $(\sigma_x)$  of 29.1 percent is 3.0 as shown above. Table C-5 and factor table C-7 show the standard error  $(\sigma_{v})$  of 44.4 percent with a base of 142,000 to be approximately  $7.3 = 7.3 \times 1.0$  percent. Therefore, using formula (3), the standard error of the difference 15.3 percent is about

$$7.9 \doteq \sqrt{(2.9)^2 + (7.3)^2}$$

This means that the 90-percent confidence interval about the difference is from 2.7 percent to 27.9 percent, and the 95-percent confidence interval is from -0.5 percent to 31.1 percent. Since the 90-percent confidence interval does not contain zero and the 95-percent confidence interval does contain zero, we can conclude that for Black high school graduates, 18 to 24 years old, some evidence of a difference does exist between the percentage enrolled in college as dependent members of families with incomes under \$10,000 and the percentage enrolled in college as dependent members of families with incomes \$25,000 or more.

Standard error of a median. The sampling variability of an estimated median depends upon the form of the distribution as well as on the size of its base. An approximate method for measuring the reliability of a median is to determine an interval about the estimated median, such that there is a

stated degree of confidence that the median based on a complete census lies within the interval. The following procedure may be used to estimate the 68-percent confidence limits of a median based on sample/data.

1. Determine, using table C-4, C-5 or C-6 and the appropriate factors, the standard error on a 50-percent characteristic;

- add to and subtract from 50 percent the standard error determined in step (1);
- 3. using the distribution of the characteristic, calculate the 68-percent confidence interval by finding the values corresponding to the two points established in step (2).

A 95-percent confidence interval may be determined by finding the values corresponding to 50 percent plus and minus twice the standard error determined in step 1.

Illustration of the computation of a confidence interval for a needian. Table F of this report shows that the median family income of all races for dependent family members 18 to 24 years old who were enrolled in college is \$23,845.

- There is a total of 4,817,000 persons 18 to 24 years old who were enrolled in college and are dependent members of families who reported family income. Using formula (2) and tables C-4 and C-7 the standard error of a 50percent characteristic is found to be approximately 1.2 = 1.0 x 1.2 percent.
- To obtain a 95-percent confidence interval on an estimated median, add to and subtract from 50 percent twice the standard error found in step (1). This yields percent limits of 47.6 and 52.4.
- 3. From table D, 37.9 percent of persons 18 to 24 years old enrolled in college were dependent members of families who reported an income under \$20,000, and 15.8 percent were dependent members of families who reported an income from \$20,000 to \$24,999. By linear interpolation, the lower limit on the estimate is found to be about

$$20,000 + (25,000 - 20,000) \frac{47.6 - 37.9}{15.8} \stackrel{.}{=} $23.100$$

Similarly, the upper limit may be found by linear interpolation to be about

$$20,000 \div (25,000 - 20,000) \frac{52.4 - 37.9}{15.8} = $24,600$$

Hence, the 95-percent confidence interval about the estimated median is from \$23,100 to \$24,600.
