ABSTRACT

This bibliographic listing of sources on Pacific/Asian American groups provides titles of existing bibliographies and literature reviews. Over 100 entries are included in the document. Most of the entries, were published during the 1970's, with a few dating from the late 1960's and several from 1980 and 1981. The objective is to offer researchers, educators, and other interested people a usuable alternative to a comprehensive listing of historical, creative, and research literature which would contain several thousand individual entries. Entries are arranged in three sections. The first section is a general section on Pacific/Asian Americans. It includes works on teaching strategies for ethnic studies, ethnic information sources in the United States, and a guide to media and materials on ethnic groups. In the second, major section, entries are arranged by nationality (Chinese, Indochinese, Japanese, Koreans, Pacific Islanders, and Filipinos). The third section is on special topics and selected sources on racial/ethnic groups. Included in this section are works which focus on Asian Americans in children's books, cultural heritage, Asian women, the status of social services delivery to minorities in the United States, and drug use and abuse among minorities in the United States. For each entry, information is presented on author, title, number of pages, publisher, and date of publication. (DB)

Bibliographic Resources on Pacific/Asian Americans

The historical, creative, and research literature on Pacific/Asian American groups has increased over the past ten years to the point where any complete listing would likely contain several thousand individual entries. As an alternative to a comprehensive list, particularly for researchers and educators who might be relatively unfamiliar with this body of information, this paper provides the titles of existing bibliographies and literature reviews.

Many of the cited bibliographies are annotated. Some appear at the ends of books or monographs; in most instances, these types of bibliographies have been included only if they are specially compiled and go beyond the usual listing of references cited in the body of the text. The literature reviews are useful as they provide critical frameworks within which to examine certain types of materials.

The titles that follow are arranged by Pacific/Asian group except for an initial general section and concluding sections on special topics and selected sources on racial/ethnic groups. Some of these titles may not be widely available except through the use of interlibrary loan procedures. Items which are part of the ERIC document system are so indicated by number.

The literature on Pacific/Asian American groups will continue to grow. One suggested method of keeping up with this information is to consult the annual bibliographies that appear in Amerasia Journal (published by the Asian American Studies Center, University of California-Los Angeles).
