ABSTRACT

Results of the 1980-81 Survey of Institutional Characteristics of Colleges and Universities, as part of the Higher Education General Information Survey (BEGIS), are presented. The survey sample consisted of 3,270 accredited institutions and branches and an additional 141 systems and central offices. Eighty more institutions/branches had accreditation during the 1980-81 school year than the previous year. Private two-year schools accounted for more than two-thirds of the increase, and the balance was dominated by a rise in the number of public two-year institutions. Data are presented indicating the growth in the number of institutions and their branches participating in the HEGIS program during the past decade. Increases in the number of public institutions outpaced that of their private counterparts until 1977, and since that tile, private institutions have been added at a ratio of nearly five to one over public institutions. Information is also provided on: the number of institutions by state, control, level sex of student body, and calendar system. The number of institutions by control and level accredited by each of the recognized accrediting agencies is also indicated, along with information on administrative staff, dates of establishment of institutions, and the number with summer or evening programs. The low turnover rates among selected administrative staff indicate the possibility of increased stability among the deans and directors of the various academic programs. Nearly two thirds of these positions had a lower turnover rate than the previous year. (SW) .

3,270 Postsecondary Institutions Accredited in 1980-81

Final tabulations from the Survey of Institutional Characteristics of Colleges and Universities conducted by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) indicate that 3,270 institutions and their branches had accreditation during the 1980-81 school year, 80 more than last year. Private 2 year schools accounted for more than two-thirds of the increase, notably those accredited by the National Association of Trade and Technical Schools (NATTS), recently added to the Department of Education's list of recognized accrediting agencies sociations. The balance of the increase was dominated by a rise in the number of public 2-year institutions-19 more than last year's count, while only six 4 year schools were added to the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) universe for the 1980 81 survey year

The universe, established by the Institutional Char acteristics survey each year, becomes the basis for the entire HEGIS network of surveys and provides a common base for coding, cross-survey study of data, and trend analysis. Growth in the number of institutions and their branches participating in the HEGIS program during the past decade is shown in table 1. Increases in the number of public institutions outpaced that of their private counterparts until 1977, and since that time, private institutions have been added at a ratio of nearly 5 1 over public insti tutions. Although 54 percent of all accredited institutions in 1980-81 were private, they accounted for only 22 percent of the enrottment in that same year 1 and 35 percent of the degrees conferred during 1978-79, the latest year for which survey data are currently available 2

The remaining tables are limited to the 3,270 accredited institutions and branches that are included in the 1980-81 universe. Tables 2 through 5 delineate the number of institutions by State, control, level, sex of student body, and calendar system, table 6 indicates the number of institutions by control and level, accredited by each of the recognized accrediting agencies, tables 7-9 contain information on administrative staff and tables 10 and 11 present selected in formation on dates of establishment of institutions and the number with summer or evening programs.

The low turnover rates among selected administrative staff, as seen in table 9, indicate the possibility of increased stability among the deans and directors of the various academic programs. Nearly two-thirds of these positions (manpower codes 47 through 75) had a lower turnover rate than the previous year. Among all selected administrative staff listed in the 1980-81 Education Directory, Colleges and Universities, only one position—the Chief Executive Officer within a System—had a turnover rate greater than 20 percent, while the majority of the other Administrative Officers (manpower codes 1 through 45) had slight increases in their rates of turnover.

Appendix

Survey Background

The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) has collected data annually on the Institutional Characteristics of Colleges and Universities as part of its Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) program. The 1980-81 survey was the fifteenth of the series. Data are provided by all institutions and their branches that are considered eligible for inclusion by the Division of Eligibility and Agency Evaluation (DEAE) in the Department of Education. This survey establishes the universe of institutions for all surveys in the HEGIS program.

The 1980-81 Survey

Survey forms were mailed in August 1980 (either directly or through various State coordinating

agencies) to the 3,190 institutions that responded to the prior year's survey, plus all newly eligible institutions. All responses received and edited as of November 21, 1980, were incorporated into the 1980-81 Education Directory to expedite its release. The Directory includes actual responses from 2,974 responding units, imputed data (i.e., the prior year's responses) for another 390, and limited listings for 48 new institutions that were nonrespondent as of November 21.

Intense followup of the 438 nonrespondents continued after publication, and on April 1, a 100-percent response rate was achieved. The final 1980-81 universe consisted of 3,270 institutions and branchies and an additional 141 systems and central office. The data provided in the attached tables represent this final universe.
