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ABSTRACT Characteristics of the fall 1980 full-time, first-time freshmen enrolled in New Jersey colleges and universities are tabulated and trends in the past five years are summarized. Highlights include the following: There was a modest decline in entering freshmen over the previous year, consistent with projections in the statewide plan. The decline was not uniform across sectors, with a higher decline at Rutgers University than at state, independent, and community colleges. Women continued to comprise the majority of freshmen at 52 percent. The racial/ethnic distribution was six percent Hispanic, 12 percent black, and 82 percent "other" (including white, American Indian/Alaskan native, Asian/Pacific Islander, and non-resident aliens). The greatest percentage decline was among blacks. A two to three percent decline occurred in all age groups except 35 and over, in which it grew about one percent in the last year. The number of New Jersey residents declined by four percent in the last year, while out-of-state residents increased 13 percent, although state residents did increase in the community college sector. Of the freshmen in senior institutions who are high school graduates, 70 percent were in the top two-fifths of their high school classes, an improvement over the previous year. Students' Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) verbal component scores remained about the same, with the proportion of math scores over 500 declining two percent. Tables show distributions of students' characteristics such as sex, ethnicity, age, geographic origin, class rank, and SAT scores as well as five-year trends. Individual institutions' enrollment data are appended. (MSE)

Profile of Full-Time First-Time Freshmen: Fall 1980 and Recent Trends

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SUMMARY

This Data Brief presents a profile of the characteristics of the Fall 1980 full-time-first-time freshmen¹ (hereinafter referred to in the text as simply "freshmen") enrolled in New Jersey colleges and universities, and summarizes trends over the past five years.

There was a modest (3.1%) decline in the number of freshmen entering N.J. colleges in 1980 compared with 1979, from 45,536 to 44,021. Freshman enrollments had been virtually stable since 1977, totalling approximately 45,000 each fall. With the exception of 1978, when there was a very small decrease in freshman enrollments (about one-half of 1%), 1980 was the first year in which a decline was exhibited. This decline is consistent with the enrollment projections in the Statewide Plan for Higher Education.

The decline in 1980 was not uniform across sectors. Enrollments decreased by about 7% at the state colleges and by nearly 17% at Rutgers. At both C.M.D.N.J. (School of Allied Health Professions)² and N.J.I.T., and the independent colleges, the decline was 3%; the community colleges however, saw an increase of 4%.

Although the numbers of both male and female freshmen declined in 1980, women continue to comprise the majority of the freshman class (52%). Nevertheless, it may be that female enrollments are levelling off after several years of steady growth.

The racial/ethnic distribution of the 1980 freshman class was 6% Hispanic, 12% Black, and 82% Other (which includes White, American Indian/

¹ A "full-time first-time freshman" is defined as a student who has not previously attended any college and who enrolls in degree-credit courses at a college as a full-time undergraduate, in pursuit of a college degree or other formal award. It should be noted that the sums of freshmen by the different data elements are not reconciled in all instances. The total numbers reported by sex and by ethnicity are the same for all sectors in all years; however, these totals do not necessarily match those by geographic origin or by age. This situation, which is occurring less and less frequently, results from the use by some colleges of different sources of freshman enrollment data--admissions files and registration files. The resulting differences in freshman enrollments are very slight and do not affect the overall freshman profile for either the state or the individual college.

² Throughout this report, the data shown for C.M.D.N.J. are for the School of Allied Health Professions, the only division of C.M.D.N.J. enrolling full-time first-time freshmen.

Alaskan Native, Asian/Pacific Islander, and Non-Resident Aliens). A comparison between 1980 and 1979 data shows that the number of black freshmen declined by 9%, Hispanics by 1%, and Others by 2%. The very slight decline in Hispanic enrollment suggests a levelling off, coming as it does after several years of marked increases; the decline in Black enrollment follows years of steady, but less dramatic, growth. In both instances, however, the proportions of Blacks (12.3%) and Hispanics (6.3%) among full-time first-time freshmen are very close to their proportions in the general population, according to the 1980 Census (12.6% and 6.7%, respectively).

The 1980 profile of freshmen by age category indicates that the number declined slightly (2%-3%) in all age groups except 35 and over. The number of freshmen in the latter category grew slightly (1%) between fall 1979 and fall 1980. However, the data do not support the notion that "older" students are making a significant impact on college enrollments, at least not among full-time first-time freshmen. The age data reveal that, percentage-wise, students from the more or less "traditional" college-going age group (those under 21 years of age) continue to dominate the full-time first-time freshman population. These students account for 86% of the systemwide total (a proportion that has been virtually constant for five years). Even in the community college sector, they account for 75% of the total.

An analysis of the geographic origin of the 1980 freshmen shows that the number of N.J. residents declined by 4% from 1979, while the number of out-of-state residents rose 13%. The community college sector is the only sector in which the number of state residents actually increased by 4%.

Of the 1980 freshmen (in senior institutions) who are high school graduates, 70% graduated in the top two-fifths of their high school class. This is an improvement over the 1979 percentage of 68%.

A distribution of freshmen by SAT score categories, comparing fall 1980 with the previous year, shows that the proportion of Verbal scores in the 500+ category remained unchanged (27%), while the pro-

portion of Math scores in that category declined by 2 percentage points (from 43% to 41%). Statewide average scores declined yearly from 1976 to 1978; since then the average Verbal score has improved slightly from 439 in 1978 to 440 in 1979 and 442 in 1980; and the average Math score has climbed from 475 in 1978 to 479 in 1980.

The summary tables and graphs which follow display distributions of the 1980 freshmen by such characteristics as sex, ethnicity, age, geographic origin, rank in class, and SAT scores, as well as five-year trends of these profiles. The numbers and proportions of freshmen enrolled by sector in 1976 and 1980 are shown in Table 1 and Figure 1. Proportions of freshmen enrolled in 1980 by sector and sex are shown in Figure 2; and numbers and proportions of freshmen enrolled by sector and sex for the past five years are shown in Tables 2 and 3. A five-year trend of freshmen enrolled by ethnicity is displayed in Figure 3, and accompanying tables of racial/ethnic data and percent distributions for the past five years follow (Tables 4 and 5). Tables 6 and 7 show freshman enrollments by age category and sector over the past five years; and Figure 4 illustrates the percentage distribution of freshmen enrolled by age category. Five-year trends regarding the geographic origin of freshmen are shown in Tables 8 and 9; and graphic illustrations of freshmen enrolled by county of residence in 1980 are given in Figures 5 through 7. Table 10 gives the percentage distribution of freshmen enrolled by rank-in-class over the past five years; Table 11 shows the distribution by SAT score categories, and Table 12 lists average SAT scores by institution from 1976 through 1980.

Finally, the data for individual institutions' 1980 freshman enrollments are presented in the Appendix (Tables 14-38).

FULL-TIME FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN ENROLLED BY SECTOR

New Jersey colleges saw a 3.1% decline in the number of freshmen entering college in 1980 compared with 1979. In 1979 there were 45,436 entering freshmen, while only 44,021 enrolled in 1980 (1,415 fewer students). The five-year trend shows a marked increase in 1977 over 1976 and a relatively stable enrollment pattern through 1979. Even with the decline in 1980, the number of freshmen enrolled was 3% above the 1976 level.

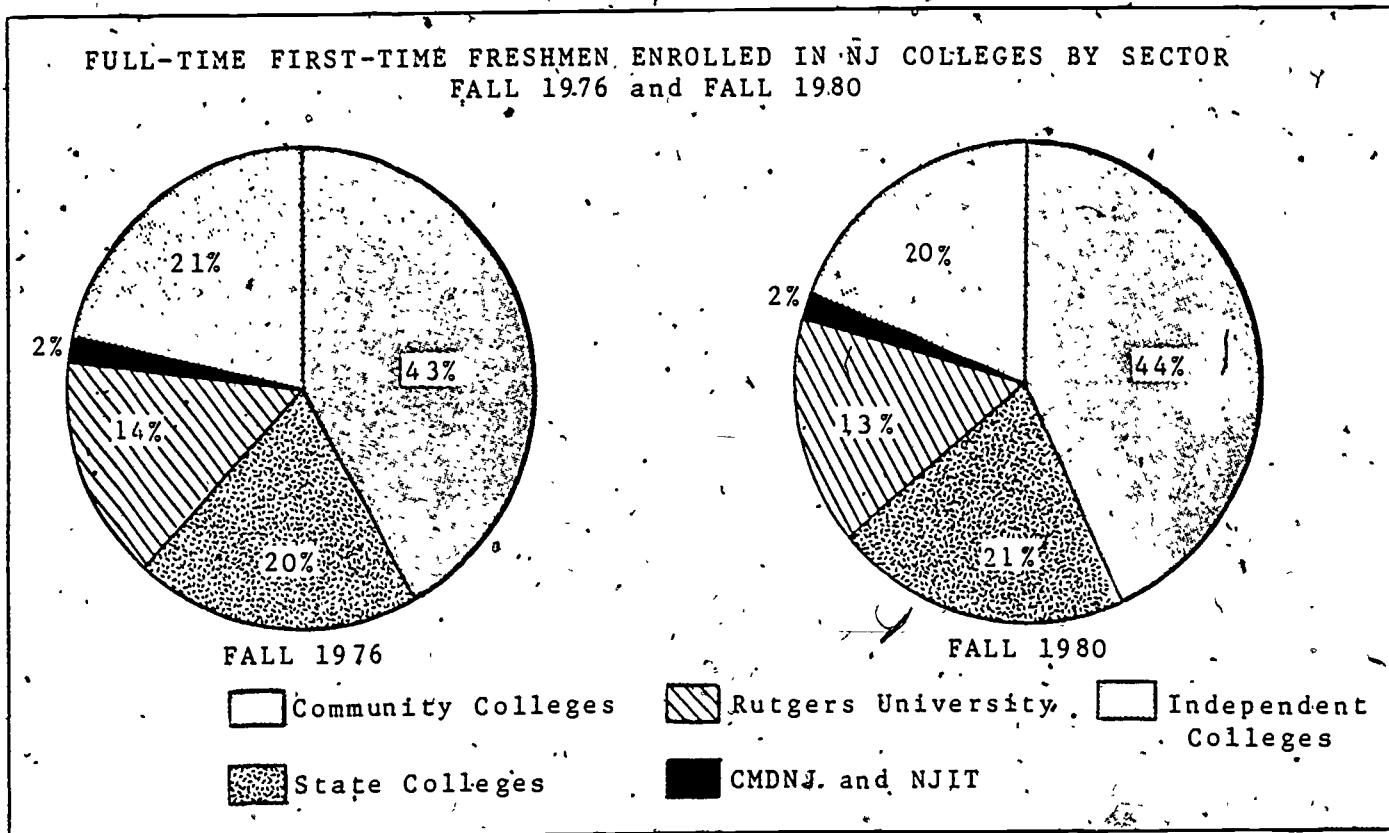

Table 1 shows that the community college sector is the only one in which an increase (4%) occurred in the number of freshmen in 1980 compared with 1979; the community colleges took in about 700 more freshmen in 1980 than in the previous year. The upswing is inconsistent with the trend of the past four years, which indicated a leveling-off of freshman enrollment in community colleges.

The nearly 4% increase in freshman enrollment at the community colleges in 1980 was offset by a nearly 8% decline in the combined number of freshmen in all other sectors. In comparing 1980 figures with those for 1979, the declines in sectors were about 7% at the state colleges, nearly 3% at the independent colleges, slightly more than 3% at C.M.D.N.J. and N.J.I.T., and nearly 17% at Rutgers University. There have

been unstable trends in freshman enrollments at the four-year college sectors over the past five years; enrollments have fluctuated from year to year in each sector, but the combined four-year total had grown slightly until the decline in 1980.

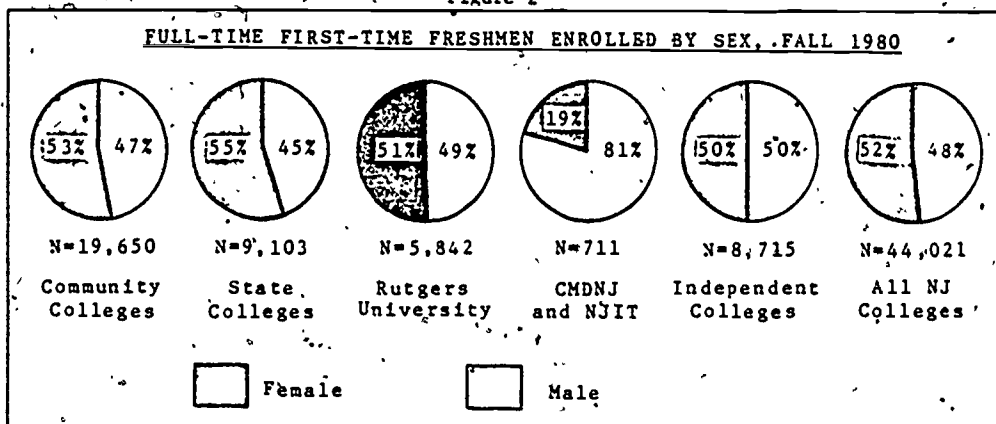

The freshman enrollment pattern at the community colleges each fall has a profound effect on the statewide pattern because, as Figure 1 illustrates, the community colleges take in almost half of the state's entering freshmen. There have been slight shifts in the percentage distributions of freshmen by sector over the past five years. The state college and community college sectors each increased their proportions by one percentage point (from 43% to 44% and from 20% to 21%, respectively). Rutgers University and the independent college sector each decreased their shares (from 14% to 13% and from 21% to 20%, respectively), while C.M.D.N.J. and N.J.I.T. had the same proportion of the total (2%) in both fall 1976 and fall 1980.

FULL-TIME FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN ENROLLED BY SEX

Women currently comprise 52% of the state's entering freshmen. As shown in Figure 2, women account for 50% or more of the freshman classes in every collegiate sector except C.M.D.N.J. and N.J.I.T. where they account for 19% of the combined total. (This proportion of women at the two institutions differs significantly--at C.M.D.N.J. women represent 90% of the total, while at N.J.I.T. their proportion is 12%. For both institutions these percentages are higher than in fall 1976, when they stood at 76% and 9%, respectively. Since N.J.I.T. accounts for virtually all of the combined enrollment in the two colleges, the female proportion of their combined total is influenced heavily by the lower percentages of women at N.J.I.T.)

The statewide numbers of both male and female freshmen declined in 1980; nevertheless, the majority of the freshmen (52%) are still women. In the public senior institutional sectors, the overall declines were reflected either less sharply or not at all in female enrollments. At Rutgers and the state colleges, the number of women declined 16.0% and 5.8%, respectively, compared with 16.6% and 7.1% declines, respectively, in total freshman enrollments. At C.M.D.N.J. and N.J.I.T., a 5.7% decrease in the number of men was offset by a 9.0% increase in the number of women, yielding an overall 3.3% decline. Only at the community colleges did both male and female freshman enrollments increase, but the male percentage increase (4.7%) was greater than the female percentage increase (3.1%). In the independent sector, the decline in female enrollment (3.6%) was greater than the male and overall declines (2.0% and 2.8%, respectively). One-year and five-year trends in freshman enrollments by sex are shown in Tables 2 and 3 which follow.

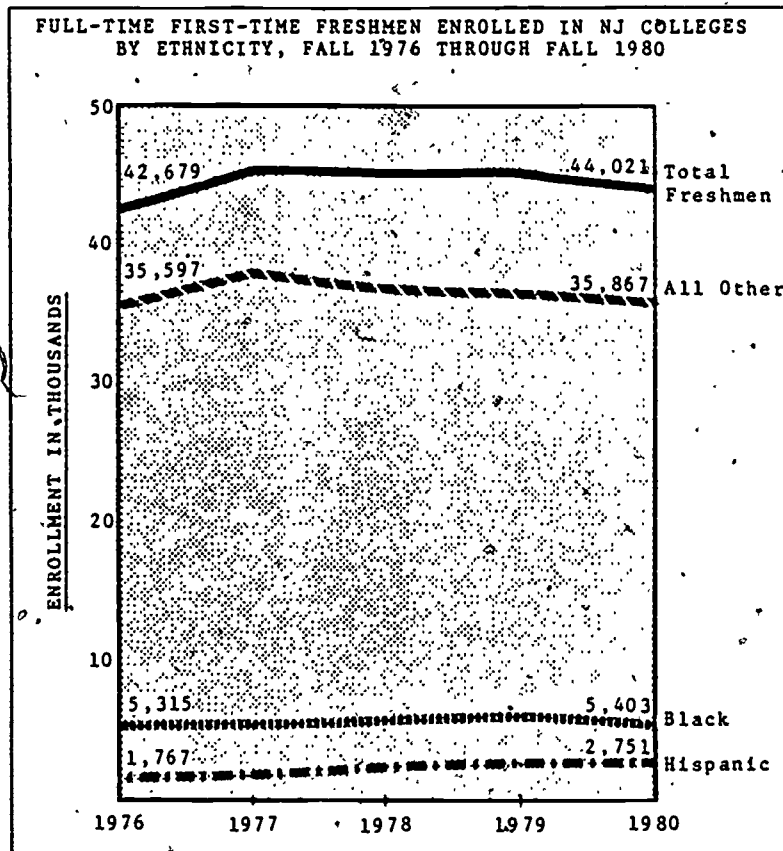
Over the past five years, the number of female freshmen has risen by 6.8%, while the number of male freshmen has declined by 0.5%. The slight five-year percent decrease in men is a result of the fact that the number of male freshmen enrolled has been declining steadily each year since 1977, while the number of female freshmen grew markedly from 1976 through 1979 (10% increase), until 1980 when the first decline occurred.

A comparison of the male/female composition of the 1980 freshman class and 1980 total full-time undergraduates shows only a slight difference. Men comprise 48.2% of all freshmen and 48.9% of all full-time undergraduates; and women comprise 51.8% of the freshmen and 51.1% of all full-time undergraduates.

FULL-TIME FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN ENROLLED BY ETHNICITY

The Fall 1980 freshman class was composed of 2,751 Hispanic students, 5,403 black students, and 35,867 Other students (which include White, Asian/Pacific Islander, American Indian/Alaskan Native, and Non-Resident Aliens). The percentage distribution was 6% Hispanic, 12% black, and 82% Other. While the total number of freshmen declined 3.1% in Fall 1980 compared with Fall 1979, the number of Hispanics declined only 0.9%, and Others, 2.3%. The larger overall decline occurred due to a 9.3% decrease in the number of blacks. This decline is explained principally by a significant drop in the number of black freshmen enrolled at two community colleges (Essex and Passaic), Glassboro State College, and Rutgers University. Figure 3 below displays the trends in freshman enrollments of minority and other students since 1976, and although the number of minority students declined between 1979 and 1980, their numbers were still larger than in 1976.

The five-year trend at the statewide level shows annual increases in the number of blacks enrolled between 1976 and 1979, followed by the 9% decline in 1980. The trend in Hispanic enrollment shows dramatic annual increases between 1976 and 1979 followed by a small decrease of 1% in 1980. It is interesting to note that while black freshman enrollment declined overall between 1979 and 1980, the number of blacks increased at C.M.D.N.J. and N.J.I.T. and at the independent colleges. Among Hispanics, freshman enrollment increases occurred at Rutgers, C.M.D.N.J. and N.J.I.T., and the independent colleges.

Different patterns emerge when comparisons are made between the percentage of total freshmen and the percentage of minority freshmen attracted by each sector. The 1980 data indicate that:

Rutgers attracted a slightly lower proportion of total freshmen in Fall 1980 (13%) compared with five years ago (14%), while enrolling the same proportion of minority freshmen (13%) as it does today. C.M.D.N.J. and N.J.I.T. attracted the same proportions of both minority and total freshmen in both Fall 1976 and Fall 1980 (2%). The independent colleges, on the other hand, enrolled 19% of the minority freshmen in 1976, considerably more than the 16% they enroll today; however, the independent college portion of total freshmen has decreased since 1976 (the colleges enrolled 21% of all freshmen in 1976, but 20% of the total in 1980). The proportions of both total and minority freshmen attracted by the state colleges in 1980 are each one percentage point higher than

they were in 1976. Their share of total freshmen grew from 20% to 21%; their share of minority freshmen, from 16% to 17%. Community colleges increased their proportion of the minority freshmen more than they increased their share of total freshmen. In Fall 1976, they enrolled 50% of minority and 43% of total freshmen; in Fall 1980, comparable percentages are 52% and 44%.

FULL-TIME FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN ENROLLED BY AGE

There was a slight decline in the total number of freshmen (whose ages are known) in 1980 compared with 1979; however, significant shifts occurred in the age profile of the freshman class, as shown in Tables 6 and 7.

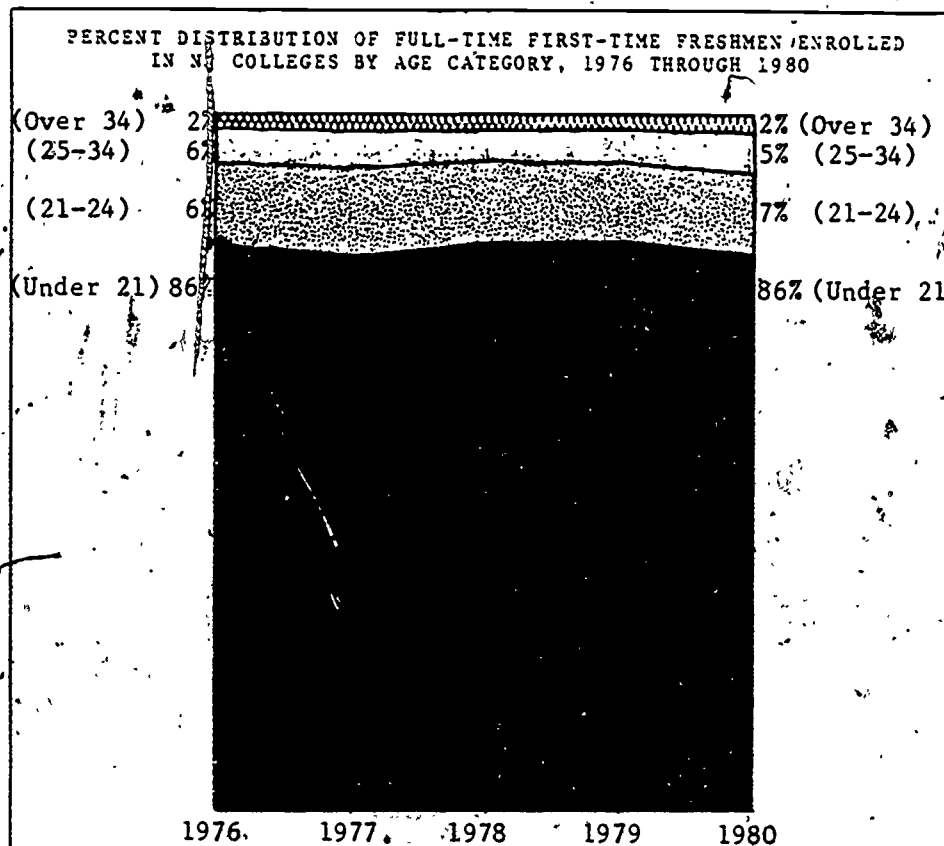
There was a 3% decline in the number of freshmen under 21 years of age; the number dropped from 38,342 in 1979 to 37,256 in 1980 (about 1,100 fewer students). This is apparently a continuation of the downward trend that began in Fall 1977.

Similar decreases occurred in the other age groups. The number of freshmen who were 21-24 years old was down by 2% (reflecting a decrease of 68 students) and the 25-34 age group declined by 3% (or 60 fewer students). The number over 34 years old increased very slightly (17), as the enrollment of these older students grew from 1,035 to 1,045 between 1979 and 1980.

There are some notable differences among sectors in the percentages of freshmen in each age category. Both Rutgers and the independent colleges have significantly higher proportions of under-21-year-old freshmen (96%) than do the state colleges (92%) or community colleges (75%). Freshmen in the older age categories (over 24) account for 14% of community college enrollment, compared with 4% at the state colleges and only 2% at Rutgers and the independents.

Over the past five years, the percentage distributions of freshman age categories have fluctuated only slightly, as illustrated in Figure 4 below. In 1980, 86% of all freshmen were under 21 years of age, a proportion that has been virtually constant since 1976. However, the proportion of freshmen from 21 to 24 years of age grew slightly, from 6% of the total in 1976 to 7% of the total in 1980. The proportion of 25-34 year-old freshmen decreased from 6% to 5% of the total, and the over-34-year-olds remained at about 2% during the past five years.

FULL-TIME FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN ENROLLED BY GEOGRAPHIC ORIGIN

The number of New Jersey residents who enrolled as freshmen in New Jersey colleges declined by 4% in 1980 compared with 1979 (about 1,700 fewer students). A decline occurred in every sector except the community colleges; the number of New Jersey residents declined by 865 at the state colleges, by 1,093 at Rutgers, and by 455 at the independent colleges. The five-year trend in state resident freshmen (see Table 8 below) shows relatively little overall change statewide; in 1980 there were only 67 more resident freshmen enrolled than in 1976. However, the number peaked in 1977 and has been declining since then. Furthermore, there have been shifts within sectors; resident enrollments have increased by about 1,100 students at the community colleges, by 300 at the state colleges, and by more than 40 at C.M.D.N.J. and N.J.I.T. while they have decreased by about 700 students at both Rutgers and the independent colleges over the five-year period.

The number of out-of-state freshmen, on the other hand, rose substantially (13%) this fall. Although the actual numbers of out-of-state residents are small compared with the number of in-state residents, the data show that the migration of students into New Jersey is continuing,

while enrollments of state-residents continue to decline slightly. The most notable growth in the number of out-of-state residents this fall occurred at the state colleges, where the number increased by 47% (or 165 students). There was also a 32% increase (or 34 out-of-state students) at the community colleges. However, it should be noted that all of the increase at the state colleges, and half of that at the community colleges, was attributable to students from foreign countries rather than from other states.

Since 1976, both the community and state colleges have more than doubled their numbers of out-of-state freshmen. The out-of-state number at Rutgers grew by 5% this fall, and the five-year percent increase has been 55%. The independent colleges saw a 9% growth this fall, and a five-year percent growth of 6%. C.M.D.N.J. and N.J.I.T. continue to enroll only a very small number of out-of-state freshmen.

Table 9 shows, over a five-year period, the percentage of freshmen in each sector who are out-of-state residents. It shows that the percentage of non-residents has been fluctuating at the independent colleges between 25% and 28%. The state college percentage has risen from 3% in 1976 to nearly 6% in 1980; and the percentage at Rutgers has risen from 5% to 9%.

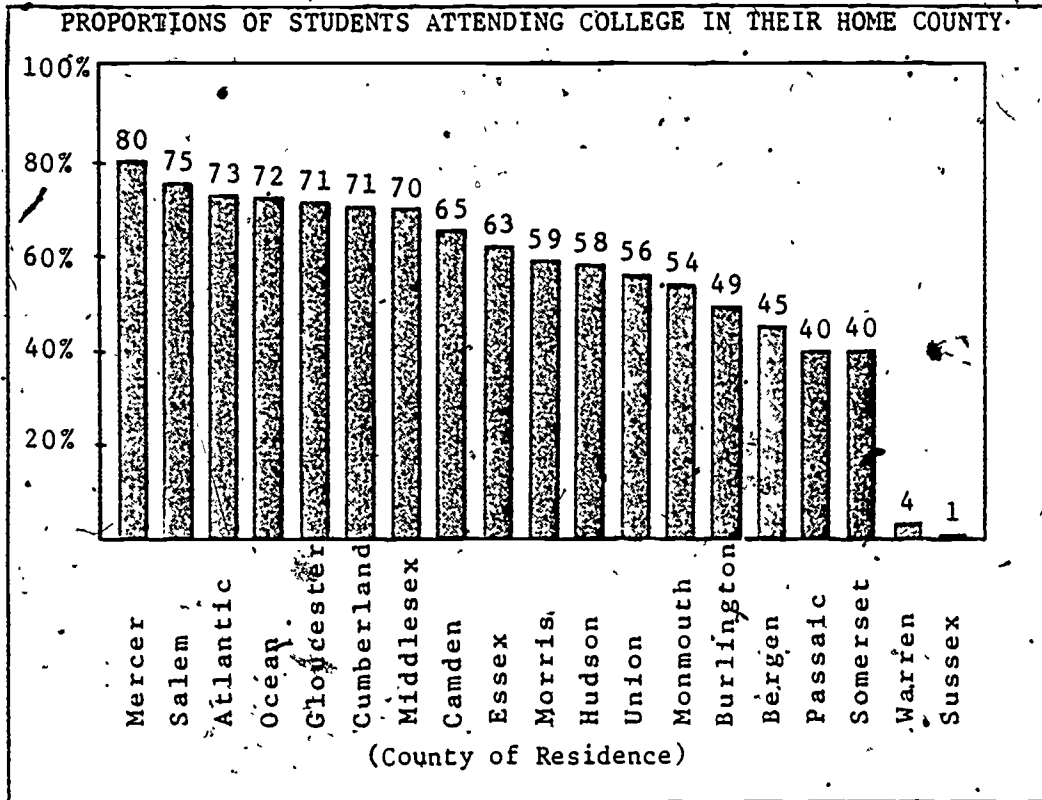

Figure 5 ranks New Jersey counties by the percentage of residents who enrolled as a freshman in a college in their home county. For instance, of all the 1980 freshmen in New Jersey institutions who reside in Mercer County, 80% enrolled in a college in Mercer County. Only 19 of

the 21 counties are listed because Cape May and Hunterdon Counties have no colleges. The graph indicates that 13 of the 19 counties retain more than half of the county residents. Warren and Sussex Counties retain only a small percentage because there is only one small independent college located in each of them.

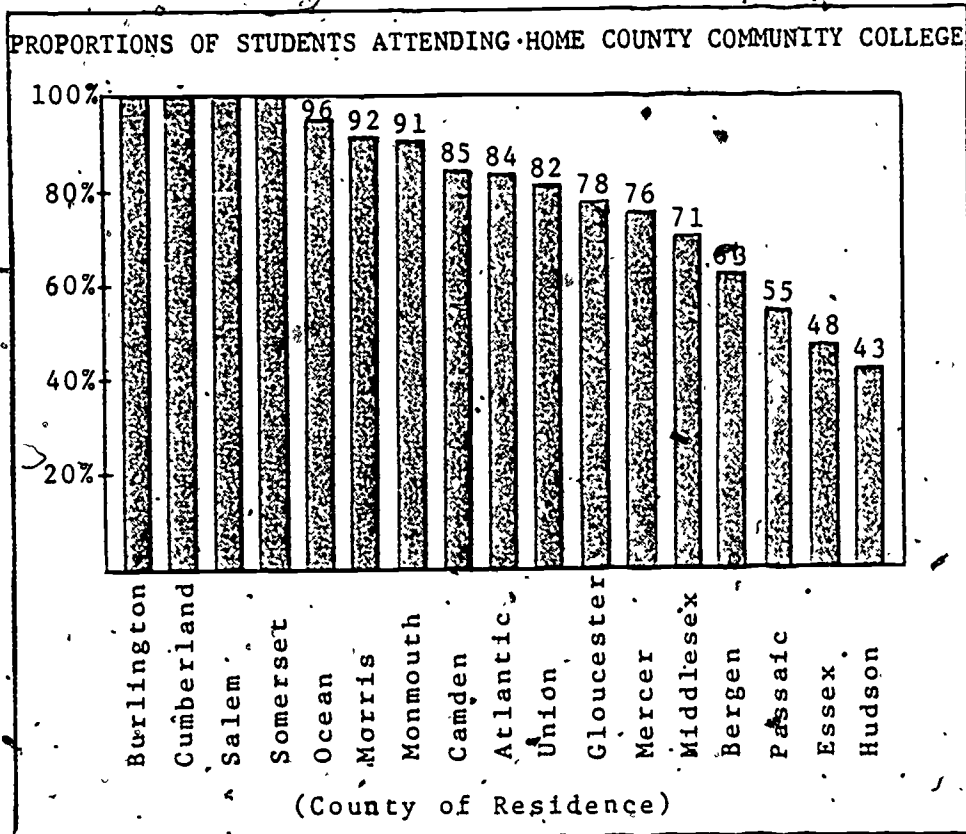

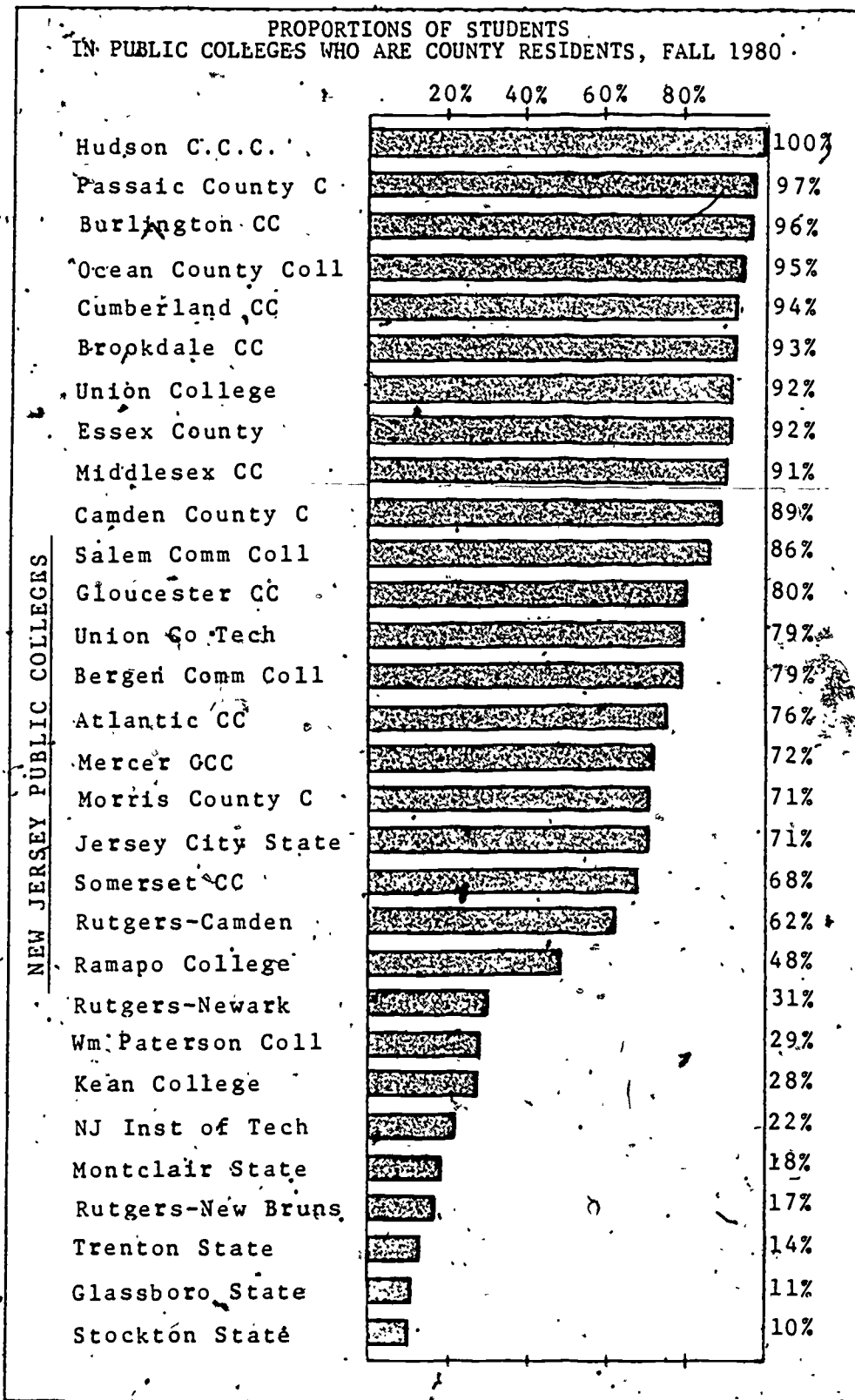

FULL-TIME FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN ENROLLED BY RANK IN CLASS

A percentage distribution of freshmen by rank in high school graduating class comparing fall 1980 with fall 1979 shows an improvement in the class rank of entering freshmen. While the proportion in the top fifth remained unchanged, the proportion in the second fifth increased, lowering proportions in the middle and lower fifths (see Table 10).

On a sector basis, both the state colleges and Rutgers increased their proportions of freshmen in the top two-fifths by 3 percentage points; the independent colleges remained unchanged compared with 1979.

The rank distribution has not changed significantly over the past five years. Since 1977, 41% of the entering freshmen have graduated in the top fifth of their high school classes. The proportion in the second fifth has fluctuated between 28% and 29%, and the middle and lower fifths have fluctuated between 27% and 32%.

FULL-TIME FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN ENROLLED BY SAT SCORES

While the proportions of freshmen in higher class rank categories increased this fall, the proportions in higher SAT score categories (500 and above) remained unchanged in the Verbal Test and declined by two percentage points in the Math Test. In both the Verbal and Math Tests, the proportions of scores in the lowest score category (200 to 399) increased (see Table 11).

Shifts within sectors between fall 1980 and fall 1979 in the proportions of freshmen with scores 500 and above were as follows: the proportion of freshmen scores at the state colleges remained stable in both Verbal and Math; at Rutgers, the proportion of freshmen with Verbal scores of 500 or above was unchanged and the proportion of freshmen with Math scores at that level increased by one percentage point; and at the independent colleges, the proportion of freshmen with 500 or above Verbal scores increased by one percentage point and the proportion with Math scores at that level decreased by one percentage point.

The statewide five-year trend shows that the proportion of freshmen with Verbal scores of 500 and above has dropped from 31% in 1976 to 27% in 1980, and that the proportion of freshmen with Math scores of 500 and above has dropped from 47% in 1976 to 41% in 1980.
