ABSTRACT

Two weeks before their June 1978 graduation, 21,225 students in the Los Angeles (CA) Unified School District graduating class completed a questionnaire about their plans after graduation and their opinions about their senior high school programs. Sixty percent reported that they had chosen their career by the time of their graduation. A smaller percentage of students planned to attend a four-year or two-year college on a full time basis than the percentage who qualified. There was a correspondence between college plans and grade point average, and between college plans and receipt of financial aid for college. With respect to the high school curriculum, respondents agreed that they learned sufficient mathematics skills to work out practical problems, and that their government course helped them understand how the government functions. Classes in art, history, nusic, vocationa's skills, and composition also received positive ratings. Detailed data are presented by district, administrative area, sex, and racial/ethnic group. FOREWORD

The purpose for conducting studies on plans of the graduates at five year intervals is to provide the District with an information base on how the graduates plan to use their high school education and how they perceive the effectiveness of their high school programs for them.

The 1978 graduates included in this study were those who were enrolled in one of the educational alternatives that have been made available to senior high school students in LAUSD. In addition to the 49 regular senior high schools, there were continuation high schools, opportunity centers, and special education schools for the handicapped as well as schools of choice. According to a survey of literature, this number of alternatives meets -- and in most cases, exceeds -- the number available in other school districts across the nation.

District policy on graduation is described in two bulletins from the Office of the Associate Superintendent, Instruction. A senior high school student who has satisfactorily completed the required course of study and has successfully passed all of the performance (proficiency) test requirements is entitled to a diploma which signifies satisfactory completion of both elements. may be granted to those students who have demonstrated satisfactory attendance and deportment while meeting all of the course and credit requirements for senior high school graduation but who did not meet any or all of the performance test requirements established by the • District; these students may participate in the graduation activities In addition, there are students who pass the California and ceremony. High School Proficiency Test, who are awarded the Certificate of Proficiency by the State Board of Education and who subsequently leave school as a graduate. However, this report does not include adult school students because they might have attended high schools in another district and, after a considerable lapse of time, enrolled in the LAUSD's Division of Career and Continuing Education.

For their cooperation in conducting this study, appreciation is extended to the LAUSD staff and students.

INTRODUCTION

I. GENERAL OVERVIEW

"Plans of the 1978 Graduates" is one of a series of such studies of senior high school students published at five-year intervals (1948 - 1978). There were follow-up studies for all but one of these surveys. Results of this current study should be compared with those of previous years with caution because of changes in the student population and District procedures for enrollment and graduation at the senior high school level. Although students from the 49 regular senior high schools were represented in this study, there were also respondents from the other senior high schools who had students eligible to graduate. For example, 31 of the 42 continuation high schools responded; 4 of 7 opportunity centers, 2 of the 11 special education schools for the handicapped that have senior high school programs and 2 of the 4 alternative schools. (See Table of Contents for the names of the schools included in this study).

Two weeks before the June 1978 graduation, 21,225 students in the graduating class completed a two-part questionnaire about their plans after graduation and their opinions about their senior high school programs. Slightly more female than male students responded (10,825 to 10,042) and 358 did not answer this item about the sex of the respondents. Although 5.4% did not indicate their racial/ethnic backgrounds, the other respondents replied as follows compared to the District and senior high school totals listed in the LAUSD "Racial and Ethnic Survey for Fall, 1978":

Of the 31,008 graduates in this class over a three-year period from September 1975 through June 1978 (including the late graduates from the summer of 1978), 21,225 completed the questionnaire for this study - that is, a 68.5% response. (See "Graduation and Attrition Rates in Los Angeles Unified Senior High Schools, Class of 1978").

2. SOURCES OF DATA

In nearly all instances, data for this study resulted from the questionnaire administered to the students. Only data used for verification and/or extension purposes were extrapolated from previous studies in this series or from other reports published by the Research and Evaluation Branch (for example, the LAUSD "Racial and Ethnic Study, Fall 1978").

The first of the two parts in the instrument included nine questions about the respondent and his/her plans. The second part, questions 10 through 24, was designed to elicit responses about the senior high school program. The last part of the questionnaire included space for the student to write comments.

In previous studies, a preponderance of respondents tended to be the academic, college bound student. For the 1973 study, an advisory group found that the most realistic method of separating the academic students from all other students was to ask the respondents if they had completed classes in mathematics, foreign language and laboratory science which are part of the "A-F" subject requirements for entrance to the University of California (there, have been no official "majors" in the LAUSD senior high schools for some time). According to the university bulletins on prerequisites and recommended subjects for admission, an applicant, to be eligible for admission to freshman standing, must be a high school graduate who meets the subject requirements, scholarship requirements and examination requirements. Therefore, for this study, respondents were asked to check whether or inot they had completed the above mentioned classes in item Number 4 on the questionnaire and to check the response which best described their grades so far in high school (mostly A's, B's, etc.) in item Number 9.

3. PROCÉDURES

Data in Parts I and II of the questionnaire were analyzed for sub-groups of respondents in the study, then presented first by summary for the total group and administrative areas. Student data followed, by males and females, then by five racial/ethnic categories listed by the United States Office for Civil Rights, as designated by each respondent. Finally, school-by-school data are shown by the regular senior high schools, then by continuation high schools, opportunity centers, special education schools for the handicapped and alternative schools. Student comments are summarized in the section on findings rather than being listed with the Parts I and II data for each sub-group.

4. FINDINGS

The findings are presented according to information gathered about the respondents, their plans for October 1978 and their opinions of their senior high school programs; approximately one-fourth of the total group made comments as well. In the results that follow, responses were combined, then analyzed first according to the total group, then by administrative areas, student group (male/female and racial/ethnic categories) and individual schools.

Respondents

By administrative areas, the percent of respondents ranged from a low of 65% in Area 4 schools to a high of 90% in Area 6 with a District mean of 77%; that is, the number of graduates responding from each administrative area compared to the number of graduates listed for the month of June. (See "Graduation and Attrition Rates in Los Angeles City Senior High Schools Class of 1978"). The number of female students responding exceeded the number of males by approximately 800, thus reflecting the greater percentage of female students enrolled in LAUSD schools according to data in the Pupil Statistics and Report Section, Budget Division.

The greatest differences appeared when data were compared for students in the five racial/ethnic groups. A greater number of American Indian/Alaskan Natives, Asian/Pacific Islander and White (not Hispanic) students and fewer Black and Hispanic completed the questionnaire than would have been expected when data listed in the Racial and Ethnic Survey, Fall 1978" were reviewed. For the purposes of this study, the graduates identified their own racial/ethnic group, and for the above survey, teachers determined students' ethnicities by visual identification according to criteria supplied by the United States Office for Civil Rights.

Part I: Plans of the 1978 Graduates

Sixty percent of the total sample in the study reported that they had chosen their career by the time of their graduation, a figure that was comparable to the 57% reported in the 1973 study. A slightly higher percentage of the female respondents (63%) said they had selected their careers than had the male respondents (58%). A broader range of response, was found when these data were analyzed by racial/ethnic groups -- from a low of 51% for Asian/ Pacific Islander graduates to a high of 77% for the Black respondents.

Analyses of the data also indicated that a smaller percentage of students in all groups would be attending a four-year or a two-year college on a full time basis in October than the percentage of

respondents who qualified. This was determined by the number of respondents who reported that they had completed the classes which related to the University of California entrance requirements and/or that they had earned a grade average of "A" or "B" compared to the number going to college.

There did appear to be some correspondence between the percent who reported an "A" average with full-time attendance at a four-year college and a "B" average with enrollment in a two-year college. Another factor that appeared to influence college enrollment was the percentage who reported that they would be receiving some type of financial kid. Again, the greatest differences among the groups occurred when the data were analyzed according to the racial/ethnic categories. When responses of students planning to attend either a four-year or a two-year college full time were combined, the range was possibly the greatest of any in the study. Among the racial/ethnic groups, 28% of the American Indian/Alaskan Native, 38% of the Hispanic, 47% of the White, 49% of the Black and 71% of the Asian/Pacific Islander graduates planned to attend college.

The lists of selected careers and colleges are presented by frequency of response for students in the total group, in each administrative area, by sex and racial/ethnic group, and by each school in the study. For further information, please see the questionnaire summaries, items 3 and 5 respectively, for each group in the study.

Part II: 1978 Graduate's Opinion Poll

The third set of findings relates to Part II of the questionnaire -the opinion of the respondents about their senior high school program. The results were analyzed by median scores on a four-point scale (1-4), low to high. Whether the responses were reported for male/female, racial/ ethnic group or administrative area, the range of medians was relatively narrow. On the District level, respondents agreed that they learned sufficient mathematical skills to work out the practical problems of everyday life (3.64) and that their high school course in United States Government helped them understand how the national, state and local governments function (3.59). Classes in art, history, music, vocational skills and composition also received positive ratings (3.38 - 3.50). There was a consensus among all groups of respondents that the school counselors did not seem to have sufficient time allocated for meaningful discussions about school and personal problems of the students (2.54) or for career counseling (2.53).

Comments

Comments were made by approximately one-fourth of the respondents.

The majority of all statements were general or personal in nature, and on the whole, were positive. Those that were specific about a member of a staff and/or some type of instructional program tended to be neutral or somewhat negative. An "I really don't care" attitude was reflected in a number of the comments. The following are a representative sample of those comments:

Instruction: In some of my classes, we were able to learn things beyond what the textbook had to offer. my business classes provided me with all the necessary equipment for my future. I fee the English department could have been stronger. . . our SAT scores are dropping because our teachers are slowed down by useless chaff in the system.

Staff: — We need teachers that really care. . . the faculty was interested in my education and my future. . . most teachers showed an interest in the students' personal lives and created a better relationship with students. . . I think the teachers should work the students harder. . . better counseling . . . faculty and students are friendly and helpful.

Personal: My high school experience was very difficult until I really wanted to learn. . .it was a learning and growing experience that I believe was an important part of my life. . .it helped me learn responsibility. . I think it was a good experience for my future life. . .I feel that this year was great, but I didn't learn as much as I wanted to. . .I didn't learn as much as I could have. . . there is a lack of discipline in some classes, and the students need more motivation to learn. . .I have enjoyed my three years here; I've learned a lot about everything, and I feel it has really helped me. . I wish I could start high school all over again and make something out of myself.

General: We need to be pushed. So push us please!... They didn't push hard enough... the graduation requirements aren't stiff enough... I think they should grade harder and put more life into the classroom. I think school is boring... It was a trip while it lasted... it's a good school, I wouldn't have picked another... there should be a method of sifting out incompétent students... I think that high school students, should be better prepared for collège... like any other school, you only "get out" as much as you "put in"... the school leaves the opportunities up to the students. If they want to learn, the facilities are available.

In addition, a thank you letter was received from a parent of an alternative school graduate.

"This is a long overdue letter. My daughter was privileged to attend the alternative school program at_______

. It was excellent; she learned a great deal, thoroughly enjoyed it and was never bored. The school is to be commended and so is the capable, efficient staff. Thank you for a job well done."

In summary, 42% of all respondents rated their senior high school program excellent or good, 26% satisfactory and 27% fair or poor.

5. CONCLUSIONS

1).

On the basis of the findings cited above, it can be concluded that for Part I (plans of the graduates), 60% of the total sample reported that they had chosen their career by the time of their graduation, a figure that was comparable to the 57% reported in the 1973 study. For the 1978 graduates, there appeared to be a discrepancy between the number of students who qualified for further education and those who would be enrolling in either a four-year or a two-year college.

For Part II (1978 graduate's opinion poll), the respondents indicated that their mathematics and United States Government classes were especially helpful and that there was a need for more counseling time being allocated to help them with career counseling as well as with school and personal problems. In summary, it can be concluded that most of the graduates in this study considered their senior high school program to have been a positive experience for them.
