INTRODUCTION

The National Institute on Drug Abuse is pleased to present this bibliography to achieve a greater sharing of resources and improved access to information. In ethnic minority communities, access to primary prevention tools, such as resources, information, and research studies and data that are relevant, has been limited. The lack of relevant resources and/or the inability to obtain current sources of knowledge in prevention programming have seriously impacted on the requisition of new knowledge and the development of prevention programs in minority communities. In response to this situation the National Institute on Drug Abuse, through its Center for Multicultural Awareness, has consistently sought to increase access to the resources and information currently available that can be applied to ethnic communities. The subject areas of these bibliographies were chosen carefully to reflect the concerns of ethnic communities and to provide information most often requested.

This bibliography contains over 280 references divided into the four subject categories of multicultural prevention, bicultural women and substance abuse prevention, program processes, and sources for Spanish and bilingual materials. A variety of sources were consulted in the compilation of these bibliographies including research journals, the Journal of Drug Education, the Hispanic Journal of Behavioral Sciences, among others and especially those listed in the Drug Abuse and Alcoholism Review. In addition, newsletters, such as La Red (The Net), The Journal, Akwesasne Notes, Drug Survival News, and ADAMHA News were surveyed for book and paper reviews. Additionally, computer searches were obtained from the National Institute on Mental Health and from within the National Institute on Drug Abuse. Contacts with minority prevention practitioners also resulted in identifying a large portion of the sources cited.

To facilitate access to the materials listed in the bibliographies, an address has been provided following each citation. It is recommended, however, that before purchasing books or reprints, that libraries (particularly university libraries) be contacted first to obtain these materials. Inter-library loan services allow for borrowing between libraries; contact your local library for information. In the case of journal articles, the publisher's address has been listed as the primary source rather than the individual author(s).
