ABSTRAC

Data tables and graphs illustrate trends in enrollment and student characteristics at Los Angeles City College (LACC) for the years 1972 through 1981. First, six tables present statistics on: (1) fall semester enrollment broken down according to day/evening status, sex, full-/part-time status, freshman/sophomore status, first-time/continuing status, age, and ethnic groups; (2) admissions classifications of LACC students (i.e., first-time freshmen, first-time transfers, returning transfers, returning students, and continuing students); (3-5) LACC new enrollments according to public and private feeder high schools; and (6) first-time transfers to LACC from forgign countries. Next, ten graphs are provided to illustrate trends revealed in these data. Finally, observations on the statings are presented. Total enrollment over the ten-year period varied less than 5% from the average if the years 1974 and 1975 are omitted. Females outnumbered males in all years except 1974 and 1977, with the percentage of females peaking at 55% in 1977. Ethnic distributions have changed significantly over the perjod, with a sharp decrease in White enrollments (from 38% in 1972 to 22% in 1981) and steady increases in Hispanic and Asian enrollments. Median age has (with the exception of 1974 and 1975) increased steadily from 24 to 26 years of age. The percentage of students transferring from a foreign high school or college has almost doubled since 1975 (from 12% to 22%). (AYC)

Purpose of the Study

In Fall 1972, the LACCD Office of Educational Research and Analysis provided LACC with some summary statistics related to enrollment and student characteristics. This information has been provided for each Fall semester since that time.

Since ten years have now elapsed, it seemed appropriate to look at these data to identify trends. This study looks at both this information and other available information for that purpose.

Procedure of the Study

In addition to the information provided by the District Office through their Fall Enrollment Analysis (1972-1981), additional information was obtained from the Admissions Office. This information consisted of reports (CCAF Reports #130&131) sent to the State detailing sources of students. The findings of the next section present selected items from these two sources.

Findings

Figure 1 - LACC Fall Enrollments 1972-1981




Figure 2 - LACC Fall Enrollments, 1972-1981: Rercent Male & Female




Figure 3 - LACC Fall Enrollments, 1972-1981: Ethnic Distributions





Figure 4 - LACC Fall Enrollment 1972-81:

First Time and Continuing




Figure 8 - LACC Fall Enrollment 1972-81: % 1st Time Freshman & Transfers

Figure 9 - LACC Fall Enrollment 1972-81: % from LACCD High Schools & Foreign High Schools





Figure 10 - Transfers to LACO from Foreign High Schools and Colleges Fall Semesters 1972-81 (% of all new students)



Summary and Conclusions

of students enrolling at LACC during the ten Fall semesters from 1972 through

- than 5% from the average if the 1974 and 1975 years are omitted. (These two years show inflated enrollments due primarily to the fact that special courses given off-campus to municipal employees were included in enrollment figures.) Following the passage of Proposition 13 in 1978, enrollment dropped slightly but rebounded strongly in 1980 and 1981 to levels above all years except 1974 and 1975.
- (2) Females have out numbered males in all years except 1974, and 1975. Percent females peaked at 55% in 1977 and then declined to 52% in 1981.
- (3) Ethnic distributions have changed significantly over the ten year period. Percent White dropped sharply from nearly 40% in 1972 to about 20% in 1977 and has since remained at about the 20% figure. Percent Blacks increased to a high of over 40% in 1977 and has since declined to just over 30%. Percent Asian and percent Hispanic have both increased steadily over the ten year period and both now approximately equal the percent White.

- (41 Median age has (with the exception of 1974 and 1975)
 increased steadily over the ten year period from 24
 to 26 years of age. Percent of students in their teens
 dropped about a third over the period (from 22% to 15%).
- (5) Percent day (about 62%) and percent evening (about 30%) has remained relatively stable over the ten years.

 Students who took both day and evening classes (about 10%) are counted as day students.
- make up slightly less than one-third of the total.

 The percent full time has dropped over the ten year period, but only slightly.
- dropped steadily from 1976 to 1979 but has since increased to about the 1976 level.

 Percent first time freshman seems to follow this pattern.

 Percent first time students however shows the reverse of this pattern, due to the fact that a consistent increase

in transfer students has taken place in the last five years.

Percent freshman (total units completed less than thirty)

- (8) The increase in transfer students referred to above is accounted for almost totally by an increase in students ransferring from a foreign high school or college. This percent* has almost doubled since 1975 (12% to 22%).
- (9) Of the total first time freshmen, the percent coming froma Los Angeles District High School has dropped steadily from 1973 (from about 60% to 50%).

- (10) Belmont High School sent more students to LACC than any other high school in each of the ten years.

 Marshall, Hollywood and Los Angeles have been runners-up.
- (11) Bishop Conaty, Cathedral, and Our Lady of Loretta have been the leading private high school feeders. None would rank in the top ten of all high school feeders, however.
- (12) Philippine Islands has been the leaders each year in the number of first time transfers from a foreign country. In the last three years South Kores, El Salvador and South Vietnam have made sizable increases.
- Although data are not presented in this study, preliminary District information indicates that the LACC percent (22%) is the highest in the District, almost double that of East L.A. (the next highest)
