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ABSTRACT Data related to the 1982 budget for federal research and development funding are highlighted in this brief publication. Although budget authority for the total federal research and development programs in 1982 represents a seven percent increase, this figure also represents a constant-dollar decrease of almost two percent. The 1982 budget accentuates a pattern already evident in the 1981 budget in that growth in national defense has far outpaced growth in other functional areas. (SK)

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TOTAL FEDERAL R&D FUNDING ESTIMATED TO INCREASE 7 PERCENT IN 1982 AFTER SEPTEMBER REVISIONS

The data below are based on an updating of *Special Analysis K* in the 1982 budget, issued by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) in April 1981, and on *Budget Amendments, Fiscal Year 1982*, also issued by OMB and dated September 30, 1981. The second document was the source of preliminary estimates for revised R&D request levels in 1982. Most R&D programs were broadly identifiable, but in the case of a few smaller R&D support agencies, a reduction of 12 percent from March levels was used in making estimates, the same reduction as was applied to the nondefense portion of the overall budget.

Research and Development

- Budget authority for total Federal R&D programs in 1982, as revised in September,¹ is now an estimated \$37.9 billion, or 7 percent higher than the \$35.5 billion estimated for 1981 (table 1). This represents a constant-dollar decline of almost 2 percent.²
- Whereas the nondefense portion of the total discretionary budget in the September revisions was cut 12 percent from March levels, the nondefense portion of the R&D total was cut an estimated 8 percent.
- The Department of Defense (DOD) and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) now show 1982 increases over 1981 R&D funding levels of 21 percent and 5 percent, respectively (table 2). All other agencies show decreases in 1982 as compared with 1981; of the five leading R&D support agencies, the Department of Energy (DOE) reflects the largest decrease—16 percent.

- In terms of functions, the 1982 budget accentuates a pattern already evident in the 1981 budget wherein growth in national defense far outpaced growth in other functional areas. R&D budget authority for national defense in 1982 is now expected to increase by 21 percent over 1981. The increase for space research and technology is estimated to be 5 percent in 1982 with growth almost entirely dependent on funding plans for the space shuttle, which was exempt from September cuts. Increases for national defense and the space shuttle are the sole factors in the overall 1982 R&D gain. For the civilian R&D total (overall minus defense) the budget shows a decrease in 1982 of 8 percent from 1981 in current dollars.

Basic Research

- An overall decrease for basic research budget authority in 1982 is expected under the proposed September amendments, with total funding set at \$4.9 billion (table 3). The estimated decline from 1981, however, is in a range of only 1 percent to 2 percent.
- DOD is the sole leading basic research support agency to show an increase in 1982 in basic research funding—15 percent.
