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ABSTRACT

Fifteen tables present data from New York State's public schools on all teaching and nonteaching professional personnel for 1981-82, including administrators. Information is presented on number of personnel, salary percentiles, academic degree and certification status, sex, age, and years of professional experience. The first 6 tables give data on professional personnel in 72 professional fields. Table 7 looks at the characteristics of teachers in the state's 13 regions, while table 8 notes trends in teacher characteristics statewide from 1977 to 1982. The final seven tables provide information on all superintendents and on principals at various school levels. (RW)

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## INTRODUCTION

Information contained in this report was derived from New York State's Basic Educational Data System and is based on data submitted by all public elementary and secondary schools in the State. The analyses included in this report were made possible, in large measure, by the excellent cooperation of school districts in striving for completeness and accuracy in filing the source documents. Special note should also be made of the contribution of the Department's Division of Electronic Data Processing which had responsibility in both the developmental and processing aspects of the Basic Educational Data System.

The statistics in this report--number of positions, salary, degree status, experience, age, sex, and certification status--are detailed for all nonteaching and teaching professional positions within professional field and for public school teachers within geographic region.

The reader of this report should keep in mind that information presented by professional field (Tables 1-6) deals with positions rather than people. If an employee of a district works in more than one professional field, i.e., English and Social Studies, he/she is counted once in each field. The tables showing characteristics of public school teachers (Tables 7-8) and administrators (Tables 9-15) do not contain duplication but rather represent unduplicated counts of individuals. In addition, except for the information on salaries, which is limited to persons employed on a full-time basis, no distinction is made between full- and part-time positions.

Salary data contained in this report are presented with several other demographic characteristics for a more comprehensive overview. For example, Table 2, reports median salaries of \$23,087 for English teachers and \$24,000 for Industrial Arts teachers. However, since teachers' salaries are influenced

by other factors, Table 5 shows that the median years of experience for English teachers is 13 as compared to 15 for Industrial Arts teachers, putting the salary differential in perspective.

Table 8 is a trend table showing selected characteristics for public school teachers over the five-year period from 1977-78 to 1981-82.

The data included here represent summaries of the wide variety of analyses which are produced from the personnel file of the Basic Educational Data System. More detailed information on staff as well as on school and district variables is available on request from the Information Center on Education.
