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ABSTRACT

To assist California school district personnel in their selection of state-adopted instructional materials, this catalog of literature materials consists of four parts. The first, an annotated index of instructional materials identified as basic materials, gives pertinent information about each literature program, including program title, year of copyright, identification of program components, designated grade levels, adoption termination date, readability levels, and a brief description of the program. The listing for each literature program also includes a page number reference to the second part of the catalog, where more detailed information about the materials is provided. This information includes a general description and sections on program organization, methodology, evaluation, teacher materials, and related materials. The price list/order form accompanies the description of each item. The third part of the catalog is an index of supplementary materials which includes program title, year of copyright, identification of program components, designated grade levels, adoption termination date, and a program description. Also included is a page number reference indicating the page on which the reader will find the price list and order form for the listed items. This price list constitutes the fourth section of the catalog. (HOD)

Foreword

California's system for adopting instructional materials for use in kindergarten through grade eight consists of two important phases. The first occurs at the state level. The State Board of Education, assisted by the Curriculum Development and Supplemental Materials Commission and other advisory groups, determines which materials are to be adopted for statewide use and then supplies school districts with lists of the materials. The instructional materials must be sufficiently diverse to meet the educational needs of all the schoolchildren in California, and they must be in compliance with the legal requirements set forth in the Education Code. The second phase occurs when school districts receive these lists and must then decide which of the materials listed will best fit their own programs and are best suited for their students.

In designing the procedures to be followed in the first phase of the process, the State Board recognized an obligation to give school districts as much information as possible to help them in the selection process. As a result the Board directed that this selection catalog be prepared and distributed to all schools in the state.

The catalog includes broad classifications of the materials and descriptions of their chief characteristics and approaches; I believe school districts can use the catalog to do an efficient job of selection. The catalog cannot, however, be considered a substitute for the careful examination of those materials. It can only help to limit the number of materials school district personnel will need to examine.

Teachers and county and district personnel throughout the state gave freely of their time and expertise to make this document available to their colleagues, and I am grateful for their help.

Since the test of this document will be its usefulness to school district personnel in their selection of materials, I invite your comments and any suggestions you might have for future catalogs.

Preface

The 1972 provisions of the Education Code placed upon school districts a new responsibility for selecting instructional materials from an extensive list provided by the State Board of Education. At the same time, the Education Code limited allotments to districts to no more than \$7 per unit of average daily attendance, minus certain overhead costs of the state, plus, in subsequent years, cost-of-living adjustments. Since that time the allotments to districts have been changed to reflect those adjustments. Allotments are now somewhat over \$14 per unit of a.d.a.

In the selection process each district must take three actions. First, the district must plan its curriculum objectives and project a schedule for when it wishes to replace materials in each subject-matter area. Second, the district must inventory those materials on hand that will help the district accomplish its curriculum objectives. Third, the district must decide what kinds of materials are needed from the state to satisfy the remainder of its instructional materials needs.

Some districts complete the cited tasks on a districtwide basis; others do so on a school basis. Either way, these actions must be taken before this selection catalog can be useful. By using the catalog, districts can reduce the number of materials that must be viewed in making their selections.

Staff development programs can be most important when new materials are introduced to teachers. Publishers and producers are often ready and willing to provide assistance with such programs.

It is hoped that school districts will look upon this process as an opportunity to increase their control over their own curricula and to improve their selections of instructional materials.

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Introduction

Selection catalogs have been prepared for the 1982 adoption in the subjects of reading and literature. An addition has been made to the *Catalog of Instructional Materials in English and Dictionaries*. The addendum describes an English program for students who are achieving above grade level. The new catalogs and the addendum include the price lists and the selection guide narratives. Also included are an annotated index of basic materials, separate write-ups for each basic program, and an annotated index for supplementary materials.

Each selection catalog has four distinct parts. The first is an annotated index of instructional materials identified as basic materials. This index gives pertinent information about each program, including program title, year of copyright, identification of program components, designated grade levels, adoption termination date (June 30 of the indicated year), readability level(s), and a brief description of the program. The readability information was provided by the publishers, and ranges and averages are included in the index. Individual publishers should be contacted if further clarification is needed. The listing for each program also includes a page number reference to

the second part of the catalog, where more detailed information about the materials is provided. This information includes a general description and sections on program organization, methodology, evaluation, teacher materials, and related materials. The price list/order form accompanies the description of each item.

The third part of the catalog is an index of supplementary materials. This supplementary index includes program title, year of copyright, identification of program components, designated grade levels, adoption termination date, and a program description. Also included is a page number reference indicating the page on which the reader will find the price list and order form for the listed item(s). This price list constitutes the fourth section of the catalog.

Use of the catalog should not be substituted for actual study of the adopted materials, and users of the catalog are therefore urged to examine the materials at one of the 30 instructional materials display centers (IMDCs) throughout the state. A list of the addresses of these centers may be found in the separate instruction packet.

General Description

This literature series has selections from past and present masters of their craft from Irving to Bradbury. The variety of selections covers a broad spectrum of topics and settings. In addition to discussion questions for each selection, the text also includes vocabulary lessons, composition assignments, and lessons on literary terms. A Literary Terms Handbook, glossary, index by types of literature, and a general index are included in the back of each text. The series is not recommended for students who are achieving two or more years below grade level.

Organization

Each text has eight units. Units are organized thematically, structurally, and generically.

Methodology

New literary terms are introduced at each level, and the Literary Terms Handbook for each level is cumulative of the terms introduced at prior levels. The units may be taught as they are arranged in the text, or the indexes may be used to design an approach suited to a particular group or to provide emphasis.

Provision for Student Evaluation

Each literary selection is accompanied by questions designed to evaluate understanding on four levels of progressive difficulty. Exercises are included with Vocabulary and Writer's Craft (literary terms) lessons.

Teachers Guide/Edition

The Teachers Manual includes program overview and structure; a scope-and-sequence chart; a list of general resources for teachers at the beginning of each unit; unit objectives; background information, where appropriate, for selections; answers to questions in the student text; composition guidelines; review quizzes for each selection; and lists of selected student resources (films, recordings, and books). The compo-

sition guidelines may be used to motivate reluctant writers; they may be used by students for self or peer evaluation or exclusively by the teacher.

General Description

ODYSSEY is a nine-volume series of hardcover literature anthologies for grades 1—7. The program includes traditional and contemporary literature and works that are representative of many cultures. The series is designed to help students gain an understanding and appreciation of literature and to support instruction in reading and the language arts. Each book spans a range of reading levels, and every prose selection is identified as "easy," "average," or "challenging."

Organization

The program is organized thematically around six strands. Beginning with the first reader, there are six thematic units in each book. Emphasis is placed on the skills of literary appreciation, reading comprehension, and composition. The development is spiral, and all skills are indexed in the Teachers Edition.

Methodology

The texts may be used for independent reading or for classroom instruction. When used independently, students receive the instruction and

practice provided by the literature skills lessons and by the question/activity pages which follow most selections.

Provision for Student Evaluation

The program is not designed for formal evaluation because of the emphasis placed on the enjoyment of literature. Informal evaluation is provided by the question/activity pages, the literature skills lessons, and the additional activities in the Teachers Edition.

Teachers Guide/Edition

There is a hardcover Teachers Edition for each book. The Teachers Edition provides a skills index, professional articles on teaching literature, and annotated student pages.

Related Materials

A volume for the eighth grade is available from the publisher. Audio cassettes are in preparation. These cassettes will provide professional readings of selections from each level.

General Description

JOURNEYS is a reading and literature program for seventh- and eighth-grade students who are achieving at or below grade level. Each book contains high-interest, easy-to-read fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and drama. Literature skills, reading skills, word attack skills, and composition are taught with the selections.

Organization

Each book contains five thematic units. Each half of the book ends with a long selection for an extended reading experience. In the thematic units, selections are followed by review questions for comprehension, literature skill questions, activities (including composition), reading skill questions, and word attack questions. Short poems, followed by review questions or activities, are interspersed throughout the thematic units.

Methodology

Selections provide for a variety of levels within one grade. Each thematic unit focuses on one literature skill category and one reading skill cate-

gory. Materials may be used sequentially or in an order suited to individual or group needs.

Provision for Student Evaluation

Questions after selections and end-of-unit tests provide for evaluation. The teachers manuals contain check tests on the selections and on word attack skills and end-of-unit tests on reading skills. Test booklets are available.

Teachers Guide/Edition

The teachers manuals state the teaching objectives and contain the scope-and-sequence charts. They contain complete lesson plans, including lead-in and follow-up activities, for the selections.

Related Materials

Test booklets are provided. Each test for a selection consists of comprehension questions, vocabulary questions, reading skill questions, and word attack questions.

General Description

This series of literature readers is for grades 4—6, with an emphasis on encouraging reading independently for pleasure and appreciation. Bibliographies and a glossary are provided in each student book. Selections are identified in the Teachers Edition as "easy," "average," or "challenging." The books are suitable for use as a literature supplement with any reading program. The readers can be used independently by students who are reading on level, or they can be used selectively (as directed by the teacher) by students who need easy or challenging reading

Organization

Each thematic unit contains a variety of selections in which students may practice comprehension and literature appreciation skills; therefore, sequential use of the material is unnecessary. A concise index of

skills is provided in the Teachers Edition. A scope-and-sequence chart is available in the teachers editions. Emphasis is on reading literature for pleasure, with Teachers Edition instruction available in literature appreciation and comprehension skills areas.

Methodology

After a general introduction, students are encouraged to read independently. Teachers may select from a variety of selections on several reading levels. Teaching plans are provided with additional information, comprehension guides, and activities for individualization, enrichment, writing, and additional reading.

Provision for Student Evaluation

Since this is a series that could supplement any reading program and is

for pleasure reading, no separate evaluative component is provided. Informal assessment may occur at any time, using the illustrative teaching plans in the Teachers Edition as a guide.

Teachers Guide/Edition

The Teachers Edition contains all student book pages, full size. Two types of teaching plans are provided for each thematic unit—Illustrative Selections and Additional Selections. The Illustrative Selections unit

has a teaching plan with objectives, background and summary, vocabulary, and instruction in comprehension and literature appreciation skills that are applicable to the selection. The Additional Selections unit has to be used for individualization and independent reading. Specific suggestions are provided for establishing a resource center.

General Description

General Description

The two books adopted, *Purpose in Literature* and *Literature and Life*, are for grades 7 and 8. Selections are classical, traditional, and contemporary, including genre ranging from articles to essays, short stories, poetry, myths, and plays. The reading level is 6.4 on the Dale-Chall scale.

Organization

Each of the books is organized into eight units, mostly thematic, but a few are based on genre alone.
