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ABSTRACT

In 1982, 46,818 students graduated from all Kentucky high schools; 23,232 (49.6%) were boys and 23,586 (50.4%) were girls. There were 42,700 students graduated from public schools, which represented 65% of the 9th grade enrollment of 1978-79. There were 4,118 students, or 8.8% of the state total, graduated from non-public high schools. Sixty-nine percent of the non-public school graduates and 42.3% of the public school graduates were attending colleges or universities, for an overall percentage rate of 44.7%. Of the total 1982 graduates, 21.8% were employed, 3.8% were in the military, 8.4% were unemployed, and 12.7% were other/unknown. Of the 175 public high schools with graduating classes, 14 (8%) graduated less than 50, and 54 (30%) graduated less than 100. Of the reporting non-public high schools with graduating classes, 17 (55%) graduated less than 50, while 24 (77%) graduated less than 100. Primary sources of data were principals' annual reports, superintendents' end-of-year reports, and the "Biennial Report of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction." Part I provides an indication of school holding power and whereabouts of graduates for both public and non-public high schools. Part II presents summary data on holding power trends from 1973 to 1982. (BRR)

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Message from the Superintendent

For a number of years this publication has been identified with the simple reporting of numbers and percents of ninth graders graduating from high school. The volume you are now reading again has this as one of its major functions. The reporting of the numbers of ninth graders in Kentucky's schools who go on to graduate from high school is relevant information, but the report's value in providing additional information should not be overlooked.

The Kentucky Department of Education places a high priority on developing an educational system which will encourage every student to complete his or her high school education. Since the minimum level of performance required by our society is the high school diploma, this priority cannot be compromised. Another major concern of this report is what happens to Kentucky high school graduates after they complete high school. We must be aware of this if we are to analyze and understand the impact of elementary and secondary education in our state and tailor education to meet the changing nature of our complex society and our young people's role in it.

This report notes a .4 percent increase in the percentage of ninth graders who did graduate as compared to last year's report. If we are to continue to maintain our educational gains in preparing youth for the future, we must continue to give consideration to the factors which motivate our students.

This report is one step in that direction.

Foreword

In an attempt to provide objective measures by which the growth and change of the secondary school system in Kentucky may be analyzed, this document, The Holding Power and Graduates, is replicated annually.

If looked at over the twenty-seven years of publication, Holding Power and Graduates provides a historical perspective critical to understanding the ways in which the needs of the students in Kentucky have changed and how the school system has adapted to meet these needs. This publication documents selected aspects of these changes. It provides evidences of the contributions that a sound Foundation Program make for the future of Kentucky schools.

The comparative analysis of the data relating to the class of 1982 and that of 1967 reveals significant improvements in education in the fifteen-year span. Increases in holding power for the entire K-12 structure are reflections of effective school organization, quality staffing, and improved educational opportunity.

For clarification it should be understood what constitutes holding power, what it does and does not represent. Holding power simply defined is the percent of students graduating from high school based on the ninth grade population four years earlier. It is a numerical reporting system that assumes a stable student population. If a specific high school has a 1976 ninth grade enrollment of 100 and 1980 graduating class of 75, it has a holding power of 75 percent. Since it is numbers, not individual students that are represented a 75 percent holding power does not indicate a 25 percent drop-out rate.

A drop-out rate is calculated on an entirely different basis. It is determined on an individual student basis.

Holding power is an indicator of educational quality and is useful for long-range analysis and planning.

It is hoped that this bulletin will be helpful to people, especially those individuals who are responsible for the development of educational policy and practice, in interpreting the growth and change factors in the Kentucky secondary education system.

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Introduction

This twenty-seventh annual report in the series of bulletins on Holding Power and Graduates of Kentucky High Schools has the purpose of providing an overview of growth during the 1967-82 period, in addition to presenting an analysis of data for the current graduating class of 1982. The 1966-67 school year marked the beginning of the seventh year of a new era in public education in Kentucky with a record-breaking appropriation made possible by revenue from the enactment of a sales tax. While there are many dimensions of a comprehensive state-local-federal financing plan for providing full educational opportunity, it is generally agreed that the ultimate criterion of adequacy of any plan is the quality and quantity of educational outcomes made possible through its operation. The class of 1982 is the eleventh graduating class having full advantage of a twelve-year program under the Minimum Foundation Program.

Using the seventh year of the decade of the Sixties as base line data, and the graduate output for the current year (1982), the following comparisons point to selected measures in the 15-year period of growth and expansion of the high school program in Kentucky.

As reported in Table 1, the increase in the number of all high school graduates for the class of 1982 (46,818) as compared to the class of 1967 (40,849) is 5,969 or 14.6 percent.

While this increase in graduates was taking place, the actual number of births for the corresponding year 1964 (class of 1982) compared to the births in 1949 (class of 1967) decreased from 75,610 in 1949 to 61,392 in 1964 or a decrease of 23.3 percent.1

A comparison of whereabouts of graduates of all Kentucky high schools, 1967 and 1982, reveals the following changes in a 15-year span in the standard categories for which principals provide data. These changes are shown in Table 1 on the following page.

In the fall of 1967, 21,734 or 53.2 percent of June graduates were reported entering a formal program of education beyond the high school level. Fifteen years later, principals reported 24,927 or 53.2 percent of the 1981 graduates enrolled in a post-secondary program -- college or university, trade, technical, nursing school or business school. A graphic comparison is shown in Figure 1.

As shown in Figure 1, the pattern of the whereabouts of Kentucky's graduates has remained relatively stable over the past 15-year period in most categories. One notable exception occurs in the Unknown category. A larger percent of the 1982 class was reported as unknown than was reported for the 1967 class; 8.6 percent in 1982 as opposed to 5.5 percent in 1967. The number and percentage of graduates who continued education beyond high school increased over the benchmark year of 1967.

ENROLLMENT PER ONE THOUSAND NINTH GRADERS




Figure 2 portrays the enrollment pattern over the past four years. Over the past 10 years, the pattern portrayed in the above figure has remained fairly constant.

As indicated in Table 2, there were 46,818 students graduating from all Kentucky high schools, of which 23,232 (49.6 percent) were boys and 23,586 (50.4 percent) were girls. There were 20,917 students recorded as entering college or 44.7 percent of the total 1982 graduating class. There were 24,927 (53.2 percent) of 46,818 graduates recorded as entering into some formal educational program beyond the high school level including special and trade schools.

Source and Interpretation of Data

There are two primary sources of data on public high school graduates; the principal's annual report and the superintendent's end-of-year report. Statistical data on number of graduates in the principal's report in October may vary from end-of-year enrollment data in the statistical report of the superintendent, submitted at the close of the school year on June 30. The data for graduates of public school districts are published in the Biennial Report of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The latter report includes graduates of public school districts only, whereas this report accounts for all reported graduates of public and non-public high schools in the state. Non-public schools who did not report are not included.

A further precaution is necessary in distinguishing between "holding power" as defined in this report and school dropouts. The method of determining retention rates follows the national pattern. In this bulletin series, rates for the ninth grade through high school graduation are based on enrollment in successive grades in successive years of all <u>public</u> and <u>non-public</u> schools. The data at hand limit the base year to the ninth grade. State data are collected annually on the School Data Form.

REPORTING THE DATA

Tables 1 and 2 on the preceding pages portray the rapid growth of secondary education in the Sixties and Seventies. The Highlights section provides a brief summary of tabular data.

Part I presents current data on holding power and graduates of public and non-public school districts in Tables 3 and 4. Trends and related data are shown in Part II.



Highlights

PUBLIC SCHOOLS

There were 42,700 students, composing 91.2 percent of the total, graduating from Kentucky's public high schools in the spring of 1982. Public high school refers to all high schools under the direct control of any one of the 180 local school districts across the Commonwealth. Of the public high school graduates, 21,562 (50.5 percent) were girls, while the remaining 21,138 (49.5 percent) were boys. There were 18,075 (42.3 percent) recorded as entering college. There were 21,870 (42.3 percent) of these graduates recorded as entering into some type of formal educational program beyond the high school level including special and trade schools.

NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS

There were 4,118 students, or 8.8 percent of the state total, graduating from Kentucky's non-public high schools in the spring of 1982. This includes all high schools not under the direct control of one of the 100 local school districts; state or federally controlled, parochial or private. Of the non-public high school graduates, there were 2,024 (49.2 percent) girls and 2,094 (50.8 percent) boys. There were 2,842 (69.0 percent) students recorded as entering college. There were 3,057 (74.2 percent) recorded as entering some formal program of education, including special and trade schools. This data represents only non-public schools who elected to report. All schools in this category are not necessarily included.



Part I Holding Power and Graduates

Tables 3 and 4 included in this section provide a comprehensive overview of the number and whereabouts of graduates of all Kentucky public and non-public school districts, for the school year 1981-82. There were 71,086 ninth grade public and non-public high school students enrolled in Kentucky schools in 1978-79. Of these ninth graders, 46,818 or 65.9 percent were graduates in 1982.

As previously discussed, the data concerning the whereabouts of the 1982 graduating class are collected on the School Data Form. LEA personnel responsible for completing these forms have been asked to include all 1982 graduates plus any subsequent summer school graduates. They are asked to be sure this count does not include duplicates. These data are collected in the fall on an annual basis.



Part II Trends: Holding Power and Related Data

The brief trends data on holding power and graduates in this section, even of short duration, provide useful benchmarks for appraising extent and rate of change in secondary education in Kentucky. Though limited to measures of quantity only, the data provide important indices to aid in high school program evaluation and as a base for further curriculum study.

As a general measure of holding power, Tables 5, 6, and 7 provide a concise summary of the ten graduating classes of public, non-public, and combined high schools from 1973 to 1982. The majority of graduates of 1982 were enrolled in the first grade in the school year 1970-71--fifteenth year of the Foundation Program Law of 1956.

Table 5 presents statewide data for public school districts on survival rates and whereabouts of graduates of public high schools for ten graduating classes, 1981-82 inclusive. Corresponding data for non-public high schools are presented in Table 6. Table 7 shows the combined data for all high schools and provides, in terms of enrollment and holding power, a measure of the growth of the total secondary program in Kentucky.
