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ABSTRACT

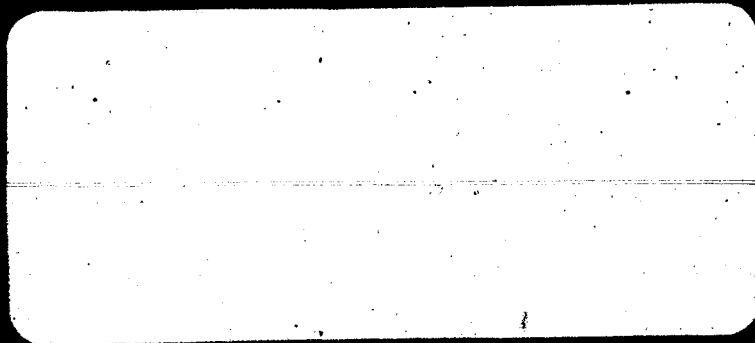
Normative data on students who took the American College Testing (ACT) Program Assessment during the 1981-1982 academic year are presented, based on a 10 percent national sample. Statistics are presented on academic abilities, interests, goals and aspirations, high school achievements and student characteristics, evaluation of the local high school, and college attractions. Specific tables include: distributions of ACT score frequencies, percentile ranks, and percentages for men and women combined and separately; grade level at time of testing and mean ACT composite test score; distributions of high school grades; distributions of interest score scales for men, women, and combined total; percentage distributions of planned college majors and vocational choice fields; degree aspirations; number of out-of-class accomplishments during high school; profile of students according to type of postsecondary institution selected and according to high school curriculum; perceived adequacy of high school curriculum according to curriculum or program; relative importance of college choice factors; and within-state colleges selected by students, listed according to the number of times selected choice number one. THE NATIONAL NORMS ARE BASED ON A TEN-PERCENT SAMPLE OF ALL STUDENTS WHO WROTE THE ACT ASSESSMENT ON A NATIONAL TEST DATE DURING THE 1981-82 SCHOOL YEAR. THOSE STUDENTS WHO TESTED RESIDUALLY OR WHO FAILED TO LIST A VALID HIGH SCHOOL CODE ARE NOT REPRESENTED BY THESE NORMS BECAUSE THEY ARE NOT INCLUDED IN THE INDIVIDUAL REPORTS PROVIDED TO THE HIGH SCHOOLS.

IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT COLLEGE-BOUND STUDENTS WHO WRITE THE ACT ASSESSMENT ARE NOT REPRESENTATIVE, IN SOME RESPECTS, OF COLLEGE-BOUND STUDENTS NATIONALLY. FIRST, STUDENTS WHO LIVE IN THE MIDWEST, ROCKY MOUNTAINS AND PLAINS, AND THE SOUTH ARE OVER-REPRESENTED AMONG ACT-TESTED STUDENTS AS COMPARED TO COLLEGE-BOUND STUDENTS NATIONALLY. SECOND, ACT-TESTED STUDENTS TEND TO ENROLL IN PUBLIC COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES MORE FREQUENTLY THAN DO COLLEGE-BOUND STUDENTS NATIONALLY.

TABLES 6.2, 6.3, AND THE NARRATIVE SUMMARY REPORT ARE NOT INCLUDED IN THE NATIONAL NORMS.

STATE NORMS

STATE NORMS ARE BASED ON ALL STUDENTS IN YOUR STATE WHO WROTE THE ACT ASSESSMENT ON A NATIONAL TEST DATE DURING THE 1981-82 SCHOOL YEAR. THOSE STUDENTS WHO TESTED RESIDUALLY OR WHO FAILED TO LIST A VALID HIGH SCHOOL CODE ARE NOT REPRESENTED BY THESE NORMS, BECAUSE THEY ARE NOT INCLUDED IN THE INDIVIDUAL REPORTS PROVIDED TO THE HIGH SCHOOLS.

STATE NORMS ARE PREPARED FOR EVERY STATE FOR WHICH 1000 OR MORE STUDENTS COMPLETED THE ACT ASSESSMENT DURING THE 1981-82 SCHOOL YEAR. IF STATE NORMS ARE NOT INCLUDED WITH THIS REPORT, YOU CAN ASSUME THAT NORMS WERE NOT COMPLETED FOR YOUR STATE.
