ABSTRACT

A survey of special education class size completed by 70% of the states resulted in tables depicting class size guidelines for a number of types of handicapping conditions: hearing impairments, multiple handicaps, mental retardation, orthopedic handicaps, profound handicaps, serious emotional disturbance, speech/language disability, and visual handicaps. Some states reported a range of class size, with the lower number representing younger students and the upper number representing older students. Average class size for hearing impaired/deaf was 8, multihandicapped 8, mentally retarded 11, orthopedically handicapped 10, profoundly handicapped 6, seriously emotionally disturbed 8, speech and language disabled 10, and visually handicapped/blind 9. CLASS SIZE SURVEY

PURPOSE OF SURVEY

To investigate states' special education class size guidelines, where they exist. The Caucus hoped that the resulting information would prove valuable in gaining a broad picture of the programs provided in special education nationally.

METHODOLOGY

The National Education Association, Caucus of Educators of Exceptional Children authorized the survey at the National Convention of the N.E.A. in Los Angeles, July, 1982. The request to each state director of special education was sent out in August, 1982 (copies attached).

Seventy percent of the states responded with information on their special éducation class size guidelines; the information they provided was recorded by category of handicapping conditions. A summary of class size averages follows at the end of the report.

LIMITATIONS OF SURVEY

Although only 70% of the states responded, no follow-up was done, so there is no information on the states not heard from. The results from this survey should be viewed as a pilot survey. The goal of the Caucus is to continue to do continued studies in this area.
