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ABSTRACT

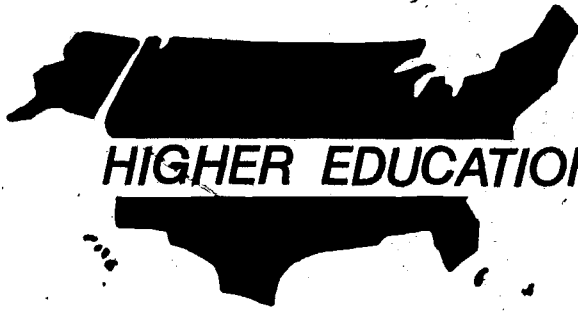
Results of an updated survey on the basic legal structures and responsibilities of state coordinating or governing agencies and public institutional governing boards are presented. The data cover the 50 states and the District of Columbia as of January 1, 1983. For each state, information is presented on the following: (1) the structure of the statewide, or central, coordinating/governing boards; (2) the basic responsibilities of these agencies; (3) the structure of both the central (statewide) coordinating and/or governing boards and the public institutional and multicampus governing boards; and (4) the statewide agency responsible for the administration and allocation of federal funds under the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended (including six federal programs). The third section contains the following information: the legal bases, number of institutions, and number of full- and part-time staff; the number of board members, whether elected or appointed, and the representation and term of office for those appointed; and the number of student and faculty members on these boards, their manner of appointment, whether statutory, voting or nonvoting, and term of office. 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In This Issue:

In 1971, ECS did a survey of the basic legal structures and responsibilities of state coordinating or governing agencies and public institutional governing boards. In response to requests from the states and from individuals, the survey was updated and expanded in November - December 1974, in spring 1979 and again in late fall 1982, and includes all 50 states and the District of Columbia. The areas covered in the survey, with page references, are summarized below. This updated survey is intended to be used as a companion to the *State Postsecondary/Profiles Handbook* (published by ECS, 1982 - 83 edition, \$15 per copy).

Part A: Page 250

Part A covers the structure of the statewide, or central, coordinating/governing boards. This section includes: (1) whether there is an office of secretary of education, (2) the type of agency - coordinating, governing or single board, (3) when the agency was established and amended, (4) whether the agency is statutorily or constitutionally based, (5) if the agency is a cabinet department, (6) whether the agency is the "1202 state commission" and if so if it was designated by statute or by the governor and (7) the manner of appointment and term of office of the executive officer.

Part B: Page 260

Part B shows the basic responsibilities of these agencies: (1) whether the agency has statutory responsibility for planning/coordination, or conducts these activities as a matter of policy, for public senior, junior, vocational, private or proprietary institutions; (2) if the agency has statutory responsibility for budget review and recommendation for public institutions, or only as a matter of policy; and (3) whether the agency has such responsibilities for program review and approval, for both new and existing programs, for public institutions.

Part C: Page 268

Part C concerns the structure of both the central (statewide) coordinating and/or governing boards and the public institutional and multicampus governing boards and is divided into three sections: Section C(1), page 268, includes the legal bases, number of institutions and number of full- and part-time staff; Section C(2), page 283, shows the number of board members, whether elected or appointed, for those appointed the representation and term of office; and Section C(3), page 301, indicates the number of student and faculty members on these boards, their manner of appointment, whether statutory, voting or nonvoting and term of office.

Part D: Page 305

Part D indicates the statewide agency responsible for the administration and allocation of federal funds under the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, although some of these programs are not currently funded: (1) Title I, Community Services and Continuing Education; (2) Title VIA, Equipment; (3) Title VIIA, Facilities; (4) Title IVA, State Student Incentive Grants; (5) Title IV, Subpart 5, Educational Information Centers; and (6) Section 1202, State Planning.
