ABSTRACT

Based on a survey conducted by the American Association of Junior Colleges (AAJC), this directory provides information on 1,091 community, junior, and technical colleges and two-year branch campuses in the United States, its territories, and selected other countries, including data on 1969-70 enrollments, personnel, and student costs. Following material on the scope of the directory, and analysis of two-year college growth is presented. Next, the directory lists the colleges alphabetically by state, including the following information for each: location; chief administrative head; year classes began; type of control or affiliation; AAJC membership; state recognition or accrediting agency; programs (i.e., transfer and/or occupational); co-educational or single-sex status; October 1969 enrollment of full- and part-time freshman, sophomore, and unclassified students; October 1969, summer 1970, and October 1970 total enrollments; full- and part-time faculty and administrators in 1970-71; and tuition per academic year for in-district, out-of-district, and out-of-state students. Statewide enrollment summaries are then provided for all institutions and for public and independent schools, followed by tables showing distribution by size of enrollment in two-year colleges. Information on changes in institutions since the previous year, AAJC, junior college organizations, and state administrators of two-year college education is presented in the final sections. (AYC)

INTRODUCTION

The American Association of Junior Colleges is pleased once again to present its annual directory of two-year community and junior colleges, technical institutes and branches of universities. The number of institutions listed, the reader will note, has risen appreciably, as have enrollments. The growth picture, in short, continues to be a healthy one. This is a reflection of trends begun more than a decade ago, indicating, we feel, increased acceptance of the role of the two-year college in higher education and, indeed, American society.

This same expansion has made it somewhat more difficult to gather, analyze and report the information on enrollments and other facts about the two-year institutions, and to meet production deadlines. Each year the staff attempts to refine the procedures involved in the project, to improve the process. During coming months, we plan to bring together experts from the field and the government to investigate still other possible refinements that might be made.

We recognize also that some of the colleges surveyed, perhaps more than we know, chafe at the extra burden caused by the processing of the information, completing the questionnaires and returning them to AAJC. The *Directory* questionnaire is only one of many that find their way to the institutions each year. We would like to stress, however, that the *Junior College Directory* has come to be known as one of the most authoritative of listings of two-year colleges in America. It provides a source of information that government agencies, many foundations, and corporations use in developing programs that may in the long run be of great benefit to two-year colleges. Increasing use is being made of the publication by educators in other countries.

This publication is not an AAJC membership directory. The report contains names of a number of institutions that are non-members. To make the listing as comprehensive as possible, the editors have made an

effort to include all institutions that are organized on a two-year basis, have state recognition and/or regional accreditation, and offer two-year associate degree programs.

In addition to enrollment data, the *Directory* contains information on tuition, programs, accreditation, control, types of institutions, association members, and numbers of personnel employed in the colleges. Summary tables on enrollment by state and types of institutions are also included.

More detailed information on individual two-year colleges may be found in the eighth edition of *American Junior Colleges* which is now being produced by the American Council on Education, to be released in 1971. The Association in general follows the criteria established for *American Junior Colleges* in determining the institutions to be included in the annual *Directory*. Institutions included are those accredited or recognized by the country's six regional accrediting agencies and state-level agencies authorized to approve junior colleges. The *Directory* does not include proprietary colleges.

The Association acknowledges the expert assistance provided by the Research Division of the National Education Association in processing and computerizing information collected.

We are especially grateful to the personnel of the reporting institutions for their cooperation in this project.

An Analysis

By Aikin Connor

The consistent growth of two-year colleges over the last decade is reconfirmed by the enrollment figures reported in the *1971 Junior College Directory*. In analyzing data gathered for the *Directory*, it is important to note that: (1) a few two-year colleges may not be listed each year for one or more of several reasons, including, unfortunately, inadvertance; (2) accuracy of reported data, although carefully checked, depends ultimately upon each individual college reporting. Considering the extent of the data collection, however, the *Directory* can be regarded as an exceptionally accurate statistical report of the year-to-year changes in United States community and junior colleges.

The *1971 Directory* lists a total of 1,091 American institutions, an increase of 53 over the previous year. Twenty-nine new institutions began classes in 1970; 45 colleges listed in the *1971 Directory* did not appear in the *1970 Directory*. A few colleges closed; several changed to four-year programs exclusively. Some colleges which are branch campuses elected this year to combine their reports with others in their district; several campuses of multi-campus districts are reported for the first time.

The 29 new institutions whose classes began in 1970 enrolled a total of 27,721 students. The largest enrollment of these new colleges was Pima College (Tucson, Arizona) with an opening enrollment of 3,537. Eastfield College (Dallas, Texas) had virtually the same enrollment: 3,522. Eight new colleges had opening enrollments of more than 1,000.

Overall total enrollment in colleges listed in the *1971 Directory* increased from 2,238,504 in 1969 to a total of 2,499,837 in October

1970. This is an increase of 261,333 students, or a growth of 11.7 per cent in total enrollment. (Note: these figures are derived from those colleges reported in the *1971 Directory*. Since some of these colleges were not reported last year, these statistics will be somewhat at variance with statistics using colleges in the *1970 Directory*.)

The publication of U.S. Census figures for 1970 afford a once-in-a-decade opportunity to observe growth in the community junior college movement from a different perspective. The census figures used in the following analysis are totals for each state, since the community college movement seeks to serve the entire population.

Comparing enrollment changes from year to year and noting increased numbers of colleges does not address the question of the strength or effectiveness of the community junior college movement. However, these changes, when observed against the backdrop of population changes, yield a measure of the vitality of the junior college movement in the various states. In the following discussion, it is important to remember that comparisons among states are not for the purpose of evaluation, either of the junior college system in those states nor their overall higher education administration. Instead, comparisons are made to illustrate the variability among the states in utilizing the community junior college to meet the varying needs of their citizens in the general area of higher education.

One good measure of the *effectiveness* or strength of the community junior college system in a state is the proportion of the population of that state served directly by its junior colleges. For example, in 1970 the proportion of the population served ranged from 8 students per 10,000 people in Nevada, to 359 per 10,000 in California (see Table A)

A measure of the *growth in effectiveness* of the community college system in each state can be made by comparing the proportion of the population enrolled in community colleges in 1960 to that enrolled in 1970. For example, the proportion of population enrolled in Hawaii's junior colleges jumped from 2 per 10,000 in 1960 to 180 per 10,000 in 1970—an increase of 9,000 per cent (see Table A).

In some states, the junior college movement seems to be centered in a few institutions; in others, many institutions are available to serve the state's population. In all probability, the tendency to develop relatively few colleges in a state is related to population density, transportation facilities, or similar considerations. An indicator of this more centralized type of system may be the ratio of population to college. For example,

Indiana has a ratio of 1,298,417 people per junior college, while Arkansas has a ratio of 37,771 per college (see Table B)

A word of caution about comparing states on the basis of a percentage rate of growth may be in order. Whenever a base figure is very low, a small amount of *real* growth will appear as a large *percentage* growth. With an increase in enrollment of approximately 7,300 students, Rhode Island enjoyed an extraordinary growth rate of 1,795 per cent while an increase of nearly 10,000 students gave Oklahoma a growth of 142 per cent (see Table B). Thus, a comparison of Hawaii's phenomenal growth rate of 11,573 per cent with California's growth rate of 145 per cent should be tempered by the knowledge that the *real* increase in Hawaii's enrollment was 13,772 while California's enrollment increased by 423,893 (see Table B)

The analysis of the data from the 1971 *Directory* and earlier editions, supports the following general statements

- 1 The community junior college movement continues to exhibit strength both in terms of new colleges built and increased enrollments
- 2 Growth patterns vary among the states but virtually all states report substantial growth in enrollment
- 3 Over the last decade the proportion of the population served by junior colleges has increased in all 50 states
- 4 Public community colleges continue to show the greatest annual growth, with independent college enrollment becoming stabilized
- 5 The proportion of full-time to part-time students continues to change very little at 57 per cent and 43 per cent, respectively

As the community junior college moves into the decade of the seventies there will be an ever-increasing need for accurate and extensive data regarding individual institutions. From the foregoing analysis it is clear that these data will continue to reflect a healthy and vigorous movement to serve the educational needs of an ever-expanding community in an age characterized by the need for information

Definition of Terms

ENROLLMENT

Full-time – Students carrying at least three-fourths (12 or more semester hours) of normal load.

Part-time – Students enrolled in the college and carrying less than three-fourths (less than 12 semester hours) of normal full-time load.

Freshmen – Students who have completed less than 28 semester hours or 42 quarter hours of college credit at time of registration.

Sophomores – Students who have completed 28 or more semester hours or 42 quarter hours of credit at time of registration.

Unclassified – Students not counted in any other category who may not have fulfilled the requirements for matriculation or who are enrolled in college-level courses for which they receive no credit. If the junior college has third-year students, these are included under unclassified.

FACULTY

Faculty – Includes all personnel who spend 50 per cent or more of their time teaching.

Administrative Staff – Includes personnel who spend 50 per cent or more of their time in administrative work.
