ABSTRACT

Based upon a questionnaire survey of two-year institutions conducted by the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges (AACJC), this directory provides information on 1,231 community, junior, and technical colleges in the United States and its territories, as well as 1979 and 1980 statistics on enrollments and personnel for each. Following introductory material on the compilation of the directory, a data summary, suggestions for interpreting the data, and a list of changes in institutions since the previous year are presented. Next, the directory lists each two-year college alphabetically by state or country and provides the following information: location; chief executive officer; telephone number; year college classes began; type of control or affiliation; AACJC membership; state recognition or accrediting agency; type of academic calendar; October 1979 and 1980 full- and part-time and total enrollment; community education enrollment in 1979-80; full- and part-time and total faculty, professional staff, and administrators as of October 1980; and tuition and fees required in 1980-81. Next, tables are presented summarizing enrollment and personnel data by state for all institutions, and for public and independent colleges. Lists of community, junior, and technical college organizations and state administrators for two-year college education, and an alphabetical listing of colleges conclude the directory. (AYC)

INTRODUCTION

The year 1980 was one of great uncertainty for America. The economy declined drastically, accompanied by ever-increasing inflation. It was a national election fraught with questions about where the people were going and what they might find when they got there. There was uncertainty about postsecondary education—particularly with regard to enrollment prospects as competition between and among colleges and universities heightened.

Despite these uncertainties, or perhaps partly because of them, more and more people turned to community, junior, and technical colleges for all manner of things. From job training to recreation, from pre-professional studies to post-college skill refinement. Millions of Americans were not uncertain about the prospect of improving their lives and their career futures in community colleges. The institutions offered hope.

That's what lies behind the data collected for this *1981 Community, Junior, and Technical College Directory*. It is reflected in a resurgence of enrollments after small increases during very recent years. This year's report will show the biggest jump in recent years.

It shows 4.8 million students enrolled in credit courses and an additional 4 million persons being served in non-credit community education programs. The credit enrollments represent a 7.5% increase over 1979 opening fall enrollments.

The *Directory* contains enrollments for the fall of 1979 and of 1980. The data was supplied by the colleges represented by a questionnaire survey conducted by the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges. As has become tradition with the publication, the response was nothing short of phenomenal. Some 98 percent of the 1231

institutions polled eventually got back to us with data which was requested. The questionnaires were examined carefully by the staff here, and many followup telephone calls were made to clarify some answers to questions.

We feel confident that the *Directory* provides the latest and best information available anywhere on names, addresses, and chief executives of the institutions; enrollments, of course; and the numbers of persons employed in faculty and staff positions.

It should be pointed out that the publication contains names of institutions that are duly recognized or accredited by appropriate agencies. Thus, the *Directory* has one of the most reliable listings extant. The Association has spent many hours to try to insure and improve reliability from year to year.

In addition to the main table—state by state, college by college rundown of data—the report contains three additional tables that give totals for the states—all colleges, independent colleges, and public colleges. Listings of state directors of community colleges and officers and address of state organizations also provide an excellent resource.

I am glad to recommend the *1981 Community, Junior, and Technical College Directory*. It will take some of the uncertainty out of judgements regarding the vigor and good health of this sector of postsecondary education.

The Data/Some Interpretations

Enrollments in community, junior, and technical colleges and institutes for the fall of 1980 total 4,825,931. This is an increase of 338,039 students over the fall of 1979, a gain of 7.53%. Public institutions reported an increase of 331,921 students, a gain of 7.66% over the previous year; independent/private institutions reported increased enrollments of 6,091, a gain of 3.97% from 1979. Table A shows enrollments in all institutions for the years 1961-1980, while Tables B and C give enrollments for public and independent institutions for the same period.

The number of full-time students totaled 1,795,442 for 1980, up 144,516 students or 8.75% from the preceding year. This is the largest gain reported over the past six years. Part-time enrollments were up 207,284, an increase of 7.43% over 1979. A graph of the full-time and part-time students over the 20-year period 1961-1980 follows Table C.

Community education enrollment—students participating in non-credit activities—totaled 3,977,050 for 1979-80, up 16.21% from the 1978-79 figures. Collection of this information did not begin until 1974-75 and thus trend lines are not definite. Table D contains this information.

Table E contains information on institutions according to the size of enrollment. This table is influenced by the manner in which the institutions report enrollments. If a multi-campus institution reports enrollment for each campus, the individual campus is tabulated in the appropriate rank. If the institution reports aggregate data for all its campuses, the institution is shown in the larger category, but the campuses appear in the "not available" column.

The 1980 enrollment increase is over twice as large as predicted. In the summer of 1980, a survey of the state directors of community, junior, and technical colleges forecasted an increased enrollment of about 3.3%. When opening fall enrollments were reported by the institutions, a number reported increases in excess of the projections. A follow-up survey was made of colleges reporting large increases. In order of frequency, their responses were as follows:

- Increased emphasis on recruiting and improved marketing techniques
- State of the economy, with unemployment in some areas resulting in increased enrollments.
- Addition of new campuses or facilities
- Curriculum additions
- Improved procedures for enrollment procedures.
- Return to normal levels of enrollments following a decline in 1978
- Increases in adult attendance

Although many institutions reported large increases, some reported decreases. Reasons given for the decline were:

- Changes in reporting procedures
- Increased costs of tuition
- Ineffective recruitment
- State of the economy. (None defined what they meant by this statement.)
- Financial restrictions which forced reduction of programs and services

Enrollment figures for each institution are reported in Table I of the *Directory*. Where 1980 fall enrollments were not made available, figures from preceding years are used. All enrollments are given as *headcount* figures and include only those students enrolled in courses or programs for credit. Non-credit enrollments are reported in community education and are for the year 1979-80. A summary by states of all institutions is found in Table II, while Tables III and IV contain summaries by states of both public and independent colleges.

Some colleges reported only total enrollments rather than the breakdown requested by the survey form. Because of



this discrepancy in reporting patterns, the full-time and part-time figures will not equal the total figures reported in Tables II, III, and IV.

As in the past, data for this *Directory* were collected directly from all two-year institutions. Each institution received a pre-printed verification form showing the figures reported by the college for the previous year. Explanations for increases or decreases over 20 percent were requested from each college. It is hoped that the use of this system eased the reporting requirements and assured increased accuracy of the data.

The *Directory* includes individual campuses of two-year institutions that are separately listed to arrive at the full number of colleges. Differences in the number of colleges from year to year are not solely due to colleges opening or closing. In addition to the method of counting colleges, changes in the total are also caused by mergers, changes in accreditation status, or types of program.

For some institutions, enrollment and other data are reported by campus; for others, the data are aggregated and reported for the college as a whole. A number of colleges offer courses and programs at various centers throughout their communities in secondary schools, churches, and senior centers. Such centers are not included or counted in this *Directory*.

Enrollment comparisons given in this introduction are based on data as reported for the fall term of 1979 and published in the 1980 *Directory*. Since the publication of the previous edition, additional information and clarification of enrollment figures have been received, altering slightly the fall 1979 figure, as reported in Tables II, III, and IV of this *Directory*.

AACJC is grateful to the individuals at both member and nonmember institutions who carefully completed the *Directory* survey forms. It is because of their efforts that we can present this detailed report on community, junior, and technical colleges.

Questions concerning the data reported in the *Directory* can be referred to the Association's director of research.

Definition of Terms

ENROLLMENT

Full-time—Students carrying at least 12 credit hours or more.

Part-time—Students enrolled in the college and carrying 11 credit hours or fewer.

Total enrollment is a headcount of full-time and part-time students enrolled for credit courses only.

Community education enrollment includes only those students participating in noncredit activities.

FACULTY

Full-time—Includes all personnel who spend 50 percent or more of their time teaching (teaching load of 9 hours or more).

Part-time—Includes all personnel who spend less than 50 percent of their time teaching (teaching load of 8 hours or fewer).

PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT STAFF

Staff includes such professional employees as librarians, counselors, etc., if these staff are not designated by the college as either faculty or administration. (Does not include classified staff.)

ADMINISTRATION

Administrative staff—Includes executive and managerial staff who spend 50 percent or more of their time in administrative work.

TUITION AND REQUIRED FEES

Student cost figures are for a full-time student for the full academic year 1979-80, and where applicable are for those students living within the state and within the institutional district.
