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ABSTRACT

This resource guide is intended to provide information on films, videotapes, filmstrips, audio-cassettes, and other related materials that can be used as teaching aids to support and enhance the high school art curriculum. The guide provides titles, the format(s) in which material is presented, the source of the material, and a short description of the contents. Where relevant, some suggestions are made regarding appropriate instructional level (foundations, basic, advanced) and special learning outcomes. The titles are alphabetically grouped into three parts. Part 1, media resources, presents 6 sub-sections on foundations and the visual expression areas, ceramics, drawing and painting, graphics, sculpture, and textiles. Part 2 discusses themes of media resources and includes 6 sub-sections entitled Circuses, Fairs, and Carnivals; The Figure; Main Street and the Built Environment; Phantasmagoria; The Sun; and Trees. The final section presents additional resources relating to the foundations and visual expression areas of the curriculum. Because of the varied nature of the foundations levels of study, titles in Parts 1 and 3 are cross-referenced. The titles in Parts 1 and 2 are available from the Provincial Educational Media Centre; the titles in Part 3 are available from a variety of sources. (LH)

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Introduction

The Secondary Art Media Resources Guide is intended to provide information on films, videotapes, filmstrips, audio cassettes and other related materials that can be used as teaching aids to support and enhance the Learning Outcomes in the 1983 Secondary Art (8-12) Curriculum.

This Media Resources Guide provides titles, the format(s) in which material is presented, the source of the material, and a short description of the contents. Where relevant, some suggestions regarding appropriate instructional level (Foundations, Basic, Advanced), and specific Learning Outcomes have been made. The titles have been alphabetically grouped in three categories to follow certain organizational sections of the Secondary Art (8-12) Curriculum.

1. **Media Resources** available from PEMC are divided into six sections: Foundations and the Visual Expression Areas (Ceramics, Drawing and Painting, Graphics, Sculpture, and Textiles). Because of the varied nature of the Foundations level of study and because of the varied contents of some of the selections, titles in this section are cross-referenced. The annotations provided attempt to explain the cross-referencing and suggest the many purposes any one title may have when planning for instruction.
2. The **Media Resources: Themes** portion of the Secondary Art (8-12) Curriculum includes only those programs available from PEMC. The six sub-sections follow those in the Curriculum: Circuses, Fairs and Carnivals, The Figure, Main Street and the Built Environment, Phantasmagoria, The Sun, and Trees. Further resource material related to the above themes is included in the resources section at the end of each theme chapter in the Secondary Art (8-12) Curriculum.

3. The **Additional Resources** section of the guide contains titles that relate to the Foundations and Visual Expression Areas of the curriculum. None of these titles are available from PEMC. They are presented in slide set, filmstrip, audiocassette, and related print formats. Although resources for this category are plentiful, high-quality and relevant titles were selected for inclusion in this guide for the convenience of the teacher and local resource personnel.

How to Order Resources

FILMS

Film Library

The PEMC film library is open to all public schools, registered independent schools, colleges, and universities in British Columbia.

School PEMC representative

Films must be ordered through a PEMC representative — a person appointed by each school to be responsible for the ordering, receiving, and returning of PEMC films — so that orders from all teachers within the institution can be co-ordinated. To register for borrowing, the principal or head teacher must submit to PEMC the name of the person who will be responsible; this person will then be supplied with catalogues, requisition forms, and ordering instructions.

Film requisition form

Teachers who wish to order films must submit a requisition form through their school PEMC representative. Teachers are asked to give a preferred date and alternative dates for each film; up to one month before the preferred date, up to one month after, or any time within the two-month period.

Film bookings

When a requisition form arrives at PEMC, the requests are entered into a computer. If a film is available for the preferred date, the computer will confirm the booking and a confirmation notice will be sent to the PEMC representative. If the film is not available for the preferred date but the borrower has agreed to accept it at alternate dates, the film will be booked for the nearest date available. If the film is not available for any of the acceptable dates, a "not-available" notice will be sent to the PEMC representative. "Not-available" notices are normally sent eight weeks prior to the latest acceptable date.

Responsibilities of borrowers

1. Borrowers must make all efforts to return materials by the due date. Chronic failure to return items on time will result in a suspension of borrowing privileges.
2. This Branch retains the right to levy a partial replacement charge against any borrower to help pay for lost or damaged material.
3. All films must be returned in their proper container.

Shipping and handling

1. Please return all films to your school representative to be returned to PEMC.
2. If a film breaks or is damaged while being projected, please insert a note, describing the damage, in the film container.
3. School representatives must return films the same way they were delivered (i.e., delivered by mail: return by mail; delivered by school district delivery: return by school district delivery; delivered by courier: return by courier.)

VIDEOTAPES

Video dubbing service

The PEMC video dubbing service is available to all schools, registered independent schools, regional colleges, and universities in British Columbia. Videotapes are for sale only and are not available on loan. School districts, colleges and universities purchase videotapes and make their collections available, for loan, within their regions.

District PEMC liaison person

Videotapes must be ordered through a PEMC liaison person who is appointed by the school district to co-ordinate videotape purchases within the district. Check with your District Superintendent or resource centre for the name of your current PEMC liaison person.

Videotape order form

All orders must be submitted through a district PEMC liaison person on PEMC videotape order forms.

Conditions of use

The PEMC Catalogue contains programs produced by PEMC and programs acquired from other sources. The conditions of use of each videotape acquired from an outside source are governed by a legal agreement between PEMC and the holder of the copyright. Misuse contravenes the negotiated terms, leaves PEMC and/or the user open to lawsuit, and will seriously jeopardize the ability of PEMC to acquire new materials. PEMC reserves the right to terminate the video dubbing service to any user failing to comply with the conditions of use.

In general, non-PEMC-produced videotapes are:

1. for use on closed-circuit television only. This specifically excludes broadcast, and use on community cable systems. Those school districts utilizing community cable distribution must make special arrangements with PEMC prior to use.
2. for non-commercial use only; within educational institutions and/or programs administered by the Ministry of Education.
3. cleared for a certain time period only. When an agreement expires, PEMC liaison people will be informed and must ensure that all copies in their possession are erased.

This series of programs relates to the Secondary Art (8-12) Curriculum, 1983 and shows B.C. artists at work in five different major content areas: ceramics, drawing and painting, graphics, sculpture and textiles. Where possible, each program shows a different project from conception to completion with the artist explaining its progress to the viewer. The straightforward style of the programs allows the artists to explain technique, materials, and interpretation of image as well as more anecdotal information such as sources of

inspiration and personal history. In this series the student viewer will gain exposure to the work of local artists and their working environments. The completed pilot program for this series **Jack Shadbolt: Metamorphosis** is listed in this section of the media resources guide.
