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ABSTRACT

Data on U.S. 1981 college and university enrollments and trends for the past few years are presented. Information is provided on enrollment in institutions of higher education by control and level of institution, student sex and age, and full- or part-time attendance status of students. Specific data include: enrollment of first-time freshmen in U.S. colleges and universities, by control and level of institution; undergraduate, graduate, and first-professional enrollments by type of institution, attendance status, and sex; enrollments for each state by level, attendance status, and sex; enrollments in public and private institutions for each state; enrollment in the 100 largest public institutions; and full-time equivalent and part-time enrollments. Highlights include the following: enrollment in all colleges and universities continued to increase in 1981; two-year institutions accounted for the majority of the overall enrollment growth in 1981; women continued to enroll at a faster rate than men; and private institutions reported slightly higher rates of growth in 1981 than did public institutions. Appendices include information on the study methodology and institutional classifications. (SW)

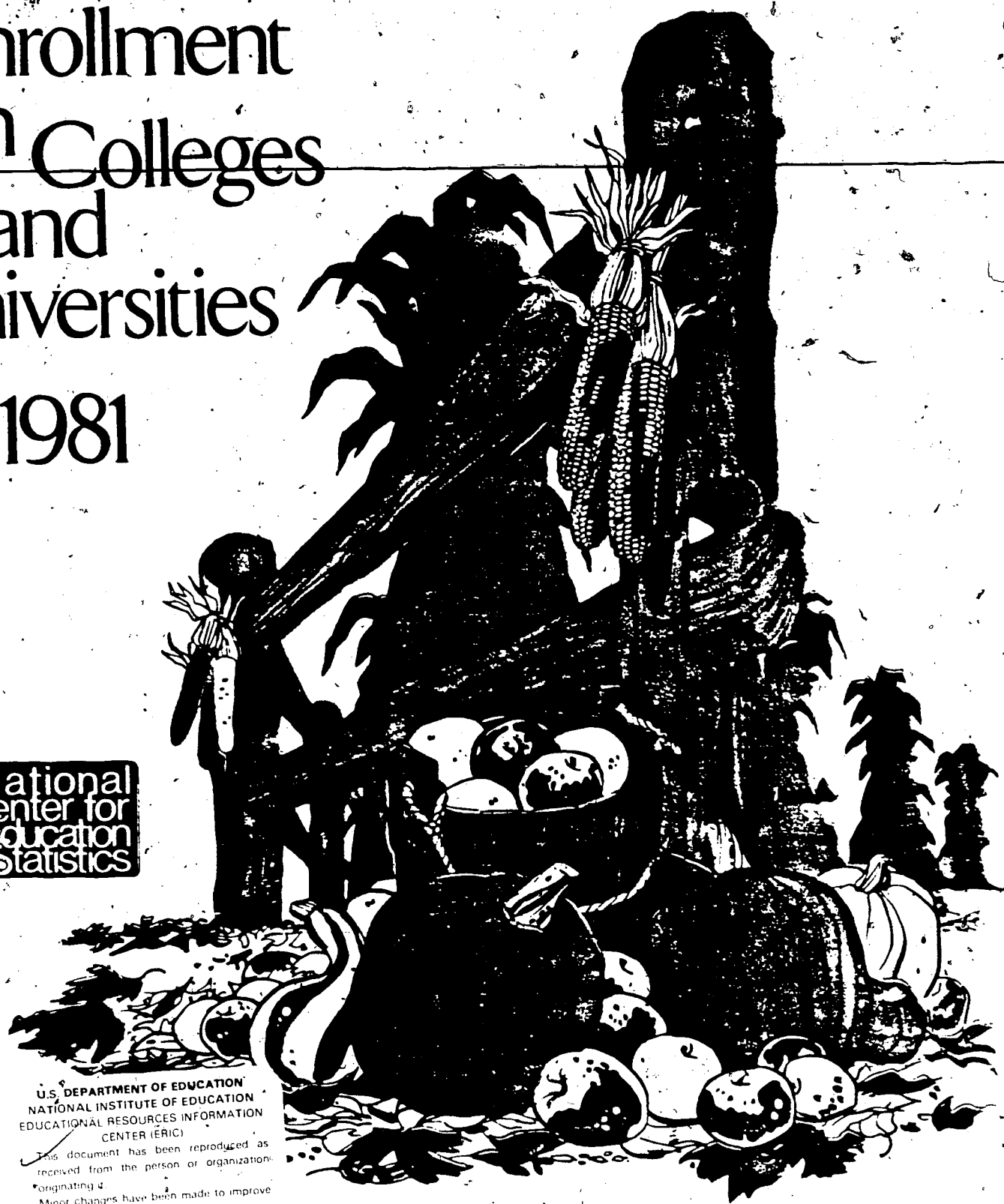

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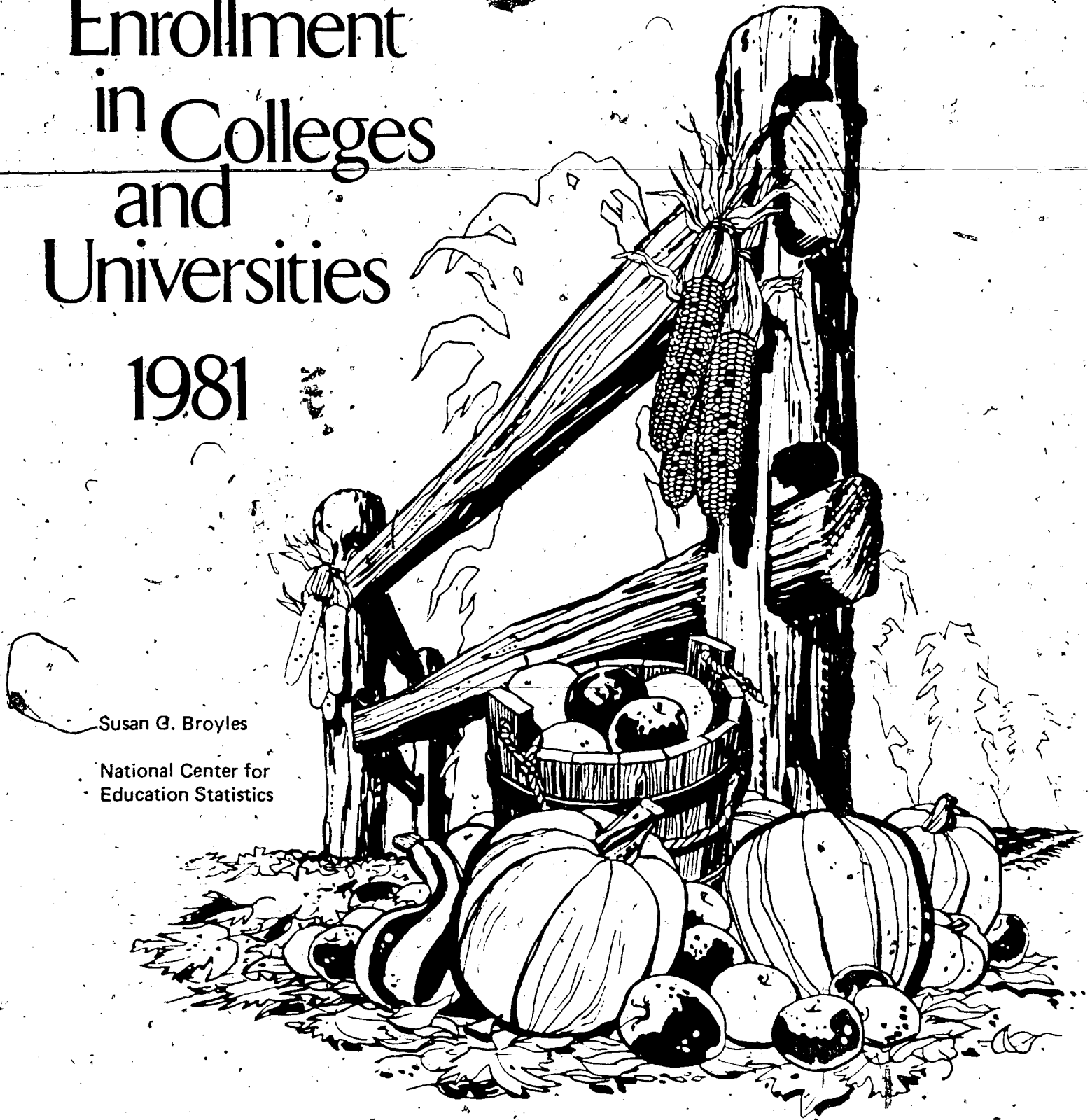

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# Foreword

This edition of *Fall Enrollment in Institutions of Higher Education* discusses data collected by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) through its 1981 survey of our Nation's colleges and universities. Recent trends in enrollment are examined in this report, and the tables that follow display detailed statistical information to supplement the charts and tables found in the text.

We wish to thank the numerous college and university officials who report these essential statistics on an annual basis, as well as the various coordinators in the States for their efforts to provide assistance wherever possible. Without their cooperative efforts, these analyses would not be possible.

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# Highlights

- Enrollment in all colleges and universities continued to increase in 1981. The total number of students enrolled in the 50 States and the District of Columbia reached nearly 12,372,000, up 2.3 percent between 1980 and 1981.
- Two-year institutions, which accounted for the majority of the overall enrollment growth in 1981, reported an increase of 3.5 percent over 1980 figures, bringing their totals to more than 4.6 million students, or a 37-percent share of the total student population. Proprietary institutions especially contributed to this overall increase among 2-year institutions.
- Specialized schools also reported enrollment gains of 3 percent in 1981; however, they represent a much smaller segment of the universe of institutions of higher education. Enrollment levels at all other types of institutions—doctoral-level, comprehensive, and general baccalaureate—remained relatively stable, with only slight increases in the total student population.
- Women continued to enroll at a faster rate than men in 1981, following the trend that began in the mid-1970's. By 1981, women represented a 51.7-percent share of the total enrollment at colleges and universities, up from 45 percent in 1975. The number of men studying in institutions of higher education increased for the third consecutive year, following declines between 1975 and 1978.
- Private institutions reported slightly higher rates of growth in 1981 than did those in the public sector. Only within the general baccalaureate institutions and the specialized schools did the public sector realize large growth rates.
- The number of freshmen entering college for the first time in fall 1981 leveled off at barely 0.3 percent more than last year compared to increases of 3.4 percent and 4.7 percent the previous 2 years. Private institutions reported increases of close to 3 percent, while public institutions reported a slight drop in the number of first-time freshmen.
- Proprietary schools reported the largest increases among those institutions reporting in both 1980 and 1981, up nearly 11 percent. The number of men attending these schools rose more than 14 percent, while the number of women increased nearly 8 percent.

# Introduction

Data presented in this report are derived from the 1981 survey of Fall Enrollment in Institutions of Higher Education, conducted by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) as part of its 16th annual Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) program. The total universe in 1981 consisted of 3,294 institutions. Actual responses were received from 3,245 colleges, or 98.5 percent of the total universe, while data were imputed for the remaining 49 schools. Data imputed for non-response accounted for only 0.5 percent of the total enrollment reported in 1981. This report is limited in coverage to the 3,253 institutions located in the 50 States and the District of Columbia; only the State tables include data for the additional 41 institutional units surveyed in outlying areas (Guam, Puerto Rico, etc.).

The new classification of institutions adopted by NCES during the 1981-82 academic year is reflected in the tables presented with this report. Institutions are identified as doctoral-level, comprehensive, general baccalaureate, specialized, 2-year, or new (to the HEGIS universe). New schools remain in this category until they have filed 2 years of earned degree data and their actual classification category can be determined based on the actual number of degrees and the number of programs in which they were awarded. Detailed tables are formatted using both new and old HEGIS classifications for comparison purposes; both sets of tables present trend data back to 1978.

The report that follows is divided into two chapters. Chapter 1 discusses changes in enrollment patterns among the 3,253 institutions in the 50 States and the District of Columbia that are in the current universe. Chapter 2 is limited in scope; it separately analyzes enrollment changes among ongoing institutions; i.e., schools in the "new" category have not been included in the tables and thus do not impact on the percent changes shown.

It should be noted that institutional data gathered as part of the 1981 survey are not being published as part of this report. Only two summary tables included in the appendix provide institutional information by level of enrollment, sex of student and attendance status; they rank the 100 institutions with the largest enrollment in 1981 for both the public and private sectors.

# Chapter 1

## Recent Trends in Enrollment for All Institutions

Enrollment data reported since the mid-1970's depict an uneven pattern of growth and decline for the first 4 years, followed by successive increases. Total enrollment in the Nation's institutions of higher education grew 10.4 percent to nearly 12.4 million over the 6-year period from 1975 to 1981 for an average annual growth rate of 1.7 percent. The 1980-81 increase in total enrollment of 2.3 percent exceeded the average annual growth rate for the 6-year period, and projections indicate that enrollment will most likely peak next year and then begin to decline. It is anticipated that total enrollment will drop to its 1980 level of 12.1 million by 1986 and then fluctuate only slightly throughout the remainder of the decade.

The more recent trends in enrollment growth can be attributed in part to several factors: 1) the continued rise in the number of women students attending institutions of higher education; 2) the increased tendency for older students to return to college; 3) more part-time students, especially at 2-year and specialized schools; and 4) the growing popularity of 2-year institutions and the programs they offer.

### Women in Higher Education

During the latter half of the 1970's, women increased their numbers substantially in higher education, a trend which continued through 1981 (figure 1). In 1975, women accounted for 45 percent of the total enrollment in colleges and universities; by 1979, more than 50 percent of all students were women, and their share has increased another 2 percent since that time. Moreover, in 1981, women made up 53 percent of the entering freshman class, the largest proportion reported since this series began.

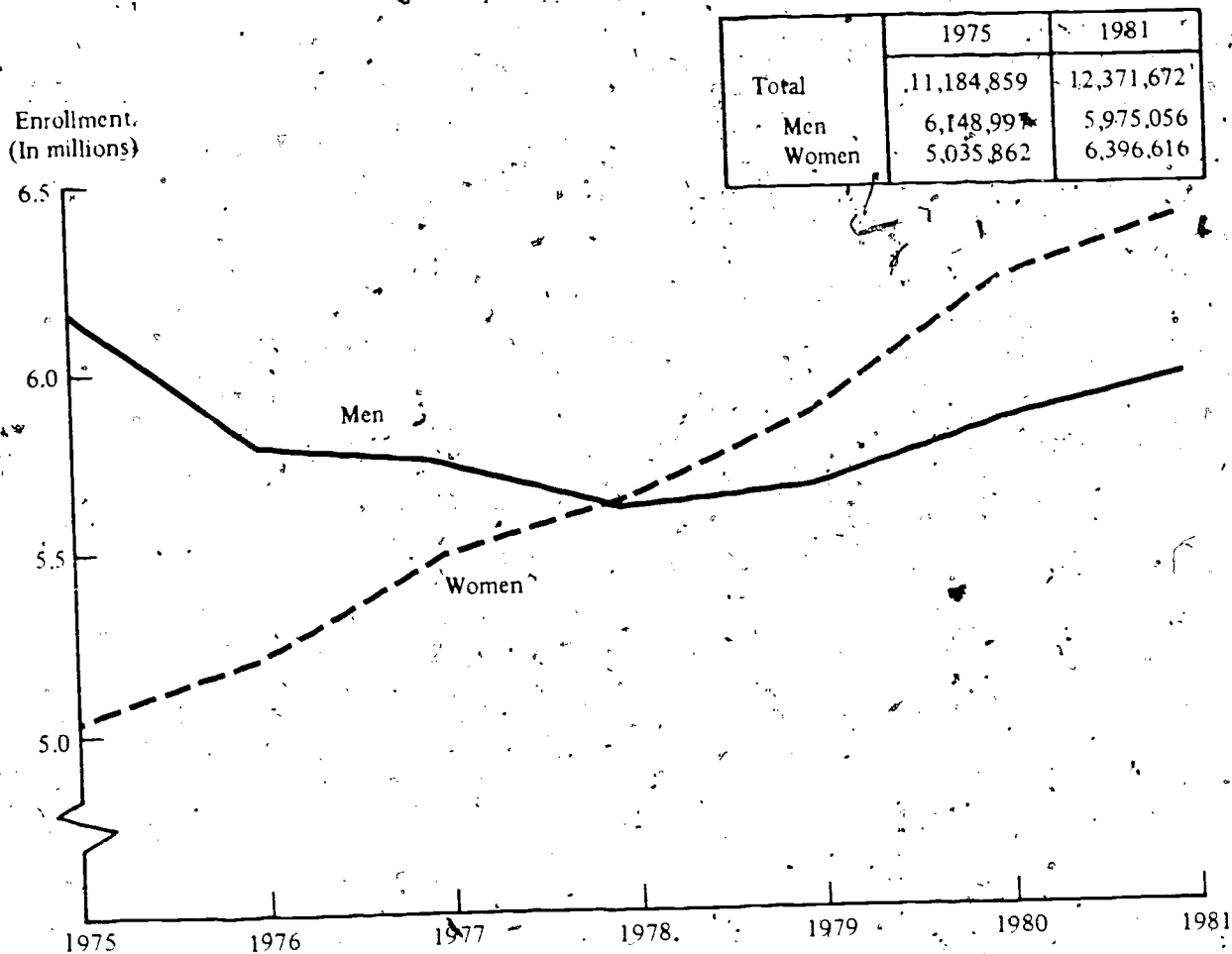
Of the 6,396,600 women enrolled in institutions of higher education in 1981, 54 percent were studying full time compared to a 58-percent share in 1975. Although this proportion has declined, the actual number of full-time women students has increased fairly steadily (2.9 percent per year), while the average annual growth rate of those attending part time has grown much more rapidly (5.5 percent per year) since 1975 (table 1).

### Increased Participation of Older Students

Another significant factor affecting enrollment growth is the increased participation of older students, i.e., those beyond the traditional 18- to 24-year-old group. Although the number of traditional college-age students was expected to peak around 1981, it is anticipated that older students will continue to enroll in increasing numbers, at least over the next few years. Almost all of the growth among older students attending colleges and universities, especially since 1975, was attributable to women. During this period, older women enrolled in increasing numbers—the majority in part-time programs. Again, projections indicate this trend should continue, at least through 1990 (table A).

## Part-Time Enrollment and 2-Year Institutions

Of particular importance to colleges and universities over the past few years has been the steady increase in part-time enrollment. Since 1978, institutions have reported nearly twice the rate of increase in the enrollment of part-time students as that of their full-time counterparts (figure 2 and table 3).

Although private institutions realized larger rates of increase (5 percent per year) in their part-time enrollment since 1978, those in the public sector also maintained a steady increase (about 4 percent per year) over the same period. However, the increase in public schools had a much more significant impact on the total enrollment picture. In 1981, they enrolled an 85-percent share of all part-time students and from 1978 through 1981 accounted for 82 percent of the total growth in the part-time student population.

As a whole, 2-year institutions enrolled 56 percent of all part-time students in 1981, compared to 54 percent in 1978. However, it is important to note the differences by control of institution (figure 3, tables B and 3). Two-year public schools enrolled 64 percent of all part-timers in public institutions in 1981; the private sector reported that less than 6 percent of its part-time students attended 2-year colleges. Although increases in part-time enrollment were reported by all types of institutions over the 1978-81 period, the absolute increase of nearly 400,000 part-time students in public 2-year schools was the driving force behind the overall rise in the number of part-time students.

## Growing Popularity of 2-Year Institutions

In addition to increases in their part-time enrollment, 2-year institutions consistently showed gains in their overall enrollment from 1978 to 1981, up 14 percent during this period, or an average of 4.6 percent per year. Recent studies have predicted another 4-percent gain for fall 1982, at least among public 2-year schools.<sup>3</sup>

These preliminary projections were based on data provided by State administrators to the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges (AACJC). Survey respondents cited several reasons for the increases, including the expansion of occupational programs at the 2-year institutions. These new programs, as well as the rise in the unemployment rate, provided additional incentives for students to seek training in occupational programs. With the increased competition for available jobs, many people in the job market decided to either sharpen their current skills or expand their present capabilities by acquiring new skills.

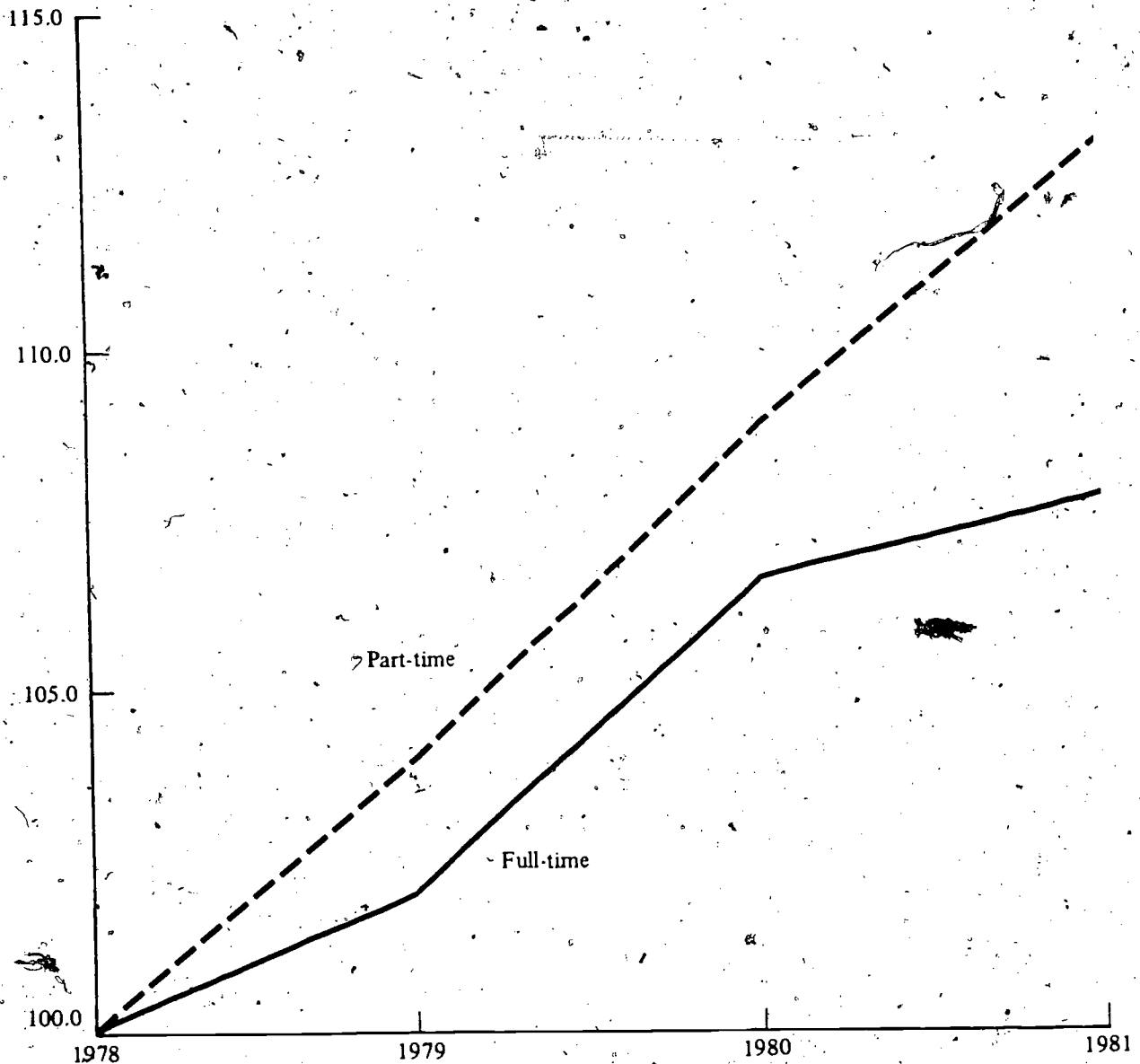

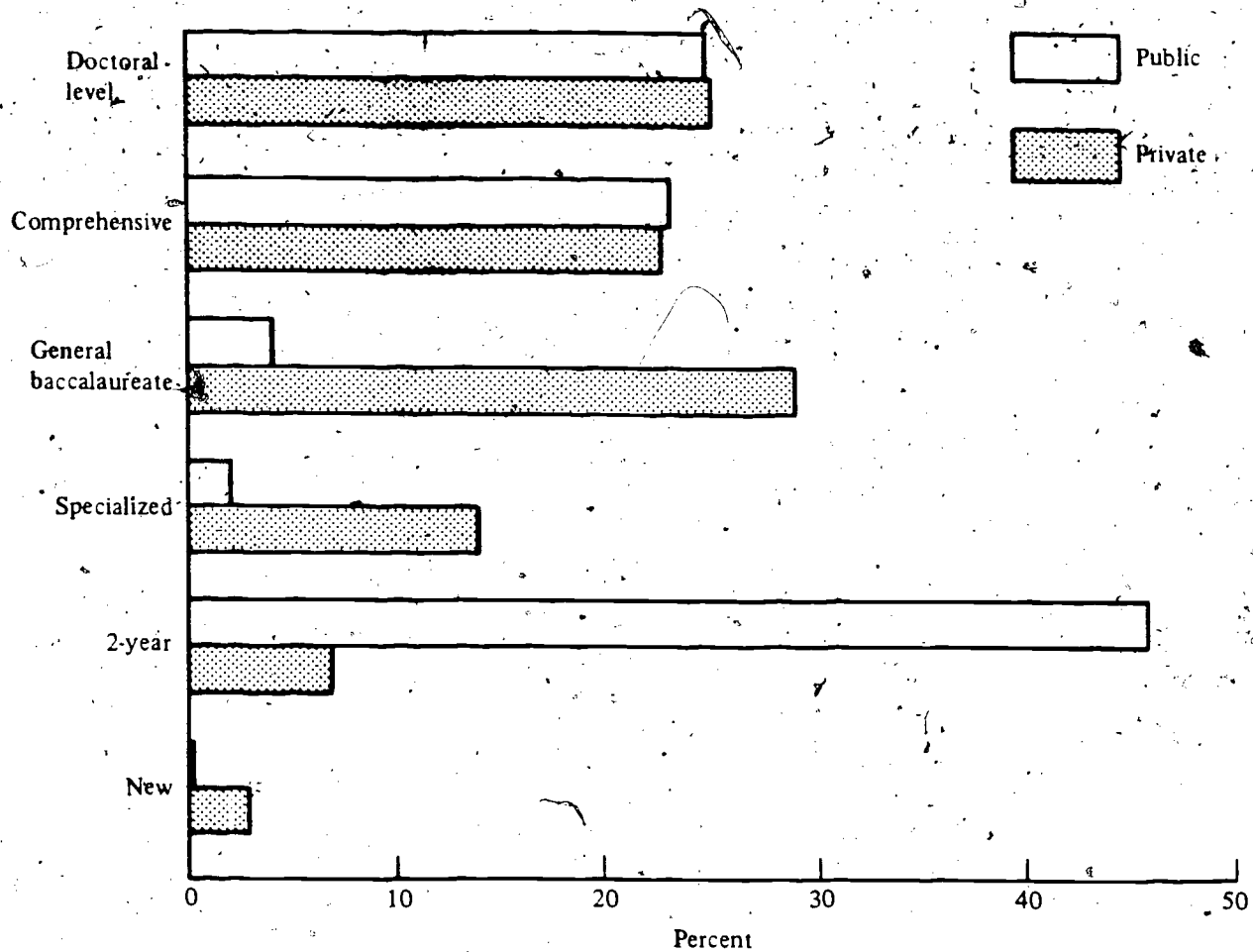
Figure 4.—Average tuition rates in institutions of higher education: Fall 1981

Another drawing point for the 2-year schools is their lower tuition rates, especially at public institutions. Studies by both NCES and the College Scholarship Service indicate that tuition rates at 2-year schools average one-third less than at 4-year institutions. This ratio holds for both the public and private sectors, although overall tuition rates at public schools are considerably lower than those at privately controlled institutions (figure 4).

## Patterns of Enrollment, by Type of Institution

In 1981, 37 percent of all students enrolled in institutions of higher education attended 2-year schools; one-fourth were studying in doctoral-level institutions, and another 23 percent were in those classified as comprehensive. These proportions have remained relatively constant since 1978, the first year for which enrollment data are available using the new NCES classification of institutions.

(Index: 1978 = 100.0)

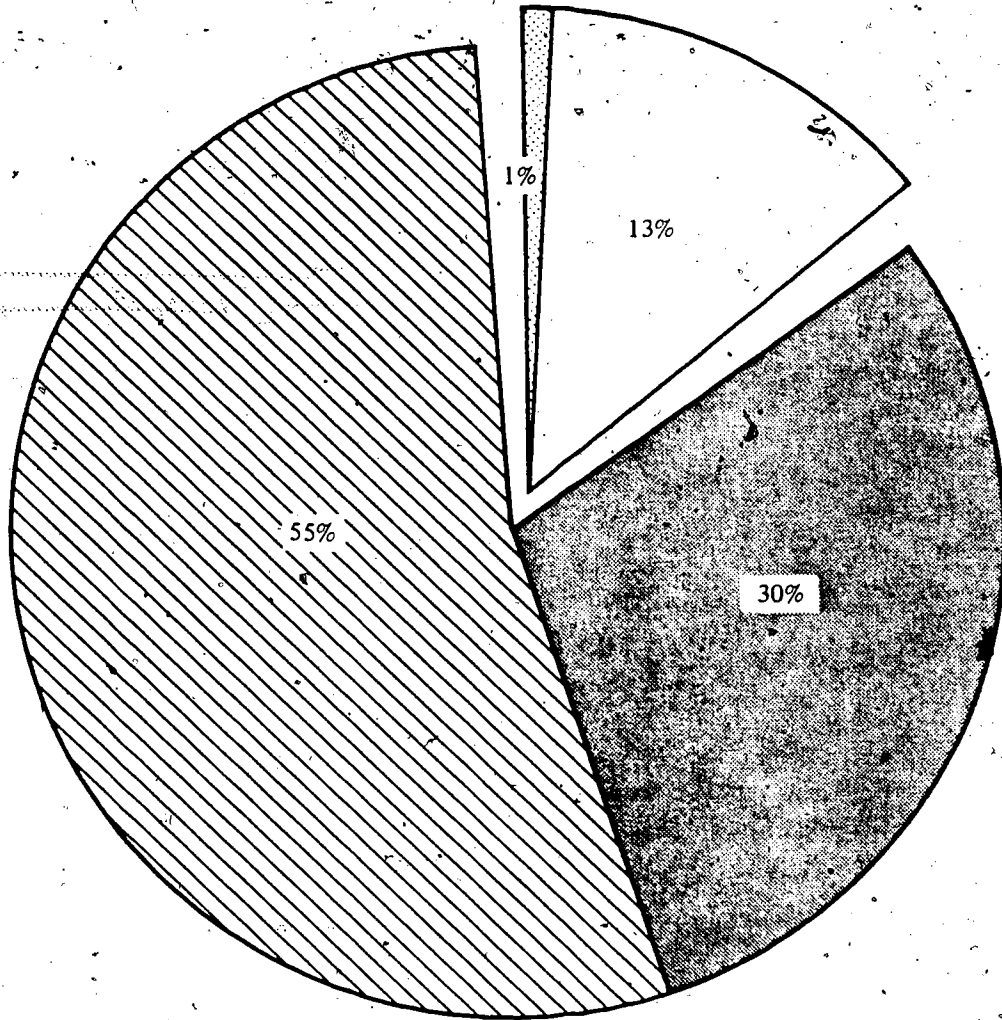






The distribution of enrollment by type of institution varies considerably for most categories when examined by control (Figure 5 and tables 7 and 8). While doctoral and comprehensive institutions maintained similar shares, the remaining categories show quite different patterns of enrollment. The largest proportion of students in the public sector were enrolled in 2-year institutions in 1981—nearly 46 percent—whereas more students attending private schools chose those classified as general baccalaureate than any other category.

In general, enrollment in doctoral-level institutions remained fairly constant between 1980 and 1981; survey respondents reported less than a 1-percent gain in total enrollment. Private doctoral institutions showed gains of about 2 percent during the same period, while public doctoral institutions reported virtually no change. Comprehensive institutions reported similar growth patterns between 1980 and 1981 in both the public and private sectors, up 0.9 percent each.

Although the growth rate in the publicly controlled general baccalaureate schools was almost twice that reported for those in the private sector, up 1.7 percent and 0.9 percent, respectively, for the 1980-81 period, the absolute increase in the number of students enrolled was nearly equal. Privately controlled general baccalaureate schools enrolled twice as many students as those in the public sector, and, as stated previously, they enrolled the largest proportion of students choosing private education.

Specialized schools enrolled barely 5 percent of the total enrollment in institutions of higher education in 1981, and both public and private schools reported increases in enrollment of nearly 3 percent over last year's totals. The bulk of the enrollment in the specialized schools is in the private sector, where the number of students has traditionally accounted for a much larger proportion of the total enrollment than in the public sector.

Two-year institutions reported the largest gains in enrollment in 1981, up 3.5 percent over 1980, to a total of more than 4.6 million students. Public 2-year schools enrolled 95 percent of these students, mostly because of their low tuition rates and the variety of programs offered, especially in occupational areas. Private 2-year institutions also reported steady gains in enrollment, up 5 percent since 1980—which, although it was a larger percentage gain than public institutions recorded, accounted for an absolute increase of less than 10,000 students.

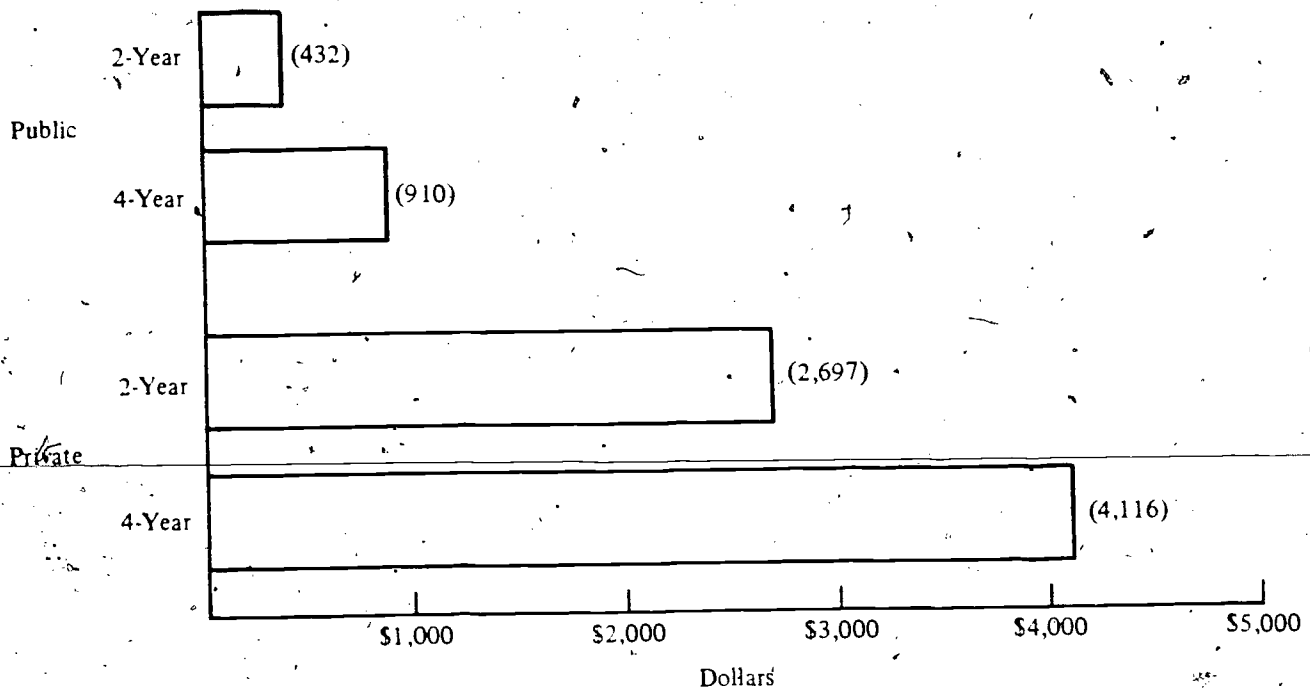

The most difficult categories of institutions to analyze are those that are new to the universe. These institutions have not been classified according to their degree offerings as yet, but they still impact on the total enrollment picture. The tables found in the appendix show the effect that these new schools have on the total HEGIS universe. Chapter 2 separately analyzes the enrollment changes without the data from the new schools. Before this classification scheme was implemented, these types of analyses were not possible. In fact, for the past few years, since the number of 18- to 24-year-olds began to level off, it was thought that the addition of new institutions to the HEGIS universe was responsible for the continued increases in enrollment. This assumption has been disproven, as the tables and figures in chapter 2 indicate.

## Enrollment Changes, by Sex of Student

The growth in total enrollment in institutions of higher education from 1978 to 1981 was largely a function of the increased participation of women in all phases of higher education. During this period, enrollment rose 13.8 percent among women, while the number of men increased 5.9 percent. By fall 1981, women accounted for 51.7 percent of the total enrollment in all institutions, compared to 49.9 percent in 1978 and 45 percent in 1975.

Between 1980 and 1981, the growth rates for women were consistently higher than those for men for each type of institution under the new classification. Only in those institutions new to the universe did the rise in the number of men enrolled exceed that of women (figure 6 and table 2). While the specialized schools reported the highest rates of growth (up 4.7 percent for women), they accounted for an absolute increase of only about 10,000 women students; whereas, the 2-year schools, which showed gains of 4.2 percent during the same 1980-81 period, actually enrolled more than 100,000 additional women students.

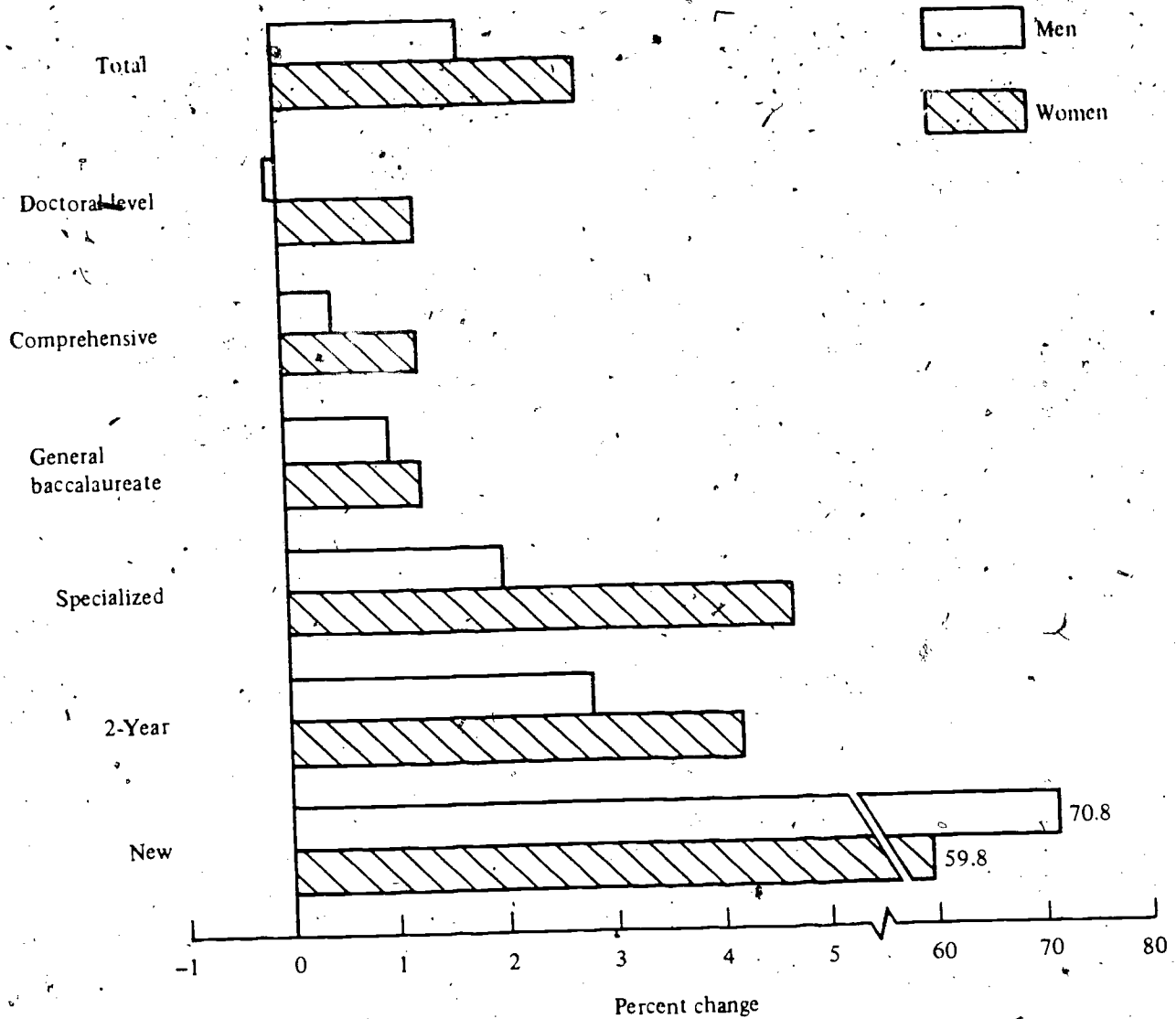
Rates of growth for men and women varied according to the type and control of the institutions attended, and no clear patterns of growth or trends are evident at this time. Two-year institutions, however, have consistently enrolled more students in both the public and private sectors than any other type. These same schools again reported the largest absolute gains in the number of men and women during the 1980-81 period.

Although the number of men enrolled in institutions of higher education increased for the third consecutive year, their rates of increase have slowed; the gain for 1980-81 was 1.7 percent compared to a 3.4-percent rise the preceding year. Only in the doctoral-level institutions did the number of men actually decline in 1981, although the drop was so small (0.1 percent) that it may be attributable to changes in reporting practices rather than the beginning of a new trend in enrollment patterns.

The number of women enrolled full- and part-time rose 1.8 percent and 4.1 percent, respectively, between 1980 and 1981 compared to 0.6 percent and 3.5 percent gains for men. Although the rates of growth were higher among part-timers, those enrolled full-time constituted a larger proportion of the total enrollment.

The number of men enrolled full-time in all institutions in 1981 continued to exceed the number of women, whereas, among students attending part-time, women accounted for a 56-percent share of the total. Only in the specialized schools did women constitute less than a 50-percent share of the total part-time population. Their share of the total population fell below 50 percent in full-time programs at both doctoral-level and specialized institutions.

Figure 6.—Percent change in enrollment in institutions of higher education, by type of institution and sex of student: 50 States and D.C., fall 1980-81



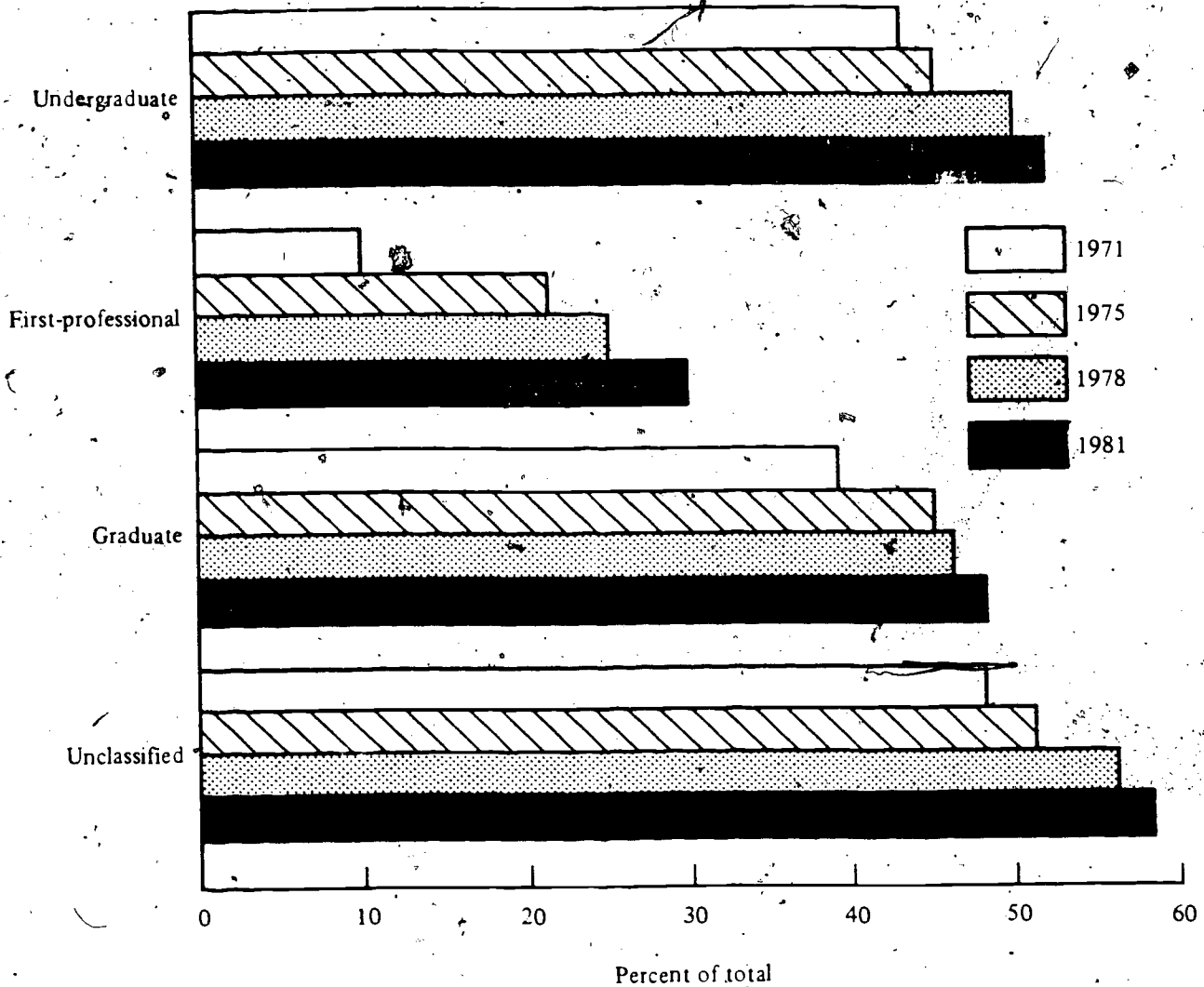
When enrollment patterns by sex of student are examined at the actual level of student enrollment, some consistent trends become evident. At the undergraduate level, the number of women enrolled has increased at a faster rate than that of men since the mid-seventies, but it was not until 1978 that women actually outnumbered men in these same programs. Since 1978, undergraduate enrollment has risen 10.7 percent, mostly driven by the 14.3-percent growth rate among women, which is double the 7.1-percent increase experienced by men. As of fall 1981, more than 4.9 million women were enrolled in undergraduate programs at colleges and universities in the 50 States and the District of Columbia. At that time, they constituted a full 52 percent of the undergraduate population (figure 7).

During the mid-seventies, the number of men attending graduate school declined until 1978, when a reversal of this trend began. Since then, enrollment for men has risen to nearly 4.6 million, which is still slightly below the 1975 peak of 4.7 million.

The number of women enrolled in first-professional programs has risen steadily over the years; as of fall 1981, nearly one-third of all first-professional students were women, up from less than 10 percent a decade ago. Since 1978, the number of women in these programs has increased 26 percent, while the total enrollment for male first-professionals rose and then fell to nearly the 1978 level (an overall increase of only 0.4 percent).

Graduate enrollment seems to have stabilized over the last few years after significant increases during the early 1970's. By 1975, graduate enrollment had peaked at nearly 1.3 million students. Between 1975 and 1976, institutions reported an

unprecedented 14-percent drop in graduate enrollment.<sup>4</sup> Since that time, the steady rise in the enrollment of women has tended to offset the reported decline among their male counterparts. In fall 1981, women represented 48 percent of all graduate students, up from less than 45 percent in 1975. The increased participation of women, especially in full-time graduate programs, was also noted by the National Science Foundation (NSF) in its annual survey of Graduate Science Students and Postdoctorates at doctorate-granting institutions. NSF reported average gains of 10 percent per year from 1975 to 1977 and 6 percent annually between 1977 and 1980.<sup>5</sup>

The unclassified category of student enrollment encompasses those enrolled at the undergraduate level as well as at the postbaccalaureate level. Unclassified enrollment increased dramatically during the early to mid-seventies, and, although the growth rate has slowed somewhat, it has continued to increase at about 4 percent per year since 1978. By 1981, nearly 1.5 million students were reported as unclassified, or 12 percent of the total in all institutions of higher education. This is the only category of enrollment that showed men increasing at a faster rate than women (3.3 percent compared to 2.2 percent) for the 1980-81 period. Women, however, still comprise the larger portion of unclassifieds, 58 percent of the total in 1981.

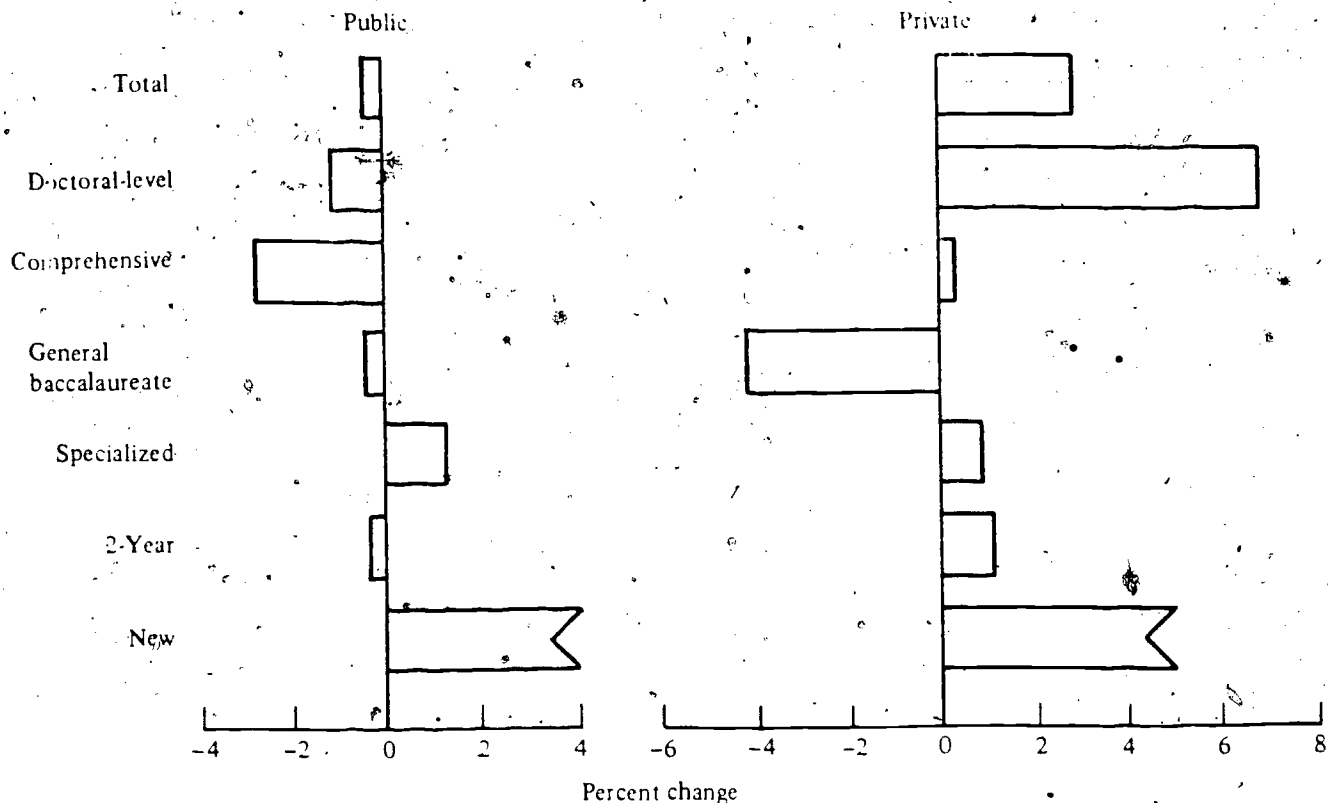

## Changes in Enrollment of First-Time Freshmen

During the fall semester 1981, freshmen enrolled for the first time in colleges and universities at almost the same level as the previous year. While the overall increase reported was only 0.3 percent, public institutions showed a slight drop (0.3 percent) and private institutions increased nearly 3 percent (figure 8 and table 5). Within each sector, the changes between 1980 and 1981 were rather erratic, as the figure shows. But when averaged over the 1978-81 period, the overall changes are more reasonable (table C).<sup>6</sup>

For the 3-year period, 2-year institutions reported the largest growth rate for first-time freshmen enrolled in higher education, up nearly 4 percent each year. In absolute terms, these same 2-year schools accounted for two-thirds of the overall increase at all institutions. Doctoral-level, comprehensive, and general baccalaureate institutions registered very few additional first-timers during this period—each reported less than a 1-percent rise in enrollment. Specialized institutions did report some growth, about 2 percent per year, but they represented less than a 3-percent share of the total enrollment of first-time freshmen.

Since 1976, entering freshman classes have consisted of more women than men, and the proportion that are women has increased steadily since that time. As of fall 1981, more than 53 percent of all first-time freshmen were women. The number of men attending our Nation's colleges and universities for the first time has fluctuated somewhat since the mid-seventies, with only 2 years (1979 and 1980) of actual increases. Women have shown consistent gains during the same period, but the 1980-81 growth rate was the lowest reported.

Full-time first-time freshmen outnumbered the part-timers nearly 2 to 1 in 1981. While the number enrolling full-time decreased this year, down 0.7 percent, part-time first-timers continued to increase, up 2.4 percent over 1980. All types of institutions (except those new to the universe) reported declines between 1980 and 1981 in the number of full-time first-time freshmen. In most instances (specialized schools were the exception because of the unusual nature of their enrollment), men registered larger declines than women. Among those enrolling part-time, some rather unusual situations arose: doctoral institutions reported increases of nearly 23 percent among first-time

freshmen, comprehensive and general baccalaureate schools registered declines of 7 percent and 6 percent, respectively, and specialized schools noted increases of nearly 13 percent. Two-year institutions enrolled almost the same number of part-time first-time freshmen in both 1980 and 1981, approximately 716,000, or 84 percent of the total in 1981, down from an 86-percent share in 1980.

## Enrollment Distribution, by State

Changes in the distribution of student enrollment began to take place in 1981. At that time, fiscal restrictions in many State budgets led to reductions in student aid and to the reduced availability of occupational programs in many public institutions. Both Washington and Oregon suffered appreciable declines in enrollment between 1980 and 1981, down 8.2 percent and 4.8 percent respectively (tables D and 13). Five other States (Delaware, Tennessee, Arkansas, Michigan, and Nevada) reported decreases in total enrollment of between 2.7 percent and 1.3 percent, while another four States showed declines of less than 1 percent. Healthy increases were noted in Alaska, up 16 percent over 1980, Louisiana up 9 percent, and Ohio and South Dakota, up nearly 7 percent each.

The overall distribution of students among States and regions has changed little over the past few years. California, New York, and Texas led the Nation in enrollment of students overall, as well as at the undergraduate level. However, at the graduate level, enrollment was distributed quite differently. Although California and New York still ranked one and two, they enrolled nearly the same number of graduate students, approximately 120,000 each. Illinois ranked third with nearly 60,000 graduates, closely followed by Pennsylvania (55,500) and Massachusetts (51,300). First-professional students tended to cluster in a few States; again, California and New York ranked highest.

# Chapter 2

## Changes in Enrollment Among Ongoing Institutions<sup>7</sup>

Traditionally, NCES's report of fall enrollment in higher education has included data from all institutions included in that year's survey universe. Because many new institutions enter the survey universe each year, the trend in enrollment among ongoing institutions has been obscured.<sup>6</sup> With the development of the new classification system of institutions, it is now possible for NCES to separately identify the institutions new to the survey universe in a particular year. By doing so, we can highlight enrollment trends among institutions that have been included for several years. The remainder of this chapter is devoted to that end.

Since the new classification has been introduced only recently, not all elements of enrollment have been tabulated using the new system. However, the following sections do provide a basis for comparison with chapter 1 that discusses enrollment in all institutions included in the survey universe.

### Changes Between 1978 and 1981

Between fall 1978 and fall 1981, total enrollment in the ongoing institutions of higher education increased almost 9 percent. Enrollment of full-time students increased 6.9 percent while that of part-time students increased 14.8 percent. As might be expected, the enrollment increases in public institutions paralleled those for all institutions, 7.5 percent among full-time students and 11.9 percent among part-time students (table E and figure 9).

Enrollment growth among all private institutions was somewhat lower during this period: 5.4 percent for full-time students and 11.1 percent among part-time students. However, these figures obscure the considerable difference in the rate of change between nonprofit and proprietary institutions. Between fall 1978 and fall 1981, nonprofit colleges and universities saw full-time enrollment increase by 4.3 percent and part-time by 14.2 percent. By contrast, during the same period, full-time enrollment in the proprietary institutions rose 43.5 percent, compared to 5.8 percent among part-timers (table E).

During the 1978-81 period, the enrollment of women continued to increase at a faster rate than that of men. Among all ongoing institutions, the enrollment of men increased 4.7 percent while that of women rose 13.1 percent. Enrollment growth rates in the public sector were slightly higher than these totals: 5.5 percent for men and 13.2 percent for women. The rate of increase in the private sector as a whole was smaller than that in the public sector: the growth rate for men increased 2 percent while that of women increased 12.6 percent. The enrollment of men in nonprofit institutions rose only 1.5 percent while the comparable figure in the proprietary institutions was 24.6 percent. The increase in the enrollment of women in nonprofit institutions was 11.6 percent compared to a 44.9-percent rise in the proprietary sector. However, since enrollment totals are small for this group, a small numerical increase can result in a large percentage increase (table F and figure 10).

### Changes from 1980 to 1981

Total fall enrollment in 1981 was 1.9 percent higher than in 1980 among all of the ongoing colleges and universities included in this survey. Among public institutions the increase was 2.0 percent, while all private institutions combined showed

Figure 9.—Percent change in enrollment in institutions of higher education, by attendance status and control, without new institutions: 50 States and D.C., fall 1978-81

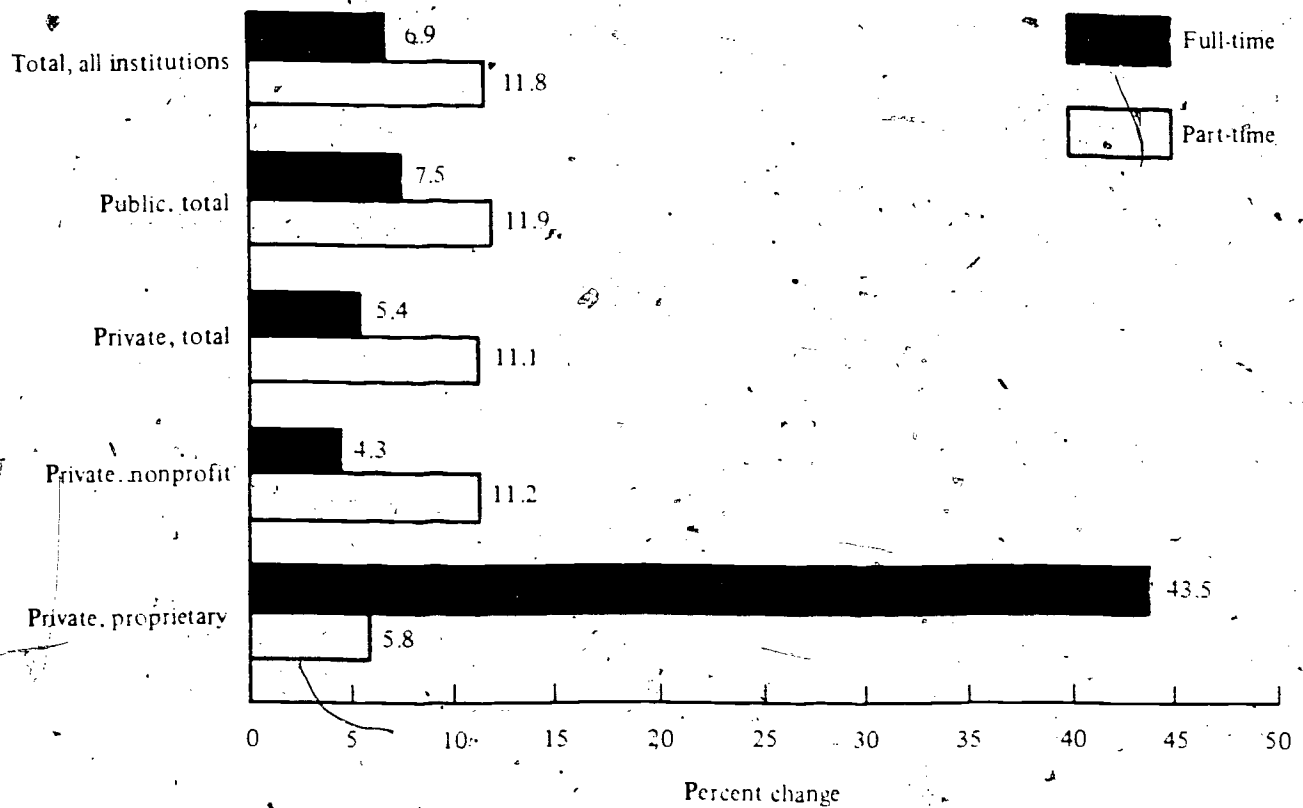




Figure 9A:—Percent change in enrollment in institutions of higher education, by attendance status and control, without new institutions: 50 States and D.C., fall 1980-81

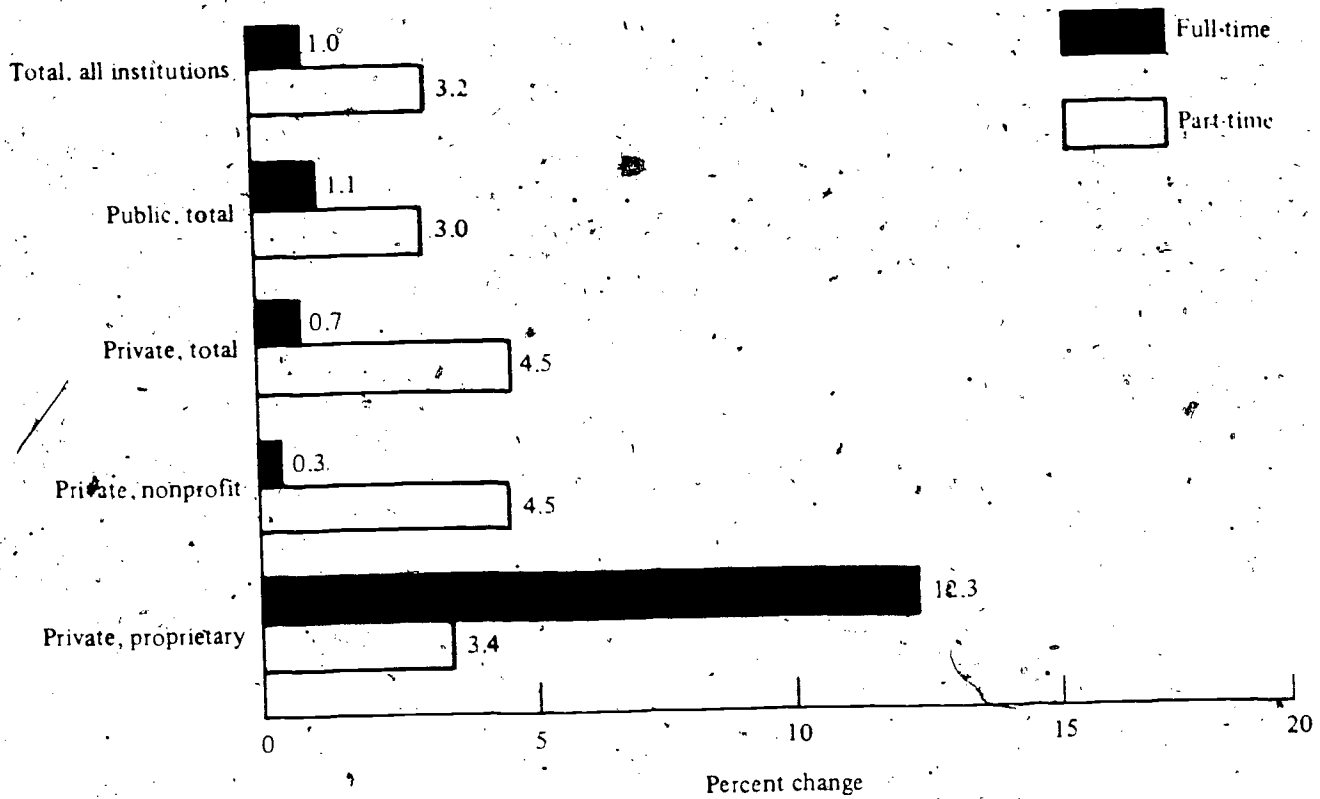

Figure 10.—Percent change in enrollment in institutions of higher education, by sex and control, without new institutions: 50 States and D.C., fall 1978-81

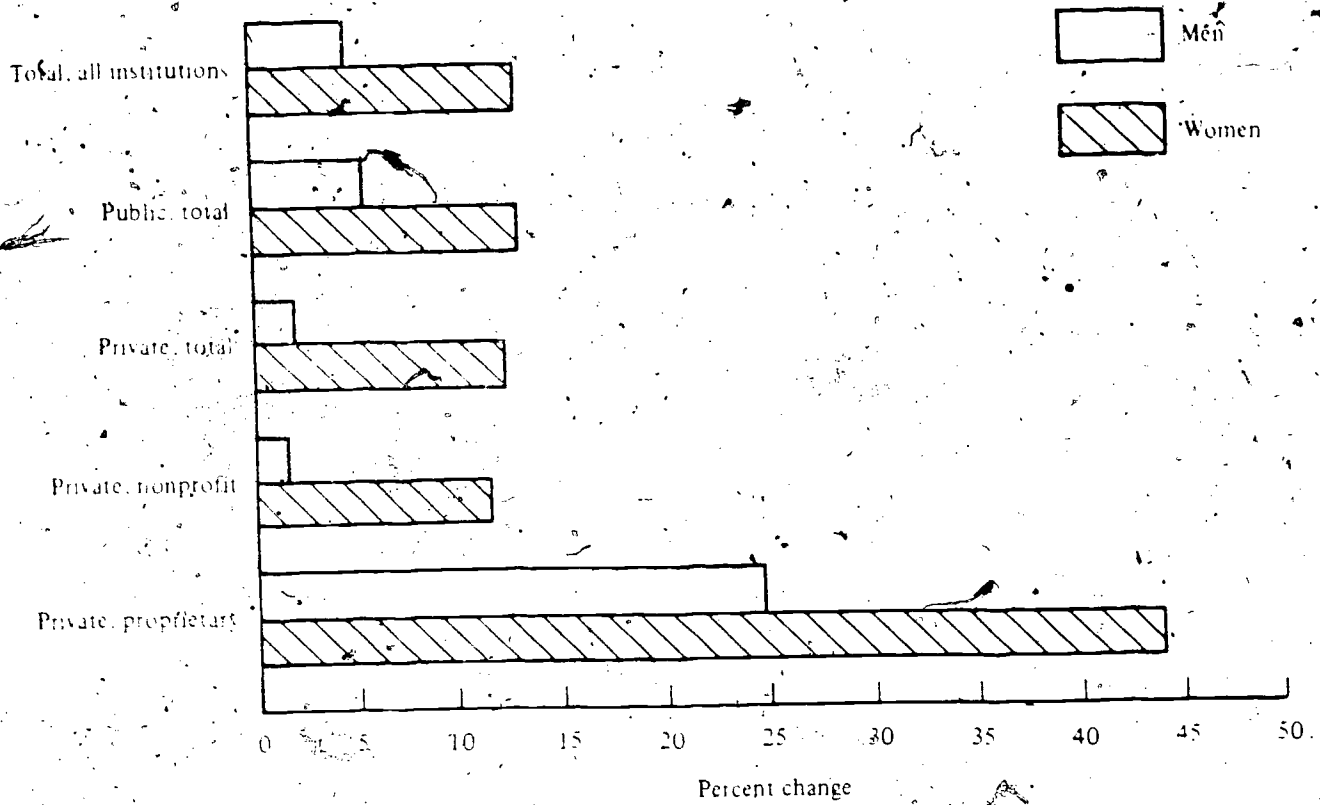
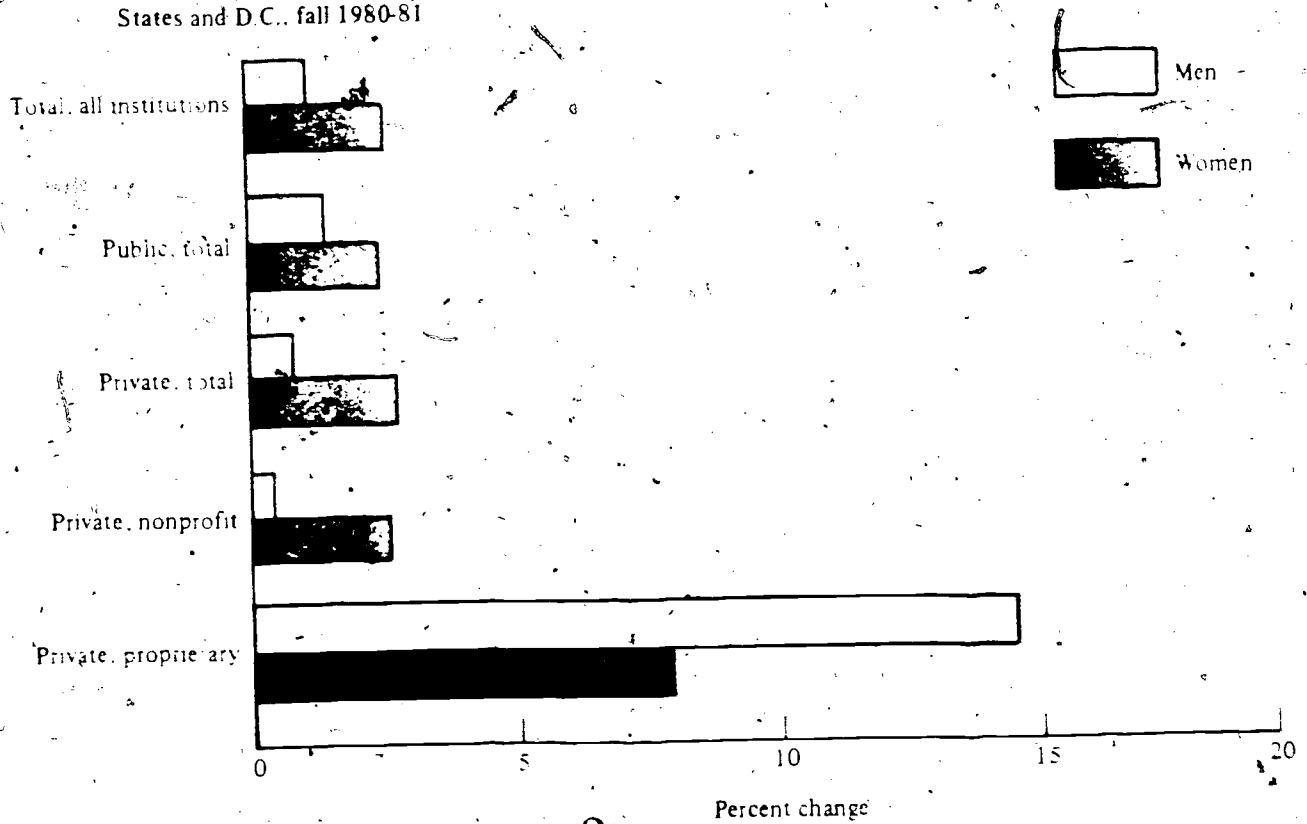


Figure 10A.—Percent change in enrollment in institutions of higher education, by sex and control, without new institutions: 50 States and D.C., fall 1980-81



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a gain of 1.8 percent. However, while enrollment in the nonprofit institutions was increasing by 1.5 percent, enrollment in proprietary institutions was increasing by 10.7 percent (table E).

Enrollment of part-time students continued to increase at a faster rate than that of full-time students in most sectors. While the 1-year increase in enrollment of full-time students was 1.0 percent, the equivalent figure for part-time students was 3.2 percent. Public institutions, in general, showed a higher rate of increase in enrollment of full-time students (1.1 percent), but a lower rate of increase in enrollment of part-time students (3.0 percent), when compared to the private sector as a whole (0.7 percent and 4.5 percent, respectively). Within the private sector, the nonprofit institutions experienced a much lower rate of increase in the enrollment of full-time students (0.3 percent), but a higher rate of increase in the enrollment of part-time students (4.5 percent), when compared to proprietary institutions (12.3 percent and 3.4 percent, respectively) (table E).

The rate of increase of the enrollment of women continued to exceed that of men, as it had for the past several years. Among all institutions, the enrollment of men increased by 1.2 percent, while that of women increased by 2.6 percent. As might be expected, the enrollment changes in public institutions were similar to those for all institutions: 1.4 percent for men and 2.5 percent for women. This compares with rates of change among all private institutions of 0.8 percent for men and 2.8 percent for women.

The difference between nonprofit and proprietary institutions was considerable. While the enrollment of men was increasing by 0.4 percent in nonprofit institutions, it increased in proprietary schools by 14.4 percent. Comparable rates for women were 2.6 percent and 7.8 percent, respectively (table F).

## Changes in Enrollment, by Type of Institution

Between 1980 and 1981, the patterns of change in enrollment among various types of institutions tended to be similar in the public and private sectors, with two notable exceptions. In general, public doctoral-level institutions tended to show the lowest rate of increase in enrollment, followed in order by comprehensive, general baccalaureate, and specialized; 2-year colleges showed the largest rate of growth. Among private, nonprofit institutions, however, the enrollment increase in doctoral-level institutions exceeded that of both comprehensive and general baccalaureate institutions. Among proprietary institutions, the rate of enrollment increase in specialized institutions exceeded that of 2-year schools (table G).

## Changes in Enrollment of First-Time Freshmen

Between 1980 and 1981, the enrollment of new freshmen declined in all types of public institutions, except for those classified as specialized. On the other hand, the enrollment of new freshmen rose in private, nonprofit institutions classified as doctoral-level and comprehensive, while declining in the other three types. Overall, new freshmen dropped by 0.7 percent in both public and private, nonprofit institutions. By contrast, the enrollment of new freshmen in proprietary institutions increased by 7.8 percent (table H).

## Summary

Through the period 1978 to 1981, total enrollment in ongoing institutions of higher education continued to increase, although at a slower rate at the end of that period. Private, nonprofit institutions showed the slowest rates of growth, while the proprietary institutions reported the fastest rates of increase. On the other hand, both public and private institutions experienced a decline in the number of new freshmen admitted in 1981.

The 0.1-percent drop in new freshmen enrolling in the total private sector masks the larger 0.7-percent decline among nonprofit institutions. While the declines in general may be small, it is the potential impact upon certain types of institutions that is disconcerting. The nonprofit, general baccalaureate institutions experienced the largest decreases in the number of new freshmen, down 4.1 percent between 1980 and 1981. It is also these institutions that have tended to enroll the majority of their students directly from high school as full-time students. With the projected decline in high school graduates, and without the tradition of programs aimed at older students, these institutions appear particularly vulnerable to competition from other types of institutions.

# Appendix A

## Methodology

### Survey Background

This publication contains the results of the 1981 survey of Fall Enrollment in Institutions of Higher Education, conducted as part of the 16th annual Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) program. All institutions recognized as accredited and listed in the *Education Directory, Colleges and Universities, 1981-82* provided information for the survey or were imputed based on a previous year's response. Data presented in the detailed tables are for all institutions located in the 50 States and the District of Columbia, except for the State tables, which include statistics for schools in the outlying areas. Tables 1 through 18 were designed to present data using the new classification of institutions; schools were designated as either doctoral-level, comprehensive, general baccalaureate, specialized, 2-year, or new to the universe. Appendix tables A-2 through A-12 are directly comparable to tables in the first section, but the old classification of institutions (university, other 4-year, and 2-year) was used in order to conform to those published last year.

### The Universe

The universe for the 1981 enrollment survey consisted of the 3,253 institutions of higher education and their branches in the 50 States and D.C., as well as an additional 41 institutions in the outlying areas. Table A-1 indicates the total number of institutional units in the 1981 universe; fall 1980 totals are included for comparison.

Data have been compiled annually as part of the HEGIS program since 1966, and the origins of the fall enrollment survey extend back to the early 1900's. The survey instrument used currently has not changed appreciably since 1976, thus preserving the consistency of reporting needed for statistical analyses. The 1981 enrollment survey requested data by attendance status (full- or part-time), enrollment level (undergraduate, first-professional, graduate, or unclassified), and sex of student. The institutional reporting of data also allows for compilation by State, control (public, private), type of institution, and various other characteristics of the institutions themselves that would lend to analysis.

### Questionnaire Editing

The survey forms, 2300-2.3A for 4-year institutions and 2300-2.3B for 2-year institutions, were mailed to State coordinators for distribution or directly to institutions in non-coordinated States for completion of data. The survey carried a due date of November 15, 1981. Follow-up was completed by March 15, and a clean data base was declared on May 20, 1982. The schedule for the processing of the 1981 data was somewhat slower than usual due to the adaptation of the new classification of institutions, the reprogramming of tables to present data in this new format as well as for just the 50 States and D.C., and the late arrival of data from two very large university systems.

Each response to the 1981 survey was edited for internal consistency (add checks) and consistency with the previous year's response (tolerance checks). Error resolution was performed and institutions were contacted for clarification of problems that could not be resolved by the data editors. These procedures eliminated the larger reporting errors; however, some variances still exist that reflect changes in definitions, reporting practices, and/or institutional policies.

### Response Rate

Responses to the 1981 survey yielded an institutional response rate of 98.5 percent. For the 49 institutions that did not respond, data were imputed based on their 1980 responses, where available. For those institutions that were not part of the 1980 universe, the enrollment estimate provided through the Institutional Characteristics Survey was prorated based on a peer institution.

For institutions that responded to the survey, partial imputation was made for item nonresponse. Again, the 1980 survey response was used where possible; FTE data were imputed or generated at .33 of the part-time total.

# Appendix B

## NCES Classification of Institutions of Higher Education

### General

The following categories A through D cover institutions that grant more than 25 percent of their degrees at the baccalaureate level or above. Institutions in category E grant 75 percent or more of their awards below the baccalaureate level. Category F is for new institutions.

#### A. Doctoral-level Institutions

These are institutions characterized by a significant level and breadth of activity in and commitment to doctoral-level education as measured by the number of doctorate recipients and the diversity in doctoral-level program offerings. Included in this category are institutions that are not considered specialized schools (see category D below) and that grant a minimum of 30 doctoral-level degrees. These degrees must be granted in three or more doctoral-level program areas\* or, alternatively, have an interdisciplinary program at the doctoral level. Included in the counts of doctoral degrees for classification purposes are the following first-professional degrees: M.D., D.D.S., D.O., and D.V.M. All of these are in a single program area, health professions. One other type of institution is also classified as doctoral: any institution that meets all other criteria for being so classified, except for the number of doctorates, and grants *only* doctorates, is classified as doctoral-level.

#### B. Comprehensive Institutions

These institutions are characterized by diverse post-baccalaureate programs (including first-professional), but do not engage in significant doctoral-level education. Specifically, this category includes institutions not considered specialized in which the number of doctoral-level degrees granted is less than 30 or in which fewer than 3 doctoral-level programs are offered. In addition, these institutions must grant a minimum of 30 post-baccalaureate degrees (master's, doctor, and first-professional) and either grant degrees in 3 or more post-baccalaureate programs or, alternatively, have an interdisciplinary program at the post-baccalaureate level.

#### C. General Baccalaureate Institutions

These institutions are characterized by their primary emphasis on general undergraduate, baccalaureate-level education. They are not significantly engaged in post-baccalaureate education. Included are institutions not considered as specialized and those in which the number of post-baccalaureate degrees granted is less than 30 or in which fewer than 3 post-baccalaureate level programs are offered and which either (a) grant baccalaureate degrees in 3 or more program areas, or (b) offer a baccalaureate program in interdisciplinary studies.

#### D. Specialized Institutions

These are baccalaureate or post-baccalaureate institutions characterized by a programmatic emphasis in one area (plus closely related specialties), such as business or engineering. The programmatic emphasis is measured by the percentage of degrees granted in the program area. An institution granting over 60 percent of its degrees in one program area, or granting over one-half of its degrees in one program area *and* granting degrees in fewer than 5 baccalaureate program areas, is considered to be a specialized institution. (The U.S. Service Schools are also considered specialized.)

#### E. 2-Year Institutions

These are institutions that confer at least 75 percent of their degrees and awards for work below the bachelor's level.

\* Programs, or program areas, are major fields of study defined at the two-digit level (such as 1200) of the HEGIS Taxonomy of Programs, plus closely related specialties. Subsequent references to program areas refer to this definition.

**F. Institutions Newly Admitted to HEGIS**

These are institutions that have been recently admitted to the Higher Education General Information System universe (NOT necessarily newly organized). As soon as degree and award information becomes available to NCES, these institutions will be reclassified.
