ABSTRACT

Data are presented showing enrollment trends and student characteristics in Illinois public community colleges. Part 1 summarizes statewide fall opening enrollments for 1979 through 1983, emphasizing changes that occurred in fall 1983. This section examines student enrollment by college and instructional program, full-/part-time enrollments, male/female enrollments, enrollments by ethnic origin, and enrollments by age category. In addition, part 1 provides a summary of data and trends for the period. Part 2 presents preliminary data for the winter quarter/spring semester of fiscal year (FY) 1984 and compares these data with information for the same period of 1983. Highlighted findings include the following: (1) the fall opening headcount enrollment for 1983 was 356,643 students, representing a decrease of 31,179 students, or 8%, from 1982; (2) of the 52 colleges in the state, 14 showed increases in enrollment, 31 experienced decreases, and 7 showed little or no change in fall 1983; (3) enrollment decreases were seen primarily in remedial, adult education, and general studies programs; (4) 30.3% of the fall 1983 students were enrolled full-time, compared with 25% for fall 1982; (5) enrollment decreases were experienced in all ethnic categories with the largest percentage of decreases occurring in minority enrollments; and (6) preliminary data for FY 1983 also showed decreases in headcount and full-time equivalent enrollments over FY 1983. 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REPORT ON ENROLLMENT TRENDS IN ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

REPORT: The purpose of this report is to present a summary of Fiscal Year 1984 student enrollment data and characteristics. The report is presented in two parts. The first part summarizes statewide fall opening enrollments for the last five years, emphasizing changes that occurred in the fall 1983. The second part presents preliminary data for the winter quarter/spring semester of Fiscal Year 1984 compared with data for the same time period in Fiscal Year 1983.

PART 1

STUDENT ENROLLMENT DATA AND TRENDS IN THE PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES OF ILLINOIS: FALL 1983

Overview of Report

This report focuses on a summary of statewide student enrollment trends and student characteristics in Illinois public community colleges. The analyses are based on fall 1983 opening enrollments as reported by the colleges to the ICCB at the end of the regular fall registration period (usually the 10th day of the term). It should be noted that these data do not reflect enrollment in courses that begin after the end of the regular registration period. For colleges having two or more modules during a semester, only those students enrolled in the first module are included. Therefore, these enrollments do not include all students to enroll during the fall term. However, they are comparable counts from year to year and from institution to institution. In addition, these counts are comparable to fall enrollment data in institutions of higher education throughout the nation.

For comparison with past fall enrollments, summary data for the last five years are presented for a number of student characteristics. In addition to the summary data, a detailed table comparing fall 1982 and fall 1983 headcount and FTE enrollments by college is included. Additional enrollment data for each community college will be included in the Fiscal Year 1984 edition of the Data and Characteristics of the Illinois Public Community College System.

Student Enrollment by Community College

Fall opening headcount enrollment for 1983 (Fiscal Year 1984) was 356,643 and full-time equivalent (FTE) students totaled 179,165. Table 1 shows a comparison of these enrollment data with similar data for the previous four years. A comparison of student headcount enrollment for 1983 with data from a year ago shows a decrease of eight percent or 31,179 students. FTE enrollment decreased 5.3 percent from 189,245 to 179,165.

Table 2 on the next page shows a comparison of 1983 fall opening enrollments with 1982 fall opening enrollments for each community college. Of the 52 colleges, fourteen showed increases, 31 showed decreases, and seven showed little or no change (< 1.0 percent) in headcount. Percentage decreases ranged from 1.7 percent to 44.1 percent while increases ranged from 1.1 percent to 32.9 percent.

Enrollment in Instructional Programs

A summary of total student headcount enrollment, distribution, and percent change by instructional program areas from fall 1979 to fall 1983 is presented in Table 3.

Although there has been a decrease in total headcount and FTE enrollments in fall 1983, enrollments in the pre-baccalaureate and occupational program areas are remaining relatively constant or increasing. Primary decreases occurred in the remedial and adult education areas, as well as in general studies program area enrollments. Other trends in enrollments by instructional program areas are difficult to interpret due to changes in the use of the "undeclared" or unknown category. There have also been changes in coding between program areas from year to year. For example, the "undeclared" category was used inconsistently in colleges in past years. As this category is being phased out, the students are being classified in other categories.

Summary of Full-time/Part-time Enrollments

The proportion of students enrolled in community colleges for twelve or more credit hours per semester has steadily increased over the last five years (see Table 4). Data show that 30.3 percent of fall 1983 students were enrolled on a full-time basis compared with 25 percent for fall 1979. While the number of full-time students showed a decrease of 4.4 percent in 1983 from the previous year, the major decreases (9.5 percent) occurred in part-time enrollments.

Summary of Male/Female Enrollments

Table 5 presents a summary of male and female headcount from fall 1979 to fall 1983. During the period from 1980 to 1983, the ratio of male to female students has remained relatively constant. This contrasts with the period of mid to late 1970's when female enrollments increased as male enrollments decreased. A comparison of 1983 with 1982 shows a slightly larger decrease in male enrollments than female enrollments.

Summary of Ethnic Origin Enrollments

Analysis of reported ethnic origin data indicates that ethnic enrollment distributions have remained relatively constant over the last five years. Table 6 presents ethnic origin enrollments, distributions, and percent changes for the year 1979 through 1983. Examination of fall 1983 data suggests that while decreased enrollments were experienced in all ethnic origin groups, the largest percentage decreases were experienced in minority enrollments. Due to the variation in the use of the unknown category, small changes in ethnic origin distribution should be interpreted with caution.

Summary of Enrollment by Age Categories

Analysis of enrollments in community colleges by age over time is difficult because of the variation in the unreported age from year to year. As the number of unreported ages continues to decrease, it will be possible to make more accurate observations regarding the age structure of the students. Table 7 presents a summary of total student headcount, annual distribution, and percent change by age categories for fall 1979 through fall 1983. The largest increase in 1983 enrollment occurred in the 21-24 age category. Decreases occurred in the categories below age 21 and above age 55.

Summary of Data and Trends

Headcount and FTE enrollments in public community colleges declined in fall 1983 by eight percent and 5.3 percent, respectively. A number of factors potentially contributed to this decline. Enrollments peaked in 1981 and 1982 when the economy in Illinois was experiencing a marked decline. As the economy improves, decline in community college enrollments is expected. Additionally, population growth has slowed since 1960. Colleges are beginning to experience the affects of a drop in the traditional entry-level college age population.

An examination of various student enrollment and characteristics data over the last five years provides some insights into where enrollment declines occurred in 1983. Enrollments in pre-baccalaureate and occupational program areas have increased in 1983 while the remedial and adult education program areas have experienced a significant decrease. Part-time enrollments experienced a greater decline than did full-time enrollments. Minority enrollments appear to have declined at a greater rate than non-minority enrollments. Enrollment decreases occurred in age groups below 21 and the age group over 55. It will be important to monitor these changes during future terms to determine whether these will become continuing trends.

PART 2

PRELIMINARY REPORT OF FISCAL YEAR 1984 WINTER QUARTER/SPRING SEMESTER
ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE ENROLLMENT: FALL 1983

The Winter Quarter/Spring Semester (second term) Enrollment Survey reports preliminary community college enrollments as of the end of registration (usually the 10th day of the term) for the five college districts with a winter quarter and the thirty-five districts on the semester system. Results of the Fiscal Year 1984 survey show that both headcount and FTE second term enrollments have decreased by 6.2 percent from the winter quarter/spring semester Fiscal Year 1983. Table 1 shows a comparison of this term's enrollments with those of last year's and with fall 1983 term. The total student headcount was 354,623, a decrease of 23,251, and total FTE enrollment was 169,664, a decrease of 11,305 from Fiscal Year 1983. Compared with fall enrollment, winter/spring headcount enrollments have decreased only 0.6 percent and FTE enrollments have decreased 5.3 percent. The headcount decrease from fall is lower than usual, while the decrease in FTE is about average.

Table 2 on the next page shows a comparison of winter quarter/spring semester headcount and FTE enrollments for each community college in Illinois with headcount and FTE enrollments for the same term during Fiscal Year 1983. Of the 52 colleges, 16 reported headcount increases, 34 showed decreases, and two revealed little or no change (< 1 percent change). Headcount increases ranged from 1.5 percent to 40.6 percent. Decreases ranged from one percent to 22.8 percent. FTE increases were reported by eleven colleges, decreases by 37 colleges, and little or no change by four colleges.
