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#### ABSTRACT

Over 150 resources used in a California junior high school individualized reading program are provided as an aid to teachers interested in developing a similar program. Emphasis is on remedial, corrective, English as a second language (ESL), and motivational materials. For each resource cited, information is provided on reading level, purpose, format, teacher's manual, teachers' evaluation, and publisher. Additional sections in the sourcebook list materials for counseling, ESL and bilingual students, and materials for specific junior high school reading levels. (LP)

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

#### INTRODUCTION

The De Anza Reading Center, a California Demonstration Program for Intensive Instruction in Reading, was established in January of 1973. It is a replication of the Model Schools Reading Program at Santa Barbara Junior High School.

The Reading Center staff is committed to two basic goals: to increase the READING ACHIEVEMENT and to improve the SELF-CONCEPT of each student enrolled in the two year program. To meet these goals, the staff has implemented the following instructional strategies:

- Supportive, non-threatening environment emphasizing individual success.
- Diagnostic-prescriptive approach to individualized instruction and learning.
- Low pupil-teacher ratio with teachers and instructional aides who care about students and believe they can learn.
- Wide variety of high interest, multi-sensory materials and methods to meet the needs of various learning styles.
- 'Program designed to mee't the needs of all students: remedial, corrective, and developmental.

Many visitors to the Reading Center have requested information about the instructional programs being used. They seek specific recommendations about appropriate materials for students who are remedial, corrective or developmental readers. Teachers are concerned with locating resources for use with predominately Spanish-speaking students, the poorly motivated, or those with perceptual problems. In addition, visitors are interested in teachers' preferences and students' responses to various programs.

De Anza Designs--Resources in Reading is an attempt to supply the requested information. We hope our experiences with junior high students using a wide variety of materials will be helpful to others. Our goal is to make learning exciting, relevant and successful for students. The materials described in this booklet are helping us to achieve this goal.

A kit containing nine sets of cards (24 cards per set) and a cassette tape for each set are the major. components of the Aero Learning Lab. Each card has a lesson printed on one side with a cutout portion for the student to write his response on paper or slate. The correct response is printed on the reverse side of the card. By flipping the card over, the student can check and correct his own work.

Each cassette tape gives needed instruction in Spanish and English. **PURPOSE** 

To provide underachieving teenagers with relevant reading material through true stories about people and their jobs. To present exercises aimed at improving basic reading skills.

FORMAT:

This soft cover book contains 31 very brief stories about real-life situations encountered by men and women in a variety of occupations. It is illustrated with photographs of adults engaged in their work and nothing in the book's format reveals its 10w readability level. Each story is followed by exercises designed to provide vocabulary development and improve comprehension skills such as recalling details, sequencing, getting the main idea and making inferences A "Let's Write" and "Let's Talk" section are provided to develop language arts skills such as spelling, punctuation and word usage. There is also emphasis on understanding the qualifications necessary to perform the various jobs portrayed.

TEACHER'S MANUAL:

Teaching guide contains rationale for the various exercises, sample lesson plans, answer key and suggestions for career activities to help students expand their knowledge of various occupations.

TEACHER COMMENTS:

None of the stories in this book are over a page long. This brevity makes All in a Day's Work a very useful material for working with the reluctant or very slow-paced reader who is often overwhelmed by lengthy stories. The exercises provided are very comprehensive and give the teacher a wide selection of skill areas to emphasize with individual students.

## ANN ARBOR TRACKING PROGRAM

READING LEVEL:

Appropriate for beginning, remedial and slow readers at all age levels, including adults.

**PURPOSE:** 

To improve visual discrimination, left to right directional attack and skill in following a line of print. To eliminate errors such as reversals, omissions, substitutions and additions. Specific purpose for each title are:

Symbol Discrimination and Sequencing: To benefit students exhibiting poor memory for word groups, inattention or distractibility.

Letter Tracking: Presents visual discrimination training for students who confuse similar letters or words, lose their place frequently, omit words and skip lines of print.

Cues and Comprehension: Designed to develop a student's ability to use visual and context cues and to improve visual memory.

FORMAT:

Workbooks containing visual discrimination practice designed to be used individually or in small groups. The three titles provide progressively more complex exercises and require timing and simple record keeping. Each workbook asks students to track symbols, letter or words in a line of print. TEACHER COMMENTS:

These lessons can be very helpful for students who need to improve their visual efficiency. For best results, exercises should be done for a brief time each day and progress charts should be kept. The lessons are popular with students who enjoy trying to better their own records and consistant practice results in good transfer of skills to regular reading material.

PURPOSE:

### PURPOSE:

To motivate reluctant low-level junior high students to read independently by providing mature-interest reading materials in paper-back form. Specifically for the problem reader who is turned off by the textbook approach. Phonetic and structural analysis, vocabulary and comprehension skills are also developed through the program.

### FDRMAT:

Paperback books featuring sports stories, science fiction, biographies of entertainment figures and other writings chosen to appeal to teenagers. Duplicator masters for each title provide worksheets which reinforce word attack and comprehension skills with brief exercises.

#### TEACHER'S MANUAL:

Teacher's guides are available for each title and contain lesson plans which include synopsis of each story, introduction of concepts and key vocabulary and comprehension questions.

#### TEACHER COMMENTS:

This series fills a need for high interest materials at low reading levels. The authors are aware of the problem of motivating older readers who have had little success with traditional textbooks. The stories are usually more popular with boys than girls.

#### PUBLISHER:

Magazines 1, 2 and 3 are usually of more interest to boys but Clues 4 and 5 appeal to girls as well. Lessons are brief and correlate with cassette tapes. Diagnostic and evaluative test booklets come in the center of the magazines and are removed when administered. Tests are also on tape. Students are placed in program by comparing diagnostic test scores with criterion test score chart.

TEACHER'S MANUAL:

Provides complete instruction for administering the program, a scope and sequence chart, a criterion test score chart and a Clues--A.P.R.L. chart for correlating lessons for students in the Audio Reading Progress Lab who need extra help on specific skills. This tape is very instructive for teachers dealing with students who speak non-standard English.

One drawback is that the diagnostic tests for magazines 1, 2 and 3 tend to place students too high in the program. Conversely, the tests for magazines 4 and 5 are quite long and the vocabulary quite frustrating for students reading at fourth grade level and below. It is probably more valid to place students in the program as a result of other diagnostic testing which has indicated a need for the basic instruction provided by the Clues Magazines.

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# MATERIALS FOR E.S.L. AND BILINGUAL STUDENTS

### SUGGESTIONS AND MATERIALS FOR NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING (NES) AND LIMITED-ENGLISH SPEAKING (LES) STUDENTS

In dealing with the instructional needs of our non-English speaking Spanish speakers we first identify the four categories in which our students fall:

#### 1. Non-English Speaking/Non-reader

Because initial instruction in reading should be presented in a student's native language, the student who has never learned to read needs to be taught basic reading skills in Spanish. A comprehensive program for this purpose is Spanish Reading Keys which is a beginning Spanish reading program. It provides sequential lesson plans in both Spanish and English and is described in detail in the body of this book.

Although concurrent teaching of reading in Spanish and English is not recommended, these students can begin to develop their oral English skills. The reading skills developed in Spanish can be applied to the reading of English after the student has sufficient mastery of the English language.

#### 2. Non-English Speaking/Literate in Spanish

Students in this catagory need to focus primarily on the acquisition of oral English skills. Materials developed for an English as a Second Language approach are useful for providing students with a practical, functional vocabulary. All of the following programs except See it, Say it and the Vocabulary Builder are accompanied by tapes which enable students to work independently. However, none of these materials can be expected to provide sufficient instruction to enable students to acquire English without extensive supplementary work in oral English.

While these students are concentrating on learning English, they should still maintain and extend their



ability to read and understand Spanish. Success in a second language is in direct proportion to the achievement level of language skills in the primary language. with 75% accuracy. This can be determined by reading paragraphs from a second grade reader or using the second grade paragraphs from a diagnostic test such as the Classroom Reading Inventory by Micholas Silvaroli. The paragraphs should be followed by several inferential questions to determine comprehension of the listening material. When a student can understand English at this level he should be ready for instruction in reading.

These exercises are challenging and provide considerable opportunities for student practice in valuable skill development. Students tend to be more enthusiastic if they are given some choice about the exercises. Assigning all exer-

cises is cherwhelming to most.
