## ABSTRACT

Based on a 1983 survey of all accredited two-year institutions in the United States and members of the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges (AACJC) in other countries, this directory provides a comprehensive list of the 1,219 community, junior, and technical colleges as well as statistics on enrollment and staffing for each. Following introductory material on the uses of the directory, information is presented on the AACJC, its mission and goals, and affiliated councils and associates. After explaining how to interpret data, summarizing changes since 1983, and defining key terms, the directory lists each two-year college alphabetically by state or country and provides the following information: location; chief executive officer; telephone number; year college classes began; type of control or affiliation; AACJC membership; state recognition or accrediting agency; type of academic calendar; October 1982 and 1983 full- and part-time and total enrollments; community education enrollments in 1982-83; full- and part-time and total faculty, professional staff, and administrators as of October 1983; and tuition and fees required in 1983-84. Next, tables are presented summarizing enrollment and personnel data by state for all institutions, and for public and independent colleges. Lists of community, technical and junior college organizations and state administrators of two-year college education and an alphabetical listing of colleges conclude the directory. Appendices include the AACJC Constitution. (AYC)

## Introduction

The annual *Community, Technical, and Junior College Directory* is recognized as the most authoritative and up-to-date publication of names, addresses, enrollments, and other facts and figures about the institutions it covers. It provides easy access to important information about individual colleges and traces trends on enrollments, staffing, tuitions, and fees. It is used by Congress, federal agencies, state education departments, colleges, and universities. Book vendors have standing orders for hundreds of copies as soon as it is off the press.

The AACJC *Directory* provides its users with the only comprehensive list of names and addresses of two-year colleges, as well as names of their chief executive officers. It also provides the accreditation status of each institution. Enrollment totals—part-time and full-time—are recorded for fall of the current year (1983-84), and for fall

of the previous academic year (1982-83). There are also statistics concerning community service/adult education enrollments. Users can find out how many faculty, staff, and administrators each institution employs and can compare tuition and fees—from college to college and state to state.

One section of the *Directory* summarizes and analyzes the data collected this year and makes comparisons with other years. These analyses are useful in helping to determine trends and patterns in growth and development.

Hundreds of hours go into the production of the *Directory*. Work begins in August, when questionnaires are sent to all accredited two-year institutions in this country and to member institutions in other countries. The next several months are spent correcting and updating data and keying it into the computers. Parts of the *Directory* go to the typesetter in January, and the rest in February. The result of all this work is a *Directory* that is accurate and current, thanks to the cooperation and responsible reporting of the participating colleges.

I believe that with its new format and more comprehensive content this publication will serve its users even better than in the past. If it raises new questions about community, technical, and junior colleges—and answers others—it will have served a most beneficial purpose.

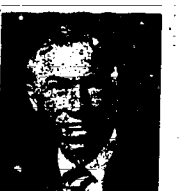

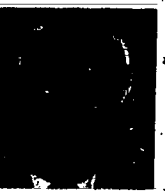

## Mission and Goals

The mission of the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges is to exert *leadership*, act as *advocate*, and provide *services* in support of community, technical, and junior colleges, as these institutions deliver accessible educational opportunities designed to address the needs of the individuals, organizations, and communities forming their constituencies.

### Goal 1

Enhance the public's understanding, acceptance, and support of the roles and missions of member institutions.

### Goal 2

Advocate the interest of member institutions to government, foundations, corporations, media, and other decision-making centers.

### Goal 3

Maintain positive working relationships with affiliated councils and among other institutions and agencies, at local, state, national, and international levels.

### Goal 4

Promote the growth, acceptance, and practice of lifelong education.

### Goal 5

Alert member institutions to trends and issues that present significant opportunities or constraints.

### Goal 6

Provide vigorous national leadership in human resources and economic development and in occupational-technical education

### Goal 7

Encourage and strengthen the humanities, arts, and sciences curricula in the community colleges.

### Goal 8

Promote and support the concept of access to postsecondary education with excellence.

### Goal 9

Provide selected services and assistance to the membership, and continue to improve the administrative operation of the Association.

### Goal 10

Recruit and maintain for membership all eligible public and private community, technical, and junior colleges, and similar postsecondary institutions, and expand the associates' affiliation.

# American Association of Community and Junior Colleges

The American Association of Community and Junior Colleges, headquartered in Washington, D.C., is the only organization whose sole purpose is to represent the interests of the 1,219 public and private community, technical, and junior colleges of the nation.

The mission of the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges is to exert *leadership*, act as *advocate*, and provide *services* in support of community, technical, and junior colleges, as these institutions deliver accessible educational opportunities designed to address the needs of the individuals, organizations, and communities forming their constituencies.

## Advocacy

AACJC continues to reach out to governmental decision makers at the national, state, and local levels on behalf of the mission and needs of community, technical, and junior colleges, their staffs, and their students. AACJC has been particularly effective in communicating with federal officials, members of Congress, and other leaders regarding the value of community, technical, and junior colleges.

The Association of Community College Trustees and AACJC have formed the Joint Commission on Federal Relations to address with "one voice, one agenda" the Congress, federal agencies, and other national organizations. Such advocacy is helping to ensure a fair share of federal funding and student financial aid.

In cooperation with ACCT, AACJC has undertaken a series of initiatives aimed at "Putting America Back to Work" through closer working relationships between business, industry, labor, government, and the colleges. New coalitions have been established with the American Council on Education, American Association of State Colleges and Universities, National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges, American Vocational Association, Education Commission of the States, Council on Occupational Education, many groups involved in adult education, and the Joint Committee on Telecommunications. Through their linkages, AACJC is able to represent the interests of community colleges more effectively.

Advocacy also involves telling the two-year college story to the general public by providing information to the media through press releases, public service radio and television announcements, publications, and staff contact.

## Leadership

Since 1920, when the American Association of Junior Colleges was founded, college presidents and administrators have relied on AACJC. The name was changed in 1972 to reflect more accurately its membership. For the most part, histories of higher education have tended to ignore community colleges; AACJC has been a leader in bringing the achievements of two-year colleges into the light of day

by helping to develop literature the academic world respects.

The theme of AACJC, *Opportunity with Excellence*, recognizes that quality teaching and learning in community colleges reaches out to serve the many, not just the privileged few. Now, at a time when the United States must re-evaluate its priorities in terms of painful economic realities, AACJC has called for a comprehensive national policy on human resource development to serve the needs of a "nation at risk."

## Service

Advocacy is a service. Leadership is a service. But in its dedication to the advancement of community, technical, and junior colleges, AACJC provides much more.

As the most comprehensive organization in the U.S. representing community-based postsecondary institutions, AACJC serves as:

- A means of identifying and giving national recognition to emerging leaders for the future—individuals, institutions, and ideas.
- The only community, technical, and junior college voice for hundreds of national meetings, committees, councils, and commissions.
- A respected reference for appointment recommendations to membership on federal commissions, advisory bodies, and other notable organizations.

- A forum for members' institutional and personal views that will influence the future of education and the nation.
- A singular source of information collected by AACJC and unavailable elsewhere (this *Directory*, for example).
- A sounding board and clearing-house for cost-effective, innovative ideas and people.
- A source of technical assistance for member colleges.

Many of these services are provided through a variety of media of communication, such as:

- *Annual AACJC Convention and Workshops*—to promote the exchange of ideas and information among some 2,500 delegates from colleges nationwide. During the year, other conferences, workshops, and assemblies offer opportunities for special interest groups to come together, particularly for professional development.
- *AACJC Letter*—the only national weekly newsletter exclusively for community, technical, and junior colleges. Personally edited by AACJC President Dale Parnell, this weekly publication is for the busy executive who wants authoritative information in a hurry. Alternate issues of the *Letter* keep you up to date on current legislative issues and federal policies. Editor Frank Mensel, AACJC's vice president for federal relations, monitors bills, attends hearings, develops testimony on pending legislation, and analyzes policies that affect community, technical, and junior colleges. *Federal Focus* lets you know when you should write to your congressional representatives on bills of interest.
- *Community and Junior College Journal*—offers readable, worthwhile information about exemplary programs, practices, and people in articles by presidents, administrators, and professors sharing their best ideas (eight issues per year).

- *Community, Technical, and Junior College Directory*—updated annually, this indispensable source of essential information contains data gathered by AACJC directly from the colleges and other sources. AACJC research analysts are available year-round to answer questions from Association members, news media, and other organizations.
- *Directory of Administrators*—first published in 1984, this reference document contains names of administrative staff at 1,219 accredited two-year colleges. It is an invaluable resource for businesses, governmental agencies, job seekers, and anyone else wanting to contact the right person at the right place.
- *Special publications*—produced with the needs of college executives and staff in mind, these include a series of handy, concise Pocket Readers, monographs, reports, indicator briefs based on statistical data, legislative and legal briefs, bulletins, and brochures.

In addition, the Association serves as headquarters for a liaison network involving the entire AACJC constituency, which includes:

- Community, technical, and junior college presidents, administrators, and staff.
- State college associations and state administrators.
- Affiliated councils.

## Governance

### Board of Directors

The Association is governed by a 31-member Board of Directors. The Board meets three times annually, in different parts of the country, to develop and monitor the policy framework within which the AACJC carries out its mission. Standing committees of the Board meet periodically during the year and provide for much of the in-depth work of the Board. Current committees, appointed by the chairman of the Board, are:

- *Executive Committee*—responsible for personnel matters, finance, and for emergency situations. Bernard J. Luskin is chairman and Judith S. Eaton is vice chairman. Members include the immediate past chairman, Harold D. McAninch, and chairs of four standing committees. - *Committee on Association Vitality and Publications*—responsible for long-range planning and publications oversight. Michael E. Crawford is chairman. Members are Joseph P. Cosand, Kay Elledge-Heimer, Raymond E. Joslin, James Tatum, and James L. Wattenbarger. Bernard J. Luskin is an ex officio member, and James F. Gollattscheck from AACJC is staff.
- *Committee on Directors and Membership Services*—responsible for internal operations of the Board, membership services, and Board nominations. John W. Casey is chairman. Members are A. Robert DeHart, James Kraby, Yvonne Kennedy, R. Jan LeCroy, and Mary M. Norman. Harold D. McAninch is ex officio member and James W. White from AACJC is staff.

- *Ad Hoc Committee on Redefinition of the Associate Degree*—Harold D. McAninch is chairman. Members are Joseph P. Cosand, Mary M. Norman, and Richard K. Greenfield.

Board members normally serve terms of three years each, with one-third of the Board elected each year. Eighteen directors are representatives of institutions, elected by the Board; six are representatives of the affiliated councils, elected by the AACJC membership; and one member is the immediate past chairman of the Board, elected by the Board. By constitutional authority, the majority of the Board must be chief executive officers. Nominations of the institutional representatives are made by the Committee on Directors and Membership Services. While continually open to receive recommendations, the Committee contacts the institutional members in the early fall, seeking recommendations for the following year. The Committee seeks persons capable and willing to bring dedicated and creative leadership to the Association and to the Board. With the recommendations from the field, together with its own experience, the Committee meets in the late fall to develop a slate of multiple nominations. Additional nominations can be made from the field following the Committee's report. The name of any such person, qualified to be a member of the Board, is added to the annual ballot when supported by letters from at least 50 official institutional representatives.

Annual elections, by mail ballot, are conducted no later than April 15 of each year. Each member institution is authorized one ballot to be completed by the official institutional representative.

Further information about the Board of Directors may be obtained from the president or secretary of the Association.

#### Officers

There are five officers of the Association. The chairman and vice

chairman of the Board are elected by the Board of Directors each spring to serve one year—July 1 through June 30. The president of the Association is appointed by the Board to serve for a time designated by the Board. The secretary and treasurer of the Association are designated by the president with the approval of the Board.

#### Commissions

Three commissions have been created by the Board to provide guidance in specific areas of concern to the Association. Commission members are appointed by the chairman of the Board and normally serve terms of three years.

- The Joint Commission on Federal Relations replaces the former Committee on Governmental Relations. The Joint Commission was formed by AACJC and the Association of Community College Trustees to unify the agenda of the two-year colleges in working with Congress and the federal agencies. Sixteen presidents, trustees, and state executives make up this "grass roots" voice of community colleges on national policy. Commission chairman is Joshua L. Smith, president of Borough of Manhattan Community College, New York.
- The Commission on Small/Rural Community Colleges, composed of 12 chief executive officers from member institutions, focuses attention on the needs and concerns of small and rural colleges. Robert A. Anderson, Jr., president of New Mexico

Junior College, New Mexico, is chairman.

- The Commission on Urban Community Colleges was established in 1983 to advise the president and Board of AACJC on matters of concern to community colleges serving urban communities. Fifteen chief executive officers from member institutions make up the commission. Paul A. Elsner, chancellor of The Maricopa Colleges, Arizona, is chairman.

#### President's Academy

The President's Academy devotes attention to the roles, welfare, and professional development of chief executive officers of AACJC member institutions. It provides opportunities to exchange ideas, a program for inservice professional development, and a means of expressing concerns of chief executive officers. Inquiries may be directed to Byron N. ## Affiliated Councils

AACJC has introduced a system of councils through which the common interests of their members can be served. Councils provide individuals with the means to affiliate with the Association beyond official institutional representation. Within a flexible organizational arrangement, councils are encouraged to take initiatives in pursuing proposals and activities in support of Association and council goals.

Through a formal process, councils are recognized as affiliates for a specified period of time—usually three years. A regular review process established by the AACJC Board of Directors allows for extension of the recognition period. Each council is assigned at least one AACJC Board member and one member of the AACJC staff to act as liaisons. In addition, the Association's Constitution and Bylaws provide for six members of the AACJC Board to be elected by the institutional membership to serve as official council representatives on the Board.

# Directory

## Interpreting the Data

In September 1983 the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges collected data directly from the 1,219 community, technical, and junior colleges that make up the field of regionally accredited, associate degree-granting colleges. Each institution received a preprinted, computer-generated form showing the figures reported by the college for the previous year, and each was asked to enter corresponding data for fall 1983. Explanations for increases or decreases over 10 percent were requested from each college.

The results of this annual survey are reported by institution in Table I, and are tabulated by state in Tables II, III, and IV. For some institutions enrollment and other data are reported by campus; for others, the data are aggregate totals and are reported at the district office level.

For the first time, the AACJC data office utilized its own computer system to collect and analyze data. This system was designed to increase the accuracy of the data collect process.

It is important to note that 1982 enrollment data in Table A, B, and C are revised figures from those in the 1983 *Directory*, due to institutional additions and deletions. Table D does not reflect these changes, and the figures reported are compared against the previous year's *Directory*.

An alphabetical listing of colleges, cross-referenced by state is available in the appendix. To locate a college that may have reorganized, or changed its name, please see "Changes in Institutions." The in-

clusion of a college one year and not the next does not necessarily mean it has ceased to exist. We ask state-level officials each fall to indicate to us which institutions should be listed in this *Directory*. The exclusion of a college from the 1984 *Directory* could be due to changes in accreditation status or type of program.

Enrollment during the 1983 opening fall term in community, technical, and junior colleges, reported a slight decrease over the 1982 academic year. Trends toward increased enrollment that were clearly visible in the 1960s now appear to have leveled off. Proportionately, the number of institutions has leveled off as well (see Table D). Total 1983 unduplicated headcount enrollment for credit stands at 4,947,975. When compared against 1982's fall term headcount enrollment for credit of 4,971,053, this represents a loss of 23,073 students, or a decline of .46 percent (see Table A).

State comparisons are important when examining the reasons for enrollment fluctuations. Student populations in four states (California, Illinois, Michigan, North Carolina) that rank in the top ten by enrollments declined in the fall of 1983 by a combined total of 141,927 students. This drop accounts for a national percentage change of almost 3 percent.

It was among the full-time students that community, technical, and junior colleges experienced the largest decline. A closer look at the data shows that the number of full-time students decreased by 19,080, or a decline of 1.03 percent,

while the part-time segment declined by only .13 percent. Public institutions followed closely with the changes in national data; total headcount figures can be found in Table B. Independent institutions, however, showed a gain; total headcount enrollment for credit stands at 148,207, an increase of 5.38 percent, or an additional 7,561 students (see Table C).

The *Directory* also lists enrollment in service, recreational, and life enrichment programs. This noncredit participation for academic year 1982-83 is reported in Table E as community education enrollment. Enrollment differences in this category from year to year do not necessarily represent a decline in participation. Since many colleges do not routinely collect these figures, this item is often not completed on the *Directory* questionnaire form.

The American Association of Community and Junior Colleges appreciates the response of the institutions and the opportunity of presenting this data to the public. Over the years, the AACJC *Directory* has become a valuable reference document for many users. That value is attributed to the excellent cooperation received from the institutions listed here and the state-level officials who assisted AACJC in identifying the colleges that should be served.

## Definitions of Terms

### ENROLLMENT

*Full-time*—Students carrying at least 12 credit hours or more.

*Part time*—Students enrolled in the college and carrying 11 credits or fewer.

*Total enrollment* is a headcount of full-time and part-time students enrolled for credit courses only.

*Community education* enrollment includes only those students participating in noncredit activities.

### FACULTY

*Full-time*—Includes all personnel who spend 50 percent or more of their time teaching (teaching load of 9 hours or more).

*Part-time*—includes all personnel who spend less than 50 percent of their time teaching (teaching load of 8 hours or fewer).

### PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT STAFF

*Staff*—Includes such professional employees as librarians, counselors, etc., if these staff are not designated by the college as either faculty or administration. (Does not include classified staff.)

### ADMINISTRATION

*Administrative staff*—Includes executive and managerial staff who spend 50 percent or more of their time in administrative work.

### TUITION AND REQUIRED FEES

*Student cost figures* are for a full-time student for the full academic year 83-84, and where applicable are for those students living within the state and within the institutional district.

# Appendix

## Constitution of the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges\*

### Preamble

We who serve in community and junior colleges are unified in the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges by a common desire to assist in extending educational opportunity to all citizens of this nation.

We believe education is essential for realizing the fullest potential of each member of our society and that appropriate higher education should be available to all who can benefit from it. Though diverse in purpose, in type, in control, in size, and in geographic location, members of the Association share a singleness of concern and dedication to this educational mission.

### Article I. Name

The name of this organization will be "American Association of Community and Junior Colleges."

### Article II. Purposes

The Association is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes and shall not engage in any activity which is not permitted by

an organization exempt from taxation under Section 501(a) and described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. No part of its net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any private individual except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services actually rendered. No substantial part of its activities shall be for carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and it shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Pursuant to these purposes, the Association shall promote the sound growth of community and junior colleges and shall help create in them an atmosphere conducive to learning. It shall contribute in every practical way to the development of a better human environment in America by working for the extension of full educational opportunity to all Americans on an equitable basis, qualitatively and quantitatively, and by striving for the elimination of all forms of discrimination whether by race, creed, sex, or financial condition.

### Article III. Membership

Section 1. The members of this organization shall be limited to community, junior, and technical colleges, and similar postsecondary institutions which are not private foundations by reasons of Section 509 (a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). The membership shall consist of two categories: full and provisional. All members shall be approved by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. *Full Institutional Members.* Institutional membership is open to community, junior, and technical colleges and similar postsecondary institutions which are accredited by a regional accrediting

association recognized by the Council on Postsecondary Accreditation. Institutional members are entitled to one vote.

Section 3. *Provisional Institutional Members:* Provisional institutional membership may be granted to newly organized community, junior, and technical colleges, and other similar postsecondary institutions which have not yet secured the necessary accreditation for institutional membership. Representatives of provisional institutional members are entitled to all privileges of the full institutional member of the Association except that they are ineligible to hold elective office. Provisional institutional members may hold this classification for five years, and during this time the Association will use appropriate resources to assist the institution to obtain the necessary accreditation.

### Article IV. Associates

Section 1. *Individual Associates:* Any person interested in the work of the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges and acceptable to the Board of Directors may become an individual associate. Individual associates may not vote or hold elective office except as otherwise provided in this constitution.

Section 2. *Institutional Associates.* Any foundation, corporation, or other organization which wishes to support the objectives of the Association may become an institutional associate upon approval of the Board of Directors. Representatives of institutional associates may not vote or hold elective office except as otherwise provided in this constitution.

Section 3. *Honorary Associates:* Individuals who have performed outstanding service in community and junior college work, upon nomination by the Board of Directors, may be elected honorary associates of the Association. Honorary associates may not vote or hold elective



office except as otherwise provided in this constitution.

#### Article V. Dues

Dues of members shall be fixed by the Board of Directors with the approval of the institutional membership at the annual business meeting or by mail ballot. Dues of associates shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

#### Article VI. Board of Directors

Section 1. The governing body of the Association shall be the Board of Directors.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall have authority to make policies for the Association which are not inconsistent with the constitution and bylaws. The Board of Directors shall have authority to establish bylaws and to establish an executive committee.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall consist of thirty-one directors.

Eighteen of the directors shall be representatives of the institutional members, of which at least fifteen shall be chief executive officers; three of the directors shall be elected at large by the Board of Directors from individuals affiliated with institutional members; three directors shall be elected at large by the Board of Directors from the general public; six directors shall be elected by the institutional membership from the recognized councils; and one director, elected by the Board of Directors, shall be the immediate past chairman of the Board of Directors.

Section 4. A majority of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business provided that a majority of those present are institutional representatives.

#### Article VII. Officers

Section 1. The officers of the Association shall be a chairman and a vice chairman of the Board of Directors, the president of the Association, and such other officers as from time to time may be elected by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. The president shall be appointed by the Board of Directors for such term and at such salary as the Board may determine.

#### Article VIII. Duties of Officers

Section 1. The chairman and vice chairman shall perform the duties pertaining to their offices as may be defined by the Board of Directors. The chairman shall preside at meetings of the Board.

Section 2. The president shall be the chief executive officer of the Association.

#### Article IX. Elections

Section 1. The chairman and vice chairman shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Six directors representing the institutional members shall be elected each year by the institutional membership to serve for terms of three years each.

One director at-large representing the total institutional membership shall be elected by the Board each year to serve for a term of three years.

One director at-large representing the public shall be elected by the Board each year to serve for a term of three years.

Two directors representing the recognized councils shall be elected each year by the institutional membership to serve for terms of three years each.

One director, the immediate past chairman of the Board of Directors, shall be elected by the Board each year to serve

for a term of one year.

Section 3. Directors representing institutional members shall be elected by a vote of the official institutional representatives of members responding by mail ballot.

Section 4. Directors shall take office on July 1 of the year of their election and shall serve until their successors are designated in accordance with provisions of the constitution.

Section 5. In the event of a vacancy in the office of the chairman, the vice chairman shall become chairman and serve the unexpired term. If there is a vacancy in both the office of chairman and vice chairman, the Board of Directors shall elect one of the members of the Board to serve as chairman for the unexpired term.

In the event of a vacancy among the directors from the institutional member representatives or from the recognized councils, the Board shall appoint a new director to serve until the committee on directors reports to the membership and annual elections are conducted.

In the event of a vacancy among the directors at-large, the Board shall elect a new director to serve for the unexpired term.

#### Article X. Meetings of the Association

Section 1. There shall be an annual meeting of the Association at such time and place as the Board of Directors may determine. Special meetings may be called by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Designated representatives of institutional members present at any meeting of which written notice has been duly given shall constitute a quorum for transaction of business.

Section 3. Each member institution shall be entitled to one vote by its designated representative.

## Article XI. Finance

At each annual meeting, the Board of Directors shall present a statement of financial condition of the Association and shall report on financial operations of the preceding year and financial plans for the succeeding year. No financial obligations shall be incurred by any officer or committee except as authorized within annual budgets, or under authority of special interim action, approved by the Board of Directors or its executive committee in interim action. The fiscal year of the Association shall be fixed by the bylaws.

## Article XII. Amendments

Section 1. This constitution may be amended at an annual meeting of the Association by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the designated representatives of institutional and provisional institutional members present and voting. Amendments shall not alter the purposes of this trust to operate exclusively for charitable and educational purposes and in a manner which makes this trust tax exempt and the donations to it deductible from taxable income to the extent allowed by the Internal Revenue Code. Written notice of any proposed amendment in the constitution shall be sent to all members of the Association at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the annual meeting.

Section 2. A referendum to the constitution may be authorized by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the designated representatives of institutional and provisional institutional members present and voting at an annual meeting. An affirmative vote of two-thirds of the institutional and provisional institutional members shall be necessary to amend the constitution through a referendum, provided that at least two-thirds of the institutional and provisional institutional members respond to such a referendum. The Board of Directors shall be responsible for conducting a referendum.

Section 3. The bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of all members of the Board of Directors. Mail ballots may be used.

## Article XIII. Provision for Dissolution and Reference to Sections

Upon dissolution of this corporation, if such ever should occur, the Directors shall distribute all assets of the Association remaining after payment of debts and liabilities to such institution or institutions or association or associations as the majority of the Board of Directors shall elect, which are exempt from taxation under Section

501(a), are organized and operated exclusively for educational or charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and have purposes similar to the purposes of this Association. All references to sections of the Internal Revenue Code are to those sections as they are now enacted or hereafter amended.

## Article XIV. Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution and any special rules of order the Association may adopt.

# Bylaws\*

## I. Membership

1. Each campus or college of a multi-campus institution shall be invited to become an institutional member. When each campus or college holds such membership, the parent institution shall automatically become an institutional member at no additional cost. Each campus unit holding membership, as well as the parent institution, shall be entitled to all membership privileges, including the right of its representative to vote and hold elective office.

2. The chief executive officer of the member institution shall be recognized as its official designated representative unless the institution's chief executive officer has designated, in writing, another individual.

## II. Organizational Structure

### 1. Officers and Directors

Directors shall serve for no more than two complete terms. A complete term shall normally be three years; however, a term of two years or more shall be considered a complete term.

Officers of the Board of Directors shall be a chairman and a vice chairman, elected by members of the Board. Election of the officers shall take place at the

spring meeting of the Board, with term of office to be for one year, beginning July 1 of the year of their election. The elected chairman and the elected vice chairman shall be limited to serving one term in their respective offices.

### 2. Committees of the Board

The Board of Directors shall have an executive committee from its own membership, a committee on professional services, a committee on directors and membership services, a committee on federal relations, and a committee on Association vitality and publications. It may also establish ad hoc committees. These committees shall be appointed by the chairman of the Board with approval of the Board.

### 3. Meetings of the Board

The Board of Directors shall meet at least twice a year. Written notice of all Board meetings shall be sent to the directors at least thirty (30) days in advance.

### 4. Other Groups

The Board of Directors may authorize the creation or discontinuance of commissions, committees, task forces, or similar groups responsible for broad areas of Association activities under the guidance and direction of the Board. The Board of Directors shall establish tenure of members of such commissions and committees. The chairman of the Board shall appoint the members of committees, commissions, and other such groups.

### 5. Responsibilities of the President

The president of the Association shall have general administrative supervision of the affairs of the Association and shall be responsible for the execution of such plans and policies as the Board of Directors may authorize, direct, or approve. He shall assign staff members appropriate titles and duties. He shall be ex officio a member of all commissions and committees, excepting the nominating committee. He shall report annually to the Association and shall make such other reports as the Board of Directors may request. He shall prepare and recommend an annual budget to the Board of Directors. He shall be responsible for the collection of dues and for the custody of funds of the Association and shall make payments therefrom in accordance with the authorizations and directions of the Board of Directors. He shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors or for such term as the Board of Directors may determine.

A secretary and a treasurer may be designated by the president with approval of the Board of Directors.

## 6. Delegation of Authority

The Board of Directors, the governing body of the Association, may at its discretion delegate portions of its authority (except approval of the budget) to the specific officers of the Association, to committees of the Board, or to councils, commissions, and committees of the Association.

## 7. Councils

The Board may from time to time enter into an agreement with councils which are organized and operate for purposes which contribute to and significantly benefit the purposes of the Association. Such an agreement, for a specified period of time, will constitute a formal affiliation with the Association. Such councils shall be organized and operated in a manner consistent with rules and regulations approved by the Board. For a council to become officially affiliated with the Association, it must submit a written request to the Board of Directors setting forth its purposes, membership criteria, form of governance, and financial structure. Approval of the Board and written notification to the council constitute official recognition and affiliation with the Association. The Board may withdraw formal affiliation of a council by a written ninety (90) day notice.

Any notice of withdrawal must set forth the reason. A group so affected may be granted a hearing by the Board if an appeal is filed within thirty (30) days after such notice is mailed by the Board.

## III. Nominations

1. Nominations for the eighteen institutional representatives shall be by the Board of Directors' committee on directors. Additional nominations may be made from the membership of institutional representatives.

2. Nominations for the eighteen institutional representatives, including source and biographical statements about nominees, shall constitute a mail ballot to be sent to the official institutional representatives by April 15 of each year.

3. The Board of Directors shall elect its at-large members from nominations made by the Board's committee on directors, with results announced to the membership at the earliest practical date following election.

4. Each recognized council not represented on the Board of Directors, including those councils whose terms are to end in the current Board year, will be invited to submit a nomination to the Board's committee on directors. This

nomination from each council shall be whatever procedure is endorsed by a decision of the members of each council concerned. If a council nominee is officially connected with an institution eligible for membership in the Association, that institution must be an institutional member. The nominations for the recognized councils, together with source and biographical statements about the nominees, shall be a part of the mail ballot to be sent to the official institutional representatives by April 15 of each year.

5. In cases of vacancies, replacements are to be made for the remainder of the membership year by appointment of the Board of Directors.

## IV. Succession of Officers and Directors

1. Members of the Board shall be considered to be ineligible to serve in the category in which they were elected if by reason of change of position they no longer represent that category. The term of office of such a member shall be terminated effective the date of change.

## V. Membership Lists

1. Names of all members shall be published annually.

2. Any members whose dues are unpaid for the preceding year shall be dropped from the membership list.

3. Institutions dropped for non-payment of dues may be reinstated by making a new application for membership in which case the Board may require the payment of delinquent dues.

## VI. Fiscal Policy

1. The fiscal year of the Association shall begin January 1 and close on December 31. The Board of Directors shall have authority to change the fiscal year.

2. The Board of Directors shall adopt an annual budget for each fiscal year.

3. The Association, on approval by the Board of Directors, may accept grants from foundations and other appropriate donors and enter into contract with the federal government and other appropriate agencies to pursue investigations and perform services consistent with Association objectives.

4. There shall be an annual audit of the general financial condition and operations of the Association by a certified public accountant.

5. The president and all employees of the Association office who handle any part of the funds of the Association shall be bonded, the amount of the bonds to be determined by the Board of Directors and paid for by the Association.

## VII. Annual Meeting

1. The annual meeting of the Association shall be held at a time and place determined by the Board. Written notice of all meetings shall be sent to all members at least two weeks in advance.
