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ABSTRACT

Designed to provide resources for initiating new courses at colleges and universities, this bibliography contains nonpublished materials developed by projects to integrate the new scholarship on women into the postsecondary curriculum. The alphabetical listing of 29 projects, many associated with postsecondary institutions, includes project address, contact person, author and title of available materials, and ordering information. Materials focus on topics such as the family, United States and world history, male-female relations, social history, judicial and legislative history, women's studies, literature, humanities, curriculum development, and materials selection. A 2-page bibliography concludes the resource. (LP)

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INTRODUCTION
