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ABSTRACT

This statistical report profiles 32 large cities' school districts. The data, covering the years 1970-82, are presented under five areas: (1) great city demographics and school enrollment, (2) school staff and organization, (3) great city school finance trends, (4) federal programs, and (5) education programs. The report includes 22 tables and 18 charts that illustrate school trends nationally and in each district, and the data should be treated as the best available draft information until the second edition becomes available. 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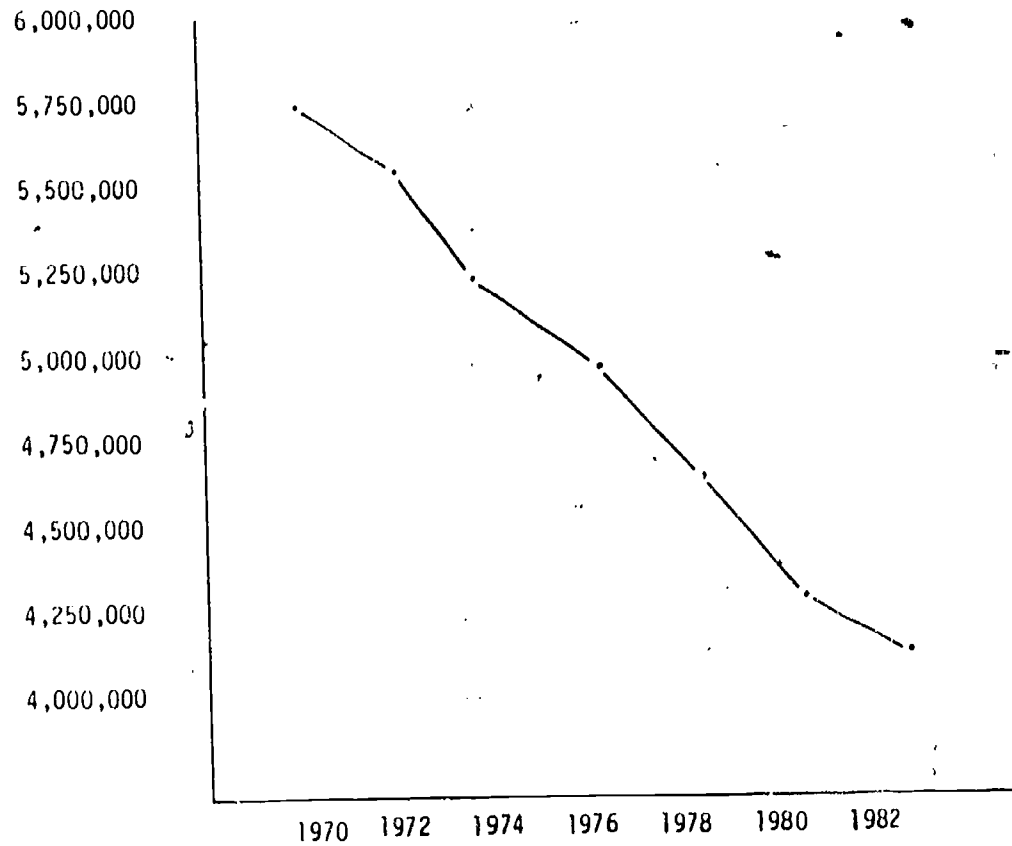
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I. GREAT CITY DEMOGRAPHICS AND SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

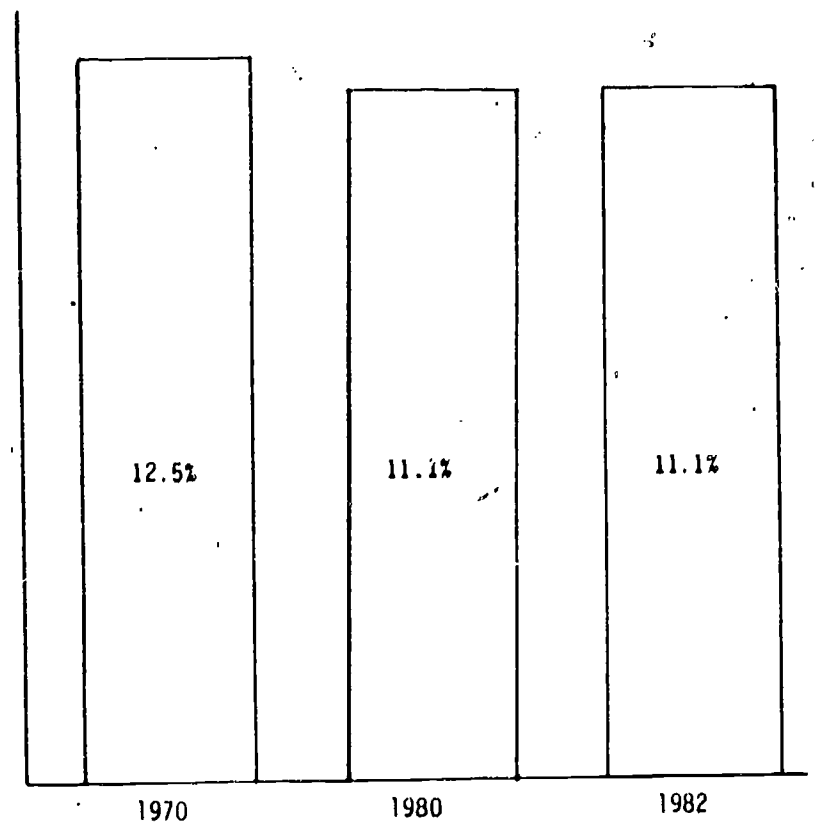
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Chart 1. Enrollment in Great City Schools, 1970-82
(Fall of Year)



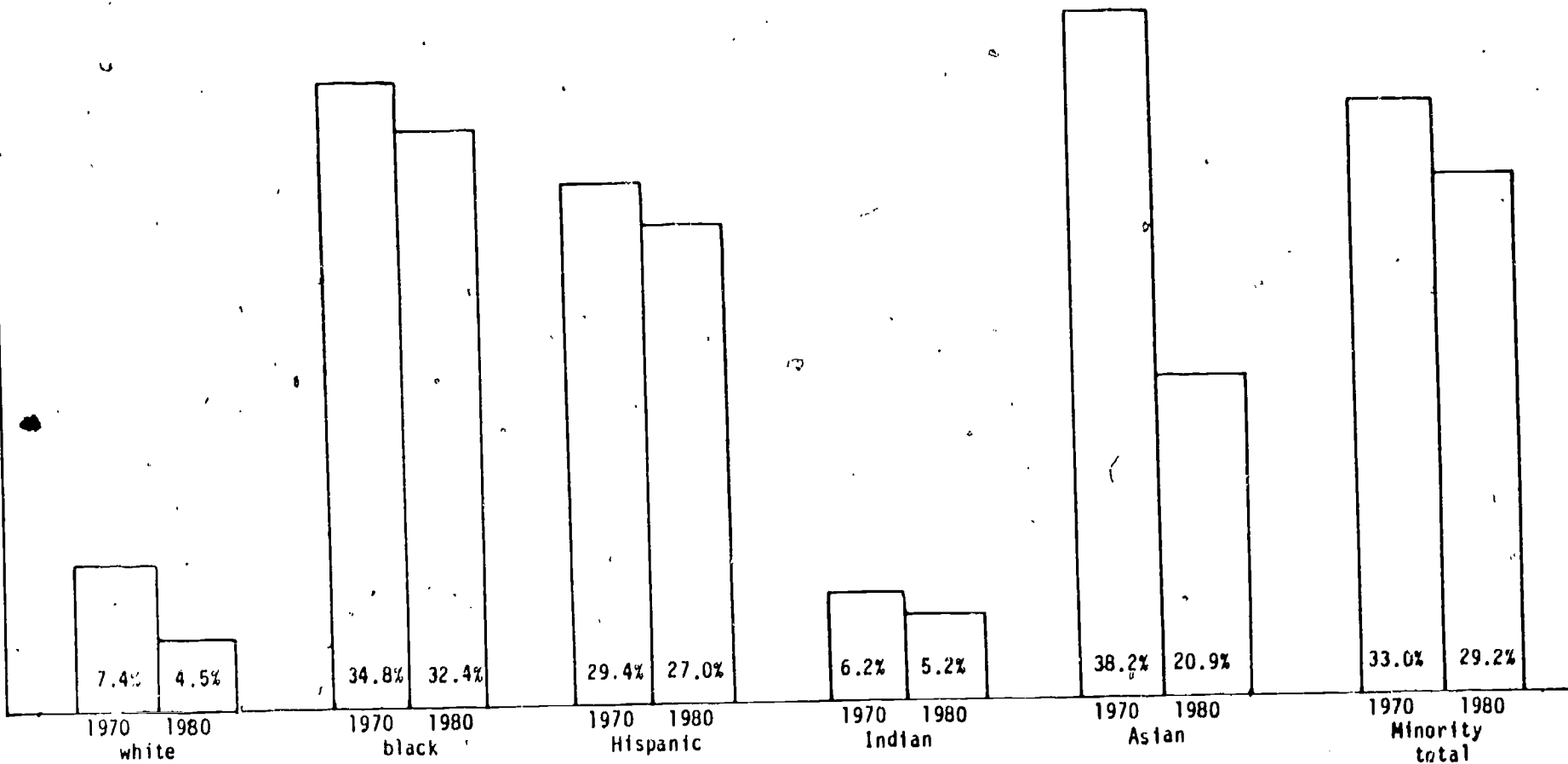
Enrollment in the Great City Schools dropped by 26.4% between the Fall of 1970 and 1982. During the same period the national enrollment in public schools declined by 17.2%.

Chart 2. Enrollment in Great City Schools as a Percent of the National Public School Total Enrollment



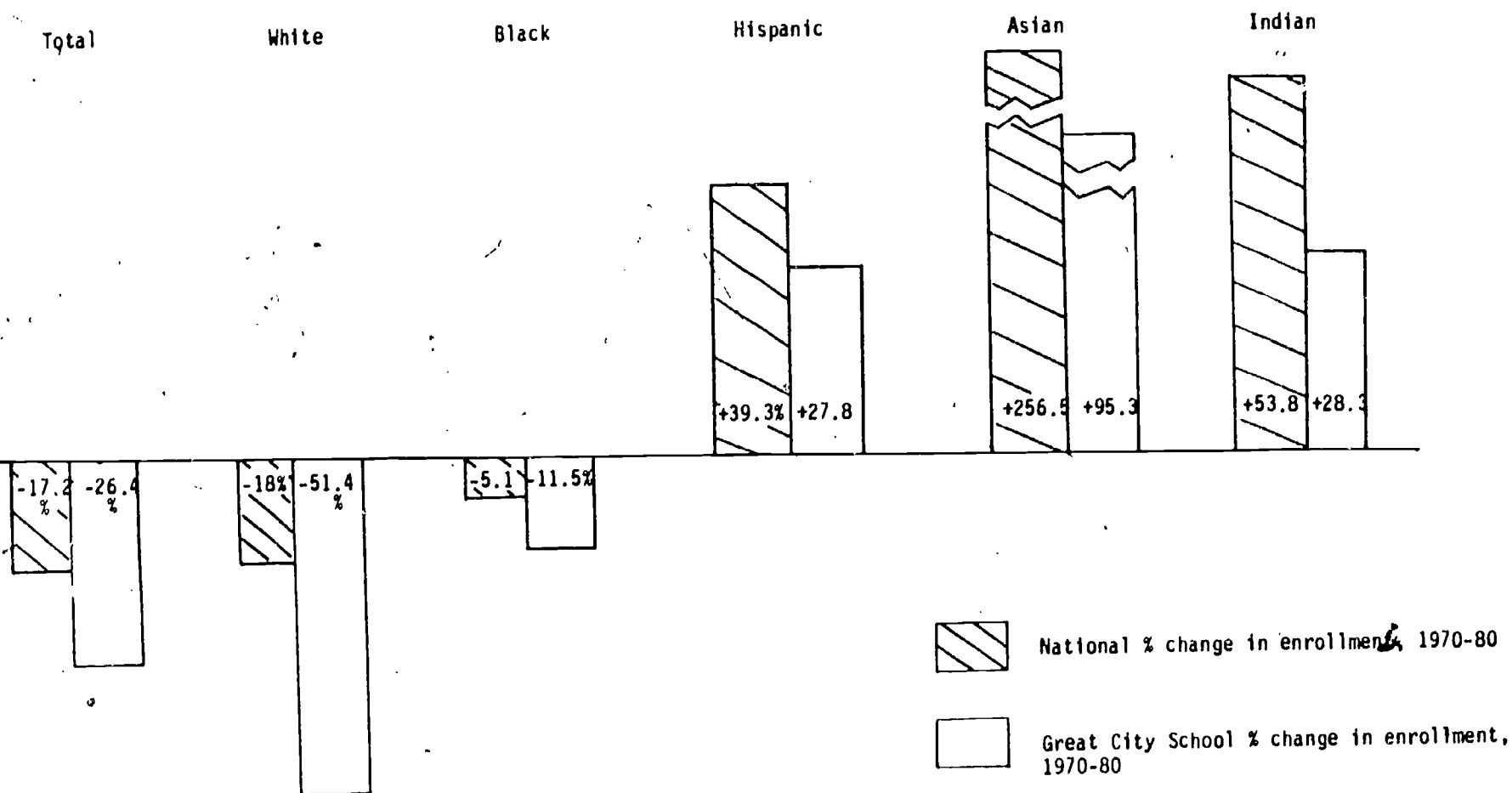
The Great City School's share of the total national public school enrollment declined from 12.5% in the Fall of 1970 to 11.1% in 1982.

Chart 3. Great City School Share of the Nation's Public School Enrollment by Race and Year (Fall data)



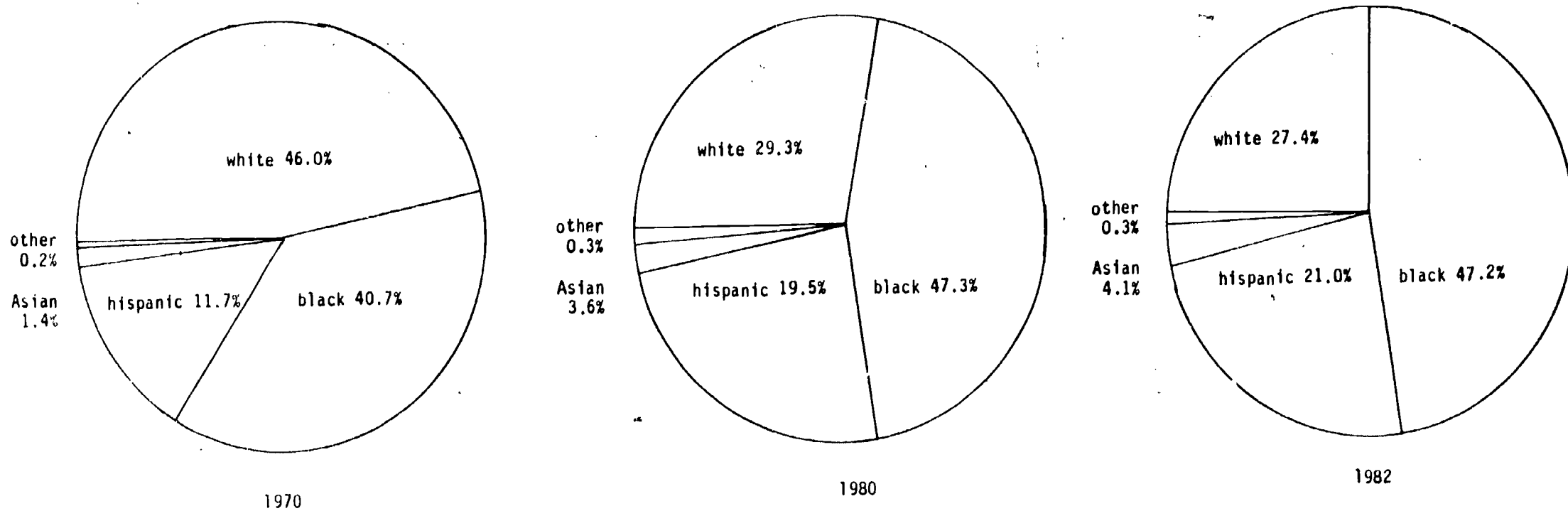
The Great City School systems enroll 29.2% of all the racial minority children in the nation who attend public school. Despite the over representation of minority children in the Great City Schools, the Council's share of the nation's minority children has dropped appreciably in all categories. The Great City School share of white children and Asian children has dropped the most significantly of all racial groups.

Chart 4. Percent Change in Enrollment in Great City Schools by Race, 1970-1980 (Fall data)



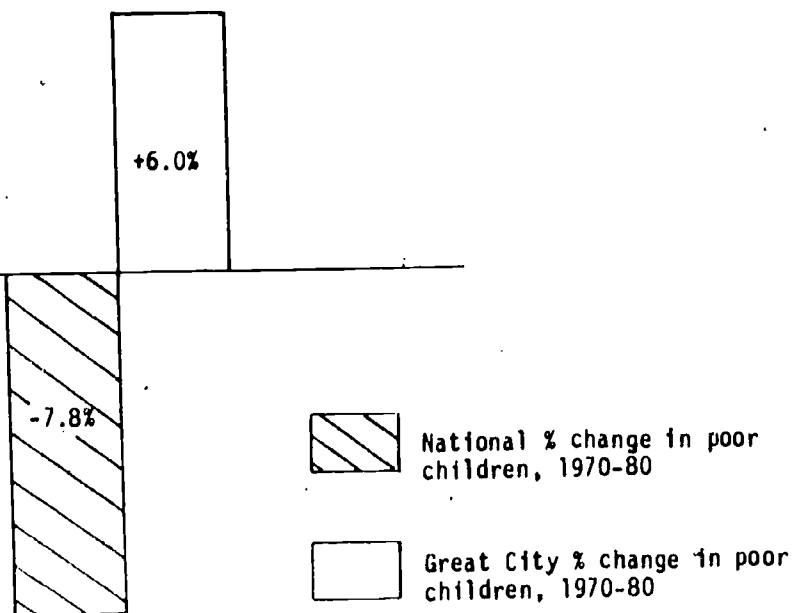
The greatest decrease in enrollment occurred with White students who declined in number by 51.4% between 1970 and 1980. The overall enrollment decreased by 26% in the same period. The largest increase in enrollment was experienced with Asian children, 95%.

Chart 5. Racial Composition of the Great City School Enrollments; 1970, 1980, 1982 (Fall data)



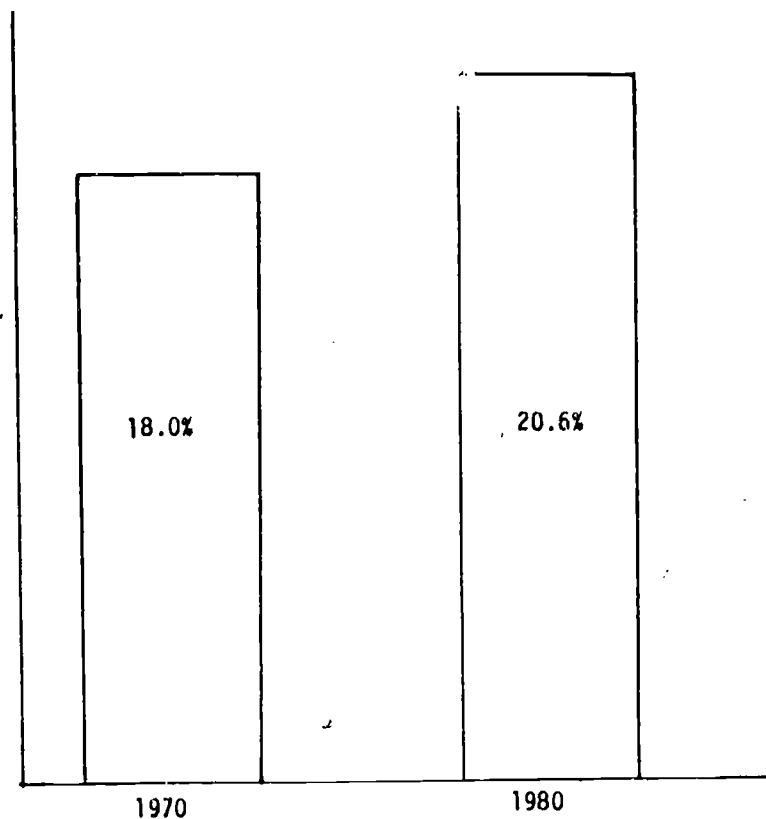
The composition of the Great City Schools has changed significantly since 1970. The proportion of the enrollment that is white has dropped from 46.0% in 1970 to 27.4% in 1982. The share of the city school enrollment that is black appears to have stabilized over the last two years at about 47%. The most dramatic shifts have occurred among Hispanic and Asian children. The Hispanic share of the urban school enrollment has doubled in twelve years and now amounts to one-fifth of all children enrolled in the Great City Schools. The Asian share of the enrollment has nearly tripled.

Chart 6. Percent Change in Numbers of Poor Children in Great Cities Compared to the Nation, 1970-1980



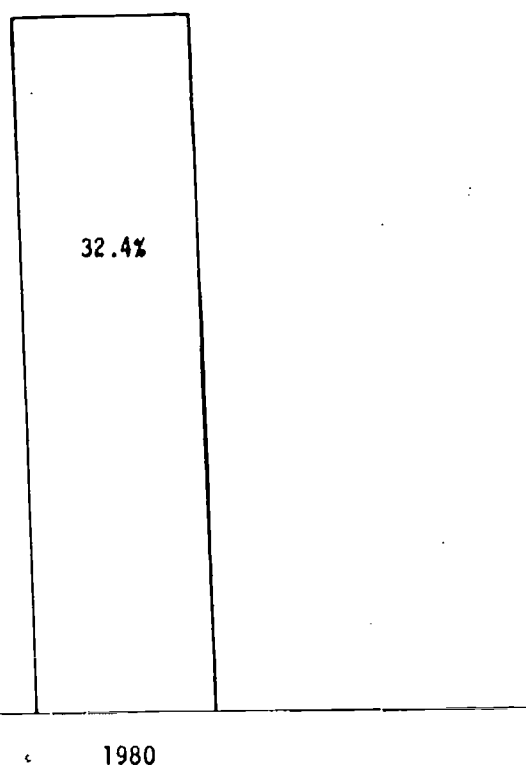
The number of poor children in the nation decreased by 7.8% between 1970 and 1980, but increased by 6.0% in the Great Cities over the same period.

Chart 7. Number of Poor Children in Great Cities as a Percent of the National Total, 1970-1980



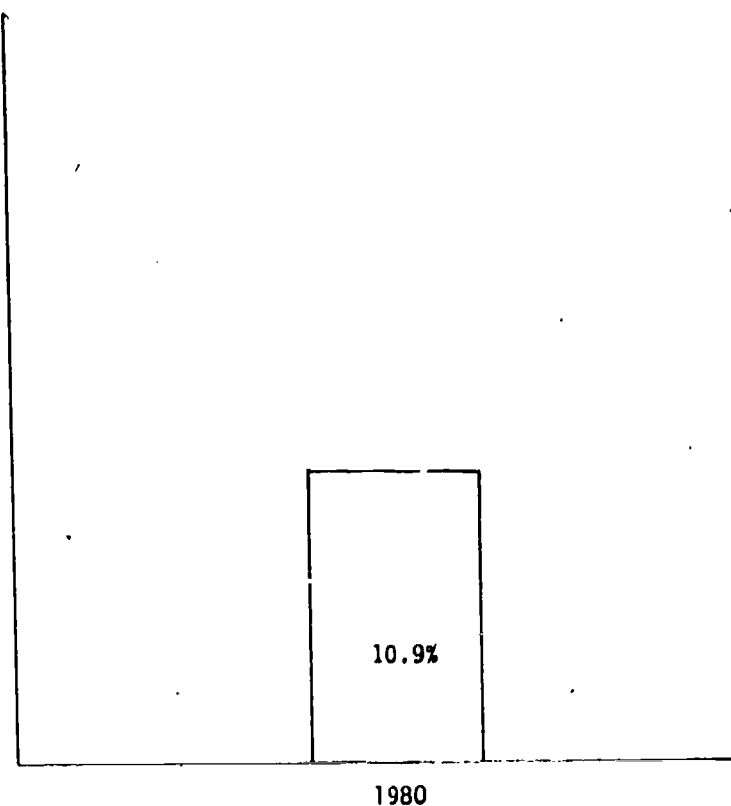
The Great Cities had 18% of the nation's poor children in 1970, and 20.6% in 1980.

Chart 8. Number of Limited English Proficient Students in Great City Schools as a Percent of the National Total



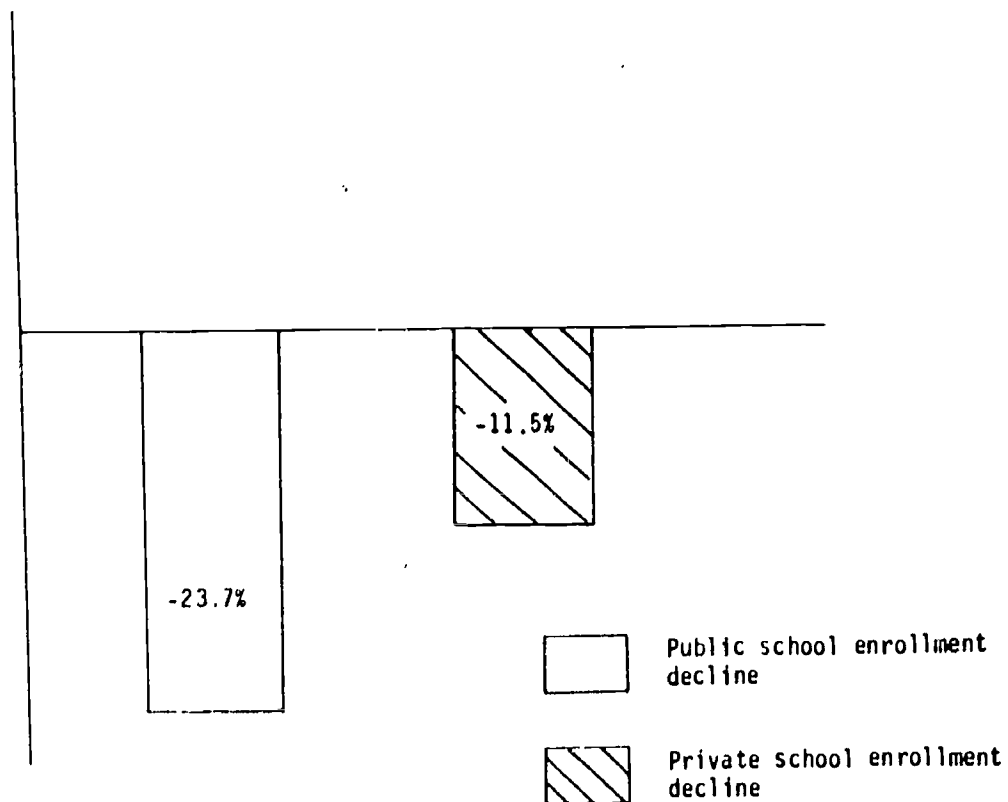
The Great City Schools serve approximately 32.4% of the nation's public school limited English proficient students.

Chart 9. Number of Special Education Students in Great City Schools as a Percent of the National Total



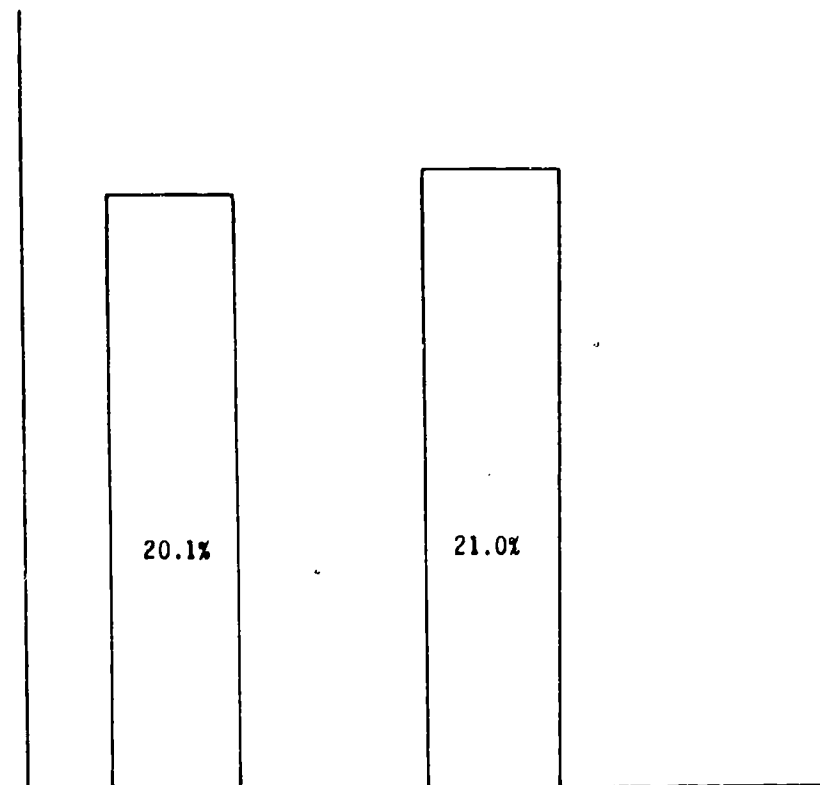
The Great City Schools serve about 11% of the nation's public school special education students.

Between 1970 and 1980, enrollment in public schools in the Great Cities declined by 23.7%. The enrollment in private schools in the same cities dropped by only 11.5% over that ten year period.

In 1970, 20.1% of the children in the Great Cities were attending private schools; in 1980, 21.0% were attending private schools. In addition, the proportion of all private school students in the country who reside in the Great Cities has declined slightly from 24.9% in 1970 to 23.5% in 1980.

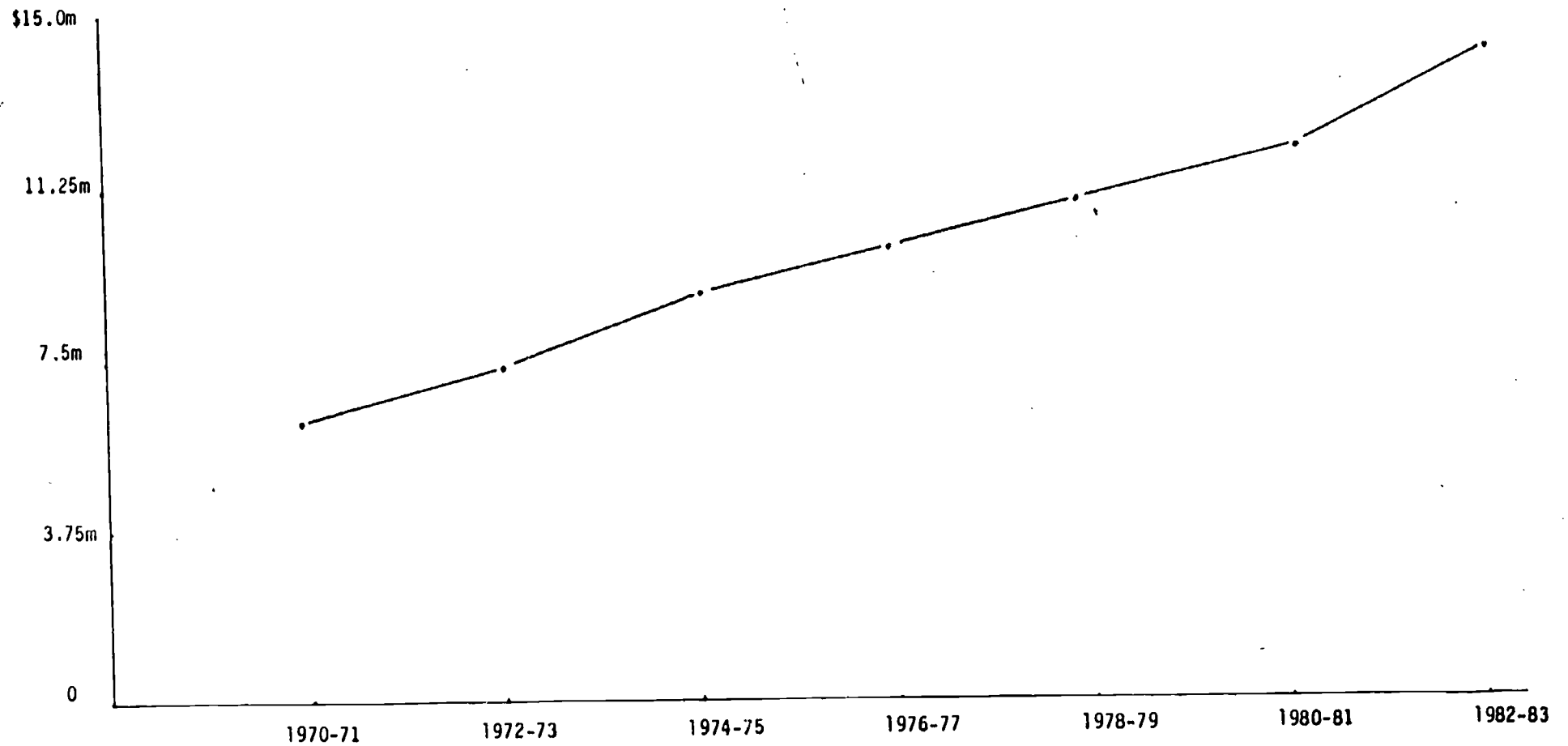

III. SCHOOL FINANCE TRENDS

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Chart 12. Total Revenues of Great City Schools, 1970-1982 (Unadjusted for inflation)



The total revenues of the Great City Schools have increased from \$6.544m in 1970 to \$14.366m in 1982, a rise of about 120%. During the same period, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased from 116.3 in 1970 to 288.6 in 1982, a rise of 148.2%.

Chart 13. Local, State, and Federal Share of Great City School Revenues by Year

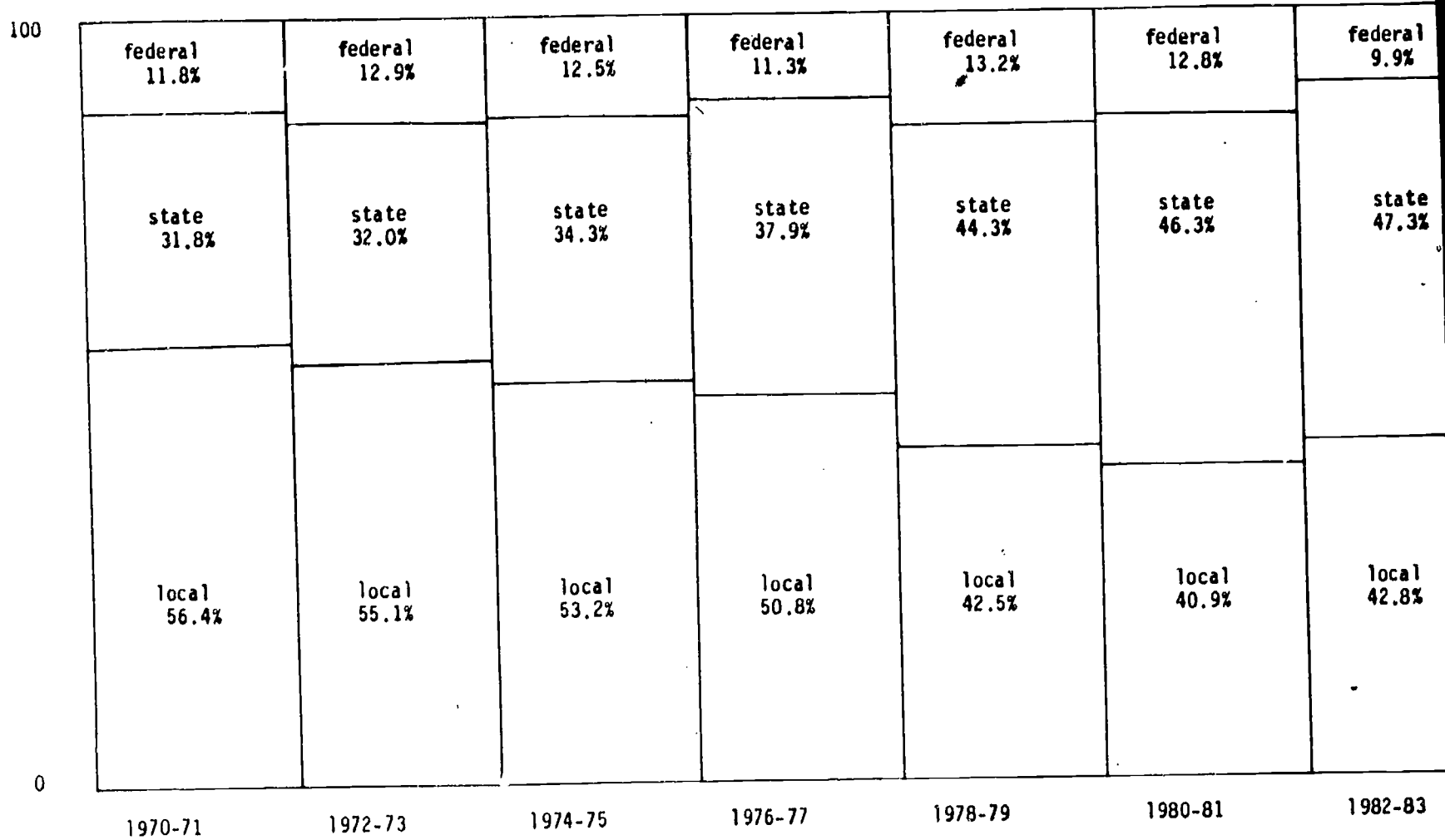
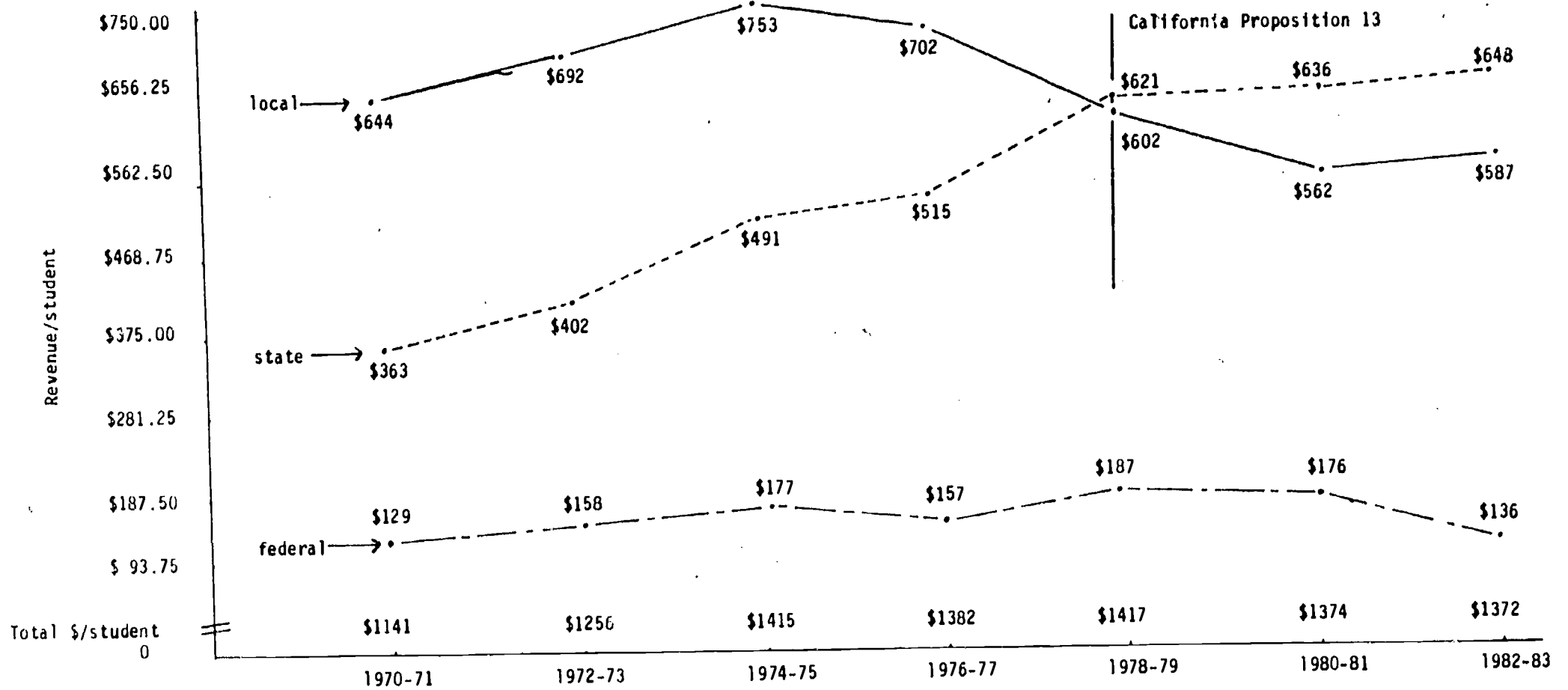
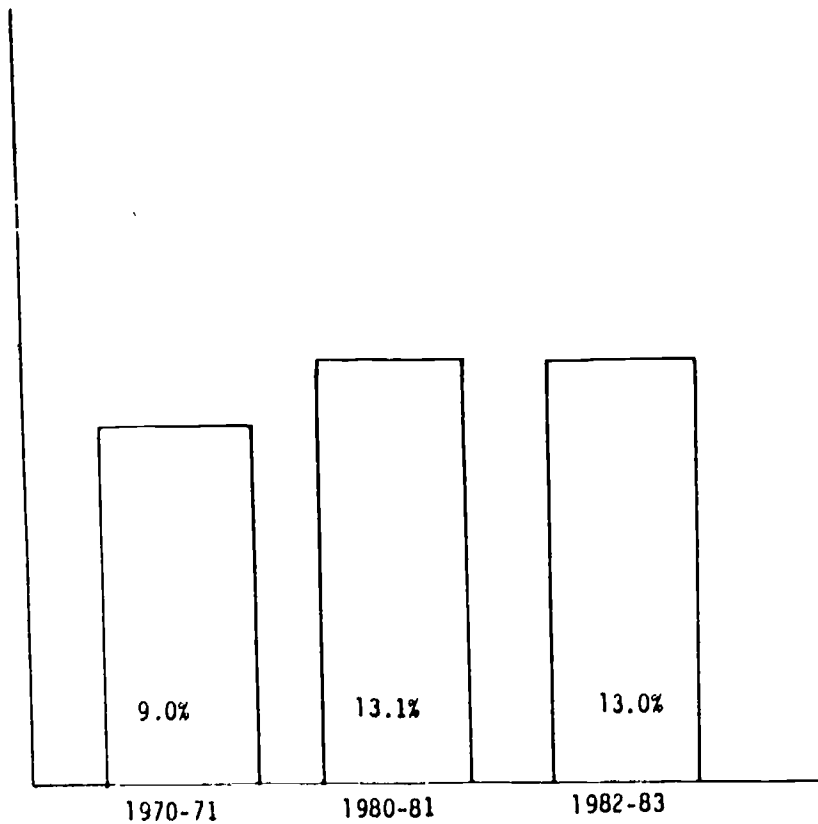


Chart 14. Local, State, and Federal Revenues Per Student (Adjusted for Inflation Since 1970)



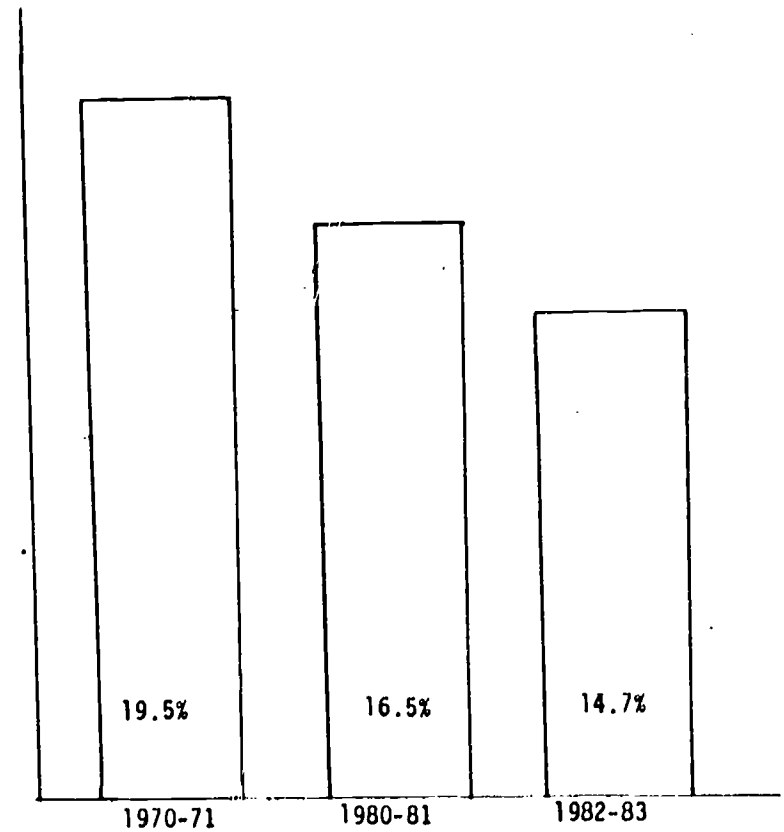
Since 1970, the Great City Schools revenue per student (in real dollars) has increased from \$1141 to \$1372, or 20.3%. Revenues per student from local sources, however, declined from \$644 to \$587, a decrease of 8.9%. State source revenues per student increased from \$363 to \$648, a jump of 78.5%; and federal source revenues remained nearly level with a 5.4% increase since 1970.

The Great City Schools garnered 9.0% of all state revenues in 1970 and 13.0% in 1982. There was no increase in the Great City share of state revenues over the first two years of the Reagan Administration.

The Great City Schools garnered 19.5% of all federal revenues in 1970 (including school lunch), but only 14.7% in 1982. The Great City share of the national total reached a peak of 20.9% in 1972 but declined steadily after the 1974 ESEA Amendments, then dipped dramatically again during the first two years of the Reagan Administration.

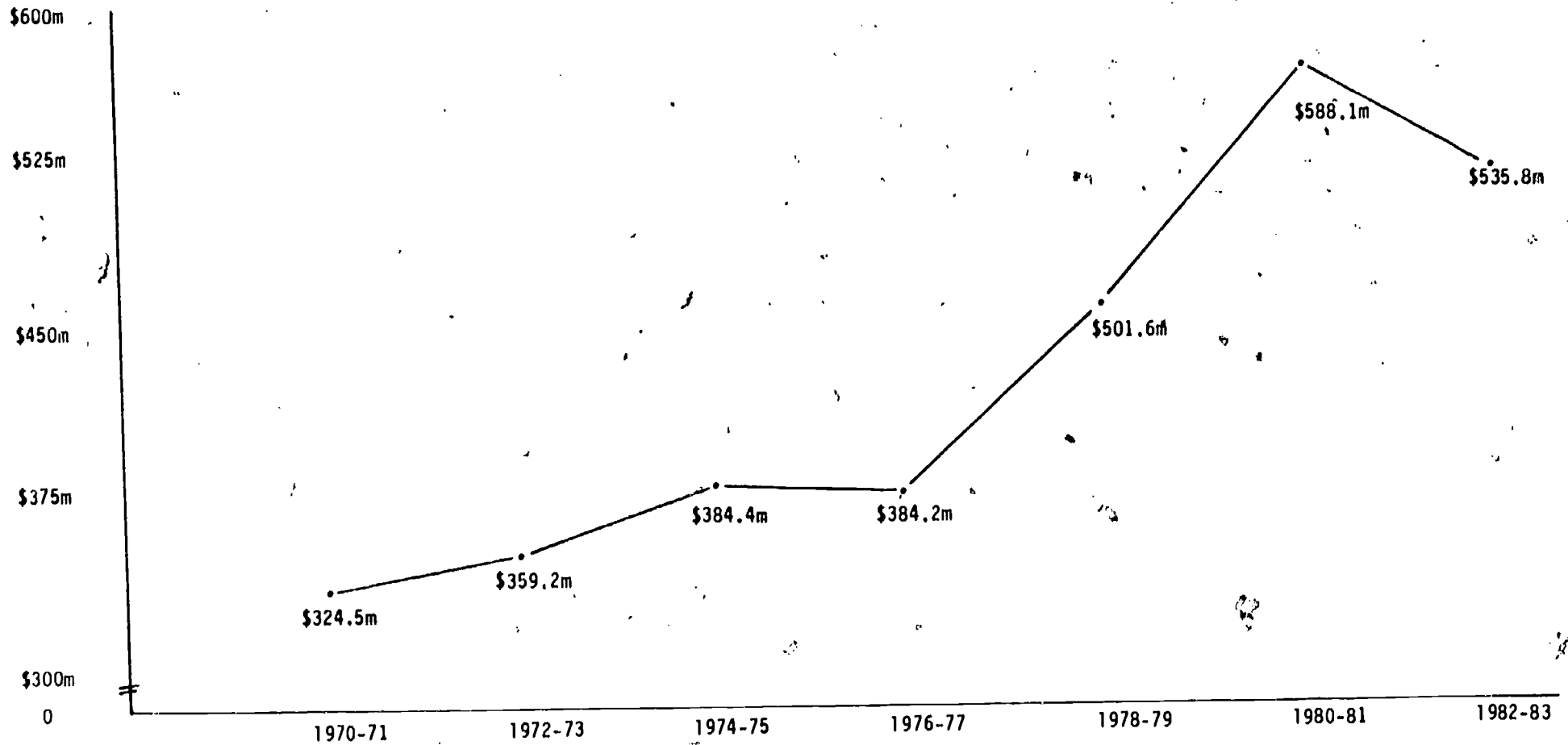

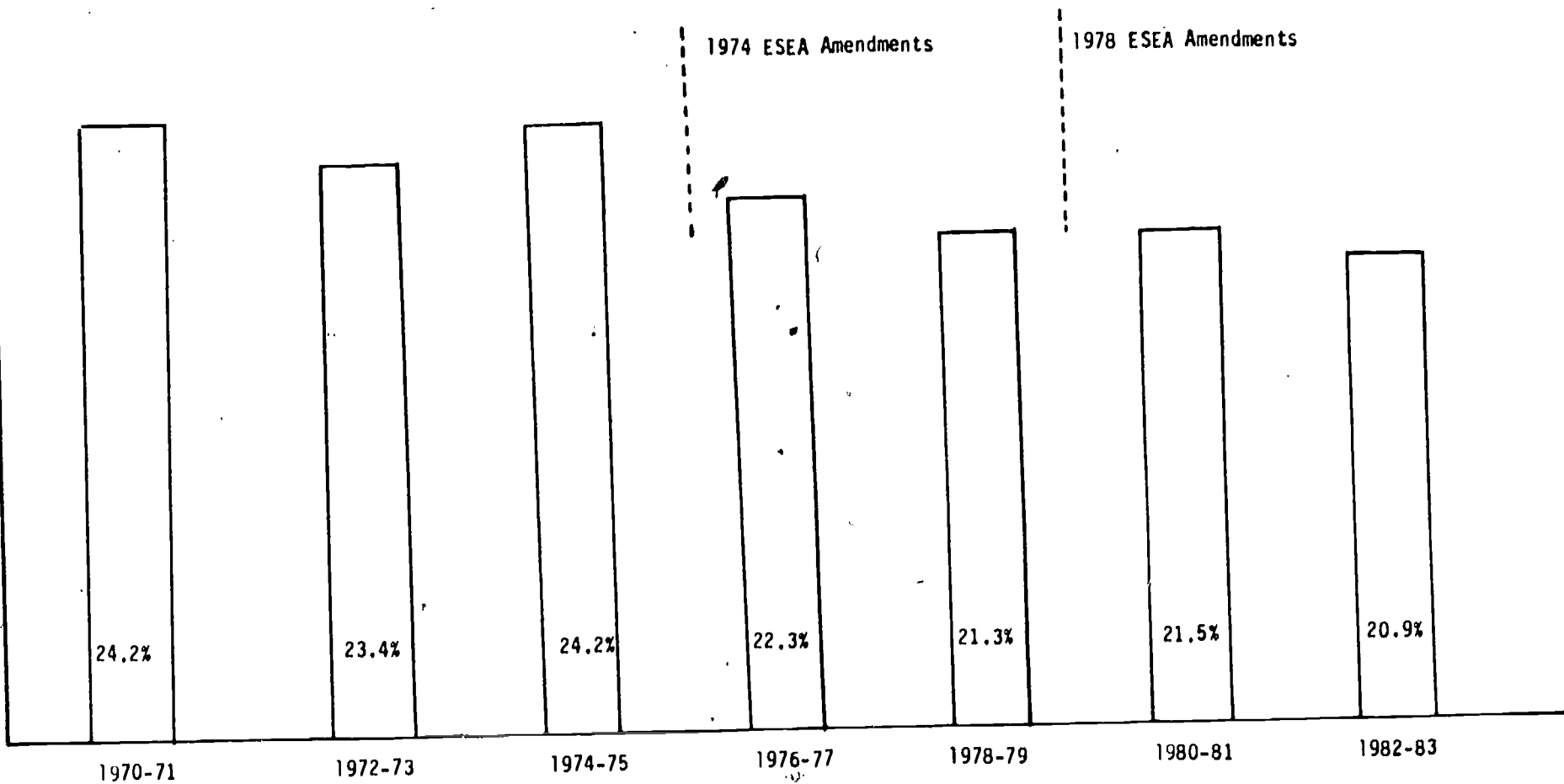

The Title I/Chapter 1 allocations to the Great City Schools has increase by about 65% between 1970 and 1982. The largest increases came in 1978 and 1980 when the federal appropriation jumped significantly and Concentration grants went into effect. The largest decreases came after the 1974 Education Amendments and the budget cutbacks under the Reagan Administration. The total federal appropriation grew by 91.3% over the same period.

Since 1970, the Council's share of the total federal appropriation for title I/Chapter 1 has decreased from about 24% in 1970 to about 21% in 1982. The two most significant shifts in resources occurred after the 1974 amendments and after the 1978 ESEA amendments. In 1974, the definition of the poverty factor in the Title I formula was changed in such a way that it worked against many big city districts. The share of funding to the cities was increased in the 1978 Amendments after the formula was changed to count more AFDC children and Concentration grants were initiated.
