ABSTRACT

Based on statistical data submitted by almost 3,000 academic libraries as part of the 1978-1979 Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS), this report develops a composite profile of an academic research library. Use of cluster analysis of library characteristics to find institutions that were quantitatively similar to one another identified four clusters of libraries. For one of these clusters, a basic group of 127 libraries that share library characteristics, factor analysis was used to derive component score coefficients for 12 statistical variables: volumes held, volumes added, total microforms, expenditures for library materials, expenditures for binding, total salaries and wages, other operating expenditures, full time equivalent (FTE) professional staff, FTE nonprofessional staff, interlibrary loans borrowed, circulation, and total reference, directional, and group transactions. These coefficients were weighted for the 12 variables, multiplied by the data for that variable for the individual library, and summed up to provide a component score for that library. Component scores were computed for each of the 2,943 libraries for which data were available. In the appendix, component scores are given for each of the libraries, making it possible to measure each institution against the statistical research library model derived by this study.

I. WHAT IS AN ACADEMIC RESEARCH LIBRARY?

Classification problems, an eminent statistician says, arise in all fields of science and beyond.¹ Among academic libraries, a knowledgeable observer can fairly easily classify this or that library as a two-year or four-year college or university library. But it is not so simple to decide what a research library is. The category of research libraries overlaps other categories. A university library may be a research library; so may a special library or a public library or even a college library. In Kruskal's phrase, the category is marked by an ineluctable fuzziness.

A research library is "A reference library provided with specialized material, where exhaustive investigation can be carried on in a particular field (as in a technological library) or in several fields (as in a university library)."² But what does "exhaustive investigation" mean? To take two examples from non-academic libraries: The Albemarle County Historical Society in Virginia has several hundred volumes and can support exhaustive investigation on some aspects of Albemarle County history. But no doubt this is not what we mean when we speak of research libraries. On the other hand, a large urban public library may have thousands of volumes, but they may comprise mostly duplicates of popular fiction and non-fiction scattered among branches; and exhaustive investigation will not be possible there.

A fuller definition of research libraries (at least of academic research libraries) is offered in Title II, Part C, of the Higher Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1021, 1041-1042) and in the Regulations on II-C (47 FR 35454-35461). According to II-C, a research library is one that makes a significant contribution to education and research, is broadly based and has national or international significance for research, is in demand by researchers, and so on. Or in brief, a research library is a library that supports research. Since "research" is ambiguous, the category of research libraries, as a result, does not have well-defined boundaries. It is not evident in what the "research-ness" of research libraries consists.

Nevertheless, the term research libraries is not devoid of meaning. Librarians and scholars know that Harvard and Yale and Berkeley and Stanford are research libraries and are doing something that other types of academic libraries are not doing or are doing in lesser ways. If we can describe clearly what it is that characterizes Harvard and Yale and Berkeley and Stanford and similar research libraries then we will be closer to criteria for academic research libraries.

In this report, therefore, we begin with the universe of approximately 3,000 U. S. academic libraries, as measured in the HEGIS library data file. Within this universe we find a cluster of libraries assumed to support research. We measure the quantitative characteristics of these libraries. We search out the ways in which they resemble one another and the ways in which they differ from other libraries. We ask which other libraries share the essential characteristics of this cluster. When we find other libraries quantitatively similar to those in the cluster, then we say that these are not significantly distinguishable from the cluster; and so they fall into the class of research libraries. Thus, we define criteria for research libraries and determine which institutions meet those criteria.

We begin by discussing the HEGIS data and the methodology for identifying an initial group of research libraries.

II. LIBRARY DATA AND THE METHODOLOGY FOR IDENTIFYING ACADEMIC RESEARCH LIBRARIES

We are seeking to describe the quantitative characteristics of academic research libraries in the United States. For this purpose we begin with the most comprehensive data file on U. S. academic libraries, the HEGIS survey. At the time this project was begun, the latest HEGIS library data available on computer tape were those from the Fall, 1979, survey (containing some data for FY 78-79).

The universe for this survey was 3,190 college and university libraries, of which 2,945 institutions responded. Two of the respondents lacked data on volumes held, staff, and expenditures. These two were deleted from our working file, on the grounds that their data were too sparse to be useful for this inquiry. Our final file of libraries therefore comprised 2,943 institutions.

To the library data we also added data from other HEGIS surveys: Fall Enrollments 1978 and 1979; Earned Degrees Conferred 1978-79 and 1979-80; Faculty Salaries 1978-79 and 1979-80; and Financial Statistics of Institutions of Higher Education, 1979. From all of these data we selected for analysis 48 basic variables on library collections, expenditures, staffing, and services; FTE and headcount enrollments of undergraduate and of graduate and professional students; associate's, bachelor's, master's, and doctor's degrees; headcount faculty; and educational and general expenditures by colleges and universities.

It should be noted that the HEGIS surveys exhibit some of the disabilities that afflict self-reported data. Missing values are a particular problem in statistical analysis. Confusion between missing values and zeros, either in reporting or in coding, can create ambiguities. For example, in the library survey over a third of the institutions report no data for microforms of books. Does this mean that they have no microforms of books, or merely that they are not reporting how many they have? When we find that even university libraries are coded as having no microforms of books, we can reasonably suspect the data.³

Another example: 72 libraries are coded as having answered no directional questions; but these same libraries did answer reference questions. If there were reference questions, then it is likely that there were also directional questions, especially since some of the libraries in this category are university libraries. So in at least some of these cases a zero for directional questions in fact indicates a missing value. For some variables, such as microforms, the patterns of ambiguous reporting or coding are extensive enough that the data should be taken with a grain or two of salt. Fortunately, for crucial variables only a few libraries exhibit missing or zero values. For example, only 16 lack values for volumes held; 37, values for volumes added, gross; 28, values for current periodical subscriptions. Where zero is coded for variables like volumes held or total staff, we have recoded the values as missing, on the grounds that it is unlikely that an academic library has no volumes or no staff.

We turn then to the problem of identifying an initial group of research libraries from our file of 2,943 libraries.

Although a knowledgeable librarian might not be able to say precisely what a research library is, he or she undoubtedly would be able to name some research libraries. Harvard, Yale, Berkeley, Stanford, Illinois, Cornell, and others would come immediately to mind. These would be the largest libraries in terms of collections, staffing, and expenditures. How could the smaller research libraries be identified? A priori it is not evident that all university libraries are research libraries or that all doctorate-granting institutions have research libraries. For example, in the state of Virginia the three largest academic libraries are the University of Virginia, Virginia Polytechnic Institute, and Virginia Commonwealth University. Would there be general agreement among librarians that all three of these are research libraries? If not, how would we decide which ones are the same kind of library, on a smaller scale, as Harvard, Yale, and Berkeley?

A pragmatic approach to identifying a sample of research libraries might be to select those that have received Title II-C grants. Those institutions have been judged, according to the Government's criteria, to be research libraries. But it is not clear how representative this sample might be -- whether it may be weighted by larger institutions, for example. A second approach would be to choose the (for 1978-79) 89 U. S. academic members of the Association of Research Libraries. Those libraries have been selected as research libraries according to carefully worked out quantitative criteria. But again a priori it is not evident how inclusive this sample would be. A third approach might be to use the Carnegie Council's classification of institutions of higher education.⁴ The Council classifies colleges and universities into six categories (doctorate-granting institutions, comprehensive universities and colleges, liberal arts colleges, and so on). The category Doctorate-Granting Institutions is subdivided into Research Universities and Doctorate-Granting Universities. The Council lists 98 Research Universities in 40 states. Of the 98 libraries in these institutions, 76 are members of the Association of Research Libraries; 22 are not members. But even granted that the Council has identified a distinct group of Research Universities, it does not follow that every Research University has a research library:

Rather than begin with prior assumptions derived from the II-C grants or ARL membership or Carnegie classification, we start with the statistical method of cluster analysis. In this method selected variables are analyzed in order to group like cases together. For example, from data on the numbers of different kinds of teeth, cluster analysis can find various groupings of similar animals. An obvious question to put to cluster analysis, therefore, is what clusters it can find among our 2,943 libraries. Is there a cluster that includes cases known to be research libraries--Harvard, Yale, Berkeley, Stanford, etc.?

In order to use cluster analysis, we must decide which variables to include in the analysis. From our 48 variables we are interested, in the first place, in

the library variables. We do not know a priori whether or to what extent university variables (such as enrollments, degrees, expenditures) may be related to library characteristics. We therefore exclude the university variables from the cluster analysis. Among library variables some are merely linear combinations of others and contribute no additional information to an analysis. For example, total FTE staff here is taken as equal to FTE professional staff plus FTE non-professional staff. If the latter two variables are in the analysis, then total staff is not needed. Other library variables available in the HEGIS file have not been of concern in library literature on quantitative characteristics. Some examples are part-time women nonprofessionals or microforms of serials or numbers of titles of government documents. For the purpose of classifying and describing libraries librarians have been more interested in variables such as volumes held or professional staff or circulation.

When we exclude these variables, we are left with 14 variables that measure library characteristics.⁵ Four measure collections, four expenditures, two staffing, and four activities and services. These 14 variables are

- Volumes held
- Volumes added, gross
- Total microforms
- Current periodical subscriptions
- Expenditures for library materials
- Expenditures for binding
- Total salaries and wages
- Other operating expenditures
- FTE professional staff
- FTE nonprofessional staff
- Interlibrary loans lent
- Interlibrary loans borrowed

Circulation

Total reference, directional, and group transactions

These are the variables to be used in cluster analysis.

III. QUANTITATIVE CHARACTERISTICS OF ACADEMIC RESEARCH LIBRARIES

A. Cluster Analysis

The goal of cluster analysis is to classify objects into groups, or clusters, suggested by the data, rather than defined a priori.⁶ The objects in one cluster are quantitatively similar to one another and dissimilar to objects in different clusters. Various types of clusters are possible. In disjoint clusters each object is placed in one and only one cluster. An example might be a two-cluster arrangement of a deck of cards, in which one cluster comprises all red cards and the other all black. A sophisticated procedure is hierarchical clustering, in which one cluster is contained within another. For example, the red cluster in a deck of cards can be divided into two clusters of hearts and diamonds, and similarly the black cluster can be divided into spades and clubs; and each of these four groups can be further divided (into face cards and others, say). Other clustering procedures (which are harder to interpret for large data sets) allow overlapping clusters, in which an object can belong to more than one cluster.

For this paper we applied a hierarchical procedure based on Ward's method, a widely-used clustering algorithm. Other methods, however, such as disjoint clustering based on Euclidean distances, produce similar results to the ones reported here.

Cluster analysis examines the 14 variables, listed above, for each library in the data file. At the highest level the analysis finds two clusters. One of these clusters is further divided into two groups, so that at this level there are three clusters. Again, one of the clusters is divided, making four clusters. And so on, down to the level where each library comprises a separate cluster. There is, in short, a hierarchy of groupings among the libraries. Looking at the highest level, we find that 127 libraries are in one cluster, and all other

libraries are in the other cluster. This cluster of 127 libraries is the group of particular interest. The cluster contains 88 of the 89 ARL libraries in the HEGIS file. (The missing ARL library is Brigham Young University, which did not report data on expenditures and so was excluded from the cluster analysis.) Of 98 institutions classed as Research Universities by the Carnegie Council, the libraries of 85 are included in this cluster. There are only 30 libraries in the cluster that are not ARL members or are not the libraries of Carnegie Council Research Universities. These 30 libraries include 26 from doctorate-granting institutions, 3 from master's degree institutions, and 1 from a two-year college. Over two-thirds of the libraries in the cluster are ARL members, including the large research libraries like Harvard, Berkeley, Yale, Stanford, as well as the smaller research library members of the ARL. The remaining one-third of the cluster comprises almost entirely libraries of doctorate-granting universities. We might well suspect that these libraries are quantitatively similar to the large libraries in the ARL that are known to be research libraries. The conclusion seems inescapable that this cluster on the whole delineates a group of research libraries in the data.

It is interesting to follow the cluster analysis to further levels of the hierarchy. The "research library" cluster divides into two groups of 12 and 115 libraries. The group of 12 comprises the largest libraries, such as Harvard, Berkeley, Illinois, and others. Thus, at the level of three clusters there are 12 very large research libraries, 115 others in a research library-like group, and a third cluster containing all other libraries. At the fourth level a group of 387 libraries splits off from this third cluster. These 387 are predominantly smaller university libraries and large college libraries. In other words, the analysis finds a fourfold grouping of libraries at this level: the 12 largest research libraries, 115 other "research libraries," 387 university or large college libraries, and a remaining cluster of mostly two-year institutions and smaller colleges.

In summary, cluster analysis points to a basic group of 127 libraries that share research library characteristics. We could, in fact, simply stop here and call these the research libraries in the HEGIS file. But it is possible, as it were, to fine-tune the analysis. For example, the 127 libraries in the cluster include a two-year college library. Did that library fall into the cluster merely because it has large collections, staffing, and services like circulation spread over many branch locations? On the other hand, there may be other libraries outside the cluster that are closely related to the 127. Or again the cluster analysis does not tell us which of our 14 variables are more significant in distinguishing between the 127 libraries and the others. In short, cluster analysis is a kind of rough-and-ready first step in classifying libraries. For fine-tuning we turn first to the statistical procedure of discriminant analysis and then to principal component analysis.

B. Discriminant Analysis

Discriminant analysis is a powerful statistical tool for identifying the characteristics that can discriminate between two or more groups.⁷ Discriminant analysis begins with separate groups--say, male and female library professionals. It then analyzes discriminating variables--salaries, salary increases, rank, etc.--to identify the combinations of variables that best distinguish between the groups. One product of the analysis can be a formula that distinguishes males from females merely on the basis of their salaries, rank, and so on.

In the present instance we have two groups, or clusters, of libraries and data for 14 variables for each library. We want to know (1) which of these 14 variables are necessary for discriminating between the two clusters, and (2) which of the 14 are sufficient for discrimination. We use a method in discriminant analysis called stepwise selection. The analysis then finds that only 12 of our 14

variables are needed for maximum discrimination. The other two variables--Current periodical subscriptions and interlibrary loans lent--add nothing significant to the discriminating power of the other variables. The 12 variables that the analysis identifies as useful for discrimination are

Volumes held

Volumes added, gross

Total microforms

Expenditures for library materials

Expenditures for binding

Total salaries and wages

Other operating expenditures

FTE professional staff

FTE nonprofessional staff

Interlibrary loans borrowed

Circulation

Total reference, directional, and group transactions

What discriminant analysis is telling us is this: If we know how many volumes an academic library had, how many volumes added, how many microforms, etc., then we can determine fairly accurately whether that library falls in the "research library" cluster or in the other cluster. We still need to determine, however, (1) whether any of the libraries in our cluster of 127 are basically dissimilar to the known research libraries, and (2) whether there are libraries outside the cluster that in fact are similar to research libraries. To answer these questions, we turn to principal component analysis.

C. Principal Component Analysis

Principal component analysis is one of the set of statistical techniques generically called factor analysis.⁸ Component analysis begins with the twelve

variables for our cluster of 127 libraries. It asks, in effect, what hypothetical variable or component is most closely related to the twelve variables. This component is derived in such a way that it has the highest possible correlations with the twelve variables. The analysis then calculates the correlations of the variables with the component. We take the component to be a summary measure of library collections, expenditures, staffing, and activities and services.

When the component analysis is performed, here are the correlations of the twelve variables with the library size component:

Volumes held	.93
Volumes added, gross	.92
Total microforms	.50
Expenditures for library materials	.91
Expenditures for binding	.81
Total salaries and wages	.95
Other operating expenditures	.75
FTE professional staff	.88
FTE nonprofessional staff	.93
Interlibrary loans borrowed	.45

Total reference, directional, and group transactions	.24

From these figures we can see that the 127 libraries are most alike in volumes held, total salaries, and FTE nonprofessionals. They are less similar in microforms, interlibrary borrowing, and reference transactions.

From these correlations between the twelve variables and the library size component, what are called component score coefficients are derived. These coefficients are directly proportional to the correlations. Here are the component

score coefficients for the data from the 127 libraries:

These coefficients are no more than weights for each of the twelve variables. When the weights are multiplied by the data from an individual library, the sum of the twelve products is a component score for that library.

It is worth emphasizing again that the weights, or coefficients, are directly proportional to the correlation of each variable with library size. Where a correlation is higher (say, for total salaries), more of the variation in library size is explained by that variable, which therefore is given a higher weight. The weights thus accurately mirror the ways in which the 127 libraries are alike or different; they reflect and measure what is common among the 127 libraries.

From these weights we can compute component scores for individual libraries. The data for each of the twelve variables are transformed to a standard normal form and multiplied by the corresponding weight. The formula for computing component scores is:

- + .12255 (log of expend. for lib. materials - 14.0521)/.5319
- + .10986 (log of expend. for binding - 11.3047)/.8031
- + .12851 (log of total salaries - 14.5587)/.5764
- + .10117 (log of other operating expend. - 12.7151)/.8067
- + .11842 (log of prof. staff - 3.9796)/.5680
- + .12567 (log of nonprof. staff - 4.5709)/.6455
- + .06112 (log of interlib. borrowing - 8.1983)/1.0976
- + .10347 (log of circulation - 13.1478)/.6672
- + .03251 (log of ref. transactions - 8.2017)/.8358

The score for an individual library indicates its rank or position in regard to the size and resources deployed of the 127 libraries. Taken together, the 127 scores range from 2.689 to -4.629. Their mean (and median) is approximately 0, and their standard deviation is 1. The scores have the useful property that they are approximated by a standard normal curve or distribution. In this kind of distribution most of the values fall between +2 and -2; we would expect no more than six or seven out of 127 to be greater than +2 or less than -2. And indeed there are three scores greater than +2 (Harvard, Berkeley, and Yale) and three less than -2 (Northern Virginia Community College, Tennessee State University, and Mills College). In a standard normal distribution, moreover, we would expect about 95% of the scores to be greater than or equal to -1.65. For our 127 libraries we would expect about 121 scores to be -1.65 or greater; and in fact 124 scores are -1.65 or greater. From this feature of the distribution we can make valuable inferences about libraries outside our sample of 127. We use the component score formula above to compute scores for other libraries. If there is a group of other libraries that are in fact like the cluster in respect to library size and resources deployed, then at least 95% of that group should score -1.65 or higher. Or in different terms the probability is no more than 5% that a library essentially like

the sample would fail to score at least -1.65 .

In summary, if we use the component score formula for our 127 libraries to calculate scores for all 2,943 libraries in the total data file, we can set a score cutoff point. For libraries with scores above that point, we say that those libraries cannot be significantly distinguished from Harvard, Yale, Berkeley, Stanford, and others in the cluster of 127. For scores below the cutoff point, we say that there is a significant quantitative distinction. How do we determine the cutoff point? There is no hard-and-fast rule in statistics for selecting the point. In social sciences a common procedure is to choose a point associated with a .05 probability level. (Interestingly, the U. S. Supreme Court has used a .05 significance level in discrimination cases.)⁹ We hypothesize, for example, that library X shows the same quantitative characteristics as Harvard, Yale, Berkeley, and other known research libraries. If we find a probability of 5% or less, then we reject this hypothesis. As we have seen, a .05 significance level is associated with a component score of -1.65 . Consequently, we can form a decision rule: If a given library scores -1.65 or higher, then accept that it shows the characteristics of Harvard, Yale, Berkeley, and other research libraries. If it scores less than -1.65 , then reject the hypothesis that it shows the essential research library characteristics.

Of the 2,943 libraries in our data file, it turns out that 181 exhibit scores of -1.65 or greater. These libraries are listed in Table 1, in descending rank order by component score. The Table also includes two columns headed "ARL" and "Carnegie". An x in the ARL column indicates that the library was a member of the Association of Research Libraries in 1978-79. An x in the Carnegie column indicates that the library is in an institution classified by the Carnegie Council as a "Research University."¹⁰

The Appendix displays the scores for the 2,943 libraries in the data file, arranged by state and by component score.¹¹

From our cluster of 127 libraries only three score below -1.65. The three, with their scores, are Northern Virginia Community College, -2.043; Tennessee State University, -2.107; and Mills College, -4.629. Brigham Young is the only ARL member not included in Table 1; because of missing data on expenditures its score cannot be calculated. There are six libraries of institutions in the Carnegie list of "Research Universities" that do not score -1.65 or higher. These, with their scores, are: St. Louis, -1.776; Utah State, -2.093; Carnegie-Mellon, -2.441; California Institute of Technology, -2.873; CUNY Graduate School, -3.928; Rockefeller, -4.035.

According to our decision rule, we accept that the 181 libraries of Table 1 are not significantly different from the group containing Harvard, Yale, Berkeley, and other research libraries. We therefore take these 181 to be the research libraries in our sample of 2,943. The libraries that score less than -1.65 we judge to be significantly different from the 181.

The component scores of Table 1 are summary measures indicating a library's size in collections, expenditures, personnel, and services and activities. The scores are simply weighted sums of the data for twelve variables. Consequently, different combinations of data can produce the same score. For example, a library with a large number of volumes but relatively few professionals can exhibit the same score as a library with few volumes and many professionals. We can obtain a clearer picture of what is implied by our -1.65 dividing lines by looking at individual variables. In a normal distribution only 5% of the values would be expected to be less than 1.65 standard deviations below the mean. Returning to our sample of 127 libraries, from which the component score formula was derived, we find that the mean of the logarithm of professional staff is 3.9796, and the standard deviation is .5680. Then 1.65 standard deviations below the mean is $3.9796 - 1.65(.5680) = 3.0424$. The antilog of this number is 20.96, which can be rounded to 21. Thus, 21 serves as a dividing line for professionals. We would

expect no more than about 5% of the libraries like Harvard, Yale, and other research libraries to have fewer professionals than 21.

The dividing lines for ten of the twelve variables used in principal component analysis are displayed in Table 2. (Two variables--Total microforms and Interlibrary loans borrowed--are omitted because the variability among the 181 libraries in respect to these variables is so great that useful dividing lines cannot be derived.) To these ten variables we add two linear combinations of variables: Total library expenditures and Total staff. Note that not all of the 181 research libraries pass each of these tests. For example, 6 of the 181 had fewer than 21 professionals. All 181 do pass the component score test because, as was observed above, a library deficient in professionals may balance that deficiency with a large number of volumes in the computation of its component score. Nevertheless, Table 2 does offer a useful guide to the characteristics of academic research libraries in 1978-79. In general, a research library had at least 445,000 volumes; 18,000 volumes added; \$530,000 in expenditures for materials; and so on. The libraries that failed to meet a majority of these levels differed from research libraries.

IV. OTHER QUANTITATIVE CHARACTERISTICS OF ACADEMIC RESEARCH LIBRARIES: REGRESSION ANALYSIS

In the preceding section we have delineated a group of 181 libraries from our file of 2,943. We have seen how in 1978-79 research libraries on the whole owned at least 445,000 volumes, spent \$1,450,000 or more, and had at least 54 FTE staff. In this section we discuss other quantitative relationships in the data of the 181 research libraries.

A useful statistical technique for describing the relations of one variable to others is multiple regression analysis. In principal component analysis we studied twelve variables, and asked what hypothetical variable, or component, is most closely related to the twelve and how strong the relationship is. In regression analysis we select a known variable, such as professional staff, and ask which other known variables are closely related to it, and again, how strong the relation is. For analysis we choose ten of the twelve variables in Table 2: Volumes held; Volumes added, gross; Expenditures for library materials; Expenditures for binding; Total salaries and wages; Other operating expenditures; Total expenditures; FTE professional staff; FTE nonprofessional staff; and Total staff. (The other two variables--Circulation and Total reference, directional, and group transactions--are only weakly correlated with other variables, so that in their case the results of regression analysis are of doubtful utility.)

How do we select the variables that best "explain," or are most closely associated with volumes, volumes added, expenditures for materials, and the other variables? Regression techniques offer procedures for selecting subsets of explanatory variables. But one should not merely follow a procedure, such as step-wise regression, unthinkingly. For example, gross volumes added are most strongly related to net volumes added. But we will not gain much by learning that gross volumes added are associated with net volumes added. For this report we are seeking a small set of explanatory variables for each of our ten variables--if

possible, no more than one or two explanatory variables in each set. For simplicity's sake, moreover, we would like to have the same set of explanatory variables for all or most of our ten variables. In other words, judgment needs to be exercised in the selection of explanatory variables.

As an aid in selection, we used a technique called all-subsets regression on the ten variables for various classes of libraries--the 181 research libraries, other doctorate-granting institutions, institutions with master's degrees or with bachelor's degrees as the highest offering, and two-year colleges. This analysis reveals that the "best" explanatory variables differ by type of library and by variable being explained. For example, for professional staff in the 181 research libraries the single explanatory variable that accounts for most variance is volumes; the best pair of explanatory variables consists of volumes and either faculty headcount 1979 or fulltime students 1978. In four-year colleges, on the other hand, the single variable most closely related to professional staff is current periodicals; and the best pair is current periodicals and fulltime students 1978. A pair of explanatory variables that recurs throughout the analysis, however, is volumes held and circulation. For research libraries this pair is the best, or is one of the two or three best, sets of explanatory variables. We offer a specific example of the use of these variables.

Consider professional staff in the 181 research libraries. The number of professionals is strongly related to volumes held and circulation. Regression analysis shows that this relationship is characterized by an R^2 of .80, meaning that 80% of the variance in numbers of professionals in research libraries can be "explained" by volumes held and circulation. The more volumes a research institution has, and the more books it circulates, the more professional staff it is likely to have. The analysis, moreover, presents a precise statement of the relationship by deriving an equation:

$$\text{FTE professional staff} = .00002208308 \times \text{Volumes held} + .00001215037 \times$$

Circulation + 14.996054.

This equation becomes more understandable when we note that .00002208308 x Volumes is approximately equivalent to 1 per each 45,000 volumes. Similarly, .00001215037 x Circulation can be converted to 1 per each 83,000 volumes circulated. Thus, the equation becomes

$$\text{FTE professional staff} = 1 \text{ per each } 45,000 \text{ Volumes} + 1 \text{ per each } 83,000 \text{ Volumes circulated} + 15.$$

The regression analysis also offers a way of judging how closely this equation predicts the actual number of professionals in given libraries. The difference between an actual number and a predicted number is a residual. The standard error of the residuals is approximately 16. We can expect in general that 95% of residuals would be greater than -1.65 standard errors. -1.65 times the standard error of 16 is approximately -26. Adding this to the equation above, we have

$$\text{FTE professional staff} = 1 \text{ per each } 45,000 \text{ Vols.} + 1 \text{ per each } 83,000 \text{ Volumes circulated} + 15 - 26 = 1 \text{ per each } 45,000 \text{ Volumes} + 1 \text{ per each } 83,000 \text{ Volumes circulated} - 11.$$

This equation presents the minimum number of professionals that one would expect in a research library. There is no more than a .05 probability that a research library would have fewer professionals than this equation predicts. From the principal component analysis we saw that a research library can be expected to have at least 21 professionals. From the regression analysis we now see that the number of professionals is also related to volumes and circulation. Any research library would be expected to have 21 professionals. A research library with 1,500,000 volumes and a circulation of 500,000 would be expected to have $1,500,000/45,000 + 500,000/83,000 - 11 = 28$ professionals or more. While component analysis sets dividing lines for all research libraries, regression analysis sets dividing lines that vary according to volumes and circulation in individual institutions.

In the same ways in which a relation between professionals and volumes and circulation has been measured, we can measure the relations of our other variables

to volumes and circulation. To explain the variable volumes, however, we cannot use volumes and circulation, since we would be relating a variable to itself. The single variable to which volumes are most closely related is doctorates awarded in 1978-79; and so we use that as the explanatory variable. Note that we are not concerned here with causes and effects. We are not saying that doctorates awarded are somehow a cause of library size in volumes, but only that there is a close statistical relationship between volumes and doctorates. The more doctorates an institution awards, the more volumes its library tends to own. If we know how many doctorates were granted in 1978-79, we can predict fairly accurately how many volumes a library had. But we cannot conclude that library size in some way depends upon degrees awarded.

The regression equations for our ten variables are displayed in Table 3. These models are intuitively attractive because they point up the ways in which added volumes, expenditures, and staffing are associated with library resources measured in volumes and library services measured in circulation. For example, in 1978-79 research libraries tended to spend \$1.40 for each volume held and \$1.50 for each circulation; the libraries had 1 staff member for each 14,500 volumes and 1 for each 24,500 circulations; they added 1 volume for each 50 volumes held and 1 for each 50 volumes circulated.

We can use these same models for other types of libraries. Among four-year college libraries, for example, the equation for FTE professional staff is 1 professional for each 61,500 volumes + 1 for each 24,800 circulations + 1 with an R^2 of .46. Research libraries have more professionals than college libraries per volumes held but approximately the same number of professionals per volumes circulated. Similarly with other variables and other types of libraries the regression equations differ from those for research libraries. By applying tests for heterogeneity of slopes in analysis of covariance, we find that these differences are significant. In other words, the regression equations of Table 3 are characteristic of research libraries but not of other types of libraries.

Thus, the regression equations offer a second way, in addition to the component scores, of characterizing research libraries.

V. SUMMARY

In Part III of this report we derived approximate dividing lines that distinguish research libraries from other kinds of libraries. Table 2 shows that a typical research library in 1978-79 had at least 445,000 volumes, expenditures of \$1,450,000, and a staff of 54. In Part IV we found that the variables in research library data are related in distinct ways. Table 3 shows, for example, that there was one professional for each 45,000 volumes plus one for each 83,000 circulations, plus 15. From the discussion in Part IV it can be seen that the minimum number of professionals that one would expect in a research library is

$$\begin{aligned} & \text{Vols}/45,000 + \text{Circ}/83,000 + 15 - 1.65 \times 16 = \\ & \text{Vols}/45,000 + \text{Circ}/83,000 - .11. \end{aligned}$$

We can draw together these criteria by saying that in academic research libraries the number of professionals was (1) at least 21, and (2) at least equal to 1 for each 45,000 volumes plus 1 for each 83,000 circulations minus 11. These criteria and others are displayed in Table 4.

Also displayed in Table 4 are the numbers of libraries satisfying these criteria. In respect to professional staff, for example, 172 of the 181 research libraries have at least 21 professionals, and their professional staff is also equal to at least $\text{Vols}/45,000 + \text{Circ}/83,000 - 11$. 55 non-research libraries satisfy this criterion.

Clearly, any one criterion by itself does not sufficiently discriminate between research and non-research libraries. Sets of the criteria do, however, offer considerably better discrimination. Here are the numbers of libraries satisfying all ten criteria, nine of the ten, eight, and seven:

92% of research libraries and only four non-research libraries pass at least eight of the ten tests. 96% of research libraries and 14 non-research libraries pass at least seven of the ten.¹² Suppose that these criteria were used to determine whether a given library is a research library. Then if we wanted a rigorous test, we would require the library to satisfy at least eight of the ten criteria. If we wanted a more inclusive test, we would require seven of the ten.

From this investigation, then, we are left with two ways of distinguishing research libraries from other types of libraries. The first way is to calculate principal component scores and require a score of -1.65 or higher. In this method the scores are weighted combinations of twelve library variables. For a given library with a score of -1.65 or greater the interrelations among the variables may or may not be typical of those in other research libraries. That is, in relation to volumes held and circulations the library may have, say, more volumes added and fewer professionals than a typical research library. But its component score will still class it with the research libraries. The second way of distinguishing research libraries is by the criteria of Table 4. If a library satisfies seven or eight of these criteria, it is classed with the research libraries. For a given library these criteria require that the values of individual variables be typical of research libraries. The library with a score of -1.65 or greater that has fewer professionals than the typical research library may fail to satisfy the Table 4 criterion for professional staff. Thus, the Table 4 criteria impose constraints not present in the component score method.

Both of the methods delineate approximately the same group of research libraries. The Table 4 criteria are perhaps preferable for applications because they are apt to make more intuitive sense to those to whom the component scores seem like mysterious mathematical mumbo-jumbo. The Table 4 criteria point out very straightforwardly that research libraries had, for example, 21 or more professionals, and that the number of professionals was related to library resources measured in volumes and library services measured in volumes circulated. 37

Do these methods potentially have practical uses? Undoubtedly the component scores and Table 4 criteria offer objective ways of judging how similar a library is to research libraries. It must be understood, however, that the component score equation and the Table 4 criteria in this paper are based on 1978-79 data. One would expect changes from year to year, especially in the minimum levels of Table 4. Consequently, in order to use these methods in continuing applications, one would need to recalculate the scores and the criteria as new HEGIS data become available. But one would also need to decide to what extent organizations as multifarious as research libraries should be judged by purely quantitative criteria, remembering, however, that the search for non-quantitative criteria can lead into truly uncharted lands.

The component score formula involves logarithms of the variables, and the logarithm of 0 is an undefined value. The libraries reporting 0 for one or more variables would thus also lack scores; and altogether over half of the potential 2,943 scores would be missing. In order to avoid such a large number of missing scores, we substituted 1's for 0's. Thus, it became possible to estimate scores for the libraries with zeros for some variables. Note, however, that the scores for these libraries are deflated somewhat. An example early in the list is U of Arkansas Pine Bluff, with a score of -5.042. From its data on volumes, volumes added, and staff, one would expect Pine Bluff to rank higher than 10th in the Arkansas list; but its score is deflated because it reports 0 for expenditures for binding. If it had reported even \$200 for binding, say, its score would have been -4.317, and it would have been ranked 7th instead of 10th.
