ABSTRACT

This report presents the results from the fall 1983 salary survey of the Illinois public community colleges. Data are provided on faculty and administrative salaries for fiscal year (FY) 1984; FY 1984 base salaries for full-time faculty on 9- and 12-month contracts; faculty overload and summer rates; average part-time faculty salary rates per course credit hour; salaries for full-time faculty with master's degrees; institutional policies related to faculty salaries and faculty contracts; 1984 contractual base salaries for other professional staff on 9- and 12-month contracts; base salaries for administrative staff; salaries paid to selected administrators; FY 1984 monthly classified staff salaries; low, high, and average monthly salaries for specified classified staff; a comparison of monthly salaries of classified personnel; fringe benefits for full-time employees; and FY 1984 mean percentage salary increases for faculty, professional, administrative, and classified staff. Highlighted survey findings include the following: (1) the average salary for faculty with 9-month contracts was \$27,182 and for those on 12-month contracts was \$24,407; (2) part-time faculty salary rates averaged \$269 per course during the fall 1983 term; (3) the average administrator salary for FY 1984 was \$33,173; and (4) the statewide average cost of fringe benefits for full-time faculty was \$3,038. PREFACE

The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) staff has conducted the Fall Salary Survey for the past twelve years. Colleges report data on faculty, administrative and classified staff salaries, and personnel policies. The annual report summarizes this information, which is used by the colleges in determining staff salaries and for purposes of comparison. The ICCB staff and other state agencies use the report to monitor and analyze trends in community college salaries and personnel policies.

Every attempt was made to ensure that the data presented are comparable for each college. However, due to the great diversity among the community colleges in both administrative structures and salary policies, caution is advised in making comparisons on the basis of any one salary figure. Several types of salaries are shown in the report, and an analysis of all of these is essential when making comparisons. For example, if one wanted to compare faculty salaries at a relatively new college with those at an established college, the salary schedule salaries would be the most appropriate for purposes of comparison. We hope the information in this report will serve the needs of each of you.

The ICCB staff appreciates the cooperation of personnel in the community colleges in completing the salary survey accurately.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FALL 1983 SALARY SURVEY REPORT

- 1. The weighted average Fiscal Year 1984 contractual base salary for faculty with 9-month contracts was \$27,182. The weighted average for faculty with 12-month contracts was \$24,407. The contractual salary is the base salary actually paid by the community colleges to full-time faculty (see Pages 3 through 5).
- 2. The state average 12-month fiscal year (W-2 type) faculty salary for Fiscal Year 1983 was \$29,220. This salary was \$3,185 higher than the average Fiscal Year 1983 contractual base salary (see Pages 6 and 7). This fiscal year salary includes salary for overloads, extra assignments, and summer teaching.
- 3. Part-time faculty salary rates ranged from \$167 to \$350 per course semester hour and averaged \$269 during the fall 1983 term. The average overload rate for full-time faculty per course semester hour during the academic year was \$371 (see Pages 8 and 9).
- 4. The state average academic year (usually 9 months) salary schedule salaries paid to full-time teaching faculty with a master's degree in the public community colleges were as follows (see Pages 10 and 11):
 - a. master's degree, no additional graduate course work, and no experience (beginning level base salary). \$15,460

 - c. master's degree, maximum hours (highest salary). . . . \$31,668
- 5. The average Fiscal Year 1984 contractual base salary paid to "other professional" staff with 9-month contracts was \$27,533; the average for 12-month contract "other professional" staff was \$20,280 (see Pages 14 through 16). "Other professional" staff include counselors, librarians, and other instructional support staff such as curriculum coordinators.
- 6. The average administrative staff contractual salary for Fiscal Year 1984 was \$33,173 and ranged from a low of \$15,515 to a high of \$75,000 (see Pages 17 through 25).
- 7. The cost of fringe benefits in Fiscal Year 1983 for full-time faculty ranged from \$181 to \$7,468 per person. The state average cost of fringe benefits for a full-time faculty member was \$3,038 (see Pages 29 through 31).
- 8. The average salary increases for <u>continuing</u> community college personnel from Fiscal Year 1983 to Fiscal Year 1984 were (Pages 32 and 33):

INTRODUCTION

The Fall 1983 Salary Survey for the Illinois Public Community Colleges was essentially the same as the survey conducted during the fall term of 1982. The survey can be faculty salary data which are based on actual contracts, salaried ty salary schedules, part-time faculty salary rates, overly salary rates, total fiscal year (W-2 type) faculty salaries, administrative laries, other professional salaries, average faculty load information, staries for positions similar to Universities Civil Service classifications, and salaries of key administrators.

Table 1 on Page 2 shows a summary of selected faculty and administrative salaries in Illinois public community colleges for Fiscal Year 1984. The range of salaries and the state average salary are shown in this table. The contractual salaries (9-month and 12-month) represent those which the colleges actually contract with the faculty. The salary schedule salaries are ones which are shown on the colleges' salary schedules. The state weighted average Fiscal Year 1984 contractual base salary for full-time faculty with 9-month contracts was \$27,182; for 12-month full-time faculty the average Fiscal Year 1984 contractual salary was \$24,407.

The average salary schedule salary for full-time teaching faculty with a master's degree and no experience increased by 3.5 percent to \$15,460, while the average salary for a teacher with a master's degree and maximum hours increased by 6.4 percent to \$31,668.

The administrative salaries shown are for an entire year (12 months) and represent the average of all the salaries reported by all public community colleges in Illinois. Not all colleges have all administrators and not all administrators are at the same administrative level; therefore, caution should be used in comparing administrative salaries.

The average part-time faculty salary rate per course credit hour increased to \$269. This represents a four dollar increase (1.5 percent). Part-time salary rates are determined in a variety of ways at each community college. For example, some colleges pay a flat dollar amount per course, while other colleges pay a rate per course credit hour or per class contact hour. In this survey, all of these various methods of payment were converted to an average rate per semester credit hour to obtain comparable data.

The Fiscal Year 1983 (W-2 type) state average full-time faculty salary was \$29,220. This is 12.2 percent higher than the average Fiscal Year 1983 contractual base salary. These total annual faculty salaries include the base salary plus extra pay for additional courses above a full-time load (overloads) and for a summer session as well as any additional payment for special assignments, such as serving as department chairperson. This salary is similar to the salary reported on the Internal Revenue Service W-2 Form except that it is for a fiscal year instead of a calendar year.

Oaktor Community College had not settled a contract for Fiscal Year 1984; therefore, salary data for this college are not included in this report.

Table 2 below shows a state summary of the ranges of salaries for full-time faculty on 9-month contracts for Fiscal Year 1984.

Table 3 on Page 4 shows the lowest, average, highest, and median academic year contractual base salaries of full-time faculty with 9-month contracts at each community college in Illinois. Table 4 on Page 5 gives the same information for full-time faculty with 12-month contracts.

The lowest salaries represent the lowest contractual base salary actually paid to a full-time faculty member at each of the community college districts and may be different from salary schedule salaries which are reported in Tables 8 and 9 of this report. The low salaries for 9-month faculty contracts ranged from \$12,000 to \$21,170.

The high salaries represent the highest contractual base salary actually paid to full-time teaching faculty members for an academic year at each of the colleges. The mean salaries represent the arithmetic weighted average of all full-time teaching faculty salaries at each community college district. Statewide average salary data reported throughout this report are weighted average salary data. The median salaries reported are those which are the middle salary (an equal number of salaries equal to or lower and equal to or higher) at each college. The median salary is the most appropriate measure of central tendencies for salary data within a given college, since it is not affected by extreme high or low salaries; however, it is not meaningful when reporting statewide composite median salary data.

Table 5 on Page 7 shows a comparison of the contractual base salaries for Fiscal Year 1983 and the total salaries paid to full-time faculty in Fiscal Year 1983. The total Fiscal Year 1983 salaries include all overloads and compensation for extra assignments paid to full-time faculty from July 1, 1982 to June 30, 1983. The comparisons on this table show the average amount of additional salary a full-time faculty member received during Fiscal Year 1983. The average additional dollar amounts range from \$165 to \$9,212 above the Fiscal Year 1983 average contractual base salary.

The state average total fiscal year salary paid to faculty in Fiscal Year 1983 is \$3,185 more than the state average academic year contractual salary for full-time teaching faculty in Fiscal Year 1983. An analysis of total faculty salary is important because some community colleges make an extra effort to ensure that the full-time faculty have first chance at overload classes and extra assignments prior to hiring part-time faculty.

Table 6 below shows a summary of the part-time faculty and full-time faculty overload and summer term salary rates in Illinois public community colleges during Fiscal Year 1984.

Table 7 on Page 9 shows the average part-time faculty salary rates per semester credit hour and full-time faculty overload rates by each community college district. The first column shows the part-time faculty rate per course credit hour. This rate is the amount paid to part-time teachers who might, for example, teach a night class at an extension center. The second column shows the overload rate for full-time faculty for the academic year. This rate represents the amount paid to full-time faculty for teaching courses above the full-time load during the academic year. Often this is compensation for teaching an extra night class or for teaching an additional class in the daytime. The third column shows the amount received by full-time faculty members for teaching a class during the summer term. Community colleges have many different bases for determining part-time faculty rates as well as overload rates. For example, some colleges pay a flat rate per course or a flat rate per term, while other colleges base their rates on contact hours or credit hours; still others pay an hourly rate. In addition, many of the colleges' overload rates for full-time faculty are based on a percentage of that faculty member's actual salary. These various methods of payment were converted to the average rate per semester credit hour so that comparable data could be obtained for each college. It must be realized, however, that much of the data reported had to be averaged and conversions were made for typical cases at each college.

A state summary of the range of salary schedule salaries for faculty with a master's degree at those community college districts which have salary schedules, as well as the state average salaries, are shown in Table 8 below.

Table 9 on Page 11 shows the Fiscal Year 1984 salary schedule galaries at each community college in Illinois. These salaries are based on the salary schedules at the colleges and not on the actual salaries paid.

INSTITUTIONAL POLICIES RELATED TO FACULTY SALARIES AND FACULTY CONTRACTS AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 10 below summarizes the institutional policies at each public community college district in Illinois which are related to faculty salaries and faculty contracts. These policies often have a considerable impact on the salaries presented elsewhere in this report. For example, the average weekly class contact hour per full-time instructional faculty has a bearing on the number of faculty that an institution must have to meet its needs. The length of a full-time academic year contract also has a bearing on academic year salary for full-time faculty.

Table 11 on Page 13 shows these policies for each college. Of the 39 community college districts in Illinois, twelve have professional rank, although not all of these use rank as a criteria for salary determinations. Twenty-two public community college districts in Illinois have master contracts with the faculty.

In addition to the class contact hours, office hours, and academic advising hours, faculty members spend much time in grading papers, preparing class presentations, working on curriculum development, and serving on college committees. Accordingly, although the state average number of required weekly hours for the faculty does not total 40 hours, most faculty members spend over 40 hours per week on their full-time assignments.

FISCAL YEAR 1984 CONTRACTUAL BASE SALARIES FOR OTHER PROFESSIONAL STAFF AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 12 below shows a summary of the range of salaries for other professional staff in Illinois public community colleges.

Tables 13 and 14 on Pages 15 and 16 show the number of staff and the lowest, average, highest, and median contractual base salaries paid to full-time other professionals (9-month and 12-month) at each community college in Illinois. Other professional staff include counselors, librarians, and instructional support staff such as curriculum coordinators. Even though some colleges may classify some of these types of personnel as non-teaching faculty, they were asked to report them in this category. Thus, this classification includes professional staff members who are not teaching faculty, not administrators, and not civil service or classified staff.

The lowest and highest salaries represent the lowest and highest base salaries actually paid to full-time "other professionals" at each of the community colleges. The average salaries represent the arithmetic average of all full-time "other professional" salaries at each college. The median salaries represent the salary received by the person in the middle of the range at each college. The weighted state average salary of "other professional" staff with 9-month contracts was \$27,533. For other professional staff with 12-month contracts, the weighted state average salary was \$20,280.

FISCAL YEAR 1984 CONTRACTUAL BASE SALARIES FOR ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 15 below shows a state summary of the range of administrative staff contractual salaries for Fiscal Year 1984. The weighted average administrative staff salary ranged from a low of \$26,260 to a high of \$44,694.

Table 16 on Page 18 shows the number of administrative staff; lowest, average, and highest Fiscal Year 1984 salaries; and the median Fiscal Year 1984 salaries of administrative staff. Administrative staff include both academic and administrative personnel and includes positions similar to those shown in Table 17 on Page 19.

Some colleges may classify some of these administrative positions as faculty or other professional staff. However, for the sake of comparison, they were asked to report them as administrative staff regardless of how they were classified at the college.

The statewide weighted average administrative salary for Fiscal Year 1984 was \$33,173. The lowest reported administrative salary was \$15,515, and the highest was \$75,000.

A summary of the Fiscal Year 1984 contractual base salaries paid to select administrators in Illinois public community colleges appears in Table 17 below.

Table 18 on Pages 20 through 25 shows the contractual base salaries paid to select administrators in each of the public community colleges in Illinois during Fiscal Year 1984. The chief executive officer of the district is either a chancellor or a president and has overall administrative responsibilities for the college district. The chief campus administrator reports directly to the chief executive officer of the district and has overall administrative responsibility for the college campus. Examples of chief campus administrators are the presidents or provosts at multi-campus institutions, and executive vice presidents for internal affairs at single campus colleges. Due to the various administrative organizations which exist at the colleges, a particular position may not exist. An analysis of the entire administrative structure must be made before making comparisons between similar positions at two different colleges. Another item for consideration when making comparisons between colleges is the number of years an administrator has been in the position.

SUMMARY OF FISCAL YEAR 1984 MONTHLY CLASSIFIED STAFF SALARIES AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 19 on Page 27 summarizes Illinois community college earnings for specific classified staff. The number of employees in Column 1 is the sum total of all employees for the respective position titles which were reported by Illinois community colleges. The average Fiscal Year 1984 salary in Column 3 is the weighted average of all monthly salaries reported for each classification. The high and low salaries are those reported by the colleges for each specific type of classification.

Table 20 on Page 28 shows a comparison of monthly mean salaries of comparable university civil service positions and classified community college positions. Overall, community college classified staff salaries are 3.1 percent lower than classified salaries at universities. However, many variables, such as tenure in the positions and exact job responsibilities, are unknown, which makes valid comparisons difficult.
