ABSTRACT

This study analyzed existing Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores and selected student background variables to answer the following seven questions about students planning to major in the humanities and related social sciences: (1) Have SAT and GRE scores for these students declined? (2) In what ways have prospective humanities students changed in recent years? (3) Are these changes similar for both sexes and all ethnic groups? (4) Are test score patterns and background characteristics different for different areas of the humanities? (5) Of those intending graduate work in the humanities, what proportion were humanities majors, and how do their GRE scores compare with those majoring in other fields? (6) What proportion of humanities undergraduate majors intended to pursue humanities graduate study, and how do their GRE scores compare with those entering other graduate fields? (7) Do change patterns in academic characteristics parallel changes observed in other characteristics? The SAT files used covered all years from 1975 to 1983 (except 1976), and the GRE files contained data from 1976-1983 (excluding 1979). The analyses consisted of frequencies, percentages, and means for each year's data. Supplements contain tables of results. (BS)

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PREFACE TO THE REVISED EDITION

The major difference between this revised edition and the previous one is the addition of GRE data for 1983.

A second important difference is the exclusion of GRE data for 1979. The first edition of this report, produced early in 1984, was found to contain some erroneous data for 1979. That year, because of an ambiguity in the instructions given to GRE registrants, a small percentage of examinees coded their major fields incorrectly. Because major field categories are crucial to this study, all GRE data for 1979 have been omitted.

A third change was in the GRE major field codes themselves. In 1983, the list of major fields was also revised because of increasing numbers of students entering new areas and decreasing numbers entering others. Slavic studies was dropped as a separate major field and included with Russian. Italian was also dropped because it was attracting so few students. A new area, speech pathology (not included in humanities), was added. This accounts for the decline in numbers of students planning to major in speech, which is part of the humanities.

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Executive Summary

This study analyzed all existing SAT and GRE scores as well as selected background variables for students planning to major in the humanities and related social sciences. The SAT files covered all years from 1975 to 1983, except for 1976. The GRE files contained data from 1976 to 1983, excluding 1979. Some of the more notable results are summarized below.

SAT Results

1. In spite of a 14% rise in the number of students taking the SAT and specifying an intended major field, the number planning to major in the humanities decreased by 42%, and the number entering the related social sciences decreased 50%. In 1975, 6.1% of all students planned to major in the humanities; by 1983, that figure was only 3.1%.

2. The percentage of students eventually planning to obtain at least a master's degree was higher than average for prospective humanities majors, and the number increased over the period studied.

3. In spite of an overall decline in SAT Verbal scores, the scores of prospective humanities majors rose 17 points and the scores of those entering the related social sciences rose 11 points.

4. For every year, beginning in 1977, students planning to enter the humanities obtained higher than average SAT Mathematics scores.

5. Students planning to enter the humanities reported higher than average high school grades in English, social studies, and foreign languages.

6. The proportion of students in an academic high school curriculum was consistently higher than average for students planning to major in the humanities, and the percentage was highest in 1983.

7. Regardless of their intended major field, the average number of years that students studied foreign languages in high school decreased between 1975 and 1983. Throughout that period, prospective humanities majors had more years of foreign languages than students entering other fields.

8. The average number of honors and awards received by students entering all major fields increased over the eight-year period and was higher than average for students entering the humanities.

9. Students planning to major in the humanities rated themselves higher than average on ability in written expression, creative writing, speaking ability, and leadership ability. Their ratings also increased over the eight years studied.

10. Compared with students entering other major fields, fewer prospective humanities majors indicated that they wanted help to improve their reading ability; furthermore, the percentage wanting help decreased over the eight years studied.

11. The percentage of students planning to request financial aid increased for students entering all major fields but was consistently lowest for those planning to major in humanities.

12. The percentage of students planning to study part time was lowest for prospective humanities majors, and that percentage decreased over the eight years studied.

13. On the average, students entering the humanities came from families having more formal education than the average for other majors.

GRE Results

1. The number of U.S. citizens taking the GRE and planning to major in the humanities decreased 47% between 1976 and 1983. The number decreased 29% among those entering the related social sciences.

2. An increasing percentage of students are planning to change majors, into and out of the humanities, between undergraduate and graduate school. A greater proportion of women than men intend to change fields.

3. Students planning to enter the humanities had consistently higher than average degree goals over the seven-year period studied. In 1983, nearly 53% of all prospective humanities majors planned to obtain more than a master's degree.

4. Average GRE Verbal scores of prospective humanities majors increased 4 points between 1976 and 1983, while the mean for students entering all major fields combined decreased 17 points. Students entering the humanities obtained higher than average mean scores each year.

5. Between 1982 and 1983, Verbal scores of prospective humanities majors rose 15 points; the average increase for all majors combined was 3 points. Average scores of women planning to major in humanities increased 21 points over this one-year period.

6. Between 1976 and 1983, GRE Quantitative score averages increased 17 points for prospective humanities majors and 6 points for those in related social sciences. Among women planning to enter the

humanities, scores rose 24 points.

7. Undergraduate grade averages were consistently higher than average for those planning to do graduate work in the humanities, and second highest for those entering a related social science. This was the same rank ordering as GRE Verbal scores.

8. Students planning to enter the humanities have parents with more formal education, on the average, than do students planning to major in all other fields combined.

Background and Purpose

Over the past decade students have shown a declining interest in majoring in the humanities, both at the graduate and undergraduate levels. The National Research Council has reported that the total number of doctorates awarded to men peaked in 1972 and then decreased 22% by 1980 (National Research Council, 1981). In the humanities, the peak occurred in 1973, but declined 39% by 1980. Among men receiving doctorates, this was the greatest proportional decline of any broad major field.

Data for women showed a different pattern. The number of doctorates awarded in all fields rose 136% from 1970 to 1980. In the humanities the number rose only until 1975 and then declined 9% by 1980. Humanities was the only broad major field showing a decline for women.

Decreasing interest in graduate study in the humanities is also evident among examinees taking the Graduate Record Examinations (GRE) (Altman and Holland, 1977 and Goodison, 1982). While the total examinee volume decreased 13% from 1976 to 1981, many areas of the humanities showed greater than average declines. These included art history (14%), comparative literature (16%), English (18%), philosophy (22%), archaeology (23%), classical languages (27%), Spanish (30%), history (32%), German (34%), and French (47%). Consistent with these figures are the decreasing numbers of students taking the GRE Subject tests in English, Philosophy, French, German, and Spanish.

At the undergraduate level we also see a declining interest in the humanities (National College-Bound Seniors, 1983). Students reg-

istering for the College Board Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) indicate increasing interest in business, computer sciences, and engineering and less interest in most humanities. Between 1975 and 1983 the percentage of all women examinees planning to major in foreign languages dropped from 2.3% to 1.3%. Philosophy, religion, English, and literature showed similar declines for both sexes.

The purpose of the present study is to address the following questions:

1. Has there been a decline in SAT and GRE scores among prospective humanities majors as there has been among students in general?
2. In what ways have prospective humanities majors changed in recent years?
3. Are the changes that are occurring among prospective humanities majors the same for both sexes and all ethnic groups?
4. Are patterns in test scores and background characteristics different for students entering different areas of the humanities?
5. Of those who intend to pursue graduate work in the humanities, what proportion majored in the humanities, and how do their GRE scores compare with those who majored in other fields?
6. Of those who majored in the humanities as undergraduates, what proportion intended to pursue their graduate studies in the humanities, and how did their GRE scores compare with those entering a different graduate field?
7. Do patterns of change in academic characteristics parallel changes observed in other characteristics?

Let us look at each of these questions in somewhat more detail.

1. Has there been a decline in SAT and GRE scores among prospective humanities majors as there has been among students in general?

Since the mid-seventies, when the College Board became aware that average SAT scores had been steadily declining for over a decade, educators as well as other professionals, and indeed, the public at large expressed serious concern over the implications of such a trend. Studies of other national testing programs revealed that not only the SAT, but nearly all standardized tests, were showing score declines. Educators formed special commissions to investigate the declines; researchers conducted numerous studies in an attempt to explain them.

While some of these studies examined changes in background variables over time as well as test scores, none of them compared trends in test scores for students planning to major in different fields. What no one asked explicitly in previous studies were questions like the following: "Are today's philosophy majors as able as the philosophy majors of a decade ago?" Because it addresses a more clearly defined population, this kind of question better reflects educators' concerns than the question "Are today's SAT-takers as able as those of a decade ago?"

The present study focusses on the specific questions of whether the average SAT and GRE scores of potential humanities majors have declined.

2. In what ways have prospective humanities majors changed in recent years?

While SAT and GRE examinees by no means represent all potential humanities professionals, they do provide indicators of trends in humanities education and career interests. Most selective institutions do require the GRE for graduate admissions and either the SAT or ACT (American College Test) for undergraduate applicants. Statistics

obtained on SAT and GRE examinees, therefore, provide a basis for drawing inferences regarding trends in career interests and related variables among the more academically able students at the time they apply to college or graduate school.

The SAT and GRE data bases contain other information about test candidates besides their test scores. When they apply to taken either exam, most students complete a background questionnaire on which they provide information about grade averages, abilities and experiences, degree objective, intended major field, parents' education, sex, race, and English language proficiency. All of these aspects of the student population, if changing, may help to explain changes in test scores.

3. Are the changes that are occurring among prospective humanities majors the same for both sexes and all ethnic groups?

Characteristics of humanities majors, and changes in those characteristics, are likely to differ for various subpopulations. Therefore we explored trends in test scores and background data separately for each sex and each major ethnic group.

4. Are patterns in test scores and background characteristics different for students entering different areas of the humanities?

While interest in the humanities is clearly decreasing, we have not looked previously at the numbers of students planning to enter each major field within the humanities. By breaking down the humanities into its major components, we were able to compare trends in all variables across major fields.

5. Of those who intend to pursue graduate work in the humanities, what proportion majored in the humanities, and how do their GRE scores compare with those who majored in other fields?

The GRE background questionnaire asks for the examinee's under-

graduate major as well as intended major field. By crosstabulating undergraduate and graduate major fields, we could examine whether, over the years, greater or lesser proportions of graduate humanities majors did their undergraduate studies in the humanities. Furthermore, we could compare the GRE scores of those coming from the humanities with those coming from other fields.

6. Of those who majored in the humanities as undergraduates, what proportion intended to pursue their graduate studies in the humanities, and how did their GRE scores compare with those entering a different graduate field?

From the same set of crosstabulations, we could examine the flow of undergraduate humanities majors into intended graduate major fields. We could not know from GRE data alone how many undergraduate humanities majors intended to go to graduate school, but of those who did plan to go and who took the GRE, we could study the proportion who continued in the humanities. In addition, we could compare the GRE scores of those who stayed in the humanities with those who changed to a different field.

7. Do patterns of change in academic characteristics parallel changes observed in other characteristics?

While it is beyond the scope of the present study to attempt to explain patterns in test scores or other variables, discovering such parallels tends to corroborate whatever inferences we might draw concerning those patterns. Suppose we were to find, for example, that SAT verbal scores first declined and then rose, i.e., the trend line was U-shaped. We might infer that true verbal ability followed the same trend. That inference would be greatly strengthened if, in

addition, high school grades and students' estimates of their verbal abilities also followed U-shaped trends.

Most of the questionnaire variables can be viewed as alternative indicators of academic ability. A few may be causally related to academic ability and test performance. Parents' education, for example, probably affects student learning and, therefore, indirectly affects test scores. Again, it is not the purpose of our analyses to determine the causes of test score patterns, though a parallel between parents' education and SAT scores might lead us to hypothesize a possible connection, and this hypothesis could be investigated in future studies.

Method

The analyses consist of simple descriptive statistics, namely, frequencies, percentages, and means for each year's data. Tests of statistical significance were not used for two reasons. First, the statistics in this study describe populations of examinees--not samples--and therefore it may be argued that the use of sampling statistics is inappropriate. All differences, however small, are significant in the sense that they describe true population differences. A significance test would answer the question of whether English majors and history majors are random samples of the same population. We already know they are not because they are self-selecting.

Second, even if we were analyzing samples, we would find comparisons between humanities majors and others to be significant in nearly all instances because the "sample" sizes are quite large.

In the present study, because of its descriptive nature, no attempt is made to explain any apparent trends or other patterns in the data. For this reason we have not reported any correlations or regressions. We expect, however, that this study will generate hypotheses that might explain our observations. Future studies can then be aimed at testing those hypotheses, using appropriate statistical models.



Analysis of Scholastic Aptitude Test Data

Each year approximately one million high school students take the SAT, and about 90% of them respond to the Student Descriptive Questionnaire (SDQ) which accompanies the application form. This number represents about one-third of all high school seniors and about two-thirds of all graduates who go directly to college. Consequently, the data analyzed in this study cannot be generalized to all high school graduates or to all entering college freshmen. Nevertheless, it does represent a large portion of students who will be attending college and who vary over a wide range of abilities.

The purpose of this study is to compare prospective humanities majors with students planning to major in other areas, as well as to examine trends in the academic and background characteristics of those intending to enter the humanities. Many of the students in the SAT population change their major field of interest after high school. The results of the analyses of SAT data, therefore, must be viewed with this in mind. Despite the fact that many students' interests change after they have begun college, the interests they express when they complete the SDQ as high school seniors give some indication of the tentative goals and values of students as they make preparation for college.

We have selected 23 items from the SDQ to analyze along with the SAT Verbal (SATV) and SAT Mathematics (SATM) scores. As we discuss the statistics for each item, we will present the item verbatim and indicate its response rate.

Major Field Definitions

One item on the SDQ requests that the applicant refer to a list and "choose the field that would be your first choice for your college curriculum." Only those students specifying a major field were included in this study. The fields included in the humanities and related social sciences were defined as follows by the National Endowment for the Humanities:

I. Humanities

Art history (including museum work)
English and literature (including creative writing,
English, literature, and speech)
Ethnic studies (including American Indian studies, Black
studies, Mexican-American studies, and Spanish-
American studies)
Foreign languages (including classical languages, eastern
languages, French, German, Italian, Russian, Spanish,
interpreting/translating, and linguistics)
History and cultures (including American, Ancient, area-
regional, and European history)
Philosophy and religion

II. Humanities-related social sciences (including anthropology, government service/politics, international relations, political science, and sociology)

These were the categories used for analysis. For the smaller subpopulations, the humanities were not broken down into the six areas, but were analyzed in total.

Population Studied

For all analyses we included all high school seniors who took the SAT during the academic year 1974/75 and from 1976/77 through 1982/83. Data for 1975/76 were not complete and could not be used in this study. From this population we eliminated students who omitted any of the following information:

1. Intended major field;
2. One or both SAT scores;
3. Sex or ethnic identity.

The primary reason for excluding students who omitted sex or ethnic identity was that we explicitly intended to study a "known" population -- one whose basic characteristics could be identified; statistics already existed for test takers at large. We would not have any basis for explaining score trends or score differences if we knew nothing about the population we were studying. Thus a basic rationale for this study was to focus on a definable population of examinees, to examine their score trends, and then to look at other characteristics of those examinees to see if changes in those characteristics might help to explain the observed score changes.

The statistics we obtained in this study compared very closely with the published statistics, where a comparison was possible. Typically, students in the population we studied had slightly higher grades and test scores than those in the College Board publications. We can infer, therefore, that the students who did not specify a major field, or who chose not to complete the SDQ at all, had lower grades and tests scores, on the average, than those who did supply that information. In the published reports, the mean SATV and SATM scores for 1983 were 425 and 468 respectively (National College-Bound

Seniors, 1983). In our study, the corresponding averages were 429 and 473.

Of all students who took the SAT, approximately 14% did not specify their intended major field and had to be eliminated. An additional 5% omitted sex and/or ethnicity and were eliminated for that reason. When we refer to "all examinees" or to the SAT "population" in this study, we are referring to the population just defined.

For comparison purposes, we conducted the same analyses for nine subpopulations: (1) all examinees, (2) males, (3) females, (4) Whites, (5) Blacks, (6) Mexican-Americans, (7) Puerto Ricans, (8) Orientals, (9) American Indians.

Variables Analyzed

The variables analyzed consisted of the numbers and percentages of students planning to major in each field, SAT scores, degree objectives, self-reported grades in English, mathematics, social studies, and foreign languages, years of studying those subjects, high school program, honors and awards, self estimates of abilities, numbers wanting help in the improvement of various skills, the percent requesting financial aid, the percent planning to study part time, and parents' education.

Results of the SAT Analysis

Tables showing trends in SAT data are included under separate cover in Supplement I entitled **Tables of Trends in Data from the College Board Scholastic Aptitude Test: Humanities Majors, 1975 - 1983**. It is not possible, in the space of this report, to discuss all aspects of all tables. Generally we will present the major findings together with some of their implications as well as the questions they raise. We refer the reader who is interested in more detailed analysis to the appropriate set of tables in Supplement I.

Numbers Entering the Humanities (Tables 2a-2i, 3a-3h, and 4)

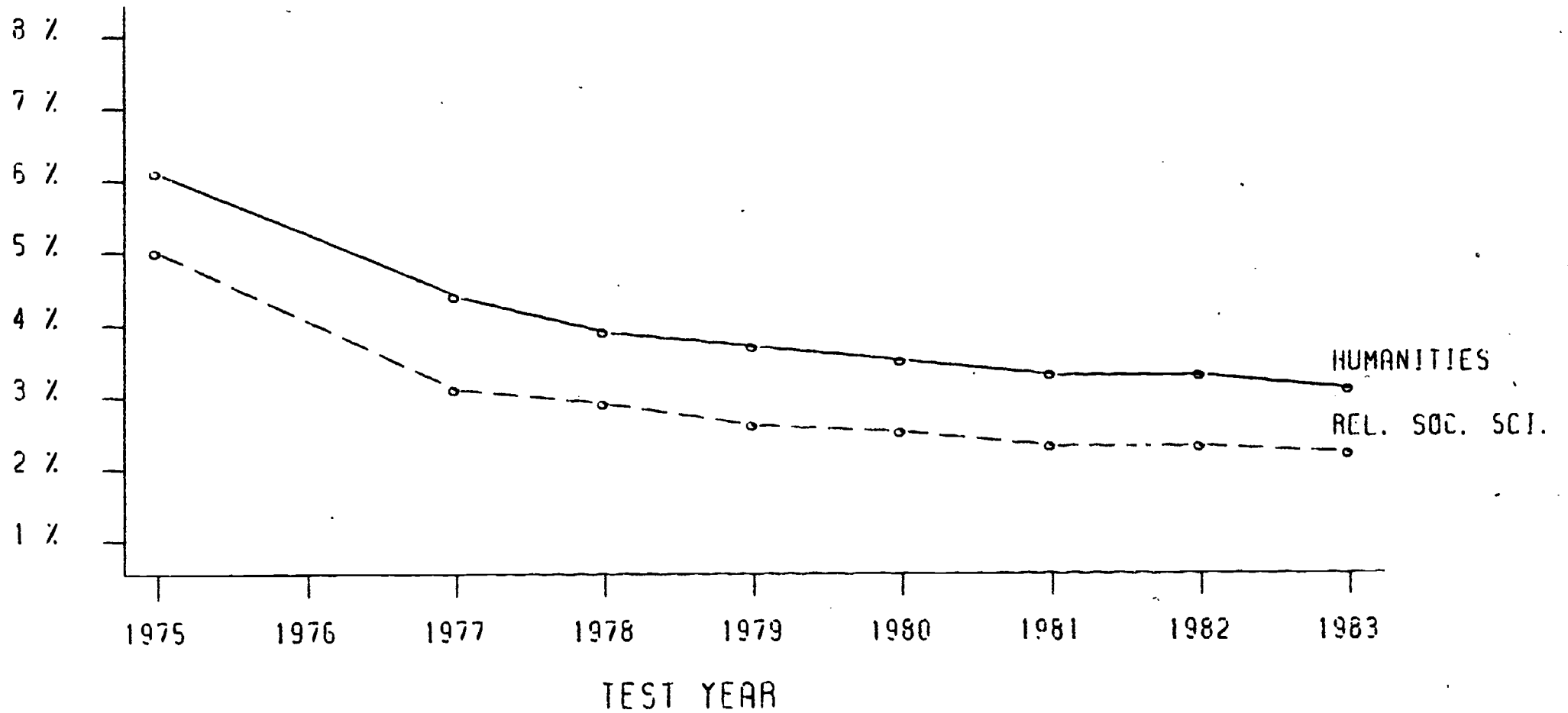
The total number of students taking the SAT and specifying a major rose 14% between 1975 and 1983. Over this same eight-year period, the number planning to major in the humanities decreased 42%. Among those entering the humanities-related social sciences, the decline was 50%.

In 1975, 6.1% of all students taking the SAT planned to major in the humanities; by 1983, that figure was only 3.1%. (See Figure 1) The decline occurred for both sexes, with a consistently greater proportion of women than men planning to major in humanities.

Consistently over the eight-year period studied, women planning to enter the humanities outnumbered men two to one. greater proportion of prospective humanities majors women, but a greater proportion of women planned to enter the humanities. While the proportion of potential humanities majors that were women remained about constant (Figure 2), there was a steady decline in the numbers of both sexes planning to enter humanities. In 1975, 4.3% of the men and 7.8% of

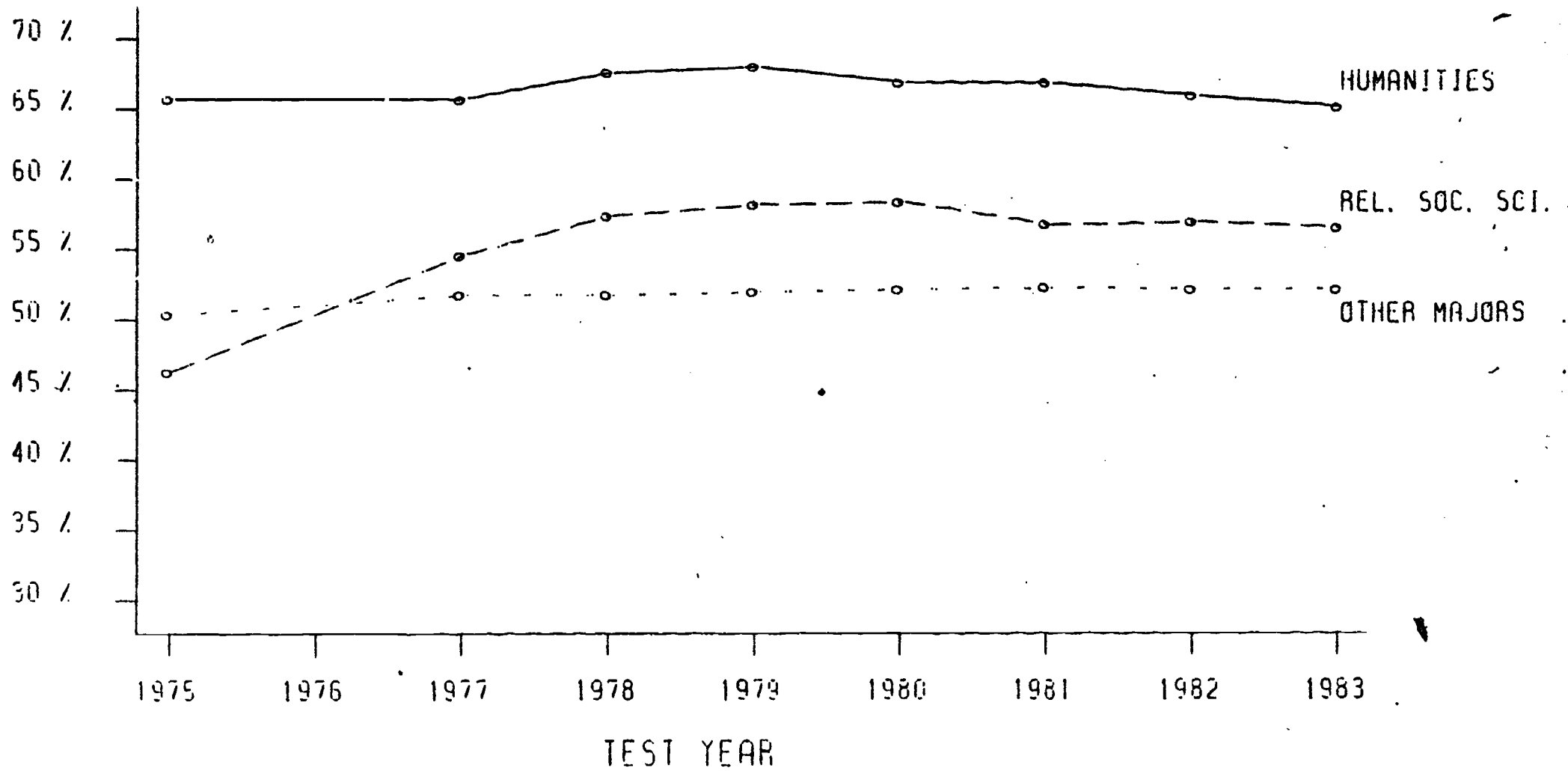
PERCENT OF SAT EXAMINEES IN HUMANITIES AND RELATED SOCIAL SCIENCES

the women chose a humanities major. By 1983, the numbers had dropped to 2.3% of the men and 3.8% of the women. (See Figures 3 and 4.)

The related social sciences also showed a decline for both sexes. For all students combined, 5.0% planned to enter the related social sciences in 1975. By 1983, the number had dropped to 2.2%. The difference between the sexes was not so great as in the humanities. Also, the decline among women was not so great as the decline among men. In 1975, 5.5% of the men and 4.5% of the women planned to major in a related social science. By 1983, the figures had dropped to 2.0% of the men and 2.4% of the women.

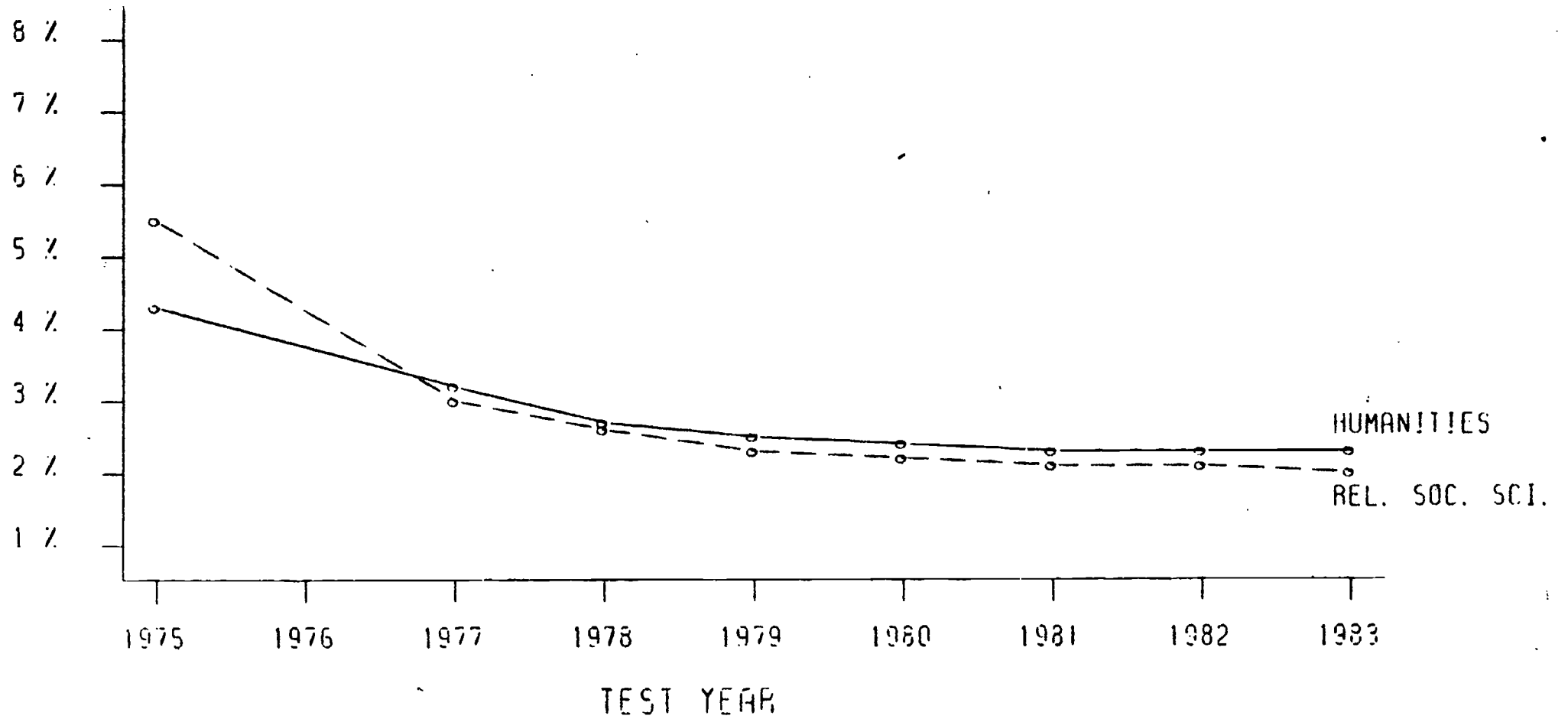
In both major field areas, the declines were monotonic*. Within some specific humanities areas, however, the numbers first increased and then decreased to their lowest point in 1983. The number of students planning to study art history nearly doubled between 1975 and 1978 and then dropped rapidly. The numbers planning to major in philosophy and religion more than doubled between 1975 and 1977 then decreased gradually thereafter. Comparing 1975 and 1983, we find the following percentage changes in numbers of students planning to major in each humanities field. A negative sign indicates a decline.

Major Field	Change in Numbers of Students
Philosophy/Religion	+36%
Art history	+19%
Foreign languages	-36%
English/Literature	-39%
History/Culture	-60%
Ethnic studies	-81%

*A monotonic curve is one which does not change direction. If numbers decreased monotonically over a seven-year period, this means that they decreased every year. If they increased monotonically, then they rose every year without exception.

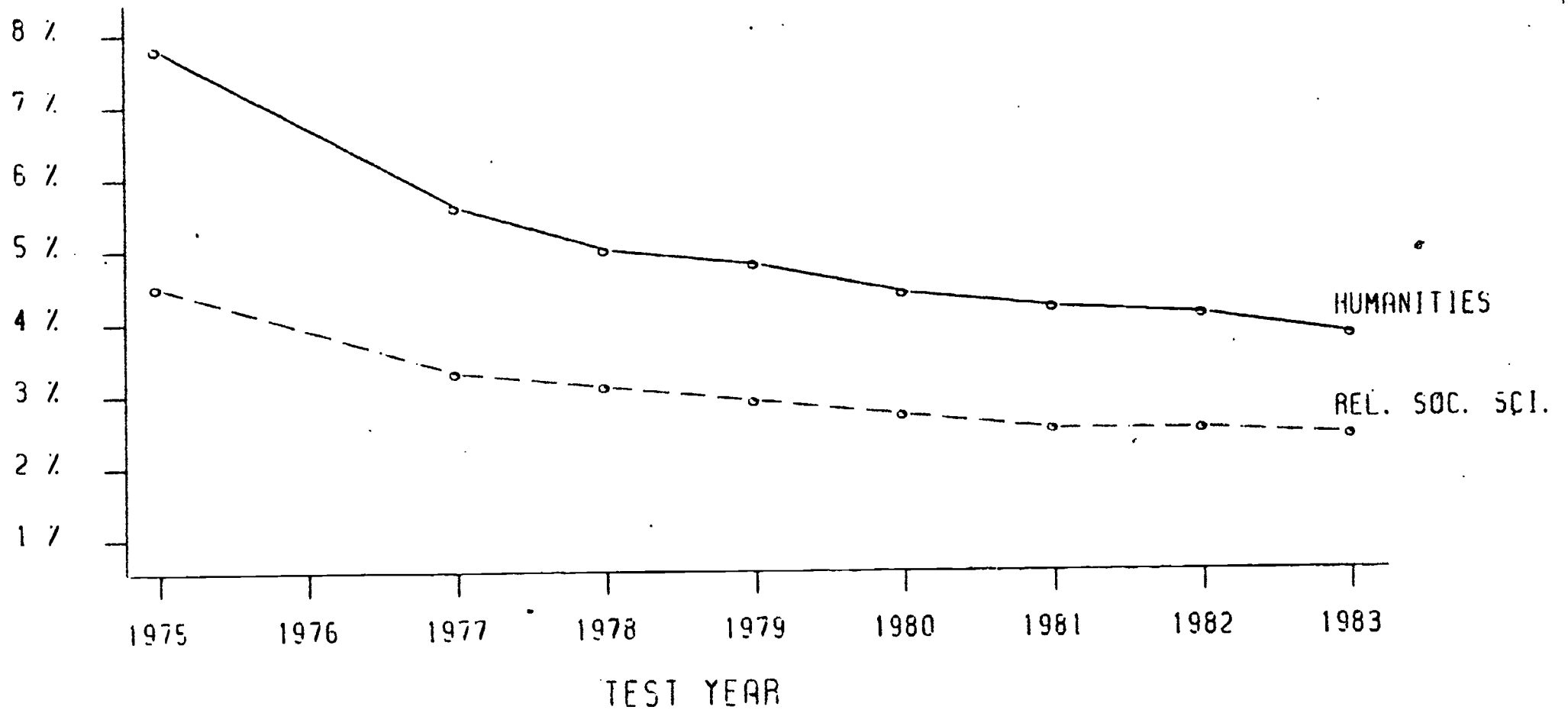
PERCENT OF MALE SAT EXAMINEES IN HUMANITIES AND RELATED SOCIAL SCIENCES

Although the total number of students taking the SAT was higher in 1983 than in 1975, the number actually increased until 1979 and decreased thereafter. This was true for both sexes. Among those planning to major in humanities and related social sciences, overall, there was a steady decline from 1975 onward. In the humanities, the rate of decline was the same for both sexes, but in the related social sciences, males declined more than females. The number of women planning to major in a related social science decreased 39%, while the number of men decreased 59%. In art history, and in philosophy and religion, the numbers first rose then declined for both sexes. The fields showing the greatest percentage declines for both sexes were ethnic studies and history and culture.

Comparing different ethnic groups, we found that only Orientals showed an increase in numbers planning to enter the humanities. Considering that the number of Oriental students taking the SAT increased 134%, the increase in prospective humanities majors of 24% was quite small. In the related social sciences, Blacks and Mexican-Americans first rose in number and then decreased. Puerto Ricans and American Indians showed no particular trend.

Proportion of Prospective Humanities Majors Planning to Enter Each Field (Table 5)

Nearly half of all prospective humanities majors intended to major in English or literature, and this proportion changed very little over the eight- year period studied. In 1975 it was 44% (38% among men and 47% among women). By 1983, the number had risen to 47% (43% for men and 49% for women). In 1975, another fourth of all humanities majors planned to study foreign languages, and the last fourth planned to major in history and cultures. Less than 5% planned to major in the other three fields. The number entering art history was less than 1% and rose to just 1.5% in 1983.

The proportion of all humanities majors planning to major in philosophy or religion rose steeply from 2.5% in 1975 to 8.2% two years later, then decreased very gradually to 5.9% in 1983. This same pattern occurred for both sexes, though after 1975, a far greater proportion of prospective philosophy and religion majors were men.

There were other large differences between men and women in the relative proportions planning to enter different majors within the humanities. In 1983, nearly one-third of all men planning to enter the humanities planned to major in history and cultures; only one-tenth of the women did. On the other hand, more than one-third of the women planned to major in foreign languages, while only 14% of the men were attracted to foreign languages.

From these analyses it is evident that the numbers of students planning to enter specific fields within the humanities are decreasing at different rates. Furthermore, the relative numbers of men and women composing the potential pool of humanities majors are changing, and they are changing differently for each field within the humani-

ties.

SAT Verbal Scores (Tables 6a-6i)

For all majors combined, mean SATV scores declined from 439 to 429 between 1975 and 1983. For prospective humanities majors, they increased from 480 to 497 over that same period. Averages for students planning to enter the related social sciences increased from 476 to 487. (See Figure 5.)

The areas showing the greatest rise in SATV scores were the same areas that showed the greatest decline in numbers, namely, English and literature, and history and cultures. Their average scores rose 23 and 30 points respectively. The greatest decline was among students planning to major in philosophy and religion, which dropped from 527 to 480, a total of 47 points.

The number of points the mean scores changed between 1975 and 1983 for each field within the humanities is summarized below:

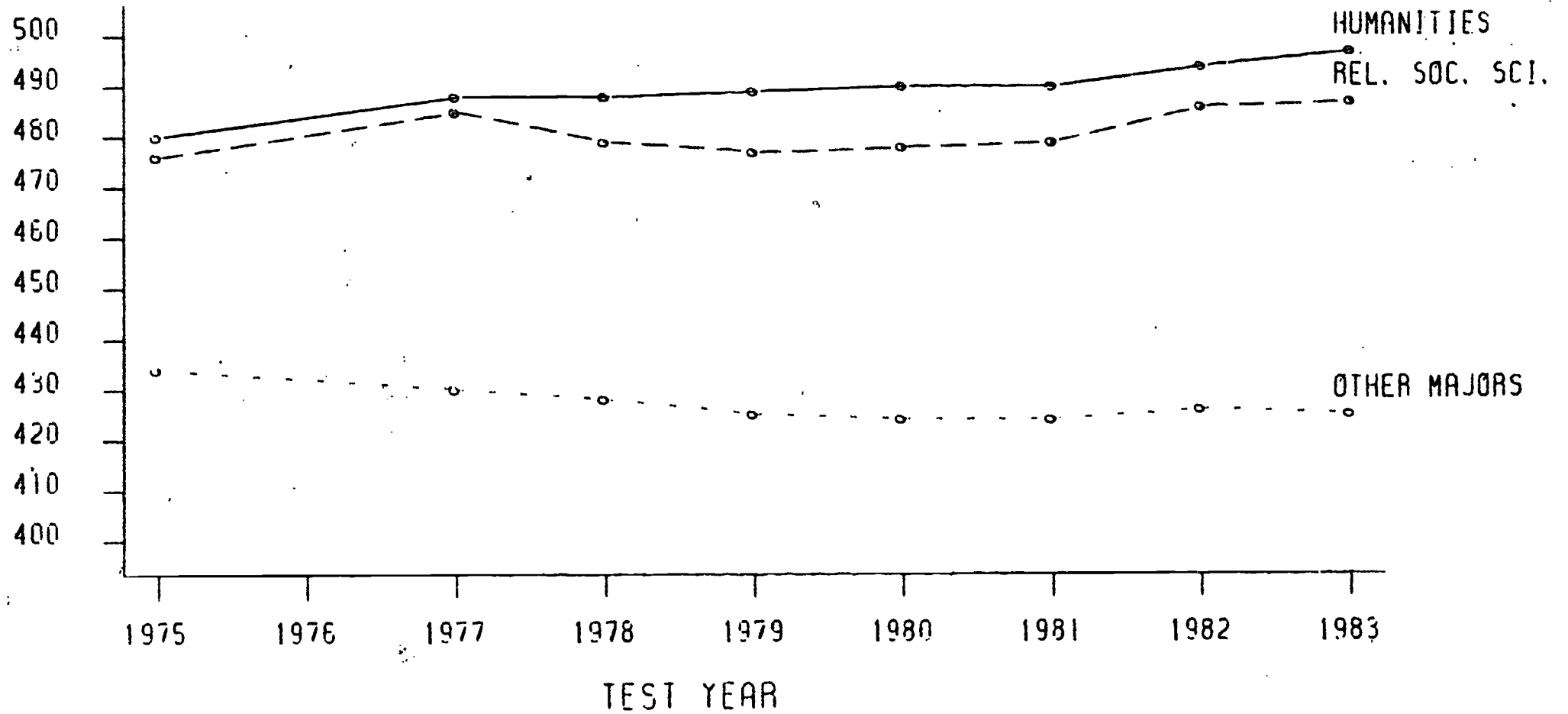

From the data at hand, we have no indication as to why scores in philosophy and religion should have dropped so severely. Part of the reason may be that we could not separate philosophy from religion. There may have been considerable differences between the scores of these two groups, and one might have risen in numbers while the other declined.

A comparison of males and females planning to enter the humanities showed that on the average, men's scores increased 24 points

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while women's scores increased 14 points (Figures 6 and 7). In 1983, the mean SATV score for men planning to major in the humanities was only 2 points higher than the average for women. Overall, men scored an average of 13 points higher than women. In 1975, women planning to study humanities scored 8 points higher than the men. Among those planning to major in art history, ethnic studies, and history and cultures, women consistently scored higher than men.

An analysis of the ethnic subpopulations revealed that for every minority group, students entering the humanities or a related social science scored consistently higher than the average for all students. Black humanities majors showed a mean score increase of 33 points over the eight-year period studied. In the related social sciences, their scores rose 10 points.

The scores of Mexican-Americans planning to study humanities increased 23 points; those entering the related social sciences increased 19 points. The average scores of Puerto Ricans entering the humanities increased 22 points, but the scores of students interested in the related social sciences declined 12 points. Whether these score differences indicate a trend is doubtful however because the averages from year to year showed no particular pattern. Score averages for Orientals and American Indians were also erratic and did not suggest a trend.

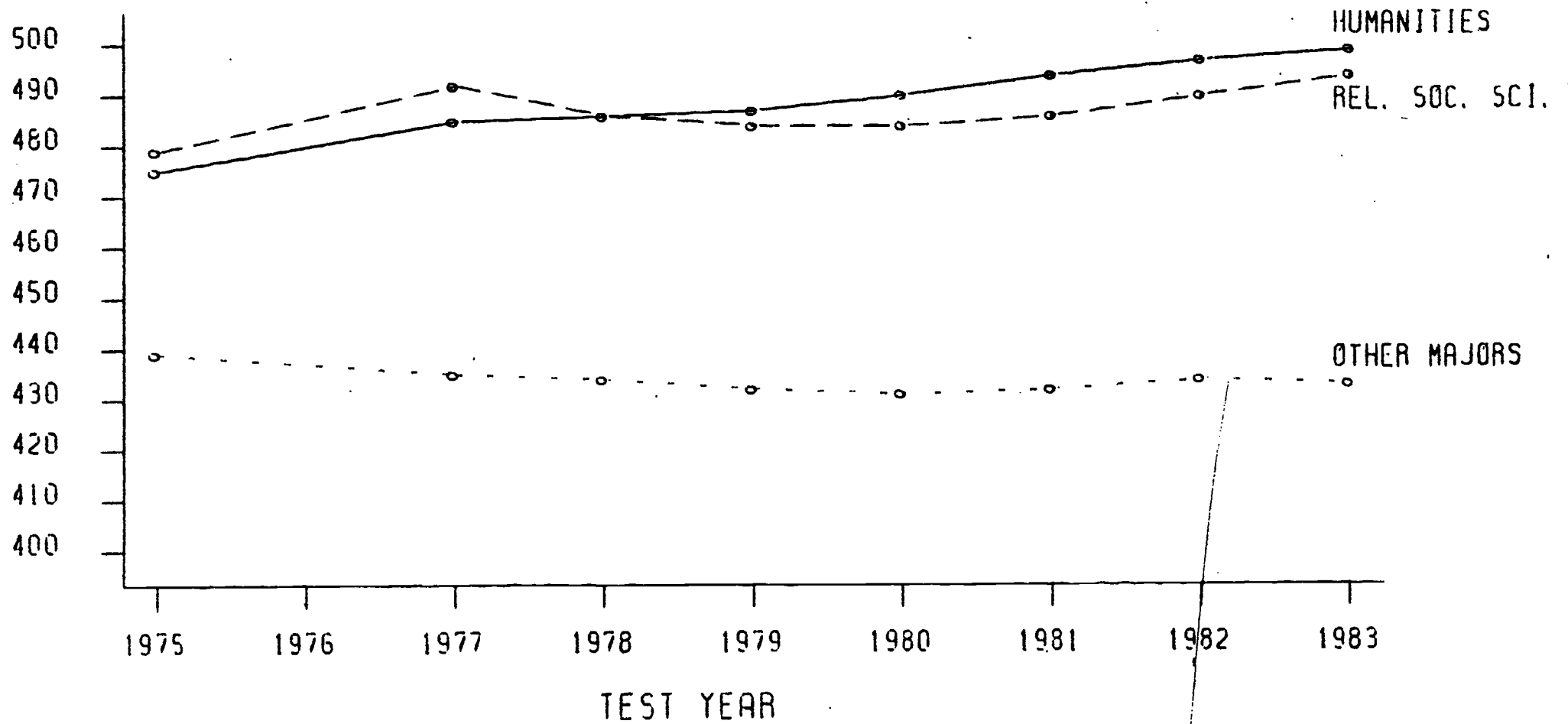
SAT Mathematics Scores (Tables 7a-7i)

For every year, beginning in 1977, students planning to enter the humanities obtained higher than average SAT Mathematics scores.

Generally students entering the related social sciences scored from 10 to 20 points higher on the SATM than those planning to enter the humanities, but both scored above the national average. Those

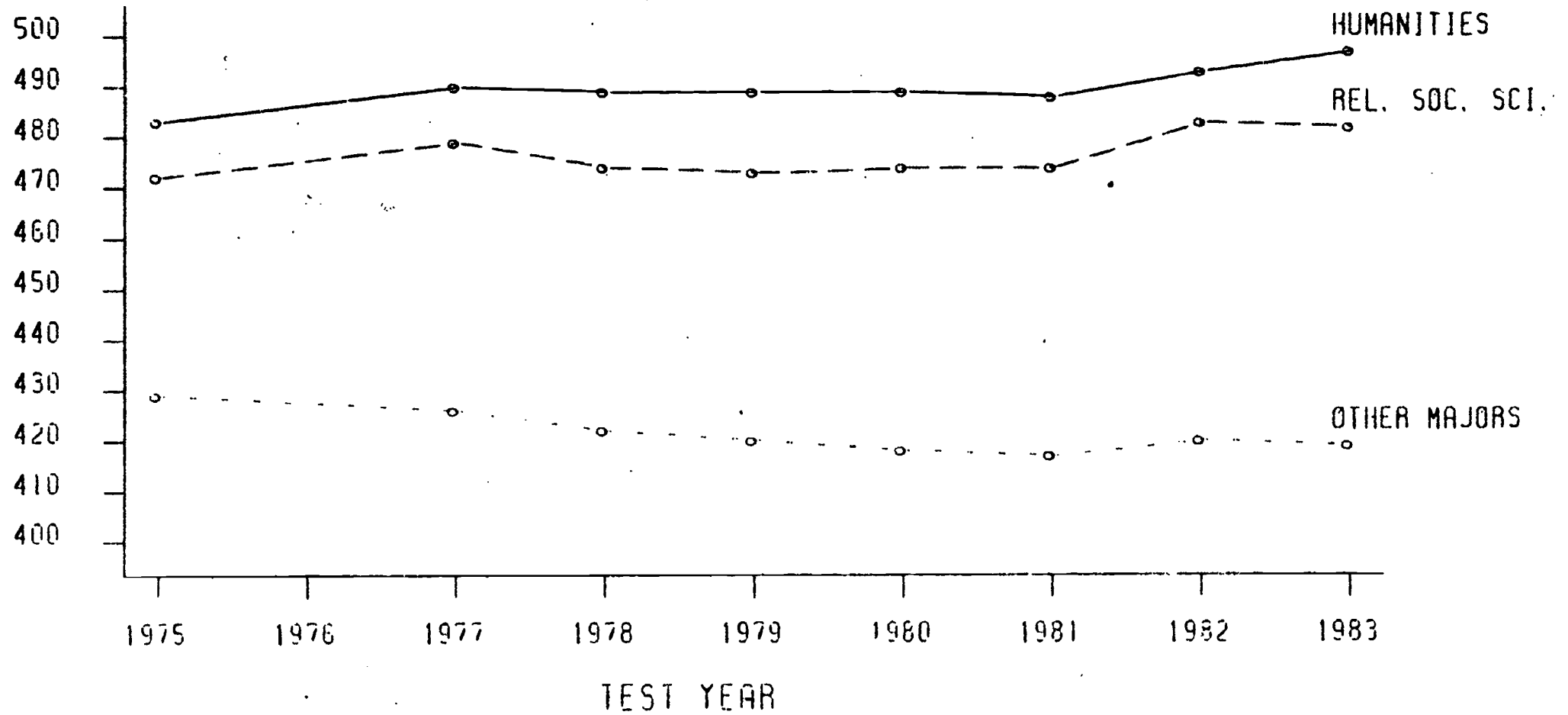

planning to study philosophy and religion obtained the highest scores within the humanities. Those interested in ethnic studies averaged the lowest.

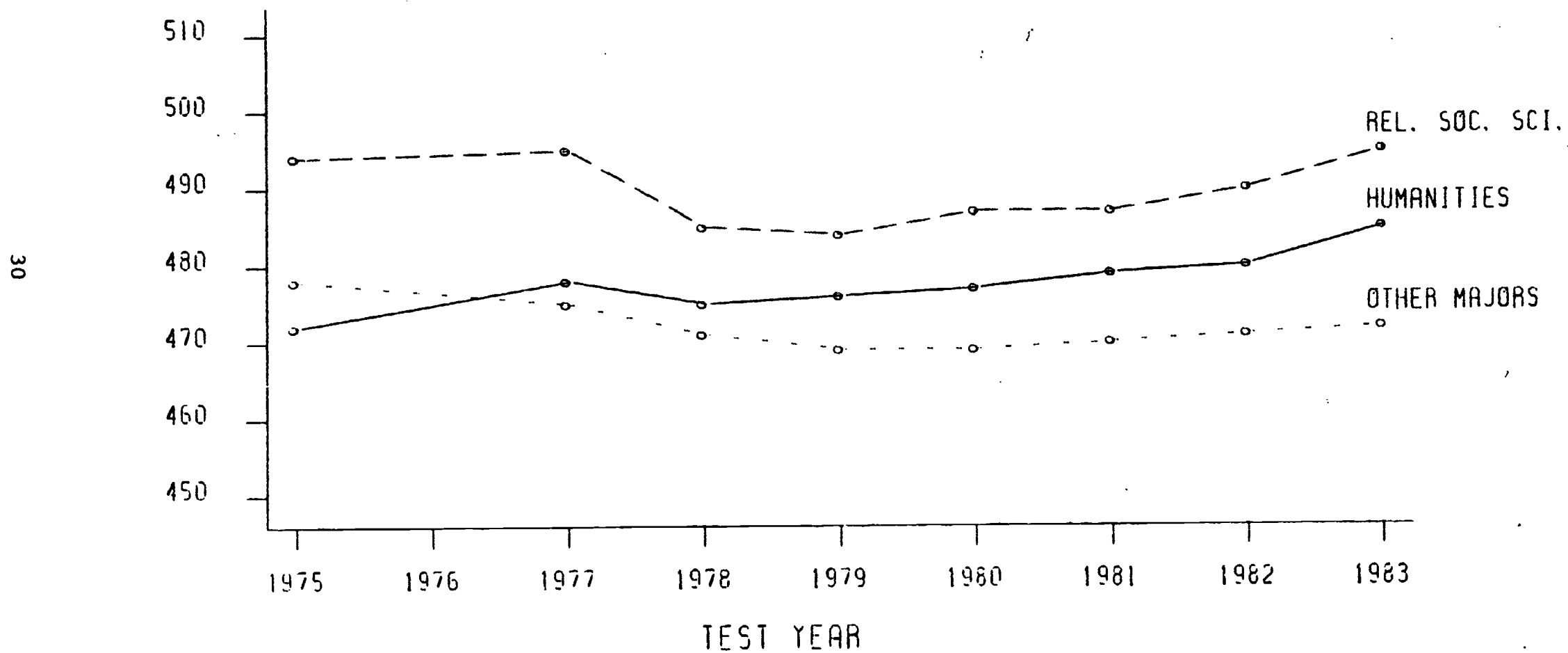
Trends for students overall showed SATM scores to decline between 1975 and 1979, where they remained constant for three years (Figure 8). Scores then rose over the next two years, but in 1983 were still 5 points lower than their 1975 average. The SATM scores of prospective humanities majors, on the other hand, rose fairly smoothly during that entire eight-year period, with only a slight dip in 1978. Among those planning to enter the related social sciences, scores declined from 494 to 484 and then rose to 495. This U-shaped pattern may suggest a recent upward trend among students in many fields.

For students overall, we found a difference of over 50 points, on the average, between the SATM scores of males and females (Figures 9 and 10). For prospective humanities majors, the difference between the sexes was only half that much. In 1983, men entering the humanities scored 24 points higher than women. Among those entering the related social sciences, the average SATM score for men was 20 points higher than the average for women. Both sexes showed overall increases in mean SATM scores between 1975 and 1983, and these increases were among students entering both the humanities and the related social sciences.

All of the ethnic subpopulations planning to enter the humanities showed increases in their SATM scores between 1975 and 1983. Among those planning to major in a related social science, all groups had U-shaped trends in their scores. The scores of Whites, Blacks, and Mexican-Americans increased by 1983 to an average higher than their 1975 score averages.

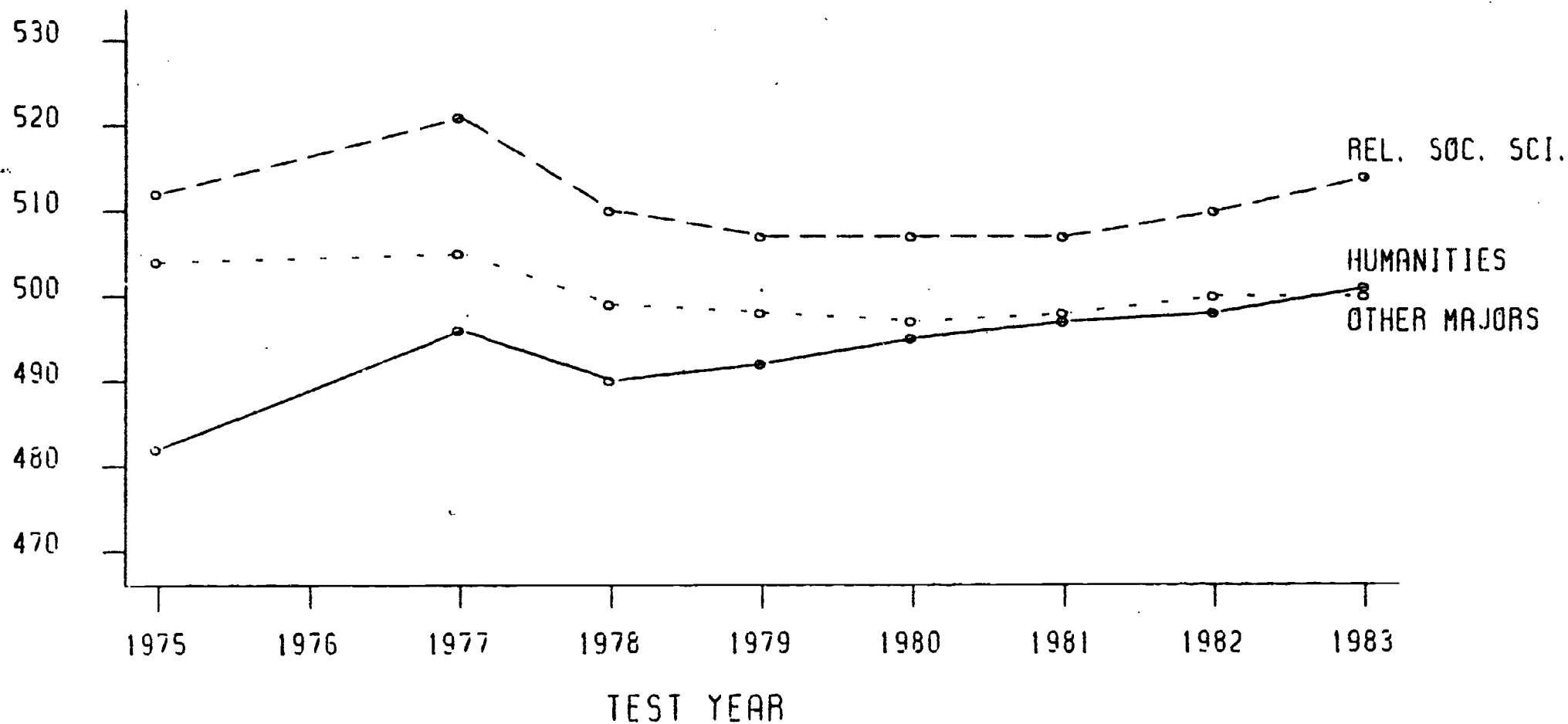
MEAN SAT MATHEMATICS SCORES ALL STUDENTS

MEAN SAT MATHEMATICS SCORES MALES ONLY

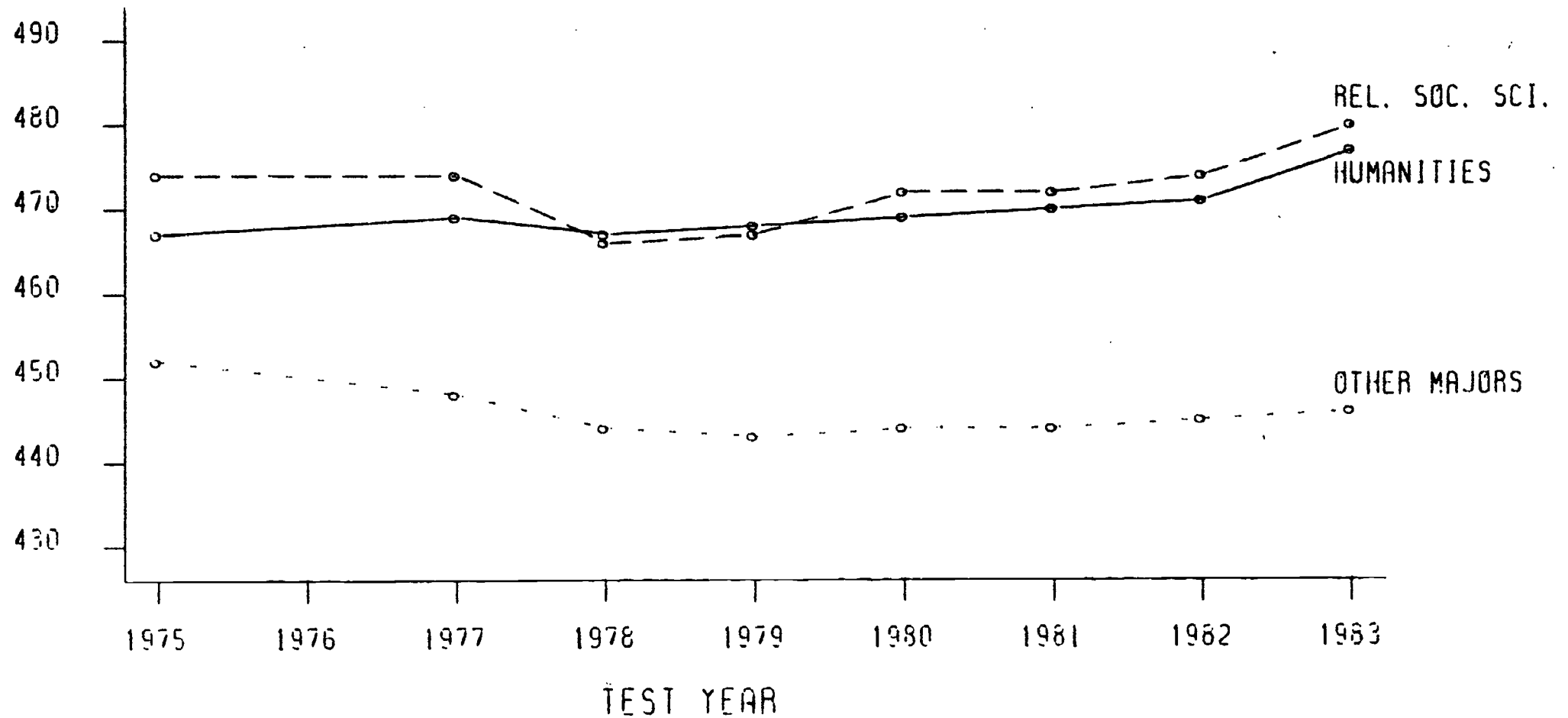

Eventual Degree Objective (Tables 8a-8i)

What is the highest level of education you plan to complete beyond high school?

- (A) A two-year specialized training program (for example, electronics or laboratory technician)
- (B) A two-year Associate of Arts degree (A.A.)
- (C) Bachelor's degree (B.A. or B.S.)
- (D) Master's degree (M.A. or M.S.)
- (E) Doctor's or other professional degree (such as M.D. or Ph.D.)
- (F) Other or undecided

The percentage of students eventually planning to obtain at least a master's degree was higher than average for those planning to major in the humanities or a related social science, and the percentage increased over the period studied.

Typically, about 18% of all students indicated that they were undecided about the degree they would seek. Our analysis was based on the remaining students -- those who specified a degree goal. Of those students, the percentage aiming for a master's degree or more increased overall and in each of the broad major fields. Among those planning to major in the humanities, the number rose from 55.7% to 61.9%. Among those entering the related social sciences, it increased from 68.2% to 74.1%. These figures were higher than the average over all other majors, which increased from 52.3% to 53.5% over the same period.

Within the humanities, not all fields showed increasing percentages of students aiming for a higher degree. Art history showed a decline from 54.6% to 51.2%. Philosophy and religion showed an even greater decline from 80.5% to 66.9%. These are the same two areas that showed increases in numbers of students.

Comparing males and females, we found that only slightly more

males than females intended to get a master's degree or more education, and the rise was greater for women than for men. Among prospective humanities majors, the number of men aiming for at least a master's degree increased from 60.9% in 1975 to 64.4% in 1983. Women rose from 53.1% to 60.5%. In the related social sciences, there was a greater difference between men and women in 1975 -- 73.6% for men compared to 61.9% for women. By 1983 there was very little difference -- 75.1% of the men and 73.3% of the women planned to achieve at least a master's degree.

Among the various ethnic groups, we found that Blacks had consistently higher degree goals than Whites, though no apparent increase over the eight-year period. This was true regardless of major field of interest. The aspirations of Orientals and American Indians appeared to rise, with Orientals having the greatest percentage of students aspiring to at least a master's degree.

High School Course Grades

For each of the subject areas in questions 12 through 17, blacken the latest year-end or midyear grade you received since beginning the ninth grade. For example, if you are a senior and have not taken biology or any other biological science since your sophomore year, indicate that year-end grade. If you are a junior and have completed the first half of the year in an English course, indicate that midyear grade. If you received the grade in an advanced, accelerated, or honors course, also blacken the letter H.

Response alternatives were specified as follows:

- (A) Excellent (usually 90-100 or A)
- (B) Good (usually 80-89 or B)
- (C) Fair (usually 70-79 or C)
- (D) Passing (usually 60-69 or D)
- (F) Failing (usually 59 or below or F)
- (G) Only "pass-fail" grades were assigned and I received a pass.
- (H) The grade reported was in an advanced, accelerated or honors course.

For this study, we analyzed self-reported grades in English, mathematics, foreign languages, and social studies. To score the responses, we ignored response H because there is no way to scale a grade in an advanced course along with regular courses. Also, we eliminated those who answered G because it too would be difficult to scale and because very few students take pass/fail courses in high school. The remaining alternatives we scored in the conventional way, namely, A=4, B=3, etc. On the average, over 98% of the examinees provided usable responses. In foreign languages, the percentage was lower because fewer students study foreign languages.

A. English Grades (Tables 9a-9i)

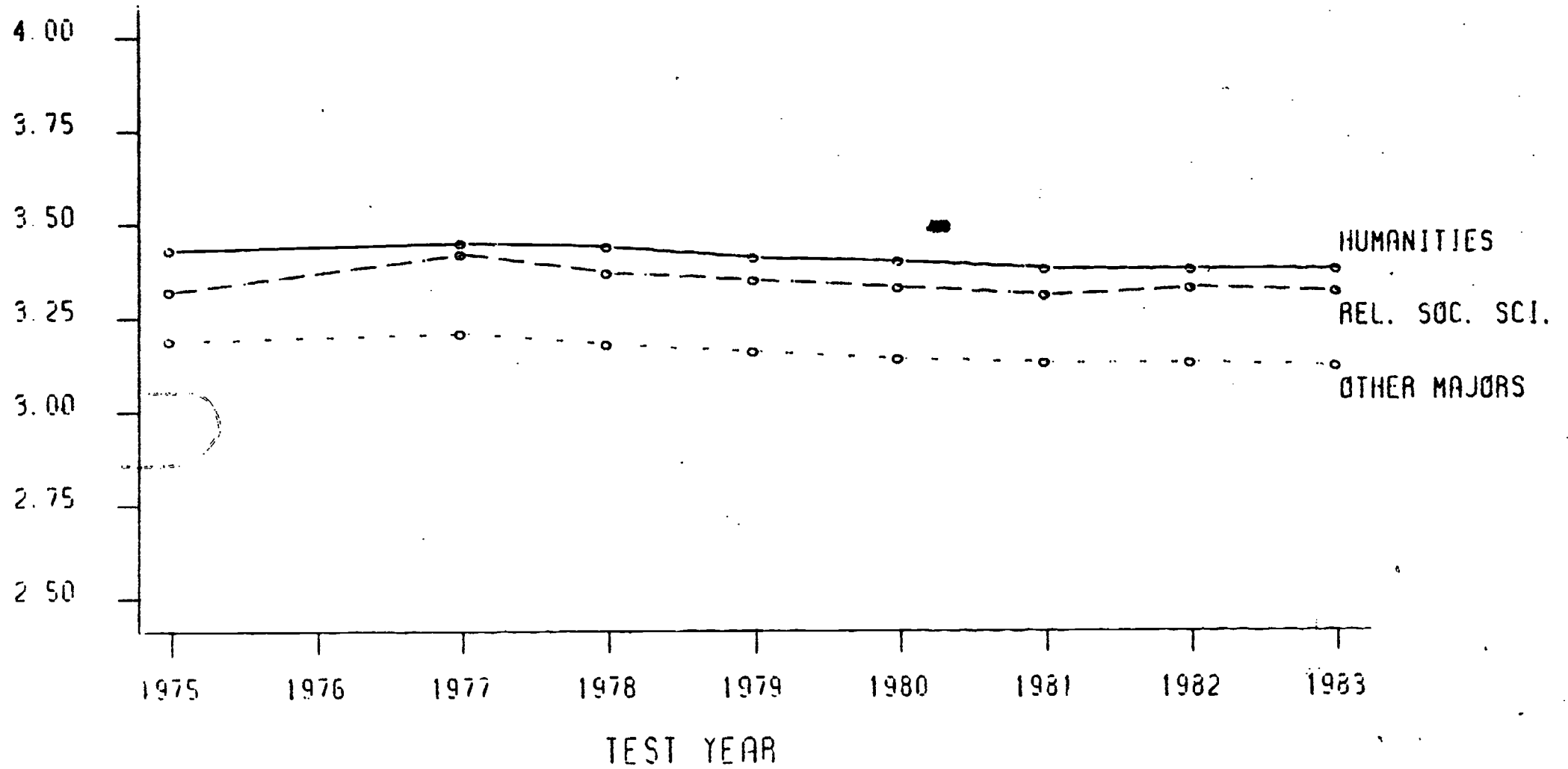
Grades in English showed a decline for prospective humanities majors and for students overall (Figure 11). Those planning to major in the humanities reported grades about 0.25 points higher, on the average, than did students entering all majors. Those entering related social sciences reported grades just slightly lower than those entering humanities, and their averages showed no overall change.

In 1983, the highest self-reported English grades were among prospective English and literature majors; the lowest were among students planning to major in ethnic studies.

Comparing grade averages of males and females, we found that for all major field areas included in the study, females reported grades about 0.2 points higher than did males. Women planning to major in the humanities showed an overall decline in English grades between 1975 and 1983, whereas men showed no change. Among those planning to enter the related social sciences, women showed a slight overall decline where, again, men showed no change.

For both sexes and for all ethnic groups, students planning to enter the humanities and related social sciences reported consistently higher average English grades than students did overall.

B. Mathematics grades (Tables 10a-10i)

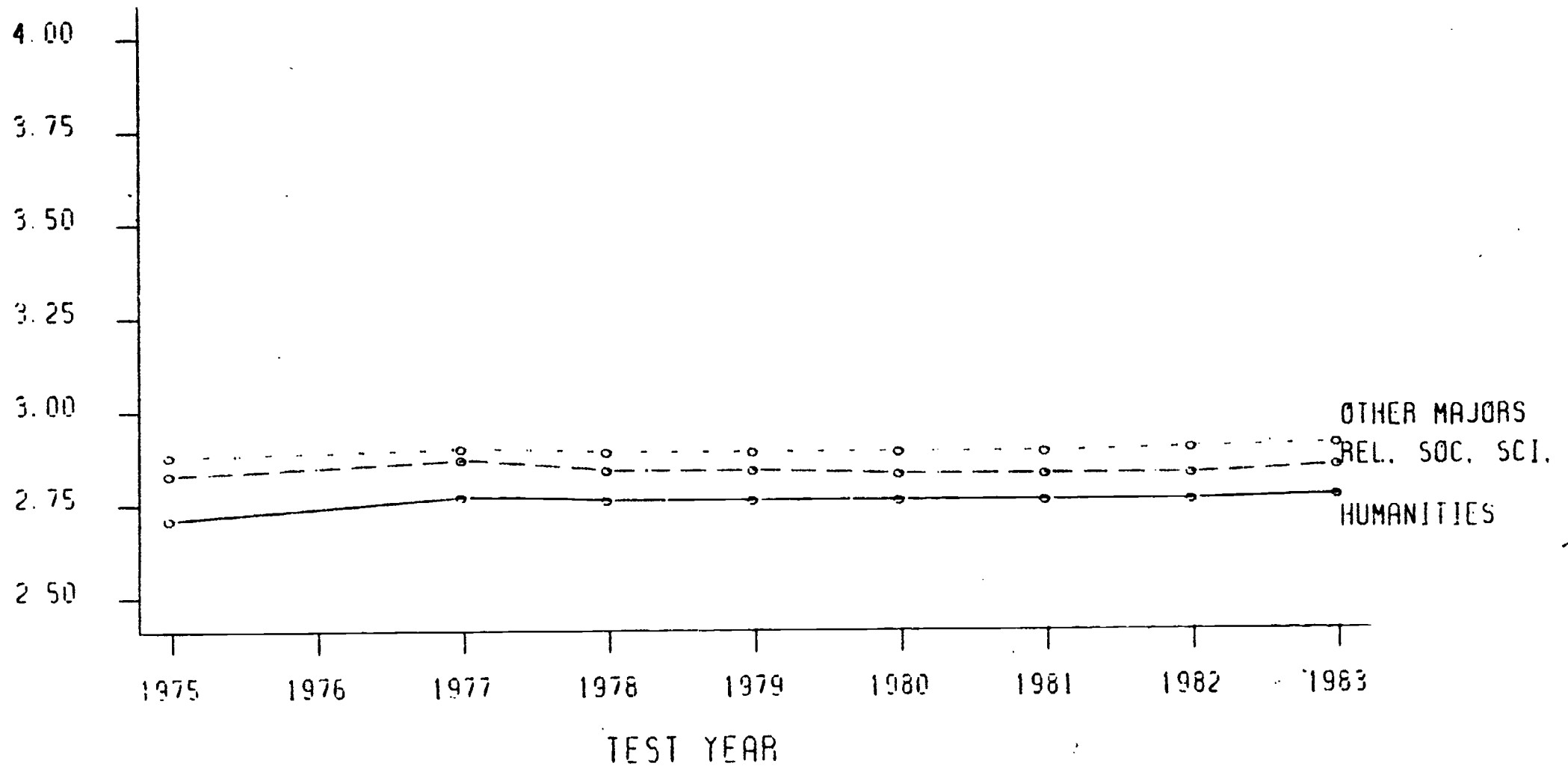
Grades in mathematics were lower, on the average, for students entering the humanities and related social sciences than they were for students in the general population. (See Figure 12.) This is surprising considering that their SATM scores were higher than those of other students. Between 1975 and 1983 average mathematics grades rose very slightly on the whole for prospective humanities majors. The actual increase occurred between 1975 and 1977; after 1977 it remained about constant. For those entering the related social sciences it fluctuated with no apparent trend.

Comparing mathematics grades of males and females, we found that among students planning to major in the humanities and related social sciences, women reported higher grades than men. Both sexes showed an increase among prospective humanities majors over the eight-year period studied. Among those entering the related social sciences, women showed a very small overall increase, while men showed essentially no change.

All of the various ethnic minorities planning to enter the humanities showed an increase in their average mathematics grades over the eight-year period, though they did not follow a smooth pattern. It is unclear whether they indicate a trend, except possibly for Oriental students who showed a more gradual rise. In the related social sciences, there was possibly an upward trend among Puerto Rican students, but generally the grades followed no particular pattern.

C. Social studies grades (Tables 11a-11i)

Students planning to enter humanities-related social sciences had higher average grades in social studies than students entering other fields. Prospective humanities majors were second highest, although students entering history and cultures had higher averages than those entering related social sciences. Clearly, the social studies grades these students reported included history. It is simply because of our classification scheme that they were included in humanities.

The average grade in social studies for prospective humanities majors showed a slight decline. The greatest grade decline was among students planning to major in philosophy or religion. Among those entering the related social sciences, the average social studies grade increased between 1975 and 1977 then declined slowly through 1983.

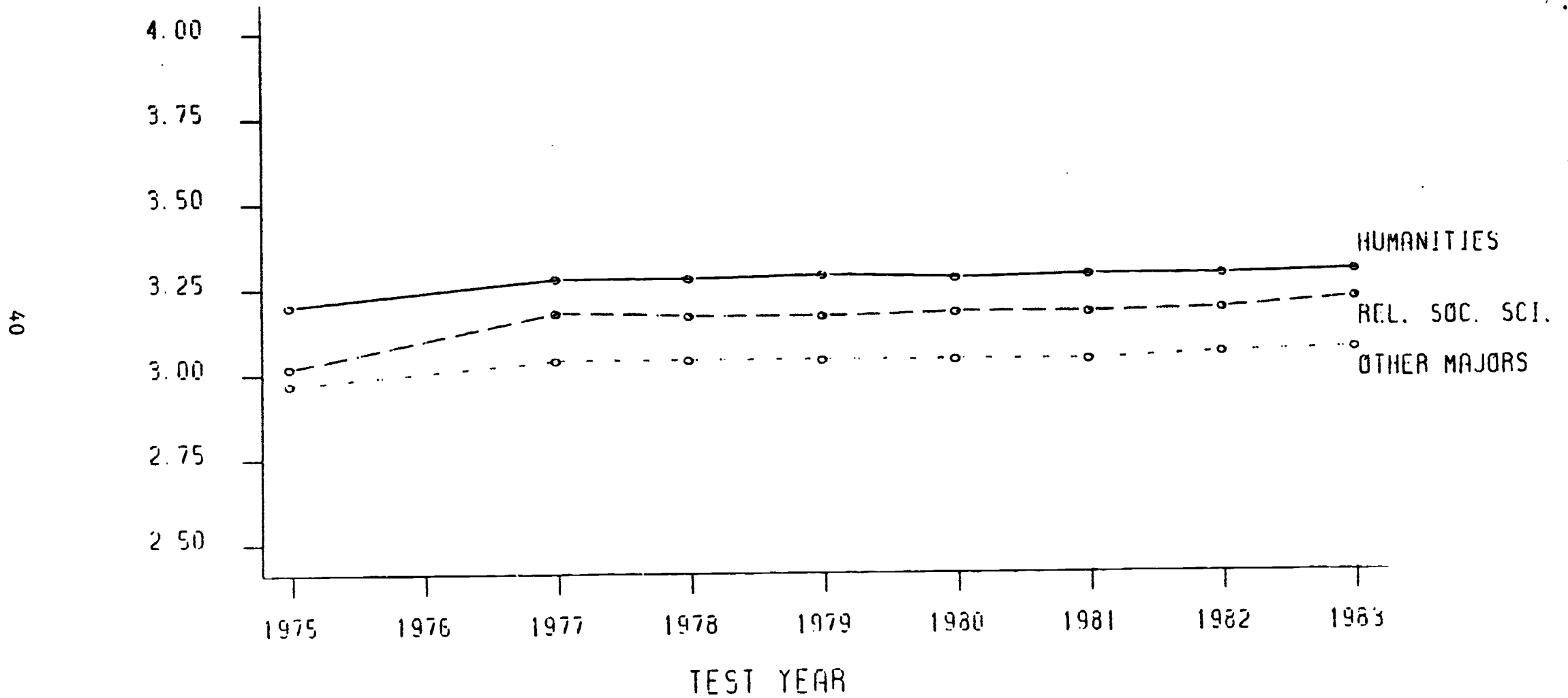
There were virtually no differences between the sexes in average social studies grade averages. Among the minority groups planning to enter the humanities, the grades of Blacks declined as did the grades of Whites, but other ethnic groups did not show a clear trend. Likewise among those entering the related social sciences, there were no apparent trends for any minority group. All analysis subgroups did have higher grade averages among those planning to enter the related social sciences than among those planning to major in humanities or other fields.

D. Grades in foreign languages (Tables 12a-12i)

Students' grades in foreign languages showed a slight rise over the eight-year period in all broad major field categories (Figure 13). Those planning to enter the humanities rose from an average of 3.20 to 3.30. In the related social sciences, students' grade averages rose

from 3.02 to 3.22. Not surprisingly, those planning to major in foreign languages had the highest grades in foreign languages.

A similar rise occurred for both sexes, with females consistently showing a higher average than males. Grade averages for each of the ethnic subgroups increased as well. None of the broad major field categories showed a decline for any ethnic group.

High School Curriculum (Tables 13a-13i)

Which of the following best describes your present high school program?

- (A) Academic or college preparatory
- (B) General
- (C) Career-oriented (business, vocational, industrial arts)
- (D) Other

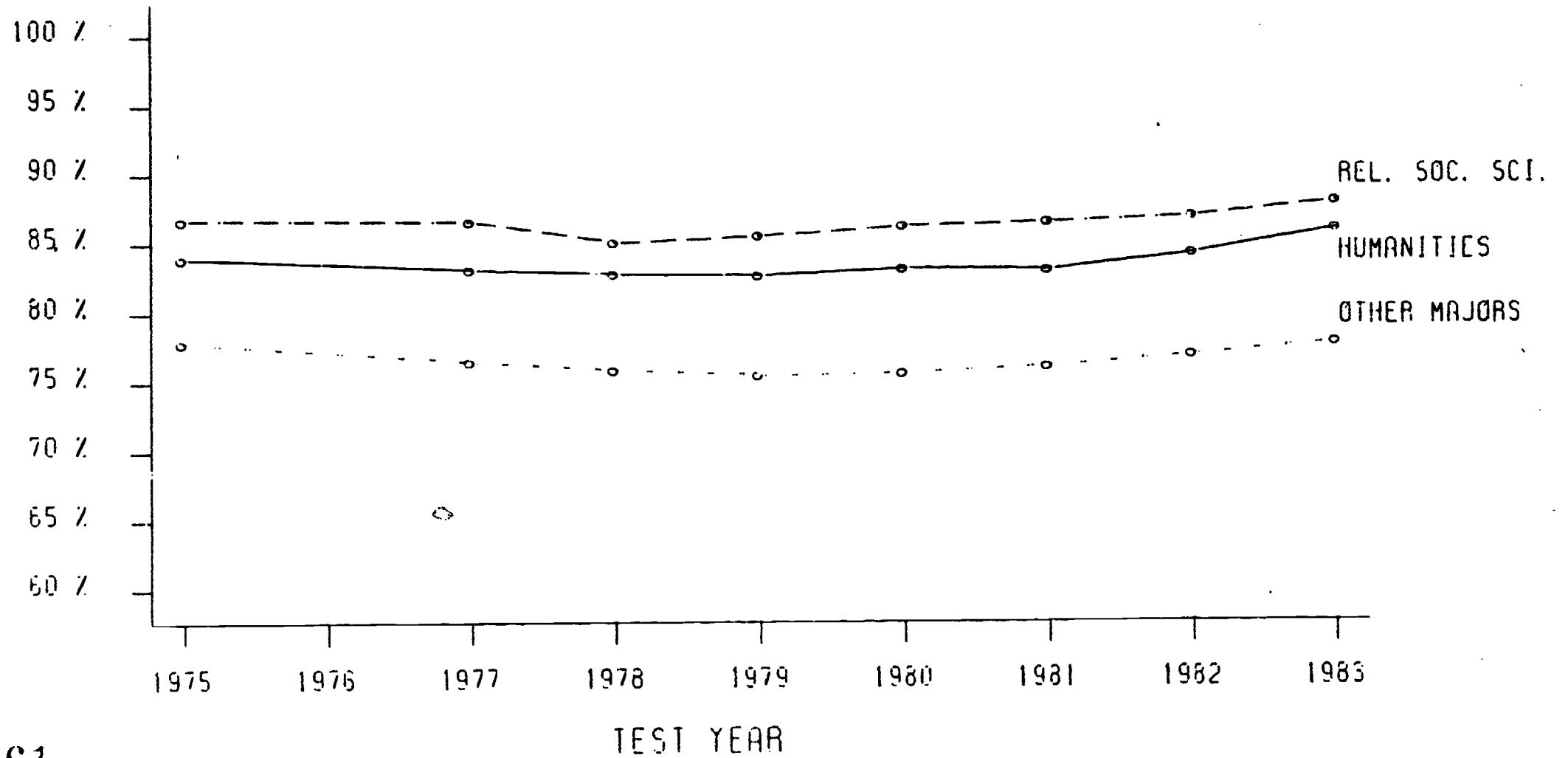
Over 98% of the students in the our population answered this question. For purposes of analysis we computed the percentage who indicated that they were in an academic or college preparatory program.

Among students planning to enter the humanities, the proportion in an academic curriculum first decreased slightly and then rose to a maximum in 1983.

In 1975, 83.9% of all prospective humanities majors indicated that they were in an academic program (Figure 14). This proportion declined slightly until 1979 and then rose to 86.1% by 1983. In the related social sciences, the numbers showed the same pattern -- first a decline and then a steep rise. Between 1975 and 1983, the percentage in an academic curriculum increased from 86.7% to 88.1%. The figures for students entering the humanities and related social sciences were consistently from 6% to 10% higher than the average for those planning to major in all other fields combined. The figures for each

sex separately were very similar.

Trends in high school curriculum were somewhat different for the ethnic minorities. Among students planning to enter the humanities, there were increasing percentages of Blacks, Mexican-Americans, Orientals, and American Indians in an academic program. The numbers for Puerto Ricans showed a 2% decrease. In the related social sciences, Whites, Orientals, and American Indians showed a rise, while Blacks and both Hispanic groups showed a decline. The trend, however, tended to be U-shaped for most subpopulations, so it is difficult to predict whether the percentages in an academic curriculum are on the increase or not.

Number of Years of Study in Academic Subjects

Questions 6 through 11 ask you to blacken the letter corresponding to the total years of study you expect to complete in certain subject areas. Include in the total only courses you have taken since beginning the ninth grade and those you expect to complete before graduation from high school. Count less than a full year in a subject as a full year. Do not count a repeated year of the same course as an additional year of study.

- (A) One year or the equivalent
- (B) Two years or the equivalent
- (C) Three years or the equivalent
- (D) Four years or the equivalent
- (E) More than four years or the equivalent
- (F) I will not take any courses in the subject area.

For this study, we analyzed responses to four subject areas: English, mathematics, social studies, and foreign languages. Students marking option F were eliminated from the analysis; those marking E were scored five years. Over 98% of the students responded to this item.

A. Number of years of English (Tables 14a-14i)

The mean number of years of studying English was highest for prospective humanities majors and second highest for those entering the related social sciences. Both showed an increase over the eight years studied.

On the average, students reported having the equivalent of more than four years of English. The mean rose only very slightly, from 4.11 to 4.14 for prospective humanities majors, and from 4.03 to 4.10 for those entering the related social sciences. The average for students planning to major in all other fields was 3.98 years in 1975 and 4.00 years in 1983.

The means for both sexes increased as well, with women consistently reporting slightly higher figures than men. Among the minorities planning to enter the humanities, Puerto Ricans and American Indians showed a slight decrease over the eight-year period, but there was no clear pattern to indicate a trend. In the related social sciences, there was a slight rise for all groups except Puerto Ricans, but again the numbers were too erratic to suggest any trend.

B. Years of studying mathematics (Tables 15a-15i)

~~Students planning to enter the humanities generally took fewer~~ years of mathematics than did students planning to major in all other fields combined. However, the numbers showed a steady increase for students entering all fields, for both sexes and for all ethnic minorities.

For those planning to enter the humanities, the average number of years of mathematics rose from 3.20 to 3.47; for those entering a related social science, the number rose from 3.40 to 3.64 years. Within the humanities, those intending to major in philosophy or

religion consistently reported having taken the greatest numbers of years of mathematics; those planning to major in ethnic studies took the least.

C. Years of studying social studies (Tables 16a-16i)

The number of years of social studies, not surprisingly, was consistently higher for those planning to enter the humanities-related social sciences; it was second highest for prospective humanities majors, and lowest for all other majors combined. Within the humanities, those planning to major in history and cultures consistently reported the highest number of years of social studies. In fact, those interested in history and cultures took more social studies courses than students entering a related social science. Of course, it is a matter of definition whether history and cultures is a humanities area or a social science. Undoubtedly, students counted high school courses in history as social studies, and we would expect history majors to take the most history courses.

Students planning to major in the related social sciences showed an increase in the number of years of social studies; the trend among those entering the humanities was uncertain.

A comparison of males and females showed that men reported taking more years of social studies than women. This was true for every year and every broad major field. The relative rank orderings remained the same for both sexes and all ethnic groups, with those entering related social sciences taking the most courses, and those entering humanities being second. For both sexes, students planning to major in history and cultures took the greatest number of social studies courses.

D. Years of studying foreign languages (Tables 17a-17i)

Students planning to major in foreign languages reported having studied more than four years of a foreign language on the average. Not surprisingly, prospective humanities majors took more years of foreign languages than those planning to enter the other major field groups, regardless of sex or ethnic identity. More importantly, however, may be the observation that the number of years of foreign language study decreased between 1975 and 1983 for students entering all major field areas, including foreign languages.

Honors and Awards (Tables 18a-18i)

During your high school years how many honors or awards (for example, essay contest, debating tournament, science fair, music, art or theater competition, or membership in a scholastic honors group) have you received?

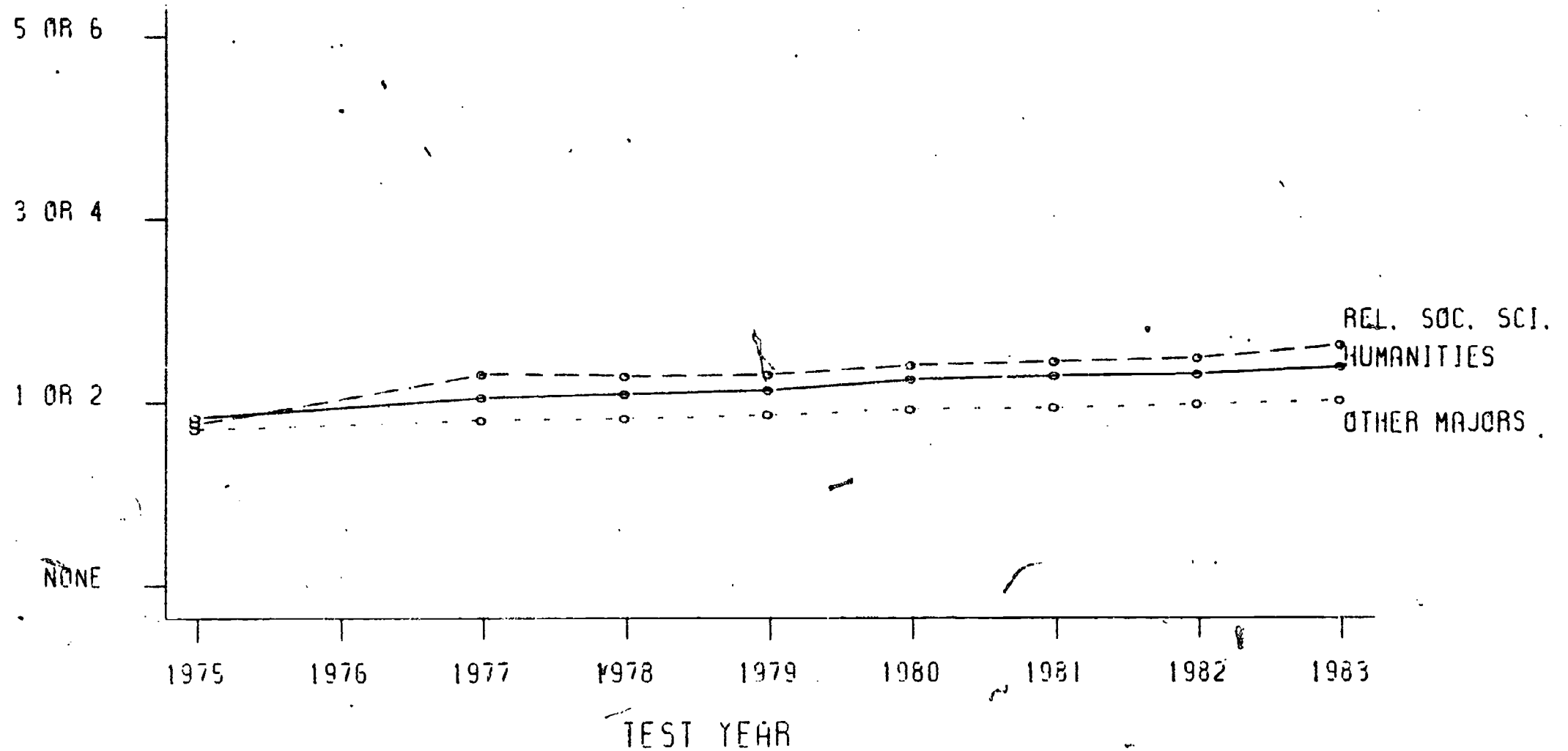
- (A) None
- (B) One or two
- (C) Three or more
- (D) Five or six
- (E) Seven or more

Over 98% of all students answered this item. In order to score it, we assigned ordinal numbers to the responses and computed that average. To interpret the numbers in the trend tables, it is necessary to convert the number back to the original scale. What is important, however, is not the actual number of awards students received but the relative number from year to year and across major fields.

The average number of honors received increased over the eight-year period for students entering all broad major field categories. The highest average was among those planning to major in humanities-related social sciences. Second highest was among prospective humanities majors. (See Figure 15.) These patterns held true for both sexes and all ethnic minorities. In addition, females consistently

received a higher average number of honors than males.

Self Estimates of Abilities

Questions 47 through 60 concern how you feel you compare with other people your own age in certain areas of ability. For each field, blacken the letter

- (A) if you feel you are in the highest 1 percent in that area of ability
- (B) if you feel you are in the highest 10 percent in that area of ability
- (C) if you feel you are above average in that area of ability
- (D) if you feel you are average in that area of ability
- (E) if you feel you are below average in that area of ability

Of the fourteen areas listed, we analyzed ability in written expression, creative writing ability, speaking ability, and leadership ability.

To score the items, we assigned ordinal numbers to each of the five alternative ratings, with 5 = upper 1 percent. As with honors and awards, the actual number is less important than the relative ratings from year to year and between major fields.

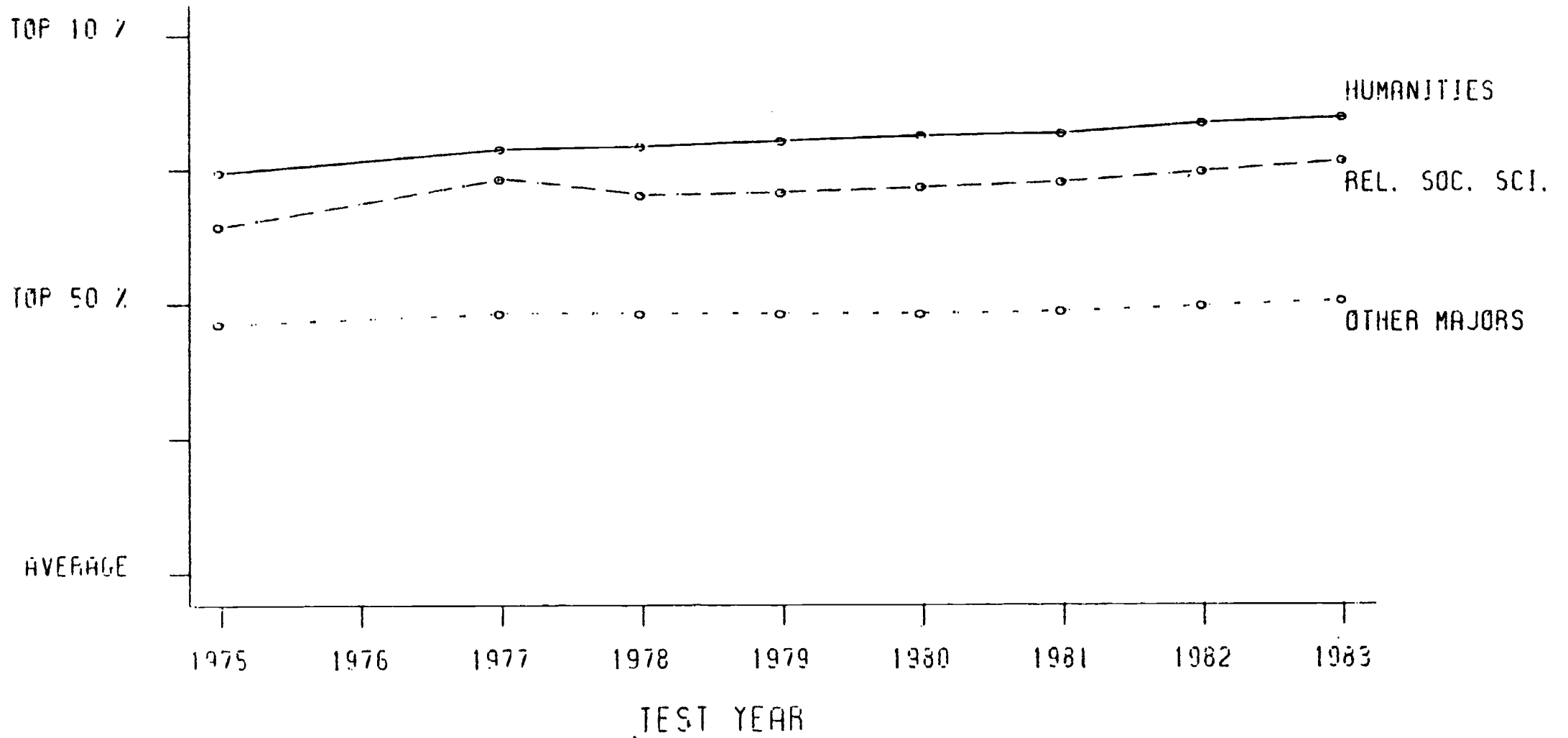
A. Ability in written expression (Tables 19a-19i)

Between 1975 and 1983, self estimates of ability in written expression improved among students entering all major field areas. The highest average ratings were among prospective humanities majors; and second highest were among those entering related social sciences. (See Figure 16.)

Among students planning to major in the humanities, those going into English and literature rated themselves the highest. Those entering ethnic studies rated themselves lower than the average for all students. The same patterns held true for both sexes and all ethnic groups except Orientals. Among Orientals, those entering re-

lated social sciences rated themselves higher, on the average, than those entering the humanities.

Females entering the humanities rated themselves higher in written expression than did males entering the humanities. In the related social sciences, however, males tended to rate themselves very slightly higher than did females.

B. Creative writing ability (Tables 20a-20i)

Estimates of creative writing ability also increased over the eight-year period for students entering all major field areas, and the highest ratings were among prospective humanities majors. (See Figure 17.) The same patterns held for both sexes and all ethnic groups except Orientals and American Indians. Among these two groups, students entering related social sciences rated themselves higher than did students entering humanities.

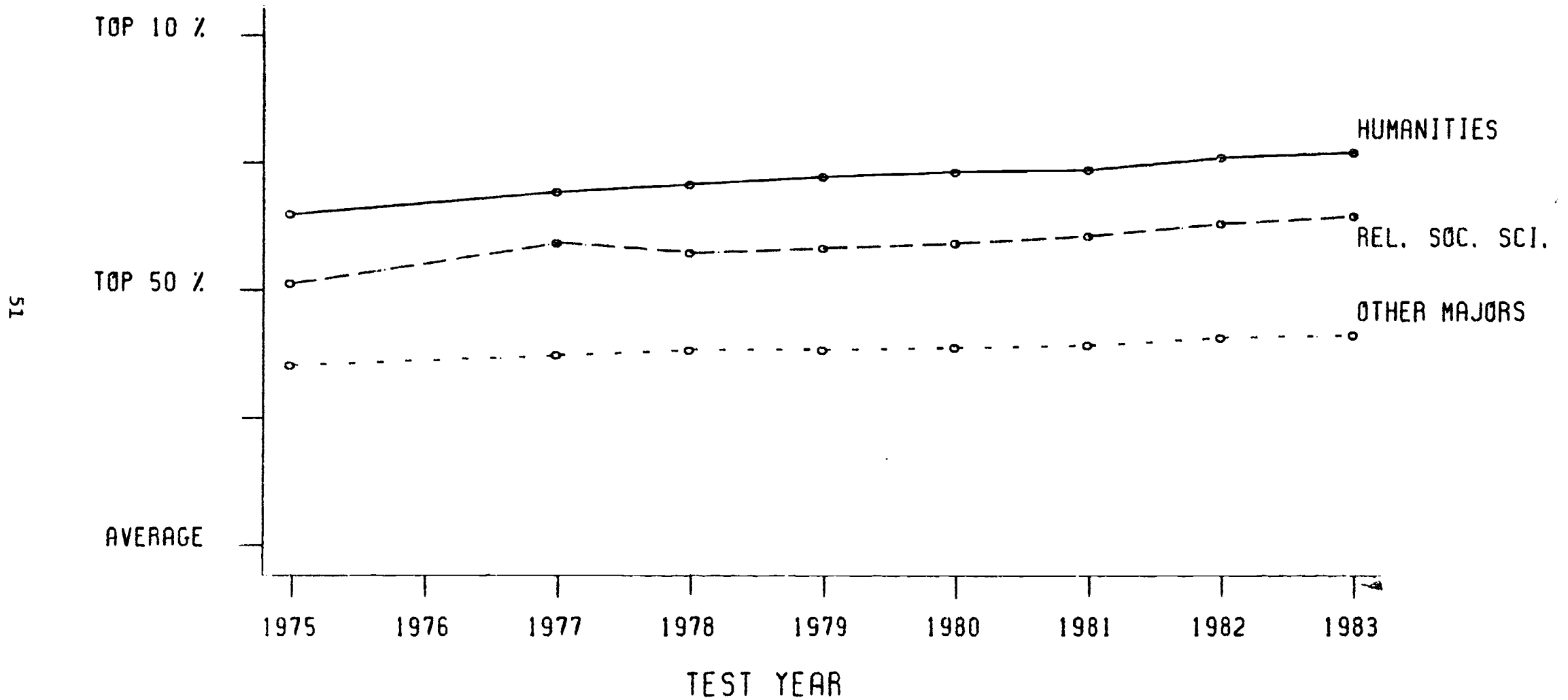
In contrast to ratings in written expression, males rated themselves slightly higher than did females in creative writing. This was true for students entering all broad major field areas and for all years.

C. Speaking ability (Tables 21a-21i)

In speaking ability, those entering related social sciences rated themselves the highest, and those entering humanities were second. Average ratings increased over the eight-year period for all broad major field areas. (See Figure 18.) These patterns held for both sexes and all ethnic groups, except American Indians, who showed no change. Males planning to enter the humanities or related social sciences consistently rated themselves somewhat higher, on the average, than did females.

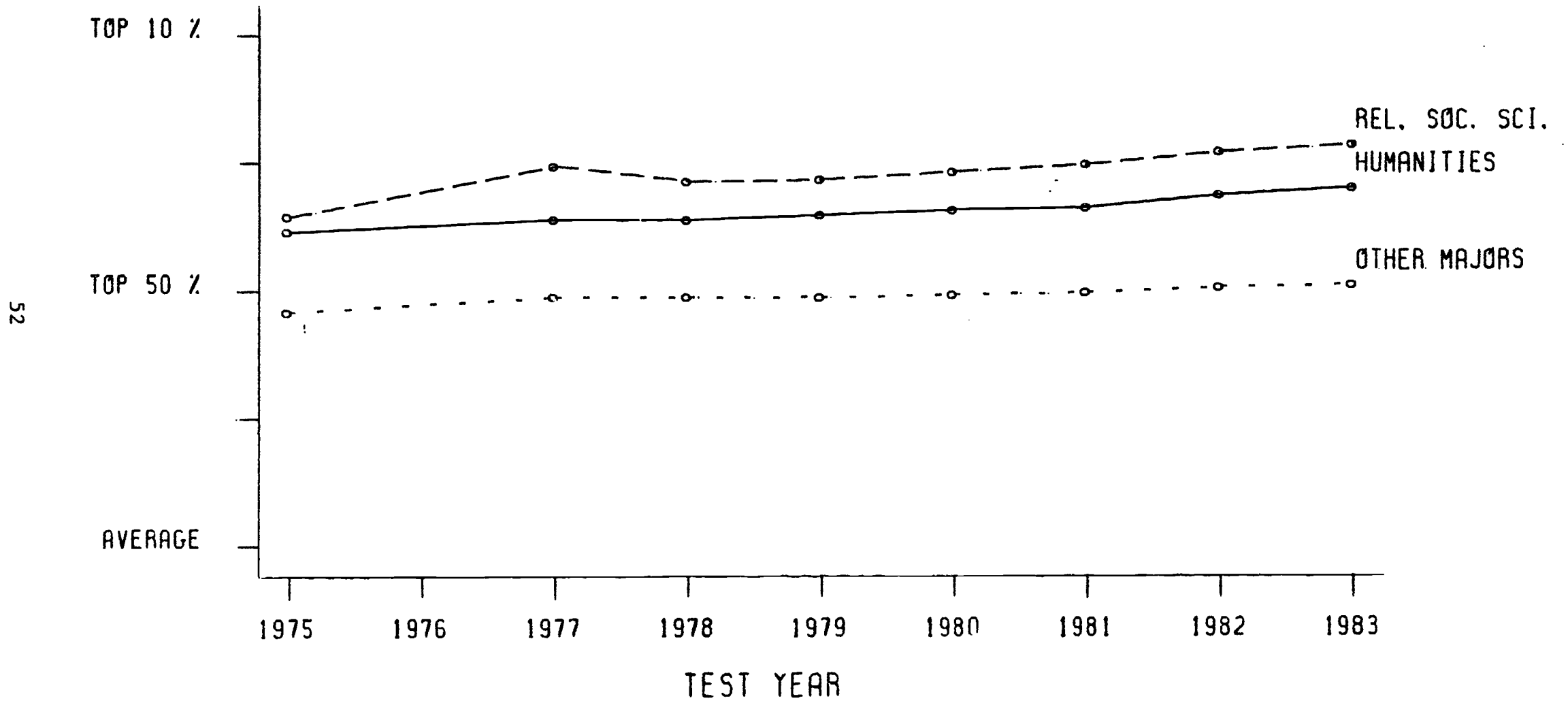
SELF ESTIMATE OF ABILITY IN CREATIVE WRITING

D. Leadership ability (Tables 22a-22i)

Students planning to enter the related social sciences rated themselves the highest in leadership ability; those intending to major in humanities were second but not much higher than the average for those enter other major fields. (See Figure 19.)

Men consistently scored themselves higher than did women. As with the other ability ratings, estimates of leadership ability rose between 1975 and 1983 for both sexes and all ethnic groups.

Numbers of Students Wanting Help to Improve Academic Skills

You may want to receive help outside regular course work from the college you plan to attend. If so, blacken the letter for each area in which you may want help.

Examinees were given a list of eight areas in which they might want help. From these we analyzed three: increasing reading ability, improving writing ability, and developing good study habits. This question was not asked prior to 1977; we therefore had only seven years of data.

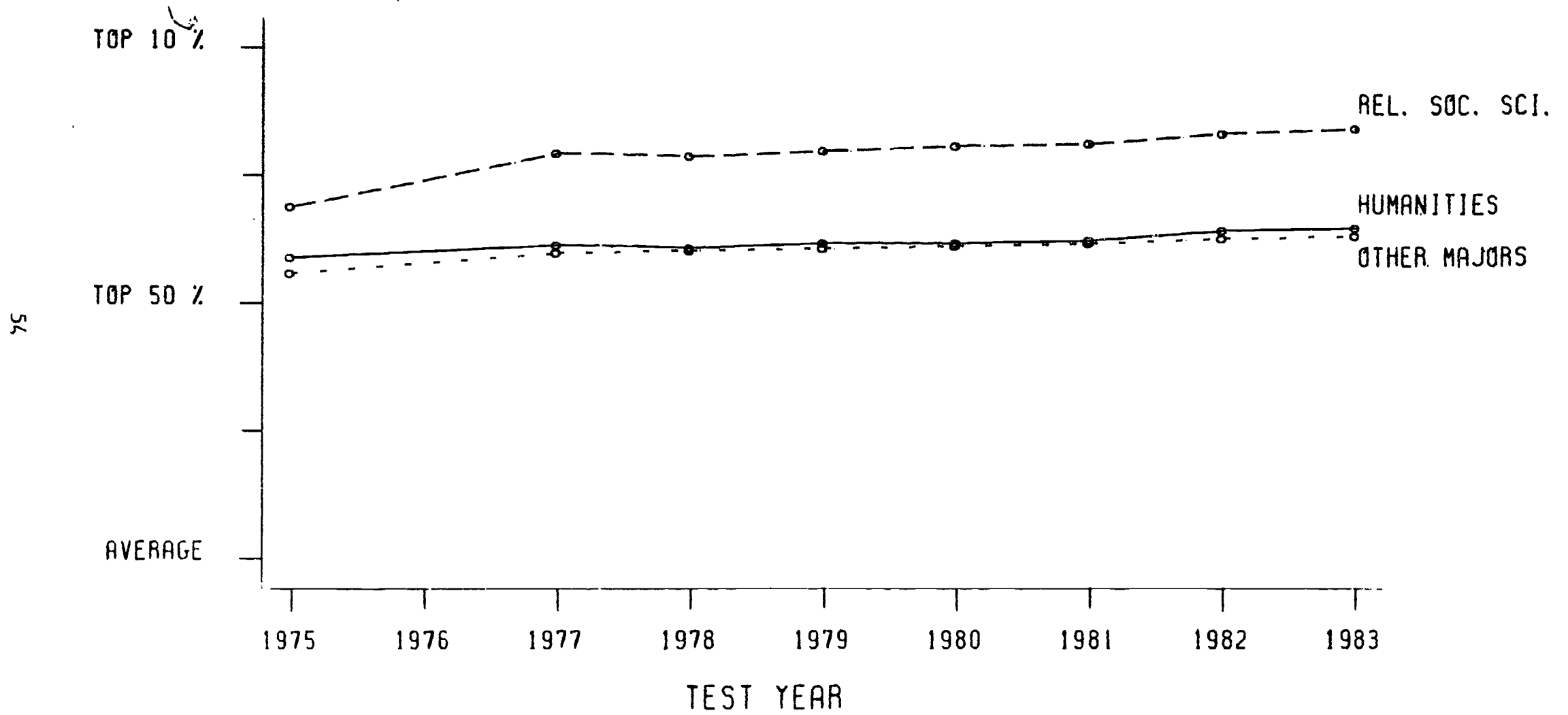
A. Desire to improve reading ability (Tables 23a-23i)

The percent who indicated that they wanted help to improve their reading ability decreased among those entering all major field areas. Students planning to major in the humanities consistently expressed less of a desire for help in reading than students entering other fields. (See Figure 20.)

For all major fields combined, the number wanting help in reading decreased from 14.1% to 10.6%. Among those entering the humanities it dropped from 10.1% to 7.2%; and among those entering the related social sciences it declined from 11.7% to 8.7%. The same

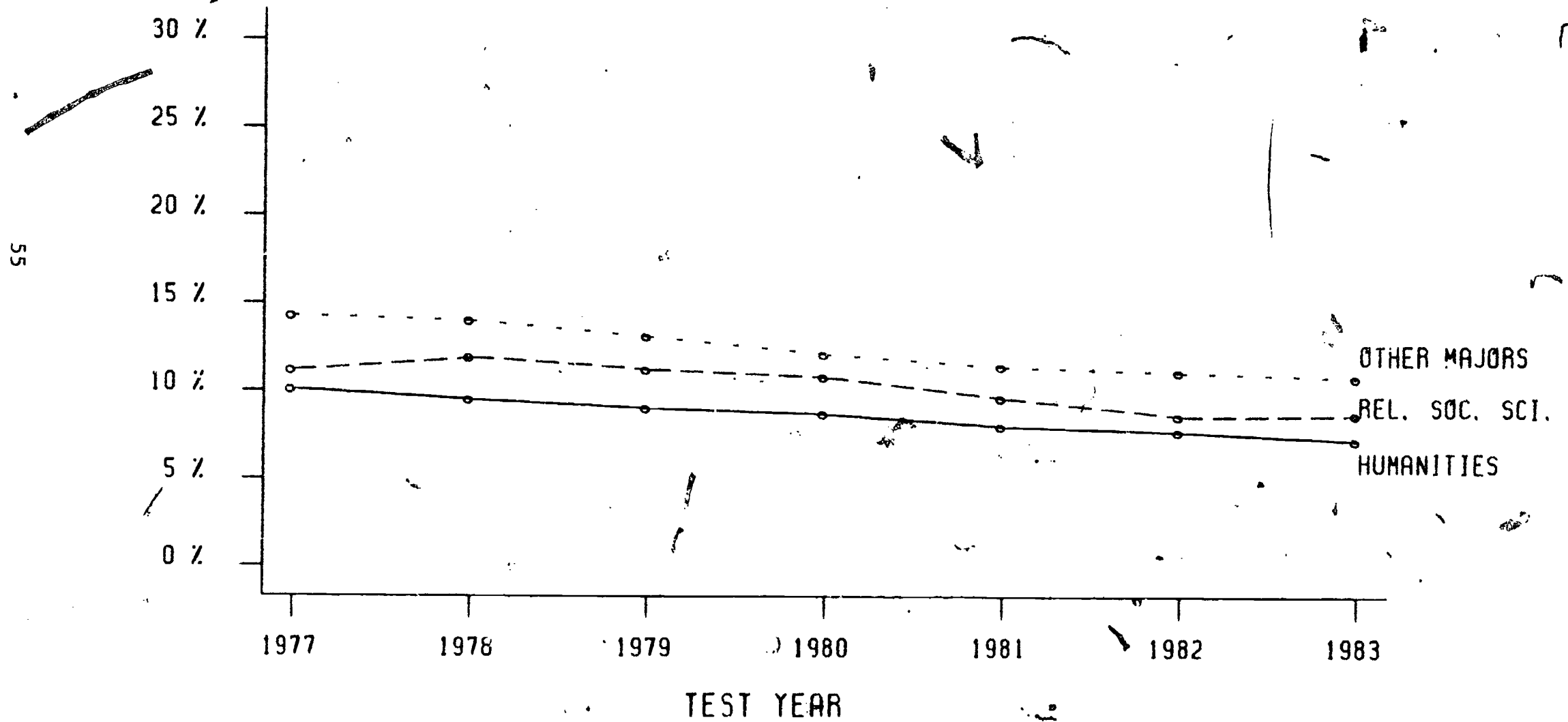
SELF ESTIMATE OF ABILITY IN LEADERSHIP

pattern held true for both sexes, though consistently fewer women than men indicated a need for help. Similarly, all of the ethnic groups showed a decline in the need for help in reading.

B. Desire to improve writing ability (Tables 24a-24i)

The greatest percentage of students wanting help to improve their writing ability was among those entering the related social sciences; second highest were prospective humanities majors. Changes over the eight years studied were erratic and did not suggest a trend.

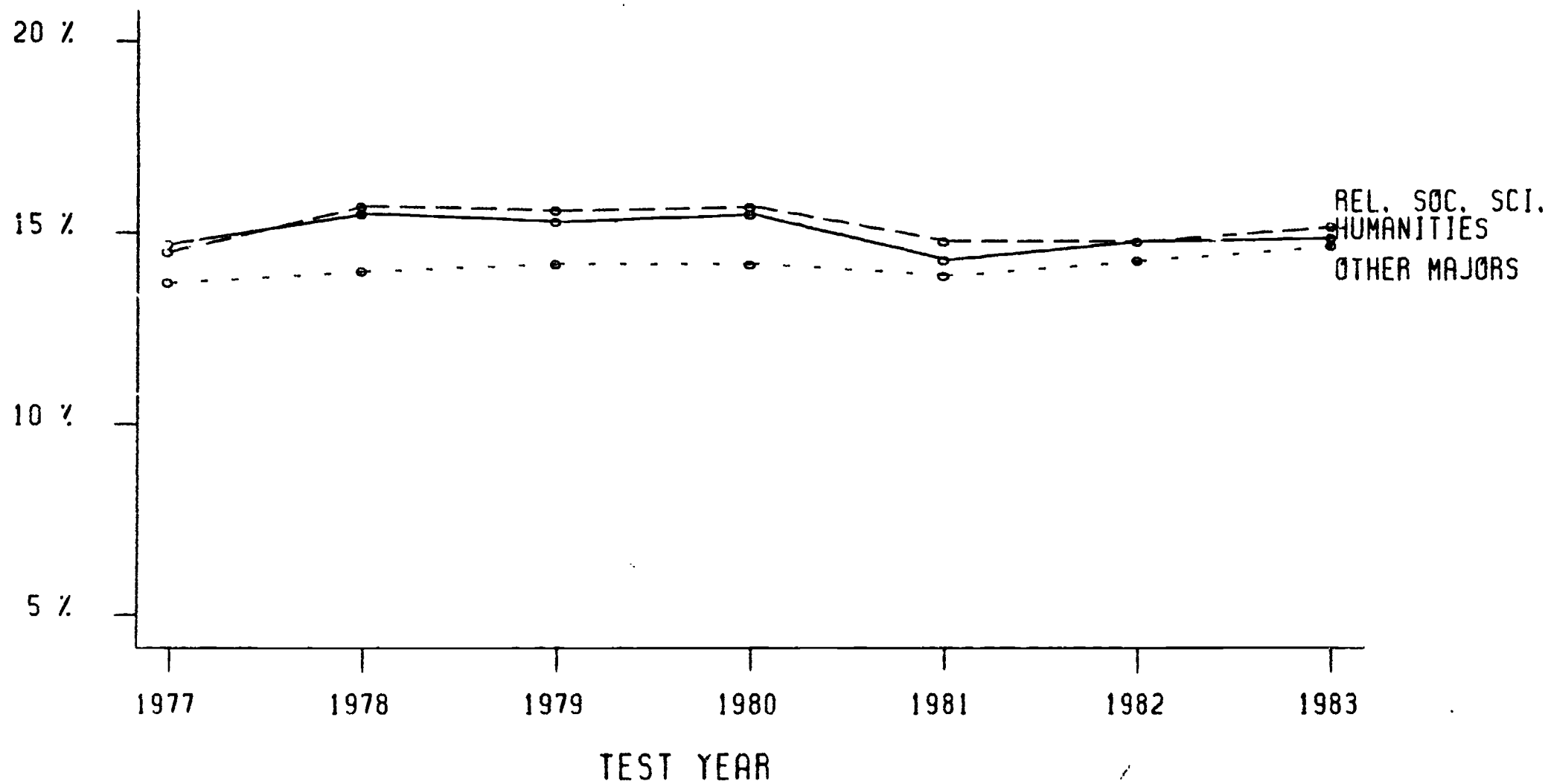
There was a very slight, irregular increase in the percentage wanting help in writing, and this was true for those entering all broad major field areas (Figure 21). Among those planning to major in the humanities, the numbers rose from 14.8% in 1977 to 15.5% in 1980 and then decreased to 14.9% in 1983. Among those entering the related social sciences there was no apparent trend, but in 1983, 15.3% wanted help with writing.

There was virtually no difference between the sexes in their responses to this question. The ethnic minorities expressed a greater interest in obtaining help with writing than did Whites.

It is not clear whether students answering this question in the affirmative felt that their writing ability was inadequate and in need of improvement or whether they simply wanted to improve the skills they had. Among males, for example, over 17% of the prospective English and literature majors wanted help to improve writing skills. This was the highest of any field studied. It is likely that two types of students indicated a desire for help -- poor writers in need of improvement, and skilled writers aiming for excellence. If that is the case, the item is not a useful indicator of the students' actual

writing skills, but may be a good indicator of motivation.

C. Desire to develop good study habits (Tables 25a-25i)

A very large percentage of students indicated that they wanted help in developing good study habits. The lowest percentage was among prospective humanities majors and the second lowest was among those entering related social sciences.

For all majors combined the number wanting to improve their study habits rose from 21.0% to 23.6% between 1977 and 1983 (Figure 22). For those entering the related social sciences the numbers were very slightly less. They increased from 19.6% to 22.2% over the same period. Prospective humanities majors were the lowest -- from 17.4% to 18.7%. All fields showed this slight rise in the numbers wanting to improve study habits, and males were slightly higher than females.

Among the minorities the same patterns held, except for Puerto Ricans entering the related social sciences, who showed a declining interest in wanting help to improve study habits.

Students Requesting Financial Aid (Tables 26a-26i)

Do you plan to apply for financial aid at any college?

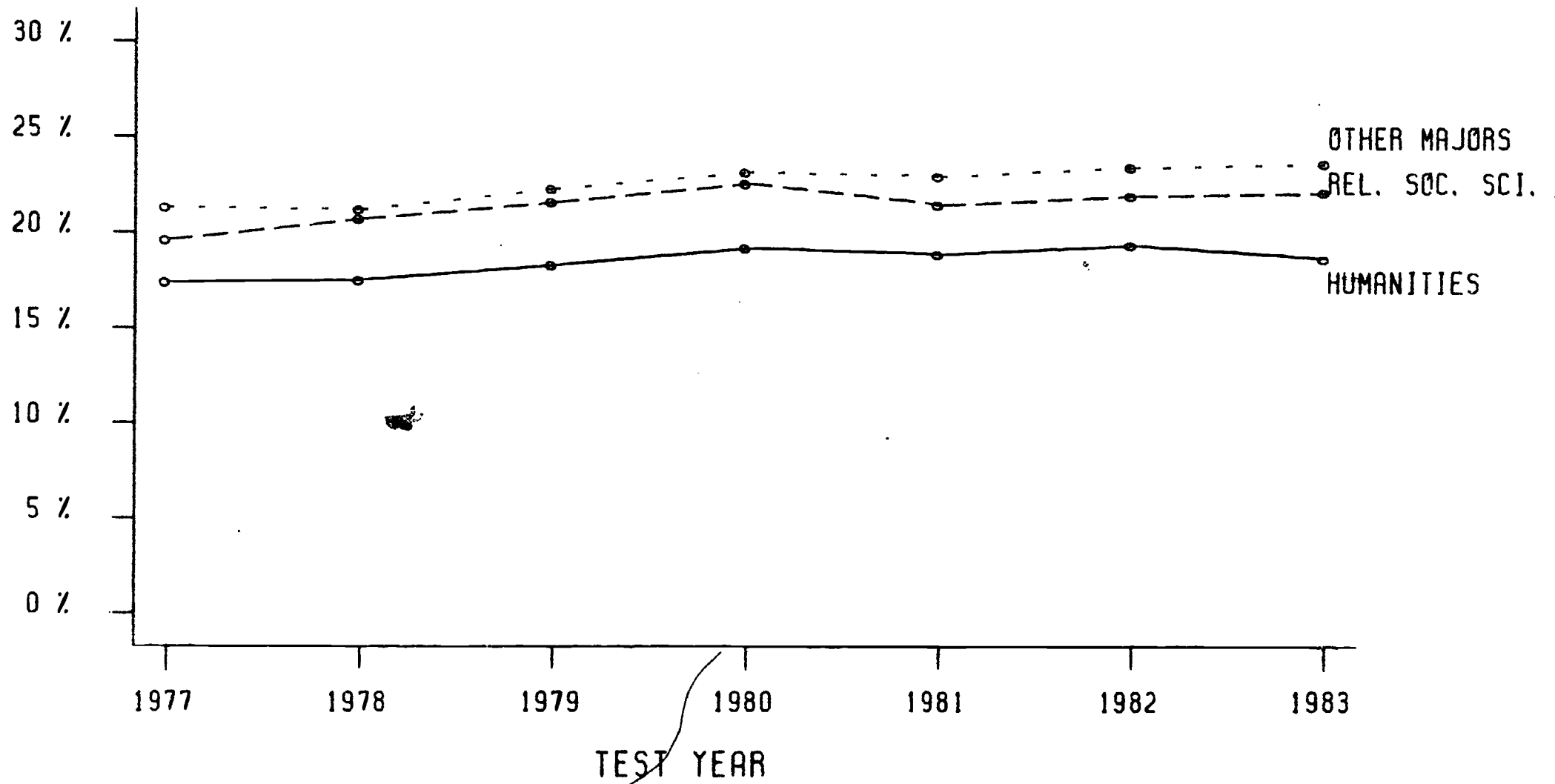
(Y) Yes (N) No

The overall response to this item was 84%. A somewhat higher percentage (87% to 90%) in each of the minority groups answered it.

The percentage of students planning to request financial aid was higher than average for those entering the related social sciences; it was lower than average for prospective humanities majors. Between 1977 and 1983 there was an increase in the need for financial aid among students entering all major fields.

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Overall, the numbers indicating that they planned to apply for financial aid increased from 71.1% to 76.4% between 1977 and 1983 (Figure 23). Among those entering the related social sciences the percentages were very slightly higher. They increased from 72.3% to 76.8% over that period. The lowest numbers were among students planning to major in the humanities. They rose from 70.2% to 73.8%. Within the humanities, the highest percentage of students planning to apply for financial aid was among those intending to major in ethnic studies; the lowest percentage was among those entering history and cultures.

Sex differences were only very slight and not consistently different across fields. The greatest percentages of students intending to apply for financial aid were among the minorities. In 1983, the number of Blacks planning to apply for financial aid averaged 92.5%; there was little difference by intended major field.

Students Planning Part-time Study (Tables 27a-27i)

When you enroll, do you expect to attend college

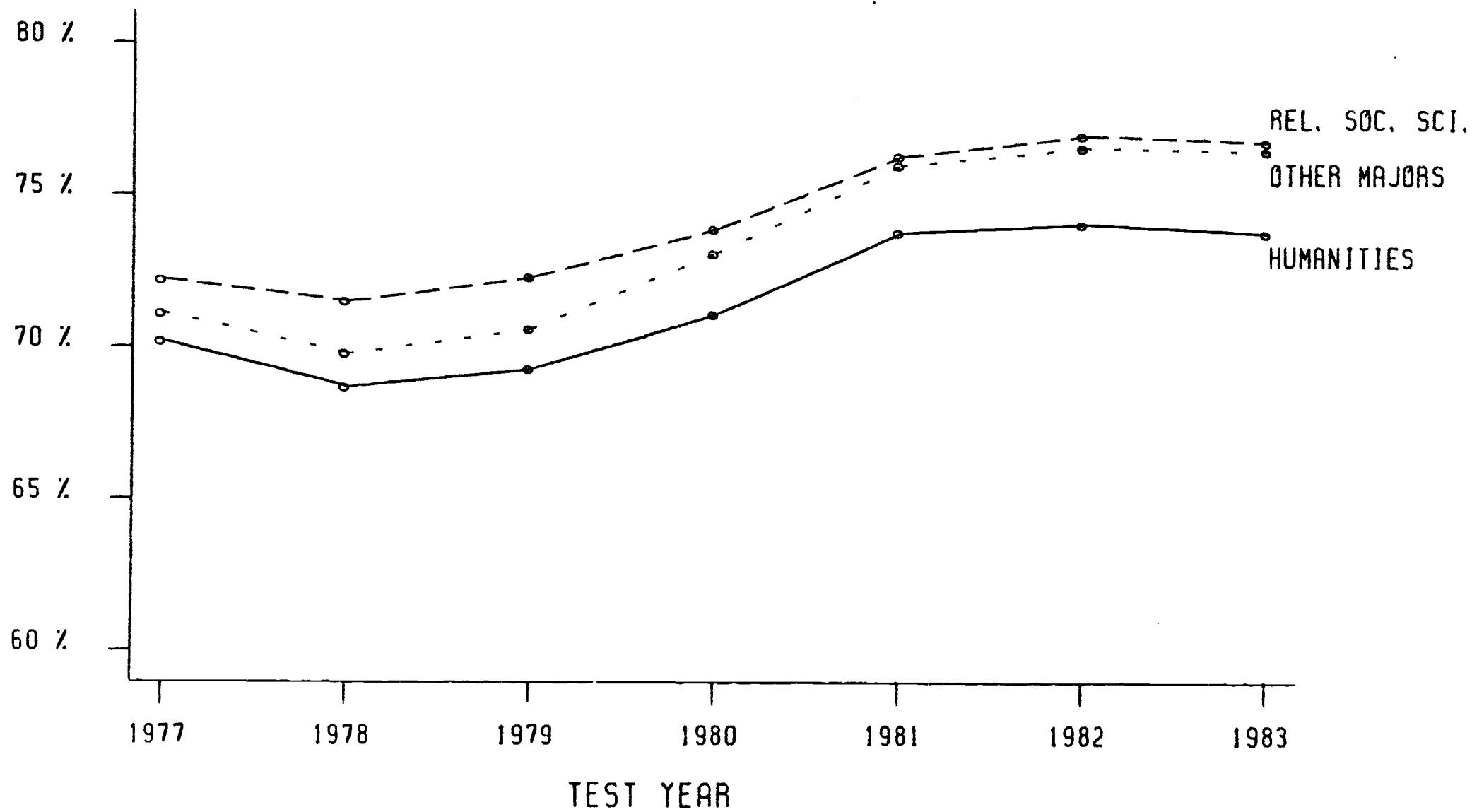
(A) full time (B) part-time

This question was answered by 85% of the students in the population we studied. Among the ethnic minority groups, the response rate was 88% to 91%.

Of all students in our population, the percentage who planned to study part time increased from 5.1% in 1977 to 5.4% in 1979 and then decreased to only 4.8% in 1983 (Figure 24). It should be noted that these trends differ from the published statistics (Grandy and Courtney, in press) which have shown a steady increase in the percent

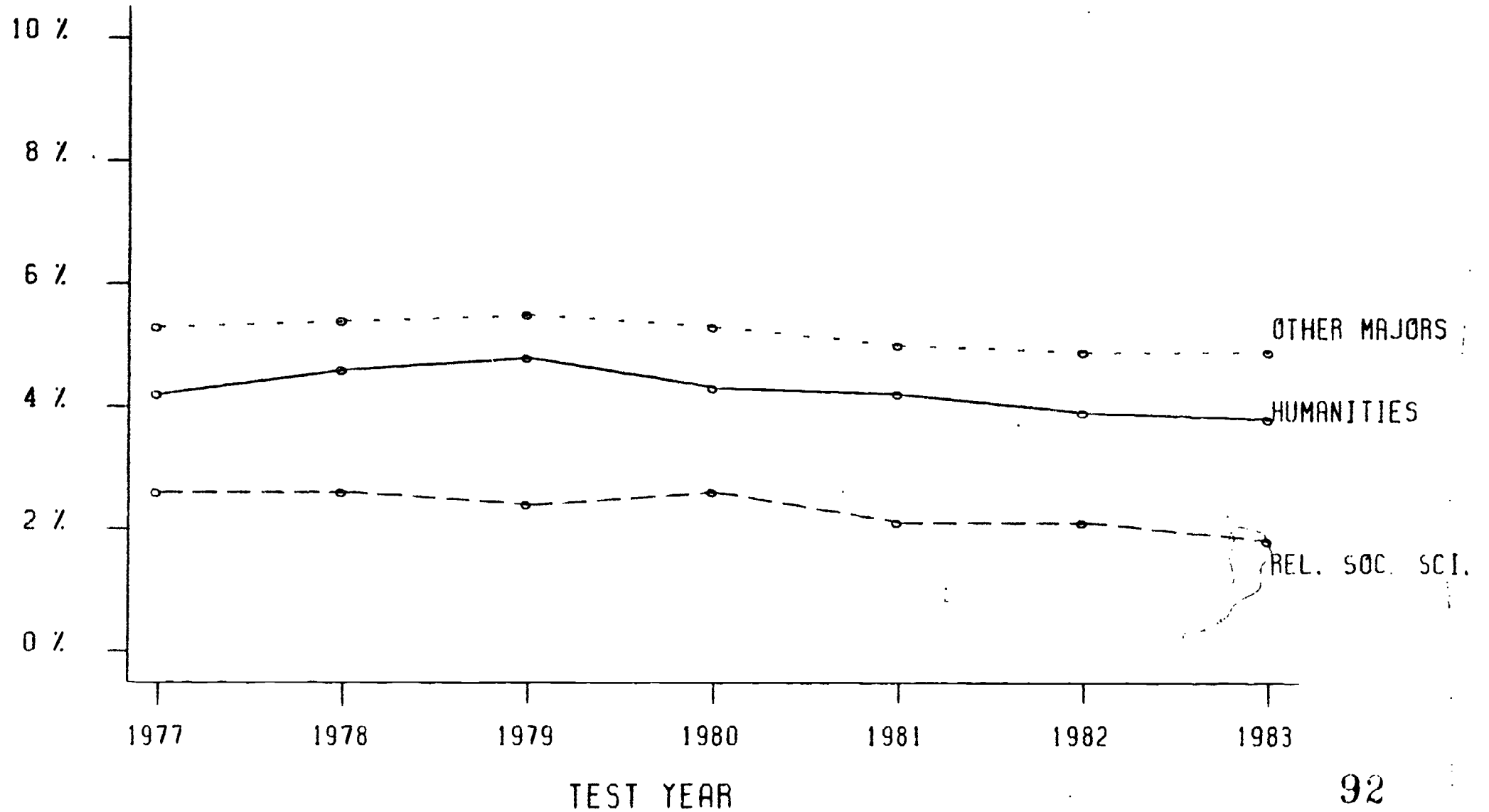
PERCENT REQUESTING FINANCIAL AID

of SAT examinees planning part-time study. We can infer from these statistics that the increase has occurred among students not specifying a major field. It is possible that the growing number of part-time students are less certain about their academic plans and are perhaps not intending to obtain a degree at all. While this would clearly not be true of all part-time students, it is apparently true of a larger proportion of part-time than full-time students.

The lowest percentage of students planning to study part time were those intending to major in the related social sciences; those entering humanities were higher, and those entering all other majors combined were the highest.

Among prospective humanities majors, the number planning to study part time decreased from 4.2% to 3.8%. Even fewer students entering the related social sciences planned part-time study. Their numbers declined from 2.6% to 1.8%. For men and women separately, the numbers also decreased. Among prospective humanities majors, the number planning to study part time decreased for all minorities; among those entering the related social sciences, plans for part-time enrollment increased for Puerto Ricans and American Indians.

Parents' Education (Tables 28a-28i and 29a-29i)

Indicate the highest level of education completed by your father or male guardian.

- (A) Grade school
- (B) Some high school
- (C) High school diploma
- (D) Business or trade school
- (E) Some college
- (F) Bachelor's degree
- (G) Some graduate or professional school
- (H) Graduate or professional degree

The same question was also asked for mother's education. The overall response rate to these items was 84%. It was slightly higher among minorities. For purposes of analysis, we computed the percentage of students whose parent had at least a four-year college degree.

Students planning to enter the humanities and related social sciences came from families with better educated mothers and fathers than did students entering all other major fields combined.

Between 1977 and 1983, the percentage of all students whose fathers had a four-year degree rose from 37.0% to 42.8% (Figure 25). Among prospective humanities majors, the figure rose from 46.0% to 55.4%; and among those entering the related social sciences, the number increased from 46.8% to 56.2%. Within the humanities, students planning to major in art history consistently had more fathers with college degrees than did students entering other fields. Students planning to major in ethnic studies had fathers with less formal education, on the average.

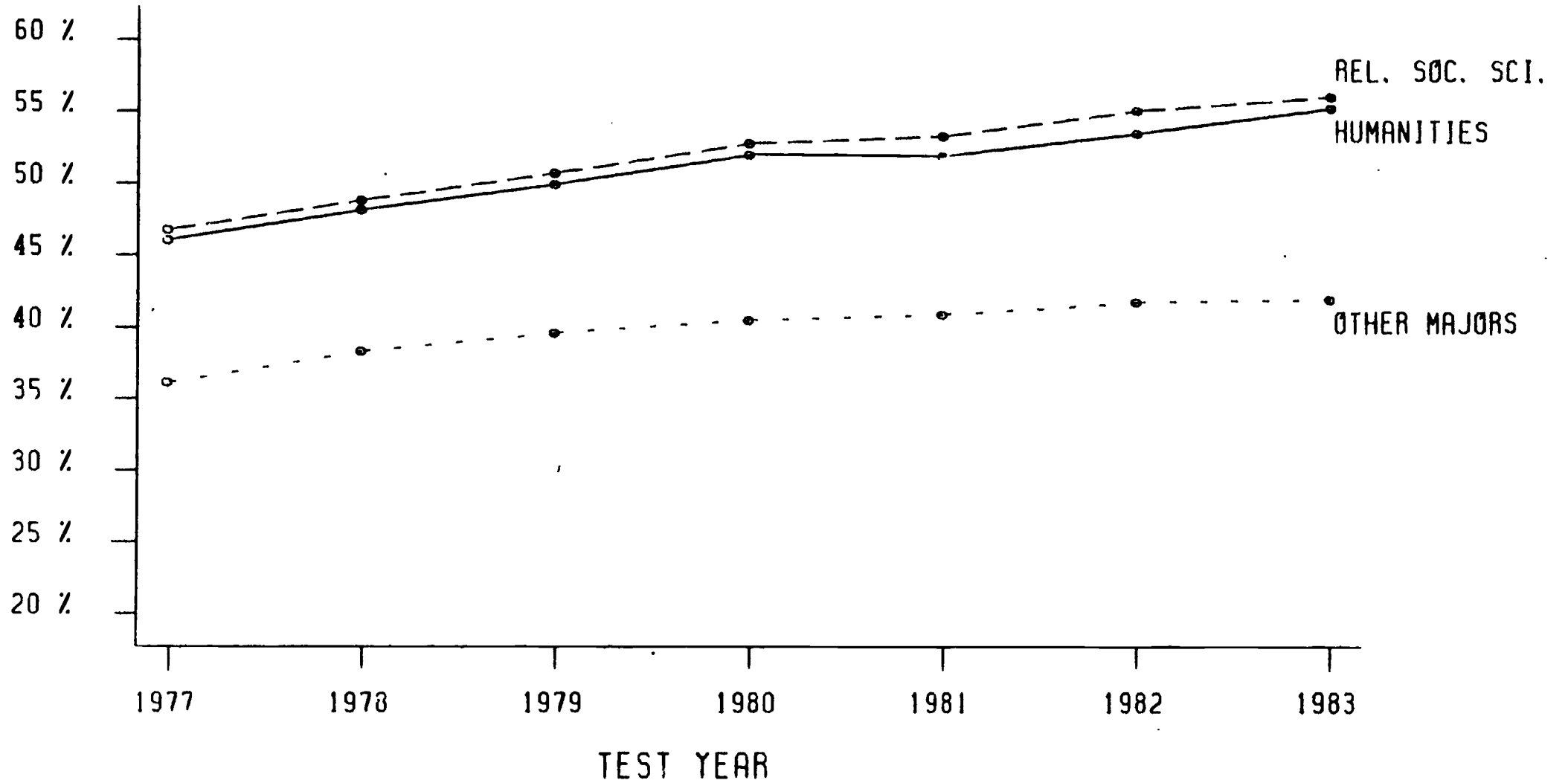
Among those entering the humanities-related social sciences, fathers of males tended to have slightly more education than the fathers of females. The reverse was true in the humanities, though the difference was very small. In all other majors combined, more males had fathers with a four-year degree.

Comparing the various ethnic groups, we found an increase in the number having college-educated fathers for all groups and in all major field categories. Furthermore, for all ethnic groups, those entering the related social sciences had better educated fathers than those entering the humanities. Students entering the "other" fields had the lowest percentage of fathers with a college degree.

Although mother's education was consistently lower than father's

PERCENT WHOSE FATHERS HAVE AT LEAST A FOUR-YEAR COLLEGE DEGREE



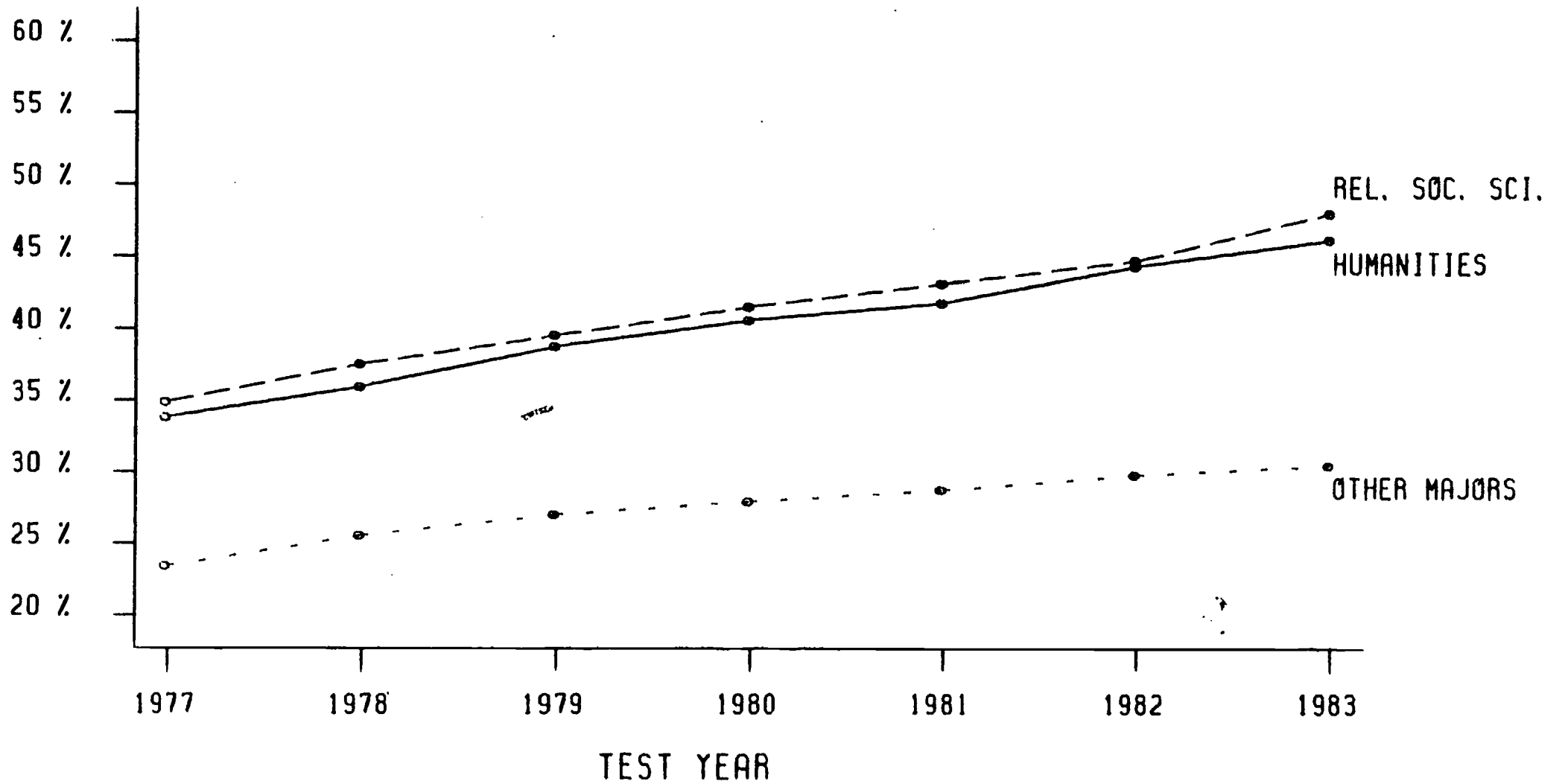

education, the same patterns held. Between 1977 and 1983, the percentage of students in our population whose mothers had a four-year degree increased from 23.2% to 28.6% (Figure 26). Among students entering the humanities, the number rose from 30.4% to 39.7%. Among those entering the related social sciences, the number having mothers with a college degree increased from 31.2% to 41.1%. Students planning to major in art history had a higher proportion of college educated mothers than did students entering any other field in the humanities.

Comparing males and females, we found the same pattern for mother's education as for father's education. Among prospective humanities majors, females had better educated mothers; among those entering other fields, more males had fathers with college degrees. All of the ethnic minorities showed increases in mother's education, and all those in the related social sciences had a greater proportion of mothers with college degrees than did those in other fields.

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Analysis of Graduate Record Examination Data

Examinees who take the GRE are generally college seniors or graduates who are planning to attend graduate school and are required to submit GRE scores as part of the admissions process. While the purpose of studying the GRE populations is to examine the changing characteristics of graduate students entering the humanities, these data cannot be generalized to all such students. Some take the GRE for reasons other than graduate-school application. Not all graduate schools require the GRE. Some students may change their major field after taking the GRE, and some may never be accepted into a graduate school. Thus the data examined here represent the test scores and self-reported background information of those who stated the intention of majoring in the humanities. For simplicity, we refer to these examinees as prospective humanities majors.

When examinees apply to take the GRE, they are asked to complete a background questionnaire similar to the SDQ completed by SAT examinees, but with fewer questions. We have selected eight items from the questionnaire to analyze along with GRE Verbal (GREV) and GRE Quantitative (GREQ) scores. As we discuss each questionnaire item in this report, we will present the item verbatim and, where appropriate, indicate its response rate.

Major Field Definitions

Referring to the Major Field Code List on page 78, find the field in which you plan to do your graduate work. Blacken the spaces for that field's code number. If you are undecided, use 00 Undecided.

The list is divided into four broad categories: humanities, social sciences, biological sciences, and physical sciences. Within each broad categories are approximately twenty-five specialized major fields. Some of these fields would be grouped differently by particular universities or other organizations. History, for example, is a social science in the GRE classification while the National Endowment for the Humanities includes it in the humanities. For this study we defined humanities fields in accordance with the definitions used by the National Endowment for the Humanities. In addition, we defined five fields that we regard as humanities-related social sciences.

Each of these two classifications comprises the following major fields:

Because decreasing numbers of students planned to major in Italian and in Slavic studies, these fields were removed from the list during 1983. Those planning to major in Italian marked "other foreign

languages" beginning that year. Slavic studies was included with Russian that same year. In addition, speech pathology was introduced as a new option in 1983. Prior to that year, students planning to major in speech pathology apparently marked speech, education, or some other closely related field.

Because very few students expressed an interest in majoring in some areas, we clustered major fields for some analyses, particularly for the small minority groups.

Population Studied

For all analyses we included everyone who took the GRE from 1976 to 1978 and from 1980 to 1983 EXCEPT the following:

1. Those who took the GRE at a special administration and for whom data were not available for analysis;
2. Those who did not mark an intended major field or who indicated that they were undecided;
3. Those who did not specify their sex, ethnic identity, or citizenship.

In addition, many examinees took the GRE more than once. To avoid using data repeatedly from the same person, we omitted all but the first occurrence of an examinee's scores within the same test year. We did not, however, attempt to locate multiple testings across years. Thus, an examinee who took the GRE in 1978/79 and again in 1982/83, for example, was included in the statistics for both years. An examinee who took the test three times in 1981/82 had only his or her first set of scores included.

Approximately 10% to 15% of the examinees omitted the question on intended major field. Only about 1% omitted sex, 1% omitted citizen-

ship, and 3% omitted ethnic identity. Of those who omitted sex or ethnicity, however, about half also omitted major field. Thus, only a very small percentage (about 1% or 2%) were eliminated from the study because they omitted sex, ethnicity, or citizenship.

The average GREV scores of examinees specifying a major field were about 8 or 10 points higher, on the average, than those omitting major field. In general, examinees who complete the background questionnaire, both in the SAT and the GRE populations, tend to have somewhat higher test scores.

For comparison purposes, we conducted the same analyses for thirteen subpopulations: (1) all examinees, (2) all U.S. citizens, (3) all non-citizens, (4) male U.S. citizens, (5) female U.S. citizens, (6) White U.S. citizens, (7) Black U.S. citizens, (8) Mexican-American U.S. citizens, (9) Puerto Rican U.S. citizens, (10) other Hispanic U.S. citizens, (11) Oriental or Asian-American U.S. citizens, (12) American Indian or Native American U.S. citizens, (13) other ethnic groups who are U.S. citizens. We intentionally emphasized citizenship here so that there would be no confusion in the interpretation of ambiguous subgroups such as "Orientals." On table headings, however, for the sake of brevity, an expression such as "Oriental citizens" was used to mean U.S. citizens of Asian background.

In our discussion of the GRE analysis results, we focus on U.S. citizens rather than all examinees because there was often a large difference between citizens and non-citizens (i.e., foreign students). We discuss the findings for foreign students (non-citizens) separately.

Variables Analyzed

The variables analyzed included numbers and percentages of examinees planning to major in each field of the humanities or related social sciences. These were cross-tabulated in various ways by undergraduate major field as well.

The most important variables were GRE score averages, both verbal (GREV) and quantitative (GREQ). These were also computed separately for those with different combinations of undergraduate and graduate major fields. GRE scores, like SAT scores, are equated from year to year so that even though they contain different items, the scores will be comparable. We should mention briefly, however, that two changes were made in the method of scoring the GRE during the time period we are studying. Until 1981, GRE scores were measured on a 200 to 900 scale. Beginning in October 1981 the upper limit of the scale was truncated to 800. Also at that time, scoring of the test was changed from formula scoring to rights-only scoring. With formula scoring, a fraction of the number of items answered incorrectly was subtracted from the number answered correctly. Rights-only scoring counts only those items answered correctly and applies no penalty for guessing. In spite of these changes, because the tests were equated as usual, we believe that the scores have remained comparable.

The questionnaire items we analyzed included undergraduate grade-point average (GPA) in major field, overall GPA for the last two years of college, self-reported English language proficiency, age, and mother's and father's education.

Results of the GRE Analysis

Tables showing trends in GRE data are included under separate cover in Supplement II entitled **Tables of Trends in Data from the Graduate Record Examinations: Prospective Humanities Majors, 1976 - 1983**. It is not possible, in the space of this report to discuss all aspects of these tables. Generally we will present the major findings together with some of their implications as well as the questions they raise. We refer the reader who is interested in more detailed analysis, to the appropriate set of tables in Supplement II.

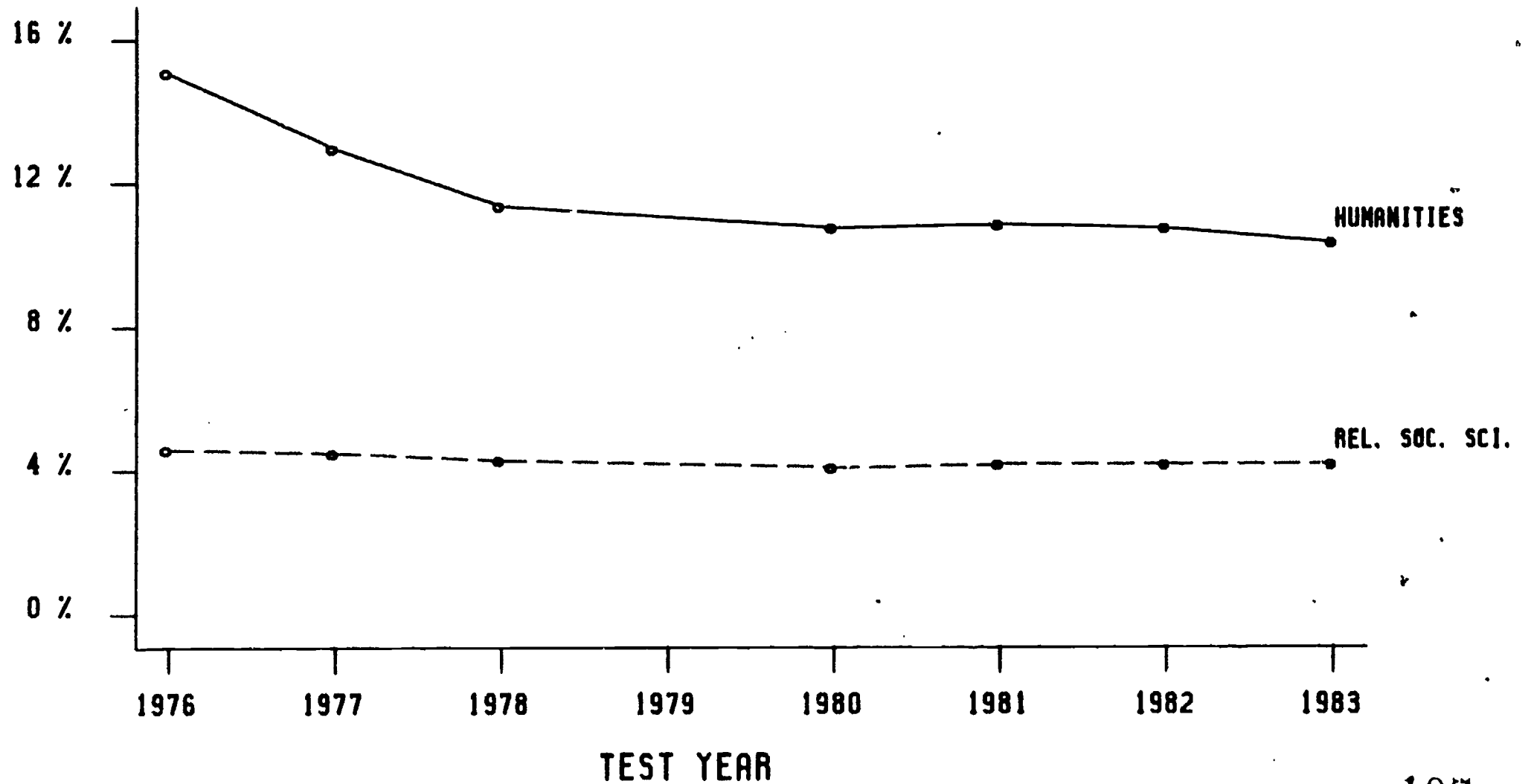
Numbers Entering the Humanities (Tables 2a-2m, 3a-3l, and 4)

The number of U.S. citizens planning to major in the humanities declined 47% in the seven-year period from 1976 to 1983. In the humanities-related social sciences the decline was 29%.

There was an overall decline in the number of students taking the GRE in nearly every field. For all major fields combined, the decline was 23%. In 1976, prospective humanities majors constituted 15.1% of all U.S. citizens specifying a major; by 1983 that proportion had dropped to 10.4% (Figure 27). The greatest percentage decrease was among those planning to major in "other humanities" and "other foreign languages" besides those listed. We currently do not know what those "other" fields were. The major field code list was not changed during the seven-year period studied. So it was clearly not the case that some new field was added that was once included in "other." Aside from these unknown fields, the major showing the greatest overall percentage decrease was French (58% decline). The smallest proportional declines were among those planning to enter religious studies (13%) and linguistics (22%).

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Graphs showing the trends in numbers of students planning to enter the more commonly selected major fields within the humanities are shown in Figure 28. The most frequently selected foreign languages -- French and Spanish -- also showed steady declines (Figure 29).

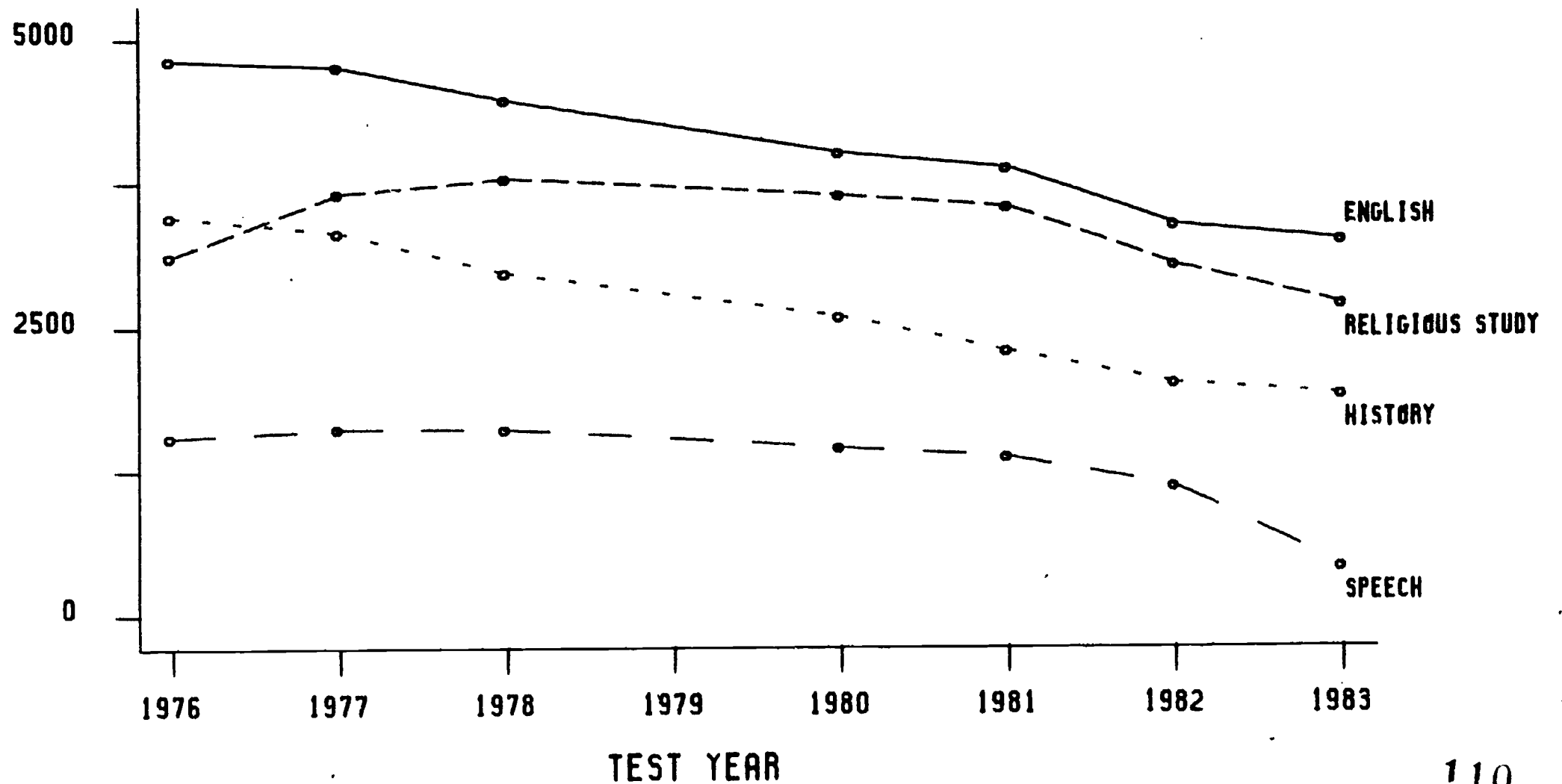
Those planning to enter the related social sciences declined from 4.6% to 4.2% of all citizens taking the GRE and specifying an intended major field. The decrease was greatest in sociology (54% decline) and second greatest in anthropology (48%). (Figure 30). Of all the major fields included under humanities or under related social sciences, only one showed an increase in numbers. The number planning to major in international relations rose 27% over the seven-year period.

Another pattern worthy of note was that, among U.S. citizens, the total number taking the GRE rose to a peak in 1978 and then declined. Among those planning to enter the humanities, however, there was a steady monotonic decline from 1976 onwards. In the humanities-related social sciences the peak occurred in 1977. Our data, unfortunately, cannot account for these trend differences.

According to examinees' self reports, the number of foreign students planning to enter the humanities peaked in 1980 and then, by 1983, declined to a point 6% lower than its 1976 value. For all major fields combined, the number of foreign students rose gradually until 1981 and began slowly declining. We need to mention here that because of some graduate school policies regarding restricted admission of foreign students, we have reason to believe that some foreign students are either omitting the citizenship item or are identifying themselves as citizens so that they will not be excluded. The extent to which

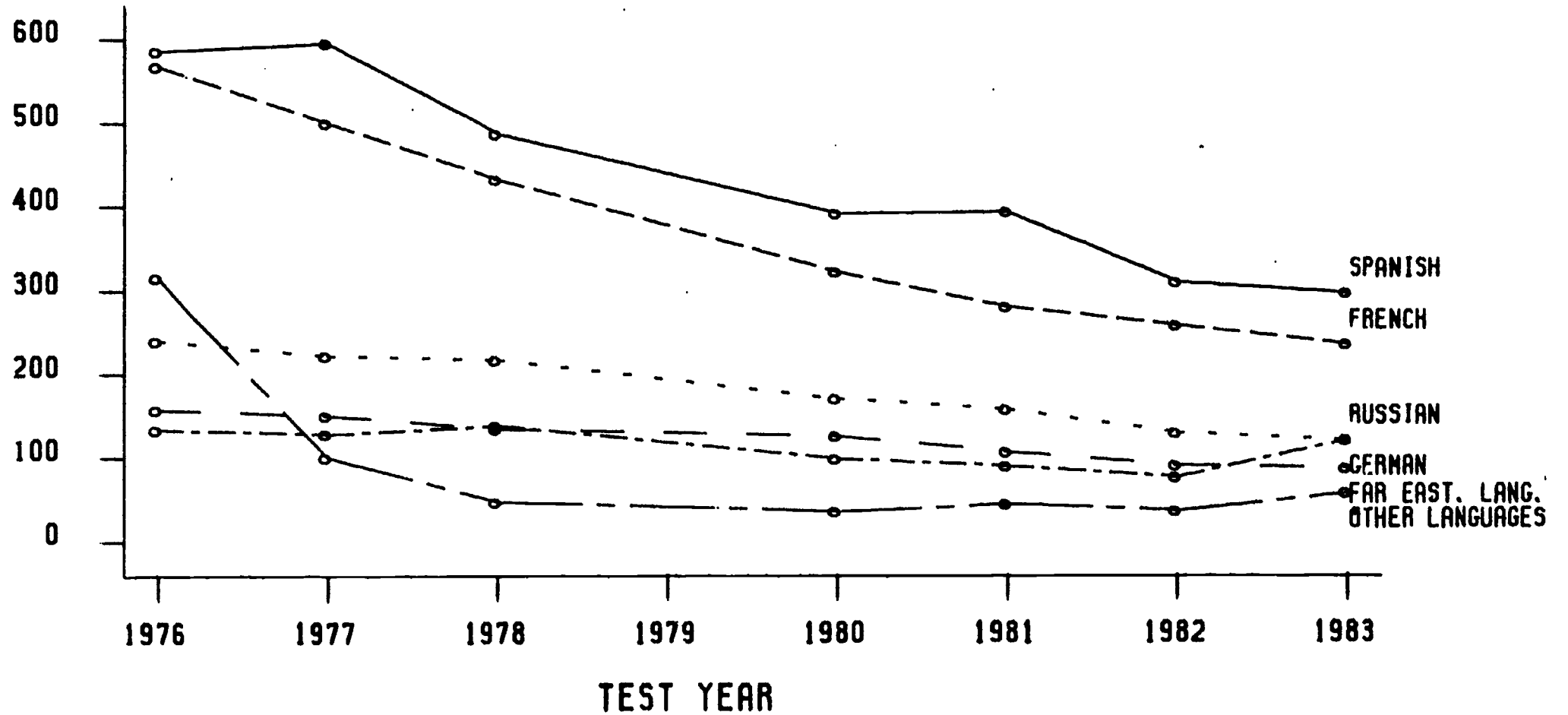
NUMBER OF U.S. CITIZENS PLANNING GRADUATE STUDY IN THE MOST POPULAR HUMANITIES AREAS

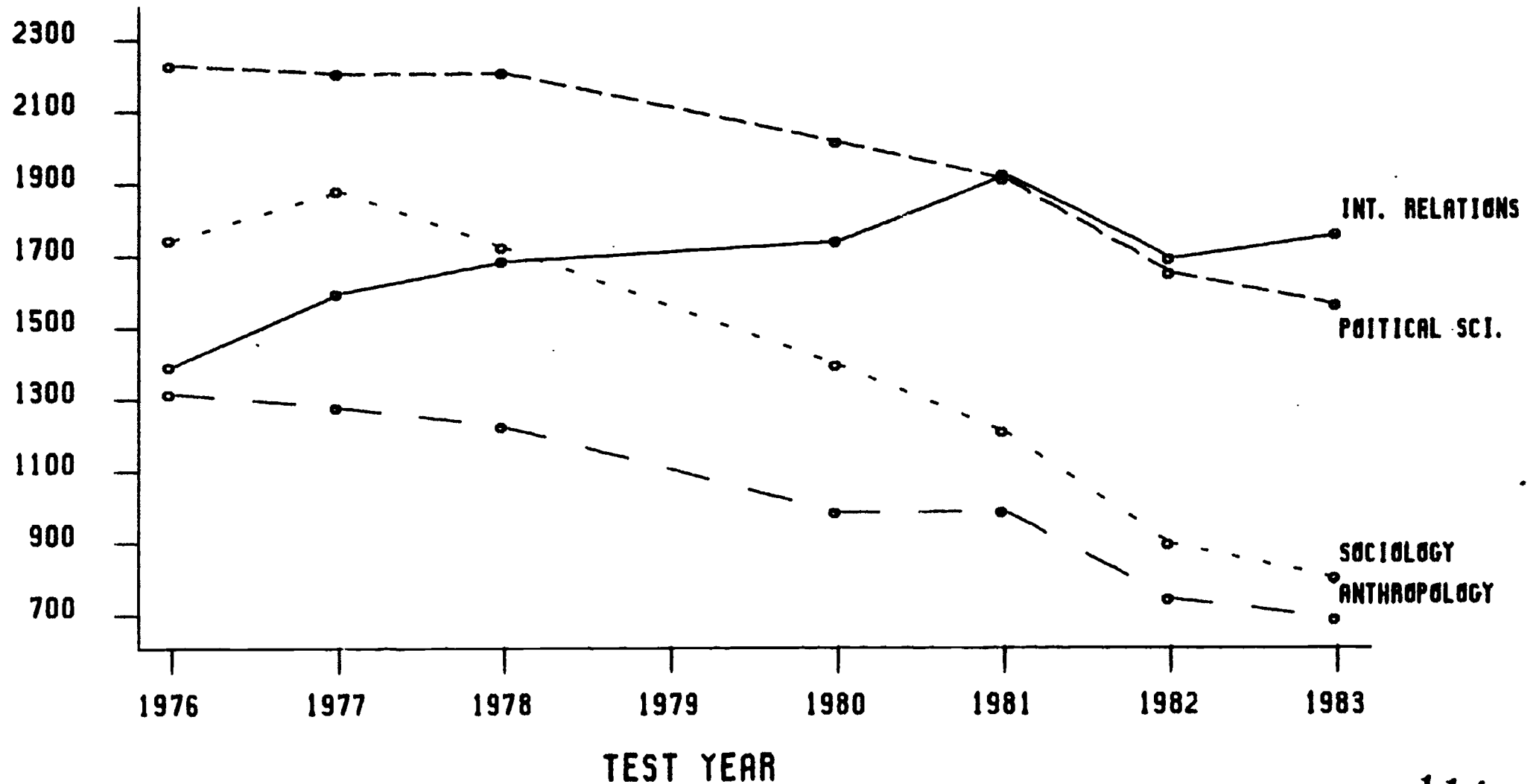
NUMBERS PLANNING GRADUATE STUDY IN FOREIGN LANGUAGES (ALL U. S. CITIZENS)

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our data are affected by the incorrect classification of foreign students is, unfortunately, not known at present.

Comparing males and females, we found very similar trends for prospective humanities majors. Slightly more than half of all examinees planning to major in the humanities were women; both sexes showed nearly identical declines. In the related social sciences the proportion of women has been gradually increasing. The slight decline in 1983 is probably the result of the inclusion of Slavic studies with Russian.

When broken down by ethnic group, we found some differences in the trends for Whites and Blacks. The number of Whites intending to enter the humanities declined 47%, while Blacks declined 58%. Of all GRE examinees specifying a major field, the percentage of Whites who planned to enter humanities dropped from 15% to 11%. A consistently smaller percentage of Blacks chose humanities. In 1983 only 6% of all Blacks planned to enter humanities.

In humanities-related social sciences, the number of Blacks peaked in 1977, and then declined 40%. Overall, in the past seven years, the number of Blacks planning to enter the humanities-related social sciences declined only 20%, while the number of Whites declined 32%. Blacks also had a proportionately greater interest in majoring in sociology than did Whites. In 1983, 16% of all U. S. citizens planning to major in sociology were Black.

The other ethnic minorities were very small in number, each constituting less than 2% of the total GRE population. All ethnic groups showed declines in the numbers planning to major in the humanities.

Proportions of All Prospective Humanities Majors Planning to Enter Specific Fields (Tables 5a-5d)

Of all U.S. citizens taking the GRE and planning to enter the humanities, 28% planned to major in English in 1983. Slightly less than one-fourth planned to enter religious studies, and 16% selected history. These three fields accounted for two thirds of all prospective humanities majors. In 1976, however, students planning to enter these fields accounted for only half of all humanities majors. Some of this shift in emphasis can be accounted for by the addition of speech pathology as a major field category in 1983. Prior to that year, some students planning to major in speech pathology apparently marked speech. In the trend data, therefore, we see a large drop in the number selecting speech.

The greatest proportional increase was among those planning to study religion. The percentage of humanities majors entering religious studies increased from 14% to 23%. The greatest proportional decline was among those in "other humanities" which decreased from 17% to only 4% of the total humanities population.

Male and female prospective humanities majors differed considerably in their interests. In 1983, the greatest proportion of men entering the humanities (35%) planned to major in religious studies, while the greatest proportion of women entering the humanities (36%) planned to study English.

In the humanities-related social sciences, there was a proportional increase in those planning to study international relations, from 21% to 37% of all citizens entering the related social sciences. Again there were very large sex differences. In 1983, 40% of the men planning to enter a related social science chose political science,

whereas the most popular and growing field for women was international relations (18% in 1976 to 39% in 1983).

What is important to realize from these analyses is that women entering the "humanities" and the related social sciences are, to a large extent, entering different major fields than men are, and the patterns of decline are different for each sex.

Undergraduate Major Field Backgrounds of Humanities Majors
(Tables 6a-6d and 7a-7d)

Increasingly greater proportions of students planning to do graduate work in the humanities did their undergraduate work in some other field.

Among prospective humanities majors, the proportion who did their undergraduate work in humanities dropped from 85% in 1976 to 78% in 1983. Students entered the humanities in greater numbers from "other majors," so that by 1983, the percentage of all prospective graduate humanities majors who had done their undergraduate work in an "other major" had risen from 12% to 18%. Less than 5% had majors in a related social science.

Of those entering a related social science, the proportion with an undergraduate major in a related social science decreased from 76% to 67% during that period. The percentage who did their undergraduate work in an "other major" increased from 11% to 17% -- a rise very similar to that observed among graduate humanities majors.

The proportions were somewhat different for men and women, but both showed the same general pattern. Among men planning to do graduate work in the humanities, the percentage whose undergraduate major was in the humanities decreased from 82% to 76%. For women, the

decrease was from 87% to 80%. In the related social sciences there were no differences between men and women.

For most examinees planning to do graduate work in the humanities, the undergraduate major was identical to the intended graduate major. The proportion, however, having the same specific undergraduate and intended graduate majors decreased between 1976 and 1983. The following brief table shows, for those examinees choosing each of the five most popular humanities or related social science majors, the percentage who did their undergraduate work in the same major field.

We see that a decreasing percentage of examinees planning graduate work in the humanities and related social sciences had undergraduate degrees in the same field. In seven fields, we found that the majority of students did their undergraduate work in a different area of the humanities or in a different related social science. The following brief table shows the percentage whose undergraduate major was identical to their intended graduate major for these seven fields:

What these figures may indicate is the scarcity of undergraduate departments in these subjects. If that is the case, all but two appear to be becoming even more scarce.

Graduate Major Field Choices of Undergraduate Humanities Majors
(Tables 8a-8d and 9a-9d)

In the previous analysis, we examined the flow of students into the humanities at the graduate level. By shifting our focus, we can examine the flow of students out of the humanities at the undergraduate level. In 1976, 59% of the GRE examinees who studied humanities as their undergraduate major planned to continue on to major in humanities at the graduate level. This percentage decreased slightly to 56% by 1983. A small percentage (about 5%) planned to enter a related social science. The remainder chose various other major fields.

Students with undergraduate degrees in a humanities-related social science were more likely to change majors than to stay in the social sciences. The number planning to continue their graduate work in a related social science rose slightly from 40% to 43%.

In the following fields, more students intended to do their graduate work in some other major outside of the humanities or related social sciences, and this was true for all seven years studied:

American studies
English
History
French
Spanish
Political science
Sociology

In many fields, the proportion who planned to go on to do graduate work in the same field was very small. It was quite astounding to see that of all undergraduates who majored in sociology, took the GRE, and planned to attend graduate school, only 24% (in 1983) planned to major in sociology. Furthermore, this number had declined from 28% in 1976. The majority of sociology majors (actually 68%) in 1983 planned to major in some field outside of the humanities or related social sciences.

While these figures on first glance are surprising, it may well be that these students were entering a field that was similar to their undergraduate major but was classified in our study as being outside of humanities or related social sciences. For example, the sociology majors might have pursued degrees in social work; the English and history majors might have planned to enter teaching. Unfortunately, it was beyond the scope of this study to analyze major fields in greater detail. Thus, we do not know at this time what other fields these examinees may have planned to enter.

There was a sizable sex difference in these figures for both the humanities and the related social sciences. While neither sex showed much of a change over the seven year period studied, there was a consistently greater proportion of men planning to pursue graduate work in the same area as their undergraduate work. In 1983, 62% of the men who had majored in the humanities as undergraduates intended to continue in the humanities; only 52% of the women planned to stay

in the humanities. Of those who majored in a related social science, 48% of the men and 40% of the women stayed in that area. A greater proportion of women than men, therefore, intended to change major fields.

The following table lists, separately by sex, the undergraduate fields that students most often left to pursue graduate work in another field outside of humanities or related social sciences:

What these results seem to suggest is that greater proportions of students in 1983 changed majors — both into and out of the humanities — than they did seven years earlier, and a greater percentage of women did so than men.

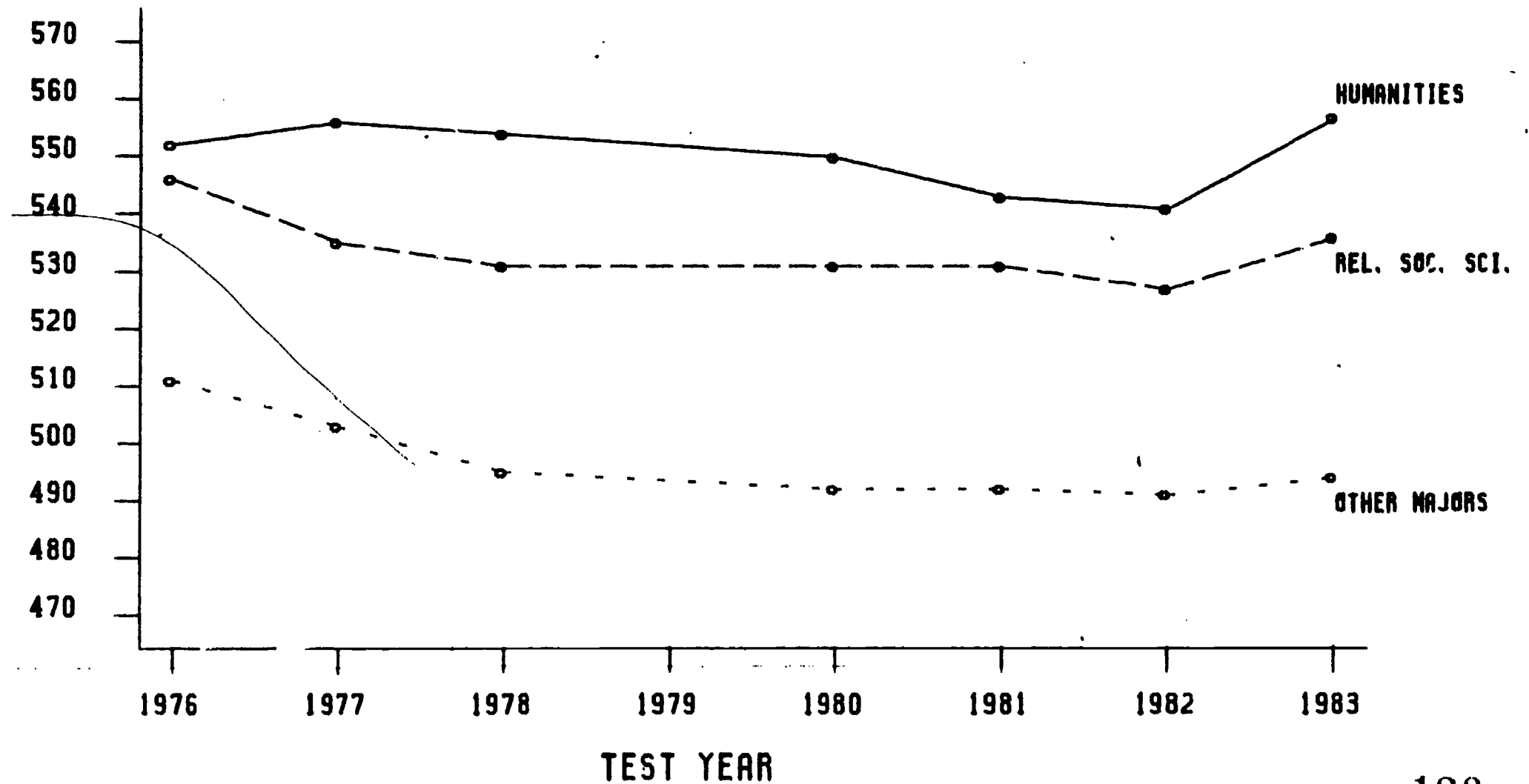
GRE Verbal Score Averages (Tables 10a-10m)

In 1983, the mean GREV score for U.S. citizens planning to enter the humanities was 55 points higher than the average for all majors combined. Those intending to major in the related social sciences scored 34 points higher than average. (See Figure 31.)

Among prospective humanities majors the highest average scores were consistently obtained by those planning to study classical languages; the lowest were in speech. Among the three most fre-

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quently selected major fields within the humanities, students planning to major in English had the highest GREV scores (Figure 32).

The highest scoring examinees planning to enter the related social sciences were in anthropology; the lowest were in sociology. More specifically, for 1983, score averages for those planning to enter each major field could be ranked as follows:

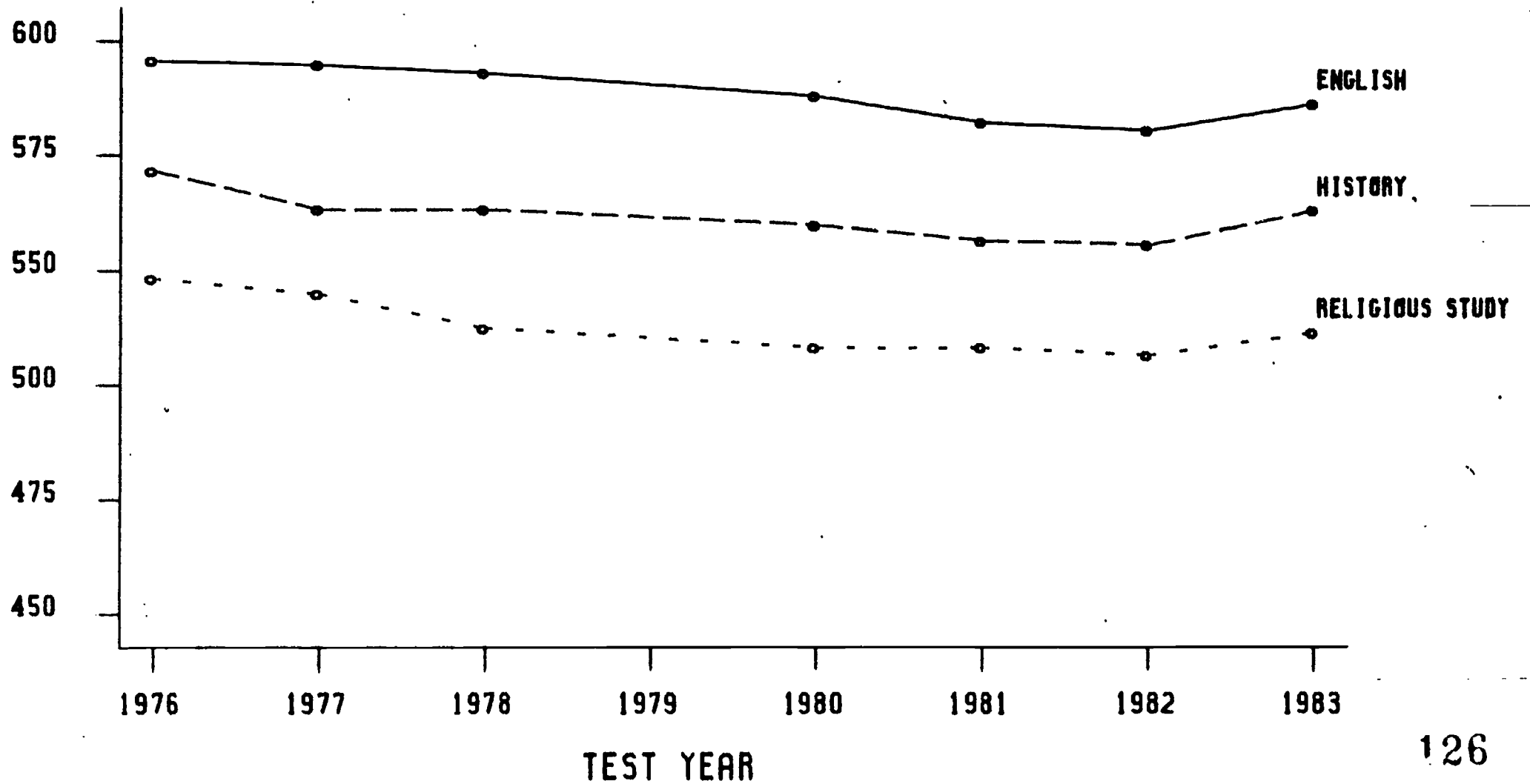

Overall, GRE Verbal scores for U.S. citizens specifying a major field showed a 17-point decline between 1976 and 1983. Prospective humanities majors rose 4 points; those entering the related social sciences declined 11 points.

Perhaps more important is the finding that between 1976 and 1982, average scores for examinees entering all but three humanities fields showed a decline. Overall there was an 11-point score decline for prospective humanities majors. In the last year, however, from 1982 to 1983, all scores rose except for those in archaeology and near

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eastern languages, which dropped only 5 points and 1 point, respectively. Average scores for all prospective humanities majors increased 15 points between 1982 and 1983.

Comparing prospective humanities majors with examinees planning to enter all major fields combined, we found that in 1976 those planning to study humanities scored 34 points above average. By 1983 the gap had increased to 55 points.

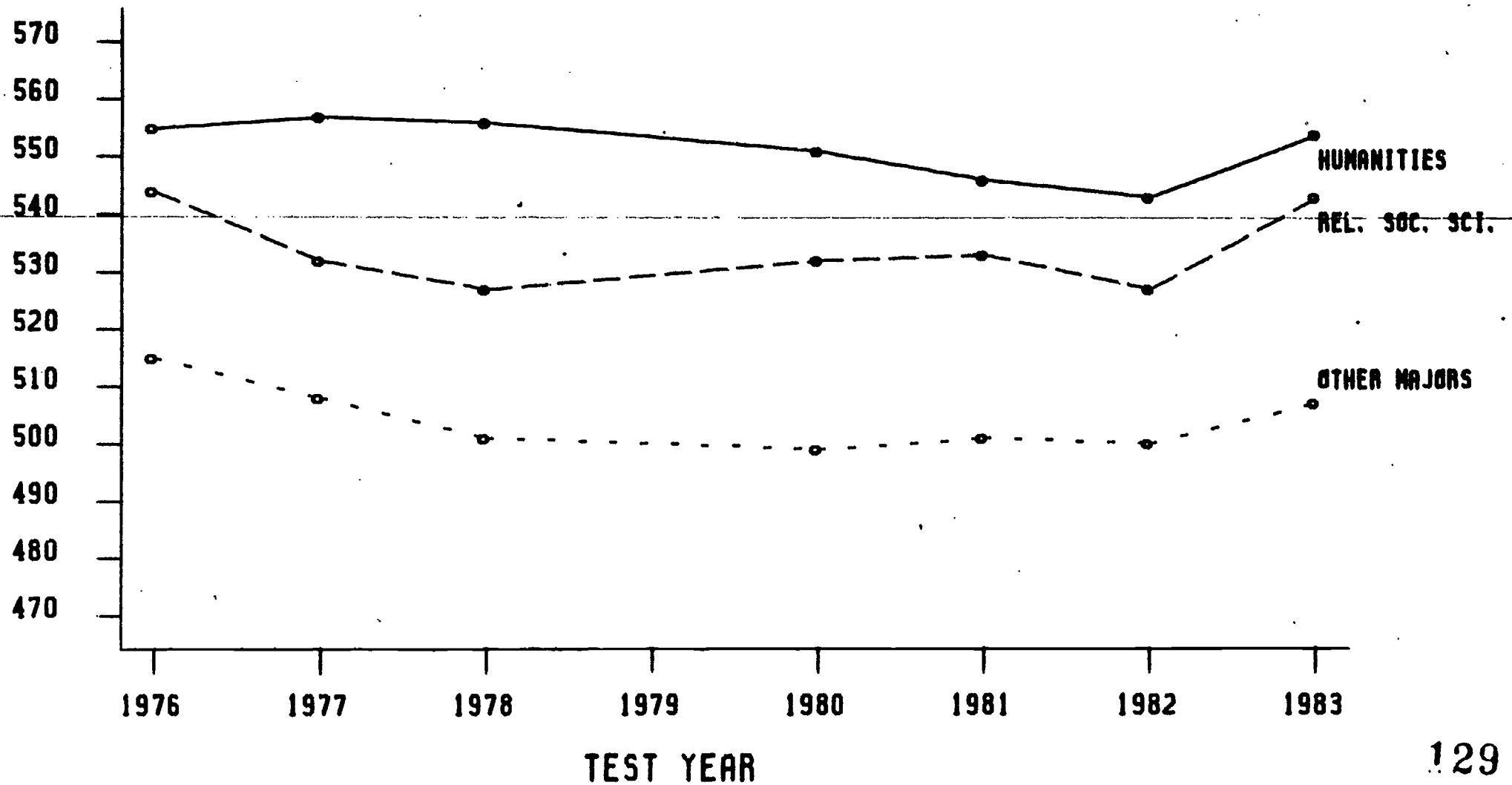
With all major fields combined, male U.S. citizens scored an average of 21 points higher than females in 1983 (Figures 33 and 34). ~~Among those planning to enter the humanities, however, there was a~~ smaller difference between men and women. Furthermore, in 1983, the mean score for female prospective humanities majors was 7 points higher than the mean for males. Over the seven-year period studied, women's scores rose an average of 11 points, while men's scores showed an average decline of 1 point. Perhaps of greatest interest is the sudden rise in scores for both sexes in 1983. In only one year, men increased 10 points, on the average, and women increased a full 21 points.

These findings indicate that the differences generally observed between the verbal test scores of males and females do not hold true of students entering the humanities. In fact, in 1983, women outperformed men by 7 points. What little difference (5 points) there was in 1976 was reduced still further and reversed by 1983.

Among those entering the related social sciences the mean for females in 1983 was 15 points lower than that for males. That year showed what appears to be a "recovery" for men -- their average scores increased to a value near the mean for 1976. Women's scores, while

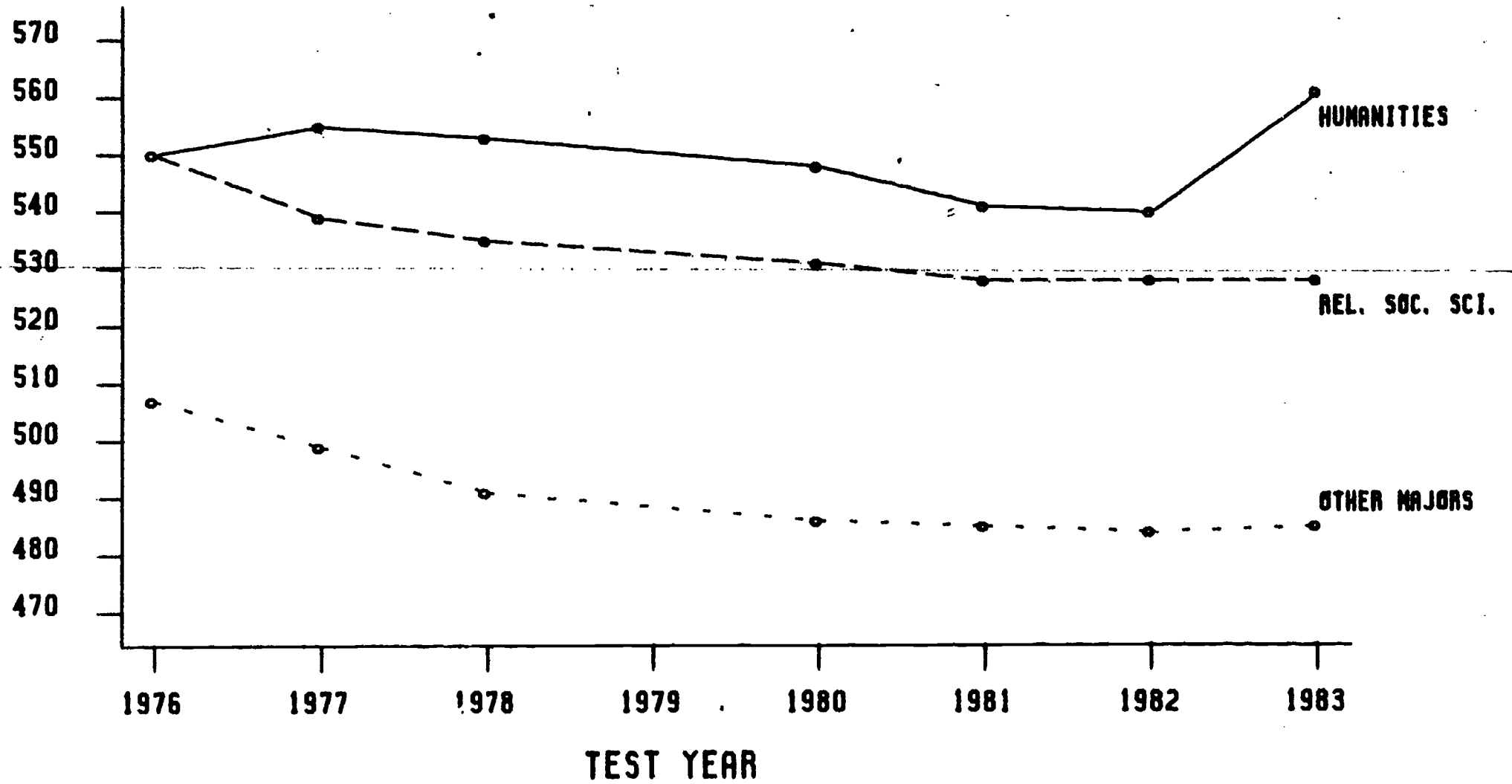
MEAN GRE VERBAL SCORES (MALE CITIZENS ONLY)

they did not continue to decline beyond 1981, only remained stable for the last two years.

Examining different ethnic groups, we found that the GREV scores of Whites planning to enter the humanities rose 3 points, overall. In 1976, prospective humanities majors scored 32 points higher than average; in 1983 they scored 50 points higher. Blacks planning to enter the humanities showed a considerable score increase of 20 points. In 1976, those planning graduate work in the humanities scored 19 points above average; by 1983 they scored 46 points above average.

The scores of Mexican-Americans rose 25 points over the seven-year period studied. In 1976 prospective humanities majors scored 12 points above average, and by 1983 they scored 36 points above average. Puerto Ricans showed a similar pattern. Those planning to study humanities scored 6 points above average in 1976 and 36 points above average in 1983. Similarly, American Indians entering the humanities scored 33 points higher than average in 1976 and 50 points higher than average in 1983. Finally, Orientals planning to major in humanities scored 21 points above average in 1976 and 43 points above average in 1983.

GRE Verbal Scores of Undergraduate and Prospective Graduate Humanities Majors (Tables 11a-11d, 12a-12b, 13a-13d, and 14a-14b)

In addition to analyzing the numbers of examinees having various combinations of undergraduate and intended graduate majors, we examined the mean GRE scores of students with each of these combinations.

Examinees who planned to enter the humanities from "other" major

fields had consistently lower average verbal scores than those who did their undergraduate work in the humanities or a related social science. Compared with those examinees having degrees in "other majors," those with humanities degrees scored from 15 to 30 points higher, on the average.

Until 1983, there was a striking sex difference among prospective humanities majors. Men whose undergraduate major was in the humanities scored higher than men whose major was in a related social science. For women planning to major in humanities, the highest scores were obtained by those who majored in a related social science as undergraduates. This pattern was consistent from 1976 to 1982, and then in 1983, the pattern for women was the same as that for men. Between 1982 and 1983, the scores for women with undergraduate degrees in humanities and planning graduate work in humanities rose 25 points. degrees in humanities.

For examinees planning to major in a humanities-related social science, those with degrees in the humanities had consistently higher GREV scores than those with degrees in a related social science or "other" major. The differences were, in fact, quite large. In 1983, the mean score of those entering a related social science with a degree in the humanities was 575. Those with degrees in a related social science had a mean score of only 527, and those with a degree in an "other" major had a mean of only 530. The same general pattern held for the other years as well. There appeared to be no sex differences in these patterns for students entering the related social sciences.

One other important observation was that examinees planning to major in some "other" field (besides humanities or a related social

science) also had higher GREV scores if they majored in the humanities as undergraduates.

Viewing these data from a different perspective — by focussing on undergraduate major — we found that, among U. S. citizens with a degree in the humanities, the higher scoring students were planning to enter related social science. In 1983, humanities majors entering a related social science had a mean GREV score of 575. This was 12 points higher than the average for those planning to go on in the humanities. A similar phenomenon occurred for students with degrees in a related social science — those who planned to enter the humanities had scores 22 points higher, on the average, than those who planned to remain in the related social sciences. These figures suggest that a student who plans to change fields for graduate work does so only if his/her test scores are higher than those of competing students who are likely to have a stronger academic background in the graduate subject area.

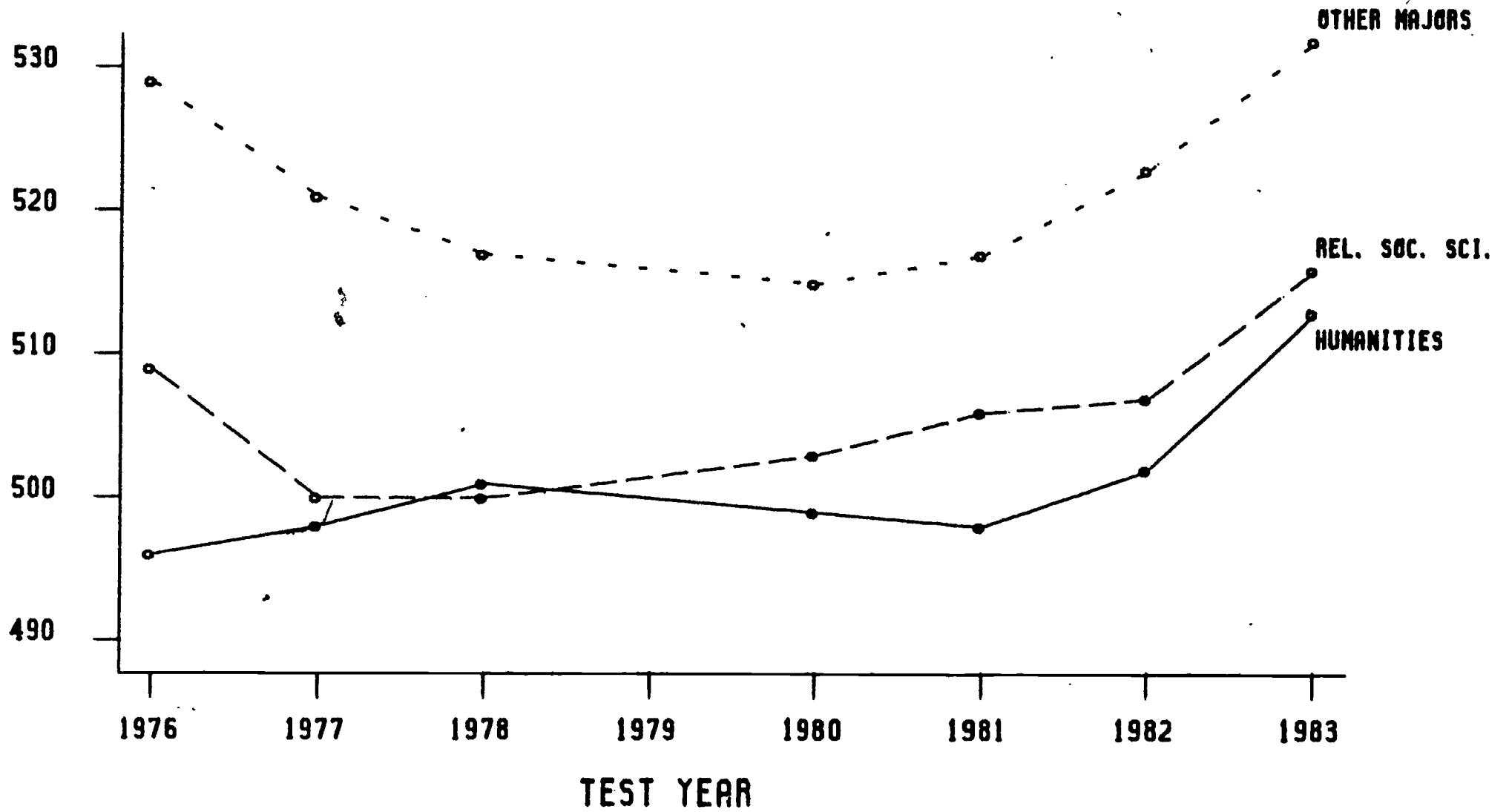
GRE Quantitative Score Averages (Tables 15a-15m)

GRE Quantitative scores increased 17 points between 1976 and 1983 among U.S. citizens planning to major in the humanities. Those entering related social sciences increased 6 points. (See Figure 35.)

Among U.S. citizens overall, there was an increase of 6 points in mean GREQ score. In 1976, humanities majors scored 27 points lower than average; by 1983, their scores were only 16 points below the average for all majors. Those planning to major in related social sciences tended to score about 5 points higher than prospective humanities majors.

In 1983 the highest GREQ scores in the humanities were obtained by prospective examinees planning to major in far eastern languages, classical languages, and philosophy; the lowest were obtained by those planning to study Spanish, speech, and art history. Among examinees entering related social sciences, those planning to major in international relations scored highest; lowest scoring were sociology majors.

Comparing males and females, we found that among prospective humanities majors the mean scores of females rose 24 points (Figure 36), and the means of males rose 9 points (Figure 37). Women entering related social sciences rose 8 points; men increased 12 points.

There was a considerable sex difference in the scores themselves, though that difference was not so great among prospective humanities majors as it was among all majors combined. Overall, the score difference between males and females was 82 points in 1976, and the difference was still 85 points by 1983. Among prospective humanities majors the difference in 1976 was 58 points; by 1983 it had narrowed somewhat to 43 points. Among those entering the related social sciences the difference was 51 points in 1976 and 55 points in 1983. Thus,

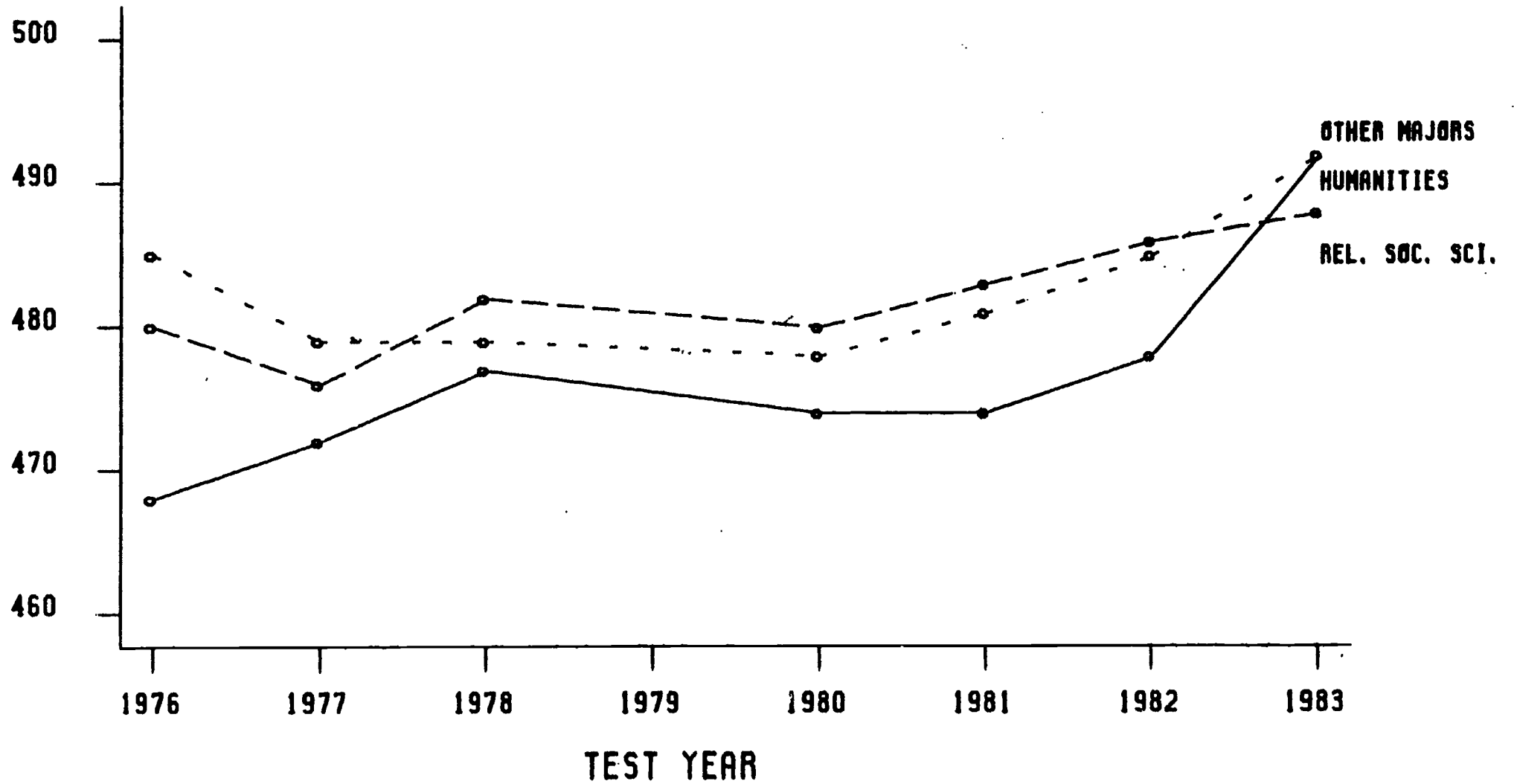
it appeared that among students planning to major in the humanities, differences in the quantitative skills of men and women were not so pronounced as they were among examinees entering other majors.

GRE Quantitative Scores of Undergraduate and Graduate Humanities Majors
(Tables 16a-16d, 17a-17b, 18a-18d, and 19a-19b)

Not surprisingly, GRE Quantitative scores showed a different pattern from verbal scores. Among prospective humanities majors, those who did their undergraduate work in an "other" field scored, on the average, consistently higher on the GREQ over all seven years. The difference between those with a degree in humanities compared with

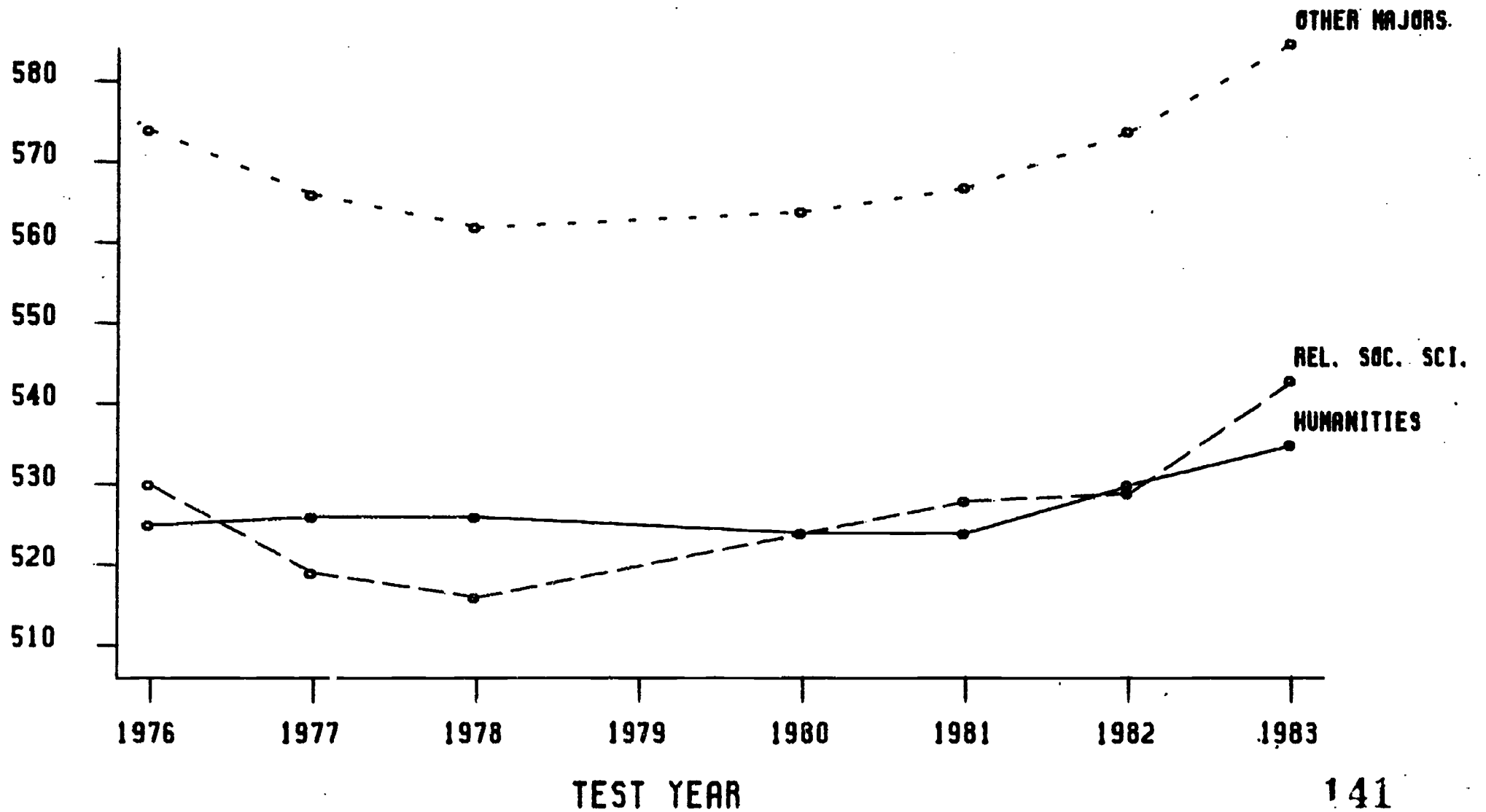
MEAN GRE QUANTITATIVE SCORES (FEMALE CITIZENS ONLY)

those having a degree in an "other" major became smaller over time, as scores for those with humanities degrees increased.

This pattern also held true for men alone, but it was not the case for women prior to 1983. Women with degrees in a related social science had consistently higher mean GREQ scores than women with degrees in either the humanities or an "other" field. In 1983, women with humanities degrees showed a sudden rise in GREQ scores.

Among examinees planning to major in a related social science, there was an increase of 17 points in the mean GREQ score of those who did their undergraduate studies in the humanities. The lowest average GREQ scores were consistently obtained by those with undergraduate majors also in the related social sciences.

Focussing on students with undergraduate degrees in the humanities, we found that regardless of sex, those planning to enter the related social sciences had the highest GREQ scores. In 1983, the average scores of humanities majors entering the related social sciences was 16 points higher than that of humanities majors planning to continue in the humanities.

Degree Objectives (Tables 20a-20m)

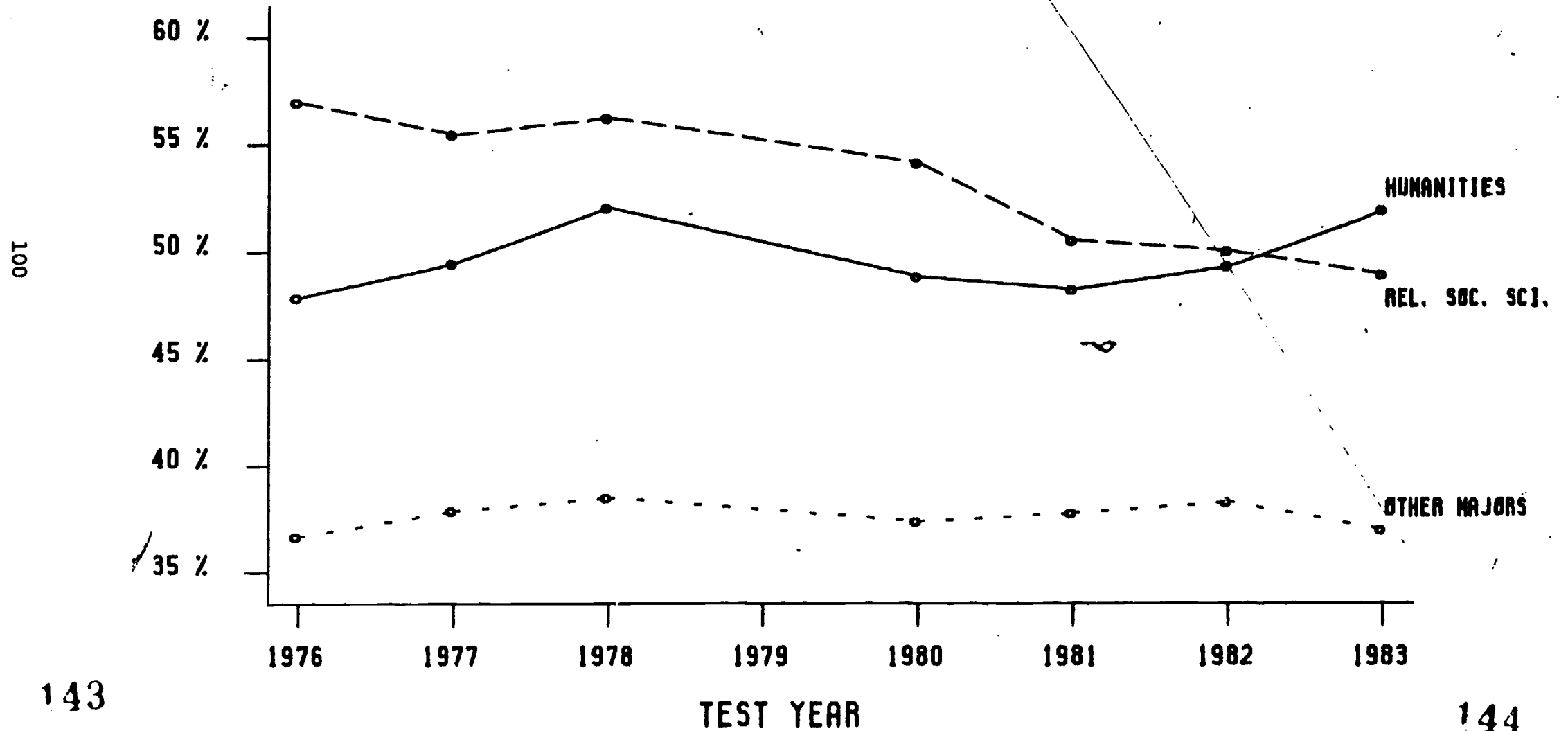
What is your eventual degree objective?

Over 99% of the examinee population included in this study responded to this item. Those intending to major in the humanities or related social sciences generally expressed higher than average educational goals (Figure 38). Among U.S. citizens in 1983, 52.8% of the

prospective humanities majors and 49.3% of those entering a related social science planned to obtain more than a master's degree. The average for all other majors combined was only 39.2%.

The major field with the highest proportion of examinees planning to obtain more than a masters degree in 1983 was philosophy (88%); the fields with the lowest proportion were "other humanities" (31%) and speech (33%).

Among those planning to major in the related social sciences, there appeared to be a downward trend — from 57% to 49% — in the number of examinees planning to obtain more than a master's degree. The highest proportion was among prospective anthropology majors (76% in 1983); the lowest was among examinees planning to study international relations (36% in 1983).

Foreign students tended to have very slightly higher degree aspirations than U.S. citizens. There were no apparent trends for foreign students. In 1983, the percentage of foreign students intending to obtain more than a master's degree in the humanities was 53%; in the related social sciences it was 51%.

There was a considerable difference between the sexes and between various ethnic groups in their degree objectives. In 1983, 55.7% of the men and 50.0% of the women entering the humanities planned to obtain more than a master's degree. When we examine trends in the humanities, however, we see a greater overall rise in the percentage of women. This suggests that the gap between men and women is decreasing. Between 1982 and 1983, in particular, the percentage of women planning graduate study in the humanities beyond the master's degree rose from 44.5% to 50.0%.

In the related social sciences, the percentage of men and women

seeking more than a master's degree in 1983 were 49.6% and 49.1%, respectively. What differences there were between the sexes in earlier years appear to have vanished by 1983. Both showed irregular trends which converged in 1983.

Among all minority groups, the percentage of examinees planning to study beyond the master's degree is higher than average for prospective humanities majors.

Comparing Whites and Blacks planning to study humanities, the proportion planning to obtain more than a master's degree was nearly always higher among Blacks. The differences were generally around 2%. In the related social sciences, a greater percentage of Whites than Blacks planned to study beyond a master's degree (49% vs. 44% in 1983).

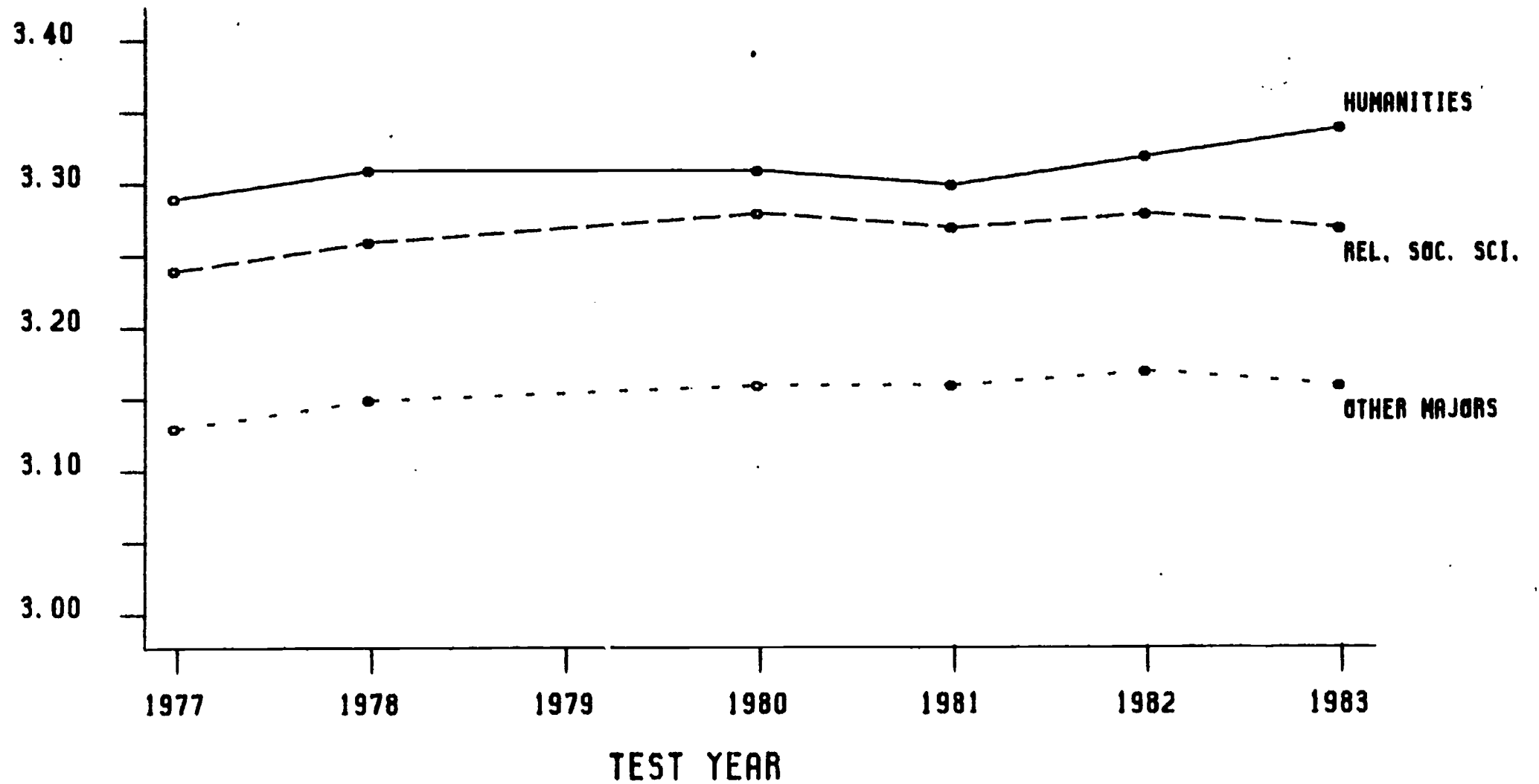

For scoring purposes, we translated A = 4, A- = 3.5, B = 3.0, etc.

Data on grades were available from 1977 onwards. For prospective humanities majors, the average GPA for U.S. citizens fluctuated between 3.29 and 3.34 over the 7-year period studied (Figure 39). Examinees entering the related social sciences had averages between 3.24 and 3.28, while the means for all majors combined ranged from

3.16 to 3.19. These differences were very slight, but they showed a consistent rank ordering with prospective humanities majors being highest, related social sciences being second, and all other majors together being lowest. Furthermore, this same rank ordering held fairly consistently for each analysis subgroup -- for foreign students, for each sex and for each ethnic group separately. This was also the same rank ordering as we saw in GREV scores.

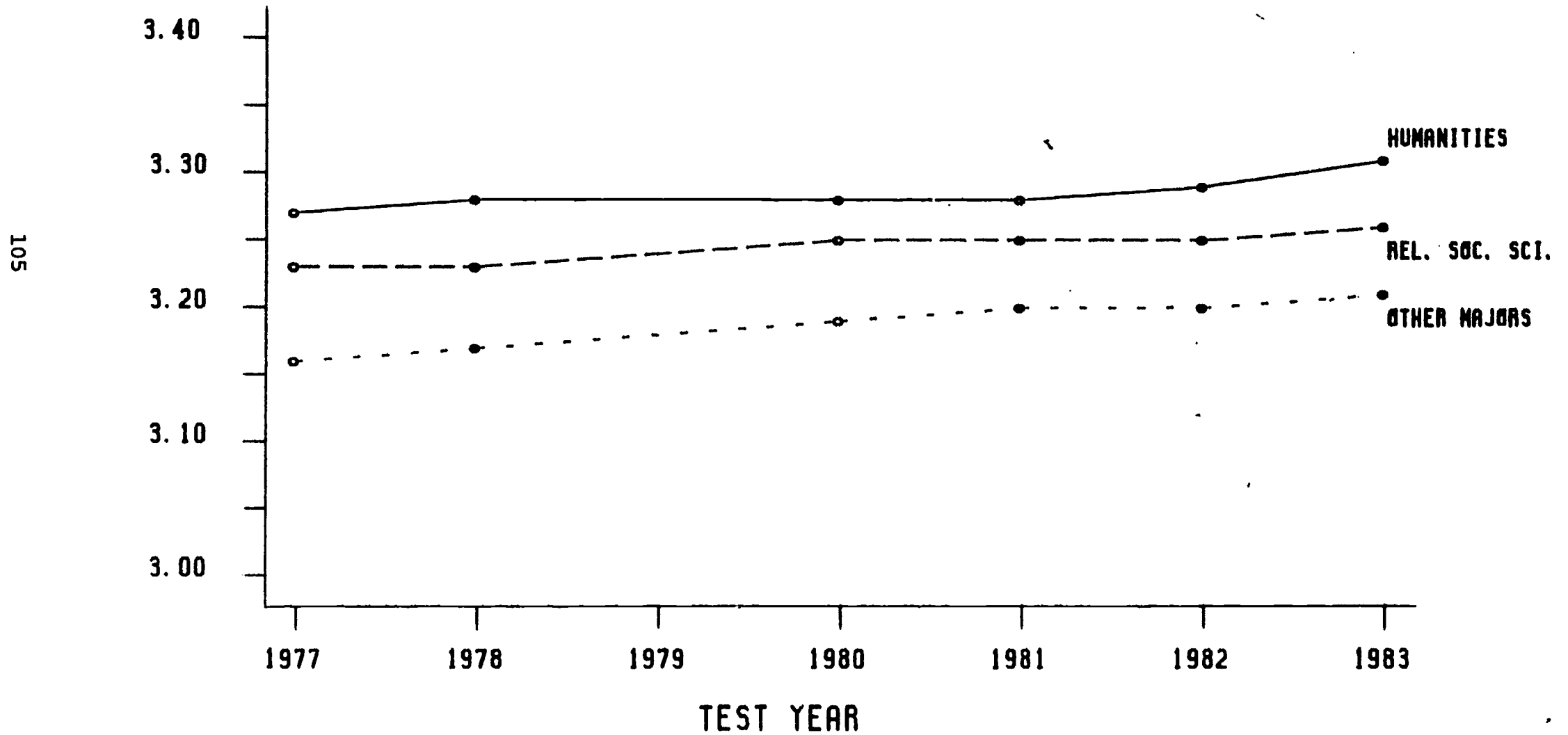

This item was scored the same way as the last one. It too showed the same rank ordering of grade averages with prospective humanities majors being the highest (Figure 40). While overall, grades appear to be rising, for the smaller ethnic subgroups there was little change in GPA over the seven-year period, or the changes seemed to show no trend. Considering the possible effects of grade inflation (or deflation?), we cannot expect trends to be very meaningful. The comparisons across major fields within each year, however, did appear to show enough consistency to be real indicators of the relative abilities of students entering different majors.

Such consistent patterns in the relative grade averages and in GRE verbal scores strongly suggest that prospective humanities majors,

on the average, have truly higher verbal abilities than students entering the related social sciences, and that students entering those social sciences have higher verbal abilities than GRE examinees overall.

English Language Proficiency (Tables 23a-23m)

Do you communicate better in English than in any other language?

(1) Yes (2) No

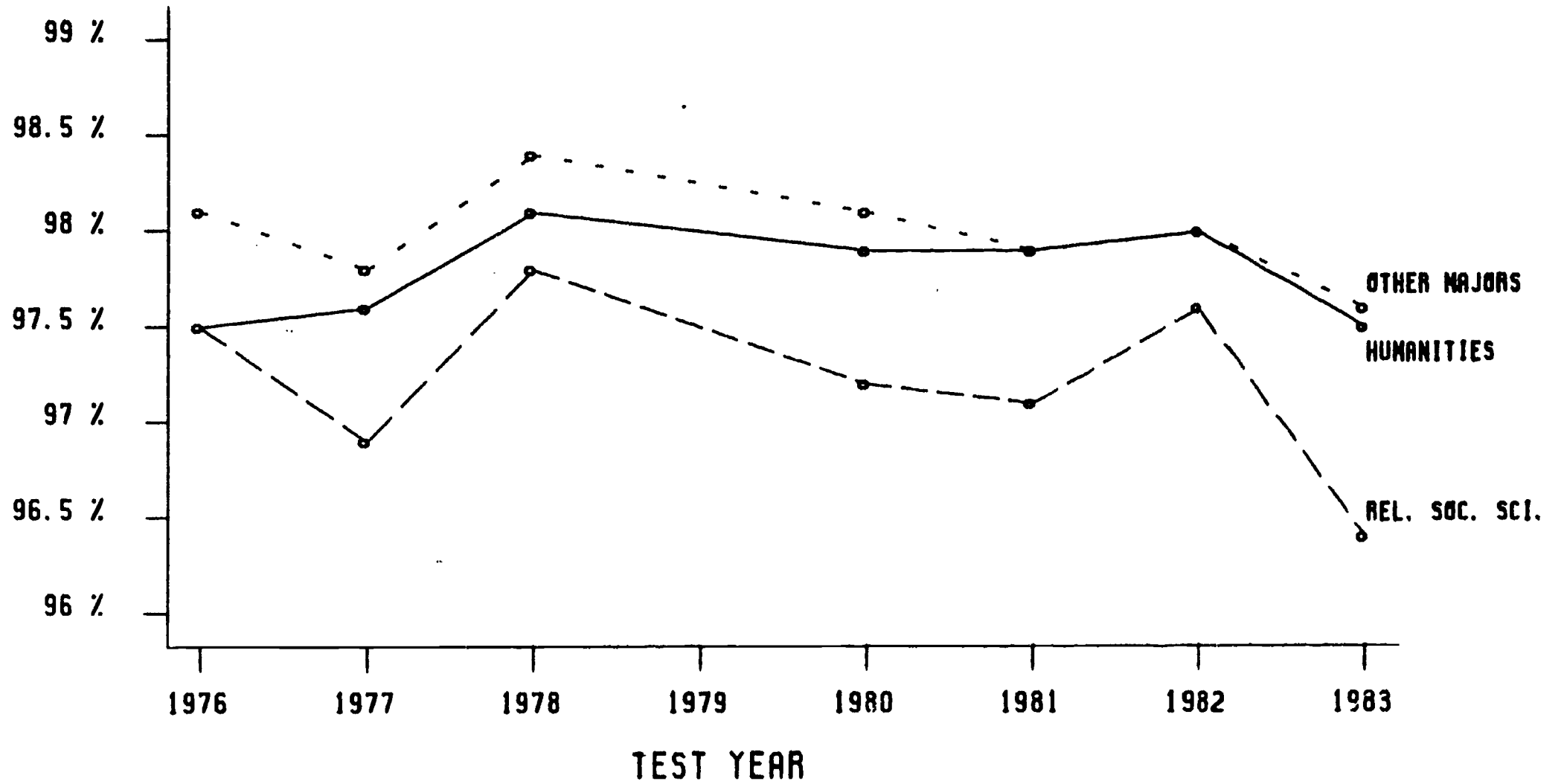
Ninety-nine percent or more of each of the GRE subpopulations answered this question. Among American Indians, 94% answered it.

The percentage of U.S. citizens citing English as their best language did not change much from year to year. (See Figure 41) There was little difference between prospective humanities majors and other examinees.

Among foreign students entering the humanities there was a decline in the percentage citing English as their best language from nearly 48% in 1976 to just under 42% in 1983. Among those entering the related social sciences, there was a similar decline with only 36% of the 1983 examinee population citing English as their best language. Among the other subgroups studied, Mexican-Americans and "other" Hispanics increased in the percentage citing English as their best language. The trends for the remaining ethnic minorities were not clear.

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Average Age of Examinees (Tables 24a-24m)

The registration form asks for the examinee's date of birth, from which we computed age. More than 99% of the examinees in our population supplied that information.

The mean age of all U.S. citizens entering the humanities rose by a year and a half between 1976 and 1983 (from 24.9 to 26.6 years). The rise was not smooth, however. The mean age peaked at 26.9 in 1980. In general, there have been more older students returning for advanced degrees in recent years. While we did not look at distributions of ages for prospective humanities majors, we know from annual publications that the distributions of ages for all examinees are highly skewed to the right (Goodison, 1983, p. 21). In other words, while the greatest percentage of examinees are in their early twenties, the ages range to over 50.

It appears from the 1983 data, that the humanities fields attracting the greatest number of older students were American studies, linguistics, and religious studies. There was considerable year-to-year variation, however, and trends within individual fields were not clearly detectable.

In the humanities-related social sciences the mean age rose from 24.8 to 25.5 years, also peaking in 1980 and then decreasing somewhat. Anthropology showed the most rapid increase in age of students and the highest mean age in 1983 (from 25.0 to 27.4 years).

Among examinees planning to major in the humanities and related social sciences, males and females differed very little in age over the years. The average age of women entering the humanities does appear to be increasing somewhat more rapidly than the average age of

men. This suggests that greater numbers of older women are returning to graduate school. In "other majors" women tended to be slightly older than men; by 1983, the difference was more than a year. This trend, so far, does not hold in the humanities.

Father's Education (Tables 25a-25m)

Beginning in 1979, the GRE background questionnaire asked for mother's and father's education. The question was worded as follows:

What was the highest level of education attained by your father?

- (1) Did not graduate from high school
- (2) High school graduate
- (3) Beyond high school but did not graduate from a four-year college
- (4) Graduate of a four-year college
- (5) Beyond college but did not receive a graduate or professional degree
- (6) Graduate or professional degree

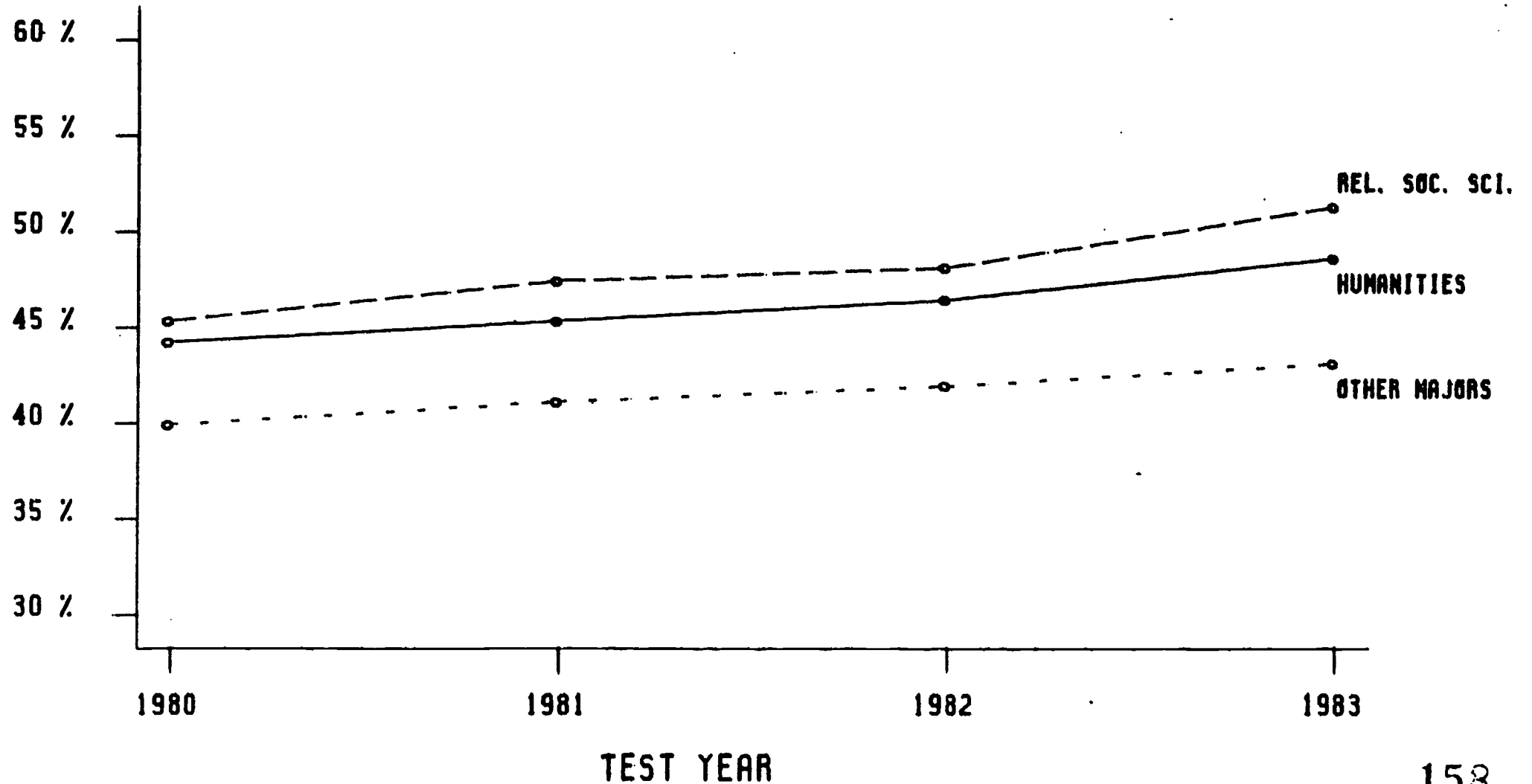
For this question we counted the percentage of examinees answering options 4, 5, or 6. Unfortunately, these data were available for only four years. Furthermore, only 55% of all examinees answered the question, on the average. Thus, when interpreting the results, we must keep in mind that non-response bias may affect our interpretations.

Students planning to enter the humanities and related social sciences reported having fathers with more formal education than did students in "other" major fields.

Among U.S. citizens in 1983, 48.7% of the prospective humanities majors and 51.4% of the related social science majors reported having fathers with a four-year college degree or more (Figure 42). Only 44.2% overall had fathers with a four-year degree. Those with the best educated fathers in 1983 planned to major in art history or comparative literature. In the related social sciences, those with

the best educated fathers were entering international relations. Examinees with the least well educated fathers planned to major in speech or religious studies (within the humanities) or sociology (within the related social sciences).

Comparing males and females, we found that among all U.S. citizens, the fathers of men tended to have slightly more education than the fathers of women. The reverse was true, however, of prospective humanities majors. Among examinees planning to major in the humanities in 1983, 44.8% of the men and 52.69% of the women reported having fathers with a four-year degree or more. Among those entering related social sciences, 49.7% of the men and 53.2% of the women had fathers with four years of college.

Among the various ethnic subgroups, Blacks showed a considerable rise in father's education over the seven-year period. In 1983, those planning to enter the humanities and related social sciences tended to have better educated fathers than examinees planning to study all other majors combined. Data for the other ethnic groups were erratic, probably because those groups were so small.

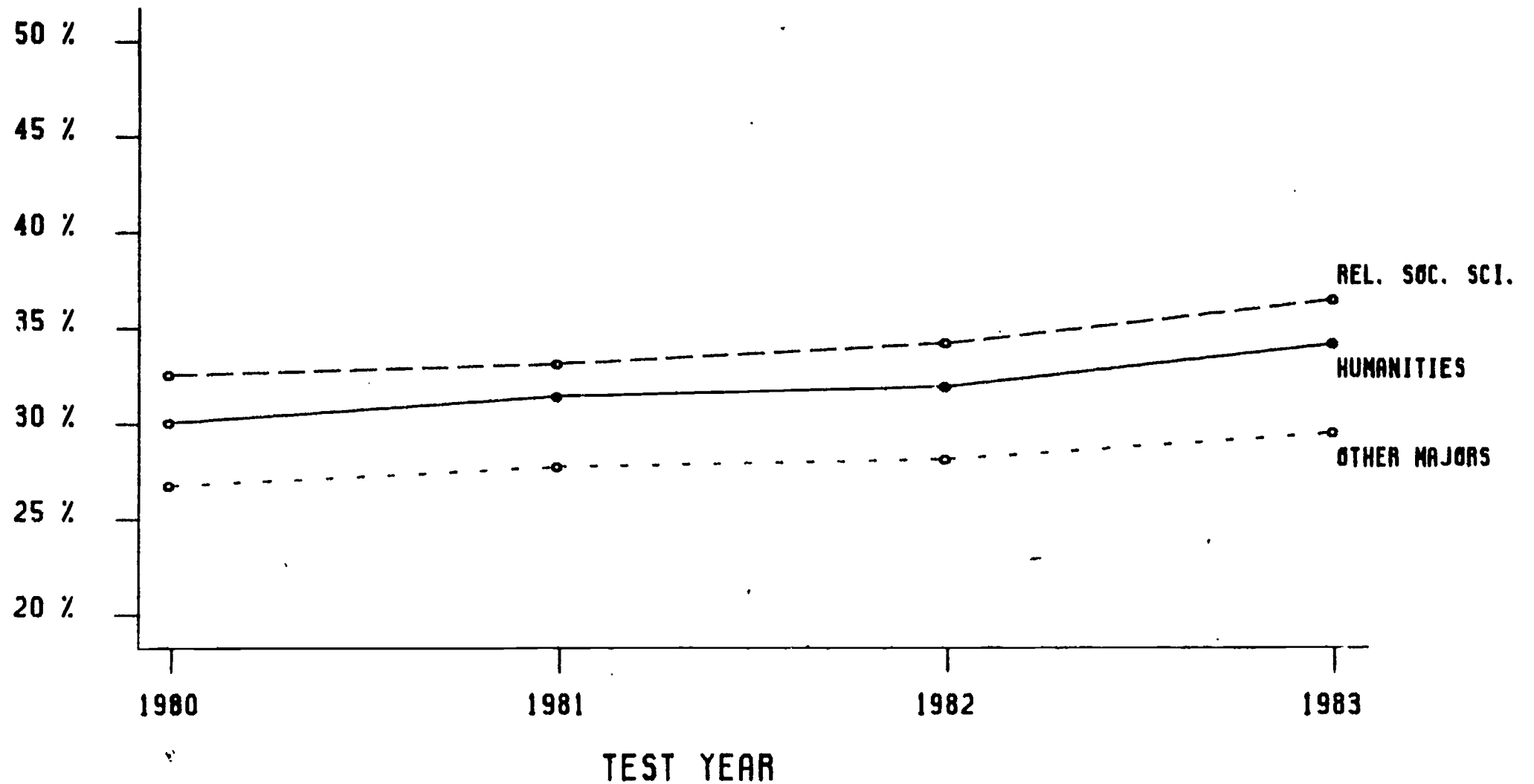
Mother's Education (Tables 26a-26m)

The question pertaining to mother's education was worded the same as for father's education, and the rate of response to the item was nearly identical.

Of those U.S. citizens who responded, we found a steady rise in the proportion of prospective humanities majors reporting that their mothers have a four-year college degree or more (30.1% to 34.3% in just three years). (See Figure 43.) Within the humanities, those planning to major in classical languages in 1983 reported the highest

mother's education (54%).

Examinees planning to enter the related social sciences had mothers with slightly more education than the mothers of prospective humanities majors. Between 1980 and 1983, the percentage of mothers with four-year degrees or more rose from 32.6% to 36.6%.

On the average, examinees entering the humanities and related social sciences reported having better educated mothers than did GRE examinees overall.

Comparing males and females we found that the mothers of women generally had more education than the mothers of men. This was true consistently across nearly all major fields and for every year. In 1983, 38.4% of the women entering the humanities reported that their mothers had a four-year college degree or more; among women entering the related social sciences, that figure was 38.0%; and among women entering other major fields combined, it was only 30.7%. Men, on the other hand, did not show such a difference between prospective humanities majors and those in other fields. The mothers of men entering the humanities appeared to have about the same amount of education as the mothers of men entering other major fields.

Among the various ethnic subgroups, Blacks showed large increases in mother's education as well as father's education. Orientals also showed a considerable rise. Trends among other ethnic groups were not well defined.

One final statement of caution needs to be made regarding parents' education. The questions on father's and mother's education received the lowest response of any item we analyzed in this study. Some of the differences we observe between the averages for intended

major fields and between the sexes are quite small. These differences may not exist in the total population of GRE examinees.

Conclusions and Discussion

At the beginning of this study, we posed seven basic questions about students planning to enter the humanities. From our analyses of all available SAT and GRE data, we are now able to answer these questions. In this section we will address each question, discussing some of the results obtained and their possible implications.

1. Has there been a decline in SAT and GRE Scores among prospective humanities majors as there has been among students in general?

Between 1975 and 1983, the mean SAT Verbal score of students taking the SAT and planning to major in some area of the humanities increased by 17 points, while the scores for all majors combined declined by 10 points. This finding clearly suggests that only the more able students are entering the humanities and that the lower-scoring students who might have entered the humanities in the past are now selecting some other major field.

Those entering the humanities-related social sciences are also scoring higher than their predecessors. Their average SAT Verbal score was 11 points higher in 1983 than in 1975.

While the average for all students entering the humanities increased, there was a considerable difference in the scores and score trends of students entering specific major fields. The greatest increases were among students planning to major in history and cultures, and in English and literature. There was a very large decline (47 points) among those planning to major in philosophy or religion. Because of the way the questionnaire was worded, it was not possible to distinguish between philosophy and religion, so we do not know

which field actually contributed to the sizable 47-point decline. But we do know that students planning to major in philosophy and/or religion in 1983 had much lower verbal scores than their predecessors. Because of the large differences between the scores of students entering different fields within the humanities, it is very important not to generalize to all areas of the humanities when we conclude that prospective humanities majors are obtaining higher test scores than they did in the past.

Students taking the GRE and planning to enter the humanities at the graduate level showed first a small verbal score decline, but in 1983, rose 15 points over the previous year. Over the seven years studied, scores of prospective humanities majors increased 4 points while the mean for all examinees declined 17 points. Over this same period the number of students planning to major in the humanities decreased 47%.

These data suggest that while the population of students electing to pursue a degree in the humanities is sharply decreasing in numbers, both at the graduate and undergraduate level, this population contains increasingly more verbally able students.

In quantitative skills it appears that there may be an upward trend in both SAT and GRE scores for students planning to enter the humanities. Quantitative score averages followed either roughly U-shaped or somewhat erratic patterns over the years studied, but on the average, seemed to be rising. From 1977 onwards, SAT test-takers planning to major in the humanities consistently scored higher than average in mathematics. This was not true of GRE, however, probably because students in the humanities would have taken few, if any, mathematics courses during their undergraduate years, and therefore,

would have lost some of their quantitative skills. Nevertheless, among both SAT and GRE examinees, quantitative scores increased over the period studied.

In general, the answer to our first question appears to be that there has not been a decline in test scores among students entering the humanities as there has been among test-takers at large; where there has been an increase, the increase has been greater than average for prospective humanities majors.

2. In what ways have prospective humanities majors changed in recent years?

Besides changing in numbers and in test scores, potential humanities majors have changed in a number of other ways. Somewhat greater numbers of SAT takers have been enrolled in academic programs in high school, they have received more honors and awards, and they rate their own academic abilities higher than they did eight years ago. Fewer indicated that they wanted help to improve their reading ability, while more said that they wanted to improve their study habits. Most likely an economic indicator, the percent who reported that they would be requesting financial aid rose very steeply between 1979 and 1981, after which it leveled off. The percent planning to study part time decreased very slightly over the eight-year period. Finally, the percentage of students whose parents have at least a four-year college degree rose more than average for students planning to enter the humanities.

Among students taking the GRE, those planning to major in the humanities have come from somewhat better educated families and have shown increases in their undergraduate grade averages. The percentage

planning to obtain more than a master's degree did not show a clear pattern, but did increase in the last three years.

These are just the most general changes that are taking place among students intending to enter the humanities. It is important to remember that all of our analyses are based on averages, and that there are many individual exceptions to our generalizations as well as whole subpopulations who may exhibit very different trends. What we have confirmed is that the population of students planning to major in the humanities, whether at the undergraduate or the graduate level, is constantly changing not only in numbers and test scores, but in many other characteristics.

3. Are the changes that are occurring among prospective humanities majors the same for both sexes and all ethnic groups?

Our analyses indicate that trends in test scores and background variables are different for each sex and each ethnic group. For any generalization we draw about prospective "humanities" majors, there will be exceptions for specific races, or possibly for one sex and not the other.

We saw that even in their selection of major field, men and women tend to choose very differently. A far greater percentage of women than men taking the SAT plan to major in the humanities. Of those who do select humanities, a high proportion of men intend to major in history and cultures while a large number of women choose foreign languages.

Likewise for test scores, women planning to enter the humanities have higher SATV scores than women intending to major in the related social sciences. Among men, however, the difference is not as great and has not been consistent over the eight-year period studied. While

the trends in SATM scores have been similar for men and women, the average scores themselves have been consistently higher for men, and this difference needs to be considered when average scores are compared across major fields having different sex ratios. A large increase in average test scores over time may just indicate a greater proportion of men planning to enter the field.

4. Are patterns in test scores and background characteristics different for students entering different areas of the humanities?

We have found that there are large differences in the mean test scores and in score trends of students planning to enter different major fields within the humanities. Among SAT takers, verbal scores rose for students entering history and cultures, and English and literature. Scores declined for those planning to major in art history, ethnic studies, and philosophy and religion. In 1983, there was a difference of 153 points between the average GREV scores of students planning to major in classical languages compared to those planning to major in speech.

5. Of those who intend to pursue graduate work in the humanities, what proportion majored in the humanities, and how do their GRE scores compare with those who majored in other fields?

About 80% of all GRE examinees planning to enter the humanities did their undergraduate work in the humanities as well. Those with bachelor's degrees in the humanities generally got higher GREV scores than those with degrees in some other major.

6. Of those who majored in the humanities as undergraduates, what proportion intended to pursue their graduate studies in the

humanities, and how did their GRE scores compare with those entering different graduate fields?

About 60% of the GRE examinees who had degrees in the humanities planned to pursue their graduate work in the humanities as well. The GREV scores of humanities undergraduates were highest, however, among those who planned to study a related social science at the graduate level. Second highest were those who intended to continue on in the humanities.

Students with undergraduate degrees in a humanities-related social science were more likely to change majors than to stay in the social sciences. Only about 40% remained in the related social sciences. Those, however, who planned to change to the humanities had higher GREV scores than those who stayed in a related social science.

These findings suggest that some of the most able students with bachelor's degrees in the humanities are changing majors into related social sciences rather than continuing their graduate work in the humanities. However, the data suggest that the opposite is also occurring -- many of the most able students with degrees in a related social science are transferring into the humanities at the graduate level. Their scores, however, are lower than those of the students who transfer from humanities to social sciences.

7. Do patterns of change in academic characteristics parallel changes observed in other characteristics?

Patterns in test scores, grades, and self-estimates of academic abilities were generally parallel, and all suggested that students entering the humanities were consistently of higher than average verbal ability. The fact that they also tended to come from better

educated families suggests a possible causal link with academic performance. Not all background variables seemed related to test scores, but many did, such as grades, self-assessments of abilities, and degree aspirations. Before any inferences can be drawn regarding connections between academic characteristics and other variables, we need to study in greater depth the possible social and economic factors that may be affecting the career decisions and the academic performance of humanities majors.

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PREFACE TO THE SAT TABLES

This volume contains 245 tables. To enable the reader to find them easily, they have been identified at the bottom of each page, first by a number and then by a letter. The number corresponds to the order in which the variable being analyzed is discussed in the accompanying text. Altogether there are 26 variables; they are identified in the **Contents**. The letter corresponds to the particular subpopulation being analyzed. The subpopulations are identified as follows:

For specific major fields within the humanities:

- a. All Examinees
- b. Males
- c. Females

For broad major field categories only:

- d. Whites
- e. Blacks
- f. Mexican-Americans
- g. Puerto Ricans
- h. Orientals
- i. American Indians

Generally, tables for the first three subpopulations (a-c) are the most detailed. They break down humanities majors into 6 specific fields. Tables for the next six subpopulations (d-i) are less detailed; they compare only the broad major fields of humanities vs. related social sciences vs. all other majors.

The populations defined for the analyses in this volume include all examinees who took the SAT from 1975 through 1983 EXCEPT

1. Those who did not indicate an intended major field;
2. Those who were missing one or both SAT scores;
3. Those who did not indicate their sex or ethnic identity.

In addition, the data files for 1976 did not contain intended major field. Therefore, 1976 data were not analyzed in this study.

The reader should refer to the accompanying text for the exact wording of each questionnaire item and a discussion of the statistics obtained. Graphical representations included in the text illustrate the more important statistics found in the tables.

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PREFACE TO THE REVISED EDITION

The major difference between this revised edition and the previous one is the addition of data for 1983.

A second important difference is the exclusion of data for 1979. The first edition of GRE tables, produced early in 1984, was found to contain some erroneous data for 1979. That year, because of an ambiguity in the instructions given to GRE registrants, a small percentage of examinees coded their major fields incorrectly. Because major field categories are crucial to this study, all data for 1979 have been omitted.

A third change was in the major field codes themselves. In 1983, the list of major fields was also revised because of increasing numbers of students entering new areas and decreasing numbers entering others. Slavic studies was dropped as a separate major field and included with Russian. Italian was also dropped because it was attracting so few students. A new area, speech pathology (not included in humanities), was added. This accounts for the decline in numbers of students planning to major in speech, which is part of the humanities.

USE OF THE GRE TABLES

This volume contains 188 tables. To enable the reader to find them easily, they have been identified at the bottom of each page, first by a number and then by a letter. The number corresponds to the order in which the variable being analyzed is discussed in the accompanying text. Altogether there are 18 variables; they are identified in the **Contents**. The letter corresponds to the particular subpopulation being analyzed. The subpopulations are identified as follows:

For specific major fields within the humanities:

- a. All Examinees
- b. All U.S. Citizens
- c. Males
- d. Females

For broad major field categories only:

- e. Whites
- f. Blacks
- g. Mexican-Americans
- h. Puerto Ricans
- i. Other Hispanics
- j. Orientals
- k. American Indians
- l. Other ethnic groups
- m. Non-citizens

Generally, tables for the first four subpopulations (a-d) are the most detailed. They break down humanities majors into 25 specific fields. Tables for the next nine subpopulations (e-m) are less detailed; they compare only the most common major fields and the broad major fields of humanities vs. related social sciences vs. all other majors.

The populations defined for the analyses in this volume include all examinees who took the GRE from 1976 to 1978 and from 1980 to 1983 EXCEPT

1. Those who took the GRE at a special administration and for whom data were not available for analysis;
2. Those who did not mark an intended major field for who indicated the they were undecided;
3. Those who did not indicate their sex, ethnic identity, or citizenship.

In addition, many examinees took the GRE more than once. To avoid using data repeatedly from the same person, we omitted all by the first occurrence of an examinee's scores within the same test year.

The reader should refer to the accompanying text for the exact wording of each questionnaire item and a discussion of the statistics obtained. Graphical representations included in the text illustrate the more important statistics found in the tables.
