#### **ABSTRACT**

Intended for those interested in publishing in the field of college reading and study strategies improvement, this paper provides a list of potential publication sources. The information includes a list of appropriate journals, newsletters, compiled works/yearbooks, and other sources. Information is given regarding the submission of manuscripts and other works to those publications. Suggestions to improve the likelihood of acceptance of submitted work follow the publication sources, and the paper concludes with a list of professional associations for college reading and study strategies and related areas. ### PUBLISHING IN COLLEGE READING by Dr. Rona F. Flippo University of Wisconsin-Parkside

### INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this paper is to provide a listing, with some guidelines, of potential publication sources for those interested in publishing in the field of college reading and study strategies improvement. This information includes a listing of appropriate journals, newsletters, compiled works/yearbooks, and other sources, with information regarding the submission of manuscripts and other works to those publications. A few of the sources are exclusively interested in papers that specifically deal with instruction and research relevant to college students' reading and study skills. The other sources are broader in scope, however, definitely do publish articles for this population. Suggestions are given to help improve the likelihood of acceptance of submitted works. Additionally, a list of professional associations for those interested in college reading and study strategies and other related areas, is provided. Several of these professional associations have publications and hold annual conferences which provide possibilities for sharing professional works.

This listing and information has been compiled through the experience of the author who has been actively involved in many of the professional associations mentioned, has published in many of the publication sources cited, and is editor of one of the cited journals. This listing will be updated periodically, as new publication sources surface, and listed sources change their emphasis, quidelines. editors/contact persons, etc.

# Suggestions to Improve the Likelihood of Acceptance of Submitted Work

- 1. Review the journals and other publication sources listed to decide which one would most likely be interested in your particular topic and/or manuscript.
- 2. Write the editor and request a guide for contributors to the publication.
- 3. Select an appropriate and definitive title for your work.
- 4. Prepare your manuscript following the specific directions for the publication selected.
- 5. Be prepared to revise your manuscript as suggested by the reviewers.
- 6. If your manuscript is not accepted, select another publication source and devote some time to preparing your manuscript to meet the specifications for that publication.

## PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS FUBLISHING CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The following professional associations publish an annual proceedings or yearbook. The articles included have been reviewed and selected from those presented at the associations' annual meetings. Those interested in publishing in these sources must (1) submit a proposal to the program chair to present a paper at the annual meetings, (2) be selected to present the paper, (3) present the paper at the conference and then submit it to the yearbook/proceedings editor, following their specific guidelines, and (4) have their manuscript accepted by the yearbook editor for inclusion in the publication.

<u>Proceedings</u> - published by Western College Reading and Learning Association (WCRLA).

MRC Yearbook - published by the National Reading Conference.

ARF Yearbook - published by the American Reading Forum.

#### OTHER PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS

Other professional associations offer qualified and interested persons an opportunity to present and share their ideas, strategies, materials, and research at annual and regional conferences. These presented works are often applicable and can be submitted to the ERIC system. Additionally, the ideas/concepts presented often serve as the beginnings of a paper that can be developed into a manuscript for later submission to another publication source. The following associations are particularly interested in presentations related to college reading and study strategies. Many of these have already been mentioned elsewhere in this handout. Interested persons are urged to contact the association to get information regarding membership and programs. Please keep in mind that leadership positions in these associations do change, however, the contacts should be willing to forward your request to the appropriate person(s).
