ABSTRACT

Descriptive statistics are presented on those students in Florida's State University System (SUS) who were previously enrolled in one of the state's 28 public community colleges. A series of tables present fall term data for 1979 through 1981, including information on students' sex, age, and race; SUS enrollment rate of community college students; credits transferred; distribution of students by the university at which they were registered and the community college from which they transferred; grade point average (GPA); and students' majors. Highlighted findings included the following: (1) the total number of transfer students attending the SUS increased from 34,344 in 1979, to 36,075 in 1980, to 39,470 in 1981; (2) males outnumbered females by 2% in 1979 and in 1980, but females outnumbered males in 1981 by less than 1%; (3) proportionately, black student representation declined from 7.5% in 1979 to 6.7% in 1981, while white student representation has declined from 81.4% to 79.1%; (4) Hispanic representation increased from 7.3% to 9.4% during this period; (5) the mean age of students decreased from 25 in 1979 to 24 in 1981; (6) students tended to complete their university work or otherwise leave after approximately 3 years; (7) 76.6% of the transfer students in 1981 transferred 60 semester hours or more upon entering the SUS; and (8) 82.8% of the transfer students earned a GPA of 2.0 or higher while enrolled at the SUS. INTRODUCTION

Community colleges in Florida presently serve as the principal provider of the first two years of undergraduate education. Eighty percent of all undergraduate students pursuing the first two years of baccalaureate degrees are enrolled in community colleges. Further, approximately 36% of the undergraduate students in Florida's public universities transferred from community colleges.

The Articulation Agreement of 1971 between the Division of Community Colleges and the Division of Universities not only facilitates the transfer of students from the colleges to the universities, but also provides for the encouragement of research conducted cooperatively by the two divisions. In the spirit of that provision, articulation reports have been published by the Division of Community Colleges since 1973. In 1974, the State University System (SUS) established the Student Data Course File which contains records of all students enrolled in the universities. Since that time, a stable format has been maintained allowing comparisons of groups of students over time. This edition of the report includes data for the Fall terms of 1979, 1980, and 1981.

The reader will likely be interested in comparing specified groups of students. It is virtually impossible to note all possible comparisons of interest found in the following tables. Therefore, the intent is to include sufficient information in the tables for the reader to make the comparisons. Because of the volume of data presented, only brief comments on the tables will be made and concentration will be on the totals.

Each table will contain summary statistics on undergraduate students who, prior to entering the SUS, were enrolled in Florida's 28 community colleges. Most tables will include data from the Fall terms of 1979, 1980, and 1981. The community colleges are listed on the inside front cover and the universities are listed on the inside back cover.

Tables 1, 2, and 3 present by sex, race, and age, respectively, the frequencies of undergraduate students in the SUS whose college of last attendance was a Florida community college. The total number increased from 34,344 in 1979 to 36,075 in 1980 to 39,470 in 1981. However, it must be noted that the 1981 total includes 3,070 unclassified students (no declared major). Heretofore, those students have not been included. When the total is adjusted to 36,400, an increase over the previous year is still noted.

Males outnumbered females by 2% in 1979 and in 1980, but females outnumber males in 1981 by less than 1%. Proportionally, Black representation has declined from 7.5% in 1979 to 6.7% in 1981 while whites have declined from 81.4% to 79.1%. These decreases were offset by an increase for Hispanics (7.3% to 9.4%) while other groups remained essentially stable. Mean age has decreased from 25 in 1979 to 24 in 1981 and that decrease is most pronounced at FIU (27 to 25), at UNF (29 to 27), and at UWF (27 to 25).

Table 4 shows that 40.0% of all transfer students were in their first year of study in the SUS in 1981. This proportion decreases as the number of years increases. Thus, students tend to complete their

university work or otherwise leave after about three years. It should be noted that prior study shows that the majority of transfer students enter the SUS in the Fall term.

Table 5 clearly shows that the majority (76.6%) of students in 1981 transferred 60 semester hours or more upon entering the SUS. Although this percent is down slightly from the prior two years, it is an indication that the students are probably utilizing the community colleges extensively to complete lower division work before moving on. Table 6 shows the total number of semester hours accumulated toward degree. These figures include the hours transferred.

Tables 7 and 8 both report the same data. Percents in Table 7 are for columns and thus show the distribution by college of origin within each university. Percents in Table 8 are for rows and thus indicate the pattern in which each college's transferring students are distributed among the universities. No particular trends are noted over the three-year period.

Table 9 clearly shows that most transfer students have earned a grade-point average (GPA) of 2.00 or higher while enrolled in the SUS. GPA is based on a 4.0 system and is calculated by dividing grade points earned by credit hours attempted. Since many GPA's equal to zero represent erroneous or missing data, these were all grouped separately.

Table 10 provides comparison of two groups of Fall 1981 students -

those who transferred prior to earning 60 semester hours at the community college and those who transferred after earning 60 semester hours. Data for 1979 and 1980 are not shown, but are available in prior editions of Articulation. Sufficient information is given to make comparisons between any two groups of interest.

Table 11 presents the same data as does Table 10, but for the SUS over the three-year period. It is noted that a large proportion of students complete 60 semester hours at the community college before transferring - 74.5% in 1979, 74.7% in 1980, and 67.4% in 1981. In each of the three years, the group transferring after earning 60 semester hours has gone on to earn a higher mean GPA with less (or equal) dispersion.

Tables 12 and 13 present the same data as do Tables 10 and 11 except that each N represents the total from a particular college.

Table 14 shows the number of students in each major field of study by university. Each of these groups is divided into two subgroups - those whose GPA was higher than 2.00 and those whose GPA was lower than 2.00. Mean GPA for the group is reported in the final column.

Table 15 provides the same data as Table 14, but for the SUS over the three-year period.
