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ABSTRACT

This booklet provides information for United States educators who wish to be considered for participation in the Teacher Exchange Program, which entails academic-year exchanges and seminars abroad. The first part furnishes information on: (1) The Fulbright Teacher Exchange Program; (2) application procedures for teaching positions abroad; (3) application procedures for seminars abroad; (4) reapplication for teaching positions and seminars abroad; (5) application deadlines; and (6) participating countries. The second part contains instructions for applicants and the application forms.

Dear Colleague:

The Teacher Exchange Program is one of the several exchange of persons programs administered by USIA. Each year over 10,000 graduate students, researchers, university lecturers, mid-career professionals and secondary students participate in programs funded in whole or in part by USIA's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

Bureau programs operate under the authority of the Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act of 1961, which has as its principal purpose the "increase of mutual understanding" between the people of the United States and of other nations.

USIA assumed direct administration of the Teacher Exchange Program on May 27, 1984. Until that time it had been administered by the U.S. Department of Education.

U.S. educators who wish to be considered for participation in the Teacher Exchange Program which entails academic-year exchanges and seminars abroad should complete the enclosed application. A variety of exchange programs and short-term seminars will be offered in the summer of 1985 and in academic year 1985-86.

Potential applicants are asked to consider carefully Part I, "Background Information." This part outlines eligibility requirements for the program and the specific program offerings for individual countries.

Part II is the application and includes specific instructions for its completion.

PART I: BACKGROUND INFORMATION

THE FULBRIGHT TEACHER EXCHANGE PROGRAM

The Fulbright Program is authorized by Public Law 87-256, the Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange (Fulbright) Act of 1961. The primary purpose of this program is to promote mutual understanding among the people of the world through educational exchange.

The Board of Foreign Scholarships (BFS)

The BFS is composed of twelve educational and public leaders appointed by the President of the United States. It establishes program policy, supervises academic exchanges, and selects participating individuals and institutions.

The U.S. Information Agency (USIA)

USIA's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs is responsible for a number of educational exchange programs authorized by the Fulbright Act. It administers these programs with the assistance of binational educational exchange Commissions and Foundations in more than 40 countries, U.S. Embassies in more than 50 other countries, and cooperating agencies in the United States.

The Teacher Exchange Branch (E/ASX)

Each year, the Teacher Exchange Branch publishes announcements of opportunities and conducts a national competition for teaching positions and seminar awards available. Staff review applications, arrange exchanges between U.S. and foreign educators, and recommend U.S. candidates for selection for seminars and exchanges. The Branch also calls upon the services of interviewing committees which do preliminary screening of applicants in various parts of the United States.

While U.S. teachers are abroad and their counterparts are teaching in the United States, the Branch continues to maintain contact with program participants, assists them when necessary and, upon the teachers' completion of the year abroad, solicits final reports and evaluations of the exchange experiences.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES FOR TEACHING POSITIONS ABROAD

Eligibility Requirements

Elementary and secondary school teachers, school administrators, and college faculty are eligible to apply for positions abroad. However, not all categories of applicants are eligible for exchange with all countries.

An applicant must 1) be a U.S. citizen at the time application is filed; 2) hold at least a bachelor's degree; 3) have a current full-time teaching/administrative assignment; and 4) have 3 years of full-time education employment in the appropriate subject field and at the level of the position for which application is made. The Country Index contains more specific information on requirements for placement in each country.

Evidence of good health and emotional maturity and stability is necessary; teachers recommended for exchange will be required to have a physical examination at their own expense. Final approval of exchange is contingent upon submission of a satisfactory medical report.

Teaching couples may apply; however, because of the limited number of positions available and, often, the lack of foreign candidate pairs with similar qualifications for interchanges, it may not be possible to arrange suitable assignments in the same locality nor to place both teachers. Teaching couples should indicate on their applications whether or not they are willing to be placed in different locations or to accept an assignment if only one of them can be placed.

Preference will be given to applicants who have not participated previously in the program; however, a teacher may reapply 3 or more years after completing the first exchange. Exceptions may be made for seminar participants who later apply for a teaching position. Previous Fulbright grants in other categories or grants under other auspices do not automatically disqualify a candidate from consideration for the program.

Other considerations being equal, veterans will be given preference. Geographic distribution of awards is also a factor in selection.

If an applicant is found to be ineligible or non-competitive for the country program(s) which he/she has listed, but would be eligible or more competitive for a program in another country, USIA may consider the applicant for that country instead. A CANDIDATE WHO DOES NOT WISH TO BE CONSIDERED FOR ANY OTHER COUNTRIES SHOULD SO INDICATE ON THE APPLICATION.

Notification of Action

In April, the Teacher Exchange Branch will notify applicants recommended for teaching positions abroad of selection or non-selection by the Board of Foreign Scholarships.

Applicants selected for exchange must attend pre-departure orientation programs of the sponsoring agencies in the United States or abroad which may be scheduled between May and August. Therefore, applicants should not finalize travel/vacation plans during that time.

Participating Countries

A number of countries cooperate in offering teacher exchange opportunities. USIA cannot guarantee that a particular program will be held in a particular country in a given year. Subject to the availability of Federal funds and the cooperation of foreign nations, we anticipate having programs in the following countries in 1985-86:

Exchange Arrangements

A variety of arrangements have been made with participating countries for Americans wishing to teach abroad. The majority of these teachers will directly exchange positions with foreign teachers. A few others will go abroad on a one-way exchange. Foreign teachers are screened and recommended by Fulbright Commissions/Foundation or other responsible educational authorities abroad. Local U.S. school officials are then asked to review and approve the qualifications of foreign teachers who are proposed for exchange with U.S. teachers.

Administrative Approval

In making application to the Teacher Exchange Program, teachers advised that the official who signs the "Administrative Approval Applicant" form, must be the official authorized to grant a leave of absence and to approve the appropriate salary arrangements.

Terms of Award

The terms of award for each teacher exchange program vary from country to country and are described in the Country Index.

A number of country programs provide full or partial transportation awards. NO TRANSPORTATION IS PROVIDED FOR DEPENDENTS. Since any costs for dependents' travel are the responsibility of the participant, teachers interested in taking their families abroad are urged to investigate the cost of transportation (e.g., charter flights) for their dependents before applying.

Maintenance allowances, when provided, are paid in the currency of the host country and are based on the cost of living in that country, not on the amount of the grantee's salary in the United States.

Fulbright grants for teaching abroad, whether paid in foreign currency or in dollars, are subject to U.S. Federal Income Tax. Information regarding the tax provisions applicable to awards may be obtained from the Foreign Operations District, Internal Revenue Service, 1325 K Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20225, attention: FOD: 81.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES FOR SEMINARS ABROAD

Eligibility Requirements

Senior high school (grades 9-12) teachers, community and junior college faculty, 4-year college/university instructors, and assistant professors are eligible to participate in seminars. Not all categories of applicants, however, are eligible for all seminars.

An applicant must be a U.S. citizen at the time the application is filed, hold at least a bachelor's degree, have 2 years of relevant full-time teaching experience, and have current full-time employment in the subject area of the seminar. Application may be made during the second year of full-time teaching. Refer to the Country Index for more specific information regarding eligibility for each seminar.

Evidence of good health and emotional maturity and stability is necessary; candidates recommended for seminars will be asked to have a medical examination at their own expense. Awards are contingent upon submission of a satisfactory medical report.

Preference will be given to applicants who have not participated previously in the program and who have not visited the country of application before. Previous Fulbright grants in other categories or grants under other auspices are not necessarily disqualifying factors.

Other considerations being equal, veterans will be given preference. Geographic distribution of awards is also a factor in selection.

Notification of Action

The Teacher Exchange Branch will notify seminar applicants in April of final selection or non-selection by the Board of Foreign Scholarships.

Participating Countries

Several countries cooperate with the United States in offering seminars abroad. Since this program is subject to change, the Teacher Exchange Branch cannot guarantee that a particular seminar will be held in a particular country in a given year. Subject to the availability of Federal funds and the cooperation of foreign nations, programs are planned in Italy and the Netherlands in 1985.

Administrative Approval

In making application to a Seminar, educators are advised that the official who signs the "Administrative Approval for Applicant" form must be the official authorized to approve participation.

Terms of Award

The terms of award for seminars vary. Specific information is included in the Country Index for seminars in each participating country.

Dependents are not permitted to accompany seminar participants.

Maintenance allowances, when provided, are paid in the currency of the host country and are based on the cost of living in that country, not on the amount of the grantee's salary in the United States.

Participants in seminars are responsible for personal expenditures and should bring additional funds with them.

It is not possible for the Teacher Exchange Branch to confirm before April the overseas seminar arrangements for housing, academic facilities and international flights. Seminars generally begin in mid to late June. Seminar participants are not permitted to join seminars already in progress and are required to attend all seminar activities including within-U.S. orientation programs, if scheduled, and to travel on group flights.

REAPPLICATION FOR TEACHING POSITIONS AND SEMINARS ABROAD

A candidate who is not selected to participate in the program may reapply, but must observe the same application deadlines as new applicants. Renewal applicants are required to submit a new application each year and a current reference from their immediate supervisor. Other references are good for three years. A new "Administrative Approval for Applicant" (form) is also required. Applicants will be advised if additional data or an interview will be required.

DEADLINE

Applications for participation in the Teacher Exchange Program for the 1985-86 year must be made by October 15, 1984. Applications and reapplications received after October 15 will be considered only for opportunities for which additional candidates are needed. All programs described in this bulletin are announced subject to the availability of funds. Programs are subject to change or cancellation.

COUNTRY INDEX

Country : CANADA (Teacher Exchange)

Dates : Similar calendar as U.S. schools: Last week of August or first week of September to middle or late June.

Eligibility : Elementary and secondary school teachers and administrators.

Teaching Assignment : Elementary or secondary levels in any subject field as determined by the availability of comparable candidates in both the United States and Canada.

Terms of Award : Direct exchange of teaching assignments; requires that teachers obtain a leave of absence with pay from school authorities. The U.S. school agrees to accept a Canadian teacher who has also secured a leave of absence with pay.

Transportation Award : None. Participants are responsible for their own travel arrangements.

Maintenance Allowances : None.

Accompanying Dependents : Permitted.

Estimated Number of Positions: : 20

Counterpart Agency : Canadian Education Association

Country : DENMARK (Teacher Exchange)

Dates : Mid-August to Mid-May. Vacation periods of approximately 7 to 10 days in October, December, and March.

Eligibility : College instructors or assistant professors of American literature.

Teaching Assignment : American literature and civilization in several Danish teacher-training colleges and higher secondary schools. Teaching 12 to 18 hours per week. Students are preparing to be teachers of English at the elementary level, at teacher training colleges, and for university entrance at higher secondary schools.

Terms of Award : One-way position in Denmark. (No exchange of positions is involved.) U.S. teacher must secure a leave of absence without pay.

Transportation Award : Round-trip economy air fare from airport nearest grantee's home for exchange teacher only.

Maintenance Allowances : The Fulbright Commission will provide the teacher a maintenance allowance based upon cost of living and number of accompanying dependents.

Accompanying Dependents : Permitted.

Estimated Number of Positions : 1

Counterpart Agency : Commission for Educational Exchange between Denmark and the United States of America (Fulbright Commission).

Language Proficiency : Fluency in Danish not required.

Country : FRANCE (Teacher Exchange)

Dates : Late August or early September through July.

Eligibility : High school teachers; a limited number of highly qualified junior high school teachers; college/university instructors, and assistant professors. Preference will be given to teachers whose assignments consist of only French language, literature, and civilization.

Teaching Assignment : English language and American literature and civilization; placement in the French education system at a level which may or may not correspond to the teaching assignment in the United States.

Terms of Award : Direct exchange of teaching assignments; requires that teacher obtain a leave of absence with pay from school authorities. The U.S. school agrees to accept a French teacher who has also secured a leave of absence with pay.

Transportation Award : Round-trip travel allowance for exchange teacher only.

Maintenance Allowances : None.

Accompanying Dependents : Permitted.

Estimated Number of Positions : 18

Counterpart Agency : Franco-American Commission for Educational Exchange (Fulbright Commission).

Language Proficiency : Fluency in French required.

Country : GERMANY, FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF (Teacher Exchange)

Dates : Approximately early-mid August through June/July.

Eligibility : Junior and senior high school teachers and college instructors through the professor level, teaching German, English, or other subjects.

Teaching Assignment : English language and literature; other subjects including, but not limited to geography, history, physical education, or other foreign languages. Teaching level may not correspond to level taught in the United States.

Terms of Award : Direct exchange of teaching assignments requires that teachers obtain a leave of absence with pay from their school authorities. The U.S. school authority agrees to accept a German teacher who also has secured a leave of absence with pay.

Transportation Award : Round-trip tourist class air fare, for the exchange teacher only, from airport nearest the teacher's home.

Maintenance Allowances : At the discretion of the Fulbright Commission in Germany, grantees may receive a cost of living supplement (currently DM 800 per month and subject to change). Grantees with 3 accompanying dependents should have a net sum, including salary, of at least \$14,000 available for the school year.

Accompanying Dependents : Permitted. Free schooling for children in German schools.

Estimated Number of Positions : 25

Counterpart Agency : Commission for Educational Exchange between Germany and the USA (Fulbright Commission) Bonn, in cooperation with Pedagogic Exchange Service, Bonn.

Language Proficiency : Fluency in German required.

Country : GERMANY, FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF (Teacher Exchange)
(John F. Kennedy School, Berlin)

Dates : Early-mid August through June.

Eligibility : Elementary and secondary teachers of various subjects.

Teaching Assignment : English language and literature, with possibilities in geography, history, and mathematics. Placement is at the John F. Kennedy School, a K-12 bilingual school integrated into the Berlin school system.

Terms of Award : One-way position in Germany. (No exchange of positions is involved.) Teachers must secure a leave of absence without pay.

Transportation Award : Round-trip tourist class air fare for the exchange teacher only from airport nearest the teacher's home.

Maintenance Allowances : A monthly maintenance allowance is provided in lieu of salary. (Currently DM 2,700 per month and subject to change). An allowance for incidental expenses and a supplement for an accompanying spouse are also provided.

Accompanying Dependents : Permitted.

Estimated Number of Positions : 1

Counterpart Agency : Commission for Educational Exchange between Germany and the USA (Fulbright Commission) Bonn, in cooperation with Pedagogic Exchange Service, Bonn.

Language Proficiency : Fluency in German required.

Country : GERMANY, FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF
(Seminar: Goethe Institute)

This is not a Fulbright program. It is sponsored directly by the German Government.

Dates : July - August (3 weeks).

Eligibility : U.S. teachers of German language at the elementary, secondary and postsecondary education levels. Preference will be given to teachers who have not previously studied in Germany.

Itinerary : Three weeks in a German city, including an optional week in Berlin.

Program Content : Lectures and discussions on German language, literature, and culture.

Terms of Award : Tuition and fees.

Transportation Award : None.

Maintenance Allowances : Partial.

Estimated Number of Positions : 40

Language Proficiency : Proficiency in German required.

Country : ITALY
 (Teacher Exchange). This program is announced on a tentative basis.

Dates : Mid-August through June.

Eligibility : Secondary school teachers of Italian language.

Teaching Assignment : English language and American literature and civilization; placement in the Italian education system. Teaching level may not correspond to level taught in the United States.

Terms of Award : Direct exchange of teaching assignments; requires that teacher obtain a leave of absence with pay from school authorities. The U.S. school agrees to accept an Italian teacher who has also secured a leave of absence with pay.

Transportation Award : None.

Maintenance Allowances : None.

Accompanying Dependents : Permitted.

Estimated Number of Positions : 5

Counterpart Agency : Commission for Educational and Cultural Exchange between Italy and the United States of America (Fulbright Commission)

Language Proficiency : Fluency in Italian required.

Country : ITALY
(Seminar: Classics)

Dates : June - August (8 weeks) (two phases)

Eligibility : Senior high school (grades 9-12) teachers of Latin or Greek, junior and community college faculty, and 4 year college/university instructors or assistant professors of Latin, Greek, or the Classics. Preference will be given to those who have a master's degree in the Classics and have not studied previously in Italy.

Itinerary : First phase: six weeks of study to be arranged by the Summer School of Classical Studies of the American Academy in Rome; to include site visits to historical monuments, excavations, and museums in or near Rome and weekly field trips to key places of interest outside Rome. Second phase: two-week program conducted by the Vergilian Society at Cumae, with visits to antiquities in and around Naples.

Program Content : Lectures provided by specialists on the life, culture, and civilization of ancient Rome and on antiquities around Naples.

Terms of Award : Partial grant for tuition and fees; estimated grantee cost is \$1,200.

Transportation Award : Round-trip economy air fare from airport nearest grantee's home; program-related travel within Italy.

Maintenance Allowances : None. A participant will be responsible for maintenance expenses, estimated to be approximately \$1,200 and is advised to bring additional funds for private travel, incidentals, and recreation.

Estimated Number of Positions : 10

Counterpart Agency : Commission for Educational and Cultural Exchange between Italy and the United States of America (Fulbright Commission).

Country : ITALY
(Seminar: Language)

This is not a Fulbright program. However, the Fulbright Commission assists in recruitment of qualified Americans.

Dates : July - August (3 weeks).

Eligibility : Senior high school (grades 9-12) teachers of Italian language.

Program Content : Discussions, lectures, and coursework in Italian language and culture at the University for Foreigners at Perugia.

Terms of Award : Tuition and fees paid by the Italian Ministry of Public Instruction.

Transportation Award : None.

Maintenance Allowances : Room and board are provided by the Italian Ministry of Public Instruction.

Estimated Number of Positions : 5

Counterpart Agencies : Commission for Educational and Cultural Exchange between Italy and the United States of America (Fulbright Commission) and the Italian Ministry of Public Instruction.

Language Proficiency : Proficiency in Italian required.

Country : THE NETHERLANDS
(Seminar: History, Culture and Society)

Dates : July (3 weeks)

Eligibility : Senior high school (grades 9-12) teachers, junior and community college faculty, and 4-year college/university instructors or assistant professors in the broad fields of World or European history, culture and civilization, or art and art history. Preference will be given to those who have a master's degree in one of the above fields and who have completed 2 full years of teaching in that field.

Itinerary : Amsterdam, with visits to sites of historical, contemporary, and cultural interest.

Program Content : An interdisciplinary approach to the Netherlands, focusing on the history and geography of the country, its institutions, culture and arts. Participants will have the opportunity to compile instructional materials.

Terms of Award : Tuition and fees and cost of participation in all program events.

Transportation Award : Only program-related travel within the Netherlands will be provided. Participants are responsible for the cost of their international travel.

Maintenance Allowances : Hotel with breakfast and a per diem allowance to cover other meals is provided the grantee.

Estimated Number of Positions : 20

Counterpart Agency : Netherlands America Commission for Educational Exchange (Fulbright Commission).

Country : SWITZERLAND (Teacher Exchange)

Dates : Fall through Summer.

Eligibility : Senior high school (grades 9-12) teachers and college/university instructors and assistant professors of German or French, who teach other subjects, with fluency in one or both of these languages.

Teaching Assignment : English in the upper grades of college preparatory schools in Switzerland; occasionally, positions are available in high school algebra, geometry, and computer science.

Terms of Award : Direct exchange of teaching assignments; requires that U.S. teachers obtain a leave of absence with pay from school authorities. The U.S. school agrees to accept a Swiss teacher who has also secured a leave of absence with pay.

Transportation Award : None.

Maintenance Allowances : None. U.S. exchange teachers without accompanying dependents should earn a gross salary of no less than \$24,000 or have available an equivalent sum for the academic year in order to meet the high cost of living in Switzerland.

Accompanying Dependents : Permitted.

Estimated Number of Positions : 3 - 5

Counterpart Agency : Swiss Office for In-service Training of Upper Secondary Teachers

Language Proficiency : Fluency in French or German required.

Country : UNITED KINGDOM (Teacher Exchange)

Dates : Late August or early September to late July.

Eligibility : Elementary and secondary school teachers and administrators, college/university faculty of all ranks.

Teaching Assignment : Any subject field, at any level from kindergarten through college/university, as determined by the availability of comparable candidates in both the United States and the United Kingdom.

Terms of Award : Direct exchange of teaching assignments; requires that teachers obtain a leave of absence with pay from school authorities. The U.S. school agrees to accept a U.K. teacher who has also secured a leave of absence with pay.

Transportation Award : None.

Maintenance Allowances : None. It is estimated that a single teacher should have a net sum of at least 8,000 Pounds Sterling available (married teachers with two children, 10,000-12,000 Pounds Sterling), with additional funds for international vacation travel or purchase of a car while abroad.

Accompanying Dependents : Permitted.

Estimated Number of Positions : 200

Counterpart Agencies : United States - United Kingdom Educational Commission (Fulbright Commission) and the Central Bureau for Educational Visits and Exchanges.

1. Read Part I carefully before applying. Be sure that you meet the eligibility requirements as well as the specific requirements of the programs for which you apply.
2. Use typewriter or print clearly in black ink to complete original and two copies of Application Form IAP-92. If additional space is needed, enter information in Item 9 "Remarks," or use additional sheets showing you name, and date of birth. Identify the item number to which the answer applies. Sign page 6 and forward original and two copies along with forms listed below as follows:

A specialist in applicable language(s), preferably current language supervisor. A separate report and two copies are necessary for each language (e.g. if applying for France and Germany.)

3. Applicants are urged to mail Forms, IAP-92, 92-1, 92-2, and 92-3 in a single envelope to USIA. Envelopes should be postmarked no later than October 15. This application is not considered complete until all the forms listed above have been filled out properly and received by USIA.
4. School authorities in other countries often request photographs. Applicants are invited to submit two recent photographs. It is not required. Please place your name on the back of the photographs.
5. To facilitate placement in schools of certain countries, it is helpful to know religious denominational preference and, in the case of the United Kingdom, country preference (Northern Ireland, Wales, Scotland, England). Applicants may indicate preferences under Item 9 "Remarks", of the application.)
6. Applicants may be asked to appear for a personal interview before a regional interviewing committee at a time to be announced later. See item 12 of application.
7. Applicants should keep the Teacher Exchange Branch informed in case of:
 - a. change of address;
 - b. change in plans which affect the application;
 - c. desire to withdraw the application;
 - d. application to teach or study abroad under another program;
 - e. termination of teaching contract; and,
 - f. change in assignment.
8. Several months will elapse between filing of applications and notice of action taken by the Board of Foreign Scholarships.
