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ABSTRACT

Data concerning the college attendance and the distribution of 1983-1984 high school graduates of New York's public and nonpublic schools are presented. The data were secured through the Education Department's Basic Educational Data System and reflect the status of graduates in fall 1984. Tables cover the following: trends in the college-going rate of high school graduates during 1970-1984; the types of institutions attended by public and nonpublic high school graduates during 1970-1984; trends for in-state and out-of-state college attendance for graduates of public/nonpublic schools; and the number and distribution of graduates entering employment, the military, or two- and four-year institutions (in New York or outside New York) by New York county and region. 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INTRODUCTION

The following tables present data concerning the distribution of 1983-84 high school graduates of New York State's public and nonpublic schools. The data were secured through the Education Department's Basic Educational Data System and reflect the status of graduates, as reported by school principals, in the fall of 1984.

Table 1 presents trends in the college-going rate of high school graduates from 1970 through 1984. Table 2 shows a 15-year trend of the college-going rate, within and outside New York State.

Tables 3, 4 and 5 show, respectively, the distribution of 1983-84 high school graduates of public schools, non-public schools, and public/nonpublic schools combined. These tables are arranged by county within geographic region.
