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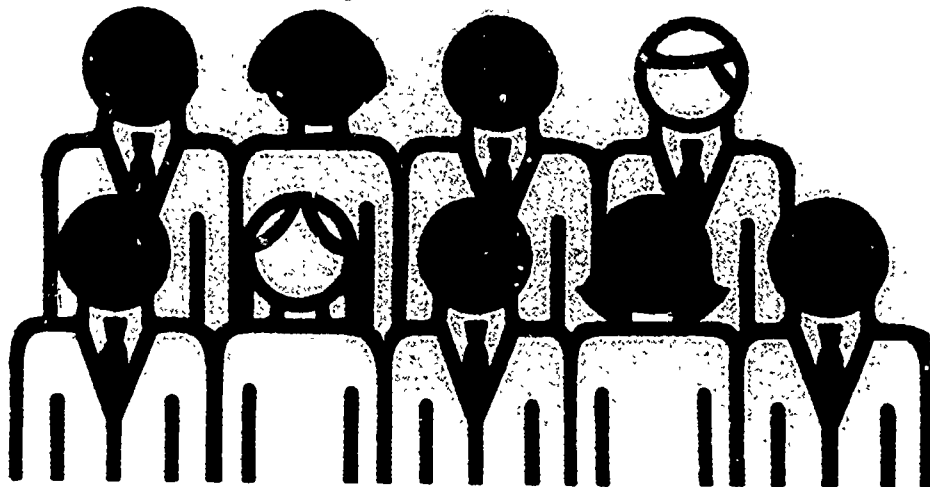
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ABSTRACT

In 1985, a study was conducted at Piedmont Virginia Community College (PVCC), using longitudinal minority enrollment data to examine trends which might be of interest to those involved in planning student recruitment activities. Study findings included the following: (1) 434 minority students were enrolled at PVCC during fall 1985, representing 11.5% of the student body, the highest percentage since 1980; (2) the largest percentage of minority students (82.5%) were Blacks, followed by Asians (12.9%), Hispanic Americans (3.5%), other minorities (2.5%), and American Indians (1.3%); (3) the percentage of minority students had been relatively stable during the past 5 years, ranging from a low of 10.2% to a high of 11.5%; (4) the ratio of minority males to females closely approximated the male/female ratio in the student body as a whole; (5) the number of minority first-time and incoming transfer students at PVCC dropped from fall 1981 through fall 1985, with especially large decreases from 1981 to 1982 and from 1983 to 1984; (6) the percentage of minority students enrolled in associate degree programs dropped by nearly 10% between 1981 and 1985; (7) 15.2% of the minority students were classified as developmental students, compared to 3.4% of the White students; (8) the percentage of minority unclassified students increased steadily since 1981; (9) the median age for both Whites and Blacks was 28; and (10) one of every three minority students was enrolled full-time in 1981 compared to one of every six in 1985. INTRODUCTION

This is the sixth in a continuing series of reports concerning minority enrollment at Piedmont Virginia Community College. The purpose of these reports is to display longitudinal minority enrollment data and examine trends which might be of interest to those involved in planning student recruitment activities.

The first Minority Enrollment Report, issued by the Dean of Student Services, covered the Fall Quarter of 1979. Reports for the Fall Quarters of 1980, 1981, 1983, and 1984 were issued by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning. No formal report for the Fall Quarter of 1982 was issued, but that quarter is documented in the report relating to the Fall Quarter of 1983.

METHODOLOGY

Data for this report were obtained from the Student Enrollment Booklets published each Fall by the Virginia Community College System. These booklets consist of numerous tables of data relating to many different aspects of student enrollment within the VCCS. Each table from which data were obtained is noted within this Report.

It should be understood that the data contained within these booklets is mid-quarter census data. Official VCCS headcounts are

derived from mid-quarter census data; official VCCS FTE's, however, are derived from end-of-quarter census data. The difference in headcount between mid-quarter and end-of-quarter is often large. The mid-quarter Fall 1985 headcount, for instance, was 3,777; the end-of-quarter headcount was 3,847. Unless otherwise noted, all figures in this Report are mid-quarter figures.

This Report essentially follows the format of last year's Report. Data have been cross-tabulated by race and other significant characteristics (sex, age, residence, status, program, etc.). Information is displayed in tables and figures which follow the narrative summary.

A few changes and modifications, however, have been made. Enrollment data now cover a four-year period of time, rather than a three-year period. Tables 1 through 7 have been expanded to include a five-year average of all data. Two new tables have been introduced. One provides information on student status (full-time, part-time), location (on-campus, off-campus), and time (day, evening). The other supplies a "snapshot" of major characteristics by five-year intervals (1975, 1980, and 1985). Finally, charts highlighting important characteristics have been included as Figures 1 through 6.

RESULTS

Four-hundred thirty-four minority students enrolled at PVCC during the Fall Quarter of 1985. This is the second largest number of minority students attending the College during any single quarter and

the most since 1980, when 441 minority students were enrolled. The percentage of minority students within the student body as a whole was 11.5%, the highest percentage since 1980. Of these minority students, 358 (or 82.5% of all minority students and 9.5% of all students) were Black. As was the case with minority students in general, this is the largest number of Blacks in attendance at PVCC since 1980.

As is evident from Figure 1 and Table 1, the percentage of minority students at PVCC has been relatively stable during the past five years, ranging from a low of 10.2% in 1982 to a high of 11.5% this year. The average minority enrollment during this period was 10.9%.

As is graphically depicted in Figure 2, by far the largest number of these students were Blacks, who have accounted for 79.9% of all minority students, and 8.7% of all students, during the period 1981-1985. The next largest minority at Piedmont were Orientals, who have accounted for 12.9% of minority students, followed by Spanish Americans (3.5%), other minorities (2.5%), and American Indians (1.3%).

The ratio of minority males to females closely approximated that of the student body as a whole, as it has during the past four years (see Table 1). The ratio of males to females at PVCC in 1985 was 0.596, while that for minorities in general was 0.573, and that for Blacks was 0.557.

The number of first-time and incoming transfer students at PVCC has generally dropped from the Fall of 1981 through the Fall of 1985, with especially large decreases from 1981 to 1982 and from 1983 to 1984 (see Table 2). In this light, it is encouraging to note that

there has been a slight increase of four percent in the number of first-time and incoming transfer students of all races from Fall 1984 to Fall 1985.

The trend for minority first-time and incoming transfer students has been essentially the same as that for the student population as a whole (here, too, there has been a four percent increase during this four-year period). What is also encouraging is that while the number of first-time White students decreased 13.3% during the past year, the number of minority first-time students increased 3.3%, and the number of first-time Black students increased by a hefty 25%.

Less encouraging has been program enrollment at PVCC during the past four years. Each year there has been a slightly larger number of unclassified students (see Table 2 and Figure 3). This has been especially true during the past two years. In the Fall of 1981, 39.6% of all students were unclassified; four years later, the percentage had reached 50.4%.

There has been a corresponding decrease in the number of students enrolled in associate degree programs. During the past four years, the percentage of students enrolled in these programs has fallen nearly ten percent (from 52.7% in 1981 to 43.6% this year). This is due primarily to less students pursuing the Associate of Science degree. While the percentage of students seeking the Associate of Arts and the Associate of Applied Science degrees was actually higher in the Fall of 1985 than it was in the Fall of 1981, the percentage of students seeking the A.S. degree was lower by 11.5%.

Although the percentage of minority students enrolled in degree programs has closely paralleled the percentage of all students

enrolled in these programs, the percentage of unclassified minority students has been substantially lower than that of students in general. The average percentage each year of unclassified minority students during the period 1981-1985 was 32.8%; the average yearly percentage of unclassified students of all races during this period was 41.4%.

Perhaps the chief reason there were less unclassified minority students than students in general is that a large percentage of minority students were classified as Developmental. The four-year percentage of all Developmental students was 4.7%. For Whites, the percentage was even lower (3.4%). For minorities, however, the percentage was 15.2% (14.1% for Blacks and 19.3% for other minorities).

Just as the percentage of unclassified students has increased since 1981 so, too, has the percentage of non-curricular students (see Table 4 and Figure 4). A non-curricular student is one who has not declared a major and is classified as either developmental or unclassified. The percentage of students with no declared major has risen from 43.2% in the Fall of 1981 to 54.3% in the Fall of 1985. This rise can be accounted for by the subsequent decline in the percentage of students declaring majors in the liberal arts or education. Four years ago, 27.9% of the student body were enrolled in a liberal arts or education curriculum; today the figure has dropped to 16.7%.

The major decline has been in the General Studies curriculum. While the percentage of students majoring in either Liberal Arts or Education, has actually increased slightly, the percentage of General Study students has decreased from 39.5% in 1981 to 22.1% in 1985 (see

Tables 5 and 5a). Other curricula have remained fairly stable during the past four years.

These curricular trends have also been true with respect to minority students. The percentage of non-curricular minority students during this period has been approximately the same as the percentage of non-curricular White students (45.9% for Whites, 46.7% for Blacks, and 52.1% for other minorities). Similarly, the decline in the percentage of students enrolled in the liberal arts and education has been roughly the same for minorities as it has been for all students (13.2% for minorities and 11.2% for students in general).

Table 6 shows student headcount at PVCC by race and residence. This is also graphically depicted in Figure 5. With the exception of Greene and Louisa counties, the number of minority students attending PVCC from each in-district jurisdiction has risen from Fall Quarter 1984 to Fall Quarter 1985. The most dramatic increase occurred in Buckingham County. Over twice as many minority students from Buckingham County attended PVCC during Fall Quarter 1985 as attended during Fall Quarter 1984. The proportion of minorities to Whites in each locality has not fluctuated much during the period 1981-1985, especially in Charlottesville and Albemarle County, the two localities from which the largest number of PVCC students originate.

With respect to age, minority students have shown no marked differences from students in general. The median age for both Whites and Blacks at PVCC in Fall 1985 was 28; the median age for minorities other than Blacks was 27 (these median ages were obtained from mid-quarter data through a Fortran program written by the author). Roughly one-third of all students, whether White or minority, fall into

the age category 25-34 (see Table 7). Figure 6 is a stacked bar graph which shows the age distribution of both Whites and minorities at PVCC.

As can be seen in Table 8, the proportion of full-time to part-time students at PVCC has been steadily shrinking. In the Fall of 1981, one of every four students was full-time; today, less than one of every five students is full-time.

This decline has been even greater for minority students. Four years ago, one of every three minority students was full-time; now, one of six is full-time. In other words, during the past four years, the number of full-time minority students at PVCC, especially Blacks, has been cut in half. The trend toward more part-time students, then, is more pronounced with respect to minorities. This makes it easier to understand why more minority students today are both unclassified and non-curricular.

Table 8 also shows the proportion of on-campus to off-campus, and day to evening, students. These proportions have been relatively stable during the past four years for both White students and minority students.

Table 9 shows the percentage of minority students by selected variables at five-year intervals (1975, 1980, and 1985). Some noticeable changes are apparent. The percentage of minority students is slightly lower today than it was ten years ago (11.5% as opposed to 12.7% in 1975). An even more dramatic change concerns the ratio of minority males to females. Although this ratio has been stable during the 1980's, the proportion of females to males is much larger now

than it was in 1975. Almost two of every three minority students at PVCC today is female.

What is interesting to note, however, is that in terms of status (part-time vs. full-time), degree status, and curriculum, a "peak" seems to have occurred around 1980, and PVCC today is much as it was ten years ago. For instance, in both 1975 and 1985, roughly 16% of the minority students were full-time; in 1980, however, twice as many minority students were full-time (32%). In 1975 five percent of all minority students were unclassified and 7.1% had declared no major. These percentages are almost the same today (4.7% are unclassified and 6.1% are non-curricular). In 1980, however, they were much higher (8.3% were unclassified and 9.1% were non-curricular).

Fall PVCC Minority Enrollment Percentage

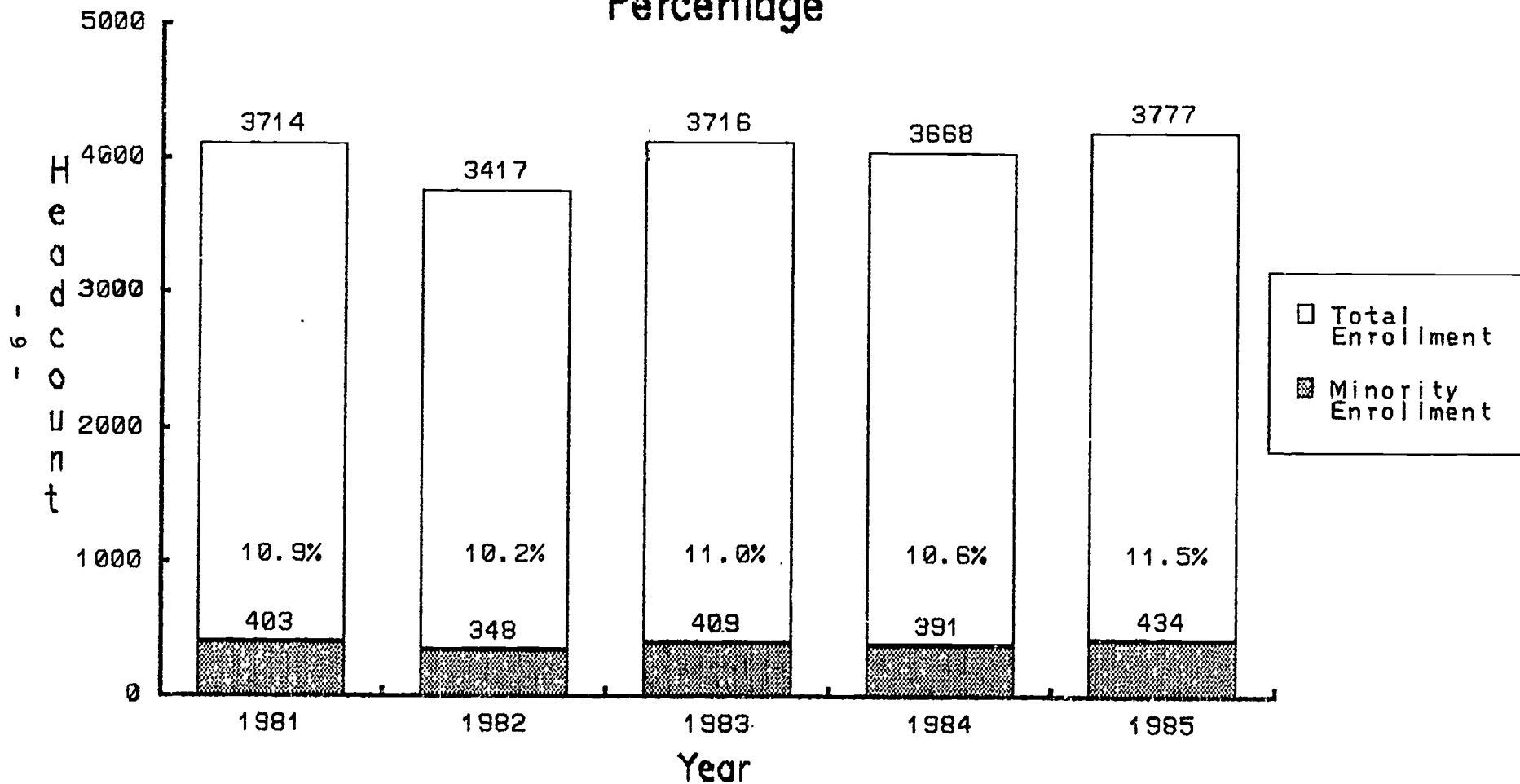

Fall PVCC Minority Enrollment

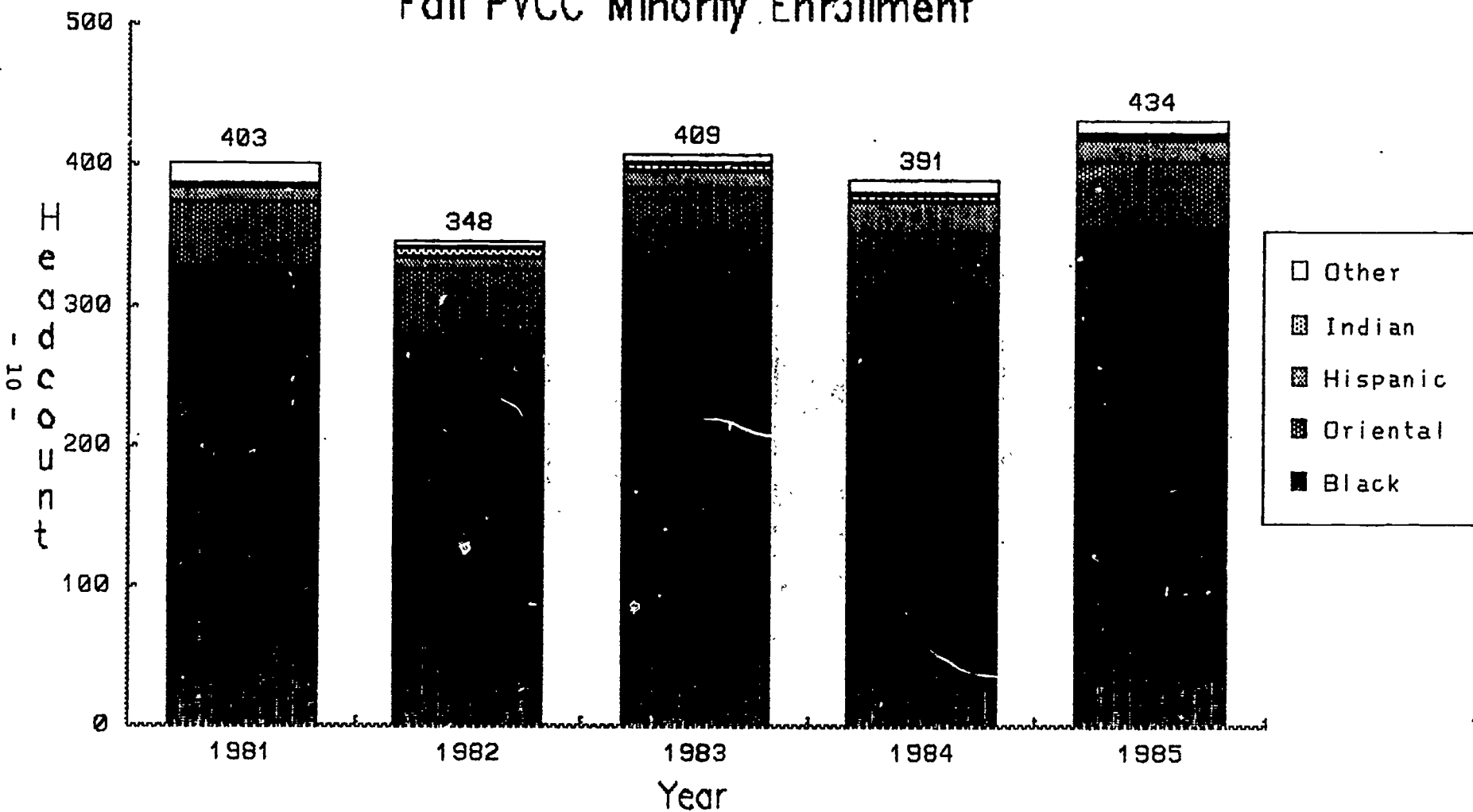

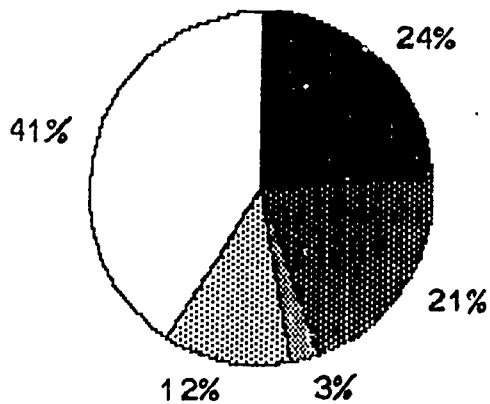

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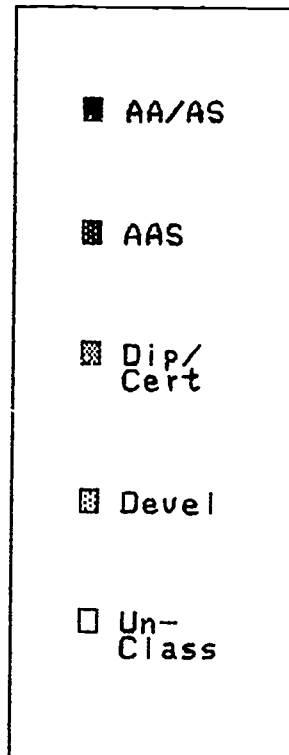
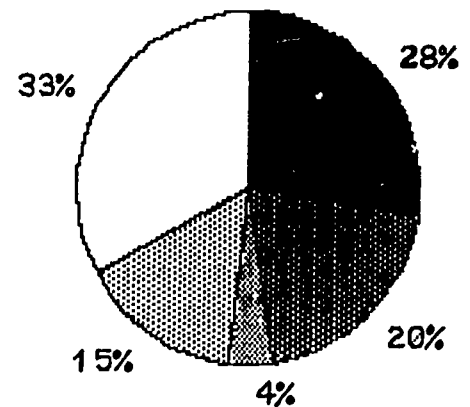

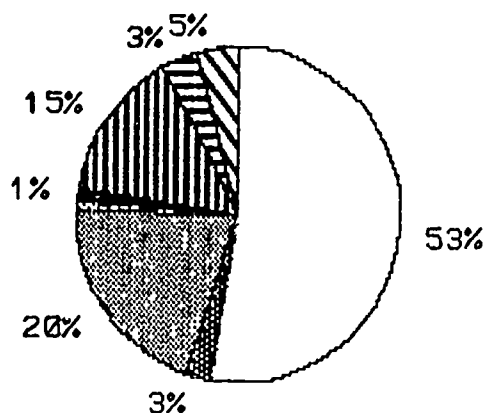

Fall Average (1981-85)

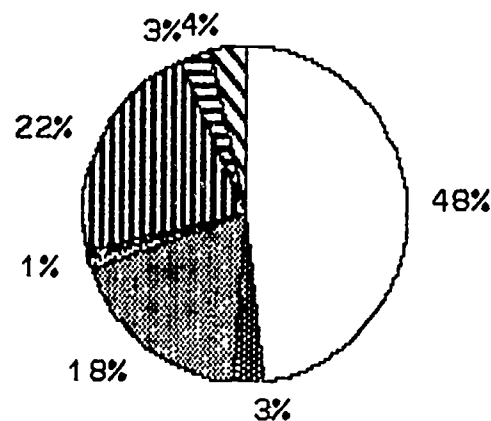

PVCC Fall Quarter Student Residence By Race

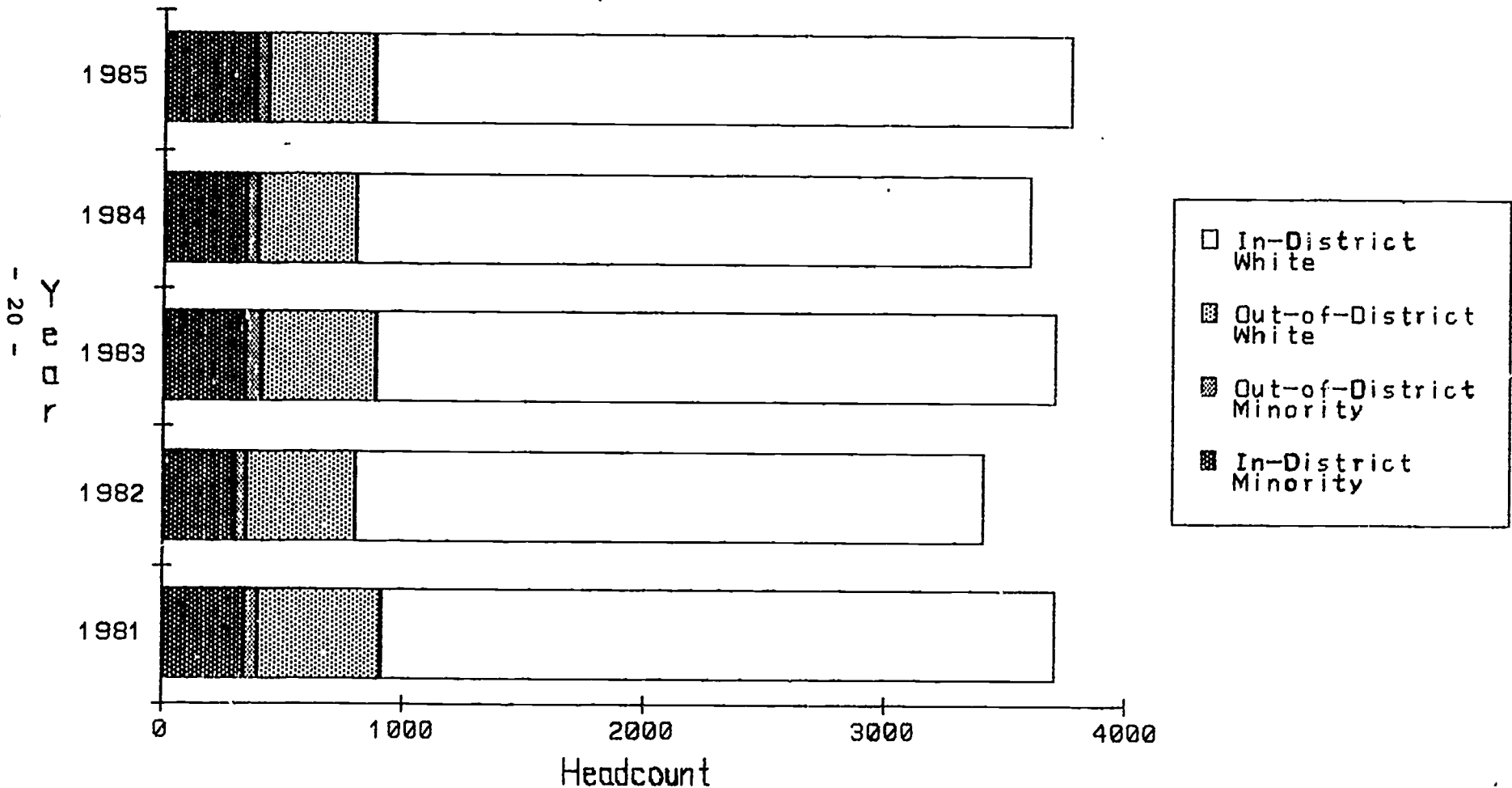

Fall Average (1981-85)

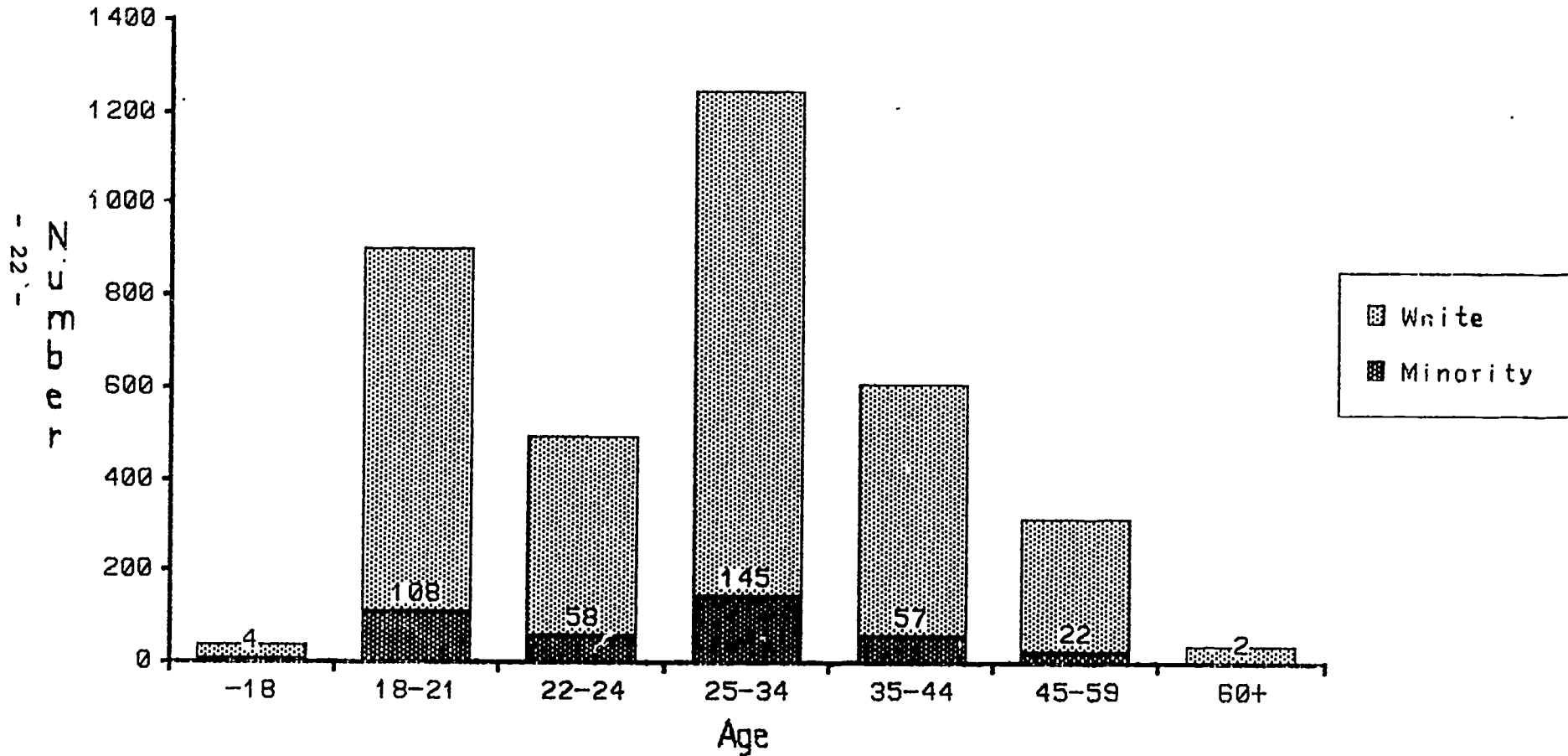
