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ABSTRACT

Crop production in 1984, particularly for spring-planted crops, returned to near-normal levels from the much reduced output of 1983 when government programs curbed planted acreage and drought depressed yields. Iowa led in receipts of the next three highest earning commodities: soybeans, \$2 billion; corn, \$2.1 billion; and hogs, \$2.6 billion. All of the income estimates in this report are based on a calendar year. The data, while mainly based on information from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Statistical Reporting Service and the Census of Agriculture, also include information from other government agencies and private sources. The publication includes 58 tables of statistical data and a short summary.)

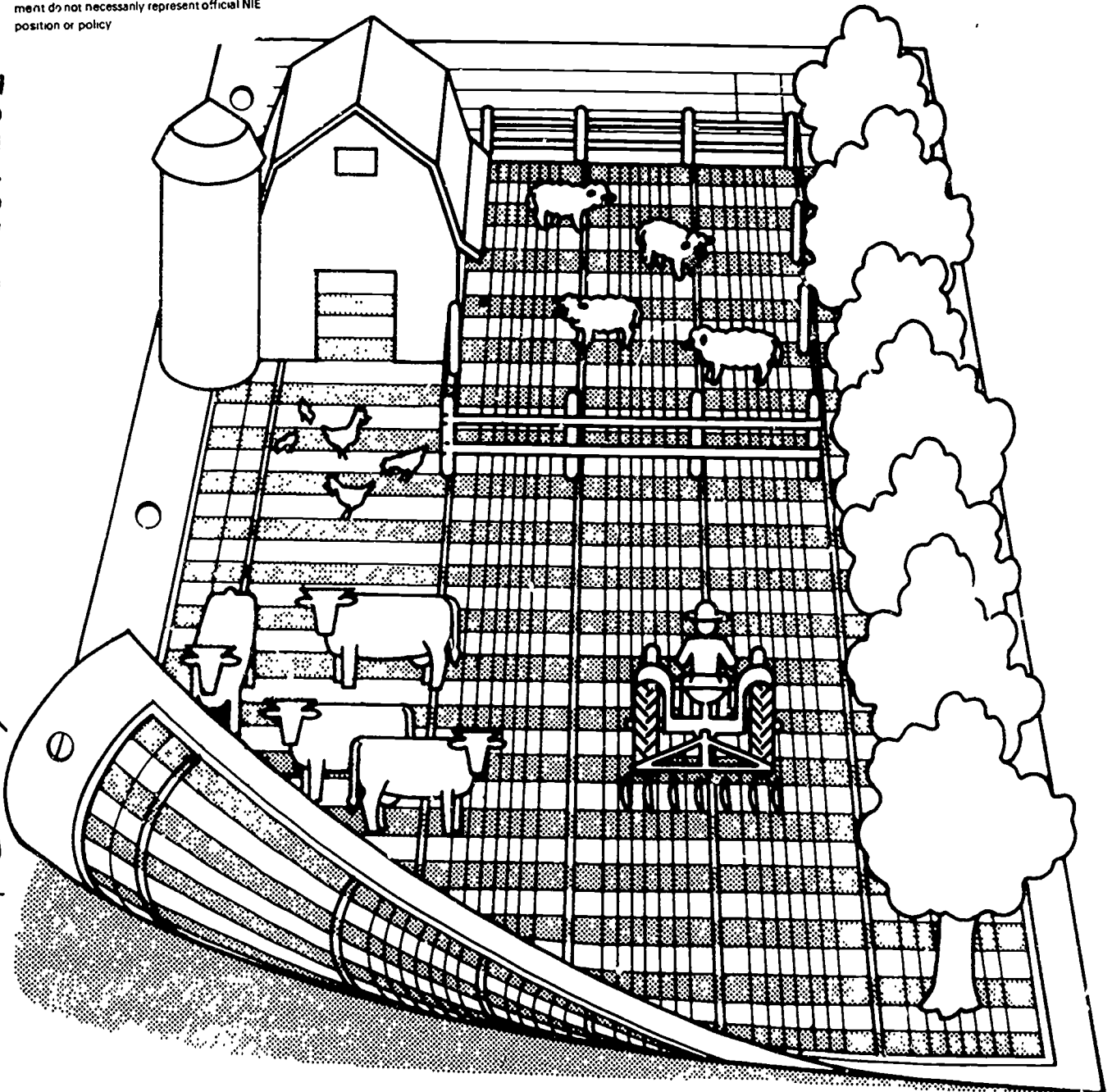
State Financial Summary, 1984

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Preface

This report is one of five in the Economic Indicators of the Farm Sector series. This issue was formerly called Economic Indicators of the Farm Sector: State Income and Balance Sheet Statistics. Other reports are National Financial Summary (formerly Income and Balance Sheet Statistics), Production and Efficiency Statistics, Farm Sector Review, and Costs of Production.

State Financial Summary, 1984, corresponds to the national data published in National Financial Summary, 1984, disaggregated to the State level. Data are reported at the State level for farm income and balance sheet accounts including and excluding farm households.

One major feature is the separation of the operator's household and dwelling from farm production transactions, assets, and debt. This format is more appropriate for expanding the aggregate accounts into subsector groups. All of the income estimates in this report are based on a calendar year.

The data, while mainly based on information from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Statistical Reporting Service and the Census of Agriculture, also include information from other Government agencies and, in some cases, from private sources. Some minor revisions were made for 1970-77, and other revisions incorporate the 1982 Census of Agriculture beginning with 1978.

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Highlights

This report details a State-by-State financial ranking of the U.S. farm sector in 1984. Crop production, especially from spring-produced crops, returned to near-normal levels after falling in 1983 when Government programs curbed planted acreage and a summer drought lowered yields. Crop prices increased because of 1983's record drawdown in farmer-owned crop inventories. Net farm income, the value of production within the year (whether sold or added to inventories) less expenses, was more than double 1983's figure. Net cash income, which is cash income (regardless of the year of production) less cash expenses, was 2.5 percent above 1983.

Here's a 1984 financial profile of some major farm States:

Leaders in farm cash receipts in 1984 were California, at \$14.2 billion; Texas, \$9.7 billion; Iowa, \$9.3 billion; Nebraska, \$7.1 billion; Illinois, \$6.7 billion; and Minnesota, \$6.2 billion. Texas, Iowa, Nebraska, California, and Wisconsin led in livestock receipts. California, Illinois, Iowa, Texas, and Florida led in crop receipts.

Top earners in cash receipts for major individual commodities were Texas for cattle and calves; Wisconsin for dairy products; Iowa for soybeans, corn, and hogs; Kansas for wheat; Arkansas for broilers; and California for greenhouse and nursery products, eggs, and cotton.

Top earners in net cash income for 1984 were California, at \$3.8 billion; Iowa, \$2.7 billion; Texas, \$2.2 billion; Florida, \$2.1 billion; and Nebraska, \$1.9 billion. Net farm income (with inventory adjustment) was led by California, at \$3.5 billion; Iowa, \$2.2 billion; Texas, \$2.2 billion; Florida, \$1.8 billion; and Illinois, \$1.7 billion.

California farmers spent the most on production, \$12.1 billion, followed by farmers in Texas, \$9.8 billion; Iowa, \$9.1 billion; Illinois, \$7.2 billion; and Nebraska, \$6.7 billion.

Under the balance sheet accounts, the leading States in assets, including farm households, as of December 31, 1984, were Texas, at \$108 billion; California, \$69.3 billion; Iowa, \$53.6 billion; Illinois, \$51.4 billion; and Minnesota, \$39.8 billion. The State rankings, excluding operator households, were the same.

California owed the most total debt, at \$17.8 billion, followed by Iowa, \$16.3 billion; Texas, \$14 billion; Minnesota, \$11.7 billion; and Illinois, \$11.2 billion. The State rankings stayed the same when households were excluded.

Texas registered the largest equity, at \$94 billion, followed by California, \$51.5 billion; Illinois, \$40.2 billion; Iowa, \$37.3 billion; and Minnesota, \$28.1 billion. When operator households were excluded, the rankings remained the same.

The highest debt-to-asset ratios were 32 percent in Nebraska; Iowa, 30.5 percent; South Dakota, 30 percent; Minnesota, 29.5 percent; and Georgia, 28.5 percent.

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Economic Indicators of the Farm Sector

State Financial Summary, 1984

1984 Agriculture Wrap-Up

Net cash income rose 2 percent in 1984. The gain resulted from a 4-percent increase in cash receipts from farm marketings which helped offset higher cash expenses and a drop in direct Government payments. A substantial buildup of inventories in 1984 boosted net farm income to more than double the previous year's level.

Crop receipts climbed more than 3 percent as higher prices outpaced a lower volume of marketings. We traced the decline to 1983's drought and the Payment-in-Kind (PIK) program which had sharply lowered the 1983 crop harvest. Food grain receipts were unchanged. Wheat receipts fell 4 percent, but farmers earned substantial gains on rice, rye, feed grains, sorghum, and hay. Farmers earned less from sales of corn, oats, and barley. Receipts from soybean marketings fell slightly as reduced marketings offset higher average prices. Increased receipts for peanuts boosted total oil crop receipts by more than 1 percent. Substantial gains in receipts for vegetables and fruits and nuts also contributed to the gain in crop receipts.

Receipts from livestock marketings in 1984 rose almost 5 percent from the previous year, reaching a record \$72.7 billion. With marketing volume holding near the 1983 level, a 4-percent gain in farm prices for all livestock and products accounted for most of the increase. Cash receipts for poultry and eggs registered the largest gain, 22 percent, while dairy receipts dropped 4 percent, the first year-to-year decline since 1962. Cash receipts for other livestock in 1984 were mixed, with cattle receipts up 7 percent and hog receipts off 1 percent.

While cash receipts were up in 1984, direct Government payments to farmers dropped from the year-earlier level. Cash payments, which included deficiency, diversion, disaster, storage, and conservation program payments, fell slightly to about \$4 billion. The Government made its final disbursements of commodities under the PIK programs. These disbursements, valued at almost \$4.5 billion, were \$700 million less than the year before. Corn accounted for about two-thirds of the 1984 total, and farmers received additional disbursements of cotton, wheat, sorghum, and rice. Combining both cash and in-kind payments, direct Government payments amounted to \$8.4 billion, about 10 percent below the 1983 level but still well above any other year.

Rising production expenses softened part of the gain in last year's cash receipts. At \$139.5 billion, total production expenses rose almost 3 percent from the PIK- and drought-reduced levels of 1983. Outlays for seed, fertilizer, pesticides, machine hire and customwork, and net rent showed the sharpest year-to-year gains, ranging from 16 to 28 percent. Despite lower prices, increased purchases boosted outlays for livestock by more than 7 percent. Feed costs, however, slipped 4 percent from the previous year's level.

Total interest expenses, at \$21.1 billion, fell 1.4 percent, marking a second consecutive annual decline. The decline in both real estate and nonreal estate interest expenses was attributable to a drop in outstanding debt rather than the average interest rate which remained steady. Interest expenses of \$10.7 billion on real estate debt fell 1 percent from a year earlier, declining for the first time since 1946. Nonreal estate interest expenses, at \$10.4 billion, declined 2 percent and more than 8 percent from the 1982 peak.

Farm income increased despite lower Government payments and higher production expenses. Net cash income, which measures the income available to purchase assets, to retire loans, and to cover farm household expenses, totaled \$39.2 billion in 1984, up 2 percent from the previous year and the highest level on record.

Total net farm income jumped sharply to \$34.5 billion, more than double the 1983 level and a record; it measures the income generated by a given year's production

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has published comprehensive income estimates relating to agriculture since the midtwenties. The series has been revised and expanded, incorporating individual State estimates in 1949 and sales class distributions in 1960. In 1980, new accounts were developed to separate the earnings of the farm business unit from farm family income and to permit a further analysis of the income and wealth of the production units and the operators of those units by type of farm, value of sales class, and type of ownership. These accounts, along with the former accounts, are included in this publication.

The production sector accounts measure the economic viability of the production units (establishments) of the farm sector (a part of the business sector of the national economy) apart from the well-being of the farm operator families (a part of the household sector of the national economy). Information on the nonfarm assets and debts of farm operators is limited and is not reported in this publication.

In this report, the State income accounts (excluding operator households) include data for calendar years 1981 through 1984. The balance sheet accounts (excluding operator households) include data for December 31, 1980, through December 31, 1984.

This publication consists of an income section and a balance sheet section. Titles of tables in both sections indicate whether farm operator household transactions are included or excluded.

The terms "farm" and "establishment" represent the place where the production process occurred. In this report, the establishment concept used for 1977 and following years is based on the official Census farm definition adopted in 1974 which includes places with annual sales, or potential sales, of \$1,000 or more.

Households include all families or individuals receiving income from the agricultural production sector. The household category emphasized in this report is farm operators, although some of the tables include landlord and employee categories. The operator category includes owners and tenants, as well as managers associated with corporate or institutional establishments.

whether sold, used onfarm, or held in inventory. The substantial gain in net farm income followed the large swing in the value of the change in farm inventories. Farmers drew down inventories sharply, resulting in a net reduction to total gross income of \$9.8 billion in 1983. However, as inventories were replenished in 1984, the value of the change in inventories added about \$7.8 billion to the total gross income of farmers. The nearly \$18-billion swing between the 2 years made up the bulk of the sharp rise in total net farm income in 1984.

State Income Accounts

Table 1 summarizes major income statistics; table 2 shows rankings by commodity; table 3 shows rankings by State. Net farm income and its components appear in table 4, followed by cash income with components in table 5 and farm production transactions in table 6. Other tables present cash receipts by commodities, farm production expenses by State, and Government payments by program and State.

Rankings by Commodity and State

In 1984, California led in cash receipts from all commodities with \$14.2 billion. California led in sales of all crops and ranked fourth for all livestock. California was also the top producer of greenhouse and nursery products, eggs, cotton, hay, tomatoes, sugar beets, grapes, and lettuce.

Texas ranked second by earning \$9.7 billion in cash receipts, with the highest sales of livestock and fourth highest crop sales. Texas was the leading producer of cattle and calves and sorghum grain. Iowa, a principal crops and livestock producer, ranked third in all commodities, second in all livestock, and third in crops. Nebraska ranked fourth in all commodities, and Illinois ranked fifth.

In 1974, the top five States in cash receipts were California, Iowa, Illinois, Texas, and Minnesota. California, Texas, Iowa, Illinois, and Kansas ranked as the top States in cash receipts for all commodities in 1984; Texas led in livestock receipts and California in crop receipts. The proportion of total cash receipts remained fairly stable with the top five States having 35 percent of the total cash receipts in 1974, 35 percent in 1979, and 33 percent in 1983 and 1984.

Net Farm Income

Net farm income is a measure of the net value of production occurring within a given year. Unsold and unused portions of new production are valued and added to sales in deriving net farm income. Sales from beginning-year inventories are deducted to eliminate the effects of production from prior years. Inventories typically climb during years of heavy production and decline when production is below normal.

The net farm income accounts differ from both the cash income and production transactions accounts in that farm household income is included in net farm income. The farm household accounts affect both the income and expenses in net farm income. The imputed rental value of all farm dwellings is included as income. The expenses for these dwellings are included in repair and operation, interest, taxes, capital consumption, and other miscellaneous expenses. The impact of the dwelling tends to increase with the degree of urbanization, because of higher real estate values and, with the preponderance of small farms, because of fewer acres of farmland per dwelling.

The five leading States in net farm income after inventory adjustment were California, at \$3.5 billion; Iowa, \$2.2 billion; Texas, \$2.2 billion; Florida, \$1.8 billion; and Illinois, \$1.7 billion.

Three States recorded negative net farm income after inventory adjustment: Wyoming, at -\$76 million; Montana, -\$55 million; and West Virginia, -\$12 million. A common characteristic is that cattle and calves was the leading commodity in sales for all three States.

Cash Flow

Cashflow status is an indicator of the short-term financial situation of farmers. Although the wealth and income situation of the average farm operator may be adequate, the cash flow may be inadequate to meet current obligations, thus causing financial difficulties. Inadequate cash flow may not be unusual for beginning farmers and for those who may recently have purchased land financed at high interest rates.

Net cash income is a better indicator of funds generated by the business for loan servicing and other essential expenditures than the more widely quoted net farm income, but the two measures are complementary. Net cash income is a function of all cash transactions (and share rent), including sales of commodities produced in prior years. Net cash income does not include noncash items such as the imputed rental value of farm residences and the value of food consumed on farms where produced. Net cash income is more comparable to taxable income, because most farmers are taxed on a cash accounting basis rather than an accrual accounting basis.

State cash income differs from the production transactions table in that only cash transactions enter the calculations. Net inventory change, rental value of hired laborers' dwellings, and home consumption are not cash items and are not included in receipts. Cash uses include only expenses that are cash transactions. Capital consumption is a noncash expense and is not included. The perquisites for hired labor are also excluded. Cash income from farming measures the cash available for capital asset purchases, loan retirement, and operator household cash income. Cash income from farming is generally higher than returns to operators.

Cash income from farming for the United States rose to \$39.2 billion from \$38.3 billion in 1983. Cash income from farming in 1984 was highest in California, at \$3.8 billion, followed by Iowa, \$2.7 billion; Texas, \$2.2 billion; Florida, \$2.1 billion; and Nebraska, \$1.9 billion. In 1983, the top earners were California, Iowa, Texas, Illinois, and Minnesota.

Farm Production Transactions

In the transaction summary, the residual is returns to operators (gross receipts minus nonfactor payments minus factor payments), and total receipts are designated gross receipts of farms. In the income summary, total receipts are designated gross farm income. The components of gross receipts of farms are farm marketings of crops and livestock, net inventory change, Government payments, other farm income (machine hire and customwork income, recreational income and other farm-related income, rental value of farm laborers' dwellings, and forest product sales), and the value of home consumption. The components of gross farm income are cash receipts, Government payments, other farm income (machine hire and customwork income, recreational income and other farm-related income, and forest product sales), and nonmoney income (gross rental value of all farm dwellings and the value of home consumption). Gross receipts of farms and gross farm income treat Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) loans as sales and include them as a cash receipt.

A major difference exists between the two series because the gross-receipts-of-farms category includes only the rental value of farm laborers' dwellings. Gross receipts of farms also include net inventory change, and gross farm income does not.

Production expenses under the production transactions accounts are divided into nonfactor and factor payments. Nonfactor payments include intermediate production expenses of nonfarm origin, such as fuel, repairs, fertilizer, and pesticides, and of farm origin, such as seed, feed, and livestock purchased. Other nonfactor payments include capital consumption and business taxes.

Capital consumption, used to capture the expense for the flow of services (such as wear and tear and obsolescence) provided by durable goods in the current period includes depreciation and accidental damage of the capital stock. The current expense of capital consumption is measured as the value of the addition to capital stock which would insure that the serviceability of the capital stock at the beginning of the period is equal to its serviceability at the end of the period. The maintenance of stock, therefore, requires that capital consumption be valued on a replacement value basis rather than on an original purchase price basis. Depreciation is lower in the production transactions accounts than in the net farm income accounts because the operators' dwellings are not included.

Factor payments are the income available to provide returns to the factors of production: land, labor, and capital. These returns are interest, wages to hired labor, net rent to all landlords, and returns to operators. Returns to operators are the portion of income left to the operators as the returns for their own labor and management of factors used in the farm business. California led the Nation in returns to operators, at \$3.2 billion, followed by Iowa, \$1.9 billion; Florida, \$1.7 billion; Texas, \$1.7 billion; and Illinois, \$1.4 billion. In 1983 California led in total returns to operators at \$2.3 billion, followed by Florida, \$1.7 billion; Texas, \$1.1 billion; Washington, \$754 million; and Wisconsin, \$561 million.

Factor payments for the United States increased to \$34.7 billion from \$33.9 billion. Nonfactor payments increased to \$99.3 billion from \$96.2 billion.

Many of the States that had negative returns to operators in 1983 showed positive returns to operators in 1984, with the U.S. total increasing to \$28.4 billion from \$8.6 billion. The Corn Belt States, which showed the largest losses in 1983, rebounded with some of the highest returns. Only three States had negative returns in 1984: Montana, -\$119 million; Wyoming, -\$106 million; and West Virginia, -\$49 million.

Returns to farm production resources were higher in 1984 than in 1983, especially in States dependent on grains and livestock, such as in the Corn Belt. Favorable weather conditions, increased production, and higher prices contributed to these increased returns to farm resources. California, Florida, and Texas continued to enjoy strong income positions, because of the diversity and size of their agricultural production.

Production Expenses

Production expenses in the transactions accounts and net farm income accounts differ in several ways. The expenses associated with operators' dwellings appear under the net farm income accounts but not under the transactions accounts. Expenses are higher in the net farm income accounts because they include household expenses, such as repairs, interest, business taxes, capital consumption, and other miscellaneous costs. Feed, livestock, seed, fertilizer, electricity,

marketing charges, and nonreal estate interest are the same for both accounts. Contract labor is a part of wages under the net farm income accounts but is a part of the service accounts (machine hire, customwork, and contract labor) in the transactions accounts. In the net farm income accounts, only net rent to nonoperator landlords is an expense, because it represents payment by the farm sector for the use of land and buildings owned by a nonfarmer. Payment to a farmer-landlord comprises an exchange of funds between farmers and generates no net effect within the sector. In the production transactions account, net rent paid to all landlords is an expense. Because the production transactions account measures the returns to operators from their establishments, we include the cost of renting from both operator and nonoperator landlords.

Total U.S. production expenses increased to \$139.5 billion from \$135.6 billion. The leading States in production expenses, as in 1983, were California, at \$12.1 billion; Texas, \$9.8 billion; Iowa, \$9.1 billion; Illinois, \$7.2 billion; and Nebraska, \$6.7 billion.

State Balance Sheet Accounts

The balance sheet accounts measure the current wealth in the farm sector as of December 31. There are two balance sheet accounts, one that includes farm operator households and one that excludes farm operator households. Both accounts include the landlord's farm assets and debts in addition to the farmer's farm assets and debt. The account that includes operator's household also includes part of the farm family's personal assets, such as the value of the operator dwelling if it is located on the farm, the value of household equipment and furnishings of farmers, the portion of automobiles and trucks used for nonfarm purposes, time deposits, savings bonds, and the related debt on these items. These items were included because the personal welfare of many small farmers was tied to the welfare of farming operations when this account was set up in 1945. The account that excludes farm operator households also excludes the farm family's personal assets and debts. What remains is the farm sector's assets and debts for both farmers and landlords. We recommend the use of the account that includes farm operator households when looking at the effect of farming on wealth or well-being of farm families or rural communities. Use the balance sheet account that excludes farm operator households when assessing farm sector well-being.

The balance sheet of the farm sector differs from ordinary balance sheets because it measures the value of assets at current market value instead of book value. Starting with this publication, the balance sheet date will be December 31 instead of January 1. For example, what would have been January 1, 1985, will now be December 31, 1984. The day's difference means it will be easier to compare income figures to the balance sheet data because calendar year income data will correspond with the end-of-year balance sheet data.

We made numerous revisions to the State-level accounts, mostly by incorporating data from the 1982 Census of Agriculture. There has been a major change in the way State-level debt for the Farm Credit Administration (FCA) lenders is calculated. For years before December 31, 1983 and 1984, FCA provided the Economic Research Service (ERS) with information by State on agricultural loans outstanding held by the Federal land banks, Production Credit Associations (PCA's), and Federal Intermediate Credit Banks. For December 31, 1983 and 1984, FCA provided only loans outstanding by district. We derived State figures by using the distributional pattern of the loans outstanding for December 31, 1982, and applied this same pattern to the district totals.

This year, FCA furnished revised data on outstanding loans held by Federal land banks and PCA's for December 1974 through December 1984. The revised figures incorporated the nonaccrual loans inadvertently left out by the FCA. We assigned the revised figures to States based on the State distribution pattern of loans for each year.

Beginning with this publication, we apply the same methodology for calculating Alaska and Hawaii farmland values as we use for the other 48 States.

Real estate assets amounted to over 75 percent of total farm asset values, showing that fluctuating real estate values strongly affect total farm assets. Total U.S. farm assets, excluding operator dwellings, fell to \$856 billion on December 31, 1984, off 14.7 percent since 1980, the year of peak equity. U.S. farm real estate asset values declined 17.9 percent between 1980 and 1984, while nonreal estate values declined by 3.4 percent. The leading State in total farm assets, excluding operator dwellings, was Texas, at \$98.2 billion. Texas was the only major agricultural State that realized an increase in total farm asset values since 1980, with a 31.6-percent increase from 1980 to 1984. All other leading agricultural States experienced declines in farm asset values. California was the second leading State with \$63 billion in total assets, followed by Iowa, \$49.9 billion; Illinois, \$48.2 billion; and Minnesota, \$36.4 billion. In 1980, Iowa held the highest total asset value of \$82.3 billion, followed by Texas, \$74.6 billion; Illinois, \$73.4 billion; California, \$64.5 billion; and Minnesota, \$49.4 billion. Since then, however, Iowa reported the greatest decline in total farm asset values with a decrease of 39.3 percent. Iowa's real estate values declined 46.8 percent over the same time period.

Debt and Equity

Total U.S. farm debt amounted to \$198.9 billion on December 31, 1984, an increase of 16.7 percent since December 31, 1980. Although real estate debt increased 17 percent over the same time period, the ratio of real estate debt to total debt remained constant at 52 percent. California was the leading State in total liabilities, excluding operator dwellings, on December 31, 1984, at \$16.8 billion, and showed \$8.7 billion as real estate debt and \$8.1 billion as nonreal estate debt. California's total debt increased most, by 29.2 percent, from 1980 to 1984. Iowa was second in total liabilities, at \$15.6 billion, with \$8.3 billion in real estate debt and \$7.2 billion in nonreal estate debt. Texas debt ranked third, \$13.3 billion, with \$6.1 billion real estate and \$7.2 billion nonreal estate debt. Minnesota's total debt of \$21.1 billion consisted of \$15.4 billion in real estate and \$5.7 billion in nonreal estate debt. Illinois, ranked fifth, had \$10.8 billion in total debt, with \$6.9 billion in real estate and \$4.6 billion in nonreal estate debt.

Equity in agriculture has fallen with declines in total asset values and increases in total debt since 1980. Equity fell \$175.6 billion from December 31, 1980, to December 31, 1984, a 21.1-percent decline to its present level of \$657.2 billion. All leading agricultural States, except Texas, showed falling equity levels. Iowa realized the greatest decline in equity at 49.8 percent, from 1980 to 1984. Illinois, Indiana, and Nebraska also realized over 40-percent declines in equity during 1980-84. Minnesota and Ohio equity fell 37 percent. Texas, by contrast, was the only leading agricultural State to show an increase in equity, at 32.7 percent, during 1980-84.

Debt-to-Asset Ratio

We use the debt-to-asset ratio as a measure of financial stress. The ratio determines the solvency and risk-bearing ability of the agricultural sector. The debt-to-asset ratio has been climbing the past 4 years, because of falling land values and the failure of lower income levels to retire outstanding farm debt. The debt-to-asset ratio for the United States, excluding operator dwellings, increased from 17 percent on December 31, 1980, to 23.2 percent on December 31, 1984. The decline in farmland values has hit some States hard, particularly in the Corn Belt. In Illinois, the debt-to-asset ratio increased from 12.8 percent in 1980 to 22.3 percent in 1984; Iowa, from 16.9 percent to 31.2 percent; and Indiana, from 16.5 percent to 25.9 percent. However, in Texas, the debt-to-asset ratio declined from 14.3 percent to 13.5 percent. Nebraska had the highest debt-to-asset ratio of all States, at 32.6 percent, followed by Iowa, 31.2 percent; Minnesota, 30.4 percent; South Dakota, 30.4 percent; and Georgia, 29.8 percent.
