ABSTRACT

These three reports offer data and analysis on enrollments in the Illinois public community colleges, focusing on second term (i.e., winter quarter or spring semester) enrollments in fiscal year (FY) 1986, community education/non-credit enrollment and community service activities in fall 1985, and summer term 1986 enrollments. Selected findings include the following: (1) headcount decreased by 8.4% and full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment decreased by 4.7% from second term enrollment in FY 1985; (2) compared with fall 1985 enrollment, second term headcount and FTE enrollments decreased 6.2% and 6.6%, respectively; (3) of the 54,637 students participating in non-credit courses in 46 of the 50 Illinois community colleges, approximately two-thirds were female; (4) the 50 colleges offered more than 1,600 community service workshops, conferences, and seminars, serving a total of 69,743 participants; and (5) total summer 1986 headcount enrollment was 167,515, representing a decrease of 4.9% over the previous summer. REPORT OF FISCAL YEAR 1986 WINTER QUARTER/SPRING SEMESTER
ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE OPENING ENROLLMENT

REPORT: The Winter Quarter/Spring Semester (second term) Enrollment Survey reports opening community college enrollments as of the end of registration (usually the 10th day of the term). The report covers enrollments for the three college districts on winter quarter and the thirty-six districts on semester systems. Results of the Fiscal Year 1986 survey show that headcount decreased by 8.4 percent and FTE by 4.7 percent from the winter quarter/spring semester Fiscal year 1985. Table 1 shows a comparison of this term's enrollments with those of last year's and with fall 1985 term. The total headcount was 318,575, a decrease of 29,229, and the total FTE enrollment was 155,627, a decrease of 7,685 from Fiscal Year 1985. Compared with fall enrollment, winter/spring headcount and FTE enrollments have decreased 6.2 and 6.6 percent, respectively. Both of these decreases are greater than normally occur between fall and winter/spring terms.

Table 2 on the next page shows a comparison of winter quarter/spring semester headcount and FTE enrollments for the same term during Fiscal Year 1985. Of the 39 districts, eight reported increases, 26 showed decreases, five reported little or no change (less than one percent change) in headcount. FTE increases were reported by eight districts, decreases by 26, and five districts reported little or no change.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION (NON-CREDIT) ENROLLMENTS AND COMMUNITY SERVICE ACTIVITIES SURVEY REPORT: FALL 1985

REPORT: Each year in addition to offering academic courses for credit, the Illinois public community colleges strive to meet the needs of their local areas by offering public service programs. Public service programs consist of non-credit community education courses and other activities of an educational nature such as workshops, conferences, seminars, forums, and exhibits. In order to ascertain the extent of public service activities within the community college system of Illinois, the Illinois Community College Board conducts a survey of community education (non-credit) classes and other community service activities provided by the colleges during the fall term.

Table 1 presents a summary of the unduplicated number of people taking community education (non-credit) courses during the 1985 Fall Term. Forty-six of the fifty colleges reported enrollments in non-credit courses totaling 54,637 participants. Approximately two-thirds of Fall 1985 non-credit students were females.

A summary of the number of community service workshops, conferences and seminars conducted by the colleges during the fall term and the number of participants are presented in Table 2. The number of participants represent a total count which may include duplicates in more than one activity. The 50 colleges offered more than 1,600 workshops, conferences, and seminars with a total of 69,743 participants.

Table 3 presents a summary of the number of other types of community service activities such as forums, exhibits, concerts, plays, lecture series, etc., that were sponsored by the colleges during the Fall 1985 Term. The colleges sponsored over 3,400 such activities with a total estimated attendance of over 404,175.

In summary, the Illinois public community colleges served 54,637 individuals through non-credit courses and sponsored approximately 5,000 community service activities attended by approximately 474,000 people during the Fall 1985 Term.

REPORT ON SUMMER TERM ENROLLMENT
(SUMMER 1986/FISCAL YEAR 1987)

The First Summer Term Enrollment Survey reports preliminary community college enrollments as of the end of registration (usually the fifth to the tenth day of the term) of the first summer term. Results of the fiscal year 1987 summer survey show that headcount and credit hours decreased from the summer term fiscal year 1986. The total student headcount was 167,515, a decrease of 8,701 (4.9 percent). This decrease was less than that experienced one year ago when a decrease of 7.7 percent occurred. The total number of credit hours was 704,150, a decrease of 24,390 (3.3 percent) from Summer 1985. Table 1 shows a summary of the number of districts reporting increases, decreases, or little or no change (less than one percent change) from one year ago compared to the gains and losses reported last year. While the system continued to experience decreases in both total headcount and credit hours, fewer districts reported decreases in headcount and credit hours this year than last year.
