ABSTRACT

This publication presents the current approval status of each of the 44 colleges and universities in North Carolina that offer programs leading to initial and advanced-level teacher certification. Programs leading to certification of professional school personnel may exist at the 4-, 5-, 6-, and 7-year levels. Certification at the fourth-year level represents the equivalent of a 4-year planned program of study that culminates in the bachelor's degree. The fifth year level requires the completion of an approved program, culminating in a master's degree. The sixth-year level equates to a 60 semester hour planned graduate program for which the master's degree is prerequisite for completion. At the seventh-year level, the doctoral degree is required along with the completion of an approved program. Approved programs, accreditation, term of approval, approved program cycle, and contact person are listed for each college or university. (JD)

INTRODUCTION

This publication presents the current approval status of each of the forty-four colleges and universities in North Carolina that offer programs leading to initial and advanced-level teacher certification.

Programs leading to certification of professional school personnel may exist at the 4, 5, 6, and 7 year levels. Certification at the 4th year level represents the equivalent of a four-year planned program of study that culminates with the Bachelor's degree. The 5th year level requires the completion of an approved program, culminating with a Master's degree. The 6th year level equates to a 60 semester hour planned graduate program for which the Master's degree is prerequisite for completion. At the 7th year level, the doctoral degree is required along with the completion of an approved program.

Under the "Approved Program Approach," institutions requesting approval are required to document their compliance with State standards for teacher education programs. Full approval for a seven-year period is granted by the State Board of Education when all standards are judged to be met. Approval of a shorter duration indicates either a provisional approval during which time institutions must address recommendations relative to compliance with specific standards. Once approved by the State Board of Education, institutions may recommend their graduates for certification.

Temporary Authorization is granted by the Division of Program Approval for the establishment of new certification programs. Once operational, the new program is reviewed by an on-site visitation team for approval action.

Prospective teachers wishing to prepare for teaching in a specified field or grade level are referred to institutions offering approved programs. Inquiries regarding teacher education program requirements should be addressed directly to the institution under consideration.

Pursuant to G.S. 115C-284(c), 115C-296, and 115C-315(d), the State Board of Education has designated the National Teacher Examinations (NTE) as the standard examinations required as prerequisite to initial certification (North Carolina Administrative Procedures Code 2H.1707). NTE requirements are in addition to all other requirements for any certificate. The following are minimum score requirements for initial certification in North Carolina effective February 2, 1984.

Professional Knowledge Examination Score. (PK) All applicants for initial certification in North Carolina will be required to present a minimum score of 644 on the Professional Knowledge Examination.

Teaching Area Scores. A minimum teaching area score, as shown in the following table, is required of all applicants for initial certification in North Carolina. If no appropriate teaching area examination is available from Educational Testing Service for the area(s) of certification you qualify for, the Professional Knowledge minimum score shall satisfy the NTE requirement. A maximum of one area exam (if one is offered) is required even if you qualify for more than one area of certification.

.1707 STANDARD EXAMINATIONS

(a) Pursuant to G.S. 115C-296 the State Board of Education herewith designates the National Teacher Examinations as the standard examinations required for initial certification. NTE requirements are in addition to all other requirements for any certificate. The following minimum score requirements shall be effective upon adoption.

- (1) Communication Skills Score. Effective July 1, 1984 a minimum score of 632 and effective July 1, 1986 a minimum score of 636 on the Communications Skills Test shall be required for formal admission to an approved teacher education program.
- (2) General Knowledge Score. Effective July 1, 1984 a minimum score of 627 and effective July 1, 1986 a minimum score of 631 on the General Knowledge Test shall be required for formal admission to an approved teacher education program.
- (3) Professional Knowledge Score. A minimum score of 644 on the Professional Knowledge Examination shall be required of all applicants for initial certification.
- (4) If no teaching area score is possible under (a) (5) of this Rule, the Professional Knowledge score shall satisfy the NTE requirement.
- (5) Teaching Area Scores. Minimum teaching area and Professional Knowledge scores are both required except as provided in (a) (4) of this Rule.

(b) In lieu of National Teacher Examinations scores an applicant may be certified on the basis of the equivalent percentile score on the Graduate Record Examinations as specified by the State Board effective July 1, 1982.

NORTH CAROLINA RECIPROCIITY PLANS

Programs of teacher education in out-of-state institutions are recognized to the extent that they are equivalent to North Carolina's standards and guidelines. The State recognizes four teacher education and certification reciprocity approaches as outlined below.

I. RECIPROCIITY BASED ON ACCREDITATION BY THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR ACCREDITATION OF TEACHER EDUCATION (NCATE)

A graduate of an institution outside of North Carolina accredited by NCATE at the time of graduation is eligible for a North Carolina certificate.

II. RECIPROCIITY BASED ON INTERSTATE AGREEMENTS

A plan has been developed whereby states with similar standards for teachers have contracted to issue certificates on a reciprocity basis. North Carolina now has a reciprocal contract with 28 states as follows:

III. RECIPROCIITY BASED ON APPROVAL BY NASDTEC

The National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification (NASDTEC) has developed and adopted standards for state approval of teacher education. The following states are included in this reciprocity plan for initial certification:

NOTE: It should be observed that some states appear under both the Interstate Agreement arrangement and the NASDTEC plan. This has no significance other than that they qualify under both plans.

1V. RECIPROCITY BASED ON PROGRAMS NOT ACCREDITED BY NCATE OR APPROVED THROUGH THE INTERSTATE AGREEMENT OF THE NASDTEC PLAN

Records of applicants prepared by out-of-state institutions that are accredited by their state board of education or a regional accrediting agency but not by NCATE or recognized through any other reciprocity procedure will be issued a Provisional Class A Certificate provided the following conditions have been met:

- A. The applicant shall be a graduate of an accredited senior college.
- B. Reciprocal relations shall be concerned only with certification of classroom teachers at the bachelor's degree level.
- C. The reciprocity certificate shall be restricted to the areas and levels in which the applicant holds, or is qualified to hold, an out-of-state certificate.
- D. The reciprocity certificate (Provisional) shall be valid for one year. After the completion of a year of successful teaching experience in North Carolina, the provisional limitation will be removed.
- E. The reciprocity certificate shall be subject to the renewal requirements of North Carolina.
- F. The applicant must hold, or be qualified to hold, the highest grade current certificate in the state in which the teacher education program at the bachelor's degree level was completed.

NORTH CAROLINA CERTIFICATION PROCEDURES

- 1. Secure and complete an application for North Carolina certification.
- 2. Have preparing institution(s) complete recommendation form(s).
- 3. File copy of out-of-state certificate, if issued. If out-of-state certificate has not been issued, the application will be processed using transcripts and recommendations only.
- 4. Secure complete documentation of all college transcripts and verification of all teaching experience outside of the North Carolina public schools.
- 5. File the completed application and documentation as a package with the Division of Certification, State Department of Public Instruction, Raleigh, North Carolina 27611.
