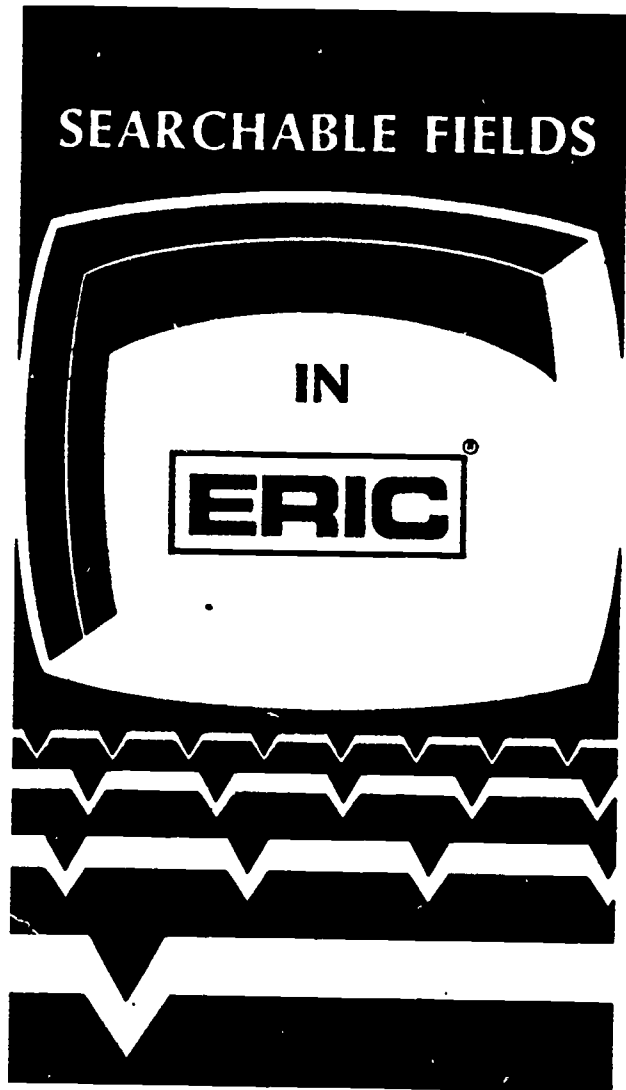

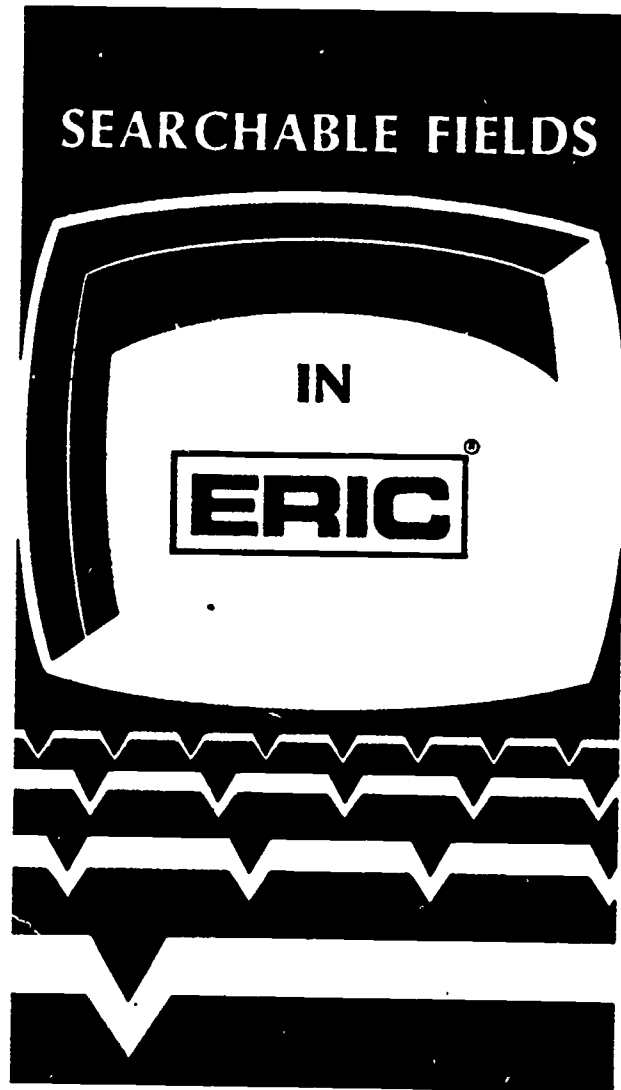

Clues to ERIC

ERIC is the Educational Resources Information Center, formed in 1966 to offer users access to the world of educational literature. Today the ERIC database is one of the nation's largest bibliographic databases, having indexed over half a million documents in the field of education.



ERIC's Searchable Fields and Vendors' Field Access Labels

Two subfiles provide online access to the ERIC database: **Resources In Education (RIE)** and **Current Index to Journals In Education (CIJE)**. RIE provides bibliographic information and abstracts for a variety of educational documents. RIE documents (identified by "ED" Accession numbers) are available on microfiche at over 700 libraries and educational institutions in the United States. CIJE is an annotated index to articles on education from more than 760 journals. CIJE documents (identified by "EJ" Accession numbers) can be found at any library that carries the referenced journals. RIE and CIJE indexes are available in printed form at over 2,000 libraries and educational service centers throughout the United States and abroad.

This reference guide introduces and explains major searchable fields of the ERIC database and presents field access labels (field access commands) of three online ERIC vendors—BRS, DIALOG, and ORBIT. The guide also lists the codes necessary for searching particular ERIC fields. Some fields are not searchable by certain vendors; in such cases, the space for the field access label is left blank. Explanatory notes and instructions concerning the field access labels appear in italics.

The vendors offer different options for searching ERIC. Contact the vendor of your choice for information about search services. Although many searching options are available, for precision searching you are encouraged to use the controlled vocabulary in the **Thesaurus of ERIC Descriptors**. For further information on search strategies, contact the ERIC Processing and Reference Facility, which will refer you to the appropriate ERIC Clearinghouse. Addresses for the vendors and the ERIC Facility, along with names of the ERIC Clearinghouses, appear later in this guide.
