ABSTRACT

New York State college and university admissions and enrollment data for fall 1984 are presented, with statistical tables providing data for specific institutions, as well as for various institutional classifications. Data are provided on: trends in degree-credit enrollment by type of institution from fall 1970 to fall 1984; degree-credit enrollment by level of study, sector, and sex of student for fall 1984; first-time student degree-credit enrollment in institutions by sector; degree-credit and noncredit enrollment by level of program and institutional classification, as well as for specific institutions; degree-credit enrollment in occupational programs by major program area, level, attendance status, and sex of student; undergraduate upper-division degree-credit enrollment in institutions by major subject area, level, attendance status and sex of student; first-professional degree-credit enrollment in institutions by subject area; mastar's, and doctoral degree program enrollment by major subject area, level, attendance status, and sex of student; trends in undergraduate admissions by sector and admissions status, fall 1982 to fall 1984; and undergraduate applications received, accepted, and full-time students actually enrolled in class by institutional classification. DEFINITIONS

DEGREE-CREDIT ENROLLMENT: Students in a program or taking courses which are creditable toward a diploma; certificate; or associate, bachelor's, master's, doctoral, or first-professional degree.

UNDERGRADUATE:

LOWER DIVISION - Includes freshmen and sophomores in bachelor's degree programs, students in associate degree programs, and students in terminal occupational programs of one, two, or three years that result in formal recognition below the baccalaureate. UPPER DIVISION - Includes students who have completed the sophomore year and typically are enrolled in a four- or five-year bachelor's degree program. UNCLASSIFIED - Not candidates for a degree or other formal award, although taking degree-credit courses designated by the institution as undergraduate level. Includes students in undergraduate certificate or diploma programs of less than one academic year. ORGANIZED OCCUPATIONAL ENROLLMENT - Students in a program specifically associated with the development of skills required for occupations at the technical or semiprofessional level. FIRST-TIME STUDENTS - Students who have not previously enrolled in any college. however, students admitted under "Advance Credit or Advance Placement" plans if they had never been previously enrolled in an institution of higher education and students attending college for the first time during the summer session are included.

FIRST-PROFESSIONAL: Students enrolled in a professional school or program which requires at least two academic years of college work for entrance and a total of at least six years for a degree. Report only students in the following first-professional degree programs: Dentistry (D.D.S. or D.M.D. degree), Medicine (M.D. degree), Optometry (O.D. degree), Osteopathic Medicine (D.O. degree), Pharmacy (D.Phar. degree), Podiatry (Pod.D., D.P. or Podiatric Medicine, D.P.M., include Chiropody), Veterinary Medicine (D.V.M. degree), Chiropractic (D.C. degree), Law (LL.B. or J.D. degree), and Theological Professions (B.D., M.Div., or other first-professional degree).

GRADUATE:

MASTER'S OR DOCTORAL DEGREE ENROLLMENT - Students who hold a bachelor's or first-professional degree or equivalent, and are in a program for a master's or doctoral degree.

GRADUATE CERTIFICATE ENROLLMENT - Students enrolled in graduate level curricula which lead to a certificate, such as a Certificate of Advanced Studies (CAS, School Administrator and Supervisor, School Counselor, and Library and Information Studies).

UNCLASSIFIED - Students who are not candidates for a graduate degree or certificate but taking degree-credit courses, designated by the institution as graduate level.

- FULL-TIME: Those students whose academic load-coursework or other required activity is at least 75 percent of the normal full-time load. Undergraduate students must carry at least 12 credit hours to be considered full-time, while graduate students must carry at least 9 credit hours.
- PART-TIME: Those students whose academic load-coursework or other required activity is less than 75 percent of the normal full-time load.
- NONCREDIT ENROLLMENT: Students taking courses which are not creditable toward a degree, diploma, or certificate.
