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ABSTRACT

In February and March of 1986, Butler County Community College (BCCC), Pennsylvania, conducted a survey of Butler County high school seniors to determine student characteristics, educational plans, influences on plans and college choice, perceptions of BCCC, and information sources. Surveys were administered in class to 1,903 seniors in seven high schools. Study findings, based on a 77% response rate (1,470), included the following: (1) 97% of the respondents were white; (2) an average of 13% of the students' parents did not finish high school, 58% had completed high school, and 29% had attended college; (3) in regard to grade point average, 15% of the students were in the 90 to 100 range, 45% were in the 80 to 90 range, and 37% were in the 70 to 80 range; (4) 817 of the students planned to attend college full-time after graduation, 279 did not plan to attend college, and 182 were undecided; (5) 173 students listed BCCC as their first choice for college attendance; (6) the majority of the seniors from all high schools indicated that they had learned nothing about BCCC through the radio or newspaper; (7) parents and other relatives were the most significant influences on students' future plans; and (8) low cost and closeness to home were the most popular characteristics of BCCC. Survey responses by high school and the survey instrument are included in the study report. (LAL)

Of the 754 seniors, 632 surveys were completed. As with all Butler County high schools, Butler is predominantly white - 97% of the survey respondents are White with 1% Black and all other races represented under 1% each.

The majority of seniors' parents have completed high school. Additionally, many parents have completed some college with a total of 41 through the graduate degree level. The highest real number and percentage of college completers are parents of students with graduation plans to attend a four-year college. Of the 233 students in this category, 59 parents have a bachelor degree, and an additional 29 have a graduate degree.

In regard to student GPA, the majority of students claim to be in the 80-90 range, with the majority of those represented by students choosing to attend a four-year college.

Lastly, WDVE, B-94, and WYDD respectively are the top radio stations, with the Butler Eagle and Pittsburgh Press representing top newspapers.

Of the 121 seniors, 105 surveys were completed. These seniors are 97% White, with 3% represented by the Asian or Pacific Islander race.

As with each of the seven high schools, the majority of seniors' parents have completed high school. Additionally, many parents have completed college, with five through the graduate degree level. The highest real number and percentage of college completers are parents of students with graduation plans to attend a four-year college. Of the 27 students in this category, 9 parents have a bachelor degree, and an additional 3 have a graduate degree.

In regard to student GPA, the majority of students claim to be in the 80-90 range, with the majority of those represented by students choosing to attend a community college.

Of the 225 seniors, 164 surveys were completed. These seniors are 97.6% White, with Blacks and American Indians at 1% each and Asian or Pacific Islanders representing less than 1%.

The majority of seniors' parents have completed high school. Again, many parents have completed college, with 11 through the graduate degree level. The highest real number and percentage of college completers are parents of students with graduation plans to attend a four-year college. Of the 64 students in this category, 12 parents have a bachelor degree and an additional 7 have a graduate degree.

In regard to student GPA, the majority of students claim to be in the 80-90 range, with the majority of those represented by students choosing to attend a four-year college.

Of the 162 seniors, 108 surveys were completed. These seniors are 99% White with only one Hispanic and one American Indian.

The majority of seniors' parents have completed high school. Again, many parents have completed college with seven through the graduate degree level. The highest real number of college completers are parents of student with graduation plans to attend a four-year college. Of the 50 students in this category, ten have parents with a bachelor degree. Whereas, the highest percentage of college completers are parents of students with graduation plans to attend a community college. In this category, 4 of 25 have bachelor degrees.

In regard to GPA, the majority of students claim to be in the 80-90 range, with the highest real number represented by students planning to attend a four-year college (26 of 50) and the highest percentage represented by students planning to attend a community college (17 of 25, or 68%).

The majority of seniors' parents have completed high school. Many parents have completed some college, with only one completing a graduate degree. The highest real number and percentage of college completers are parents of students with graduation plans to attend a four-year college. Of the 30 students in this category, five parents have a bachelor degree and one parent has a graduate degree.

This table presents background information by high school, in the areas of sex, race, parent's educational background and student GPA. Additionally, top radio stations and newspaper results are summarized.

From a possible 1,903 seniors, 1,470 or 77% of the surveys were completed. The completion rates by schools ranged from 64% to 87%. Of those who completed the survey, 50% are male and 50% female. As would be expected from the results in Table I, 97% of the respondents are White with less than 1% represented by each of the other five racial categories (Black, Hispanic, American Indian, Asian, or Pacific Islander, and Other.)

An average of 13% of the students' parents did not complete high school. (The range of non high school completers was 9.5% - lowest and 26% - highest.) A total of 58% of the parents have completed high school. This number includes completion of a GED, when indicated. The remaining 29% of the parents have had some college, with the majority of those obtaining a bachelor degree.

In regard to student GPA, overall, 15% are in the 90-100 range, with 45% in the 80-90 range, 37% in the 70-80 range and 20% in the 60-70 or below range.

Lastly, WDVE, B-94 and WYDD respectively are the top radio stations overall. This order fluctuates from school to school, with these three stations remaining at the top. The Butler Eagle is the top newspaper for all but one school, where the Pittsburgh Press comes out on top. Overall the Butler Eagle is most widely read.

The results of this table are taken directly from questions 8, 9, 11, 14, 15, 16 and 17. Therefore, each question will be stated and a summary of the results presented by question.

Question #8: "If you plan to go to college after high school will you attend full-time or part-time?"

Overall, most students (817) indicated they would attend full-time. The overall results also hold true for each individual high school. The next largest group (279) indicated that they did not plan to attend college, while the third group (182) are undecided and the smallest group (121) plan to attend part-time.

Question #9: "Have you heard about Butler County Community College?"

The largest group of students, 93% or 1,342, responded "yes," while 7% or 94 responded "no." The largest percentage of "no" answers came from Mars (10.4%), Slippery Rock (10%), and Seneca Valley (9.5%).

Question #11: "If you plan to go to college, please list the colleges that you are considering."

173 students chose BCCC as their first choice.
28 students chose BCCC as their second choice.
26 students chose BCCC as their third choice.

**Questions #14 and 15: 14. "How much have you heard on the radio about BCCC?"
15. "How much have you read in the newspaper about BCCC?"**

The overall results indicate that the majority of seniors have heard or read "none" with "very little" as the second most popular choice. This trend is consistent for each high school.

**Questions #16 and 17: 16. "What do you believe the general attitude about BCCC is at your high school?"
17. "What is your attitude about BCCC?"**

Overall students chose "Fair," "Good," "Poor," and "Excellent" in that order. In a few of the schools, the order was "Good," "Fair," "Poor," and "Excellent."

General Survey Information

Table IV presents the top choices to questions 6, 7, 10, 12, and 13. The top five choices were listed for all questions except #10. (This question only has the top four because of the large gap between the choice ranked #4 versus the #5 ranked choice.) With each of the questions, the student could mark as many choices as applied, with the choice selection ranging from twelve in questions #6 and #13 to twenty-two choices in question #12. Again, as in Table III, each question will be presented individually.

Question #6: "Which of the following have influenced you in making plans for after high school?"

Top choices:	1. Parents and other relatives	973
	2. Friends	585
	3. High school teacher(s)	340
	4. Financial situation	257
	5. College student or graduate	208

Parents and relatives is surely the most significant factor, with each of the next two falling proportionately from the number one choice. This trend is consistent for each individual high school.

Question #7: "What factors have you considered in choosing a college to attend after high school?"

	3. Overall reputation of the college	564
	4. Course offerings	564
	5. Appearance of campus	386

Although these choices are the top five choices, as one might expect based on the closeness of the results, the ordering of the choices vary from school to school.

The first and second choices are obviously the most popular, and strongest characteristics of Butler County Community College.

Question #12: "If you plan to attend a college other than Butler County Community, why not Butler County Community College?"

As with question #7, the order of the top five choices varies from school to school. No two schools have an identical ordering.

It is interesting to note, that although parents and other relatives are noted as having the most influence on student graduation plans (question #6) most frequently students rely on peers for information. Parents and relatives are the second choice for information.

SUMMARY

Two of the questions which were not covered previously: #18, "If you are planning to attend college, what field will you enter?" and #21, "If friends were to ask you to tell them about Butler County Community College what would you say?" help summarize the results of the survey.

The Butler County high school seniors are interested in all fields of study with no one area being most popular. Although, some fields were chosen by more than one student, every major imaginable was represented.

Lastly, most of the comments about BCCC were positive with less than 5% being negative. The most popular positive comments were that BCCC is a good college, or good place to start, it is close to home and has a low cost. The other most popular comment which was considered neither positive nor negative, but of concern is that many seniors don't know anything about BCCC when asked to respond to inquiries.

Overall, BCCC is viewed positively by students. It is considered a "Good - Fair" college which is most popularly not chosen because courses are not offered in the field of the student's interest. However, many students "want a greater academic challenge" and believe that BCCC does not have a "good enough academic reputation." They do not choose BCCC because it is "too close" and has "no dorms."

This study highlights areas of strengths in BCCC's reputation, along with other areas that may be considered or addressed for increasing the already positive attitude of Butler County high school seniors.
