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ABSTRACT

Data on Illinois public community college faculty and staff characteristics are presented and analyzed in this report for fall 1983, 1984, and 1985. Tables provide statistics on faculty and staff employment classification by college; full-time employment classification by sex and ethnic origin; full-time teaching faculty by highest degree held, age, sex, tenure status, and years of service; primary teaching area of full- and part-time faculty; full-time academic support personnel by highest degree held, sex, age, and years of service; and full-time administrative supervisory, and professional/technical personnel by highest degree held, age, sex, and years of service. Summary findings included the following: (1) the colleges reported a total of 21,143 employees in fall 1985; (2) in fall 1985, 49% of the part-time faculty and 36.6% of the full-time faculty were females; (3) a comparison of faculty data with community college student characteristics revealed that minorities were not as well represented among full-time faculty/staff as they were in the student population; (4) in all racial/ethnic categories, the number of men employed was equal to or greater than the number of women, with the exception of Blacks, Hispanics, and other/unknown; and (5) among full-time teaching faculty, 83.6% held master's degrees or higher, 40.5% were between the ages of 40 and 49 years, 85.7% were tenured, 60.2% had been employed in the same classification for 11 years or more, and the most common teaching area was letters. This report presents a summary of the results of Illinois public community college faculty and staff characteristics data for the fall term 1985. The report includes information on full- and part-time teaching faculty and all other full-time staff employed by the colleges during the fall term. A similar report was written for fall terms 1983 and 1984. Information from these reports has been included in this report for comparative purposes. In addition, the reports for 1983 and 1984 are available in their entirety from the ICCB office upon request.

The main body of this report presents the faculty and staff data in statewide summary form for fall terms 1983, 1984, and 1985. Individual district data for the fall term 1985 full-time faculty and staff are presented in Appendix A. Appendix B summarizes the available information on part-time teaching faculty.

Employment Classification

The Illinois public community colleges reported a total of 21,143 employees during the fall term 1985. Part-time staff other than faculty are not reported; hence, we do not have the data for all community college staff. In addition, two colleges were unable to report information on part-time faculty in fall term 1985. Although the data regarding part-time teaching faculty have limitations, they have been summarized and presented, where possible.

Each staff member was classified into one of eight employment classifications: teaching faculty, academic support, administration, supervisory, professional/technical, clerical, custodial, and other. Table 1 shows a summary and the three-year trend of the number of staff by employment classification. Of the fall 1985 full-time staff, the largest category was full-time teaching faculty with 4,765. This was a decrease of 30 or 0.6 percent from a year ago and 4.5 percent from two years ago. The second largest category in fall 1985 was clerical with 2,482, an increase of 129 from last year and 158 from fall 1983. The professional/technical category decreased from 1,385 in fall 1984 to 1,294 in fall 1985, a decrease of 91 or 6.6 percent. Custodial workers increased by 50 from 1,037 in fall 1984 to 1,087 in fall 1985. The administrative category also showed an increase from last year with 962 reported in fall 1985 compared to 885 in fall 1984 and 829 in fall 1983. The number of academic support personnel increased from 526 in fall 1984 to 585 in fall 1985, an increase of more than 11 percent. The smallest category in fall 1985 was supervisory with 284. This represented a decrease of 34 individuals (10.7 percent) from a year ago.

Thirty-seven districts (48 colleges) reported data for part-time faculty in fall 1985. A total of 9,474 was reported for this category (see Appendix B). The two colleges that did not report part-time faculty in fall 1985 for this report had reported a total of approximately 1,167 part-time faculty on the fall salary survey.

\* Table 1 shows that this category fluctuated greatly over the three-year period. However, it is important to note that the large differences in numbers are due to the fact that not all colleges reported their part-time faculty for each of the three years studied rather than actual changes in the number of part-time staff employed.

Table 2 presents a state summary of full-time employees by employment classification and sex for fall terms 1983, 1984, and 1985. Analysis of fall 1985 full-time staff reveals that, as has been the case in previous years, overall employment by sex is fairly evenly distributed with 50.3 percent females and 49.7 percent males. However, examination by employment classification shows much diversity. As might be expected, the clerical staff were predominantly female for the three-year period and the custodial staff were predominantly male. Two categories -- academic support and other -- also were fairly evenly distributed between the sexes over the three-year period. The percentage of female technical staff have steadily increased from 59 percent in fall 1983 to 63.8 percent in 1985. As in previous years, more men than women were employed as administrative staff (67.5 percent male opposed to 32.5 percent female) and as teaching faculty (63.4 percent male and 36.6 percent female) in fall 1985. However, the 1985 percentages indicate a notable increase in the proportion of female administrators. Part-time faculty were fairly evenly split between the sexes. In fall 1985, 49.0 percent of the part-time faculty were female and 50.1 percent were male. (See Appendix B, Table AA.)

Employment classification categories distributed by ethnic origin and sex for full-time personnel for fall terms 1983, 1984, and 1985 are presented in Table 3. Overall, the racial/ethnic origin distribution for fall 1985 was as follows: Asian, 1.6 percent; American Indian, 0.1 percent; black, 15.4 percent; Hispanic, 1.9 percent; white, 80.1 percent; and other or unknown, 0.8 percent. This was similar to the distribution reported in 1984 with Asian, American Indian, and Hispanic remaining fairly unchanged; black decreasing by 0.3 percent; white increasing by 2.9 percent; and other decreasing by 2.8 percent.

A recent ICCB study, Minority Student Participation, Fiscal Years 1983 Through 1986, using federal Equal Employment Opportunity Commission data, shows similar results although employment classifications are different. The major difference between the data sources is the percentages of blacks and whites employed full-time. The data reported directly to the ICCB indicate a higher percentage of blacks and a lower percentage of whites than were reported in the EEO survey. This discrepancy may be due to differences in the dates of data collection.

A comparison of faculty data with community college student characteristics reveals that minorities are not as well represented among full-time faculty/staff as they are in the student population. Data from the Geographic Profile of Employment and Unemployment, 1984, published by the U.S. Department of Labor, classifies the Illinois civilian, non-institutional, employed population for 1984 into three racial/ethnic categories -- white, black, and Hispanic origin. Hispanic counts are duplicated in the counts of whites and blacks, making it difficult to make comparisons between the faculty/staff data and that of the employed population. However, the employed population data are presented here for rough comparative purposes. Whites comprised 87.7 percent of the employed population, blacks comprised 9.6 percent, and "other races" comprised 2.7 percent. Hispanics represented 5.4 percent of the total employed population. Even with Hispanics included in the white and black counts, it is possible to ascertain that on the whole the community college system employs minorities at a higher rate than is found in the general employed population. This is especially true for blacks.

Examination of racial/ethnic data reveals that the fall 1985 distribution varied considerably within employment classifications. In comparison with data for other sectors of higher education in Illinois as provided to the Illinois Board of Higher Education in 1983, community college administrative staff had a higher proportional representation of blacks. Minority representation among community college full-time faculty was lower than representation among community college administrative staff. However, a comparison with the racial/ethnic distribution for faculty from other institutions of higher education in the state shows minority representation in community college faculty to be higher than in other sectors. The most outstanding difference was among black faculty. Other institutions had slightly higher proportional representation for Hispanics and Asians than the community colleges. Table AA of Appendix B shows that in fall 1985 a little over 75 percent of the part-time faculty were white. Blacks comprised 9.5 percent of the part-time faculty followed by Asians with 1.6 percent, Hispanics with 1.2 percent, and American Indians with 0.1 percent. A relatively large percentage of part-time faculty was classified as other or unknown.

During fall term 1985, in all racial/ethnic categories, the number of men employed was equal to or greater than the number of women, with the exception of blacks, Hispanics and other/unknown. In every employment classification, with the exception of administration and custodial, black females outnumbered black males.

The next five sections will discuss more in-depth analyses of the five professional-level employment classification categories: Teaching faculty, academic support, administration, supervisory, and professional/technical.

#### Teaching Faculty

Examination of fall term 1985 data submitted on the highest academic degree earned by full-time teaching faculty reveals that 83.6 percent held master's degrees or higher (see Table 4). The associate degree was the highest degree for 1.7 percent of the teaching faculty, and the bachelor's degree was the highest degree obtained by 10.1 percent. A higher percentage of males (84.3 percent) held graduate degrees in fall 1985 than did females (82.4 percent). Doctoral degrees were held by 13.1 percent of the males compared to 8.4 percent of the females for a combined percentage of 11.4 percent. A comparison with previous years' data indicates that the percentage of faculty with masters and doctoral degrees has increased over the last three years.

Table BB in Appendix B shows that the highest degree earned by 30.8 percent of the fall 1985 part-time faculty was the master's degree. Slightly over 37 percent of the part-time faculty fell into the None/Unknown Degree category. Finally, a little over 21 percent of the part-time faculty had a bachelor's degree as the highest degree earned.

The age structure of the teaching faculty during fall terms 1983, 1984, and 1985 is shown in Table 5. The largest percentage, 40.5 percent, of full-time faculty members in fall 1985 was between the ages of 40 and 49 years. Another 23.3 percent was in the age category of 30 to 39. Only 2.2 percent was under the age of 30, and 2.1 percent was over the age of 65. Slightly less than 34.0 percent was age 50 or older. Women tended to be younger than their male counterparts in fall 1985, with 31.0 percent of the women compared to 35.6 percent of the men age 50 years of age or over. The age structure over the last few years has continued to shift to the older age groups with considerable decline occurring in the under 40 age groups.

Table 6 indicates that a high percentage (85.7 percent) of the fall term 1985 full-time teaching faculty was tenured. This percentage was up from 83.3 percent a year ago and 82.8 percent in fall 1983. A higher percentage of male faculty over female faculty was tenured in fall 1985 (88.3 percent males compared to 81.1 percent females). However, over the last three years, the percentage of female tenured faculty has grown at a faster rate over that of their male counterparts. The percentage of female faculty who were tenured was 77.5 percent in 1983. That number increased to 77.9 percent in 1984 and 81.1 percent in 1985. In contrast, 85.9 percent of the male faculty was tenured in 1983 and 86.5 percent in 1984; a high of 88.3 percent was reached in 1985. In addition, in fall 1985 a slightly higher percentage of female faculty, over male faculty members, held other non-tenured positions (5.7 percent and 3.3 percent, respectively).

As might be expected, a comparison of information on the tenured-status of faculty with data on years of service in the current classification, as presented in Table 7, shows that there is a close correspondence between these two factors. Further examination of years of service reveals that the percentage of faculty employed in the same classification for eleven years or more has increased from 52.5 percent in fall 1983 to 60.2 percent in fall 1985. Men tended to be employed in their positions longer than women. About 50.0 percent of the women faculty members had taught ten years or less compared to only 34.0 percent of the men.

Each faculty member was assigned to a primary teaching area, and if appropriate, to a secondary teaching area. Table 8 presents the number of teaching faculty members employed in primary teaching areas for fall term 1985 only as designated by a two-digit Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) code. A three-year comparison of these teaching areas plus an individual college breakdown of faculty employed in each area is available upon request from the ICCB office. (This detailed information was too voluminous to be included in the body of this report.) Examination of primary teaching area assignments shows that the largest primary teaching area for full-time faculty in fall 1985 was letters (English, literature, etc.) with 617 full-time faculty. The second largest primary teaching area for full-time faculty was business and office with 447 full-time faculty. Other large areas included social sciences, 368; health sciences, 331; math, 314; life sciences, 272; physical sciences, 257; allied health, 220; and business and management, 206. Each of these areas reflected an increase from fall 1984 in the number of full-time faculty reported, with the exception of allied health which showed a decrease of two full-time faculty members. Although complete data are unavailable for part-time faculty, several teaching areas appear to be staffed by a larger number of part-time rather than full-time faculty in fall 1985. These areas include business and management, business and office, allied health, vocational home economics, basic skills, leisure and recreational activities, psychology, protective services, precision production, and visual and performing arts. A number of smaller areas also appear to have more part-time than full-time faculty.

#### Academic Support

Academic support personnel include such professionals as librarians and counselors. The colleges reported a total of 585 persons employed full-time during fall term 1985 in this category. This figure increased 11.2 percent from the fall 1984 academic support employment level of 526. However, the fall 1985 level was almost six percent lower than the fall 1983 level of 622. Table 9 provides information on the highest academic degree attained by this group. In fall 1985, the largest number of academic support staff (400 or

68.4 percent) held master's degrees. Doctoral degrees had been attained by 9.4 percent in fall 1985 compared to 8.6 percent in fall 1984 and 8.8 percent in fall 1983. Slightly less than three-fourths of the doctoral degrees were held by males in fall 1985 compared with approximately 66.7 percent a year ago. On the whole, women in this category had a slightly lower level of degree attainment than men in the three years examined.

Table 10 presents the age structure of academic support personnel for fall terms 1983, 1984, and 1985. The age structure of this group was somewhat similar to that of the teaching faculty during fall term 1985. About 29.9 percent of the academic support employees were 50 years of age or older. This figure fluctuated slightly over the three-year period examined, with 31 percent aged 50 or older in fall 1984 and 26.2 percent in this same category in fall 1983. In fall 1985, nearly 6.0 percent of the academic support group was less than 30 years of age, compared to 2.2 percent of the teaching faculty in the less than 30 category. In fall terms 1983 and 1984, the percentages of academic support personnel under the age of 30 were 7.4 percent and 5.1 percent, respectively.

Table 11 presents the number of years of service (or employment) in their current classification for academic support personnel for fall terms 1983, 1984, and 1985. Examination of fall term 1985 data shows that 40.9 percent of the academic support staff compared to 37.3 percent in fall 1984 had been employed in their current classifications between eleven and twenty years. About 19.3 percent had been employed for two years or less in fall 1985, with 7.7 percent employed less than one year. The percentage of those with less than one year's experience has increased each year since 1983. Of those with less than one year's service, 55.6 percent were women in fall 1985, down from 72.2 percent in fall term 1984. Slightly over 55.0 percent of the men had held their positions for over ten years, compared to only 32.0 percent of women.

#### Administrative Personnel

The colleges reported 962 employees in the full-time administrative employment classification category during fall term 1985, an increase of 8.7 percent from a year ago and an increase of 16.0 percent over the fall 1983 level. The data indicate that colleges use different institutional policies for classifying administrative personnel. Hence, if comparative analysis is desired for this category, each college's local institutional classification policy would need to be obtained and appropriately considered. Interpretation of the following summary data, thus, should take possible classification differences into consideration.

Analysis of the highest academic degree data earned by administrators (see Table 12) shows doctoral degrees were held by 20.0 percent of the administrative staff in fall term 1985, 20.2 percent in fall term 1984, and 20.5 percent in fall term 1983. The data indicate that the number of administrators whose highest degree was a bachelor's degree, rose from 16 percent in fall 1984 to 18 percent in fall 1985. Likewise, the number of administrators whose highest degree was a master's degree, rose 1.4 percent from 46.2 percent in fall 1984 to 47.6 percent in fall 1985. These increased percentages may be due in part to more complete data on degree status as the percentage of unknowns declined over the same period of time.

Table 13 presents the age structure of community college administrative personnel for fall terms 1983, 1984, and 1985. Slightly over 30 percent of administrative personnel were 50 years of age or over in fall term 1985

compared to 28.9 percent in fall 1983. Nearly eight percent of female administrators were less than 30 years of age, compared to only 1.8 percent of the men in this group in fall 1985. In fall 1984, 8.4 percent of female administrators were less than 30 years of age, compared to 2.6 percent of their male counterparts. And in fall 1983, 10.5 percent of the female administrators were less than 30 years of age compared to 2.6 percent of the men.

The final variable examined for this group was years of service in their current classification for the past three fall terms (see Table 14). In fall term 1985, 66.4 percent of the administrators had been in their current classification category ten years or less compared to 69.3 percent in fall 1984. Approximately ten percent of the administrators had been employed less than one year in fall 1985 with 26.3 percent employed in their classification two years or less.

### Supervisory Personnel

Supervisory personnel are those individuals who have the duty, responsibility, or authority to recommend the employment, transfer, suspension, dismissal, promotion, assignment, reward, or discipline of other staff both full- and part-time.

Table 15 presents two-year comparison data on the highest academic degree attained by supervisory personnel. Examination of fall 1985 data reflect that 8.5 percent held associate degrees, 17.3 percent held bachelor's degrees, 27.1 percent held master's degrees, 2.8 percent held doctoral degrees, and 21.9 percent were reported as having "other" degrees during fall term 1985. The remainder (22.5 percent) held no degrees or their educational status was unknown. Fall 1984 data show that five percent of full-time supervisory personnel held associate degrees, 20.1 percent held bachelor's degrees, 24.8 percent held master's degrees, 3.1 percent, doctorate degrees, and 18.6 percent fell into the "none/unknown" category. A comparison of these two years shows that the number of supervisory personnel in each degree category increased from fall 1984 to fall 1985 with the exception of the bachelor's, doctoral, and none/unknown categories.

The age structure of supervisory personnel is shown in Table 16 for fall terms 1984 and 1985. The largest percentage of supervisors, both male and female, was between the ages of 30 and 39 in both fall terms 1984 and 1985 (33.4 percent and 33.8 percent, respectively).

Years of service in supervisory positions for the past two fall terms are presented in Table 17. A high percentage of supervisors, 30.0 percent, had been in their positions for two years or less in fall 1985. This is a slight increase over the fall 1984 figures where 26 percent of the supervisory personnel had been in their positions for two years or less. About 49.7 percent of the supervisors had held their current positions for five years or less in fall 1985 compared to 52.1 percent in fall 1984.

### Professional/Technical Personnel

The professional/technical classification category includes such positions as data analysts, accountants, computer programmers, engineers, and internal auditors. A total of 1,294 individuals was reported in this category during fall term 1985 -- 825 females and 469 males. This represents a decrease of 6.6 percent over the number of professional/technical personnel (1,385) reported a year ago.

Table 18 presents two-year comparison data on the highest academic degree attained by persons in professional/technical positions. A large percentage, 59.1 percent, either did not have a college degree or their educational status was unknown in fall term 1985. Those falling in one of these two categories in fall 1984 numbered 60.8 percent. Bachelor's degrees were held by 22.1 percent, and 9.5 percent held master's degrees in fall 1985. In fall 1984, 21.8 percent held bachelor's degrees and 9.5 percent held master's degrees. As is apparent, these figures hardly fluctuated over the two-year period examined. Only four individuals, less than one percent of the total in this category, held doctoral degrees in fall 1985, and ten individuals held doctorates in fall 1984.

Table 19 presents the age structure of professional/technical personnel for fall terms 1984 and 1985. This category represented the youngest group analyzed in this report for these two fall terms. Over 25 percent were less than 30 years of age during fall terms 1984 and 1985. Only 15.1 percent were 50 years of age or older in fall 1985 compared to 12.6 percent in fall 1984.

Of all the classification categories analyzed in this report, professional/technical personnel had been in their positions the fewest number of years in fall terms 1984 and 1985 (see Table 20). Over 45.0 percent had been in their positions for less than two years, with 19.3 percent having held their positions for less than one year in fall 1985. This was a decrease from fall 1984, where 48.5 percent of these employees had been in their positions less than two years and 21.6 percent had held their positions for less than one year. Nearly three-fourths (71.2 percent) of the professional/technical personnel had been employed in their positions no more than five years in fall 1985, and only one individual in this category had been employed for over 20 years.

#### Summary and Conclusions

Community colleges in Illinois provided detailed characteristics data for 21,143 personnel employed in the fall term 1985. Comparable information is included in this report for fall terms 1983 and 1984. There was a slight increase in the total number of full-time employees reported for fall terms 1984 and 1985. In fall 1984, the colleges reported a total of 11,449 full-time employees, while in fall 1985 they reported 11,669 employees, an increase of 1.9 percent. There were decreases in the numbers of full-time teaching faculty, supervisory, and professional/technical personnel from fall 1984. Increases were reported for administrative, clerical, custodial, academic support, and other full-time staff for the same period.

Analyses of the employment of males and females within the system indicate that with the exception of those areas such as clerical and custodial, which have traditionally been dominated by one sex, most employment classification areas show a fairly even distribution of males and females. As was the situation in fall 1983 and 1984, more males than females were employed as administrators and full-time faculty in fall 1985. The reverse held true for the professional/technical category. After experiencing a decrease in fall 1984, the proportion of male faculty members returned to approximately the same level as 1983, while the proportion of female administrators increased steadily over the three-year period. Examination of those individuals who have been employed in their classification categories for less than a year reveals that in both areas of administration and teaching, more men than women were hired during the most recent year.

The overall distribution of full-time personnel by racial/ethnic categories differs somewhat from the latest U.S. Department of Labor data on the Illinois civilian employment data. Proportionately, more blacks and fewer Hispanics are employed in community colleges than are found in the general civilian employed population. Considerable variation in racial/ethnic distribution was found among the various employment classification areas. A comparison with the racial/ethnic distributions in other institutions of higher education in Illinois shows minorities having a higher proportional representation in faculty and administrative positions in community colleges than is found elsewhere.

Although the number of full-time faculty has decreased slightly, the characteristics of the faculty have remained fairly stable with a large majority being 40 years of age or older, tenured, and having been employed in their current positions for over ten years. In fall 1983, 3.5 percent of the full-time teaching faculty were less than 30 years of age. In fall 1984, this number was 3.0 percent, and 2.2 percent in fall 1985. This decline may be explained in part, by the fact that the faculty were growing older and entering the next age category. Faculty increases occurred in the discipline areas of life and physical sciences, math, business and management, science technologies, basic skills, leisure and recreational activities, liberal/general education, and vocational home economics, among others, over the past year.

The third year of analyses of Illinois public community college personnel demonstrates the importance of this data collection effort. Not only is the database providing the ICCB with an understanding of the characteristics of community college faculty and staff, but it is also beginning to serve as a vehicle for observing trends in the changes that take place in the community college system. The lack of complete information on part-time faculty continues to be a problem. Nearly 69 percent of the community college faculty are teaching on a part-time basis. Therefore, information on this segment of the teaching staff is vital to describe accurately the faculty resources within the community college system.
