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ABSTRACT

An unduplicated headcount of students enrolled in college-level credit courses in Florida's community colleges is provided as taken at the end of the initial drop-add period in fall 1985. The first portion of the report provides data showing 5-year (fall 1981 through fall 1985) statewide trends in actual opening fall credit enrollments. Figures and tables focus on statewide enrollment by student status (i.e., first-time-in-college, returning, or transfer students); by full-/part-time status; by class (i.e., freshman, sophomore, or unclassified); by program (i.e., advanced and professional, vocational, and other); by race; and by sex. Next, tables provide fall 1985 data by campus. Highlighted findings indicate the following: (1) fall enrollments increased in 1985 for the first time since 1983; (2) for the 5 years beginning with 1981, there was an overall decline of 958 students or 0.4%; (3) returning students represented the largest group of community college students, accounting for 67.3% of the total in 1985; (4) first-time-in-college students showed an 11.9% decline since 1981; (5) the number of full-time students decreased by 5.2% over the 5-year period, while the number of part-time students increased by the same percent; and (6) an analysis of enrollments by race and sex showed that there were slight decreases among non-resident aliens and whites, while other ethnic groups showed annual increases or remained fairly constant; and that female students continued to comprise the larger percentage of total students. 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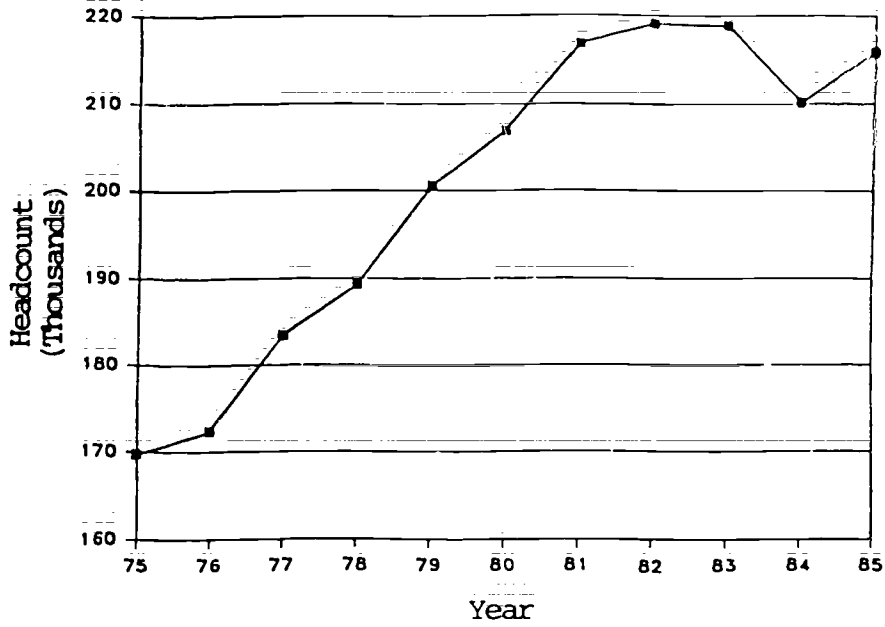
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Opening Fall Enrollments

Fall 1985



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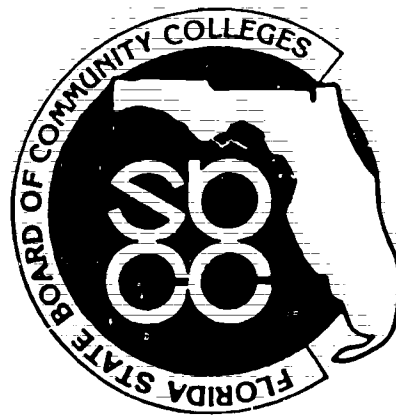

ANALYSIS OF OPENING FALL ENROLLMENTS

The EF-1, Opening Fall Enrollment Report, is an unduplicated head-count of enrolled students taken at the end of the initial drop-add period in the Fall term. It includes only those students registered in college-level credit (advanced and professional and postsecondary vocational) courses. It does not include students enrolled solely in vocational credit courses, adult elementary and secondary courses, or community instructional services courses.

In terms of total enrollments, Fall enrollments increased in 1985 for the first time since Fall 1983. For the five years beginning with 1981, there was an overall decline of 958 or 0.4%.

The first seven tables commencing on page 4, show trends over the past five years (Fall 1981 through Fall 1985) in actual opening Fall credit enrollments.

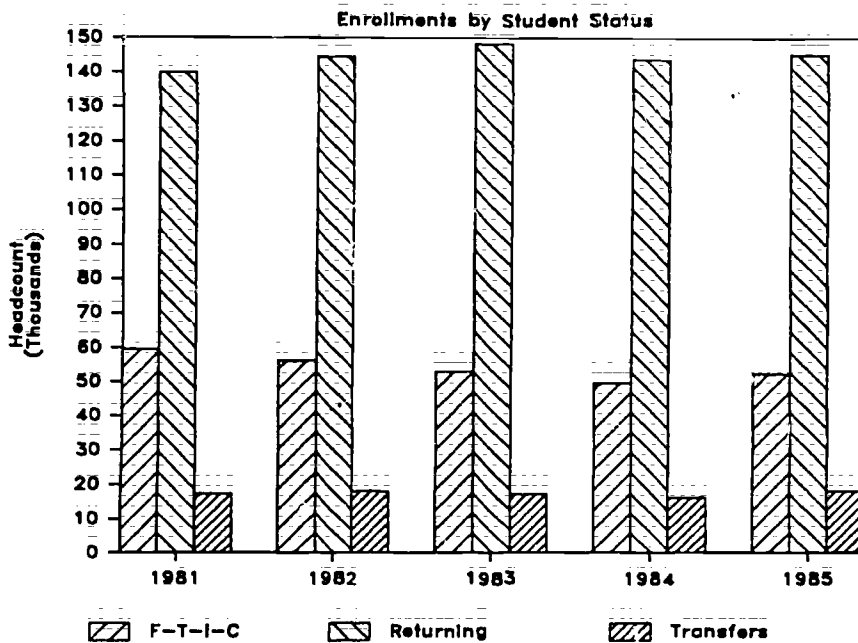
Tables 1 and 2 show this enrollment as first-time-in-college students, returning students, and transfer students. Returning students represent the largest group of community college students. Except for a decline in Fall 1984, this group has increased consistently over the five years, accounting for 67.3% of the total in 1985 compared to 64.5% in 1981. Returning students enrolled the previous year represent 83.4% of the returning students, while returning students not enrolled the previous year comprise the remainder. This latter group have been growing at a faster rate over the five years than the former group and shows a growth rate of 16.8% since 1981.

First-time-in-college students show a 7,071 decline since 1981 or 11.9%. Most of this decline reflects a decrease in enrollments of other first-time-in-college students of 9,675 or 27.0%. Previous year high school graduates (including early admissions) reflect a decrease in 1984 followed by a new high in 1985. The five-year increase for previous year high school graduates was 2,604 or 10.9%.

The remaining group of students reflected in Tables 1 and 2 are transfer students. There has been an increase in the number of transfers since 1981 and the total enrollments for this group accounted for 8.4% of all enrollments in 1985 compared to 8.0% in 1981.

Figure 1 presents a graphic comparison of first-time-in-college (F-T-I-C) students, returning students, and transfer students for the five-year period.

Tables 3, 4, and 5 compare the opening Fall enrollment by full-time/part-time, program, and class, respectively. Table 3 shows that the number of full-time students, has decreased by 11,546 between 1981 and 1985 while the number of part-time students has increased by over 10,588. The percent of the total for full-time students has decreased by 5.2% over the five-year period while, of course, the percent of part-time students has increased by that same percent. Table 4 shows an increase in all programs except vocational from 1981 to 1985. Although the "other" group displays the greatest percent increase (13.0%), the percent of the total enrollment each year has remained fairly consistent for all programs. In Table 5, freshmen decreased 5.7% over the five-year period, while sophomore students increased by 3.5%.

Figure 2 is a graphic representation of the relationship of full-time to part-time student enrollments since 1981. This seems to represent a trend in contrast to the other two groups (full-time/part-time and program) which have tended to fluctuate moderately up and down over the five years.

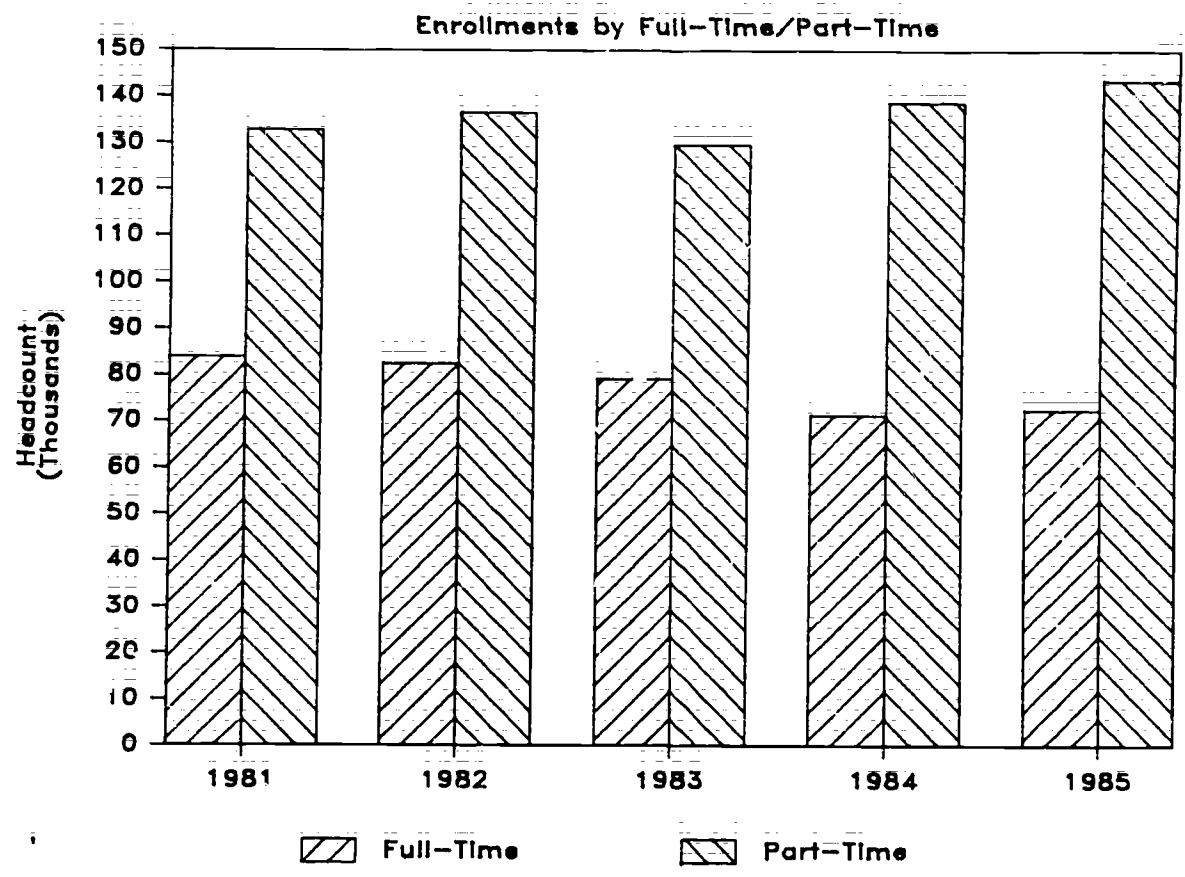
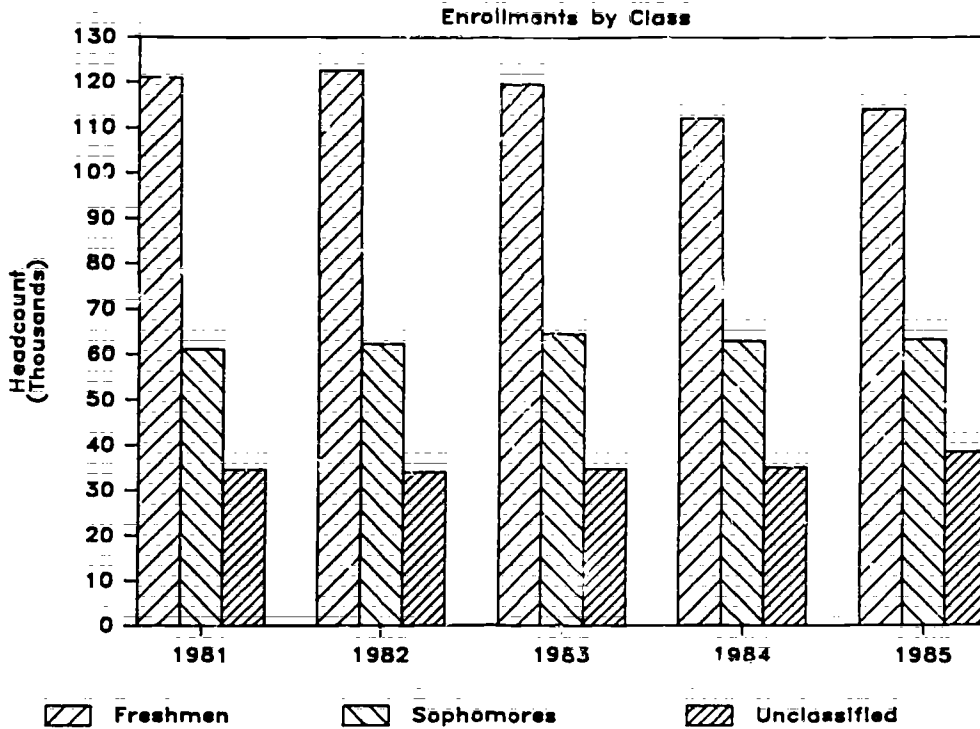


Figure 3 graphically presents the data displayed in Table 5, enrollments by class (freshmen, sophomores and unclassified).

Tables 6 and 7 contain enrollments by race and sex for 1981 through 1985. There were slight decreases among non-resident aliens and whites, while other groups show small annual increases or remained fairly constant. Female students continued to comprise the larger percentage of total students.

Tables 8, 9, 10, and 11 exhibit by college the Fall 1985 data discussed in Tables 1 through 7.
