ABSTRACT

Information submitted by the 28 Florida community colleges is presented concerning the salaries of full-time professional personnel at each institution. The information was submitted to the State's Division of Community Colleges by each college using standard terminology, definitions, and formats. The following information is provided: (1) minimum and maximum salaries for each official college salary schedule used to pay instructional personnel by degree level or professional rank; (2) the number of full-time instructional staff and their average salary for each contract length by degree level; (3) the number of instructional department administrators and their average salary for each contract length by degree level; (4) the number of executive, administrative and managerial personnel and their average salary for each contract length by degree level; (5) the number of non-instructional professional personnel (e.g., counselors, librarians, and curriculum specialists) and their average salary for each contract length by degree level; and (6) the salaries of selected executive positions at each college. The following six tables provide information on the salaries of full-time professional personnel for each of the 28 Florida community colleges. This information was submitted to the Division of Community Colleges by each college using standard terminology, definitions, and formats. The following briefly describes the information reported in each table.

Table 1 Summary of Scheduled Salary Ranges for Instructional Personnel

This report shows the minimum and maximum salaries for each official college salary schedule used to pay instructional personnel. The information is presented by degree level or professional rank. (See Table 1 footnote).

Table 2 Report of Annual Salaries for Full-Time Personnel - Instructional

This report shows the number of full-time instructional staff and average salary for each contract length by degree level. Instructional personnel are those whose primary assignment is teaching.

Table 3 Report of Annual Salaries for Full-Time Personnel - Instructional Department Administrators

The report provides the same information as Table 2, but for those professional personnel who provide direct administrative support to instructional departments or divisions.

Table 4 Report of Annual Salaries for Full-Time Personnel - Executive, Administrative, and Managerial

This report provides the same information as Table 2, but for those professional personnel who exercise primary responsibility for the management of the institution.

Table 5 Report of Annual Salaries for Full-Time Personnel - Non-Instructional Professional Personnel

This report provides the same information as Table 2, but for those professional personnel whose primary duty is in areas other than teaching or administration. This would include, for example, counselors, librarians, curriculum specialists, etc.

Table 6 Salaries for Selected Positions

This report shows the salaries of selected executive positions in each community college.
