FOREWORD

The Title II-C Program was enacted through the Education Amendments of 1976 in recognition of the fact that the major research libraries of the Nation represent the bibliographic foundation of our research resources and that financial stringency and increased costs have severely reduced their capabilities for resource sharing. Grants under Title II-C assist major research libraries in maintaining and strengthening their collections, which are essential to scholarship and research on a national and world-wide basis, and assist them in making their holdings available to individual researchers and scholars and to other libraries whose users have need for such research materials.

This brochure has been prepared in order to respond to requests from librarians and other members of the public for information about the types of projects which have been funded by the Title II-C Program. As in previous years, this ninth year slate of awards reflects a diversity of subject matter and design in the effort to make accessible rare and unique collections of material. Tables which summarize these activities and the funding record to date are also included.

ABSTRACT

The American Antiquarian Society possesses the world's best collection of early American imprints and newspapers. From 1955 to about 1965 its staff edited the microform series Early American Imprints: First Series (Evans), published by Readex Microprint Corporation, which included the text of every available book, pamphlet, and broadside printed in the U.S. from 1640 to 1800. This microform series has proven to be of great value to scholarship, but full access to it has been hampered by a lack of adequate cataloguing. AAS will produce full MARC cataloguing of the microform set, which will be entered into national data bases and made available to individual libraries.

ABSTRACT

The Library of the American Museum of Natural History will microfilm, restore and conserve some 80 unique scientific and historic ledgers, scrap-books, field diaries and notebooks, and specimen catalogs from scientific expeditions, fieldwork, and laboratory work, which form a unique record of the development of science and a major scientific institution in the United States. These records are used daily for the curation of collections and in scientific research, therefore hard-copies will be provided, while the unique manuscripts, some dating from 1815, will be preserved, cataloged into OCLC, and made accessible to the scholarly community.

ABSTRACT

The Center for Research Libraries (CRL) will continue to microfilm its collection of ethnic newspaper titles, published in 38 languages, and related to ethnic groups whose major migration to the United States took place in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The files are extensive, and for a significant number of titles are either the only files or the largest and most complete file known. Bibliographic records were entered into the CONSER data base as a part of the Humanities Newspaper Project. Thus this collection is a scholarly resource to which there is adequate access, but which is in grave danger of rapidly disappearing.

ABSTRACT

This project will improve accessibility and availability of the Dartmouth College Library collections in theatre and the performing arts, a comprehensive resource consisting of monographs, periodicals, newspapers, scripts, libretti, programs, playbills, scrapbooks, slides, sheet music, and other materials providing primary source materials for research in the performing arts. The collections contain in total some 48,000 individual items falling into four major categories: (1) plays, (2) playbills, (3) non-book materials, and (4) sheet music.

Machine-readable records in the MARC format will be prepared according to current cataloging standards and the records made available in the RLIN and OCLC shared cataloging databases and in the Dartmouth Online Catalog. The shelf life of the materials in these collections will be extended throughout the application of various conservation and preservation operations.

To insure preservation of the 123,000 photographic prints of the pioneer automotive photographer Nathan Lazarnick, the 91 albums in which the prints are compiled will be microfilmed to produce a master negative from which prints may be generated as needed or on demand, and a positive film which can be made available for general public use. The Emory University Libraries will conduct a project of retrospective conversion, cataloging, and preservation for a discrete collection of 16,977 titles of eighteenth century imprints in the subject areas of philosophy and religion. Cognizance of national and international efforts, professional awareness of the importance of preservation activities, and the uniqueness and strength of the libraries' eighteenth century imprints in philosophy and religion have determined the choice of library materials for this project. A major portion of titles covered by the project have not been contributed as yet to the bibliographic utilities, OCLC and RLIN. ABSTRACT

The Houston Academy of Medicine-Texas Medical Center Library serves over 18 non-profit institutions which have a combined, annual research budget of over \$210,000,000. Nearly 17,000 clients from these institutions depend on the Library for many services. One service point, the Historical Research Center, houses a particularly comprehensive special collection, the Burbank - Fraser Collection on Arthritis, Rheumatism, and Gout. Access is limited by inadequate or non-existent cataloging. Thus the collection is not available for historical and scientific research. ABSTRACT

The purpose of this project is to preserve and make available to scholars the Samuel L.M. Barlow letterbooks and Richard Bull's expanded version of James Granger's Biographical History of England. The use of the letterbooks has been severely restricted because of their fragility and the Bull Collection is deteriorating because of heavy use. The letterbooks will be preserved on microfilm and reproductions made available to scholars; the originals will be retired from hands-on use. For the Bull Collection the covers of the 36 volumes will be removed, cleaned, edges trimmed, pages cleaned, and repairs will be made on approximately 100 prints and mounts, which will then be stored in acid-free, clam-shell boxes.

The Hoover Institution possesses a Poster Collection totaling approximately 68,000 items: illustrated wall placards, official proclamations, and propaganda of various other types. The papers are of particular significance since, in many instances, they represent the only available record dealing with specific events during times of political unrest or development.

In order to preserve these holdings, the Hoover Institution has begun a brittle document preservation program that includes two basic components for dealing with the two separate groups of materials. Color slides (use copies plus preservation copies) are made of the posters, using Kodachrome film. Selected posters receive applied treatment, and all posters are encapsulated, catalogued and indexed online. The newspapers are being microfilmed, with subsequent catalogue entries in RLIN.
