ABSTRACT

Information on 1986 salaries and benefits for faculty, staff, and administrators in the Illinois public community college system is provided in this report. After introductory material provides a summary overview of the report, information is presented on fiscal year (FY) 1987 contractual base salaries for full-time faculty; FY86 full-time faculty salaries; FY87 part-time faculty salaries and full-time faculty overload and summer rates; salary schedules for full-time faculty with a master's degree; institutional policies related to faculty salaries and contracts; FY87 contractual base salaries for administrators and other professional staff; salaries paid to selected administrators during FY87; FY87 monthly classified staff salaries; fringe benefits; and salary increases. Selected findings include the following: (1) the median FY87 contractual base salary for faculty with 9-month contracts was \$30,583, and for faculty with 12-month contracts was \$31,265; (2) part-time faculty salary rates averaged \$290 per course semester hour; (3) the average FY87 contractual base salary paid to other professional staff with 9-month contracts was \$32,468; (4) the average administrative staff contractual salary ranged from a low of \$27,836 to a high of \$52,786; and (5) the cost of fringe benefits in FY86 for full-time teaching faculty averaged \$2,405. 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INTRODUCTION

The Fall 1986 Salary Survey for the Illinois Public Community Colleges was essentially the same as the survey conducted during the fall of 1985. The survey requests faculty salary data which are based on actual contracts, salaries from faculty salary schedules, part-time faculty salary rates, overload faculty salary rates, total fiscal year (W-2 type) faculty salaries, administrative salaries, other professional salaries, average faculty load information, salaries for positions similar to Universities Civil Service classifications, and salaries of select administrators.

At the time data for this report were compiled, six districts had not yet finalized negotiations for fiscal year 1987 salary increases (Thornton, Kishwaukee, Joliet, Lincoln Land, Spoon River, and State Community College). Two of these districts (Spoon River and State Community College) submitted data pertaining to their institutional policies and fiscal year 1986 information such as fringe benefits and W-2 salaries. One college (Shawnee) was not able to meet the deadline for publication of this report.

Since such a large number of districts are not included in this report, extreme care should be exercised in comparing this year's statewide ranges and average salaries to last year's numbers.

Section I

FISCAL YEAR 1987 CONTRACTUAL BASE SALARIES FOR FULL-TIME FACULTY AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 1 summarizes the ranges of salaries for full-time faculty on 9-month contracts for fiscal year 1987.

Table 2 identifies the lowest, average, highest, and median academic year contractual base salaries of full-time faculty with 9-month contracts at each community college in Illinois reporting data. Table 3 provides the same information for full-time faculty with 12-month contracts.

The high salaries represent the highest contractual base salary actually paid to full-time teaching faculty members for an academic year at each of the colleges reporting data. The mean salaries represent the weighted average of all full-time teaching faculty salaries at each community college district. Statewide average salary data reported throughout this report are weighted average salary data. The median salaries reported are those which are the middle salary at each college. The median salary is the most appropriate measure of central tendencies for salary data within a given college since it is not affected by extreme high or low salaries; however, it is not as meaningful when reporting statewide composite median salary data.

Section II

TOTAL FISCAL YEAR 1986 FULL-TIME FACULTY SALARIES (W-2 TYPE)
AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 4 compares the contractual base salaries reported for fiscal year 1986 and the total salaries paid to full-time faculty in fiscal year 1986. The Fiscal year 1986 W-2 type salaries include all overloads and compensation for extra assignments paid to full-time faculty from July 1, 1985 to June 30, 1986.

The state average total fiscal year salary paid to faculty in fiscal year 1986 for those districts reporting data is \$3,095 more than the state average academic year (9 months) contractual salary for full-time teaching faculty in fiscal year 1986. An analysis of total faculty salary is important because some community colleges make an extra effort to ensure that the full-time faculty have first chance at overload classes and extra assignments prior to hiring part-time faculty.

Section III

FISCAL YEAR 1987 PART-TIME FACULTY SALARY RATES AND FULL-TIME FACULTY OVERLOAD AND SUMMER TERM RATES AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 5 summarizes part-time faculty and full-time faculty overload and summer term salary rates in Illinois public community colleges during fiscal year 1987.

Table 6 presents the average part-time faculty salary rates per semester credit hour and full-time faculty overload rates by each community college district. The first column shows the part-time faculty rate per course credit hour. This rate is the amount paid to part-time teachers who might, for example, teach a night class at an extension center. The second column shows the overload rate for full-time faculty for the academic year. This rate represents the amount paid to full-time faculty for teaching courses above the full-time load during the academic year. Often this is compensation for teaching an extra night class or for teaching an additional class in the daytime. The third column reflects the amount received by full-time faculty members for teaching a class during the summer term. Community colleges have many different bases for determining part-time faculty rates as well as overload rates. Some colleges pay a flat rate per course or a flat rate per term, while other colleges base their rates on contact bours or credit hours; still others pay an hourly rate. In addition, many of the colleges' overload rates for full-time faculty are based on a percentage of that faculty member's actual salary.

SALARIES BASED ON FISCAL YEAR 1987 SALARY SCHEDULES FOR FULL-TIME FACULTY WITH A MASTER'S DEGREE AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

A state summary of the range and average salaries of fiscal year 1987 salary schedule salaries for faculty with a master's degree at those community college districts which have salary schedules is shown in Table 7.

Table 8 provides the fiscal year 1987 salary schedule salaries at each community college in Illinois. These salaries are based on the salary schedules at the colleges and not on the actual salaries paid.

Section V

INSTITUTIONAL POLICIES RELATED TO FACULTY SALARIES AND FACULTY CONTRACTS AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 9 summarizes the institutional policies related to faculty salaries and faculty contracts at each public community college district in Illinois. These policies often have a considerable impact on the salaries presented elsewhere in this report. The average number of weekly class contact hours per full-time instructional faculty, for example, has a bearing on the number of faculty that an institution must have to meet its needs. The length of a full-time academic year contract also has a bearing on academic year salary for full-time faculty.

Table 10 shows these institutional policies for each college. Of the 34 community college districts in Illinois reporting, twelve have professional rank, although not all of these use rank as a criteria for salary determinations. Thirty-two public community college districts reported that they have master contracts with the faculty.

In addition to the class contact hours, office hours, and academic advising hours, faculty members spend much time in grading papers, preparing class presentations, working on curriculum development, and serving on college committees. Accordingly, although the state average number of required weekly hours for the faculty does not total 40 hours, most faculty members spend over 40 hours per week on their full-time assignments.

Section VI

FISCAL YEAR 1987 CONTRACTUAL BASE SALARIES FOR OTHER PROFESSIONAL STAFF AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 11 summarizes the range of fiscal year 1987 salaries for other professional staff in Illinois public community colleges.

Tables 12 and 13 identify the number of staff and the lowest, average, highest, and median contractual base salaries paid to full-time other professionals (9-month and 12-month) at each community college in Illinois. Other professional staff include counselors, librarians, and instructional support staff such as curriculum coordinators. Even though some colleges may classify some of these personnel types as non-teaching faculty, they were asked to report them in this category.

The lowest and highest salaries represent the lowest and highest base salaries actually paid to full-time other professionals at each of the community colleges. The average salaries represent the weighted average of all full-time other professional salaries at each college. The median salaries represent the salary received by the person in the middle of the range at each college. The weighted state average salary of other professional staff with 9-month contracts was \$32,468. For other professional staff with 12-month contracts, the weighted state average salary was \$24,059.

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Section VII

FISCAL YEAR 1987 CONTRACTUAL BASE SALARIES FOR ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 14 summarizes the range of administrative staff contractual salaries for fiscal year 1987. The weighted average administrative staff salary ranged from a low of \$27,836 to a high of \$52,786.

Table 15 provides the number of administrative staff; lowest, average, and highest fiscal year 1987 salaries; and the median fiscal year 1987 salaries of administrative staff for each district reporting data. Administrative staff includes positions similar to those shown in Table 16.

Some colleges may classify some of these administrative positions as faculty or other professional staff. However, for the sake of comparison, they were asked to report them as administrative staff regardless of how they were classified at the college.

The statewide weighted average administrative salary for fiscal year 1987 was \$39,109. The lowest reported administrative salary was \$14,850, and the highest was \$90,893.

Section VIII

SALARIES PAID TO SELECT ADMINISTRATORS AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES DURING FISCAL YEAR 1987

A summary of the fiscal year 1987 contractual base salaries paid to select administrators in Illinois public community colleges appears in Table 16.

Table 17 indicates the contractual base salaries paid to select administrators in each of the public community colleges in Illinois during fiscal year 1987. The chief executive officer of the district is either a chancellor or a president and has overall administrative responsibilities for the district. The chief campus administrator reports directly to the chief executive officer of the district and has overall administrative responsibility for the college. Examples of chief campus administrators are the presidents or provosts at multi-campus institutions and executive vice presidents for internal affairs at single campus colleges. Due to the various administrative organizations which exist at the colleges, a particular position may not exist. An analysis of the entire administrative structure must be made before making comparisons between similar positions at two different colleges. Another item for consideration when making comparisons between colleges is the number of years an administrator has been in the position.

Section IX

SUMMARY OF FISCAL YEAR 1987 MONTHLY CLASSIFIED STAFF SALARIES AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 18 summarizes Illinois community college earnings for specific classified staff titles. The number of employees in Column 1 is the total of all employees for the respective position titles which were reported by Illinois community colleges. The average fiscal year 1987 salary in Column 3 is the weighted average of all monthly salaries reported for each classification. The high and low salaries are those reported by the colleges for each specific type of classification.

Table 19 compares monthly mean salaries of comparable university civil service positions and classified community college positions. Overall, community college classified staff salaries are 2.6 percent lower than classified salaries at universities. However, many variables, such as tenure in the positions and exact job responsibilities, are unknown, such makes valid comparisons difficult.

The salaries shown throughout this report do not include these fringe benefits. Fringe benefits are defined as payments other than wages and salary, such as vacation, retirement, insurance, worker's compensation, and unemployment insurance.
