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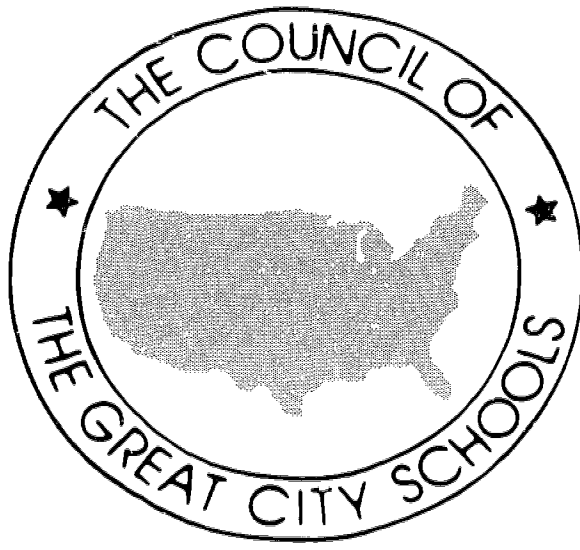
This report provides statistical information on the 35 large urban school systems that comprise the Council of Great City Schools. Data are organized into the following categories: (1) enrollment and demographics (including racial composition, children below poverty level, and private school, handicapped, vocational education and limited English proficient enrollment); (2) staff and organization (including school board size, school board selection, frequency of school board meetings, superintendent and teacher characteristics, average teacher salaries, and grade level organization of the district); (3) finances (including expenditure per pupil, property tax rates, bonded debt rating, total local and state revenues); (4) federal allocations to selected programs (including ECIA Chapter 1 and 2, Impact Aid, Education of the Handicapped--Public Law 94-142--vocational education, bilingual education, magnet schools, child nutrition, job training, Head Start, and day care); and (5) educational indicators (including attendance rates, testing requirements, requirements for graduation, and homework policies). In addition, this report, in general, covers the school years from 1980-81 to 1985-86. A previous similar profiles report published in 1983 covered the years 1970 to 1982. we caution readers from laying the data from the two reports end-to-end in order to create a 15 year trend. Different school systems and data sources were used for many items. Moreover, we would caution researchers and policy makers from attempting to combine data elements in this report, e.g. dividing total revenues by total enrollment to try and derive a per pupil expenditure figure that jibes with what we have listed or what the members may treat as their own official figure. Many data sources were used for this report, not all of which are compatible with one another.

Finally, I would like to thank personally Sharon Spriggs for the typing and production work on this report. Until attempted, it is almost impossible to imagine typing all of these tables -- without a word processor.

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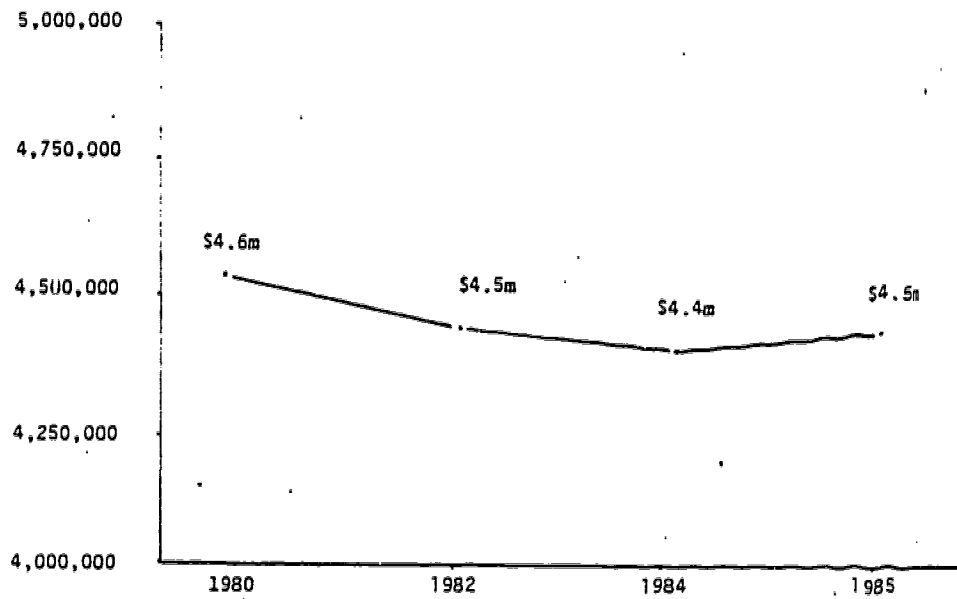
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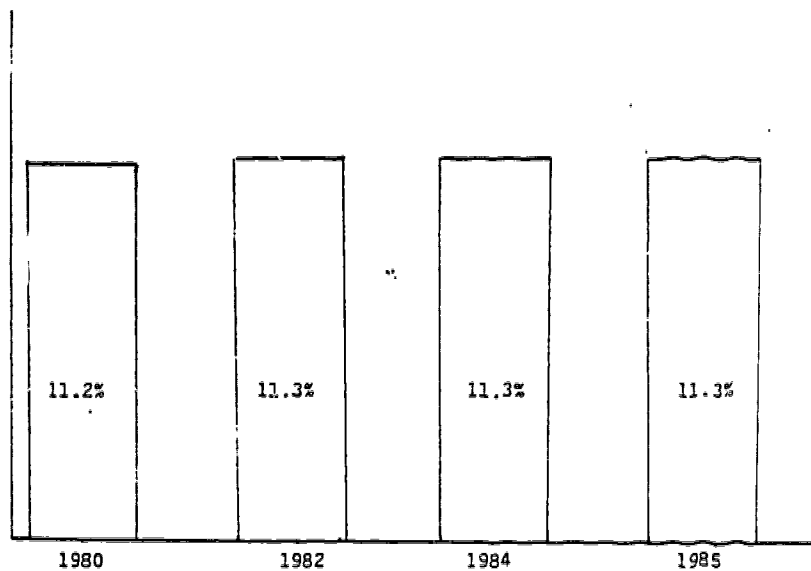
I. GREAT CITY SCHOOL ENROLLMENT AND DEMOGRAPHICS

Chart 1. Enrollment in Great City Schools, Fall 1980-1985



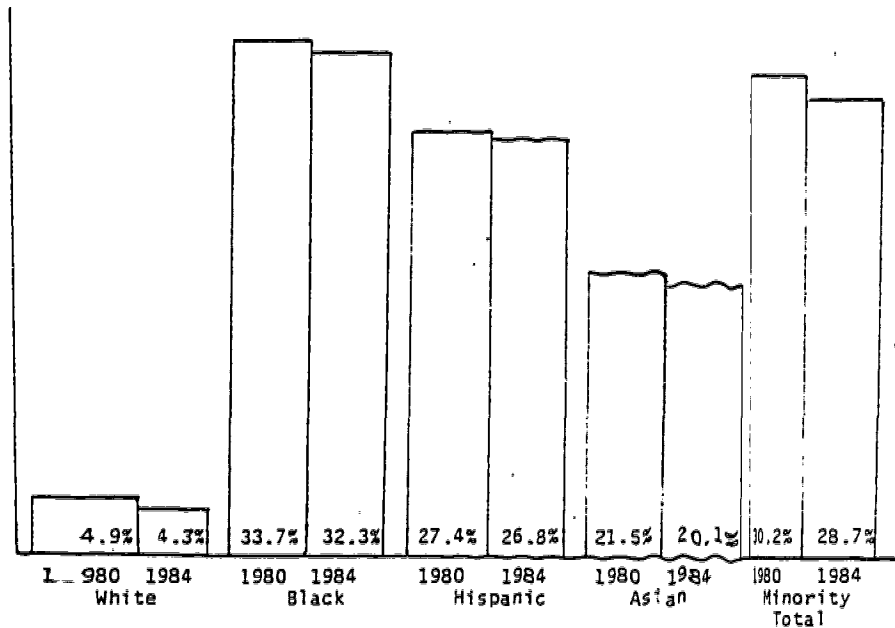
Enrollment in the Great City Schools dropped by 3.3% between the fall of 1980 and 1985. During the same period the national enrollment in public schools dropped by about 3.9%. The 1985-86 enrollment in the urban schools increased over the previous year for the first time since 1968-69.

Chart 2. Enrollment in Great City Schools as a Percent of the Nation's Public School Total Enrollment



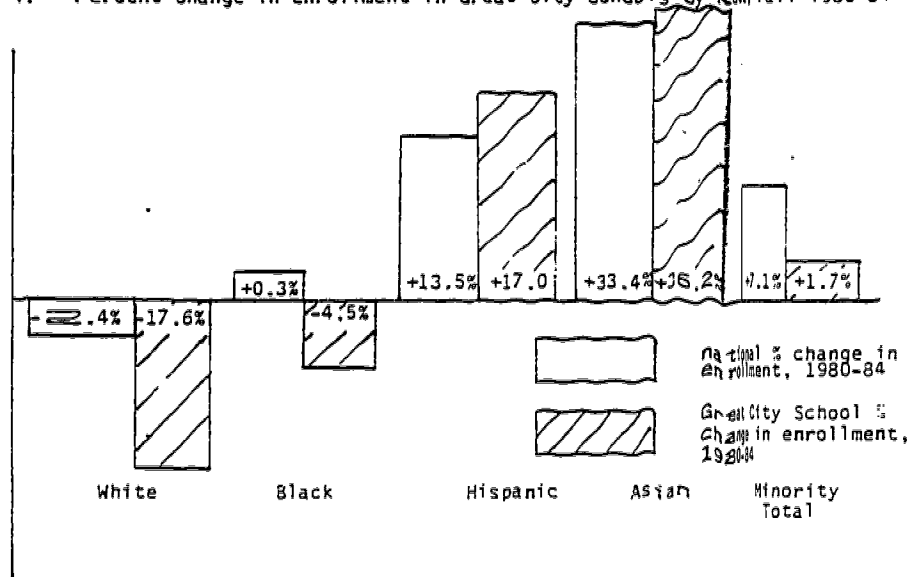
The Great City School's share of the total national public school enrollment increased slightly from 11.2% to 11.3% between the Fall of 1980 and 1985. This is the first period in over twenty years in which urban school enrollment remained stable relative to the national enrollment.

Chart 3. Great City School Share of the Nation's Public School Enrollment by Race and Year



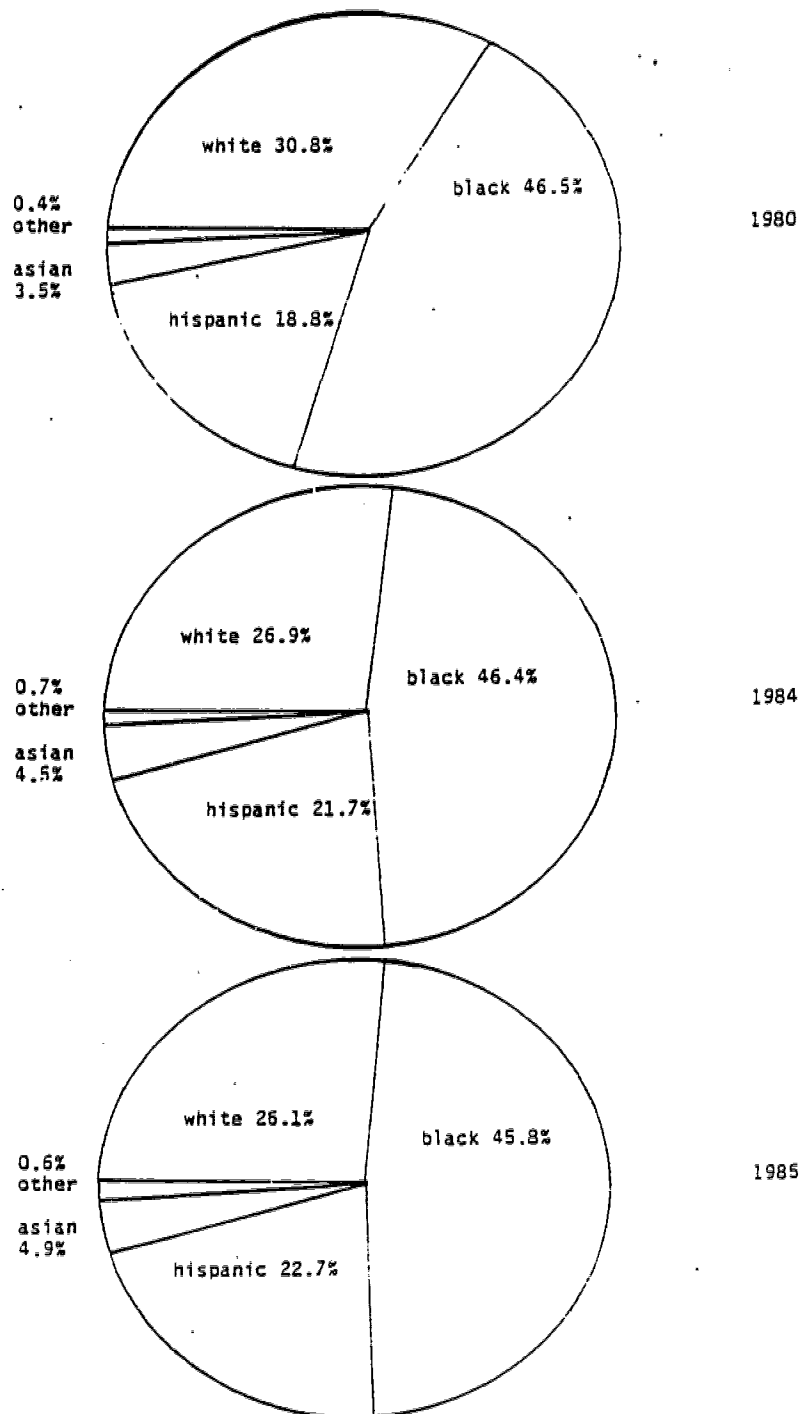
The Great City School systems enroll 28.7% of all the racial minority children in the nation who attend public school. The Great City School's share of each racial group has declined, however, slightly since the fall of 1980.

Chart 4. Percent Change in Enrollment in Great City Schools by Race, Fall 1980-84



The greatest increase since 1980 in the enrollments in the Great City Schools has been seen among Asian students whose numbers increased by 36.2%, followed by Hispanic students whose numbers increased by 17.0%. White enrollment decreased significantly by 17.6% since 1980 while the numbers of Black children remained relatively stable.

Chart 5. Racial Composition of the Great City School Enrollments; 1980,1984,1985



The composition of the enrollments of the Great City Schools continues to change. The proportion of the enrollment that is white dropped from 30.8% in 1980 to 26.1% in the Fall of 1985. The share of the enrollment that is black appears to have stabilized since 1980, but the proportion that is either hispanic or asian has increased rather dramatically in just five years.

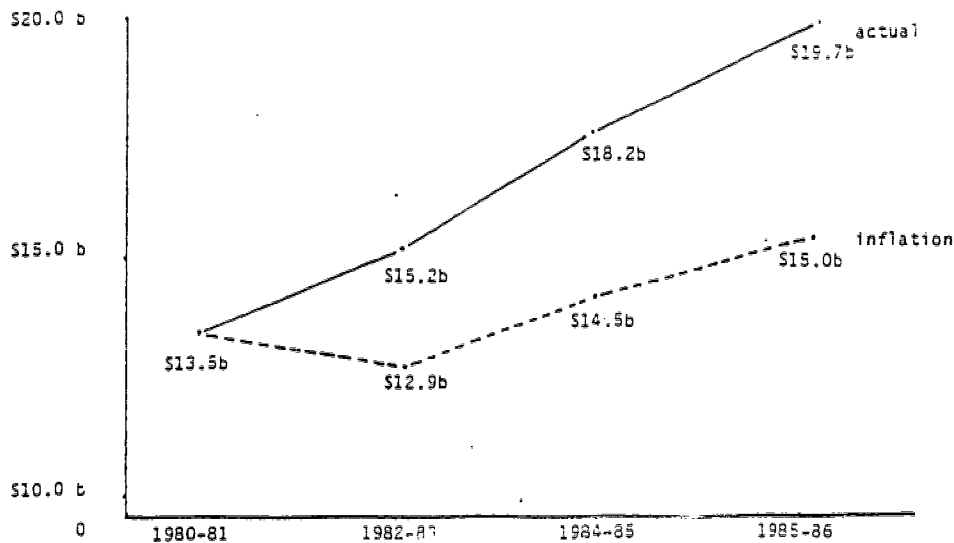

Chart 6. Total Revenues of Great City Schools, 1980-1985 (inflation adjusted)



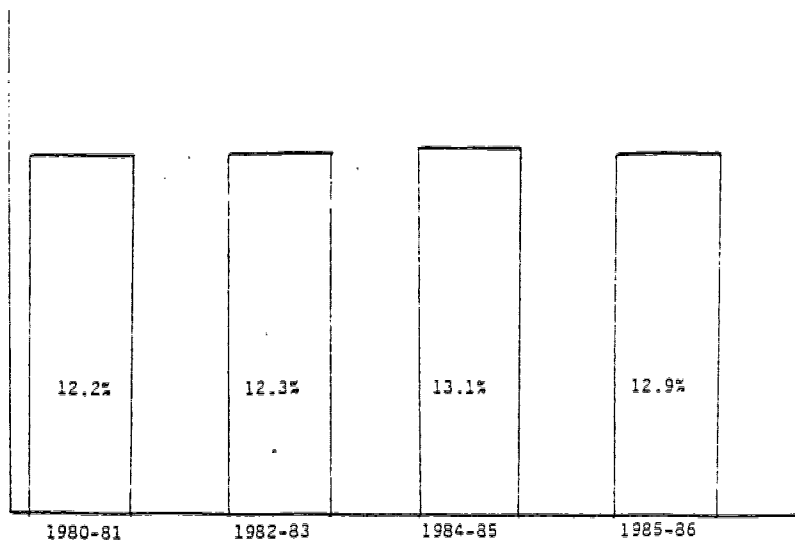
The total revenues (including local, state and federal) of the Great City Schools have increased from \$13.5 billion in 1980-81 to over \$19.7 billion in 1985-86, a gain of 45.9%. Adjusted for inflation, these revenues have grown about 12% during the same period.

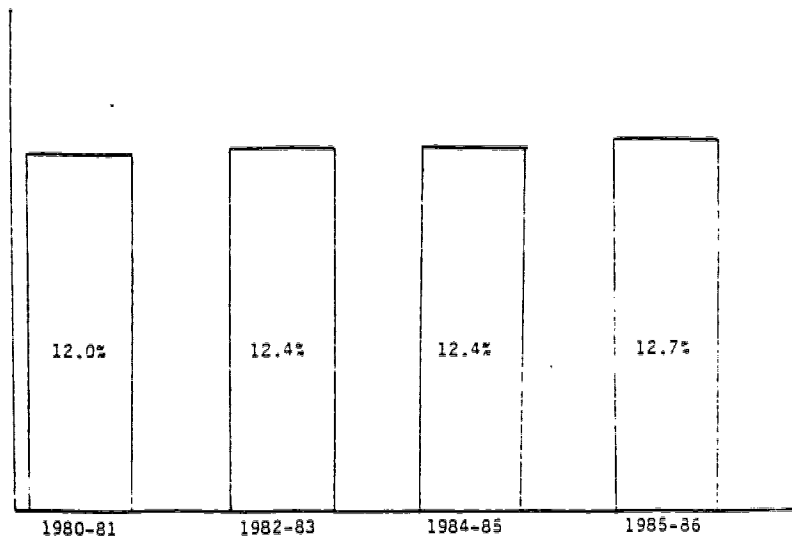

Chart 8. Great City School Revenues as a Percent of All Local Spending on Education Nationally



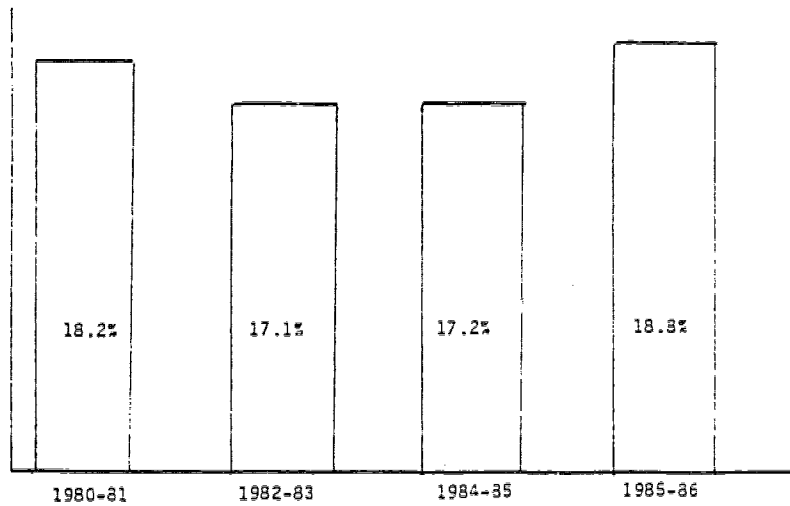
The Great City Schools garnered 12.2% of all locally derived revenues in 1980 and 12.9% in 1985.

The nation's spending on Great City Schools increased from 12.7% of all elementary and secondary education funding in 1980 to 13.1% in 1985-86.
