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ABSTRACT

This report provides an overview of the holdings of the Auburn University Libraries, including the Ralph Brown Draughon Library, the Architecture Library, the Veterinary Medical Library, and the Haley Center collection, with particular emphasis on the holdings in support of the Department of Educational Media. A summary is provided of collections, staffs, services, interlibrary cooperation activities, and facilities of the libraries. General and specific holdings in educational media are then discussed, including current and retrospective monographs, reference publications, government documents, serials, and miscellaneous collections. Appendices include a subject profile for the Department of Educational Media holdings, a listing of educational media courses, non-subject parameters for the Blackwell-Blackwell North American approval program, and a listing of educational media core journals. OVERVIEW OF THE LIBRARY-DESCRIPTION AND ASSESSMENT OF EXISTING COLLECTIONS, STAFF SERVICES, INTERLIBRARY COOPERATION, AND FACILITIES

The Ralph Brown Draughon Library, the central research library of Auburn University, was constructed in 1962. There are two branch libraries, the Architecture Library and the Veterinary Medical Library. A small collection to accommodate additional evening and late evening study needs of undergraduate students is located in Haley Center. These comprise the Auburn University Libraries.

The Collection: The collections are organized in the Draughon Library with printed material by subject in three departments: Humanities, Science and Technology, and Social Sciences. Materials in microformat and U.S. government documents are organized for use in the Microforms and Documents Department. The staff of Special Collections Department maintains special materials and provides services for these collections. During the past five years, since the beginning of fiscal year 1981-82, the collection has grown at an average rate of 4.7 percent from an overall figure of 1,164, 181 volumes to 1,383,165 fully processed physical volumes as of September 30, 1986. These volumes are in printed format. The figure does not include 1,614,347 individual items in microformat; 855,777 items in the U.S. government collection, or 110,095 maps.

The Library maintains 17,373 serial subscriptions, of which 11,326 are periodicals and 186 are newspapers and spent a total of \$2,610,775 in 1985-86 for library materials and binding. While there are recognized qualitative deficiencies, especially in the area of journal holdings, the collection has been judged as generally adequate by recent accreditation teams representing various disciplines and by the Southern Association of College and Schools.

The staff added 60,692 volumes to the collection last year and 646 new journal titles. Development of the collection is the joint responsibility of the faculty and the library staff, and funds for library materials (books, back files of journals, and the first-year costs of new journal subscriptions) are made available for this purpose. The Library began to receive books supporting academic programs at Auburn automatically beginning with the 1986 imprints through agreements with blanket order vendors with experience in library approval plan purchases. Funds covering these costs and the costs of journal and serial subscriptions after the first year are encumbered from the Libraries' budget at the beginning of each year before funds for the purchase of other library materials are allocated. Librarians who are subject bibliographers are assigned to the various subject departments of the library and include book selection as a regular component of their duties based on those needs identified in consultation with the faculty.

The Library is a depository for U.S. government publications, U.S. patents, National Aeronautics and Space Administration publications, U.S. Geological Survey maps, and Defense Mapping Agency maps.

The Staff: The overall staff consists of 40 librarians, four professionals and 81 support staff positions. In addition to these full-time positions, the Library benefits as a result of the services of additional student assistants who worked 56,484.50 hours last year and five part-time graduate assistants.

In 1982 members of the visiting team of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Self-Study project strongly recommended that the University make every effort to expand the Library in recognition of known qualitative deficiencies. As a result, the Library has added nine positions for librarians and 14 new support staff positions over the last three years in an effort to meet the minimal requirements for Association of Research Libraries membership

by 1990, a goal to which the University is committed. There are plans for the correction of other deficiencies as resources are available.

Services: The Library is open and staffed for services 99.25 hours per week. Circulation, reference and information services are available all hours the Library is open. Additional services include interlibrary loans for books and journal articles, bibliographic instruction and tour services, photocopy services, and the assignment of locked carrels for graduate students and faculty. Library users can access material the Library acquired through the use of computer terminals located in strategic areas throughout the building. The Library has maintained an active online computer search service for the journals indexed since 1975 and currently has access to 250 data bases including those made available through the services of major vendors. These include Bibliographic Retrieval Service, Lockheed's DIALOG, System Development Corporation's ACCESS, the Medical Literature Analysis and Retrieval Systems (MEDLARS), CASSIS for searching U.S. patents, NASA/RECON (National Aeronautics and Space Administration-Remote Console), STN (Scientific and Technical Information Network) International, and WILSONLINE. On-going work with regard to automation includes plans for the automation of circulation and the retrospective conversion of pre-1975 cataloging records to magnetic tape.

Interlibrary Cooperation: The Library is a member of SOLINET (Southeastern Library Network), NAAL (Network of Alabama Libraries), and participates in providing materials to libraries in the State through an active interlibrary loans program.

Facilities: The Draughton Library was planned and constructed to house one million volumes in an open stack arrangement with 132,307 square feet of assignable space available and study space for 2,000 library users. The

demands related to the housing of the collection have eroded available seating to approximately 1,200 spaces, including informal seating in lobby areas. Because of the shortage of space for collections, 89,868 lesser-used volumes and 13,258 bound and unbound government documents are stored in a closed-stacks area with some use of compact shelving. While these volumes are available for use, the closed-stack storage project will remain operational until storage space has been depleted, within five years. However, consent for a library addition has been given by the Board; the planning phase is underway. This will address a substantial portion of the Library's space deficiencies.

**Auburn University Libraries
Review of Holdings in Support
of the Department of Educational Media**

Introduction: This collection in educational media which is characterized by the Library of Congress classification sequences detailed in Auburn University Libraries' profile (see Appendix 1, Profile) is used mostly by undergraduates enrolled in EM 200, Educational Media; EM 370, Microcomputer Concepts and Applications in Education; or a choice of several courses designated "courses for advanced undergraduates or graduates" or by graduate students doing advanced research. Educational Media is not a program option for undergraduates, although graduate students may earn a Master's degree either as a Media Specialist (MSE) or in Media-Instructional Development (MID). The Doctor of Education is not offered in Educational Media (see Appendix 2, Courses Offered).

The library does not keep ongoing circulation statistics but does make an estimate of the books checked out four times per year during the fifth week of classes each quarter to be used as a guide in allocating book funds. This estimate has been judged as being quite accurate by the library's administration in predicting actual circulation statistics. During Fall 1985-Summer 1986, cards in the education LC sequence (L-LT) represented 2.7% of the total cards or 4,133 cards out of 155,655. This rather low percentage may be taken as an indication that the students in education as a whole may be geared toward the use of journal articles or ERIC reports rather than books, resembling the students of the pure sciences rather than those in history and English who represent the greatest circulation.

In keeping with the profile discussed above, estimates of circulation statistics are also available for the juvenile LC sequence (PZ 5-PZ 9999) and the library

science (Z 662-Z 1000) LC sequence. During Fall 1985-Summer 1986, cards in the juvenile LC sequence represented 1.4% of the total cards or 2200 cards out of 155,655, and cards in the library science LC sequence represented 0.2% or 314 cards out of 155,655.

Auburn University Libraries house mostly print resources. Students in Educational Media needing films, filmstrips, audio cassettes, video cassettes, or computer software will not find it on the shelves. For media, students rely upon the Learning Resources Center which collects media primarily and is funded totally by the School of Education.

Bibliographers collecting in the area of Educational Media are aware of the problems of applying finite funds to an area whose technological base has simply exploded. Students training to become media specialists have no guarantee that the technology that they're learning today will even be used ten years from now. What to collect and how much is an ongoing dilemma, but fortunately in a research library, potential use exists for everything collected.

Category 1 Current and Retrospective Monographs

Faculty in the Social Sciences Department of the library rate current monographic holdings as adequate--an opinion which will be supported by an analysis of the collection. This collection meets the needs of undergraduate and graduate researchers in Educational Media. In November 1986, an estimated count of the library's holdings in the broad area of Educational Media numbered 14,169 books and was based on the library's profile of the subject (see Appendix 1, Profile).

A random survey of 6.4% of the imprints of this collection revealed that

The average copyright date of this collection is 1970 (standard deviation, .6.4). This rather youthful average is useful in Educational Media which utilizes the latest technology.

Retrospective holdings have been checked by a system of list checking. The Encyclopedia of Educational Research (5th Edition) was chosen as a scholarly source and the references in the articles on media topics were checked as follows:

In doing list checking, the question always asked is "Could these articles have been written at this library?" The answer which should help to satisfy those who have doubts about the library's retrospective holdings is yes, these articles certainly could have been written at Draughon Library with the help of Interlibrary Loan.

Because studies have shown a positive correlation between the size of collections in academic libraries and the academic excellence of the institution, enrollment per capita statistics are included here.¹

While the 8.24 per capita figure for education students might seem low, it is useful to remember that all education undergraduates will not be using this collection at the same time and that students in education may also be geared toward journal articles. Outside of the Auburn University setting, these per capita statistics will have little relevance because all libraries do not profile their collections in the same way Draughon Library does. On the other hand, statistics on other libraries complete holdings and enrollment are easily obtainable for comparative purposes.

There is almost a complete lack of uniformity in the way collection statistics are reported in libraries. Draughon Library creates subject profiles for university departments, on which this monographic segment of this report is based, solely for the purpose of allocating book funds. There are no circulation or growth statistics recorded per se for the 14,169 books defined in the profile.

The growth statistics which follow are for the entire LC education

sequence (L-LT) which is what the library makes available. Although there is no question that the library is growing due in part to its drive for status as an Association of Research Libraries' "ARL Library" by 1990, the statistics offered here are given as an indication of what the library is getting, what the publishing world is producing, and how the library's new approval plans are working for the library.

These tables are designed to illustrate the number of books added to the LC education sequence (L-LT) and the juvenile collection as compared with the total books added to the third floor, the American book title production, and the library's approval plans, Blackwell-Blackwell North American for British and American imprints in education and Yankee Book Peddler Co. for juvenile books.

Education books comprised 6.4% or 1054 of the third floor's total, a figure which seems very consistent with the American book publishing statistic on the surface, but since the 1054 is comprised of retrospective and foreign titles as well as esoteric items such as reports and conference proceedings, it is actually a very different number than the production total. This is not to say that the library is not receiving enough of the new titles produced as it should, but rather that a great deal of what's produced amounts to textbooks which are unsuitable for a university library. The book production statistic is offered simply as a measure with which to judge the library's additions.

The library added an approval program through Blackwell-Blackwell North American which includes the field of education on January 1, 1986. The plan was to furnish the library with everything published in education in Britain and the United States with parameters to limit what is unsuitable for a university collection (see Appendix 3, Parameters). Assuming Blackwell-Blackwell North American's 1985 offering to be similar to 1986, it would seem roughly half of Blackwell's books were unsuitable for a university collection as we received 454 out of last year's 1,077.

The library also added an approval plan through Yankee Book Peddler Co. for juvenile books on January 1, 1986, which supplied 1023 books or 56.92% of the 1,797 books added to the juvenile collection during FY85/86. Book production statistics are again furnished to illustrate that the library's 1,797 were chosen in part from the 2,720 book produced in the United States last year.

Approval plans work if closely monitored and polished by continuous testing to see if they're working. More testing will be needed before the library's can be proven. Hopefully in the future, approval plans will free bibliographers to work on the collections--to do retrospective collection

development and to prepare reports such as this one.

Category 2
Reference Publications

Current reference holdings are strong and are used heavily by students enrolled in Educational Media courses--an opinion which will again be supported by analysis.

Many standard reference tools exist in each area of the profile which were identified and checked by utilizing the following bibliographies:

Most of what we lacked dealt with free school library materials, notably the Educator's Guide Series. The library surprisingly was strong in bibliographies which recommend juvenile fiction. A Hispanic Heritage..., More Notes from a Distant Drummer, and Reading Ladders for Human Relations are all housed in the library.

T.E.S.S.: The Educational Software Selector is a well-used guide to software in education which may be supplemented by several other encyclopedias of software now located in the Reference QA's, most notably Bowker's new Software Encyclopedia (REF QA76.753.S67). A look at this area of 4th Floor Reference will reveal evidence of the explosion of new software available.

Media Review Digest was cancelled by the library in 1981. Because it is cited in every bibliography checked for this report as the "core media

reference tool and standard catalog of media information", it is recommended that it be reinstated.

Education Index and CIJE were checked for this report; we have 92% of the former and 67.11% of the latter. These figures are improving as we add more journals.

In addition, a check of the indexing coverage of the journals we presently receive revealed several 4th floor indexes to be useful in the field of educational media: Microcomputer Index, and the Institution of Electrical Engineer's Computer and Control Abstracts, Electrical and Electronics Abstracts, and Physics Abstracts. Science Abstracts. Series A.

Online coverage of the field of educational media is quite good. Wilsonline provides an online counterpart to Education Index. Dialog provides online coverages for the NICEM Indexes through A-V Online (file 46), CIJE through ERIC (file 1), Microcomputer Index through Microcomputer IndexTM (file 233), and Computer and Control Abstracts, Electrical and Electronics Abstracts and Physics Abstracts. Science Abstracts. Series A through Inspec (file 12, 13).

Category 3 Government Documents

Draughton Library has been a government depository since 1874, a fact which makes it an outstanding sources of federal statistics. Department of Education statistics contained in such familiar publications as Digest of Education Statistics and the Condition of Education are housed in the library's Microforms and Documents Department (MADD). Old editions extend back to the beginning of their issue and may be traced by the government's own index, Monthly Catalog (also available online through Dialog, G.P.O. Publications Reference File, file 166), or by two commercial indexes which provide coverage, American Statistics Index (Dialog, ASI, file 102),

and Index to Publications of the United States Congress (Dialog, CIS, file 101). The library receives most of what the federal government publishes automatically as a depository library. What it does not receive it tries to purchase directly from the government or is furnished by ASI or CIS as microfiche. This attention to detail makes the Microforms and Documents Department one of the best depository collections in the area.

Category 4
Serials

A list of source journals was created from Auburn University Libraries'

LUIS terminal by typing in the following:

audio-visual education--periodicals
computer-assisted instruction--periodicals
educational technology--periodicals
libraries, university and college--periodicals
library science--periodicals
reference books bibliography--periodicals
reference services--libraries--periodicals
serials control systems--periodicals
teaching--aids and devices--periodicals

These subject headings netted the list of core journals offered complete with holdings and indexing sources in Appendix 4 (see Appendix 4, Core Journals). This list was found to be consistent with the journals covered in the Encyclopedia of Educational Research (5th edition) references discussed previously and the two bibliographies, Tools of the Trade... and ARBA Guide to Education checked in Category 2, Reference Publications.

Associations account for many publishers of the journals offered. The American Society of Educators (ASE) publishes Media and Methods, and and the major association of the educational media field, the Association for Educational Communication and Technology (AECT) publishes TechTrends, which through several title changes extends back to 1956, and ECTJ Educational Communication and Technology Journal which through several title changes extends back to 1953. One of ECTJ's previous titles, A-V Communication Review,

was the only one of the educational media titles to be cited in the Institute of Scientific Information's SSCI Journal Citation Reports.

Category 5
Miscellaneous Collections

Anyone doing in-depth research in the field of education must be aware of the ERIC database which is available online (Dialog, file 1) and also in paper as Current Index to Journals in Education (CIJE) and Resources in Education (RIE). CIJE contains references to journal articles and RIE contains references to reports on a wide variety of topics which are maintained on microfiche in MADD. Just how important our "ED" fiche collection is was made very apparent to me during the checking of the references in the Encyclopedia of Educational Research as each writer cited ERIC documents over and over again. At this writing in December 1986, 270,562 ERIC documents were housed at Auburn University Libraries--a wealth of information for students and faculty in education.

Education

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EDUCATIONAL MEDIA (EM)

Associate Professors G.D. Whigam, Neel, B.R. Ladford, J.S. Hill
Assistant Professor B.H. Bannon

Area of Specialization: Media Specialist (MSE), Instructional Design (AID).

The program in Educational Media provides for certification at the A level and AA level for media specialists. Many courses are open to graduate level majors in other program areas of the College and the University.

Prerequisites: 1) a minimum of twelve (12) quarter hours in Educational Media courses or equivalent; 2) professional objectives to study, enter and/or advance in the educational media field.

The Instructional Design program in Educational Media emphasizes the application of instructional design technology, including computers, into the learning process. These courses are open to training directors in industry, business, and the military as well as specialists in education.

Prerequisite: departmental recommendation.

COURSES FOR ADVANCED UNDERGRADUATES AND GRADUATES

- 50A. MEDIA RESOURCES PLANNING AND PRESENTATIONS (4) LEC, 2 LAB, 4 Cr., EM 200 or COI. Selecting, planning, preparing, and presenting media resources, including access and selection, using materials and equipment, producing materials, planning presentations, and evaluating uses of resources.
- 51A. MEDIA FOR CHILDREN (4). Examination and evaluation of printed and other types of materials in view of their relevance to the needs and interests of various age and grade levels of elementary school children. Study of selection sites, principles, and criteria for selecting materials.
- 51B. MEDIA FOR YOUNG ADULTS (4). Study and evaluation of books and other media in relation to the interests, needs, and attitudes of young adults.
- 52A. REFERENCE MATERIALS AND SERVICES (4). Study and evaluation of basic reference sources for learning resources centers. Introduction to research methods needed to locate information to support the curriculum of the school.
- 54A. ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF MEDIA CENTERS (4) Cr., EM 200 or concurrent with EM 200. Basic organization of books, non-book materials, and services for effective use in media centers. Administering the budget, selection and purchase of materials, preparation of materials for use, circulation of materials, inventory, carrying report of materials, and instruction in the use of media on computers.
- 55A. CLASSIFICATION AND CATALOGING OF MEDIA (4) Cr., EM 200 or concurrent with EM 200. Principles and procedures of classifying and cataloging books and other printed materials, illustrations, recordings, and community resources. The vertical file, the Dewey decimal system of classification, Wilson and Library of Congress printed cards, and subject headings are studied.
- 57A. THE MICROCOMPUTER AS AN EDUCATIONAL MEDIUM (4) LEC, 2 LAB, 2 Cr., EM 200 or COI. Applications of microcomputers in education for instruction and administration, present and future.
- 58A. COMPUTER BASED EDUCATION: PROGRAMMING SYSTEMS (4) Cr., EM 200 or COI. Programming a microcomputer in the BASIC language with emphasis on educational applications.

COURSES PRIMARILY FOR GRADUATE STUDENTS

- 60A. TECHNOLOGY IN EDUCATION (4) Cr., EM 200 or its equivalent or consent of department head. Theory, problems, procedures, and standards in the utilization of technology.
- 60B. MODES OF MEDIATED INSTRUCTION (4) Cr., EM 200. Development and integration of media into learning procedures. Emphasis is on the designing of media in a total systems approach to curriculum building.
- 61A. SELECTION AND USAGE OF MEDIA FOR YOUTH (4) Cr., EM 240, 241, or COI. Evaluation, selection, and use of print and non-print media for children and young adults, including materials for multicultural, special, gifted education.
- 62A. PROGRAMS AND PRINCIPLES OF MEDIA SERVICES (4) Cr., EM 240 or COI. Place and function of media services in school programs. Functions of school media personnel in leadership and principle application in media program development. Course work includes Practicum experience.
- 67A. INTERNSHIP (3-18). Supervised on-the-job experience in a school, college, or other appropriate setting. These experiences, accompanied by regularly scheduled on-campus discussion periods, are designed to provide observation and analysis of the intern experience.
- 69A. PROBLEMS IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF MEDIA SERVICES (4) Cr., EM 240. Current problems relating to an effective program of media services. Experiences include problem identification and resolution in the field.

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Education

- 67B. COMMUNITY INFORMATION AND REFERENCE SERVICES (4) Cr., EM 240 and 230. The use of reference sources, information networks, community surveys and group decision-making in applying school media programs to the community.
- 67C. DIRECTED INDEPENDENT STUDY (4) Cr. Special study in which the student's learning efforts are guided toward desired objectives. Includes evaluation by professor and student of each assignment at regular intervals.
- 67D. SEMINAR IN EDUCATIONAL MEDIA (3) Cr., consent of department head. May be repeated for credit not to exceed 18 hours. Special problems formulated around student's area of specialization designed to engage students in an intensive study and analysis of problems identified.
- 68A. RESEARCH IN EDUCATIONAL MEDIA (4) Cr., 24 hours in Media and professional education. Analysis and review of research with an emphasis on the individual's research needs.
- 68B. EVALUATION OF MEDIA PROGRAMS (3) Cr., consent of department head. An intensive study of factors contributing to effective organizational arrangements. Experiences include participation in evaluation of field programs.
- 69A. COMPUTER BASED EDUCATION: APPLICATIONS SYSTEMS (4) LEC, 2 LAB, 2 Cr., EM 200 and EM 240, or COI. Design, development, and implementation of computer assisted instruction software.
- 69B. PRACTICUM (4) Cr. Experiences closely relating theory and practice, closely carried on simultaneously.
- 69C. GRADUATE RESEARCH FORUM (4). May be repeated but counted only once toward graduation. Presentations by graduate students of research proposals under findings. Analysis of procedures and findings.
- 69D. RESEARCH AND THESIS (Credit to be arranged) May be taken more than one quarter.
- 69E. FIELD PROJECT (Credit to be arranged) May be taken more than one quarter.

FOUNDATIONS OF EDUCATION (FED)

- 01 (DA) Academic difficulty level. Concerned with the difficulty of the textual material.
- Forms 0103 Lower undergraduate text. A textbook aimed at students in courses offered during the first half of undergraduate college work.
- Books 0104 Upper undergraduate text. A textbook aimed at students in courses offered during the second half of undergraduate college work.
- Books 0105 Graduate text. A textbook intended for students in courses offered at the graduate school academic level.
- Books 0106 Professional book. A specialized book intended for professionals and practitioners in the furtherance of their knowledge and skills in their fields of expertise.
- Books 0107 Other. A book that is not a textbook, normally intended for the general or non-specialist reader.
- 03 (DG) Readership level. Concerned with the intended reader or audience.
- Books 0301 Specialist reader. Used for books whose subject matter is presented so as to be of primary interest and value to a student or authority in the field covered.
- Books 0302 Non-specialist reader. Used for books presenting information or instruction in a subject field to readers whose primary interests and concerns are in a different field of study, such as a book on statistics for a biologist.
- Books 0303 General reader. Used for books whose presentation is oriented toward the general reader rather than to any specialist.
- Books 0305 General reference. Used for books of reference that can be used by specialists, non-specialists and generalists alike, normally requiring a specific designation of the exact type of reference book by use of appropriate MSP-05 (Type of book) coding.
- 04 (CI) Type of library. Concerned with the type of library or collection for which a book is best suited or most probably intended.
- Books 0401 University-research library. Used generally for books having a high level of difficulty and of interest only to advanced specialists in the field, when used alone. May be used with MSP-0403 for books equally suited to both university and college libraries.
- Books 0403 Undergraduate library. Used for books whose difficulty or specialization is not beyond an undergraduate student. May be used alone or in combination with MSP-0401.
- Books 0405 Highly specialized collection. Used for books whose inclusion would be inappropriate in any collection other than one devoted to very comprehensive coverage of the subject field. This MSP is especially appropriate for books to which general subjects are necessarily assigned, but where the slant is extremely narrow or provincial. This MSP is never to be used with any other MSP-04 option in book profiling.
- Forms 0406 Popular collection. Used for books of a non-academic nature that are intended mainly for relaxation reading, typically suited for a public library browsing room. This MSP is never to be used with any other MSP-04 option in book profiling.
- Forms 0407 Firm order only. Used for books, when only form notifications are to be sent, and the books are not returnable by the library, because of publisher returns policies, awkward format, excessive price, etc.

- Forms 0408 Returnable-forms. Used for books when only form notifications are to be sent, but the books are returnable by the library.
- Books 05 (TB) Type of book. Concerned with the non-physical textual make-up of books.
- Books 0501 General. A book whose type cannot be indicated by the use of one or more of the following NSP-05 options.
- Books 0502 Encyclopedic work. A work with broader coverage than a subject dictionary; may or may not be alphabetically arranged; often a multi-volume set, the parts of which may be issued separately.
- Books 0503 Collected works. The works of a single personal or corporate author, containing the complete works, or the complete writings of a special type or on a special subject. Used for all of an author's poems or letters, even though he may also have written short stories or plays.
- Books 0504 Selected works. Selections of previously published writings of an author.
- Books 0505 Symposium proceedings. Also used for abstracts of proceedings, and for an edited work based on the proceedings, transactions, etc., of any kind of held meeting.
- Books 0506 Multi-author text. A formally organized work having systematic continuity, the individual chapters of which have been written by several authors. Not to be confused with NSP-0507 (Collected articles non previously published), which is to be used for a work containing a number of independent papers brought together into a single volume because they reflect one theme.
- Forms 0507 Collected articles not previously published. A collection of articles by several authors, none of which was previously published in the same language, the general make-up of which does not present a logical textual continuity; includes Festschriften. Not to be used for literary writings, for which NSP-0509 (Anthology) is to be used.
- Forms 0508 Collected articles previously published. A collection of articles by several writers, all or most of which have been published before in the same language. May have some new introductory or running commentary by an editor. Not to be used for literary writings.
- Books 0509 Anthology. A collection of literary writings by several authors, generally previously published, but occasionally original works.
- Books 0510 Abstracts & extracts. A work consisting of synopses and summaries of longer publications, as well as original works being published for the first time in abstract form. May be used for an abridgement of a single previously published work.
- Books 0511 Catalog. Works consisting of extensive listings in widely varying areas, including such types as buying manuals; to be used for catalogs of such non-book items as coins, stamps, art works, etc., but not for a catalogue raisonné. For works identified as "catalogs" of books, or for discographies, NSP-0512 should be used instead.
- Books 0512 Bibliographies, indexes, discographies. In addition to readily identifiable bibliographies and discographies, this NSP is to be used for catalogs of library collections and for indexes of published works, such as Granger's Index to poetry. Such works as taxonomic indexes of botanical specimens are to be considered Handbooks (NSP-0521).

A reprint by a U.S. publisher would be coded 420-0 (U.S.), even though the book being reprinted was first published in a different country; it is the reprint that is in hand, and it was originally published in the U.S. An American translation of a novel originally published in French and in France, would not have 23040 (France) entered as the country of original publication, because the English translation being profiled was published first in the U.S. The determination of the country of original publication of some books is an intricate procedure, and requires consulting a more detailed set of rules than is offered here.
- Books 17. (CS) Country of source publisher. Used by entering the code for the country in which the publisher or distributor from whom the book was acquired is located.

Books 18 (GI) Geographic characteristics of the subject. Used by entering the code for the geographic location(s) connected with the subject of the book. For literary works, a special application of this NSP is to enter the code for the country of the author of the work, thus showing that the book is an American novel or a play by an Italian.
